THIS PHONE MEETS THE GOVERNMENT'S REQUIREMENTS FOR EXPOSURE TO RADIO WAVES.

Your phone is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed and manufactured not to exceed the emission limits for exposure to radio-frequency (RF) energy. These limits are part of comprehensive guidelines and establish permitted levels of RF energy for the general population. The guidelines are based on standards that were developed by independent scientific organizations through periodic and thorough evaluation of scientific

studies. These guidelines include a substantial safety margin designed to ensure the safety of all persons, regardless of age and health.

The exposure standard for phones employs a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR. This device is complied with SAR for general population/uncontrolled exposure limits in ANSI/IEEE C95.1-1992 and had been tested in accordance with the measurement methods and procedures specified in IEEE1528.

The FCC has granted an Equipment Authorization for this model phone with all reported SAR levels evaluated as in compliance with the FCC RF exposure guidelines. Although the SAR is determined at the highest certified power level, the actual SAR level of the phone while operating can be well below the maximum value. This is because the phone is designed to operate at multiple power levels so as to use only the power required to reach the network. In general, the closer you are to a wireless base station antenna, the lower the power output of the phone. Before a phone model is available for sale to the public, compliance with national regulations and standards must be shown.

The highest SAR value for 4065F when tested is 1.26 W/Kg for use at the ear and 1.26 W/Kg for use close to the body.

While there may be differences between the SAR levels of various phones and at various positions, they all meet the government requirement for RF exposure.



1.1 Keys and connectors

Back button

 Tap to go back to the previous screen, or close a dialog box, options menu, the Notification panel, etc.

Home button

- From any application or screen, touch to return to the Home screen.
- Touch and hold to turn on Google Assistant.
 You can get help such as getting directions and restaurant information based on the content detected on the screen.

Recent Apps button

Touch to view applications you've recently accessed.

Power key

- Press: Lock the screen/Light up the screen.
- Press and hold: Show the popup menu to select from Restart/Power off/Airplane mode.
- Press and hold the Power key and Volume down key to take a screenshot.
- Press and hold the Power key for at least 10 seconds to force reboot.
- Touch to unlock the screen if you have set fingerprint to unlock your screen.

The Google Assistant Button

• Press: Launch Google Assistant.

Volume keys

- In call mode, adjusts the earpiece or headset volume.
- In Music/Video/Streaming mode, adjusts the media volume.
- In general mode, adjusts the ringtone volume.
- Mutes the ringtone of an incoming call.
- In camera preview mode, press the **Volume up** or **down** key to take a photo.
- When the screen is locked, double-press the **Volume up** to open the camera.



1.2 Getting started

1.2.1 Setting up

- 1) Insert the pin into the hole and pull out the tray.
- ② Insert or remove your SIM card or microSD card.

Your phone only supports nano-SIM cards. Do not attempt to insert other SIM types like mini and micro cards as these may cause damage to your phone.

Charging the battery



You are advised to fully charge the battery. Charging status is indicated by a percentage displayed on screen. The percentage increases as the phone is charged.



To reduce power consumption and energy waste when the battery is fully charged, disconnect your charger from the plug; switch off Wi-Fi, GPS, Bluetooth or background-running applications when not in use; reduce the backlight time, etc.

1.2.2 Powering on your phone

Hold down the **Power** key until the phone powers on, unlock your phone (Swipe, Pattern, PIN, Password, Fingerprint or Face) if necessary and confirm. The Home screen is displayed.

1.2.3 Powering off your phone

Press and hold the **Power** key until options appear, then select **Power off**.

1.3 Home screen

You can bring all the items (applications, shortcuts, folders and widgets) you love or use most frequently to your Home screen for quick access. Touch the **Home** button to switch to the Home screen.



- Status bar
 - Status/Notification indicators
 - Swipe down to open the Notification panel
- 4 Search bar
 - Touch 2 to enter text search screen
 - Touch 3 to enter voice search screen
- Favorites tray applications
 - Enter the application

Touch and hold to move or remove applications

Auto-rotate screen

From the app list, touch Settings > Display > Advanced > Auto-rotate screen to enable the function.

1.3.1 Using the touchscreen

Touch &

To access an application, touch it with your finger.

Touch and hold



To enter the available options for an item, touch and hold the item. For example. Select a contact in Contacts and touch and hold it. An options list will then appear.



Place your finger on the screen to drag an object to another location.

Slide/Swipe



Slide the screen to scroll up and down the applications, images, and web pages. You can slide the screen horizontally too.



Similar to swiping, flicking is a lighter and quicker stroke.

Pinch/Spread



Place two fingers on the screen surface and draw them apart or together to scale an element on the screen.

Rotate



Automatically change the screen orientation from portrait to landscape by turning the phone sideways to have a better screen view.

1.3.2 Status bar


From the status bar, you can view both phone status (on the right side) and notification information (on the left side).

Drag down the status bar to view notifications and drag again to enter the quick settings panel.

Touch and drag up to close it. When there are notifications, they can be accessed by touching them.

Notification panel

When there are notifications, touch and drag down the Status bar to open the Notification panel to read more detailed information.




Quick Settings panel

Touch and drag down from the top of the screen twice to open the Quick settings panel.

You can enable or disable functions or change modes by touching the icons.

Touch the **Edit** icon of to customize your Quick settings panel.



1.3.3 Lock and unlock your screen

To protect your phone and privacy, you can lock the screen with a pattern, PIN, password, fingerprint or face unlock.

To lock phone screen

If your phone remains inactive for a period of time, it will automatically lock the screen and enter sleep mode to save power. Go to **Settings > Display > Advanced > Screen timeout** and select a screen timeout period.

You can also manually lock the screen by pressing the **Power** key once.

To unlock the phone screen

Press the **Power** key once to light up the screen, swipe up and unlock the screen with the method you have set.



Use Pattern Unlock

Draw the same pattern you have set to unlock the screen.

Use PIN Unlock

Enter the PIN you have set to unlock the screen.

Enter a Password to Unlock the Screen

Once the screen is turned on, swipe up from any position on the screen to display the password input panel. Then enter your lock screen password.

Use Fingerprint unlock

Touch the fingerprint sensor with an enrolled finger to unlock the screen.

Use Face Unlock

Lift your phone and align it with your face. Your phone will unlock once your face is recognized.

1.3.4 Personalizing your Home screen

Add

You can touch and hold a folder, an application or a widget and drag the item to your preferred Home screen.

Reposition

Touch and hold an item and drag it to the desired position and then release. You can move items both on the Home screen and the Favorites tray. Hold the icon on the left or right edge of the screen to drag the item to another Home screen.

Remove

Touch and hold an item and drag it up to the top of the **Remove** icon, then release.

Create folders

To improve the organization of shortcuts or applications on the Home screen and the Favorites tray, you can add them to a folder by stacking one item on top of another. To rename a folder, open it and touch the folder's title bar to input the new name.

Wallpaper customization

Touch and hold an empty area on the Home screen, then touch **Wallpapers** to customize wallpaper.

1.3.5 Shortcuts and recently used applications

Consult Shortcuts

Touch and hold the empty area on the Home screen, then touch **Shortcuts** to display all shortcuts.

Touch the selected shortcuts and slide it to move to your preferred screen.

Consult recently used applications

To consult recently used applications, touch the **Recent Apps** button . Touch a thumbnail in the window to open the application.



Touch one thumbnail and swipe right to close an application.

Touch **Clear all** at the bottom of the screen to close all the running applications.

1.3.6 Volume adjustment

Using the volume key

Press the **Volume** key to adjust the volume.

To activate silent mode, press the **Volume** key and touch \triangle to show this icon \triangleright .

To activate vibrate mode, press the **Volume** key and touch $\hat{\square}$ to show this icon $\hat{\square}$.

Using the settings menu

From the app list, touch **Settings > Sound** to set the volume for media, call, ring & notification, alarm, etc.

2 Text input.....

2.1 Using the on-screen keyboard

On-screen keyboard settings

Go to Settings > System > Languages & input > On-screen keyboard, touch the keyboard you want to set up and a series of settings will become available.

Adjust the onscreen keyboard orientation

Turn the phone sideways or upright to adjust the onscreen keyboard orientation. You can adjust this by changing the settings (Touch Settings > Display > Advanced > Auto-rotate screen), or touch Auto-rotate icon on the Quick Settings panel.

2.1.1 Gboard



- 1 Enter text or numbers
- 2 Touch and hold to select symbols
- 3 Switch between "abc/Abc" mode; Touch and hold to switch to "abc/ABC" mode
- 4 Switch between symbol and numeric keyboard
- 5 Touch and hold to show input options

2.2 Text editing

You can edit texts which you have entered.

- Touch and hold or double tap within the text you want to edit.
- Drag the tabs to change the area of the selected text.
- The following options will appear: Cut, Copy, Share and Select all.
- If you have previously cut or copied any text, touch the tab to show Paste which allows you then paste the text at the current location.

3.1.1 Making a call

To make a call, touch **(** in the Favorites tray.

Enter the desired number from the dial pad and touch to place the call, or select a contact from **Contacts** or **Call logs** by sliding or touching tabs and then make the call.

The number you entered can be saved to **Contacts** by touching the **Create new contact** or **Add to a contact**.

If you make a mistake, you can delete the incorrect digits by touching igotimes.

To hang up a call, touch .

International call

To dial an international call, long press 0 to enter "+", then enter the international country prefix followed by the full phone number and touch .

Emergency call

If your phone has network coverage, dial the emergency number and touch to make an emergency call. This works even without a SIM card and without typing the PIN code

3.1.2 Answering or rejecting a call





When you receive a call:

• Press **ANSWER**, or swipe up the icon (%) to answer;

- Press **DECLINE**, or swipe down the icon (%) to reject;
- Touch Reply to reject the call by sending a preset message.

3.1.3 Calling your voicemail

Your voicemail is provided by your network to avoid missing calls. It works like an answering machine that you can consult at any time.

To access your voicemail, long press 1.

If you receive a voicemail, oo appears on the Status bar. Open the Notification panel and touch **New voicemail**.

3.1.4 During a call

To adjust the volume during a call, press the **Volume** key.



- End the current call.
- Touch once to mute the current call. Touch this icon again to unmute the call.
- iii Display the dial pad.
- Touch to add another call.
- Touch once to activate the speaker during the current call. Touch this icon again to deactivate the speaker.
- Put a call on hold.
 - To avoid accidental operation of the touchscreen during a call, the screen will automatically darken when you put the phone close to your ear, the screen will re-illuminate when it is removed from your ear.

3.1.5 Managing multiple calls

With this phone you can handle multiple calls at the same time.

Swap calls

When you accept two calls, touch \mathfrak{A} to switch between two lines. The current call will be put on hold.

Conference calls (1)

You can set up a conference call as follows.

- Place a call to the first participant of the conference call.
- Touch 📞 to add another call.
- Enter the phone number of the person you want to add to conference and touch . You can also add participants from Call logs or Contacts.
- Touch \uparrow to start the conference.
- Touch to end the conference call and disconnect all callers.

3.1.6 Phone settings

Touch : from the **Phone** screen, then touch **Settings** to set phone and contacts.

3.2 Call logs

You can access your call logs by touching \(\begin{cases} \text{from the} \) **Phone** screen to view missed calls, outgoing calls and incoming calls.

Touch one call to view information or further operations. You can launch a new call, send a message to the contact or number, or view detailed information of the call.



To delete the call history of a selected contact or number, touch and hold the contact and choose **Delete**.

3.3 Contacts.....



Contacts enables quick and easy access to the people you want to reach.

You can view and create contacts on your phone and synchronize them with your Gmail contacts or other applications.



Sending a multimedia message

- To send a multimedia message, enter the recipient's phone number in the **To** bar.
- Write the text of the message in the Text message bar.
- Touch + to send a voice message, attach files or share a contact.
- Touch ___ to attach a photo/video you have taken or stored in Gallery.
- Touch o to take a photo.
- Touch Tt to take a video.
- When finished, touch be multimedia message.

4.2 Manage messages

When a message is received, will appear on the Status bar as a notification. Swipe down the Status bar to open the Notification panel. Touch the new message to open and read it. You can also access the Messages application and touch the message to open it.

Messages are displayed as a conversation.

Touch a message to enter the message composing screen:



- Tap for more options.
- Tap to call the number.
- **3** Tap to save the number to Contacts or view the contact details if the number has been saved.

To adjust message settings, touch and select **Settings** on the message list screen.

5.1 Camera.....



Before using the camera, make sure that you remove the protective lens cover to avoid it affecting your picture quality.

There are multiple ways to open the Camera app.

From the Home Screen

From the home screen, touch Camera

From the Lock Screen

When the screen is locked, press the Power key once to light up the screen, then swipe left on the camera icon in the lower right corner to open the camera.

Using shortcut key

When the screen is locked, double-press the **Volume up** key to open the camera.

- Take HDR photos.
- Flash mode

Touch to switch the camera flash to auto/on/off.

- 6 Pinch fingers together to zoom out, or spread fingers apart to zoom in.
- 7 View the photos or videos you have taken.
- Take a photo.

To take a photo

The screen acts as the viewfinder. First, position the object or landscape in the viewfinder, touch the screen to focus if necessary and touch or press the Volume key to take a photo. The photo will be automatically saved. You can also take burst shots, swipe left, and touch More > Burst, then touch and hold to take burst shots, the maximum number is 30.

To take a video

Touch **Video** to change the camera mode to video. Touch to start video recording. Touch the left part of this icon to take a picture during video recording. Touch the right part of this icon to pause video recording and touch to continue. Touch to stop recording. The video will be automatically saved.

Further operations when viewing a photo/video you have taken

- Slide left or right to view the photos or videos you have taken.
- Touch < , then Gmail/Bluetooth/MMS/etc. to share the photo or video.
- Touch **Back button** \triangleleft to return to **Camera**.

5.1.1 Settings

7.1 FM Radio⁽¹⁾.....



Your phone is equipped with a radio⁽²⁾ with RDS ⁽³⁾ functionality. You can use the application as a traditional radio with saved channels or with visual information related to the radio program displayed if you turn to stations that offer Visual Radio service.

To listen to a radio programme, swipe up from the Home screen, then touch **FM Radio**.

- 1 Touch to view the saved recordings, set storage path and scheduled off time.
- 2 Touch to enable/disable the loudspeaker.
- 3 Touch to go to next channel.
- 4 Touch to go to previous channel.
- **5** Touch to turn on/off the radio.
- **6** Touch to add the current station to **Favorites** or to remove it from **Favorites**.
- Touch to open and view the saved channels list.
- **8** Touch to record radio.

7.2 Sound Recorder.....



Use this function to record audio files, the recording file you stopped will be stored in audio file automatically.

8 Google applications......

Google apps are preinstalled on your phone to improve work efficiency and help you enjoy life.

This manual briefly introduces the apps. For detailed features and user guides, refer to related websites or the introduction provided in the apps.

You are recommended to register with a Google account to enjoy full functionality.

8.1 Google Go

A web browser with which you can surf the internet.

Your bookmarks, browsing history, and settings across all devices on which the browser is installed can be synchronized with your Google account.

8.2 Gmail

As Google's web-based email service, Gmail is configured when you first set up your phone. With this application, you can send and receive emails, manage emails by labels, archive them, etc. Emails can be automatically synchronized with your Gmail account.

8.3 Maps

Google Maps offers satellite imagery, street maps, 360° panoramic views of streets, real-time traffic conditions, and route planning for traveling by foot, car, or public transportation. By using this application, you can find your own location, search for a place, and get suggested route planning for your trips.

8.4 YouTube

YouTube is an online video-sharing application where users can upload, view, and share videos. Available content includes video clips, TV clips, music videos, and other content such as video blogging, short original videos, and educational videos. It supports a streaming function that allows you to start watching videos almost as soon as they begin downloading from the internet.

8.5 Play Store

Serves as the official app store for the Android operating system, allowing users to browse and download applications and games. Applications are either free of charge or at a cost.

In Play Store, search for the app you need, download it and then follow the installation guide to install the app. You can also uninstall, update an app, and manage your downloads.

8.6 **Duo**

A video chat mobile app.

With phone numbers verified, users can easily video call people from their contact list.

8.7 Google Assistant Go

Devices can have a dedicated hardware button for the Google Assistant Go (GA-button). With a GA-button, users can launch the Google Assistant Go in three different modes: Default , Visual snapshot, and Walk talkie.

- Default Single press to activate
 Default mode is the same as launching the Google
 Assistant Go by long-pressing on the home button.
- Walkie-talkie Touch and hold and hold to activate

Walkie-talkie mode launches the Google Assistant Go with microphone auto-endpointing turned off. Microphone auto-endpointing is used to automatically close the microphone and finalize a user query in default mode. In walkie-talkie mode, the microphone remains open until the user releases the GA-button. When the user releases the GA-button, the microphone closes and the Assistant sends the user query.

To go to **Settings**, tap **Settings** from the Home screen.

You can also swipe down from the notification panel and touch **3**.

9.1 Network & internet

9.1.1 Wi-Fi

You can connect to the internet when your phone is within range of a wireless network. Wi-Fi can be used on your phone even without a SIM card inserted.

To turn Wi-Fi on and connect to a wireless network

- Touch Settings > Network & internet > Wi-Fi.
- The default is turned on .
- Detected Wi-Fi networks are listed.
- Touch a Wi-Fi network to connect to it. If the network you selected is secured, you are required to enter a password or other credentials (you should contact the network operator for details). When finished, touch CONNECT.

You can also connect to a Wi-Fi network by scanning a QR code.

• Touch Settings > Network & internet > Wi-Fi > +

Touch settings > Network & internet > Wi-Fi.

To add a Wi-Fi network

When Wi-Fi is on, you can add new Wi-Fi networks according to your preference.

- Touch Settings > Network & internet > Wi-Fi > Add network.
- Enter the name of the network and any required network information.
- Touch SAVE.

To forget a Wi-Fi network

The following steps prevent automatic connection to networks which you no longer wish to use.

- Turn on Wi-Fi, if it's not already on.
- On the Wi-Fi screen, touch the name of the saved network.
- Touch **FORGET** in the dialog that opens.
- Touch and hold the name of the connected network, then touch **Forget**.

9.1.2 Mobile network

Go to Settings > Network & internet > Mobile network to enable Data roaming, set your Preferred network type, check the network connection you are using or create a new access point, etc.

9.1.3 Airplane mode

Turn on **Airplane mode** to simultaneously disable all wireless connections including Wi-Fi, Bluetooth and more.

9.1.4 Hotspot & tethering

To share your phone's data connection via USB and Bluetooth, or as a Wi-Fi hotspot, go to **Settings > Network & internet > Hotspot & tethering** to activate these functions.

To rename or secure your Wi-Fi hotspot

You can rename your phone's Wi-Fi network (SSID) and secure its Wi-Fi network.

- Touch Settings > Network & internet > Hotspot & tethering > Wi-Fi hotspot.
- Touch Wi-Fi hotspot to rename the network SSID or set your network security.
- Touch OK.



The functions above may incur additional network charges from your network operator. Extra fees may also be charged in roaming areas.

9.1.5 Data saver

By enabling Data saver, you can reduce data usage by preventing some apps from sending or receiving data in the background.

9.1.6 VPN

Virtual private networks (VPNs) allow you to connect to the resources inside a secured local network from outside that network. VPNs are commonly deployed by corporations, schools, and other institutions so that their users can access local network resources when not inside that network, or when connected to a wireless network.

To add a VPN

- Touch Settings > Network & internet > Advanced > VPN and then touch +.
- On the screen that opens, follow your network administrator's instructions to configure each component of the VPN settings.
- Touch SAVE.

The VPN is added to the list on the VPN settings screen.



Before adding a VPN, you should set a screen lock for your phone.

To connect to/disconnect from VPN

To connect to a VPN:

- Touch Settings > Network & internet > Advanced > VPN.
- The VPNs you have added are listed. Touch the VPN you want to connect with.
- In the dialog that opens, enter any requested credentials and touch **CONNECT**.

To disconnect from a VPN:

• Touch the VPN you want to disconnect from. In the dialog that opens, touch **DISCONNECT**.

To edit/delete a VPN

To edit a VPN:

- Touch Settings > Network & internet >Advanced > VPN.
- The VPNs you have added are listed. Touch the icon next to the VPN you want to edit.
- After editing, touch SAVE.

To delete a VPN:

 Touch the icon next to the selected VPN, then touch FORGET to delete it.

9.1.7 Private DNS

Touch to select private DNS mode.

9.2 Connected devices (1)

9.2.1 Pair new device

To exchange data with another device, you need to turn Bluetooth on and pair your phone with the Bluetooth device with which you want to exchange data.

- Touch Settings > Connected devices > + Pair new device.
- Touch a Bluetooth device you want to pair your phone with in the list.
- In the dialog that pops up, touch **PAIR** to confirm.
- If the pairing is successful, your phone will be connected to the device.

To unpair from a Bluetooth device

- Touch 🥸 beside the device you want to unpair from.
- Touch **FORGET** to confirm.
- (1) You are recommended to use Alcatel Bluetooth headsets, which have been tested and proved compatible with your phone. You can go to www.alcatelmobile.com for more information about the Alcatel Bluetooth headset.

9.2.2 Connection preferences

Touch to set the connection preferences, you can select Bluetooth, Cast, Printing, Files received via Bluetooth and Nearby Share.

9.3 Apps & notifications

Touch to view details about the applications installed on your phone, to manage their data usage or force them to stop.

In the **Permission manager** menu of an application, you can grant permissions for the app, such as allowing the app to access your **Camera**, **Contacts**, **Location**, etc.

9.4 Battery

Touch any category in the battery management screen to view its power consumption.

9.5 Display

In this menu, you can adjust your screen **Brightness** level, Adaptive brightness, Wallpaper, Font size, Lock screen display, etc.

To rotate screen contents when device is rotated, touch **Auto-rotate screen**.

9.6 Scheduled power on/off

Turn on the switches to enable scheduled power on/off, and preset your power on/off time and repeat mode.

9.7 Sound

Use the Sound settings to configure many aspects of call ringtones, music, and other audio settings.

Vibrate for calls

Touch to select **Never vibrate**, **Always vibrate** or **Vibrate fist then ring gradually**.

Silent mode

Touch to turn on / off Silent mode.

Do Not Disturb

If you do not want to be disturbed by your phone or information ringtones during work or rest, you can set the **Do Not Disturb** mode.

Swipe down the Status bar twice to access the Quick Settings panel, tap to turn on Do Not Disturb.

Media

Touch to show/hide player when the media session has ended.

• Shortcut to prevent ringing

Press power & volume up together to vibrate or mute calls and notifications.

- Phone ringtone
 Touch to select phone ringtone.
- Default notification sound
 Set the default sound for notifications.
- Default alarm sound
 Set your alarm ringtone.
- Other sounds and vibrations
 Set Dial pad tones, Screen locking sound, Touch sounds, etc.

9.8 Storage

Enter **Settings** > **Storage** to check the usage of storage space, and free up more when necessary.

9.9 Privacy

To protect your privacy, you can set an app to be allowed or forbidden to access your location, SMS, phone, etc. Also whether or not to show passwords or choose the activities and info that you want to Google to save.

9.10 Location

Tap to set whether to allow an app to access your device's location. You can set Allow only while using the app, Ask every time or Deny.

9.11 Security

Screen lock

Select one method such as None, Swipe, Pattern, PIN or Password to unlock the screen.

• Fingerprint

Use your Fingerprint to unlock the screen or take a photo/video, etc.

Access **Settings > Security > Fingerprint** to activate these functions.

Face unlock

Face unlock allows you to unlock your device with your facial data. Set it according to the on-screen steps.

Ensure that you are facing the phone screen when using face recognition.

NOTE: you need to set a pattern, PIN, or password before using fingerprint and face key.

Smart Lock

Smart Lock keeps your device unlocked when it's safe with you and locked when it detects that it's been put down.

Others

You can also set SIM card lock, App pinning, etc. in Settings > Security.

9.12 Accounts

Touch to add, remove, and manage your email and other supported accounts. You can also use these settings to control how and whether all applications send, receive, and synchronize data on their own schedules, and whether all applications can synchronize user data automatically.

Touch **Add account** to add an account for the selected app.

9.13 Accessibility

Use the Accessibility settings to configure any accessibility plug-ins you have installed on your phone.

9.14 Smart controls

• Lift to check phone

Turn on to check time, notifications and other info, pick up your phone.

• Smart motion

Pick up, flip or shake device to control relevant applications.

Pocket mode

Smart control when device in pocket.

9.15 Digital Wellbeing & parental controls

In this menu you can find how much time you have spent on the phone and even on each app. You can customize the time limit for using the phone so that have a healthy and balanced life.

In addition, parents are able to restrict their children's usage time to manage their browsing habits.

9.16 Google

Touch to configure your Google account and service settings.

9.17 System

• System update

If you want to update the system, touch CHECK FOR UPDATES (refer to "10.1 FOTA Upgrade").

• Languages & input

Touch to configure language settings, Gboard, Google voice typing settings, Pointer speed, etc.

Gestures

To set some gestures for convenient use, such as Quickly open camera, Lift to check phone, Prevent ringing, etc.

Date & time

Use Date & time settings to customize your preferences for how date and time are displayed.

Backup

Turn on to back up your phone's settings and other application data to Google servers. If you replace your phone, the settings and data you've backed up will be restored onto the new phone when you sign in with your Google account.

• Reset options

If Erase all date (factory reset) is selected, all data in your phone's internal storage will be erased, please back up your data before reset.

10 Making the most of your phone

10.1 FOTA Upgrade

Use the FOTA (Firmware Over The Air) Upgrade tool to update your phone's software. To access Updates, from the app list, touch **Settings > System > System Update**.

If you want to update the system, touch CHECK FOR UPDATES and when that's finished, your phone will have the latest version of the software.

During FOTA downloading or updating, to avoid errors in locating the correct update packages, do not change your default storage location.

13 Troubleshooting.....

Before contacting the service center. here are some instructions to help you troubleshoot your device:

- For optimal operation, fully charge the battery.
- To improve the phone's performance, remove unnecessary files or apps on your phone.
- Update your phone's software via the System
 Update. Alternatively you can touch Settings >
 System > System Update to update software.
- Reset your phone via Factory data reset. Touch Settings > System > Reset options > Erase all data (factory reset). Another method is to hold down the Power key and the Volume up key at the same time when your phone is powered off. All your phone data will be lost permanently. It is strongly advised to fully back up your phone data before resetting.

and carry out the following checks:

My phone can't be switched on or is frozen

• When the phone can't be switched on, charge for at least 20 minutes to ensure the minimum battery power needed. Then switch it on again.

- When the phone falls into a loop during power on animation and the user interface can't be accessed, press and hold the **Power** key to reset. This eliminates any abnormal OS booting issues caused by third party applications.
- If neither method is effective, reset the phone by pressing the Power key and the Volume up key at the same time, and then selecting Wipe data/Factory reset. Press the Volume key to select, and press the Power key to confirm each selection.

My phone has not responded for several minutes

- If your phone doesn't respond, turn off your phone by pressing and holding the Power key until it turns off and then restart it again.

My phone turns off by itself

My phone can't connect to a network or "No service" is displayed

My phone can't connect to the internet

- Make sure that the internet access service of your SIM card is available.

- Make sure that you are in a place with network coverage.
- Try connecting at a later time or another location.

Invalid SIM card

 Make sure that the SIM card has been correctly inserted.

- Make sure that the chip on your SIM card is not damaged.
- Make sure that the service of your SIM card is available.

My phone can't make outgoing calls

- Make sure that you have dialed a valid number and have touched call icon.
- For international calls, check the country and area codes.
- Make sure that your phone is connected to a network, and the network is not overloaded or unavailable.
- Check your subscription status with your carrier (credit, SIM card validity, etc.).
- Make sure that you have not barred outgoing calls.
- Make sure that your phone is not in airplane mode.

My phone can't receive incoming calls

- Make sure that your phone is switched on and connected to a network (check for overloaded or unavailable network).
- Check your subscription status with your carrier (credit, SIM card validity, etc.).
- Make sure that you have not forwarded incoming calls.
- Make sure that you have not barred certain calls.

• Make sure that your phone is not in airplane mode.

The caller's name/number doesn't appear when a call is received

- Check that you have subscribed to this service with your carrier.
- Your caller may have concealed his name or number.

I can't find my contacts

- Make sure that your SIM card is not broken.
- Make sure that your SIM card is inserted properly.
- Import all contacts stored on your SIM card to your phone.

The sound quality of the calls is poor

- Adjust the volume during a call by pressing the Volume key.
- Check the network strength. Move to a location with stronger signal strength.
- Make sure that the receiver, connector and speaker on your phone are clean.

I can't use the features described in the manual

- Check with your carrier to make sure that your subscription includes this service.
- Make sure that this feature doesn't require an **Alcatel** accessory.

When I select a number from my contacts, the number can't be dialed

- Make sure that you have correctly recorded the number in your file.
- Make sure that you have selected the country code when calling an international number.

I can't add a contact

 Make sure that your SIM card contacts are not full; delete some files or save the files to the phone.

My callers can't leave messages on my voicemail

Contact your network carrier to check service availability.

I can't access my voicemail

- Make sure that your carrier's voicemail number is correctly entered in "Voicemail number".
- Try later if the network is busy.

I can't send and receive MMS

- Check your phone storage as it might be full.
- Contact your network carrier to check service availability and MMS parameters.
- Verify the server center number or your MMS profile with your carrier.

SIM card PIN locked

 Contact your network carrier to obtain the PUK (Personal Unblocking Key) code.

I can't connect my phone to my computer

- If you are using a Windows computer, make sure it supports MTP mode. If you are using a Mac, make sure to install Android File Transfer from www. android.com/filetransfer/.

I can't download new files

- Make sure that there is sufficient phone storage space for your download.
- Select the microSD card as the location to store downloaded files.
- Check your subscription status with your carrier.

The phone can't be detected by others via Bluetooth

- Make sure that Bluetooth is turned on and your phone is visible to other users.
- Make sure that the two phones are within Bluetooth's detection range.

The battery drains too fast

 Make sure that you follow the complete charge time (minimum 150 minutes).

- After a partial charge, the battery level indicator may not be exact. Wait for at least 20 minutes after removing the charger to obtain an exact indication.
- Adjust the screen brightness as appropriate.
- Extend the email auto-check interval for as long as possible.
- Update news and weather information on manual demand, or increase their auto-check interval.
- Exit background-running applications if they are not being used for extended periods of time.
- Turn off Bluetooth, Wi-Fi, or GPS when not in use.

The phone becomes warm following prolonged calls, game playing, internet surfing or running other complex applications

 This heating is a normal consequence of the CPU handling excessive data. Ending the above actions will make your phone return to normal temperature.

After a factory data reset is performed, I can't use my phone without entering Google account credentials

- After a reset is performed, you must enter the original Google account credentials that were used on this phone.
- If you don't remember your Google account credentials, complete Google account recovery procedures.

 If you still cannot access your phone, apply to the authorized repair center, but remember that it will not be regarded as warranty case.

I forgot some passwords/codes/keys on phone

- Perform a factory data reset.
- If you still cannot access your phone, apply to the authorized repair center, but remember that it will not be regarded as a warranty case.
