### 3.2 Buttons and lights (HP Deskjet 6540-50 series)

Use the printer buttons to turn the printer on and off, cancel a print job, and restart a job. The printer lights give you visual cues about the status of the printer.

The printer buttons are located in the upper portion of the control panel.


1. Power button and light
2. Print Cancel button
3. Resume button and light

The control panel also contains Print Cartridge Status lights and a Print Quality Selector button.

## Power button and light

The Power button turns the printer on and off. It might take a few seconds for the printer to turn on after you press the Power button.
The Power light flashes when the printer is processing.
Caution: Always use the Power button to turn the printer on and off. Using a power strip, surge protector, or a wall-mounted switch to turn the printer on and off can cause printer failure.

## Print Cancel button

Pressing the Print Cancel button cancels the current print job.

## Resume button and light

The Resume light flashes when an action is required, such as loading paper or clearing a paper jam. When the problem is solved, press the Resume button to continue printing.

### 3.3 Print Cartridge Status lights (HP Deskjet 6540-50 series)

The Print Cartridge Status lights indicate the status of the print cartridges.

| Status of the Print Cartridge Status lights | Status of the print cartridges |

| Flashing | Service required |

The Print Cartridge Status lights are located in the center of the printer control panel.


1. Print Cartridge Status lights

2. The left status light represents the tri-color print cartridge.

2 . The right status light represents the print cartridge that is installed in the compartment on the right side of the print cartridge cradle. That print cartridge can be the black print cartridge, the photo print cartridge, or the gray photo print cartridge.

### 3.4 Print Quality Selector button (HP Deskjet 654050 series)

Use the Print Quality Selector button to set print quality and print speed from the front of the printer.

The Print Quality Selector button is located on the lower portion of the printer control panel.

## Enabling the Print Quality Selector button

Before using the Print Quality Selector button, you must enable it from the printer software.

Follow these steps to enable the Print Quality Selector button:

1. Open the Printer Properties dialog box.
2. Click the Printing Shortcuts tab or the Paper/Quality tab.
3. Click Use printer default in the Print quality drop-down list.

Note: Depending on the type of document that you are printing, the Use Printer Default option might not be available on the Printing Shortcuts tab.

## 4. Click OK.

## Using the Print Quality Selector button

Use the Print Quality Selector button to specify the print quality for documents that you plan to print. You cannot change the print quality for a document after the document begins printing.

Follow these steps to use the Print Quality Selector button:

1. Verify that the Print Quality Selector button is enabled from the printer software.
2. Press the Print Quality Selector button to select one of the following print qualities:


Note: FastDraft and Maximum dpi can only be selected in the printer software. If a document is printed in either FastDraft or Maximum dpi mode, the currently selected print-quality icon flashes until the document is complete.

## Lights

The Print Quality Selector icons light up or flash to indicate the selected print quality:

### 3.5 Paper trays (HP Deskjet 6540-50 series)

The printer has two paper trays:

- In tray
- Out tray

In tray
The In tray holds paper or other media to be printed.


1. In tray

Slide the paper guides firmly against the edges of the media on which you are printing.


1. Paper-width guide
2. Paper-length guide

## Out tray

Printed pages are deposited in the Out tray.


1. Out tray
2. Envelope slot

Use the envelope slot to print single envelopes.
Raise the Out tray to load paper.


To prevent paper from falling out of the Out tray, pull out the Out-tray extension, and then unfold the Out-tray extension stop.


1. Out-tray extension
2. Out-tray extension stop

Do not unfold the Out-tray extension stop when printing on legal paper.
After the print job is complete, fold the Out-tray extension stop, and then push the Out-tray extension into the Out tray.


### 3.6 Envelope slot (HP Deskjet 6540-50 series)

Use the envelope slot to print single envelopes.


## 1. Envelope slot

Follow these step to use the envelope slot:

1. Insert the envelope with the side to be printed on facing down and the flap to the left.

2. Push the envelope into the printer as far as it will go without bending.
3. Print the envelope.

### 3.7 Print cartridges

Four print cartridges are available for use with the printer.

## Using print cartridges

Everyday printing
Use the black and tri-color print cartridges for everyday print jobs.

## Quality color photos

For more vibrant colors when printing color photographs or other special documents, remove the black print cartridge and use a photo print cartridge in combination with the tri-color print cartridge.

## Quality black and white photos

For outstanding black and white photographs, remove the black print cartridge and use a gray photo print cartridge in combination with the tri-color print cartridge.

## Replacing print cartridges

When buying print cartridges, look for the print cartridge selection number.
You can find the selection number in three places:

- Selection number label: Look at the label on the print cartridge you are replacing.



## 1. Selection number label

- Printer documentation: For a list of print cartridge selection numbers, see the reference guide that came with the printer.
- Print Cartridge Ordering Information dialog box: For a list of print cartridge selection numbers, open the printer Toolbox , click the Estimated Ink Level tab, and then click the Print Cartridge Ordering Information button.

If a print cartridge runs out of ink, the printer can operate in the ink-backup mode.
For information about installing a print cartridge, see the print cartridge installation page.

### 3.8 Ink-backup mode

In the ink-backup mode, the printer operates by using only one print cartridge. The ink back-up mode is initiated when a print cartridge is removed from the print cartridge cradle.

To remove a print cartridge, see the print cartridge installation page.

## Ink-backup mode output

Printing in ink-backup mode slows the printer and affects the quality of printed documents.

| Installed print cartridge | Result |
| :--- | :--- |
| Black print cartridge. | Colors are printed as grayscale. |
| Tri-color print cartridge. | Colors print but black is grayed and is not a true black. |
| Photo print cartridge. | Colors are printed as grayscale. |
| Gray photo print cartridge. | Colors are printed as grayscale. |

Note: It is recommended that you do not use the photo print cartridge or the gray photo print cartridge for ink-backup mode.

## Exiting ink-backup mode

Install two print cartridges in the printer to exit the ink-backup mode.
To install a print cartridge, see the print cartridge installation page.

### 3.9 Automatic Paper-Type Sensor

The Automatic Paper-Type Sensor automatically selects the appropriate print settings for the media that is being printed on, particularly HP media.

When the Automatic Paper-Type Sensor is engaged, the printer scans the first page of a document with a red optical sensor light to determine the best paper-type setting. After the printer determines the paper-type setting, the page is printed.
Do not place the printer in direct sunlight. Direct sunlight can interfere with the Automatic Paper-Type Sensor.

To use the Automatic Paper-Type Sensor, see the paper-type selection page.
Note: The Automatic Paper-Type Sensor is not available for documents that are printed from the 250-Sheet Plain Paper Tray Accessory or the Auto TwoSided Print Accessory with Small Paper Tray.

## Folding the paper trays

Follow these steps to fold the paper tray:

1. If necessary, fold the Out-tray extension stop, and then push in the Out-tray extension.

2. Raise the printer cover.
3. Raise the Out tray.

4. Verify that the In-tray extension is pushed in, and then pull the paper-length guide to the edge of the In tray.

5. Raise the In tray.

6. Close the printer cover.

### 5.1 USB

The printer connects to the computer with a Universal Serial Bus (USB) cable. The computer must be running Windows 98 or later to use a USB cable.


For instructions about connecting the printer with a USB cable, see the setup poster that came with the printer.

### 5.2 Front USB port (HP Deskjet 6540-50 series)

Use the USB port on the front of the printer to connect the printer to a laptop quickly.


1. Front USB port

The first time you connect a laptop to the front USB port of the printer, you must configure the laptop for the port.

### 5.2.1 Front USB port - printer software not installed

Follow the steps below if the printer software has not been installed on the laptop.
If the printer software has been installed on the laptop, follow the instructions for configuring the laptop to use the front USB port.

## Installing the printer software

1. Verify that the printer is turned on.
2. Use a USB cable to connect the laptop to the front USB port on the printer.
3. Wait for a New Hardware wizard to appear.
4. After the New Hardware wizard appears, insert the printer software CD in the CD-ROM drive of the laptop.
5. Follow the onscreen instructions to install the printer software.

### 5.2.2 Front USB port - printer software already installed

Follow the steps below if the printer software has been installed on the laptop.

If the printer software has not been installed on the laptop, follow the instructions for installing the printer software.

## Configuring the laptop

Configuring the laptop to use the printer's front USB port creates another copy of the printer software on your laptop. The new copy of the printer software is configured for the printer's front USB port.

1. Verify that the printer is turned on.
2. Use a USB cable to connect the laptop to the front USB port of the printer.
3. Wait for a New Hardware wizard to appear.
4. Do one of the following depending on the version of Windows on the laptop:

- Windows XP : When prompted, click OK.
- Windows 2000 : Allow Windows to configure the laptop automatically.
- Windows Me : When prompted, insert the printer software CD in the CDROM drive of the laptop, and then follow the onscreen instructions.
- Windows 98 : Allow Windows to configure the laptop automatically.

When Windows offers you the opportunity to name the printer, give the printer a name that indicates that you are using the front USB port, such as HP Deskjet 65xx Front USB .

### 5.2.3 Using the front USB port

Before using the front USB port on the printer, you must configure the laptop for the port.

Follow these steps to use the front USB port:

1. Use a USB cable to connect the laptop to the front USB port on the printer.
2. Open the document that you want to print, click File, and then click Print.
3. Click the HP Deskjet 6540-50 series printer, and then click OK or Print.

Note: If two copies of the HP Desket 6540-50 series printer appear, select the copy that is configured for the front USB port.

### 5.3 Networking

You can make a printer available to other computers on a network by sharing the printer.

### 6.1.1 Enhancing your photos

The printer software offers several features to make printing digital photos easier and improve photo quality:

- Get the best combination of speed and quality by using PhotoREt.
- Use the HP digital photography options to touch up photos.
- Achieve the highest resolution with Maximum dpi.
- Print an Exif-formatted photo if you have Exif-enabled software.
- Use HP Everyday Photo Paper, Semi-gloss to save money and ink when printing photos.

Learn how to add professional touches to your digital photographs:

- Use the photo print cartridge for great colors.
- Use these software options to improve printed colors:
- Advanced color settings
- Color management
- Use the gray photo print cartridge for outstanding black-and-white photos.
- Print black-and-white photos.
- Print to the edges of the photo paper with borderless printing.

To prevent photo paper from curling, follow the photo paper storage guidelines.

### 6.1.2 PhotoREt

PhotoREt offers the best combination of print speed and quality for your image.
Follow these steps to print with PhotoREt technology:

1. Open the Printer Properties dialog box.
2. Click the Printing Shortcuts tab or the Paper/Quality tab.
3. Click Best in the Print quality drop-down list.
4. Select any other print settings that you want, and then click OK.

### 6.1.3 HP digital photography options

The printer has several features to enhance the quality of digital photographs.

## Opening the HP digital photography options dialog box

Follow these steps to open the HP digital photography options dialog box:

1. Open the Printer Properties dialog box.
2. Click the Printing Shortcuts tab or the Paper/Quality tab, and then click the HP digital photography button.

## Using the HP digital photography options dialog box

Use the HP digital photography options dialog box to set these options:


1. Red eye removal : Click On to remove or reduce red-eye in the photograph.
2. Contrast enhancement : Adjust the contrast to your preference. Click Automatic to allow the printer driver to automatically balance the contrast.
3. Digital flash : Adjust the exposure in dark areas of photos to bring out detail. Click Automatic to allow the printer driver to automatically balance lightness and darkness.
4. SmartFocus : Enhance image quality and clarity. Click On to allow the printer driver to automatically focus the image.
5. Sharpness : Adjust the image sharpness to your preference. Click Automatic to allow the printer driver to automatically set the level of sharpening for the image.
6. Smoothing : Soften an image. Click Automatic to allow the printer driver to automatically set the level of smoothing for the image.

### 6.1.4 Maximum dpi

The Maximum dpi print quality setting offers $4800 \times 1200$ optimized dpi printing.
The $4800 \times 1200$ optimized dpi print mode is the highest quality resolution for this printer. When $4800 \times 1200$ optimized dpi is selected in the printer driver, the tri-color print cartridge prints in the $4800 \times 1200$ optimized dpi mode (up to $4800 \times 1200$ optimized dpi color and 1200-input dpi). If a photo print cartridge is also installed, the print quality is enhanced. A photo print cartridge can be purchased separately if it is not included with your printer.

Note: Use an HP premium photo paper when printing in the Maximum dpi print quality setting in order to enhance color matching and detail in the photo.

Follow these steps to print in the $4800 \times 1200$ optimized dpi mode:

1. Open the Printer Properties dialog box.
2. Click the Printing Shortcuts tab or the Paper/Quality tab.

Note: On the Printing Shortcuts tab, select either Photo printing-borderless or Photo printing-with white borders.
3. Find the appropriate drop-down list:

| Tab | Drop-down list |

| Printing Shortcuts | Paper type |
| Paper/Quality | Type is |

Note: You do not need to set the print quality on both tabs.
4. Select the appropriate photo paper type in the drop-down list.
5. Click Maximum dpi in the Print quality drop-down list.

Note: The Maximum dpi setting temporarily uses a lot of disk space and may print slowly.
6. Select any other print settings that you want, and then click OK.

### 6.1.5 Exif Print

Exif Print (Exchangeable Image File Format 2.2) is an international digital imaging standard that simplifies digital photography and enhances printed photographs. When a photograph is taken with an Exif Print-enabled digital camera, Exif Print captures information such as exposure time, type of flash, and color saturation, and stores it in the image file. The HP Deskjet printer software then uses this information to automatically perform image specific enhancements, to create outstanding photographs.

Printing Exif Print-enhanced photos requires the following equipment:

- A digital camera that supports Exif Print
- Exif Print-enabled photo software

Follow these steps to print Exif Print-enhanced photos:

1. Open the file that you want the Exif Print-enabled photo software to print.
2. Open the Printer Properties dialog box.
3. Click the Printing Shortcuts tab or the Paper/Quality tab.

Note: On the Printing Shortcuts tab, select either Photo printing-borderless or Photo printing-with white borders.
4. Click Normal or Best in the Print quality drop-down list.
5. Select any other print settings that you want, and then click OK.

The printer software automatically optimizes the printed image.

### 6.1.6 Printing borderless photos

Use borderless printing to print to the edges of certain paper types and on a range of standard and custom paper sizes from $101 \times 152 \mathrm{~mm}$ ( $4 \times 6 \mathrm{in}$ ) photo paper to a $210 \times 594 \mathrm{~mm}$ ( $8.5 \times 23.4 \mathrm{in}$ ) custom photo size.

## Guidelines

- Do not print borderless documents in ink-backup mode. Always have two print cartridges installed in the printer.
- Open the file in a software application and assign the image size. Ensure that the size corresponds to the paper size on which you want to print the image.


## Printing

1. Open the file that you want to print.
2. Open the Printer Properties dialog box.
3. On the Printing Shortcuts tab, click Photo printing-borderless in the drop-down list.

4. Select the appropriate print setting for the photo that you want to print.
5. If you want to use them, set the HP digital photography options.
6. Select any other print settings that you want, and then click OK.

If you printed on photo paper that has a tear-off tab, remove the tab to make the document completely borderless.


### 6.1.7 Photo print cartridge

The photo print cartridge, used in conjunction with the tri-color print cartridge, provides six-ink, virtually grain-free photos that have exceptional fade resistance.


The photo print cartridge can be purchased separately if it is not included with your product.

## Installing the photo print cartridge

To install the photo print cartridge, remove the black print cartridge from the printer, and then install the photo print cartridge in the compartment on the right of the print cartridge cradle.

## Using the photo print cartridge

Follow these steps to print in six-ink color print mode:

The Advanced color settings dialog box appears.

### 6.1.9 Color management

Color management defines the range of colors that can be printed. The printer software translates the colors of your document from their current color settings to the color-management option that is selected.

Follow these steps to select a color-management option:

3. Click one of the following options in the Color management drop-down list:

- ColorSmart/sRGB : ColorSmart/sRGB is an appropriate option for most print jobs. It is used for most Web-based documents and current imaging devices.
- AdobeRGB : When printing from a professional application with AdobeRGB, turn off the color management in the application and allow the printer software to manage the color space. Use the AdobeRGB setting for documents or photos that were originally created in the AdobeRGB color space.
- Managed by application : This option allows the application from which you are printing manage the color of the document.

4. Select any other print settings that you want, and then click OK.

### 6.1.11 Printing black-and white-photos

To print a photo that is already black and white, simply follow the instructions for the type and size of photo that you want to print.

### 6.1.12 Storing and handling photo paper

Follow these instructions to maintain the quality of your HP brand photo paper.

## Storage

- Keep unused photo paper in a resealable plastic bag, in the box in which it was originally packaged. Store the packaged photo paper on a flat surface in a cool place.
- When you are ready to print, remove only the paper that you plan to use immediately from the plastic bag. When you have finished printing, return any unused photo paper to the plastic bag.
- Do not leave unused photo paper in the printer paper tray. The paper might start to curl, which can reduce the quality of your photographs.


## Handling

- Always hold photo paper by its edges. Fingerprints on photo paper can reduce print quality.
- If the corners of the photo paper curl more than $10 \mathrm{~mm}(3 / 8 \mathrm{inch})$, flatten the paper by putting it in the resealable storage bag, and then rolling the bag on a table edge until the paper is flat.

Photo paper should be flat before it is printed on.

6. Slide the paper guides firmly against the edge of the sheets.
7. Lower the Out tray.

## Printing

Note: If your software program includes a label printing feature, follow the instructions that are provided with the software program. Otherwise, follow the instructions below.

1. Open the Printer Properties dialog box.
2. On the Printing Shortcuts tab, click General everyday printing , and then specify the following print settings:

- Paper size : The appropriate paper size
- Paper type : Automatic or Plain paper
- Paper source : Upper tray

3. Select the following print settings as appropriate:

- Print quality
- Grayscale printing

4. Select any other print settings that you want, and then click OK.

Use the What's This? help to learn about the features that you see in the Printer Properties dialog box.

### 6.2.10 Index cards and other small media (HP Deskjet 6540-50 series)

## Guidelines

- Use only cards and small media that meet the printer paper-size specifications. For specifications, see the reference guide that came with the printer.
- Do not exceed the In-tray capacity: up to 60 cards.


## Preparing to print

1. Verify that the printer is turned on.
2. Remove the Out tray, then remove all paper from the In tray.
3. Slide the paper-width guide all the way to the left, then pull out the paper-length guide.
4. Place the cards, with the sides to be printed on facing down and one of the short sides pointing towards the printer, into In tray and to the right. Push the cards into the printer until they stop.

5. Slide the paper guides firmly against the cards.
6. Replace the Out tray.

## Printing

1. Open the Printer Properties dialog box.
2. Click the Paper/Quality tab, and then specify the following print settings:

- Size is : The appropriate paper size
- Type is : The appropriate paper type
- Source is : Upper tray

3. Select any other print settings that you want, and then click OK.

Use the What's This? help to learn about the features that you see in the Printer Properties dialog box.

### 6.2.11 Booklets (HP Deskjet 6540-50 series)



If an optional two-sided printing accessory is attached to the printer, then follow the steps to print a booklet automatically.

Booklet printing automatically arranges and resizes the pages of a document so that when the pages are folded into a booklet, the page order is correct.


## Guidelines

Do not exceed the In-tray capacity: up to 150 sheets.

## Preparing to print

1. Verify that the printer is turned on.
2. Raise the Out tray.
3. Slide the paper-width guide all the way to the left, and then pull out the paperlength guide.
4. Place plain paper in the In tray, pushing the paper into the printer until it stops.
5. Slide the paper guides firmly against the paper.

6. Lower the Out tray.

## Printing

1. Open the Printer Properties dialog box.
2. Select the Printing Shortcuts tab, and then click Two-sided, duplex, printing in the drop-down list.
3. In the Print on both sides drop-down list, click one of the following binding options:

- Left edge booklet
- Right edge booklet

4. Select any other print settings that you want, and then click OK.
5. When prompted, reload the printed pages in the In tray as shown below.

6. Click Continue to finish printing the booklet.

Use the What's This? help to learn about the features that you see in the Printer Properties dialog box.

### 6.2.12 Posters (HP Deskjet 6540-50 series)

## Guidelines

- After the sections of a poster have been printed, trim the edges of the sheets, and then tape the sheets together.

- Do not exceed the In-tray capacity: up to 150 sheets.


## Preparing to print

1. Verify that the printer is turned on.
2. Raise the Out tray.
3. Slide the paper-width guide all the way to the left, and then pull out the paperlength guide.
4. Place plain paper in the In tray, pushing the paper into the printer until it stops.
5. Slide the paper guides firmly against the paper.

6. Lower the Out tray.

## Printing

1. Open the Printer Properties dialog box.
2. Click the Paper/Quality tab, and then specify the following print settings:

- Size is : The appropriate size
- Source is: Upper tray
- Type is : Automatic or Plain paper

3. Click the Finishing tab, and then specify the following print settings:

- Poster printing : $2 \times 2,4$ sheets, $3 \times 3,9$ sheets, $4 \times 4$, 16 sheets, or $5 \times$ 5, 25 sheets

4. Click the Basics tab, and then specify the following print settings:

- Orientation : The appropriate orientation

5. Select any other print settings that you want, and then click OK.

Use the What's This? help to learn about the features that you see in the Printer Properties dialog box.

### 6.2.13 Banners (HP Deskjet 6540-50 series)

## Guidelines

- Use HP Banner Paper for great results.
- Remove any perforated strips from the banner paper before loading it in the In tray.

- Do not exceed the In-tray capacity: up to 20 sheets.


## Preparing to print

1. Verify that the printer is turned on.
2. Remove the Out tray, and then remove all paper from the In tray.
3. Slide the paper width-guide all the way to the left, and then pull out the paperlength guide.
4. Place the banner paper in the In tray so that the unattached edge is on top of the paper stack and pointing toward the printer.

5. Unattached edge
6. Slide the paper-width guide firmly against the paper.

Note: Leave the Out tray off of the printer when printing a banner.

## Printing

1. Open the Printer Properties dialog box.
2. Click the Paper/Quality tab, and then specify the following print settings:

- Size is : Letter or A4
- Source is: Upper tray
- Type is : HP Banner Paper

3. Select any other print settings that you want, and then click OK.

Use the What's This? help to learn about the features that you see in the Printer Properties dialog box.

### 6.2.14 Iron-on transfers (HP Deskjet 6540-50 series)

## Guidelines

- Use HP Iron-on Transfers for great results.
- When printing a mirror image, the text and the pictures are horizontally reversed from what appears on the computer screen.

- Do not exceed the In tray capacity: Up to 20 sheets.


## Preparing to print

1. Verify that the printer is turned on.
2. Raise the Out tray.
3. Slide the paper-width guide all the way to the left, and then pull out the paperlength guide.
4. Place iron-on transfer paper with the side to be printed on facing down in the In tray.
5. Push the paper into the printer until it stops.
6. Slide the paper guides firmly against the paper.

7. Lower the Out tray.

## Printing

Note: If your software program includes an iron-on transfer printing feature, follow the instructions that are provided with the software program. Otherwise, follow the instructions below. Also, some iron-on transfer paper types do not require you to print a mirror image.

1. Open the Printer Properties dialog box.
2. Click the Paper/Quality tab, and then specify the following print settings:

- Size is : The appropriate paper size
- Source is : Upper Tray
- Type is : HP Iron-on Transfer
- Print Quality : Normal or Best

3. Click the Basics tab, and then specify the following print settings:

- Orientation : Mirror Image (if required for the paper type you are using)

4. Select any other print settings that you want, and then click OK.

Use the What's This? help to learn about the features that you see in the Printer Properties dialog box.

### 6.3 Printing tips (HP Deskjet 6540-50 series)

Save time

- Use the Printing Shortcuts tab.
- Create print task quick sets for documents you print often.
- Use the 250-Sheet Plain Paper Tray Accessory to reload the printer less often.
- Use the Print Quality Selector.
- Set the printer default settings for options that you use often.
- Print from front to back.
- Print collated copies.


## Same money

- Use Fast/economical printing.
- Print a two-sided document either automatically or manually.
- Print multiple pages on a single sheet of paper.
- Use HP Everyday Photo Paper, Semi-gloss to save money and ink when printing photos.

Enhance the quality of printouts

- Preview the document before printing it.
- Select the right paper type.
- Select the right print quality.
- Resize the document as needed.
- Add a watermark.
- Print a borderless brochure.
- Print the first page of a document on a different paper type.
- Print on a custom paper size.


### 6.3.1 Printing shortcuts

The Printing Shortcuts tab makes it easy to set the printing options for the documents that you want to print.


Use the Printing Shortcuts tab for the following print tasks:

- General everyday printing
- Photo printing-borderless
- Photo printing-with white borders
- Two-sided, duplex, printing
- Presentation printing
- Fast/economical printing
- Postcard printing


### 6.3.2 Fast/economical printing

Use Fast/economical printing to produce draft-quality printouts quickly.

Follow these steps to use Fast/economical printing:

1. Open the Printer Properties dialog box.
2. On the Printing Shortcuts tab, select Fast/economical printing from the dropdown list.
3. Specify the printing settings as desired.
4. After specifying the print settings, click OK

Use the What's This? help to learn about the features that you see in the Printer Properties dialog box.

### 6.3.3 Print task quick sets

Use print task quick sets to print with or save print settings that you use often.
For example, if you frequently print on envelopes, you can create a print task that contains the paper size, print quality, and orientation setting that you normally use for envelopes. After creating the print task, simply select it when printing on envelopes rather than setting each of the print settings separately.

Create your own print task or use the specially designed print tasks that are available in the Print Task Quick Sets drop-down list.

## Using a print task quick set

Follow these steps to use a print task quick set:

1. Open the Printer Properties dialog box.
2. Select the print task that you want to use from the drop-down list.

3. Click OK.

Note: To restore default print settings, click Default print settings in the Print Task Quick Sets drop-down list, and click OK.

## Creating a print task quick set

Follow these steps to create a print task quick set:
Note: The printer software can save up to 25 print task quick sets.

1. Open the Printer Properties dialog box.
2. Select the options that you want to include in the new print task.
3. Type a name for the new print task in the Print Task Quick Sets drop-down list, and then click Save.

The print task quick set is added to the drop-down list.
Note: If you add more options to the print task, you must rename the print task, and then click OK.

## Deleting a print task quick set

Follow these steps to delete a print task quick set:

1. Open the Printer Properties dialog box.
2. Select the print task that you want to delete from the drop-down list, and then click Delete.

Note: Some print task quick sets cannot be deleted.

### 6.3.4 Manual two-sided printing (HP Deskjet 6540-50 series)

If an optional two-sided printing accessory is
 attached to the printer, then follow the automatic two-sided printing instructions.

## Binding type

Select the type of binding that you want for the two-sided document, and then follow the steps for that binding:


Book binding Tablet binding

Note: Book binding is the most common type of binding.

## Book binding

Follow these steps to print a two-sided document with a book binding:

1. Open the Printer Properties dialog box.
2. Click the Printing Shortcuts tab, and then click Two-sided, duplex, printing.

3. In the Print on both sides drop-down list, click Manually.
4. Select any other print settings that you want, and then click OK.

The printer prints the odd-numbered pages first.
5. After the odd-numbered pages have been printed, reload the printed pages, with the printed side facing up.

6. Click Continue to print the even-numbered pages.

## Tablet binding

Follow these steps to print a two-sided document with a tablet binding:

1. Open the Printer Properties dialog box.
2. Click the Finishing tab.

3. Select the Print on both sides check box.
4. Select the Preserve layout check box.
5. Select the Flip pages up check box.
6. Select any other print settings that you want, and then click OK.

The printer prints the odd-numbered pages first.
7. After the odd-numbered pages have been printed, reload the printed pages, with the printed side facing up according to the document's orientation:

- Portrait

- Landscape


8. Click Continue to print the even-numbered pages.

### 6.3.5 Automatic two-sided printing

To print a two-sided document automatically, one of the following accessories must be attached to the printer:

Automatic Two-Sided Printing Accessory


Auto Two-Sided Print Accessory with Small Paper Tray

The two-sided printing accessories only support certain paper types. For a list of supported paper types, see the documentation that came with the accessory.

If a two-sided printing accessory is not attached to the printer or you are printing on an unsupported paper type, use manual two-sided printing.

## Binding type

Select the type of binding that you want for the two-sided document, and then follow the steps for that binding:


Note: Book binding is the most common type of binding.

## Book binding

Follow these steps to print a two-sided document with a book binding:

1. Open the Printer Properties dialog box.
2. Click the Printing Shortcuts tab, and then click Two-sided, duplex, printing in the drop-down list.

3. In the Print on both sides drop-down list, click Automatically.
4. Select any other print settings that you want, and then click OK.

After the first side of the page is printed, the printer pauses while the ink dries. When the ink is dry, the paper is pulled back into the duplexer and the reverse side of the page is printed.

Do not remove the paper from the printer until both sides of the page have been printed.

## Tablet binding

Follow these steps to print a two-sided document with a tablet binding:

1. Open the Printer Properties dialog box.
2. Click the Finishing tab.

3. Select the Print on both sides check box.
4. Select the Automatic check box.
5. Select the Preserve layout check box.
6. Select the Flip pages up check box.
7. Select any other print settings that you want, and then click OK.

After the first side of the page is printed, the printer pauses while the ink dries. When the ink is dry, the paper is pulled back into the duplexer and the reverse side of the page is printed.

Do not remove the paper from the printer until both sides of the page have been printed.

### 6.3.6 Using the Print Quality Selector (HP Deskjet 6540-50 series)

The Print Quality Selector button is located on the front of the printer.


1. Print Quality Selector button

## Enabling the Print Quality Selector button

Before using the Print Quality Selector button, you must enable it from the printer software.

Follow these steps to enable the Print Quality Selector button:

1. Open the Printer Properties dialog box.
2. Click the Printing Shortcuts tab or the Paper/Quality tab.
3. Click Use printer default in the Print quality drop-down list.

Note: Depending on the type of document that you are printing, the Use Printer Default option might not be available on the Printing Shortcuts tab.
4. Click OK.

## Using the Print Quality Selector button

Use the Print Quality Selector button to specify the print quality for documents that you plan to print. You cannot change the print quality for a document after the document begins printing.

Follow these steps to use the Print Quality Selector button:

1. Verify that the Print Quality Selector button is enabled from the printer software.
2. Press the Print Quality Selector button to select one of the following print qualities:


Note: FastDraft and Maximum dpi can only be selected in the printer software. If a document is printed in either FastDraft or Maximum dpi mode, the currently selected print-quality icon flashes until the document is complete.

## Lights

The Print Quality Selector icons light up or flash to indicate the selected print quality:

| Status of the icons | Meaning |
| :--- | :--- |
| One icon is lit. | The illuminated icon is the selected print <br> quality. |
| One icon is lit and another flashes. | The illuminated icon is the selected print <br> quality for the current print job. <br> The flashing icon is the selected print quality <br> for the next print job. |
| One icon flashes. | Either FastDraft or Maximum dpi has been <br> selected as the print quality from the printer <br> software. |

### 6.3.7 Using the 250-Sheet Plain Paper Tray Accessory

If the 250-Sheet Plain Paper Tray Accessory is not installed on the printer, follow the installation steps.

Note: The 250-Sheet Plain Paper Tray Accessory is not available in all countries/ regions.

Follow these steps to use the 250-Sheet Plain Paper Tray Accessory:

1. Open the Printer Properties dialog box.
2. Click the Printing Shortcuts tab or the Paper/Quality tab.
3. Find the appropriate drop-down list:

| Tab | Drop-down list |
| :--- | :--- |
| Printing Shortcuts | Paper source |
| Paper/Quality | Source is |

Note: You do not need to set the paper source on both tabs.
4. Select one of the following options in the drop-down list:

- Upper tray : prints from the In tray.
- Lower tray : prints from the 250-Sheet Plain Paper Tray Accessory.
- Upper, then lower : prints from the In tray. If the In tray is empty, the printer prints from the 250-Sheet Plain Paper Tray Accessory.
- Lower, then upper : prints from the 250-Sheet Plain Paper Tray Accessory. If the accessory is empty, the printer prints from the In tray.


### 6.3.8 Printing in grayscale

For instructions about printing black-and-white photos, see the black-and-white photo printing page.

Follow these steps to print in grayscale:

1. Open the Printer Properties dialog box.
2. Click the Printing Shortcuts tab, and then click either Presentation printing or Fast/economical printing.
3. In the Print in grayscale drop-down list, click one of the following:

- High quality : Use this option for high-quality printouts.
- Black only : Use this option for fast, economical printing.

4. Select any other print settings that you want, and then click OK.

### 6.3.9 Printing multiple pages on a single sheet of paper

Use printer software to print multiple pages of a document on a single sheet of paper. The printer software automatically resizes the document text and images to fit on the printed page.

Follow these steps to print multiple pages of a document on a single sheet of paper:

1. Open the Printer Properties dialog box.
2. Click the Finishing tab.

3. In the Pages per sheet drop-down list, click the number of pages that you want to appear on each sheet of paper.
4. If you want a border to appear around each page image that is printed on the sheet of paper, select the Print page borders check box.
5. Select a layout for each sheet of paper from the Page order is drop-down list.
6. Select any other print settings that you want, and then click OK.

### 6.3.10 Setting the printer default settings

The printer uses the default settings for all documents unless you open the Printer Properties dialog box and specify other settings.

To save time when printing, set the printer default settings to options that you use often. That way, you do not have to specify the options every time you use the printer.

Follow these steps to change the printer default settings:

1. Click the printer task tray icon.

2. Printer task tray icon

The Printer Properties dialog box appears.
2. Select the options that you want to use as the default settings.
3. Click OK.

A dialog box appears stating that the new settings will be used every time you print. If you do not want to see this dialog box again, select Don't show me this message again.
4. Click OK to save the new default print settings.

## Print Quality Selector (HP Deskjet 6540-50 series)

For the HP Deskjet 6540-50 series printer, you can set the default print quality from the printer by using the Print Quality Selector.

### 6.3.11 Setting the page order

Setting the page order determines the order in which your document will be printed. Frequently, it is convenient to have the first page of a document printed last so that the complete document is lying face-up in the Out tray.

Follow these steps to set the page order:

1. Open the Printer Properties dialog box.
2. Click the Basics tab.

3. Select one of the following options:

- Front to back : Prints the first page of the document last. This is the appropriate setting for most print jobs.
- Back to front : Prints the last page of the document last. This setting is required when printing the first page of a document on a different paper type.

4. Select any other print settings that you want, and then click OK.

Use the What's This? help to learn about the features that you see in the Printer Properties dialog box.

### 6.3.12 Printing collated copies

If you are printing several copies of a document at one time, use collation so that you do not have to re-arrange the copies after printing.

Note: Some software programs do not allow you use the printer software to specify the number of copies to print. If the program that you are using allows you to specify the number of copies to print, then specify the number of copies to print in the application.

Follow these steps to print collated copies:

1. Open the Printer Properties dialog box.
2. Click the Basics tab.

3. Type the number of copies that you want to print in the Copy count box.
4. Select the Collate check box.
5. Select any other print settings that you want, and then click OK.

### 6.3.13 Print preview

To save time and money when printing, preview the document on your computer before printing it. If the print preview does not look the way that you want it to, close the preview window and make the necessary adjustments to your document.

Follow these steps view a preview of a document:

1. Open the Printer Properties dialog box.
2. Click the Basics tab.

3. Select the Show print preview check box.
4. Select any other print settings that you want, and then click OK.

Before the document prints, a preview appears.
5. Do one of the following:

- Click File, and then click Print to HP Deskjet to print the document.
- Click File , and then click Cancel Printing to cancel the print job. Adjust the print settings as needed before trying to print the document again.


### 6.3.14 Selecting a paper type

## Using the Automatic Paper-Type Sensor

The Automatic Paper-Type Sensor automatically selects the print settings that are appropriate for the media that you are printing on, particularly when used with HP paper and media.

Note: The Automatic Paper-Type Sensor cannot be used for documents that are printed from the 250-Sheet Plain Paper Tray Accessory.

Follow these steps to use the Automatic Paper-Type Sensor:

1. Open the Printer Properties dialog box.
2. Click the Printing Shortcuts tab or the Paper/Quality tab.
3. Find the appropriate drop-down list:

| Tab | Drop-down list |
| :--- | :--- |
| Printing Shortcuts | Paper type |
| Paper/Quality | Type is |

Note: You do not need to set the paper type on both tabs.
4. Click Automatic in the drop-down list.
5. Select any other print settings that you want, and then click OK.

## Selecting a specific paper type

When printing a higher-quality document, it is recommended that you select a specific paper type.

Follow these steps to select a specific paper type:

1. Open the Printer Properties dialog box.
2. Click the Printing Shortcuts tab or the Paper/Quality tab.
3. Find the appropriate drop-down list:

| Tab | Drop-down list |
| :--- | :--- |
| Printing Shortcuts | Paper type |
| Paper/Quality | Type is |

Note: You do not need to set the paper type on both tabs.
4. Click the paper type in the drop-down list.
5. Select any other print settings that you want, and then click OK.

### 6.3.15 Selecting a print quality (HP Deskjet 6540-50 series)

Follow these steps to select a print quality:

1. Open the Printer Properties dialog box.
2. Click the Printing Shortcuts tab or the Paper/Quality tab.
3. Select one of the following from the Print quality drop-down list:

Note: The print quality options that are available on the Printing Shortcuts tab vary depending on the type of document you are printing.

- Use printer default : enables the Print Quality Selector button.
- FastDraft : prints at the fastest printing speed.
- Fast normal : prints more quickly than the Normal mode and at a higher print quality than FastDraft.
- Normal : provides the best balance between print quality and speed. This is the appropriate setting for most documents.
- Best : provides high-quality printing.
- Maximum dpi : provides the highest quality printing but requires longer to print than Best and requires a large amount of disk space.


### 6.3.16 Resizing a document

Use the printer software for either of these tasks:

- Print a document on a paper size different from the size for which it is formatted.
- Shrink or enlarge text and graphics on the printed page.


## Printing on different paper size

Use this feature to print a document that is formatted for one paper size on another paper size. Doing this can be useful if you do not have the correct paper size available.

For example, if you have created a document that is formatted for letter-size paper, but you do not have any letter-size paper available, you can print the document on another paper size that is available.

Follow these steps to resize the document for a different paper size:

1. Open the Printer Properties dialog box.
2. Click the Effects tab.

3. Click Print document on , and then select the target paper size from the dropdown list.

The target paper size is the size of the paper on which you are printing, not the size for which the document was formatted.
4. Do one of the following:

| Objective | Action |
| :--- | :--- |
| Shrink or enlarge the document to fit on the target <br> paper size. | Click Scale to fit. |
| Print the document at its original size on the selected <br> paper size. | Do not click Scale to fit. |

5. Select any other print settings that you want, and then click OK.

## Shrinking or enlarging text and graphics

Use this feature to shrink or enlarge printed text and graphics without changing the paper size.

Follow these steps to shrink or enlarge text and graphics:

1. Open the Printer Properties dialog box.
2. Click the Effects tab.
3. In the \% of normal size box, type the percentage by which you want to shrink or enlarge the text and graphics.

One hundred percent represents the actual size of the text and graphics. Type a number less than 100 to shrink the text and graphics. Type a number greater than 100 to enlarge the text and graphics.
4. Select any other print settings that you want, and then click OK.

### 6.3.17 Watermarks

Watermarks appear as background printing on documents.

## Applying an existing watermark to a document

Follow these steps to apply an existing watermark to a document:

1. Open the Printer Properties dialog box.
2. Click the Effects tab.

3. Select a watermark from the Watermarks drop-down list.

If you do not want to use one of the listed watermarks, create a new watermark.
4. Make one of the following selections:

- If you want the watermark to appear on the first page only, click First page only.
- If you want the watermark to appear on all printed pages, leave First page only clear.

5. Print the document according to the instructions for the paper type.

## Creating or changing a watermark

Follow these steps to create or change a watermark:

1. Open the Printer Properties dialog box.
2. Click the Effects tab.
3. Click the Edit button.

The Watermark Details dialog box appears.

4. Make one of the following selections:

- Click the New button.
- Select an existing watermark to change.

5. Type the watermark message, message angle, and font attributes.
6. After you have set the watermark details, click OK.

For instructions about applying watermarks, follow the steps for applying an existing watermark to a document.

Use the What's This? help to learn about the features that you see in the Printer Properties dialog box.

### 6.3.18 Printing a borderless brochure

You can print a borderless brochure on glossy brochure paper.
For instructions about printing a borderless photo, see the borderless photo page.

## Guidelines

- Do not print borderless documents in ink-backup mode. Always have two print cartridges installed in the printer.
- Open the file in a software application and assign the image size. Ensure that the size corresponds to the paper size on which you want to print the image.


## Printing

Follow these steps to print a borderless document:

1. Open the file that you want to print.
2. Open the Printer Properties dialog box.
3. Click the Paper/Quality tab.

4. Select one of the borderless paper sizes in the Size is drop-down list. Verify that the paper size matches the size of the paper that is loaded in the In tray.
5. Verify that the Borderless Printing check box is selected.
6. Click the glossy brochure paper type in the Type is drop-down list.

Do not select Automatic.
7. Select any other print settings that you want, and then click OK.

### 6.3.19 Printing a different first page (HP Deskjet 6540-50 series)



If the 250-Sheet Plain Paper Tray Accessory is attached to the printer, follow the steps to print a different first page with the 250Sheet Plain Paper Tray Accessory.

## Load paper

1. Load the paper for the body of the document in the In tray.

For instructions about loading a specific paper type, go to the printing other documents page, and then select the appropriate document type.
2. Load the paper for the first page on top of the paper stack in the In tray.

## Printing

Follow these steps to print a document with a different first page:

1. Open the Printer Properties dialog box.
2. Click the Paper/Quality tab.
3. Select the Use different paper for check box.
4. Click First page.

5. Select the paper type and paper size for the first page.
6. Click Upper tray in the Source is box.
7. Click Other pages.

### 6.4.3 Device Status window

The Device Status window appears each time the printer prints a file.


The following items appear on the Device Status window :

1. Ink levels : approximate ink level of each print cartridge.
2. Device status : the status of the printer. For example, Spooling or Printing.
3. Document properties : information about the current print job:

- Document : name of the document that is currently printing.
- Print quality : print quality setting that is being used.
- Paper type : type of paper in use.
- Paper size : size of paper in use.

4. Ordering information : link to the HP Web site for ordering printer supplies and accessories.

If you do not want to see the Device Status window every time you print, select the Don't show this again check box.
To cancel a print job, click Cancel print.
To close the Device Status window, click Close window.

3. Slide the paper-width guide all the way to the left, then pull out the paper-length guide.
4. Place the transparencies in the In tray, with the side to be printed on facing down and the adhesive strip facing up and toward the printer.

5. Carefully push the transparencies into the printer until they stop so that none of the adhesive strips catch on one another.
6. Slide the paper guides firmly against the edge of the transparencies.
7. Lower the Out tray, then pull out the Out-tray extension.

## Printing

1. Open the Printer Properties dialog box.
2. On the Printing Shortcuts tab, click Presentation printing, and then specify the following print settings:

- Paper size : The appropriate paper size
- Paper type : Automatic or appropriate transparency film
- Paper source : Upper tray

3. Select the following print settings as appropriate:

- Print quality
- Grayscale printing

4. Select any other print settings that you want, and then click OK.

Use the What's This? help to learn about the features that you see in the Printer Properties dialog box.

### 7.2.9 Labels (HP Deskjet 6520 series)

## Guidelines

- Use only labels that are designed specifically for inkjet printers.
- Use only full sheets of labels.
- Verify that the labels are not sticky, wrinkled, or pulling away from the protective backing.
- Do not exceed the In-tray capacity: up to 30 sheets of labels (use only lettersize or A4-size sheets).


## Preparing to print

1. Verify that the printer is turned on.
2. Raise the Out tray, and then remove all paper from the In tray.
3. Slide the paper-width guide all the way to the left, and then pull out the paperlength guide.
4. Fan the edges of the label sheets to separate them, and then align the edges.
5. Place the label sheets in the In tray with the label side facing down. Push the sheets into the printer until they stop.

6. Slide the paper guides firmly against the edge of the sheets.
7. Lower the Out tray, then pull out the Out-tray extension.

## Printing

Note: If your software program includes a label printing feature, follow the instructions that are provided with the software program. Otherwise, follow the instructions below.

1. Open the Printer Properties dialog box.
2. On the Printing Shortcuts tab, select General everyday printing, and then specify the following print settings:

- Paper size : Appropriate paper size
- Paper type : Automatic or Plain paper
- Paper source : Upper tray

3. Select the following print settings as desired:

- Print quality
- Grayscale printing

4. After selecting the print settings, click OK .

Use the What's This? help to learn about the features that you see in the Printer Properties dialog box.

### 7.2.10 Index cards and other small media (HP Deskjet 6520 series)

## Guidelines

- Use only cards and small media that meet the printer paper-size specifications. For specifications, see the reference guide that came with the printer.
- Do not exceed the In-tray capacity: up to 60 cards.


## Preparing to print

1. Verify that the printer is turned on.
2. Raise the Out tray, then remove all paper from the In tray.
3. Slide the paper-width guide all the way to the left, then pull out the paper-length guide.
4. Place the cards, with the printable sides down and the short sides pointing towards the printer, in the right side of the In tray. Push the cards into the printer until they stop.

5. Slide the paper guides firmly against the cards.
6. Lower the Out tray.

## Printing

1. Open the Printer Properties dialog box.
2. Click the Paper/Quality tab, and then specify the following print settings:

- Size is : The appropriate paper size
- Type is : The appropriate paper type
- Source is : Upper tray

3. Select any other print settings that you want, and then click OK.

Use the What's This? help to learn about the features that you see in the Printer Properties dialog box.

### 7.2.11 Booklets (HP Deskjet 6520 series)

If an optional two-sided printing accessory is
 attached to the printer, then follow the steps to print a booklet automatically.

Booklet printing automatically arranges and resizes the pages of a document so that when the pages are folded into a booklet, the page order is correct.


## Guidelines

Do not exceed the In-tray capacity: up to 150 sheets.

## Preparing to print

1. Verify that the printer is turned on.
2. Raise the Out tray.
3. Slide the paper-width guide all the way to the left, and then pull the paper-length guide to the edge of the tray.
4. Place plain paper in the In tray, pushing the paper into the printer until it stops.

5. Slide the paper guides firmly against the paper.
6. Lower the Out tray, then pull out the Out-tray extension.

## Printing

1. Open the Printer Properties dialog box.
2. Select the Printing Shortcuts tab, and then click Two-sided, duplex, printing In the drop-down list.
3. In the Print on both sides drop-down list, click one of the following binding options:

- Left edge booklet
- Right edge booklet

4. Select any other print settings that you want, and then click OK.
5. When prompted, reload the paper in the In tray as shown below.

6. Click Continue to finish printing the booklet.

Use the What's This? help to learn about the features that you see in the Printer Properties dialog box.

### 7.2.12 Posters (HP Deskjet 6520 series)

## Guidelines

- After the sections of a poster have been printed, trim the edges of the sheets, and then tape the sheets together.

- Do not exceed the In-tray capacity: up to 150 sheets.


## Preparing to print

1. Verify that the printer is turned on.
2. Raise the Out tray.
3. Slide the paper-width guide all the way to the left, and then pull the paper-length guide to the edge of the tray.
4. Place plain paper in the In tray, pushing the paper into the printer until it stops.

5. Slide the paper guides firmly against the paper.
6. Lower the Out tray, then pull out the Out-tray extension.

Printing

1. Open the Printer Properties dialog box.
2. Click the Paper/Quality tab, and then specify the following print settings:

- Size is : The appropriate size
- Source is : Upper tray
- Type is : Automatic or Plain paper

3. Click the Finishing tab, and then specify the following print settings:

- Poster printing : $2 \times 2,4$ sheets, $3 \times 3,9$ sheets, $4 \times 4$, 16 sheets, or $5 \times$ 5, 25 sheets

4. Click the Basics tab, and then specify the following print settings:

- Orientation : The appropriate orientation

5. Select any other print settings that you want, and then click OK.

Use the What's This? help to learn about the features that you see in the Printer Properties dialog box.

### 7.2.13 Banners (HP Deskjet 6520 series)

## Guidelines

- Use HP Banner Paper for great results.
- Remove any perforated strips from the banner paper before loading it in the In tray.

- Do not exceed the In-tray capacity: up to 20 sheets.


## Preparing to print

1. Verify that the printer is turned on.
2. Raise the Out tray, and then remove all paper from the In tray.
3. Slide the paper-width guide all the way to the left, and then pull out the paperlength guide.
4. Place the banner paper in the In tray so that the unattached edge is on top of the paper stack and pointing toward the printer.

5. Unattached edge
6. Slide the paper-width guide firmly against the paper.
7. Lower the Out tray.

Do not unfold the Out-tray extension stop.

## Printing

1. Open the Printer Properties dialog box.
2. Click the Paper/Quality tab, and then specify the following print settings:

- Size is : Letter or A4
- Source is: Upper tray
- Type is : HP Banner Paper

3. Select any other print settings that you want, and then click OK.

Use the What's This? help to learn about the features that you see in the Printer Properties dialog box.

### 7.2.14 Iron-on transfers (HP Deskjet 6520 series)

## Guidelines

- Use HP Iron-on Transfers for great results.
- When printing a mirror image, the text and the pictures are horizontally reversed from what appears on the computer screen.

- Do not exceed the In tray capacity: Up to 20 sheets.


## Preparing to print

1. Verify that the printer is turned on.
2. Raise the Out tray.
3. Slide the paper-width guide all the way to the left, and then pull the paper-length guide to the edge of the tray.
4. Place iron-on transfer paper with the side to be printed on facing down in the In tray.
5. Push the paper into the printer until it stops.
6. Slide the paper guides firmly against the paper.

7. Lower the Out tray, then pull out the Out-tray extension.

## Printing

Note: If your software program includes an iron-on transfer printing feature, follow the instructions that are provided with the software program. Otherwise, follow the instructions below. Also, some iron-on transfer paper types do not require you to print a mirror image.

1. Open the Printer Properties dialog box.
2. Click the Paper/Quality tab, and then specify the following print settings:

- Size is : The appropriate paper size
- Source is : Upper Tray
- Type is : HP Iron-on Transfer
- Print Quality : Normal or Best

3. Click the Basics tab, and then specify the following print settings:

- Orientation : Mirror Image (if required for the paper type you are using)

4. Select any other print settings that you want, and then click OK.

Use the What's This? help to learn about the features that you see in the Printer Properties dialog box.

### 7.3 Printing tips (HP Deskjet 6520 series)

Save time and money

- Use the Printing Shortcuts tab.
- Create print task quick sets for documents you print often.
- Use the 250-Sheet Plain Paper Tray Accessory to reload the printer less often.
- Set the printer default settings for options that you use often.
- Print from front to back.
- Print collated copies.


## Save money

- Use Fast/economical printing.
- Print a two-sided document either manually or automatically.
- Print multiple pages on a single sheet of paper.
- Use HP Everyday Photo Paper, Semi-gloss to save money and ink when printing photos.

Enhance the quality of printouts

- Preview the document before printing it.
- Select the right paper type.
- Select the right print quality.
- Resize the document as needed.
- Add a watermark.

- Print the first page of a document on a different paper type.

### 7.3.1 Manual two-sided printing (HP Deskjet 6520 series)

If an optional two-sided printing accessory is attached to the printer, then follow the automatic two-sided printing instructions.

## Binding type

Select the type of binding that you want for the two-sided document, and then follow the steps for that binding:


Book binding Tablet binding

Note: Book binding is the most common type of binding.

## Book binding

Follow these steps to print a two-sided document with a book binding:

1. Open the Printer Properties dialog box.
2. Click the Printing Shortcuts tab, and then click Two-sided, duplex, printing.

3. In the Print on both sides drop-down list, click Manually.
4. Select any other print settings that you want, and then click OK.

The printer prints the odd-numbered pages first.
5. After the odd-numbered pages have been printed, reload the printed pages, with the printed side facing up.

6. Click Continue to print the even-numbered pages.

## Tablet binding

Follow these steps to print a two-sided document with a tablet binding:

1. Open the Printer Properties dialog box.
2. Click the Finishing tab.

3. Select the Print on both sides check box.
4. Select the Preserve layout check box.
5. Select the Flip pages up check box.
6. Select any other print settings that you want, and then click OK.

The printer prints the odd-numbered pages first.
7. After the odd-numbered pages have been printed, reload the printed pages, with the printed side facing up according to the document's orientation:

- Portrait

- Landscape


8. Click Continue to print the even-numbered pages.

### 7.3.2 Selecting a print quality (HP Deskjet 6520 series)

Follow these steps to select a print quality:

1. Open the Printer Properties dialog box.
2. Click the Printing Shortcuts tab or the Paper/Quality tab.
3. Select one of the following from the Print quality drop-down list:

Note: The print quality options that are available on the Printing Shortcuts tab vary depending on the type of document you are printing.

- Use printer default : prints in the Normal mode.
- FastDraft : prints at the fastest printing speed.
- Fast normal : prints more quickly than the Normal mode and at a higher print quality than FastDraft.
- Normal : provides the best balance between print quality and speed. This is the appropriate setting for most documents.
- Best : provides high-quality printing.
- Maximum dpi : provides the highest quality printing but requires longer to print than Best and requires a large amount of disk space.


### 7.3.3 Printing a different first page (HP Deskjet 6520 series)

If the 250-Sheet Plain Paper Tray Accessory is attached to the printer, follow the steps to print a different first page with the 250Sheet Plain Paper Tray Accessory.

## Load paper

1. Load the paper for the body of the document in the In tray.

For instructions about loading a specific paper type, go to the printing other documents page, and then select the appropriate document type.
2. Load the paper for the first page on top of the paper stack in the In tray.

## Printing

Follow these steps to print a document with a different first page:

1. Open the Printer Properties dialog box.
2. Click the Paper/Quality tab.
3. Select the Use different paper for check box.
4. Click First page.

5. Select the paper type and paper size for the first page.
6. Click Upper tray in the Source is box.
7. Click Other pages.

8. Click Upper tray in the Source is box.
9. Select the paper type for the other pages in the Type is drop-down list.
10. Select any other print settings that you want, and then click OK.

Note: Do not print the document in reverse order.

### 7.3.4 Selecting a paper source (HP Deskjet 6520 series)

The printer offers three sources for paper:

| Paper/Quality | Source is |

Select any other print settings that you want, and then click OK.
4. Select one of the following options in the drop-down list:

- Upper tray : prints from the In tray.
- Lower tray : prints from the 250-Sheet Plain Paper Tray Accessory.
- Upper, then lower : prints from the In tray. If the In tray is empty, then the printer prints from the 250-Sheet Plain Paper Tray Accessory.
- Lower, then upper : prints from the 250-Sheet Plain Paper Tray Accessory. If the accessory is empty, then the printer prints from the In tray.
- Rear tray : prints from the Auto Two-Sided Print Accessory with Small Paper Tray. This option appears only if the accessory is attached to the printer.

### 8.1 Auto-off

Use the Auto-off feature to place the printer in a low-power, energy-efficient mode after it has been idle for 30 minutes. To turn on the printer, press the Power button.

Follow these steps to activate the Auto-off feature:

1. Open the printer Toolbox.
2. Click the Configuration tab.
3. Select the Activate the Hardware Auto-off feature check box.
4. Close the Printer Toolbox.

### 8.2 Installing print cartridges

## Print cartridges

## Print cartridge combinations

For printing most documents, use the tri-color print cartridge and the black print cartridge. When printing photos, you can use either the photo print cartridge or the gray photo print cartridge along with the tri-color print cartridge cradle.

Always install the tri-color print cartridge in the left print cartridge cradle compartment.

Install the black, photo, or gray photo print cartridge in the right print cartridge cradle compartment.

## Selection numbers

Before buying replacement print cartridges, verify the correct selection numbers in the reference guide that came with the printer.

You can also find the selection number on the print cartridge that you are replacing.


## Ink back-up mode

The printer can operate with only one print cartridge installed. For more information, see the ink back-up mode page.

## Installation instructions

Follow these steps so install a print cartridge:

1. Verify that the printer is turned on.
2. Load a stack of letter-size or A4-size plain, white paper in the In tray.
3. Open the printer cover.
4. Wait until the print cartridge cradle is idle and silent, and then lift the print cartridge latch to the open position.

5. Slide the print cartridge out of the print cartridge cradle.

6. Remove the replacement print cartridge from its packaging and carefully remove the pink, plastic tape.

7. Remove the pink tape only

Caution: Do not touch the print cartridge ink nozzles or copper contacts. Touching these parts will result in clogs, ink failure, and bad electrical connections. Do not remove the copper strips. They are required electrical contacts.


## 1. Do not touch the copper strips

7. Hold the print cartridge so that the copper strips are on the bottom and facing toward the printer, and then slide the print cartridge into the cradle as shown.

Note: After you insert the print cartridge, verify that the copper contacts of the print cartridge touch the back of the print cartridge cradle.

8. Push down on the print cartridge latch until it snaps closed.

9. Close the printer cover.

The printer automatically prints a calibration page.
For information about storing print cartridges, see the print cartridge storage page.
For information about recycling empty print cartridges, see the print cartridge recovery page.

Warning: Keep both new and used print cartridges out of the reach of children.

### 8.3 Aligning print cartridges

The printer automatically aligns the print cartridges after a new print cartridge is installed. You can also align the print cartridges at other times to ensure optimal print quality.

To align print cartridges:

1. Load letter-size or A4-size plain white paper in the In tray.
2. Open the printer Toolbox.
3. Click Align the Device.
4. Click Align, and then follow the onscreen instructions.

### 8.4 Calibrating color

Perform a color calibration only if the colors in photographs that are printed with the photo print cartridge and the tri-color print cartridge consistently look incorrect.

Before performing a color calibration, align the print cartridges, and then reprint your photograph. If the color is still incorrect, then perform a color calibration.

To calibrate color:

1. Load letter-size or A4-size plain white paper in the In tray.
2. Verify that a photo print cartridge and a tri-color print cartridge are installed in the printer.
3. Open the printer Toolbox.
4. Click Calibrate Color.
5. Click Calibrate , and then follow the onscreen instructions.

### 8.5 Automatically cleaning print cartridges

If your printed pages are missing lines or dots, or if they contain ink streaks, the print cartridges might be low on ink or might need to be cleaned.

If the print cartridges are not low on ink, follow these steps to clean the print cartridges automatically:

1. Open the printer Toolbox.
2. Click Clean Cartridges.
3. Click Clean, and then follow the onscreen instructions.

If your documents are still missing lines or dots after cleaning, replace the print cartridges.

Caution: Clean print cartridges only when necessary. Unnecessary cleaning wastes ink and shortens the life of the cartridge.

### 8.6 Manually cleaning the print cartridges

If the printer is used in a dusty environment, a small amount of debris can accumulate on the print cartridge contacts.

## Gathering cleaning supplies

You will need the following items to clean the print cartridges.

- Distilled water (tap water can contain contaminants that can damage the print cartridge)
- Cotton swabs or other soft, lint-free material that will not stick to the print cartridge

Be careful not to get ink on your hands or clothing as you clean.

## Preparing to clean

1. Press the Power button to turn on the printer, and then raise the printer cover.
2. Remove the print cartridges and place them on a piece of paper with the nozzle plate facing up.

3. Nozzle plate

$\Delta$
Caution: Do not leave the print cartridges outside the printer for more than 30 minutes.

## Cleaning instructions

1. Lightly moisten a cotton swab with distilled water and squeeze any excess water from the swab.
2. Wipe the print cartridge copper contacts with the cotton swab.

Caution: Do not touch the print cartridge ink nozzles. Touching the ink nozzles will result in clogs, ink failure, and bad electrical connections.


1. Clean only the copper contacts

Repeat this process until no ink residue or dust appears on the swab that you use to clean the contacts.
3. Insert the print cartridges in the printer, and then close the printer cover.

### 8.7 Printing a test page

Follow these steps to print a test page:

1. Open the printer Toolbox.
2. Click the Print a test page button, and then follow the onscreen instructions.

### 8.8 View estimated ink levels

Follow these steps to view the estimated ink levels of the print cartridges installed in the printer:

1. Open the printer Toolbox.
2. Click the Estimated Ink Level tab.

### 8.9 Removing ink from skin and clothing

Follow these instructions to remove ink from skin and clothing:

| Surface | Remedy |
| :--- | :--- |
| Skin | Wash the area with an abrasive soap. |
| White fabric | Wash the fabric in cold water and use chlorine bleach. |
| Color fabric | Wash the fabric in cold water and use sudsy ammonia. |

Caution: Always use cold water to remove ink from fabric. Warm or hot water can set the ink into the fabric.

### 8.10 Maintaining print cartridges

The following tips will help maintain HP print cartridges and ensure consistent print quality:

- Keep all print cartridges in their sealed packages until they are needed. Print cartridges should be stored at room temperature ( 15 to 35 degrees C or 59 to 95 degrees F).
- Do not remove the plastic tape covering the ink nozzles until you are ready to install the print cartridge in the printer. If the plastic tape has been removed from the print cartridge, do not attempt to reattach it. Reattaching the tape damages the print cartridge.


## Storing print cartridges

When print cartridges are removed from the printer, store them in a print cartridge protector or an airtight plastic container.

A print cartridge protector comes with the photo print cartridge and the gray photo print cartridge. If you store the print cartridge in an airtight plastic container, make sure that the ink nozzles face down but are not in contact with the container.

Inserting the print cartridge into the print cartridge protector
Slide the print cartridge at a slight angle into the protector, and snap it securely in place.


Removing the print cartridge from the print cartridge protector
Press down and back on the top of the protector to release the cartridge. Slide the cartridge out of the protector.


Caution: Do not drop the print cartridge. Dropping the print cartridge can damage it.

### 8.11 Maintaining the printer body

Because the printer ejects ink onto the paper in a fine mist, ink smudges will eventually appear on the printer case and adjacent surfaces. To remove smudges, stains, and/or dried ink from the exterior of the printer, use a soft cloth moistened with water.

When cleaning your printer, keep these tips in mind:

- Do not clean the interior of the printer. Keep all fluids away from the interior.
- Do not use household cleaners or detergent. In the event that a household cleaner or detergent is used on the printer, wipe the printer's exterior surfaces with a soft cloth moistened with water.
- Do not lubricate the support rod that the print cartridge cradle uses to slide back and forth. Noise is normal when the cradle moves back and forth.


### 8.12 Printer toolbox

The printer Toolbox contains a number of useful tools to enhance the printer performance.

Use the printer tools to perform the following tasks:

- Set the Auto-off function
- Clean the print cartridges
- Align the print cartridges
- Calibrate color
- Print a test page
- View estimated ink levels

To use the tools, open the Printer Properties dialog box, click the Services tab, and then click the Service this device button.

- Printer is not printing
- Paper jam
- Paper problems
- Print quality is poor
- Document is misprinted
- Photos are not printing correctly

- Document prints slowly
- If you continue to have problems


### 9.1 Printer is not printing

## Verify the following

- The printer is connected to the power source.
- The cable connections are secure.
- The printer is turned on.
- The print cartridges are correctly installed.
- The paper or other media is correctly loaded in the In tray.
- The printer cover is closed.
- The rear access door or optional duplexer is attached.


## Check the printer lights

The printer lights indicate the printer status and alert you to potential problems.
For more information, see printer lights are on or flashing.

## Check the printer cable connection

If the printer cable is attached to a USB hub, a printing conflict might exist. There are two methods for solving the conflict:

- Attach the printer USB cable directly to your computer.
- When printing, do not use other USB devices that are attached to the hub.


## Printing to the wrong USB port (HP Deskjet 6540-50 series)

If the computer is configured to use both the printer's back USB port and its front USB port, then you might be printing to the wrong port.

The computer has two versions of the printer driver: one for the front USB port and one for the back USB port. If you are connected to the back USB port but select the printer driver that is associated with the front USB port, the printer will not print.

Click File , and then click Print to open the Print dialog box. The Print dialog box displays two versions of the printer driver. Select the version that is associated with the port to which you are printing.

## If the printer still does not print

Select the topic below that best describes the problem:

- Paper jam
- Out of paper message
- Printer ejects paper


### 9.2 Paper jam

Do not clear a paper jam from the front of the printer.
Follow these steps to remove a paper jam:

1. Press the Resume button.

If the paper jam does not clear, then go to the next step.
2. Push the two latch handles on the rear access door toward each other, and then remove the door.

3. Remove any paper that is inside the printer by pulling it out from the back of the printer.

If you are printing labels, verify that a label did not become detached from the label sheet while passing through the printer.
4. Replace the rear access door.

5. Press the Resume button.

## Accessories?



If the Two-Sided Printing Accessory is attached to the printer, follow these steps to clear a paper jam from the Two-Sided Printing Accessory.


If the Auto Two-Sided Print Accessory with Small Paper Tray is attached to the printer, follow these steps to clear a paper jam Auto Two-Sided Print Accessory with Small Paper Tray.

### 9.3 Paper problems

## Printer prints on multiple sheets at once

Paper weight
The printer might print on multiple sheets of paper at once if the paper is under the recommended paper weight. Use paper that meets the recommended paper weight. For paper weight specifications, see the reference guide that came with the printer.

Paper is loaded improperly
The printer might print on multiple sheets of paper at once if the paper is loaded too far toward the back of the printer. Reload paper into the paper tray, pushing the paper until you feel resistance.

The printer might print multiple sheets if different paper types are loaded in the printer. For example, photo paper might be mixed with plain paper. Empty the paper tray and load only the paper type that is appropriate for the document that you are printing.

## Printer will not feed paper

Try one or more of the following solutions:

- Reduce the number of sheets in the paper tray.
- Remove the paper from the tray, then reload the paper.
- Use a different type of paper.


## Printer ejects the paper

If the printer ejects the paper, try one of the following solutions:

- Move the printer away from direct sunlight. The printer may have been placed in direct sunlight, which can affect the Automatic Paper-Type Sensor.
- Select a paper type other than Automatic.
- If you are performing a color calibration , install both the tri-color and photo print cartridges.
- If you are printing a borderless document and the Resume light and Print Cartridge Status light are flashing, follow the borderless printing guidelines.


## Other paper problems

- For information about clearing a paper jam, see the paper jam page.
- If an out-of-paper message appears, see the error messages page.


### 9.4 Print quality is poor

For help with photo print quality, see the photo troubleshooting page.

## Streaks and missing lines

If your printed pages are missing lines or dots, or if streaks appear, the print cartridges might be low on ink or might need to be cleaned.

## Print is faded

- Verify that neither of the print cartridges is low on ink.

If a print cartridge is low on ink, consider replacing the print cartridge when the print quality lessens.

If the print cartridge is not low on ink, clean the print cartridge.

- Verify that a black print cartridge is installed.

If the black text and images on your printouts are faded, you might be printing with only the tri-color print cartridge. Insert a black print cartridge, in addition to the tri-color print cartridge, for optimal black print quality.

- Verify that the protective piece of plastic tape has been removed from the print cartridges.


1. Plastic tape

- Consider selecting a higher print quality.


## Blank pages print

- The protective piece of plastic tape might still be attached to the print cartridges. Verify that the plastic tape has been removed from the print cartridges.
- The print cartridges might be out of ink. Replace one or both empty print cartridges.
- The printer might be in direct sunlight. Direct sunlight can adversely affect the Automatic Paper-Type Sensor. Move the printer out of direct sunlight.
- You might be trying to print a borderless document with only the black print cartridge installed. When printing a borderless document, always have the tricolor print cartridge and another print cartridge installed.


## Too much or too little ink appears on the page

Adjust the ink volume and dry time

1. Open the Printer Properties dialog box.
2. Click the Basics tab.
3. Click the Advanced features button.

The Advanced features dialog box appears.
4. Move the Ink volume slider toward Light or Heavy.

Note: If you increase the ink volume, move the Dry time slider toward More to avoid smearing the ink.
5. Click OK , and then click OK again.

Select a specific paper type

1. Open the Printer Properties dialog box.
2. Click the Paper/Quality tab.
3. In the Type is field, select an appropriate paper type. Do not select Automatic.

### 9.5 Document is misprinted

## Text and images are misaligned

If the text and images on your printouts are misaligned, then align the print cartridges.

## Document is printed off-center or at an angle

1. Verify that the paper is correctly placed in the In tray or optional lower tray.
2. Verify that the paper guides fit firmly against the paper.
3. Reprint the document.

Parts of the document are missing or printed in the wrong place
Open the Printer Properties and confirm the following options:

| Tab | Setting |
| :--- | :--- |
| Basics | Orientation : verify the appropriate orientation |
| Paper/Quality | Size is : verify the appropriate paper size |
| Effects | Scale to fit : select to scale text and graphics to the paper |
| Finishing | Poster printing : verify that Off is selected |

## Envelope is printed at an angle

1. Slide the flap inside the envelope before loading it in the printer.
2. Confirm that the paper guides fit firmly against the envelope.
3. Reprint the envelope.

## Document does not reflect the new print settings

The printer default settings might differ from the software program print settings. Select the appropriate print settings within the software program.

### 9.6 Photos are not printing correctly

## Check the paper tray

1. Place the photo paper in the In tray with the side to be printed on facing down.
2. Slide the paper forward until it stops.
3. Slide the paper guide firmly against the edge of the paper.

## Check the printer properties

Open the Printer Properties dialog box and verify the following options:

| Tab | Setting |
| :--- | :--- |
| Paper/Quality | Size is : The appropriate size <br> Type is : The appropriate photo paper type <br> Print quality : Best |

## Colors are tinted or incorrect

If colors in photographs appear tinted or incorrect, follow these steps:

1. Align the print cartridges using plain, white paper.
2. Reprint the photograph on photo paper.
3. If colors continue to appear tinted or incorrect, calibrate the color.

A photo print cartridge and tri-color print cartridge must be installed for color calibration.
4. Reprint the photograph.
5. If colors continue to appear tinted or incorrect, then open the Printer Properties dialog box, click the Color tab, and then click the Advanced color settings button.
6. On the Advanced color settings dialog box, adjust the colors as appropriate. The following are guidelines to follow:

- If the colors are too yellow, move the Color tone slider towards Cooler.
- If the colors are too blue, move the Color tone slider towards Warmer.

7. Reprint the photograph.
8. If colors continue to appear tinted or incorrect, align the print cartridges.

## Part of the photo is faded

Fading occurs on the edges of a photo


Verify that the photo paper is not curled. If the photo paper is curled, place the paper in a plastic bag and gently bend it the opposite direction of the curl until the paper lies flat. If the problem persists, then use photo paper that is not curled.
For instructions about preventing photo paper from curling, see the photo paper storage page.

Fading occurs near the edges of a photo


If fading occurs approximately 25 to 64 mm ( 1 to 2.5 inches) from the edge of a photo, try the following:

- Install a photo print cartridge and a tri-color print cartridge in the printer.
- Rotate the image 180 degrees.
- Open the Printer Properties dialog box, click the Paper/Quality tab, and then set the Print quality to Maximum dpi.

Use the What's This? help to learn about the features that you see in the Printer Properties dialog box.

### 9.7 Banners are not printing correctly

## Check the paper tray

- Unfold and refold the paper when several sheets feed into the printer at one time.
- Confirm that the unattached edge of the banner paper stack is on top and pointing into the printer.
- Verify that the correct paper for banner printing is in use.


## Check the printer properties

Open the Printer Properties dialog box and verify the following settings:

| Tab | Setting |
| :--- | :--- |
| Paper/Quality | Size is : The appropriate banner size <br> Type is : HP Banner Paper |

## Check the software

- Verify that the software program that you are using prints banners. Not all software programs print banners.
- If gaps appear at the ends of the sheets, verify that the printer software is operating correctly.


### 9.8 Borderless printing problems

When printing borderless photos or documents, follow these guidelines:

- Verify that the paper size that is specified in the Paper size drop-down list on the Printing Shortcuts tab matches the size of the paper loaded in the In tray.
- Select the appropriate paper type in the Paper type drop-down list on the Printing Shortcuts tab.
- If printing in grayscale, select High quality under Print in grayscale on the Color tab.
- Do not print borderless documents in ink-backup mode. Always have two print cartridges installed in the printer.


## Part of the photo is faded

Fading occurs on the edges of a photo


Verify that the photo paper is not curled. If the photo paper is curled, place the paper in a plastic bag and gently bend it the opposite direction of the curl until the paper lies flat. If the problem persists, then use photo paper that is not curled.

For instructions about preventing photo paper from curling, see the photo paper storage page.

Fading occurs near the edges of a photo


If fading occurs approximately 25 to 64 mm ( 1 to 2.5 inches) from the edge of a photo, try the following:

- Install a photo print cartridge and a tri-color print cartridge in the printer.
- Rotate the image 180 degrees.
- Open the Printer Properties dialog box, click the Paper/Quality tab, and then set the Print quality to Maximum dpi.

Use the What's This? help to learn about the features that you see in the Printer Properties dialog box.

## Streaks appear in a light portion of a photo



If streaks appear in a light portion approximately 64 mm ( 2.5 inches) from one of the long edges of a photograph, try the following:

- Install a photo print cartridge in the printer.
- Rotate the image 180 degrees.

Use the What's This? help to learn about the features that you see in the Printer Properties dialog box.

Image is printed at an angle


Follow these steps if the image is printed at an angle:

1. Remove all paper from the In tray.
2. Load the photo paper correctly in the In tray.
3. Verify that the paper guides fit firmly against the media.
4. Follow loading instructions for the media type.

## Printout has an unwanted border

## For most photo paper types



If the printout has an unwanted border, then try the following solutions:.

- Align the print cartridges
- Open the Printer Properties dialog box, click the Paper/Quality tab, and verify that the selected paper size matches both the paper size that the photo is formatted for and the size of the paper that loaded in the printer.
- Open the Printer Properties dialog box, click the Paper/Quality tab, and then select the Borderless auto fit check box.

If printing a two-sided document, print the document manually rather than automatically.

## For photo paper with a tear-off tab

If the border appears below the tear-off tab, then remove the tab.


If the border appears above the tear-of tab, then align the print cartridges.


## Ink smears

Use an HP photo paper.
Verify that the photo paper is not curled. If the photo paper is curled, place the paper in a plastic bag and gently bend it the opposite direction of the curl until the paper lies flat. If the problem persists, then use photo paper that is not curled.

If the paper is not curled, then follow these steps:

1. Open the Printer Properties dialog box.
2. Click the Basic tab, and then click the Advanced features button.

The Advanced features dialog box appears.
3. Move the Dry time slider toward More.
4. Move the Ink volume slider toward Light.

Note: The colors in the image might become lighter.
5. Click OK.

If the problem persists, try the following steps:

1. Remove the borderless printing media, and then load plain paper in the In tray.
2. Press and hold down the Power button, and then press the Resume button. The printer prints a self-test page.
3. Repeat step 2 until the back side of the self-test page contains no ink smears.

### 9.9 Error messages

## Out of paper message

If the In tray or optional lower tray contains paper

1. Verify the following:

- There is sufficient paper in the paper tray (at least ten sheets).
- The paper tray is not overly full.
- The paper stack is touching the back of the paper tray.

2. Slide the paper guides so that they fit firmly against the edges of the paper.
3. Press the Resume button to continue printing.

If the In tray or optional lower tray is empty

1. Load paper in the tray.
2. Press the Resume button to continue printing.

## The error message 'there was an error writing to USB port' appears

If you are using a USB printer cable, the printer might not be receiving correct data from another USB device or USB hub. Connect the printer directly to the USB port on the computer.

## The error message 'there was an error writing to LPT1' appears

The printer is connected to the computer with a USB cable but the cable may not have been attached before installing the software.

Uninstall, and then reinstall, the software.

## The error message 'two-way communication cannot be established' or 'printer not responding' appears

The printer might not be able to communicate with the computer if the USB cable is too long.

If you receive this error message, ensure the USB cable is not greater than five meters (approximately 16 feet, five inches) in length. Connect the printer directly to the USB port on the computer and not to a USB hub.

## Printing to the wrong USB port (HP Deskjet 6540-50 series)

If the computer is configured to use both the printer's back USB port and its front USB port, then you might be printing to the wrong port.

The computer has two version of the printer driver, one for the front USB port and one for the back USB port. If you are connected to the printer's back USB port but select the printer driver that is associated with the front USB port, the printer will not print.

Click File, and then click Print to open the Print dialog box. The Print dialog box displays two versions of the printer driver. Select the version that is associated with the port to which you are printing.

### 9.10 Printer lights are on or flashing

## Overview

For an overview of the printer's lights, click your printer model:


## What the lights indicate

The printer lights indicate the printer status.

## Power light is flashing

The printer is preparing to print.
The light stops flashing when the printer has received all data.

## Resume light is flashing

The printer might be out of paper

1. Place paper in the In tray.
2. Press the Resume button on the front of the printer.

## There might be a paper jam

Follow these instructions to clear a paper jam.

## Print cartridge status light is on or flashing

The HP Deskjet 6540-50 series printer has two print cartridge status lights. The left light corresponds to the left print cartridge, and the right light corresponds to the right print cartridge.

The HP Deskjet 6520 series printer has a single print cartridge status light for both print cartridges.

HP Deskjet 6520 series only
Look for an error message on the computer monitor. If the error message does not appear, then follow the steps below.

If the light is on and not flashing
Check to see if a print cartridge is low on ink. Replace the print cartridge when print quality degrades.

If a print cartridge is low on ink, consider replacing the print cartridge.
If neither print cartridge is low on ink, press the Resume button. If the Print Cartridge Status light remains on, turn off the printer, and then turn on the printer.

If the light is on and flashing
Verify that the correct print cartridges are installed.
If you were printing a borderless document when the light started flashing, follow the borderless printing guidelines.

Otherwise, follow these steps:

1. Open the printer cover of the printer, remove the print cartridge on the right, and then close the cover.
2. Do one of the following:

- If the light is flashing : Open the printer cover, replace the print cartridge that you removed, and then remove the other print cartridge. Go to step 3.
- If the light is off: There is a problem with the print cartridge that you removed. Go to step 3.

3. Manually clean the print cartridge.

After cleaning the print cartridge, reinsert it into the printer.
If the print cartridge status light continues to flash, replace the print cartridge.

Print quality icon lights are on or flashing (HP Deskjet 6540-50 series)
See the Print Quality Selector page.

## All lights are flashing

Restart the printer.

1. Press the Power button to turn off the printer, then press the Power button to restart the printer.

Proceed to step 2 if the lights continue to flash.
2. Press the Power button to turn off the printer.
3. Disconnect the printer power cord from the electrical outlet.
4. Reconnect the printer power cord to the electrical outlet.
5. Press the Power button to turn on the printer.

## Power-cord light

The light on the power cord illuminates when electricity is flowing through the cord. If the light is off, then the cord is not receiving power.

### 9.11 Document prints slowly

## Multiple software applications are open

The computer does not have sufficient resources for the printer to print at its optimum speed.

To increase printer speed, close all unnecessary software applications when printing.

Complex documents, graphics, or photographs are printing
Documents containing graphics or photographs print slower than text documents. If your computer does not have enough memory or disk space to print the document under normal conditions, you can use Low Memory Mode. Using this option may reduce the quality of the printout. Low Memory Mode also disables $4800 \times 1200$ optimized dpi printing.

To activate Low Memory Mode:

1. Open the Printer Properties dialog box.
2. Click the Basics tab, and then click the Advanced Features button.
3. Select Low Memory Mode, and then click OK.
4. Print the document.

## Best or maximum dpi print mode is selected

The printer prints more slowly when Best or Maximum dpi is selected as the print quality. To increase the printer speed, select a different print-quality mode.

## Printer driver is outdated

An outdated printer driver might be installed.
For information about updating the printer driver, visit the HP Web site www.hp.com/ support.

## Computer does not meet system requirements

If your computer does not have enough RAM or does not have a large amount of free space on the hard drive, the printer processing time will be longer.

1. Verify that the computer hard disk space, RAM, and processor speed meet the system requirements.

For the system requirements, see the reference guide that came with the printer.
2. Make space available on the hard drive by deleting unneeded files.

## Printer is in ink-backup mode

The printer might print more slowly if it is in ink-backup mode.
To increase the print speed, use two print cartridges in the printer.

### 9.12 If you continue to have problems

If you continue to have problems after investigating the troubleshooting topics, turn off and then restart your computer.

If you still have problems after restarting your computer, go to HP customer support at www.hp.com/support.

## 10 Optional accessories

The following optional accessories are available to be used with your HP printer.


If an accessory is not included with your printer, it can be purchased separately from an authorized HP dealer.

For accessory part numbers, see the accessory supply list.
Note: The availability of accessories varies by country/region.

### 10.1 Automatic Two-Sided Printing Accessory (duplexer)

The duplexer is a special hardware device that enables the printer to automatically print on both sides of a page.

Using a duplexer with your printer has several advantages. It allows you to do the following tasks:

- Print on both sides of a page without manually reloading the page.
- Use less paper by printing on both sides of paper sheets.
- Create professional-looking brochures, reports, newsletters, and other special items.

If the duplexer is not packaged with your printer, it can be purchased separately from an authorized HP dealer.

Note: The duplexer is not available in all countries/regions.


The duplexer only supports certain paper types. For a list of supported paper types, see the documentation that came with the duplexer.

### 10.1.1 Installing the duplexer

Follow these steps to attach the duplexer to your printer:

1. Push the two latch handles on the printer's rear access door toward each other, and then remove the door.


Note: Do not discard the rear access door. In order to print, either the duplexer or the rear access door must be attached to the printer.
2. Insert the duplexer in the back of the printer until both sides snap into place.


Note: Do not press the buttons on either side of the duplexer when installing it in the printer. Use the buttons only when removing the duplexer from the printer.

### 10.1.2 Enabling the duplexer

Follow these step to enable the duplexer:

1. Open the printer Toolbox.
2. Click the Configuration tab.
3. Click Automatic Two-Sided Printing Module , and then click Apply.
4. Click OK in the confirmation box that appears.
5. Click the $\mathbf{X}$ in the upper-right corner to close the screen.

Note: After the duplexer is enabled, it is not necessary to re-enable it every time you print.

### 10.1.3 Printing a booklet automatically

To print a booklet automatically, one of the following accessories must be attached to the printer:

Automatic Two-Sided Printing Accessory


The two-sided printing accessories only support certain paper types. For a list of supported paper types, see the specifications for either the Automatic Two-Sided Printing Accessory or the Auto Two-Sided Print Accessory with Small Paper Tray.

If a two-sided printing accessory is not attached to the printer or you are printing on an unsupported paper type, use manual two-sided printing.

## Guidelines

Do not exceed the In-tray capacity: up to 150 sheets.

## Printing

Load paper in the printer paper tray, and then follow these steps to print a booklet automatically:

1. Open the Printer Properties dialog box.
2. Click the Printing Shortcuts tab, and then select Two-sided, duplex, printing from the drop-down list.

3. From the Print on both sides drop-down list, select one of the following binding options:

- Left edge booklet
- Right edge booklet

4. Select any other print settings that you want, and then click OK.

After the first side of the page is printed, the printer pauses while the ink dries. When the ink is dry, the paper is pulled back into the duplexer and the reverse side of the page is printed.

Note: Do not remove the paper from the printer until both sides of the page have been printed.

### 10.1.4 Automatic two-sided printing problems

## Paper jam occurs inside the Automatic Two-Sided Printing Accessory

## Paper jam

Follow these steps to remove a paper jam from the duplexer.

1. Turn off the printer.
2. Press the buttons on the left and right sides of the duplexer, and then remove it from the printer.

3. Remove any paper inside the printer.
4. Open the duplexer.

5. Remove any paper from inside the duplexer.
6. Close the duplexer, and then re-attach the duplexer to the printer.


## Option for two-sided printing cannot be selected

The printer driver cannot sense the duplexer until a print job is sent to the printer. Print a single sided document, and then print the two-sided document. The option for using the duplexer will appear in the printer software.

If the option for the duplexer still does not appear, then verify that the following conditions exist:

- The duplexer is attached to the printer.
- The duplexer is enabled in the printer software.
- The media type and size selected on the Paper/Quality tab are supported by the duplexer.

For a list of supported media types and sizes, see the specifications for your duplexer:

- Automatic Two-Sided Printing Accessory
- Auto Two-Sided Print Accessory with Small Paper Tray


## Only one side of the page prints when the two-sided printing option is enabled

Verify that the following conditions exist:

- The correct print options are set in both the printer software and the software program that you are using.
- The photo paper is not curled, if you are printing on two-sided photo paper. Photo paper should be flat before printing. See storing and handling photo paper for more information.
- The media type and size that is selected on the Paper/Quality tab are supported by the duplexer.
See the documentation that came with the duplexer for a list of supported media types and sizes.

If the media type or size is not supported by the duplexer, you can print the document by using the manual two-sided printing instructions.

Note: Do not try to print a two-sided document on single-sided paper, such as single-sided photo paper.

## Binding margin is in the wrong place

1. Open the Printer Properties dialog box.
2. Click the Finishing tab.
3. Verify that the following conditions exist:

- Flip pages up is not selected for binding along the side (book binding).
- Flip pages up is selected for binding along the top (tablet binding).

For more information, see two-sided printing.

Paper size changes when the two-sided printing option is selected
The paper size is not supported by the duplexer.

## Colors look faded

If the colors look faded, trying printing the two-sided document by using the manual two-sided printing instructions.

### 10.2 250-Sheet Plain Paper Tray Accessory

The 250-Sheet Plain Paper Tray Accessory expands the paper capacity of your printer to 400 sheets. It is useful for high-volume printing and for occasions when you want to use the In tray for special media such as letterhead paper, but still have plain paper readily available.


If the 250-Sheet Plain Paper Tray Accessory is not included with your printer, it can be purchased separately from an authorized HP dealer.

Note: The 250-sheet Plain Paper Tray Accessory is not available in all countries/ regions.

### 10.2.1 Installing the 250-Sheet Plain Paper Tray Accessory

Follow these steps to install the 250-Sheet Plain Paper Tray Accessory:

1. Turn off the printer.
2. Select a location for the printer and place the 250-Sheet Plain Paper Tray Accessory in this location.
3. Carefully lift the printer and orient it above the paper tray.

4. Gently place the printer on top of the paper tray.

### 10.2.2 Loading the 250-Sheet Plain Paper Tray Accessory

## Two parts

The 250-Sheet Plain Paper Tray Accessory has two parts.


1. Base
2. Lower tray

The lower tray has three size adjusters.


1. Paper-width guide
2. Paper-width fence
3. Paper-length guide

Note: When changing the paper size in the paper tray, you must set all three paper guides.

## Setting the paper size

When changing the paper size in the paper tray, all three paper guides must be set to the correct setting.

Follow these steps to set the paper size:

1. Remove the lower tray from the base.

2. Slide the paper-width guide until the arrow is even with the correct setting.

3. Align the arrows

Note: To print on legal-sized paper, set the paper-width guide to LTR .
3. Set the paper-width fence by carefully inserting it into the appropriate slots.


1. Tilt the fence forward.
2. Insert the fence into the appropriate slots
3. Tilt the fence back until it locks into place

Note: To print on legal-sized paper, set the paper-width fence to LTR .
4. Set the paper-length guide by pulling it until the arrow lines up with the paper size.


1. Align the arrows

Note: To print on legal-sized paper, pull the paper-length guide all the way out.

## Loading paper

Follow these steps to load paper:

1. Remove the lower tray from the base.
2. Verify that all three paper guides are set to the correct setting.
3. Insert the paper into the lower tray.

4. Insert the lower tray in the base until it locks into place.


### 10.2.3 Printing a different first page with the 250-Sheet Plain Paper Tray Accessory

## Guidelines

The 250-Sheet Plain Paper Tray Accessory is not included with your printer, but can be purchased separately from an authorized HP dealer. The accessory is not available in all countries/regions.

## Load paper

1. Load the paper for the body of the document in the 250 -Sheet Plain Paper Tray Accessory.
2. Load the paper for the first page in the In tray.

## Printing

Follow these steps to print a document with a cover page:

1. Open the Printer Properties dialog box.
2. Click the Paper/Quality tab.
3. Select the Use different paper for check box.
4. Click First page.

5. Select the paper type and paper size for the first page.
6. Click Upper in the Source is box.
7. Click Other pages.

8. Click Lower in the Source is box.
9. Click the paper type for the other pages in the Type is drop-down list.

Do not select Automatic.
10. Select any other print settings that you want, and then click OK.

Do not print the document in reverse order.

### 10.3 Auto Two-Sided Print Accessory with Small Paper Tray

The Auto Two-Sided Print Accessory with Small Paper Tray is a hardware device that contains a rear tray for small media and a duplexer for two-sided printing on both full-size and small media.


- Postcards and other small media can be printed on two sides automatically when they are fed from the rear tray.
- Photo paper and envelopes can be printed on one side by using the small paper tray.
- Print two-sided documents automatically.

If the Auto Two-Sided Print Accessory with Small Paper Tray is not included with your printer, it can be purchased separately from an authorized HP dealer.

Note: The Auto Two-Sided Print Accessory with Small Paper Tray is not available in all countries/regions.

### 10.3.1 Installing the Auto Two-Sided Print Accessory with Small Paper Tray

Use these steps to install the Auto Two-Sided Print Accessory with Small Paper Tray:

1. Push the two latch handles on the printer rear access door toward each other, and then remove the door.


Do not discard the rear access door. In order to print, the accessory or the rear access door must be attached to the printer.
2. Insert the accessory into the back of the printer until both sides snap into place.


Note: Do not press the buttons on either side of the accessory when installing it into the printer. Use the buttons only when removing the accessory from the printer.

### 10.3.2 Printing postcards

## Guidelines

- Use only cards that meet the specifications for the Auto Two-Sided Print Accessory with Small Paper Tray. For more information, see the Auto TwoSided Print Accessory with Small Paper Tray specifications.
- When printing a large number of cards, remove the printed material from the printer's Out tray about halfway through the print job.

The address side of the cards should face outward.

3. Release the paper lever.
4. Slide the paper-width guide against the edge of the cards.

- Paper Type : Plain paper

### 10.3.3 Small photos

## Guidelines

- For high-quality results, use a photo print cartridge in combination with the tricolor print cartridge.
- For maximum fade resistance, use HP Premium Plus Photo Paper and install aphoto print cartridge in the printer.
- To learn how to use the printer's photo printing features, see the photo enhancing page.
- Use HP Everyday Photo Paper, Semi-gloss to save money and ink when printing photos.
- Verify that the photo paper that you are using is flat. For information about preventing photo paper from curling, see the photo paper storage instructions.
- Do not exceed the maximum capacity of the rear tray: 20 sheets of photo paper.


## Preparing to print

### 10.3.4 Envelopes

Insert the envelopes with the address side facing outward and the flap to the left.

3. Release the paper lever.
4. Slide the paper-width guide against the edge of the envelopes.

- Size is : The appropriate envelope size
- Type is : The appropriate paper type
- Source is : Rear tray

3. Select any other print settings that you want, and then click OK.

### 10.3.5 Problems with the Auto Two-Sided Print Accessory with Small Paper Tray

Do not clear a paper jam from the front of the printer.

## Paper jam

Follow these steps to remove a paper jam from the Auto Two-Sided Print Accessory with Small Paper Tray.

1. Turn off the printer.
2. Press the buttons on the left and right sides of the accessory, and then remove it from the printer.

3. Remove any paper that is inside the printer.
4. Lift the back lever on the accessory, and then unhook the Small Paper Tray

5. Tilt the Small Paper Tray forward and open the lower door of the accessory.

6. Tilt the Small Paper Tray
7. Open the lower door
8. Remove any paper that is inside the accessory.
9. Close the accessory, and then secure the back lever to close the accessory.
10. Re-attach the accessory to the printer.


## Option for two-sided printing cannot be selected

The printer driver cannot sense the duplexer until a print job is sent to the printer. Print a single sided document, and then print the two-sided document. The option for using the duplexer will appear in the printer software.
If the option for the duplexer still does not appear, then verify that the following conditions exist:

- The duplexer is attached to the printer.
- The duplexer is enabled in the printer software.
- The media type and size selected on the Paper/Quality tab are supported by the duplexer.

## Paper size changes when the two-sided printing option is selected

## Binding margin is in the wrong place

1. Open the Printer Properties dialog box.

3. Verify that the following conditions exist:

- Flip pages up is not selected for binding along the side (book binding).
- Flip pages up is selected for binding along the top (tablet binding).

## Only one side of the page prints when the two-sided printing option is enabled

Verify that the following conditions exist:

- The correct print options are set in both the printer software and the software program that you are using.
- The photo paper is not curled, if you are printing on two-sided photo paper. Photo paper should be flat before printing. See storing and handling photo paper for more information.
- The media type and size that is selected on the Paper/Quality tab are supported by the duplexer.
