Power Sources

This unit should be operated only from the type of power source indicated on the information label.

If you are not sure of the type of electrical power supplied to your home, consult your dealer or local power company.

Grounding or Polarization

This unit is equipped with a polarized AC power cord plug (a plug having one blade wider than the other), or a DC power connection, for use in a vehicle. Follow the instructions below:

For the unit with a polarized AC power cord plug

This plug will fit into the power outlet only one way. This is a safety feature. If you are unable to



insert the plug fully into the outlet, try reversing the plug. If the plug still fails to fit, contact your electrician to have a suitable outlet installed. Do not defeat the safety purpose of the polarized plug by forcing it in.

For the unit with a DC power connector

For installation in a vehicle, connect the red wire to the 12V accessory line and the black wire to a ground terminal.

Wall outlet

Do not use a poor fitting outlet.

Insert the plug fully into the outlet. If it is loose, it may cause arcing and result in fire. Contact your electrician to have the outlet changed.

Wiring

For your safety, unplug the power cord when wiring cables.

Electric shock

Do not touch the AC power cord or the unit with a wet hand. If you plug/unplug the AC power cord from the unit with a wet hand, it may cause electric shock.

Never attempt to move the unit unless the AC power cord is disconnected.

Cleaning

- Clean the power plug regularly.
- If the plug is covered with dust and it picks up moisture, its insulation may deteriorate
- and result in fire. Unplug the power plug and clean it regularly. Unplug the power cord when cleaning this unit. If not, it may
- result in electric shock. Clean the cabinet of the TV with a dry soft cloth. To remove dust from the screen, wipe it gently with a soft cloth.

Overloading

- Never place the unit in a confined space, such as a bookcase or built-in cabinet, unless proper ventilation is provided.

Heat sources




Antennas Outdoor Antenna Grounding



Section 810 of the National Electrical Code (NEC) in USA and Section 54 of the Canadian Electrical Code in Canada provides information with respect to proper grounding of the mast and supporting structure, grounding of the lead-in wire to an antenna discharge unit, size of grounding conductors, location of antenna discharge unit, connection to grounding electrodes, and requirements for the grounding electrode.







Precautions

Inserting Batteries in the Remote Control


- 1. Open the cover completely.

- 3. Silde back the cover.






Trouble shooting

In case a problem occurs with your LCD TV, please take the following steps first.
If you still have the problem, turn the power off and contact your dealer or an authorized service center.

Problem	Action		
The screen does not appear.	Is the power plug connected? Insert the power plug. Press the power button of the remote control.		
The screen appears too slowly after the power is turned on.	This problem occurs for a brief time in the process of image elimination processing in order to hide temporary screen noise that occurs when the power is turned on. But if the screen does not come after 1 minute contact your dealer or an authorized service center.		
Screen is too bright or too dark.	Perform brightness adjustment or Contrast adjustment.		
Screen is too large or too small.	Adjust the screen size.		
Stripes appear on the screen and it shakes.	Stop using wireless telephones, hair dryers and electric drills.		
The screen does not move.	Press the PAUSE button. Check if the Pause button is pressed on external equipment.		
Screen appears, Voice is not heard	 Press the "MUTE"button. Increase the sound level by pressing volume adjustment buttor Check if sound terminal of external input is connected properly Check if audio cables are connected properly. Select and check the other input. If the sound still does not work and the other channels are the same after you have done as the above, contact your dealer or an authorized service center. 		
Remote control does not work	 Check if main power is On. Check that the batteries of the remote controller were loaded properly. Check to see if any obstacle exists between the LCD TV and the remote control, then remove it, if any. If the batteries are low, replace them with two new batteries.



1. Lay the TV down with the rear facing up on a non-abrasive surface.




- 2. Remove the four screws (M5 x 20) shown in Figure A.

1. Remove the six screws (M4 x 10) shown in picture C with a Phillips screwdriver.




2. Remove the stand cover from the TV shown in picture D.
