Operation Panel



(1) ON/OFF button

Turns the printer on and off. See "Turning On/Off the Printer" on page 6.

(2) Buttons to be used to navigate menus on the LCD

See "How to Navigate Menus on the LCD" on right column.

(3) OK button

Finalizes your selection for the menu or setting item. See "How to Navigate Menus on the LCD" on right column.

Dismisses the error message and resumes the printer's normal operation after resolving a printing error or removing jammed paper.

(4) [+][-] buttons

Specifies the number of copies to print.

(5) Print button

Press to start printing according to the settings displayed on the LCD.

(6) Stop/Reset button

Cancels a print job in progress.

(7) Power lamp

Lights or flashes blue to indicate the power status.

(8) Alarm lamp

Lights or flashes orange when an error, such as paper-out or ink-out, occurs.



Power lamp indicates the power status.

Off: The printer is turned off. Lighting: The printer is ready to print, is currently printing, or is in operation. Flashing: The printer is preparing to turn on or off.


Basic Operation

This section describes the operation to navigate menus with the **Easy-Scroll** Wheel, \blacktriangle , \bigtriangledown , \triangleleft , and \blacktriangleright buttons, and the OK button, taking the HOME screen as an example.

1 Press the HOME button.

The HOME screen will appear.

Turn the Easy-Scroll Wheel to select the menu, then press the OK button.



You can turn the **Easy-Scroll Wheel** left or right. You can also use the ◀ or ▶ button to select setting items.

Move the icon of the desired menu to position (A).

The selected menu screen will appear.

You can select the following menus on the HOME screen:

Select and print:

You can print the photos saved on a memory card while displaying on the LCD, and specify the number of copies for each photo listed. See "Selecting Photographs to Print—Select and print" on page 12.

Layout print:

You can print your favorite photo in the specified layout. See "Printing Multiple Photos on One Sheet of Media—Layout print" on page 13.

Create item:

You can create your own items such as stickers or calendars using selected photo, or print your favorite photo with a frame. See "Using Other Useful Printing Function" on page 16.

Special photo print:

You can print all photos saved on a memory card and print photos according to the settings on the camera. You can also print a list of all photos and the photo information when you shot. See "Using Other Useful Printing Function" on page 16.

Settings:

You can perform the maintenance or change the various settings of the printer. See "When Printing Becomes Faint or Colors Are Incorrect" on page 27 or "Changing the Printer Settings" on page 33.

Slide show:

You can display photos saved on a memory card on the LCD sequentially.

Operation of Other Buttons

Function buttons (2), (3)

Two Function buttons enable you to select the menu displayed at the bottom of the LCD.

The screen that appears when you press a Function button depends on the screen that is displayed and which Function button you press.

Left Function button (2): When you press the left Function button on the **HOME** screen, the remaining ink volume screen is displayed.

Right Function button (3): When you press the right Function button on the **HOME** screen, the introductions for the selected menu functions are displayed.

When you press them on the other than the **HOME** screen, the operation procedure or the menus is displayed.

• Back button (6)

You can return the LCD to the previous screen.

NAVI button (4)

When you do not know how to use the print function for the frequent use or how to load paper, you can easily get the explanation from the navigation menu.

Turning On/Off the Printer


This section describes the method to turn on/off the printer.

Turning On the Printer

Note

If the ink tank is not installed, refer to your setup sheet to install it.

- Plug in the AC Adapter and connect the other end to a power outlet.
- **2** Press the Open button, then open the Paper Feed Tray and the Paper Output Tray, and then fold the Paper Feed Tray in half.



🖽 Note

Pull the LCD Monitor up and adjust its angle to a position where you can see it clearly.

3 Press the **ON/OFF** button to turn the printer on.



The Power lamp flashes, then changes to steady (non-flashing).

The HOME screen appears on the LCD.

E Note

If the **Alarm** lamp is lit orange and an error message is displayed on the LCD, see "Error Message Is Displayed on the LCD" on page 35.

Turning Off the Printer


Check the following before turning off the printer.

- The Access lamp of the memory card is not flashing.
- The printer is not operating.

Number Important

The Access lamp flashes while the printer is reading or writing data from/to the memory card. Removing the memory card or turning off the printer while the Access lamp is flashing may damage the data saved on the memory card.

1 Turn off the printer by pressing the **ON/OFF** button.



The **Power** lamp goes out and the power will be turned off. Push down the LCD Monitor.

2 Close the Paper Feed Tray and then the Paper Output Tray.

Note

Power cord

Before unplugging the power cord, turn off the printer and ensure that the **Power** lamp has gone out. You may not be able to print afterward if you unplug the power cord when the **Power** lamp is lit or flashing.

Screen-saver mode

If you leave the printer more than about 5 minutes without using any button on the operation panel when the printer is turned on, the LCD goes into Screensaver mode automatically.

Press the **OK** button to resume the LCD.

🖽 Note


When using the optional battery, the printer will be turned off automatically after about 5 minutes from when the LCD goes into Screen-saver mode.

Loading Printing Paper

This section describes the available page size and media type, and how to load paper.

Loading paper

- Turn on the printer. See "Turning On the Printer" on page 6.
 - (1) Press the Open button, then open the Paper Feed Tray and Paper Output Tray, and fold the Paper Feed Tray in half.



E Note

Pull up the LCD Monitor and adjust its angle in the position where you can see it clearly.

- (2) Press the ON/OFF button.
- 2 Flatten the four corners of the paper before loading it.

E Note

If paper is curled, gently bend the corners in the opposite direction until the paper becomes flat. See "Paper is curled." on page 42.

3 Ensure that the Paper Thickness Lever is set to the right.



R Note

When printing, set the Paper Thickness Lever to the right. Set the Paper Thickness Lever to the left only if ink smudges or the printed surface is stained. Return the Paper Thickness Lever to the right after printing.

Load the paper. 4

Do not load higher than the Paper Guide's thickness.



- (3) Slide the Paper Guide against the left side of the paper stack.
- Photo stickers

- (1) Load the paper into the Rear Tray with the print side facing up. If you use Canon genuine 4" x 6" / 101.6 x 152.4 mm paper, up to 20 sheets of paper can be loaded.
- (2) Align the paper stack with the right edge of the Rear Tray.
- 4" x 6" or Card Shorter margin

N Important Always load paper in portrait orientation.

Paper Handling

- · Folded, curled, or wrinkled paper
- Damp paper
- Paper that is too thin (weighing less than 17 lb / 64 gsm)
- Picture postcards
- · Postcards affixed with photos or stickers
- Any type of paper with holes
- Paper that is not rectangular
- Paper bound with staples or glue
- · Paper with adhesives
- Paper decorated with glitter, etc.



Printable Image Data

This printer supports JPEG and TIFF images created by DCF ver. 1.0/2.0 standard compliant digital cameras (Exif ver. 2.2/2.21 compliant).

Number Important

Compatible image types are limited to JPEG and TIFF only. Other image or movie types such as RAW images cannot be printed.

Inserting the Memory Card

This printer is equipped with two Card Slots to meet various types of memory cards. Refer to the illustration on right column to find the Card Slot that corresponds to your memory card. Check the card face and insert it gently until it reaches the bottom and the **Access** lamp turns on. The card's end protrudes from the Card Slot even if it is correctly set.

You can also use the Card Slot as the memory card drive of the computer.

E Note

- When Read/write mode is selected in Read/write attribute under Device settings by using the Operation Panel on the printer, card direct printing cannot be done. After using the Card Slot as the memory card drive of the computer, remove the memory card, then be sure to set Read/write attribute to Read-only mode. See "Changing the Printer Settings" on page 33.
- When you use a computer to edit or process photos saved on a memory card, be sure to print them from the computer. If you print using the Operation Panel, the data may not be printed correctly.
- **1** Turn on the printer.

See "Turning On the Printer" on page 6.

2 Attach a card adapter if your memory card requires one.

A Caution

When using miniSD Card, microSD Card, xD-Picture Card, MEMORY STICK Duo, MEMORY STICK PRO Duo, or RS-MMC, be sure to use a card adapter when inserting these cards into the Card Slot.

If one of these cards is inserted without an adapter, you may not be able to remove the card. In this case, see "Cannot Remove a Memory Card" on page 46.




Insert only one memory card into the Card Slot.


A Caution

- When a memory card is inserted into the Card Slot, the Access lamp is lit. When this Access lamp is flashing, the printer is accessing to the memory card. In this case, do not touch around the Card Slot.
- The memory card will stick out of the Card Slot, but do not force it into the slot any further. Doing so damages the printer and the memory card.
- Make sure that the memory card is correctly oriented and labeled side is facing up before inserting it into the Card Slot. If you force the memory card into the Card Slot in the wrong orientation, you may damage the memory card and/or the printer.

Removing the Memory Card

Nortant Nortant

If you used the Card Slot as the memory card drive of the computer, you need to do a "safe removal" operation on your computer before physically removing the memory card from your printer.

Windows

Right-click the removable disk icon and click **Eject**. If **Eject** is not displayed on the screen, make sure that the **Access** lamp is not flashing, and then remove the memory card.




Drag the icon into the Trash.

Make sure that the **Access** lamp is lit, then remove the memory card.

Do not remove the memory card while the **Access** lamp is flashing. Hold the part of the memory card that is sticking out to remove it from the printer.

N Important

The Access lamp flashes while the printer is reading or writing data from/to the memory card. Removing the memory card or turning off the printer while the Access lamp is flashing may damage the data saved on the memory card.



Printing Photographs Saved on a Memory Card

Photos saved on the memory card can be reviewed on the printer's LCD. You can select a photo and print a single copy of the photo, or specify the number of copies to print.

Selecting Photographs to Print—Select and print

You can display the photos saved on the memory card on the LCD and print them.

- Prepare for printing.
 - (1) Turn on the printer. See "Turning On/Off the Printer" on page 6.
 - (2) Load paper. See "Loading Printing Paper" on page 8.
 - (3) Insert the memory card into the Card Slot. See "Inserting the Memory Card" on page 11.
- 2 Select Select and print and print on the Home screen, then press the OK button.
- 3 Confirm the page size, media type, and other settings, then select Next, and then press the OK button.

The photo selection screen is displayed.

Note

- To change the settings, select the item and press the **OK** button. See "Print Setting Screens" on page 15.
- may be displayed on the LCD while reading the photo.

- Select the photo to print and specify the number of copies for each photo.
- (1) Use the Easy-Scroll Wheel or the 4 or b button to display the photo to print.



- (2) Use the [+] or [-] button to specify the number of copies.
- (3) Repeat steps (1) and (2) to specify the number of copies for each photo.
- (4) Press the OK button. The print confirmation screen is displayed.



Advanced Print Settings Screen

When you press the left Function button in the print settings confirmation screen, the **Auto image fix** screen is displayed.

When **Auto image fix ON** is selected, the scene or person's face of a shot photo is recognized and the most suitable correction for each photo is made automatically. It makes a darkened face by backlight brighter to print. It also analyzes a scene such as scenery, night scene, person, etc. and corrects each scene with the most suitable color, brightness, or contrasts automatically to print.

- Photos in a memory card are printed in Auto image fix as default. In Auto image fix, you can specify only Date or File no. on the next page.





You can connect a PictBridge compliant device such as a digital camera, camcorder, or mobile phone using a USB cable recommended by the device's manufacturer, and print recorded images directly without using a computer.

Connectable Devices

PictBridge is an industry standard enabling a range of digital photo solutions, including the direct printing of photos from a digital still camera, camcorder or mobile phone* without the need to use a computer. A device can be connected to this printer for direct printing regardless of the manufacturer or the model as long as it complies with the PictBridge standard.

* PictBridge compliant digital still cameras, digital camcorders, and cameraequipped mobile phones are hereafter collectively referred to as "PictBridge compliant device".

A device with this mark is PictBridge compliant.

Printable Image Data Format

This printer prints images taken with a DCF (Design rule for Camera File system) ver. 1.0/2.0-compatible digital camera (Exif ver. 2.2/2.21 compliant), as well as PNG files.

Printing Photographs Directly from a Compliant Device

To connect a PictBridge compliant device to this printer, use a USB cable recommended by the device's manufacturer.

A Caution

Do not connect any equipment other than PictBridge compliant devices or the optional Bluetooth unit BU-20 to the Direct Print Port of the printer. If you do so, electric shock, fire, or damage to the printer could result.

Important

- Set up the printer according to your setup sheet before you start printing.
- Never disconnect the USB cable during printing unless when explicitly allowed to by the PictBridge compliant device. When disconnecting the USB cable between the PictBridge compliant device and printer, follow the instructions given in the device's instruction manual.



Layout Setting

Various layout options are available.







- Do not place any obstacle between the infrared ports of the printer and mobile phone or PDA it will block data transmission.
- During printing, be careful not to interrupt infrared communication with the printer. If it is interrupted, send the data from the mobile phone or PDA again.
- Depending on your device, the print quality may be degraded due to the restriction on the infrared transfer capacity.
- We recommend printing on sticker or credit card-sized paper when the print quality on other types of paper is not fine.


About transmittable data

- Due to security settings on the mobile phone or PDA, downloaded content or photos downloaded from an URL attached to an E-mail cannot be printed.
- Video files cannot be printed.
- Depending on the size of a photo, it may take a while for this printer to start to print after starting the infrared communication.
- Depending on your device, data saved on a memory card may not be printed.
- Printed quality and orientation (portrait or landscape) are determined automatically according to the shot photo size.
- Depending on the photo size shot on the mobile phone, the edges of the image may be cut off when performing borderless printing; the margin size may change when printing with borders.
- If the photo file is over 1.8 MB in size, it may not be possible to send the file.

Routine Maintenance

When Printing Becomes Faint or Colors Are Incorrect

When printing becomes faint or colors are incorrect, the ink may have run out, or the Print Head Nozzles are probably clogged. Follow the procedures below to clean the nozzles.

Before performing maintenance

- Open the Printer Cover and make sure that the ink lamp is lit red.
- If the ink lamp is flashing slowly, the ink tank is running low. If the printing is blurred, replace the ink tank. See "Replacing an Ink Tank" on page 30.
 If the printing is not blurred, you can continue printing for a while, but the printer may not be able to print properly along the way. We recommend you to have a replacement ink tank available.
- If the ink lamp is flashing fast, the ink tank is empty. Replace the ink tank. See "Replacing an Ink Tank" on page 30.
- If the ink lamp is not lit, the tank is not set properly. Press the (MSH) mark on the ink tank until the tank clicks into place.
- If the print result is not your expected one, for instance, the printed photo is rough, performing the Print Head Alignment may resolve the problem.



Replacing an Ink Tank

This section explains the way to confirm the ink status and the procedure to replace an ink tank.

When ink runs out or other errors occur, an error message is displayed on the LCD to inform you of the error. See "Error Message Is Displayed on the LCD" on page 35 and confirm how to handle it.

- If printing becomes faint or white streaks appear despite sufficient ink levels, see "When Printing Becomes Faint or Colors Are Incorrect" on page 27.

Getting the Ink Status Information

You can confirm the status of the ink tank in the following ways:

- "With the LCD of this Printer" below.
- "With the Ink Lamp" on right column.

When printing from your computer, error messages appear on your computer screen as well.

You can confirm the status of the ink tank in the remaining ink volume screen on the LCD.

If the lamp is still off after reinserting the ink tank, there has been an error and the printer cannot print.

Replacing an Ink Tank

N Important

Handling Ink

• To maintain optimal printing quality, we recommend the use of specified Canon genuine ink tank.

Refilling ink is not recommended.

- Once you remove an ink tank, replace it immediately. Do not leave the printer with an ink tank removed.
- Replace an empty tank with a new one. Inserting a partially used ink tank may cause the nozzles to clog. Furthermore, with such a tank, the printer will not be able to inform you when to replace the tank properly.
- Once an ink tank has been installed, do not remove it from the printer and leave it out in the open.

This will cause the ink tank to dry out, and the printer may not operate properly when it is reinstalled. To maintain optimal printing quality, use an ink tank within six months of first use.



Read/write attribute

Selects whether to allow data to be written onto memory cards from a computer.

Number Important

- Remove the memory card before changing this setting. For details, refer to the User's Guide on-screen manual.
- When you write the data on the memory card, connect the printer with the AC adapter. The printer cannot be set to the Read/write mode with using the optional battery. The printer can be set to the Read/write mode when using both the AC adapter and optional battery, but do not remove the AC adapter when you write the data on the memory card.
- If you set this setting to Read/write mode, card direct printing cannot be done. After you finish operation of the memory card dedicated drive, be sure to set it back to Read-only mode. Slide show setting



When these settings are incorrect, you cannot obtain a proper print result. If you are printing a photograph or an illustration, incorrect paper type setting may reduce the quality of printout color.

• Check 2: Did you set the print quality setting appropriately?


