## **Before Printing**

## **Turning the Machine On and Off**

Turn on the machine before printing.

#### Turning on the Machine

Before turning on the machine, confirm the following.

• The Print Head and ink tanks are set into place.

If you are using the machine connected to a computer, confirm also the following.

- The machine is connected to your computer (or a compatible device).
- The MP Drivers are installed.



If preparatory operations above are not complete, follow the *Easy Setup Instructions* to complete them.

1 Open the Operation Panel and press the **ON/ OFF** button to turn on the machine.

The **POWER** lamp flashes green, and changes to steady, non-flashing light.



If the **ALARM** lamp lights up or flashes orange and an error message is displayed on the LCD, see "Error Message Is Displayed on the LCD" on page 57.

2 If you are using the machine connected to a computer, turn on your computer.



### **■** Turning off the Machine

1 To turn off the machine, press the **ON/OFF** button.

When the **POWER** lamp stops flashing, the machine is turned off.



#### About the Power Plug

When removing the power plug after turing off the machine, be sure to confirm that the **POWER** lamp is not lit. If the power plug is removed from the wall outlet with the **POWER** lamp still lit or flashing green, the machine may become unable to print.

#### • The Screen-saver Mode

The LCD goes out if the machine is not operated for 5 minutes. Press any button to restore the display. You cannot change the wait time before the LCD goes out.

## **Handling the Original Document**

This section describes how to load the original document on the Platen Glass.

#### ■ Original Document Requirements

The original documents you load on the Platen Glass for copying or scanning must meet these requirements:

Document type	<ul><li>Paper documents</li><li>Photographs</li><li>Books</li></ul>
Size (W x L)	Max. 8.5 x 11.7 inches / 216 x 297 mm
Thickness	Max. 0.8 inches / 20 mm

### ■ Loading Original Documents


Load originals to copy or scan on the Platen Glass.

### ■ Note

Make sure any glue, ink, correction fluid, or the like on the original document is completely dry before loading it on the Platen Glass.

- 1 Load the original document on the Platen Glass.
  - (1) Lift the Document Cover.
  - (2) Load the original on the Platen Glass.
    Place the original face down on the Platen
    Glass

Align the upper left corner of your original with the alignment mark on the upper left corner of the Platen Glass.



## **Important**

- Do not place any objects weighing more than 4.4 lb / 2 kg on the Platen Glass.
   Do not press or put weight on the original with pressure exceeding 4.4 lb / 2 kg. Doing so may cause the scanner to malfunction or the Platen Glass to break.

#### **I** Note

- The machine cannot scan the area within about 0.04 inches / 1 mm from the far edge, and within about 0.04 inches / 1 mm from the left edge of the Platen Glass.
- You can also scan in originals that are up to 0.8 inches / 20 mm thick, such as books. Set them on the Platen Glass in the same way as paper documents.



Gently close the Document Cover.

## Media Types You Cannot Use

Do not use the following types of paper. Using such paper will not only produce unsatisfactory results, but can also cause the machine to jam or malfunction. Additionally, when printing on A5 or smaller sized paper, do not use paper thinner than a post card, including plain paper or notepad paper cut to a small size.

- Folded, curled, or wrinkled paper
- Damp paper
- Paper that is too thin (weighing less than 64 gsm / 17 lb)
- Paper that is too thick (non-Canon genuine paper weighing more than 105 gsm / 28 lb)
- Picture postcards

- Postcards affixed with photos or stickers
- Envelopes with double flaps
- Envelopes with sticker flaps
- Envelopes with an embossed or treated surface
- Any type of paper with holes
- Paper that is not rectangular
- Paper bound with staples or glue
- Paper with adhesives
- Paper decorated with glitter, etc.

### Photo Paper Pro Guidelines

- Do not touch the print surface until the ink is dry (approximately 30 minutes). Colors in dark images may appear indistinct at first, but will become clearer after approximately 30 minutes.
- Images may become smudged if you place printouts in an album before the ink is completely
  dry. We recommend to allow the ink to dry for 24 hours before placing your printouts in an
  album.
- Do not attempt to dry the ink with a hair dryer or by exposing printouts to direct sunlight.
- Do not store or display printouts in hot or humid conditions. Never expose them to heat or direct sunlight.
- Store printouts in photo albums, photo frames, or presentation binders to protect them from direct exposure to air or sunlight.
- Do not mount printouts in an adhesive-type album as you may not be able to remove them.
   Note that some types of clear plastic folders and albums may cause the edges of the paper to turn yellow.

Canon recommends that you use Canon genuine media to ensure optimal print quality.




#### ■ Using the Auto Sheet Feeder and the Front Feeder

You cannot load paper other than A4, Letter, or B5-sized plain paper in the Front Feeder. When using any other type of paper, load it in the Auto Sheet Feeder. For details on loading paper, see "Loading Paper" on page 12.




- (A) Auto Sheet Feeder

#### • When Printing for the First Time

At purchase, the machine is set to feed from the Auto Sheet Feeder. If you are printing without changing paper source settings, load paper in the Auto Sheet Feeder.

#### To Change the Paper Source

The **Auto Sheet Feeder** lamp lights up when feeding from the Auto Sheet Feeder, and the **Front Feeder** lamp lights up when feeding from the Front Feeder.


Before you print, make sure that the paper source selection matches the paper source where you actually loaded paper.

To change the paper source, simply press the **Paper Feed Switch**.

#### ■ Paper Source Selection Scenarios


Deciding on the usage of the two paper sources to print with minimum reloading of paper depends on the variety of the type of paper you use regularly.

#### If you print regularly on photo paper as well as on plain paper

If you use photo paper as much as plain paper, you can load photo paper in the Auto Sheet Feeder and plain paper in the Front Feeder. This way, you can switch the paper source according to the type of paper just by pressing the **Paper Feed Switch**.

#### ■ Note

You cannot load paper other than A4, Letter, or B5-sized plain paper in the Front Feeder. When using any other type of paper, load it in the Auto Sheet Feeder. For details on loading paper, see "Loading Paper" on page 12.

- (B) Front Feeder: Load A4, Letter, or B5-sized plain paper


#### ■ Changing the Paper Source

Before printing, confirm that the location where you have loaded paper is selected as the paper source. Press the **Paper Feed Switch** to change the paper source.

- (C) Front Feeder lamp



- Always load paper in portrait orientation (A). Loading paper in landscape orientation (B) can cause the paper to be jammed.


- You can load up to 150 sheets of plain paper (17 lb / 64 gsm, 0.52 inches / 13 mm in height) in the Auto Sheet Feeder and up to 110 sheets of plain paper (17 lb / 64 gsm, 0.39 inches / 10 mm in height) in the Front Feeder. However, proper feeding of paper may not be possible at this maximum capacity depending on the type of paper or environmental conditions (either very high or low temperature and humidity). In such cases, reduce the sheets of paper you load at a time to around half (around 0.2 inches / 5 mm in paper stack height).
- Do not stack more than 50 sheets in the Paper Output Tray.

#### When Printing on 5" x 7", 4" x 6", or 2.13" x 3.39" (Credit Card-sized) paper

## Scanning Images

You can scan images from the machine to a computer without printing them and save them in popular file formats, such as JPEG, TIFF, bitmaps, or PDF. If you are scanning printed text, you can use the OCR (Optical Character Recognition) software to convert it to text data.

## **Scanning Methods**

### Scanning Using the MP Navigator

Using MP Navigator, you can scan originals loaded on the Platen Glass and view images saved on your computer or on a memory card. Scanned documents can be previewed and be easily printed and edited according to your needs.

## Printing from a PictBridge Compliant Device

You can connect a PictBridge compliant device such as a digital camera, camcorder, or mobile phone and print recorded images directly without using a computer.

#### ■ Note

- PictBridge is an industry standard enabling a range of digital photo solutions, including the direct printing of photos from a digital still camera, camcorder or mobile phone\* without the need to use a computer. A device can be connected to this machine for direct printing regardless of the manufacturer or the model as long as it complies with the PictBridge standard.
- You can select the images to print and specify various print settings from your camera or mobile phone. \* PictBridge compatible digital still cameras, digital camcorders, and camera-equipped mobile phones are hereafter collectively referred to as "PictBridge compliant device".



A device with this mark is PictBridge-compatible.

#### Connecting a PictBridge Compliant Device

To connect a PictBridge compliant device to this machine, use a USB cable recommended by the device's manufacturer.

#### Caution

Do not connect any equipment other than PictBridge compliant devices or optional Bluetooth Units BU-20 to the Direct Print Port of the machine. If you do so, electric shock, fire, or damage to the device could result.

#### **□** Note

When printing photos with the digital device connected to the machine, we recommend the use of the AC adapter supplied with the device. If you are using the device battery, be sure to charge it fully.

When printing directly from a PictBridge compliant device, you can only use the Auto Sheet Feeder as the paper source. Do not load paper in the Front Feeder.



## ■ Printing Photographs Directly from a PictBridge Compliant Device

When operating the device, be sure to follow the instructions given in the instruction manual of your PictBridge compliant device. This section describes the page size, media type, layout, image optimization modes, and date printing mode that can be set on a PictBridge compliant device connected to the machine.

## Confirming or Changing PictBridge Print Settings from Your Camera

To change the page size or media type, operate the device to select the PictBridge print setup mode and confirm or change the settings.

### About the Settings Explained Below

Some setting items explained below may not be available on some devices. In this case, the **Default** setting explained below is applied for the setting item.

\* In the following description, names of settings items are given according to those used in Canon-brand PictBridge compliant devices. Setting item names may be different depending on the brand or model of your device.

#### Printable Image Data Format

This machine prints images taken with a DCF® (Design rule for Camera File system)-compatible digital camera\*, as well as PNG files.

\* Exif2.21 compliant

#### Paper Size and Paper Type Settings

If these settings are set to **Default** (the setting to follow that of the machine) on the PictBridge compliant device, the **Page size** and the **Media type** settings specified in the Memory card mode of the machine are applied.

The following sizes and types of printing paper can be loaded according to the **Paper size** and **Paper type** settings.

- \*1 Exclusively used to print photo stickers. When printing on sticker paper, select 10x15 cm/4" x 6" in Paper size.
- \*2 Can be selected only on certain Canon-brand PictBridge compatible devices.
- \*3 Plain Paper can be selected for Paper type only when Paper size is set to A4 or 8.5" x 11" (Letter). When Paper type is set to Plain Paper, borderless printing will be disabled even when Layout is set to Borderless.
- \*4 You can print in 4-up layout when Paper size is set to A4 or 8.5" x 11" (Letter).

#### Layout and Trimming Settings

If **Layout** is set to **Default** (the setting to follow that of the machine) on the PictBridge compliant device, the print setting specified in the Memory card mode of the machine is applied. The setting on the PictBridge compliant device is applied for **Trimming**.

When printing onto Photo Stickers (PS-101), select N-up for Layout, then select 16-up.

- \* Some PictBridge compliant devices may display the Layout option 2-up, 4-up, 9-up, and 16-up. In this case always select **16-up**.
- \* If there are no options on the PictBridge compliant device that correspond to **16-up**, printing on stickers is not possible.
- \* When printing on Photo Stickers (PS-101), do not set Layout to Borderless.

#### Image Optimize Setting

If **Image optimize** is set to **Default** (the setting to follow that of the machine) on the PictBridge compliant device, the print setting specified in tab 2 of the Setting screen of the Memory card mode of the machine is applied. For details on this setting, refer to the *User's Guide* on-screen manual

If you are using a Canon-brand PictBridge compatible device, additional options of **VIVID**, **NR**, **VIVID+NR**, or **Face** may be available, depending on the model.

\* VIVID prints green and blue portions of photos more vividly.
 NR (Noise Reduction) reduces noise in blue portions, such as the sky, and dark portions.
 VIVID+NR is a combination of the VIVID and NR functions.

Face corrects the contrast of backlit images.

#### Date/File No. Print Setting

You cannot change this setting on this machine. The setting on the PictBridge compliant device is applied.

If the images already have dates superimposed when shot, set this PictBridge setting item to **Off**. If you select **Date**, **File No.**, or **Both**, the date and/or file number will be printed over the date printed by the camera's function.

#### **■** Note

- Never disconnect the USB cable during printing unless when explicitly allowed to by the PictBridge compliant device.
  - When disconnecting the USB cable between the PictBridge compliant device and machine, follow the instructions given in the device's instruction manual.
- You cannot set or do the following by operating on the PictBridge compatible device.
  - Print quality setting
  - Machine maintenance

# **Routine Maintenance**

# Replacing an Ink Tank

When ink runs out, replace the ink tank. The machine will not print if the wrong type of ink tank is used, or if it is installed in the incorrect position.

The machine uses the following ink tanks.





- Be sure to install the ink tanks in the correct order. The proper arrangement from the left is Black 5, Cyan 8, Magenta 9, Yellow 9.
- If printing becomes faint or white streaks appear despite sufficient ink levels, see "When Printing Becomes Faint or Colors Are Incorrect" on page 40.

## ■ Getting the Ink Level Information

You can confirm the ink level in each ink tank by the ink lamps. Open the Scanning Unit (Printer Cover) of the machine to confirm how the ink lamps light or flash.

#### Ink is low:



The ink lamp flashes slowly (at around 3-second intervals). You can continue printing for a while, but we recommend you to have a replacement ink tank available.

#### Ink is out:



The ink lamp flashes quickly (at around 1-second intervals). Replace the ink tank with a new one.

\* If an ink tank related error message is displayed on the LCD, an ink tank error has occurred and the machine is unable to print. For details, see "Error Message Is Displayed on the LCD" on page 57.


#### ■ Knowing When to Replace Ink Tank

Identify the empty ink tank on the LCD and replace it.

#### If the "!" symbol is displayed above an ink tank

If the machine detects low ink when you start printing, an error message such as the following appears on the LCD.

Obtain a replacement tank as soon as possible.



(A) Ink tank with low ink

#### If the "X" symbol is displayed above an ink tank



- (B) Ink tank that may have run out of ink
- Ink may have run out. Replacing the ink tank is recommended.
- Press the **Stop/Reset** button to cancel printing. Replace the ink tank with a new one.
- If printing is in progress and you want to continue printing, press the OK button with the ink tank installed. Then printing can continue. Replacing the ink tank is recommended after the printing. The machine may be damaged if printing is continued under the ink out condition.

#### If an empty ink tank is displayed distinctly from other ink tanks



- (C) Ink tank that has run out of ink
- Ink has run out. Replace the ink tank.
   Printing under the current condition may damage the machine.
- If you want to continue printing in this condition, you need to release the function for detecting
  the remaining ink level. Press and hold the Stop/Reset button for at least 5 seconds, and
  then release it.
  - \* With this operation, releasing the function for detecting the remaining ink level is memorized. Please be advised that Canon shall not be liable for any malfunction or trouble which may be caused by continuation of printing under the ink out condition.

### ■ Replacing Ink Tanks

When ink tanks run out of ink, replace them using the following steps.

## Important

#### Handling Ink

- To maintain optimal printing quality, we recommend the use of specified Canon brand ink tanks.
   Refilling ink is not recommended.
- Once you remove an ink tank, replace it immediately. Do not leave the machine with ink tanks removed.
- Replace empty tanks with new ones. Inserting partially used ink tanks may cause the nozzles to clog. Furthermore, with such tanks, the machine will not be able to inform you when to replace the tanks properly.
- Once an ink tank has been installed, do not remove it from the machine and leave it out in the open. This will cause the ink tank to dry out, and the machine may not operate properly when it is reinstalled. To maintain optimal printing quality, use an ink tank within six months of first use.
- Color ink may be consumed even when printing a black-and-white document or when blackand-white printing is specified.
   Color ink is also consumed in Print Head Cleaning and Print Head Deep Cleaning, which may be necessary to maintain the machine's performance. When an ink tank is out of ink, replace it immediately with a new one.
- 1 Open the Front Feeder.
- Make sure that the machine is turned on, lift the Scanning Unit (Printer Cover) open, and set the Scanning Unit Support to hold the cover.

The Print Head Holder moves to the center.

#### **▲** Caution

- Do not hold the Print Head Holder to stop or move it.
- Do not touch the metallic parts inside the machine.

### Important

If the Scanning Unit (Printer Cover) is left open for more than 10 minutes, the Print Head Holder moves to the right. Close and reopen the Scanning Unit (Printer Cover) to return the holder to the center.


- 3 Remove the ink tank whose lamp is flashing fast.
  - (1) Push the tab and remove the ink tank.


## Important

- Handle ink tanks carefully to avoid staining clothing or the surrounding area.
- Discard empty ink tanks according to the local laws and regulations regarding disposal of consumables.



- Do not remove more than one ink tank at a time. Be sure to replace ink tanks one by one when replacing more than one ink tank.
- For details on ink lamp flashing speed, see "Getting the Ink Level Information" on page 34.





\*1 Do NOT touch the Print Head Lock Lever; remove only the ink tank.

# 4 Prepare the replacement tank.

(1) Remove the new ink tank from its packaging, then pull the orange tape in the direction of the arrow (A) so that the protective film does not remain on the air hole (B). Then remove the film completely (C).


### Important

Make sure that all the orange tape has been peeled off along the perforation. If part of the orange tape is remaining, ink may leak out when you remove the protective cap and may not eject properly when printing.

(2) Remove the orange protective cap from the bottom of the ink tank. Discard the cap once it is removed.

## **Important**

- Be sure to remove the clear film from the ink tank in the exact order shown in step 4-(1), as failure to follow this step may cause the ink to leak and stain your clothes and hands.
- Do not squeeze the side of ink tanks as this may cause the ink to leak out and stain your clothes and hands.
- Do not re-attach the protective cap once you have removed it. Discard it according to the local laws and regulations regarding disposal of consumables.
   Do not touch the open ink port once the protective
- Do not touch the open ink port once the protective cap is removed, as this may prevent the ink from being ejected properly.
- Be careful not to stain your clothes and hands with ink on the removed protective cap.




- \*1 Do not touch the electrical contacts on the ink tank. Doing so can cause the machine to malfunction or become unable to print.
- \*2 Carefully hold the protective cap when removing it to prevent the ink from staining your fingers.

- 5 Install the ink tank.
  - (1) Insert the front end of the ink tank into the Print Head.
  - (2) Press on the rush mark on the ink tank until the ink tank snaps firmly into place.
  - (3) Make sure that the ink tank lamp lights up red.

## Important

The machine cannot be used unless all the ink tanks are installed.



\*1 Make sure the position of the tank matches the label.


6 Lift the Scanning Unit (Printer Cover) slightly to set the Scanning Unit Support back to its original position, and then gently close the Scanning Unit (Printer Cover).

### **▲** Caution

Be sure to hold the Scanning Unit (Printer Cover) firmly, and be careful not to get your fingers caught.

#### ■ Note

- If the error message is still displayed after the Scanning Unit (Printer Cover) is closed, see "Error Message Is Displayed on the LCD" on page 57.
   When you start printing after replacing the ink tank,
- When you start printing after replacing the ink tank, Print Head Cleaning is performed automatically. Do not perform any other operations until Print Head Cleaning finishes.



# **Keeping the Best Printing Results**

To avoid drying of the Print Head and clogging of the nozzles, note the following.

#### ■ When You Turn Off the Machine

Follow the procedure below to turn off the machine.

- (1) Press the **ON/OFF** button to turn off the machine.
- (2) Confirm that the POWER lamp has gone out. This takes a few seconds or as long as around 20 seconds.
- (3) Unplug the power cord from the wall outlet.
  If you are using a power outlet strip, you can switch it off instead.

When you press the **ON/OFF** button to turn off the machine, the machine automatically puts a protective cap on the Print Head to prevent the ink from drying. If you remove the power cord or switch off the power outlet strip before the **POWER** lamp goes out, this capping will not be done properly, causing the Print Head to dry and clog.

#### ■ When You Are Not Using the Machine for a Long Time

When you are not using the machine for a long time, print or copy in both black & white and in color, or perform Print Head Cleaning, about once a month to prevent degradation of the Print Head.

Numerous nozzles are installed in the Print Head for high-precision printing. Just as the uncapped tip of a ballpoint pen or marker becomes dry and unusable if it is not used for a long period of time, the print head nozzles become blocked by dried ink. Periodically printing or cleaning the Print Head can prevent this blockage.

#### **■** Note

- If the printed area is traced with a highlight pen or paint-stick or stained with water or sweat, ink
  may blur depending on the paper.
- If the print head nozzles get clogged, printouts will become faint or particular colors will not be printed properly. For details, see "When Printing Becomes Faint or Colors Are Incorrect" on page 40.

# When Printing Becomes Faint or Colors Are Incorrect

When printing becomes faint or colors are incorrect even if ink remains in the ink tanks, the print head nozzles are probably clogged. Print the nozzle check pattern to confirm the condition of the nozzles and then perform Print Head Cleaning.

If the ruled lines are shifted after running print head maintenance, align the Print Head.

#### ■ Note

#### Before performing maintenance

- Open the Scanning Unit (Printer Cover) and make sure that all lamps for the ink tanks are lit red.
  - If any one of the lamps is flashing slowly, the associated ink tank is running low. You can continue printing for a while, but we recommend you to have a replacement ink tank available.
  - If any one of the lamps is flashing fast, the associated ink tank is empty. Replace the ink tank. See "Replacing Ink Tanks" on page 36.
    If an ink lamp is flashing fast even though ink remains in that ink tank, it is inserted in the wrong position. Make sure that the ink tank of the correct color is inserted in each position, matching the label. See "Replacing an Ink Tank" on page 34.
  - If the ink lamp is not lit, the tank is not set properly. Press the clicks into place. Make sure that all packaging material is peeled off the ink tank. See "Prepare the replacement tank." on page 37.
- Increase the Print Quality setting in the printer driver settings.
   See "Print Results Not Satisfactory" on page 62.




# **Printing the Nozzle Check Pattern**

Print the nozzle check pattern to determine whether the ink ejects properly from the Print Head.

- 1 Make sure that the machine is turned on, open the Front Feeder, and extend the Output Paper Support.
- **2** Load a sheet of A4 or Letter-sized plain paper in the Auto Sheet Feeder or the Front Feeder.
  - Set the Paper Thickness Lever to the left.
- 3 Press the Paper Feed Switch to select the paper source where you have loaded paper.
- 4 Print the nozzle check pattern.
  - (1) Press the Menu button.
  - (2) Use the ◀ or ▶ button to select Maintenance/settings, then press the OK button. The Maintenance/settings screen is displayed.
  - (3) Use the ◀ or ▶ button to select Maintenance, then press the OK button. The Maintenance screen is displayed.
  - (4) Use the ▲ or ▼ button to select Nozzle check and then press the OK button. The pattern print confirmation screen is displayed.



(5) Use the ▲ or ▼ button to select Yes and then press the OK button. The nozzle check pattern is printed, and the pattern confirmation screens are displayed alternately.


# **Examining the Nozzle Check Pattern**

Follow the procedure below to examine the nozzle check pattern, and perform cleaning if necessary.

#### **■** Note

If the ink level is low, the nozzle check pattern is not printed correctly. Replace the relevant ink tank. See "Replacing an Ink Tank" on page 34.

Check the nozzle check pattern you printed.




(1) Check if lines in this pattern are missing.

- (2) Check if there are white streaks in this pattern.




- (A) Good




# **Print Head Cleaning**

Clean the Print Head if lines are missing or if white streaks appear in the printed nozzle check pattern. Cleaning unclogs the nozzles and restores the print head condition. Note that cleaning the Print Head causes used ink to be absorbed in the ink absorber. Cleaning the Print Head consumes ink, so perform Print Head Cleaning only when necessary.

- 1 Make sure that the machine is turned on, open the Front Feeder, and extend the Output Paper Support.
- 2 Load a sheet of A4 or Letter-sized plain paper in the Auto Sheet Feeder or the Front Feeder.

Set the Paper Thickness Lever to the left.

- 3 Press the **Paper Feed Switch** to select the paper source where you have loaded paper.
- 4 Start Print Head Cleaning.
  - (1) Press the Menu button.
  - (2) Use the ◀ or ▶ button to select Maintenance/settings, then press the OK button. The Maintenance/settings screen is displayed.
  - (3) Use the ◀ or ▶ button to select Maintenance, then press the OK button. The Maintenance screen is displayed.
  - (4) Use the ▲ or ▼ button to select Cleaning and then press the OK button. The confirmation screen is displayed.



(5) Use the ▲ or ▼ button to select Yes and then press the OK button.


Print Head Cleaning starts.

Do not perform any other operations until Print Head Cleaning finishes. This takes about 50 seconds.




# **Print Head Deep Cleaning**

If print quality does not improve by standard Print Head Cleaning, try Print Head Deep Cleaning, which is a more powerful process. Note that cleaning the Print Head causes used ink to be absorbed in the ink absorber. Print Head Deep Cleaning consumes more ink than standard Print Head Cleaning, so perform this procedure only when necessary.

- 1 Make sure that the machine is turned on, open the Front Feeder, and extend the Output Paper Support.
- 2 Load a sheet of A4 or Letter-sized plain paper in the Auto Sheet Feeder or the Front Feeder.

Set the Paper Thickness Lever to the left.

- 3 Press the **Paper Feed Switch** to select the paper source where you have loaded paper.
- 4 Start Print Head Deep Cleaning.
  - (1) Press the Menu button.
  - (2) Use the ◀ or ▶ button to select Maintenance/settings, then press the OK button. The Maintenance/settings screen is displayed.
  - (3) Use the ◀ or ▶ button to select Maintenance, then press the OK button. The Maintenance screen is displayed.
  - (4) Use the ▲ or ▼ button to select Deep cleaning and then press the OK button. The confirmation screen is displayed.



(5) Use the ▲ or ▼ button to select Yes and then press the OK button.
Print Head Deep Cleaning starts.
Do not perform any other operations until Print Head Deep Cleaning finishes. This takes about 100 seconds



- **5** Check the condition of the Print Head.
  - (1) Print the nozzle check pattern to check the print head condition. See "Printing the Nozzle Check Pattern" on page 41. If a particular color is not printed properly, replace the ink tank of that color. See "Replacing an Ink Tank" on page 34.
  - (2) If the print head nozzles are still not clean, turn off the machine and perform another Print Head Deep Cleaning after 24 hours.

(3)	If this does not solve the problem, the Print Head may be damaged. Contact your Canon service representative.

# **Aligning the Print Head**

If ruled lines are printed misaligned or print results are otherwise unsatisfactory, adjust the print head position.


- 1 Make sure that the machine is turned on, open the Front Feeder, and extend the Output Paper Support.
- **2** Load a sheet of A4 or Letter-sized plain paper in the Auto Sheet Feeder or Front Feeder.
  - Set the Paper Thickness Lever to the left.
- 3 Press the **Paper Feed Switch** to select the paper source where you have loaded paper.
- 4 Print the Print Head Alignment Sheet.
  - (1) Press the Menu button.
  - (2) Use the ◀ or ▶ button to select Maintenance/settings, then press the OK button. The Maintenance/settings screen is displayed.
  - (3) Use the ◀ or ▶ button to select Maintenance, then press the OK button. The Maintenance screen is displayed.
  - (4) Use the ▲ or ▼ button to select Auto head align and then press the OK button. The confirmation screen is displayed.


#### **■** Note

If you select **Head alignment print**, the machine exits the process after printing the current head position adjustment values.

(5) Use the ▲ or ▼ button to select Yes and then press the OK button.
The Print Head Alignment Sheet is printed.



## **5** Adjust the print head position.

(1) For each row in the Print Head Alignment Sheet (A, B, C, etc.), select the pattern that has the least noticeable streaks, and fill in the corresponding circle ( ) with a dark pencil or a black ink pen.



- (2) Load the Print Head Alignment Sheet on the Platen Glass.

  Place the marked side down and align the upper left corner of the sheet with the arrow mark (alignment mark) at the upper left corner of the Platen Glass.
- (3) Press the OK button. The Print Head Alignment Sheet is scanned and the print head is aligned automatically.

#### **■** Note

- If adjustment was not done successfully, the "Failed to scan head alignment sheet." error message is displayed on the LCD. For details, see "Error Message Is Displayed on the LCD" on page 57
- If the results of Automatic Print Head Alignment are not satisfactory, perform Manual Print Head Alignment. For details, see "Manual Print Head Alignment" on page 49.

## ■ Manual Print Head Alignment

If the results of Automatic Print Head Alignment are not satisfactory, follow the procedure below to perform Manual Print Head Alignment.

For details on performing Automatic Print Head Alignment, see "Automatic Print Head Alignment" on page 48.

- 1 Make sure that the machine is turned on, open the Front Feeder, and extend the Output Paper Support.
- 2 Load two sheets of A4 or Letter-sized plain paper in the Auto Sheet Feeder. Set the Paper Thickness Lever to the left.

## Important

You cannot print the print head alignment pattern if paper of size other than A4 or Letter is loaded. Be sure to use A4 or Letter-sized plain paper.

3 Press the Paper Feed Switch to select the paper source where you have loaded paper.


- 4 Print the Print Head Alignment Sheet.
  - (1) Press the Menu button.
  - (2) Use the ◀ or ▶ button to select Maintenance/settings, then press the OK button. The Maintenance/settings screen is displayed.
  - (3) Use the ◀ or ▶ button to select Maintenance, then press the OK button. The Maintenance screen is displayed.
  - (4) Use the ▲ or ▼ button to select Manual head align and then press the OK button. The confirmation screen is displayed.

#### ■ Note


If you select **Head alignment print**, the machine exits the process after printing the current head position adjustment values.

- (5) Use the ▲ or ▼ button to select Yes and then press the OK button. The print head alignment pattern is printed.
- When "Did the patterns print correctly?" is displayed, confirm that the pattern is printed correctly, use the ▲ or ▼ button to select Yes, then press the OK button.

The input screen for the head position adjustment values is displayed.



- **6** Adjust the print head position.
  - (1) Check the printed patterns and use the ◀ or button to input the number of the pattern in column A that has the least noticeable streaks.



- (2) Move the cursor to column B, and then use the ◀ or ▶ button to input the number of the pattern that has the least noticeable vertical streaks.
- (3) Repeat the procedure until you finish inputting the pattern number for column K.





If it is difficult to pick the best pattern, pick the setting that produces the least noticeable vertical white streaks.

- (4) Check the printed patterns and use the ◀ or ▶ button to input the number of the pattern in column L that has the least noticeable horizontal streaks.





(5) When you have finished inputting all pattern numbers, press the **OK** button.

#### ■ Note

When you turn off the machine, be sure to press the **ON/OFF** button on the machine. Otherwise, the settings made here will not be saved.

# **Cleaning Your Machine**

This section describes the cleaning procedure that is needed to maintain your machine.

#### ▲ Caution


- Be sure to turn off the power and disconnect the power cord before cleaning the machine.
- Do not use tissue paper, paper towels, or similar materials for cleaning. Paper tissue powders or fine
  threads may remain inside the machine and cause problems such as a blocked Print Head and poor
  printing results. Use a soft cloth to avoid scratching the components.
- Never use volatile liquids such as thinners, benzene, acetone, or any other chemical cleaner to clean
  the machine; these can damage the machine's components.

#### Cleaning the Platen Glass and Document Cover

Moisten a clean, soft, lint-free cloth and wring out excess water. With it, wipe the Platen Glass (A) and the inner side of the Document Cover (white sheet) (B). Then wipe with another clean, soft, dry, lint-free cloth, making sure not to leave any residue, especially on the Platen Glass.



The sheet (B) is easily damaged, so wipe it gently.



### ■ Cleaning the Paper Feed Rollers (Roller Cleaning)

Clean the paper feed rollers if paper is not fed properly.

#### Cleaning the Paper Feed Rollers of the Auto Sheet Feeder

Cleaning the paper feed rollers of the Auto Sheet Feeder will wear the rollers, so perform this only when necessary.

- Make sure that the machine is turned on, and then remove any paper from the Auto Sheet Feeder and Front Feeder.
- 2 Press the Paper Feed Switch to select the Auto Sheet Feeder.
- 3 Clean the paper feed rollers.
  - (1) Press the Menu button.
  - (2) Use the ◀ or ▶ button to select Maintenance/settings, then press the OK button. The Maintenance/settings screen is displayed.
  - (3) Use the ◀ or ▶ button to select Maintenance, then press the OK button. The Maintenance screen is displayed.
  - (4) Use the ▲ or ▼ button to select Roller cleaning, then press the OK button. The confirmation screen is displayed.
  - (5) Use the ▲ or ▼ button to select Yes, then press the OK button. The Paper Feed Rollers will rotate as they clean.
- 4 Repeat step 3 twice.
- **5** Open the Front Feeder and extend the Paper Output Support.
- **6** Load three or more sheets of A4 or Letter-sized plain paper in portrait orientation in the Auto Sheet Feeder.

Set the Paper Thickness Lever to the left.

**7** Repeat step 3 three times.

The paper cleans the Paper Feed Rollers as it feeds through the machine.

If there are no signs of improvement after performing cleaning three times, contact a Canon service representative.

## Cleaning the Paper Feed Roller of the Front Feeder

- **1** Turn off the machine.
- **2** Load five or more sheets of A4 or Letter-sized plain paper in the Front Feeder.

#### **I** Note

Paper is loaded to aid the cleaning process and will not be printed on.


- 3 Hold the Rear Cover Lever and then press to the right and pull to remove the Rear Cover.
- 4 Manually rotate the paper feed roller toward you and apply a cotton swab or the like to wipe off dust or stain.
  - (A) Do not touch these.

#### **▲** Caution

Do not touch the small rollers (A) located on the right and left of the paper feed roller as they may come off.

#### **□** Note


- If the dirt is hard to remove, slightly moisten the tip of the cotton swab with water.
- Paper loaded in the Front Feeder will gradually feed and eject as you manually rotate the roller. Remove ejected paper. If you run out of paper while cleaning, reload the paper in the Front Feeder.




Hold the Rear Cover so that the Rear Cover Lever comes to the left. Align the protrusions at the right edge of the cover with the slots at the rear of the machine and press on the lever to reattach the Rear Cover.

# Important

Press firmly on the Rear Cover until it is fit squarely in the rear of the machine. If the Rear Cover is not reattached properly, paper may not be fed properly and cause paper jams.





## ■ Cleaning the Inside of the Machine (Bottom Plate Cleaning)

This section describes how to clean the inside of the machine. If the inside of the machine becomes dirty, printed paper may get dirty, so we recommend performing cleaning regularly.

- Make sure that the machine is turned on, and then remove any paper from the Auto Sheet Feeder.
- **2** Open the Front Feeder and extend the Paper Output Support.
- **3** Fold a single sheet of A4 or Letter-sized plain paper in half widthwise, and then unfold the paper.

4 Load this and only this sheet of paper in the Auto Sheet Feeder with the open side to the front.

Set the Paper Thickness Lever to the left.



- **5** Perform bottom plate cleaning.
  - (1) Press the Menu button.
  - (2) Use the ◀ or ▶ button to select Maintenance/settings, then press the OK button. The Maintenance/settings screen is displayed.
  - (3) Use the ◀ or ▶ button to select Maintenance, then press the OK button. The Maintenance screen is displayed.
  - (4) Use the ▲ or ▼ button to select Bottom plate cleaning, then press the OK button. The confirmation screen is displayed.
  - (5) Use the ▲ or ▼ button to select Yes, then press the OK button. The paper cleans the inside of the machine as it feeds through the machine. If the ejected paper is smudged, clean the inside of the machine again. If the problem is not resolved after performing cleaning again, the protrusions inside the machine may be stained. Clean them according to instructions. See "Cleaning the Protrusions Inside the Machine" on page 55.

## Important


- Even if the Front Feeder is selected as the paper source, paper will be fed from the Auto Sheet Feeder.
- Do not perform any other operation while the bottom plate is being cleaned.

## ■ Cleaning the Protrusions Inside the Machine

If protrusions inside the machine are stained, wipe off any ink from the protrusions using a cotton swab or the like.

# Important

Before cleaning the inner parts, be sure to turn the machine off.

#### ■ Colors Are Uneven or Streaked

Print quality is not set appropriately.	In the Operation Panel, set <b>Print quality</b> in the Copy mode or Memory card mode to <b>High</b> .
	Especially when printing a document that requires a lot of ink, increasing the <b>Print Quality</b> setting in the printer driver settings is effective in reducing uneven colors.

Cleaning the Paper Feed Rollers of the Auto Sheet Feeder will wear the rollers, so perform this procedure only when necessary.  For details on cleaning, see "Cleaning the Paper Feed Rollers (Roller Cleaning)" on page 53.
Paper not loaded properly.	Make sure of the following when you load paper in the machine.  When loading two or more sheets of paper, align the edges of the sheets before loading.  Always load the paper in portrait orientation, either in the Auto Sheet Feeder or the Front Feeder, regardless of the printing orientation.  When loading paper in the Auto Sheet Feeder, load the paper with the print side facing UP. Align the right edge of the paper stack against the Cover Guide and slide the Paper Guide so that it just touches the left edge of the stack.  When loading paper in the Front Feeder, load the paper with the print side facing DOWN. Align the right edge of the paper stack against the right edge of the Front Feeder and slide the Paper Guide against the left edge of the stack. 

Press firmly on the Rear Cover until it is fit squarely in the rear of the machine. If the Rear Cover is not reattached properly, paper may not be fed properly and cause paper jams.

- (4) If you were not able to remove the paper out in step 2, remove it from the Front Feeder. See "Paper jammed in the Paper Output Slot, the Auto Sheet Feeder, or the Front Feeder." on page 70.
- (5) Reload the paper in the Front Feeder and press the **OK** button on the machine.

If you turned off the machine in step 2, all print jobs in queue are canceled. Reprint if necessary.

Machine is not connected properly.	Make sure that the USB cable is plugged in securely to the computer and the machine.
	<ul> <li>If you are using a relay device such as a USB hub, disconnect it, connect the machine directly to the computer, and try printing again. If printing starts normally, there is a problem with the relay device.</li> <li>Consult the reseller of the relay device for details.</li> </ul>

## ■ Error No.: 1700/1710 Is Displayed

### Error No.: 2001 Is Displayed

Cause	Action
No response from connected digital camera or video camcorder. / Connected digital camera or video camcorder connected is not compatible with this machine.	Disconnect the cable connecting the machine and the device, and then reconnect it.
	Depending on the model or brand of your device, you may have to select a PictBridge-compliant print mode on the device before connecting it to the machine. You may also have to turn on the camera or select Play mode manually after connecting the device to the machine.
	Perform necessary operations according your device's instruction manual before reconnecting it to the machine.
	If the error is still unresolved, there is a possibility that you are using a digital camera or digital video camcorder that is not supported by this machine. Use a digital camera or digital video camcorder compatible with this machine.

## **Cannot Print Properly from a Digital Camera**

The following are the possible errors that may occur when printing directly from a digital still camera or digital video camcorder\*, and the actions to resolve them.

\* Hereafter, the digital still cameras and digital video camcorders are collectively referred to as "digital camera" or "camera".

### ■ Note

- PictBridge compatible digital cameras can be connected to your machine for direct printing.
- This section describes errors that are indicated on Canon-brand PictBridge compatible cameras. The error messages and operations may vary depending on the camera you are using. If you are using a non-Canon PictBridge compatible camera and not sure how to dismiss the printer error message from the camera, check the error message displayed on the LCD and dismiss the error message. For details on dismissing an error message from the machine, see "Error Message Is Displayed on the LCD" on page 57.
- A communication time out occurs if printing takes a long time or if it takes too much time to send data.
   This may cancel printing. In such cases, disconnect the cable between the machine and the camera, and then reconnect it. Turn the camera on if it does not turn on automatically. If the problem is still not resolved, select a different photo and check if it can be printed.
- Your PictBridge compatible device may need to be switched to printing mode before it is connected to
  the machine, depending on the model of the camera. Also, it may need to be turned on manually or
  switched to playback mode after connected to the machine. Refer to your camera's instruction manual
  and take perform necessary operation before connection.
- The print head nozzles may be clogged if printing becomes faint or colors are incorrect. See "When Printing Becomes Faint or Colors Are Incorrect" on page 40.
- If the paper is curled or its surface is scratched during printing, make sure that you are using the correct type of paper. If the problem is not resolved by using the correct type of paper, adjust the position of the Paper Thickness Lever. See "Inappropriate Paper Thickness Lever setting." on page 65.
- For the errors indicated on the camera and their solution, also refer to your camera's instruction manual. For details on other troubles with a digital camera, contact the manufacturer of the camera.

<b>Error Message On Camera</b>	Action
"Printer in use"	The machine is busy, perhaps processing a print job from the computer.
	Wait until printing is complete. If the machine is warming up, wait until the warm- up is complete. When it is ready, the machine starts printing your print job automatically.
"No paper"	Load paper in the Auto Sheet Feeder and select <b>Continue</b> *1 in the display on your camera.

"Paper Error"	<ul> <li>The Front Feeder is selected on the machine. Load the paper in the Auto Sheet Feeder, press the Paper Feed Switch to select the Auto Sheet Feeder as the paper source, then select Stop in the display on your camera and try printing again.</li> </ul>

	<ul> <li>The paper size setting specified on the machine is not supported by your camera. Specify a paper size that is supported by your camera.</li> </ul>

"Printer cover open"	Close the Scanning Unit (Printer Cover) on the machine.

	If the Print Head is already installed, remove the Print Head and then reinstall it.
	If the error is still not resolved, the Print Head may be damaged. Contact your Canon service representative.

"ink absorber <sup>*2</sup> full"	The machine has a built-in ink absorber to hold the ink used during Print head cleaning, for example.
	You can continue printing by selecting <b>Continue</b> *1 on the display on your camera.
	However, because printing is disabled once the ink absorber becomes completely full and until the ink absorber is replaced, you are recommended to contact a Canon service representative as early as possible. (You will need to replace a particular part of the machine.)
"No ink"	An ink tank is not installed properly, or is out of ink.
	Confirm the error message displayed on the LCD and take the appropriate action to resolve the error. For details, see "Error Message Is Displayed on the LCD" on page 57.
"Ink Error"	An ink tank that was once empty is installed.
	Replace the ink tank and close the Scanning Unit (Printer Cover).
	Printing with an ink tank that was once empty may damage the machine.
	If you want to continue printing in this condition, you need to release the function for detecting the remaining ink level. Press and hold the <b>Stop/Reset</b> button for at least 5 seconds, and then release it.
	* With this operation, releasing the function for detecting the remaining ink level is memorized. Please be advised that Canon shall not be liable for any machine malfunction or damage caused by refilled ink tanks.
	See "Replacing an Ink Tank" on page 34.
"Hardware Error"	An ink tank error has occurred. Replace the ink tank. See "Replacing an Ink Tank" on page 34.
"Printer error"	An error requiring servicing may have occurred. (Machine's <b>POWER</b> lamp flashes green and <b>Alarm</b> lamp flashes orange alternately.)
	Disconnect the cable between the machine and the camera, turn off the machine, and unplug the power cord of the machine from the power supply.  After a while, plug the power cord of the machine back in, turn on the machine, and then reconnect the camera to the machine.
	If the same error occurs, contact your Canon service representative.

<sup>\*1</sup>To resume printing, you can also press the **OK** button on the machine instead of selecting **Continue** on the camera.

<sup>\*2</sup>The ink absorber absorbs ink used during cleaning, for example. If this message appears, you will need to call for servicing to replace the absorber and to check the machine for proper operation.

# **Cannot Print Properly from a Photo Index Sheet**

Cause	Action
"Failed to scan Photo Index Sheet." is displayed.	Make sure the Photo Index Sheet is set in the correct position and orientation on the Platen Glass.
	Make sure the Platen Glass and the Photo Index Sheet are not dirty.
	<ul> <li>Make sure all required circles on the Photo Index Sheet are filled in. If the filled circles on the sheet are not marked dark enough, the machine may not read the settings.</li> </ul>
	Refer to "Printing by Using the Photo Index Sheet" in "Other Useful Functions" of the <i>User's Guide</i> on-screen manual.
