## General Guide

Press (c) to change from mode to mode

- In any mode, press (B) to illuminate the display for about one second.
- In any mode, hold down © for about one second to return to the Timekeeping

Timekeeping

## Day of week

Use the Timekeeping Mode to set and view the current time and date.

Month - Day To set the time and date

1. In the Timekeeping Mode, hold down (A) until the seconds start to flash, which indicates the setting screen.
2. Press (C) to move the flashing in the sequence shown below to select other settings.

3. When the setting you want to change is flashing, press (D) to change it as described below.

| To change this setting | Perform this button operation |
| :--- | :--- |
| Seconds | Press © to reset to $\mathbf{0 0}$. |
| Hour, Minutes, Year, Month, Day | Press (D) to increase the setting. |

- Pressing (D) while the seconds are in the range of 30 to 59 resets them to 00 and adds 1 to the minutes. In the range of 00 to 29, the minutes are unchanged.

4. Press (A) to exit the setting screen

- The day of the week is automatically displayed in accordance with the date (year, month, and day) settings.
- The year can be set in the range of 2000 to 2099
- The watch's built-in full automatic calendar automatically makes allowances for different month lengths and leap years. Once you set the date, there should be no reason to change it except after you have the watch's battery replaced

To toggle between 12-hour and 24-hour timekeeping
In the Timekeeping Mode, press (D) to toggle between 12-hour timekeeping and 24-hour timekeeping.
With the 12-hour format, the $\mathbf{P}$ (PM) indicator appears to the left of the hour digits for times in the range of noon to $11: 59$ p.m. and no indicator appears to the left of the hour digits for times in the range of midnight to 11:59 a.m.

- With the 24 -hour format, times are displayed in the range of 0:00 to 23:59, without any indicator.
- The 12 -hour/24-hour timekeeping format you select in the Timekeeping Mode is applied in all other modes.


## Alarms

| Alarm date (Month - Day) | You can set up to five independent multi-function alarms with hour, minutes, month, and day. When an alarm is turned on the alarm tone sounds when the alarm time |

## Alarm Types

The alarm type is determined by the settings you make, as described below.

## - Daily alarm

Set the hour and minutes for the alarm time. This type of setting causes the alarm to sound everyday at the time you set.

## - Date alarm

Set the month, day, hour and minutes for the alarm time. This type of setting causes the alarm to sound at the specific time, on the specific date you set.

## - 1-Month alarm

Set the month, hour and minutes for the alarm time. This type of setting causes the alarm to sound everyday at time you set, only during the month you set.

## - Monthly alarm

Set the day, hour and minutes for the alarm time. This type of setting causes the alarm to sound every month at time you set, on the day you set.

To set an alarm time


1. In the Alarm Mode, use (D) to scroll through the alarm screens until the one whose time you want to set is displayed.


- To set a one-time alarm, display one of the screens indicated by an alarm number from $\boldsymbol{?}$ through $\mathbf{5}$. To set the snooze alarm, display the screen indicated by $\mathbf{i}$.

2. After you select an alarm, hold down (A) until the hour setting of the alarm time
starts to flash, which indicates the setting screen.

- This operation automatically turns on the alarm.

3. Press (C) to move the flashing in the sequence shown below to select other settings.

4. While a setting is flashing, press (D) to increase it.

- To set an alarm that does not include a month (Daily alarm, Monthly alarm), set for the month. Press (D) until the - mark appears (between 12 and 1) while month setting is flashing
- To set an alarm that does not include a day (Daily alarm, 1-Month alarm), set for the day. Press (D) until the -- mark appears (between the end of the month and 1) while the day setting is flashing.
- When setting the alarm time using the 12 -hour format, take care to set the time correctly as a.m. or p.m. (P indicator).

5. Press (A) to exit the setting screen.

## Alarm Operation

The alarm tone sounds at the preset time for 10 seconds, regardless of the mode the watch is in. In the case of the snooze alarm, the alarm operation is performed a total of seven times, evare five minutes, until you turn the operation is performed

- To stop the alarm tone after it starts to sound, press any button
- Performing any one of the following operations during a 5-minute interval between
snooze alarms cancels the current snooze alarm operation.

In the Alarm Mode, hold down (D) to sound the alarm

To turn Alarms? through S and the Hourly Time Signal on and off
 Hourly Time Signal on indicator

1. In the Alarm Mode use (D) to select a one-time alarm
(alarm number 3 through 5) or the Hourly Time Signa (:9ic)
2. Press (A) to toggle it on and off.

- The on/off status of Alarms $\boldsymbol{Z}$ through $\mathbf{5}$ and the Hourly Time Signal is shown by indicators along the bottom o the displays.
- ine alarm on indicators and Hourly Time Signal on indicator are displayed in all modes
- While an alarm is sounding, the applicable alarm on indicator flashes on the display.

Countdown Time


The countdown timer can be set within a range of one minute to 24 hours. An alarm sounds when the countdown reaches zero.

- You can also select auto-repeat, which automatically restarts the countdown from the original value you set whenever zero is reached.
- All of the operations in this section are performed in the Countdown Timer Mode, which you enter by pressing (C) (page E-5).
To use the countdown timer
Press (D) while in the Countdown Timer Mode to start the countdown timer.
When the end of the countdown is reached and auto-repeat is turned off, the alarm sounds for 10 seconds or until you stop it by pressing any button. The countdown time is automatically reset to its starting value after the alarm stops

To select the operation of Alarm :

1. In the Alarm Mode, use (D) to select Alarm :
2. Press (A) to cycle through the available settings in the sequence shown below.

- The snooze on indicator (SNZ) and Alarm $\boldsymbol{f}$ on indicator are displayed in all modes. - The snooze on indicator (SNZ) flashes during the 5 -minute intervals between
alarms
- The alarm indicator (Alarm ; on and/or SNZ) flashes while the alarm is sounding.


## To turn auto-repeat on and off

Auto-repeat indicator 1. In the Countdown Timer Mode, hold down (A) until the 1. In the Countdown Timer Mode, hold down (A) until the
hours setting of the countdown start time starts to flash, which indicates the setting screen
2. Press (B) to toggle auto-repeat on (A.RPT displayed) Nat off (A.RPT not displayed)

- Note illuat pressing (B) in the above operation also turns on illumination.
When the end of the countdown is reached while auto-repeat is on, the alarm sounds, but the countdown restarts from the beginning without stopping. You can
top the countdown by pressing (D) and manually reset to the start time by pressing $\AA$ A the start time by pressing (A).

- The countdown timer measurement operation continues even if you exit the Countdown Timer Mode.
- Press (D) while a countdown operation is in progress to pause it. Press (D) again to

(ely stop a countdown operation, first pause it (by pressing (D)), and then press (A). This returns the countdown time to its starting value

## Stopwatch



The stopwatch lets you measure elapsed time, split times, and two finishes.

- The display range of the stopwatch is 23 hours, 59 minutes, 59.99 seconds
- The stopwatch continues to run, restarting from zero after it reaches its limit, until you stop it.
- The stopwatch measurement operation continues even if you exit the Stopwatch Mode.
- Exiting the Stopwatch Mode while a split time is frozen on the display clears the split time and returns to elapsed time measurement
- All of the operations in this section are performed in the Stopwatch Mode, which you enter by pressing © (page $\mathrm{E}-5$ ).

## Dual Time

The Dual Time Mode lets you keep track of time in a different time zone.

- In the Dual Time Mode, the seconds count is synchronized with the seconds count
of the Timekeeping Mode.


## To set the Dual Time

## Illumination



An LED (light-emitting diode) and a light guide panel illuminate the entire display for easy reading in the dark

- Illumination may be hard to see when viewed under direc sunlight.
- Illumination turns off automatically whenever an alarm sounds.
- Frequent use of illumination runs down the battery life.

To illuminate the display
In any mode, press (B) to illuminate the display for about one second.

## Reference

This section contains more detailed and technical information about watch operation. It also contains important precautions and notes about the various features and functions of this watch.

## Auto return features

If you leave a screen with flashing digits for two or three minutes without performing any operation, the watch automatically saves any settings you have made up to that point and exits the setting screen.

Data and Setting Scrolling
The (D) button is used to scroll through setting screen data on the display. Holding down this button during a scroll operation scrolls through the data at high speed.
