Belt Clip To Install or Replace Batteries:

Remove belt clip by releasing belt clip latch and sliding clip up.

2. Pull up on the battery door latch to remove the battery compartment cover.

3 Insert three (3) AAA hatteries Position batteries according to polarity markings.

4. Replace battery compartment cover

and belt clip.

Do not attempt to charge alkaline batteries.

Do not mix alkaline, standard (carbon-zinc), or rechargeable (Ni-Cd, Ni-MH, etc.) batteries.

During charging your radios will show one of the following: 1) The low battery icon will flash to show charging action. -or- 2) The display will show circling icon to show charging action. It is recommended to turn OFF the radios during charging. Charge the radios for 16 hours.
