



Safety Instructions

A WARNING

TO REDUCE THE RISK OF FIRE, ELECTRICAL SHOCK, OR INJURY TO PERSONS, OBSERVE THE FOLLOWING:

- a. Use this unit only in a manner intended by the manufacturer. If you have questions, contact the manufacturer.
- b. Before servicing or cleaning unit, switch power off at service panel and lock service panel disconnecting means to prevent power from being switched on accidentally. When the service disconnecting means cannot be locked, securely fasten a warning device, such as a tag, to the service panel.
- 1. Read your owner's manual carefully and keep it for future reference.
- 2. Be careful of the fan and blades when cleaning, painting, or working near the fan. Always turn off the power to the ceiling fan before servicing.
- 3. Do not put anything into the fan blades while they are turning.
- 4. Do not operate reversing switch until fan blades have come to a complete stop.

Additional Safety Instructions for Installation

- 1. To avoid possible shock, be sure electricity is turned off at the fuse box before wiring, and do not operate fan without blades.
- 2. All wiring must be in accordance with the National Electrical Code "ANSI/NFPA 70-2014" and Local Electrical Codes. Use the National Electrical Code if Local Codes do not exist. The ceiling fan must be grounded as a precaution against possible electrical shock. Electrical installation should be made or approved by a licensed electrician.

- 3. The outlet box and joist must be securely mounted and capable of reliably supporting at least 50 pounds. Use only U.L. outlet boxes listed as "Acceptable for Fan Support of 22.7 kg. (50 lbs.) or less", and use the mounting screws provided with the outlet box. Most outlet boxes commonly used for support of light fixtures are not acceptable for fan support and may need to be replaced. Consult a qualified electrician if in doubt.
- 4. The downrod furnished with the fan provides the minimum recommended floor to fan blade clearance for an 8 foot ceiling.
- 5. The fan must be mounted with the fan blades at least 7 feet from the floor to prevent accidental contact with the fan blades.
- 6. Follow the recommended instructions for the proper method of wiring your ceiling fan. If you do not know enough about electrical wiring, have your fan installed by a licensed electrician.

WARNING: To reduce the risk of electrical shock, this fan must be installed with an isolating wall control/ switch.

NOTE: This fan is suitable for use with solid-state speed controls.

WARNING: This product is designed to use only those parts supplied with this product and/or any accessories designated specifically for use this product by Emerson Electric Co. Substitution of parts or accessories not designated for use with this product by Emerson could result in personal injury or property damage.

WARNING: To reduce the risk of personal injury, do not bend the blade flange when installing the blade flanges, balancing the blades or cleaning the fan. Do not insert foreign objects in between rotating fan blades.

WARNING: To avoid fire, shock or injury, do not use an Emerson or any other brand of control not specifically approved for this fan.

NOTE: All setscrews must be checked and re-tightened where necessary before installation.





Remove the fan motor assembly from the protective plastic bag. Place the fan assembly into the lower foam pad with the top of the motor facing up.

The lower foam pad serves as a holder for the fan during assembly.

Materials

Wiring outlet box and box connectors must be of type required by the local code. The minimum wire would be a 3-conductor (2-wire with ground) of following size:

Your Emerson Ceiling Fan comes supplied with a SW605 Fan Wall Control and a installed DC receiver. This system allows you to regulate your ceiling fan speed.

This Emerson Ceiling Fan may be used with the following accessories: SR600 Remote Control.

WARNING

Before assembling your ceiling fan, refer to section on proper method of wiring your fan (page 12). If you feel you do not have enough wiring knowledge or experience, have your fan installed by a licensed electrician.

2. Electrical Requirements

Your new ceiling fan will require a grounded electrical supply line of 120 volts AC, 60 Hz, 15 amp circuit.

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WARNING

To reduce the risk of fire, electric shock, or personal injury, mount fan to outlet box marked "Acceptable for Fan Support of 22.7 kg. (50 lbs.) or less", and use screws supplied with outlet box. Most outlet boxes commonly used for support of light fixtures are not acceptable for fan support and may need to be replaced. Consult a qualified electrician if in doubt.

A WARNING

Turning off wall switch is not sufficient. To avoid possible electrical shock, be sure electricity is turned off at the main fuse box before wiring. All wiring must be in accordance with National and Local codes and the ceiling fan must be properly grounded as a precaution against possible electrical shock. The outlet box must be securely anchored and capable of withstanding a load of at least 50 pounds.

If your fan is to replace an existing ceiling light fixture, turn electricity off at the main fuse box at this time and remove the existing light fixture.


3. Ceiling Fan Assembly

3.1

Remove the hanger ball by loosening the Phillips head set screw in the hanger ball until the ball falls freely down the downrod (Figure 1).

Remove the pin from the downrod, then remove the hanger ball (Figure 1).


Retain the pin and hanger ball for reinstallation in Step 3.7.



3.2

Separate, untwist and unkink the two 80" motor leads.

Route the two motor leads through the downrod (Figure 2).




3.3

Loosen the two Phillips head set screws in the motor coupler for installation of the downrod (Figure 3).

Seat the 4.5" downrod in the motor coupler (Figure 3).

Rotate and align the downrod holes with all the holes in the motor coupler (Figure 3).



3.4

Align the clevis pin holes in the downrod with the holes in the motor coupler.


Install the clevis pin and secure with the hairpin clip (Figure 4).

The clevis pin must go through the holes in the motor coupler. It is critical that the clevis pin in the motor coupler is properly installed and securely tightened.

Retighten the Phillips head screws to secure the downrod to the motor (Figure 4).


A WARNING

It is critical that the clevis pin and setscrews in the motor coupler are properly installed and securely tightened. Failure to verify that the pin and setscrews are properly installed could result in the fan falling.



3.5


Make sure the grommet is properly installed in the coupling cover, then slide the coupling cover on the downrod until it rests on the motor housing (Figure 5).



3.6

Place the ceiling cover over the downrod (Figure 6).

Be sure that the ceiling cover and the coupling cover are both oriented correctly (Figure 6).





3.7


Route the two motor leads through the hanger ball (Figure 7).

Reinstall the hanger ball on the downrod as follows:

Position the pin through the two holes in the downrod and align the hanger ball so the pin is captured in the groove in the top of the hanger ball (Figure 7).

Pull the hanger ball up tight against the pin and securely retighten the Phillips head screw in the hanger ball (Figure 7).

A loose Phillips head screw could create fan wobble.




3.8

The fan comes with black and white leads that are $80^{\prime\prime}\,\text{long.}$

Measure up approximately 6 to 9-inches above top of hanger ball/4.5" downrod assembly (Figure 8).

Cut off excess leads and strip back insulation 1/2-inch from end of leads.




3.9

Carefully turn the partially assembled ceiling fan upside down, place the ceiling fan onto the two carton styrofoam pieces, in preparation for final assembly (Figure 9).

Remove each of the ten spacer screws and five rubber shipping spacers from the motor hub before installation of blade assemblies (Figure 9).

Discard the five rubber shipping spacers and ten spacer screws.



3.10

NOTE: Your ceiling fan will operate with the following Blade Select Blades (Sold Separately):


B77, B78, B79, B90, B91, B92, B97, B100, B101, B102, B103, B107, B108, B109, G44, G54, & G60.

Mount the fan blade (sold separately) using the four $#10-24 \times 12$ mm round head screws and flat washers (supplied in parts bag) to secure flange to blade (Figure 10).

Repeat for the remaining four blades.

Make sure all screws are tighten securely in the fan blade and flange.

NOTE: Some accessory blades are supplied with shorter screws. These shorter screws MUST be used to assemble the blades to flanges.





3.11

Loosely attach one blade/flange assembly to the motor hub by securing the two $#10-32 \times 5/8$ " oval head screws (supplied in parts bag) (Figure 11).


Install remaining blade assemblies in the same way. Gently snug all flange screws to the motor hub, working around the hub in a clockwise sequence.

The blade flanges have an interlocking feature that must be fully engaged before tightening the screw. Make sure all the flanges are properly engaged and then tighten the flange screws. If one of the flanges does not seat properly on the motor hub, loosen the adjacent flange screws, reengage and reseat the flanges, then tighten the screws again.

NOTE: Take care not to scratch fan housing when installing blades.

A WARNING

To reduce the risk of personal injury, do not bend the blade flange when installing the blade flanges, balancing the blades or cleaning the fan. Do not insert foreign objects in between rotating fan blades.




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4. How to Hang Your Ceiling Fan

A WARNING

The fan must be hung with at least 7' of clearance from floor to blades (Figure 12).



A WARNING

The outlet box and joist must be securely mounted and capable of supporting at least 50 lbs. Use only a U.L. outlet box listed as "Acceptable for Fan Support of 22.7 kg. (50 lbs.) or less".

A WARNING


To reduce the risk of fire, electric shock, or personal injury, mount fan to outlet box marked "Acceptable for Fan Support of 22.7 kg. (50 lbs.) or less", and use screws supplied with outlet box. Most outlet boxes commonly used for support of light fixtures are not acceptable for fan support and may need to be replaced. Consult a qualified electrician if in doubt.

4.1

Securely attach the hanger bracket to the outlet box using the two screws supplied with the outlet box. (Figure 13).

A WARNING

Hanger bracket must seat firmly against outlet box. If the outlet box is recessed, remove wall board until bracket contacts box. If bracket and/or outlet box are not securely attached, the fan could wobble or fall.





4. How to Hang Your Ceiling Fan (Continued)

4.2

Carefully lift the fan and seat the hanger ball/ downrod assembly on the hanger bracket that was just attached to the outlet box (Figure 14).

Be sure the groove in the ball is engaged with the antirotation tab on the hanger bracket (Figure 14).


A WARNING

Failure to seat tab in groove could cause damage to electrical wires and possible shock or fire hazard.

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WARNING

To avoid possible fire or shock, do not pinch wires between the hanger ball/downrod assembly and hanger bracket.



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5. How to Wire Your Ceiling Fan

If you feel that you do not have enough electrical wiring knowledge or experience, have your fan installed by a licensed electrician.

WARNING

To avoid possible electrical shock, be sure electricity is turned off at the main fuse box before wiring.

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
NOTE: If you are not sure if the outlet box is grounded, contact a licensed electrician for advice, as it must be grounded for safe operation.

5.1

Connect the green grounding lead from the hanger ball and the green grounding lead from the hanger bracket to the grounding conductor of supply (this may be a bare wire or wire with green colored insulation). Securely connect wires with wire connectors (supplied) (Figure 15).



Securely connect the fan motor white wire to the supply white (neutral) wire using wire connector (supplied) (Figure 16).





Securely connect the fan motor black wire to the supply black (hot) wire using wire connector (supplied) (Figure 17).




5.4

After connections have been made, turn leads upward and carefully push leads into the outlet box, with the white and green leads on one side of the outlet box and position the black lead on the other side of the outlet box (Figure 18).

A WARNING


Check to see that all connections are tight, including ground, and that no bare wire is visible at the wire connectors, except for the ground wire. Do not operate fan until blades are in place. Noise and fan damage could result.



5. How to Wire Your Ceiling Fan (Continued)

5.5

Screw the two threaded studs (supplied) into the tapped holes in the hanger bracket (Figure 19).



5.6


Lift the ceiling cover up to the threaded studs and turn until studs protrude through the holes in the ceiling cover (Figure 20).

Secure the ceiling cover in place by sliding lockwashers over the threaded studs and installing the two knurled knobs (supplied). (Figure 20).

Tighten the knurled knobs securely until the ceiling cover fits snugly against the ceiling and the hole in the ceiling cover is clear of the downrod.

A WARNING

To avoid possible fire or shock, make sure that the electrical wires are completely inside the outlet box and not pinched between the ceiling cover and the ceiling.




6. Final Assembly

6.1

Remove one #6-32 x 3/8" round head screw with lockwasher from the motor hub and retain for later use (Figure 21).

Loosen the other two #6-32 x 3/8" round head screws with lockwashers on the motor hub for the installation of the switch housing adapter (Figure 21).



6.2

Place the motor hub connector through the center hole of the switch housing adapter.

Place the switch housing adapter onto the motor hub, aligning the three screw holes.

Rotate the switch housing adapter key hole slots counterclockwise to engage both loosened screws (Figure 22).

Reinstall the previous removed #6-32 x 3/8" round head screw with lockwasher (Figure 22).

Secure the switch housing to the motor hub by tightening the three switch housing screws.

Spare #6-32 x 3/8" round head screw with lockwasher supplied in parts bag.


6. Final Assembly (Continued)

6.3

The switch housing assembly connector and the motor hub connector are keyed and color-coded and must be mated correctly (same color-to-color) before they can be engaged.

Engage the connector of the switch housing assembly with the motor hub connector (Figure 23).

Make sure the connector latch closes properly.




6.4

Tuck all the wires and connectors into the switch housing adapter.

Align the three screw holes of the switch housing assembly.

Secure the switch housing assembly to the switch housing adapter using the three $#6-32 \times 3/8$ " flat head screws (supplied in parts bag) (Figure 24).





7. Wall Control Procedures

7.1

Your Emerson Ceiling Fan/Light Control consists of wall mounted transmitter and a receiver which is mounted under the fan ceiling cover. The remote control is designed to separately control your ceiling fan speed and light intensity. Code switches in the transmitter and receiver may be set in 32 different positions. If your fan and light go on and off without using your control, you may be getting interference from other remote units such as garage door openers, car alarms or security systems. To remedy this situations, simply change the combination code in your transmitter and receiver.

7.2

Your wall control has code switches which must be set in one of 32 possible code combinations (Figure 25). The five levers (numbered 1, 2, 3, 4, and 5) on the switches are factory-set in the ON (up) position. Change the switch settings as follows:

NOTE: Do not duplicate the code of an existing control of an installed ceiling fan within 100 feet.

7.3


Slide the five switch levers in the wall control to your choice of ON (up) or down positions. Use a ball-point pen or small screwdriver and slide the levers firmly up or down.

7.4

The sixth switch marked ON and I is for dimming control of lights: Set switch to ON to allow for dimming of the lights. Set switch to I for no dimming of the lights such as for fluorescent bulbs and non-dimming CFLs.

7.5

Preset Memory Feature: Your Emerson receiver is equipped with a preset memory feature. If the AC supply to the receiver is powered through a wall switch, when the switch is turned OFF, the control will remember the light intensity and fan speed. When the switch is turned back ON the light and fan will resume operation as they were prior to the switch being turned OFF.



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8. Wall Control Installation

8.1

🕰 WARNING

Turning off wall switch is not sufficient. To avoid possible electrical shock, be sure electricity is turned off at the main fuse or circuit breaker box before wiring. All wiring must be in accordance with National and Local codes and the ceiling fan must be properly grounded as a precaution against possible electrical shock.

This control is designed to operate only one ceiling fan

NOTE: Electric connections should be in accordance with the National Electrical Codes and all Local Codes. Before starting, disconnect power to the circuit at the fuse box or circuit breaker panel.

Remove the faceplate and screws from the existing wall switch. Pull switch out from wall outlet box.

Disconnect the wire from the existing fan wall switch (Figure 26).



CAUTION: To reduce the risk of electrical shock, disconnect the electrical supply circuit before installing the fan, light kit or receiver.


NOTE: Make all wiring connections using wire connectors (supplied). Make sure that all connections are tight, including ground, and that no bare wire is visible at the wire connectors, except for the ground wire.

8.2

Disconnect electrical power to the branch circuit at the circuit breaker or fuse box before attempting to install the ceiling fan wall control into the outlet box.


8.3

Remove faceplate and screws from existing wall control. Pull control out from the wall box. Determine the "hot" wire and the "load" wire and disconnect these wires from control (Figure 27). Do not attempt to disconnect any wires not already connected to existing control.



WARNING

Turning off wall switch is not sufficient. To avoid possible electrical shock, be sure electricity is turned off at the main fuse or circuit breaker box before wiring. All wiring must be in accordance with National and Local codes and the ceiling fan must be properly grounded as a precaution against possible electrical shock.





8. Wall Control Installation (Continued)

8.4

Before installing wall control, place wall control in "OFF" mode by pushing "ON/OFF" switch to the "OFF" position.

8.5

Connect one black wire of wall control to the "hot" wire. Securely connect wires with wire connectors supplied (Figure 28).

8.6

Connect one black wire of wall switch to the "load" (black) wire in wall box. Securely connect wires with wire connector supplied.

8.7

Screw wall control into wall box using the supplied screws. Leave wall control in "OFF" mode until fan installation is completed.

A WARNING

Check to see that all connections are tight and that no bare wires are visible at the wire connectors.

8.8


The wall control is supplied with a white, ivory, and almond color switch covers. Choose the finish that best suits your needs and snap the cover onto the wall control (Figure 28).

8.9

Install decorator wall plate using the two screws provided with wall plate. Leave wall control in "OFF" mode until fan installation is completed (Figure 28).

A WARNING

Do not connect any neutral (white) wire to this control. Incorrect wiring will damage this control.



8. Wall Control Installation (Continued)

3-WAY INSTALLATION

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(One fan controlled by two different wall controls) (See Figures 29 and 30).

WARNING

Turning off wall switch is not sufficient. To avoid possible electrical shock, be sure electricity is turned off at the main fuse or circuit breaker box before wiring. All wiring must be in accordance with National and Local codes and the ceiling fan must be properly grounded as a precaution against possible electrical shock.

8.10

Disconnect electrical power to the branch circuit at the circuit breaker or fuse box before attempting to install the ceiling fan wall control into the outlet box.

8.11

At all wall box locations remove faceplates and screws from existing controls. Pull controls out from wall boxes and determine which wall box contains the "hot" lead and which wall box contains the "load" wire. Also, identify traveler wires which are common to both wall boxes. Disconnect wires from existing controls only. Do not attempt to disconnect any wires not already connected to existing controls.

8.12


Before installing wall control, place wall control in "OFF" mode by pushing "ON/OFF" switch to the "OFF" position.

8.13

Install a wall control in the wall box containing the "hot" wire first. Connect the black wire of the wall control to the "hot" wire. Securely connect wires with wire connectors supplied.

8.14

Connect one black wire of the wall control to both remaining traveler wires in the wall box and secure with wire connector supplied.





8. Wall Control Installation (Continued)

3-WAY WIRING DIAGRAM: NEW CONSTRUCTION

NOTE: Retrofit 3-way installations are likely to include two traveler wires between the two wall boxes. In new construction, only one traveler wire Is required (See Figure 30).

WARNING

Check to see that all connections are tight and that no bare wires are visible at the wire connectors.

8.15

Screw the SW605 wall control into wall box using the supplied screws. Leave wall control in "OFF" mode until fan installation is completed.

8.16

Next, install the other SW605 wall control into the wall box containing the load wire. Connect the black wire of the SW605 wall control to the traveler wire(s) already connected to the black wire (in the other wall box). Secure with wire connectors supplied.

8.17


Connect one black wire of the SW605 wall control to the "load" (black) wire and secure with wire connector supplied.

8.18

Connect one black wire of the SW605 wall control to both remaining traveler wires in the wall box and secure with wire connector supplied.

8.19

Screw the SW605 wall control into wall boxes using the supplied screws. Leave the SW605 wall control in "OFF" mode until fan installation is completed.



8.20

The SW605 wall control is supplied with a white, ivory, and almond color switch covers. Choose the finish that best suits your needs and snap the cover onto the SW605 wall control (Refer to Figure 28).

8.21

Install decorator wall plates using the two screws provided with wall plate. Leave the SW605 wall control in "OFF" mode until fan installation is completed (Refer to Figure 28).

9. Programming the Receiver Operating Frequency & High Speed Conditioning of Fan Control

-- Important - Read This Section Carefully and Follow the High Speed Conditioning Instructions Closely --

PROGRAMMING THE RECEIVER OPERATING FREQUENCY & HIGH SPEED CONDITIONING OF FAN CONTROL

IMPORTANT: Ceiling fan blades <u>MUST</u> be installed before high speed conditioning can begin.

NOTE: If using a 3-way switch installation, ensure that both wall controls are using the same switch code.

9.1

Turn the wall switch ON/OFF switch to the "OFF" position.

Restore electricity to the ceiling fan branch circuit at the circuit breaker or fuse box

Flip the SW605 wall control's ON/OFF switch to "ON" position.

Within one minute of flipping the switch to "ON", push and hold the FAN OFF button () for 3 to 5 seconds to set the code in the receiver. The ceiling fan lights (if installed) will blink to indicate the SW605 wall control code has been paired with the receiver.

IMPORTANT: Immediately after successful pairing, the ceiling fan will automatically begin high speed conditioning of the motor. During conditioning, the electronic motor control software is calculating speeds for the 2nd through 5th speed settings based on the blades that were installed on the fan.

9.2

The fan will run for approximately 1 minute in the upward direction then reverse direction to down flow and run an additional 1 minute. When conditioning is complete, the fan will come to complete stop.

IMPORTANT: Do not interrupt the conditioning until the fan comes to a complete stop in approximately 5 minutes. All functions of the control will be rejected during conditioning.

9.3

High speed conditioning is now complete.

9.4

If programming is unsuccessful, retry the above instructions after cycling the SW605 wall control ON/OFF switch to restart the 1 minute programming time period.

9.5

If still unsuccessful, shut off the electricity at the fuse box or breaker panel and change the SW605 wall control frequency (page 17). After changing the frequency settings, repeat instructions 1 - 5 of this section within one minute of restoring the electricity.



10. Using Your Ceiling Fan

A WARNING

Fan installation must be completed, including the installation of the fan blades, before testing the remote control.

Your wall control has full control of your fan and light (Figure 31).

10.1

To set the desired fan speed, press the (\bigcirc) button to decrease the speed and the (\bigcirc) to increase

the speed. The LED display will light up to indicate the new speed selected

10.2

To turn the light on and off, press and release the LIGHT (()) button. To set the light intensity, press and hold the LIGHT (()) button. The light will turn on at the light intensity previously selected (Figure 31).

10.3


If airflow is desired in the opposite direction, press the (O) button on the wall control. The fan must be operating at any speed for the reverse button to function. The blades will turn in the opposite direction and reverse the airflow.

10.4

Your wall control comes complete with your choice of three wall cover plates: ivory, white or light almond.

10.5

Your fan is now wired to be turned on and off from the fan switch.



11. Optional AL100 Accent Light Installation



CAUTION: To reduce the risk of electric shock, disconnect the electrical supply circuit to the fan before installing light kit assembly.

Position the AL100 accent light so that the opening of the AL100 accent light slides through the downrod. Align the mounting holes of the AL100 accent light to the motor assembly (Figure 32).


NOTE: Be sure the AL100 accent light connector is located close to the motor assembly connector for ease of installation.

Engage the AL100 accent light connector to the motor assembly 2-pin connector (Figure 32).


Install the AL100 accent light to the motor assembly using three AL100 accent light mounting screws (supplied with accent light) (Figure 33).

Securely connect the AL100 accent light connector to the motor assembly connector (Figure 34).

Screw the four 25-watt candelabra base bulbs (supplied) into the AL100 accent light sockets (Figure 34).





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12. Maintenance

IMPORTANT CARE INSTRUCTIONS for your Ceiling Fan

Periodic cleaning of your new ceiling fan is the only maintenance that is needed.

When cleaning, use only a soft brush or lint free cloth to avoid scratching the finish.

Abrasive cleaning agents are not required and should be avoided to prevent damage to finish.

14. Energy Efficient Use of Ceiling Fans

Ceiling fan performance and energy savings rely heavily on the proper installation and use of the ceiling fan. Here are a few tips to ensure quality and product performance.

Choosing the Appropriate Mounting Location. Ceiling fans should be installed, or mounted, in the middle of the room and at least 2.1 m above the floor and 46 cm from the walls. If ceiling height allows, install the fan 2.5 m - 2.75 m above the floor for optimal airflow. Consult your Emerson Retailer for optional mounting accessories.


Using the Ceiling Fan Year Round. In the summer, use the ceiling fan in the counter-clockwise direction. The

airflow produced by the ceiling fan creates a wind-chill effect, making you "feel" cooler. Select a fan speed that provides a comfortable breeze, lower speeds consume less energy. In the winter, reverse the motor and operate the ceiling fan at low speed in the clockwise direction. This produces a gentle updraft, which forces warm air near the ceiling down into the occupied space. Remember to adjust your thermostat when using your ceiling fan - additional energy and dollar savings could be realized with this simple step!

Turn Off When Not in the Room. Ceiling fans cool people, not rooms. If the room is unoccupied, turn off the ceiling fan to save energy.
