


LOCATION OF CONTROLS



This telephone requires 4 AA - size alkaline batteries (not included) to operate the Caller ID and memory functions.

- 1) Make sure that the telephone is disconnected from the wall lack
- 3) Install 4 AA size batteries as shown on the diagram.
- Replace the cover. 5) Re-connect the line cord to the modular wall jack.



CONNECTING THE TELEPHONE

1. Connect the coil cord to the handset and base as shown in the diagram below:



2. Plug one end of the straight line cord into the jack at the back of the phone's base, and other end into a modular wall telephone jack.




3. Pick up the handset and confirm you hear the dial tone

WALL MOUNTING

To mount your telephone on a wall plate (not included), follow the instructions

1) Plug a short straight line cord (not included) into a modular wall phone jack 2) Align the holes on the base with the mounting studs on the wall plate. 3) Pull the base down onto the studs until the telephone is secure



Setting up the Caller ID menu


