



- 2. Insert the two (2) AAA rechargeable batteries with the (+) and (-) poles correctly aligned into the battery compartment.
- 3. Close the battery cover.
- 4. Place the handset on the base to charge.

Registering Your Handset

- 1. Locate the Paging [on] button located on the base of your Emerson Digital Cordless Phone. Press and hold the Paging [a) button.
- 2. While holding the Paging [on] button on the base, press the menu button
- 3. When the display shows PIN, enter the base PIN and press \bigcap_{ok}^{menu} . When the handset registers with the base, it is assigned a handset number.
- 4. Press (menu) to confirm.

Release the Paging [a) button on the base.

NOTE: The Master PIN is required before you can register or unregister handsets. The PIN is 0000.

De-Register a Handset

- 2. Scroll down to **UNREGISTER** and press menu ok 3. Enter the 4 digit master PIN and press (menulok
- Display shows the first registered handset number.

4. Scroll ▲ or ▼ to select the handset you want to delete and press menu

UNREGISTERED is displayed on the handset screen.

NOTE: You must use one handset to delete another. You cannot delete the handset that is currently in use.

LOCATION:

You need to place your Emerson Digital Cordless Phone base within 3.5 feet of a socket outlet and telephone wall socket so that the cables will reach. The socket-outlet should be installed near the equipment and should be easily accessible. Make sure that it is at least 3 feet away from other electrical appliances to avoid distortion or interference. Your Emerson Digital Cordless Phone works by sending radio signals between the handset and base. The strength of the signal depends on where you place the base. Placing it as high as possible ensures the best signal.

HANDSET RANGE

The unit has a range of up to 200 yards outdoors when there is a clear line of sight between the base and handset. Any obstruction between the base and handset will reduce the range significantly. With the base indoors and the handset either indoors or outdoors, the range will normally be up to 100 feet. Thick concrete and stone walls can severely affect the range.


SIGNAL STRENGTH

The ill icon on your handset indicates that you are within range of the base. When out of range of the base, the icon disappears. If you are on a call, you will hear a warning beep. The line will hang up if the handset moves out of range of the base. Move closer to the base. The handset will automatically reconnect to the base.

Rechargeable battery warning

Telephone jack requirements



To use this phone, you must have an RJ11C modular telephone jack. If you do not have a modular jack, please call your local telephone company to find out how to get one installed.
