Before using the player, read this manual thoroughly and keep it for future reference.

This manual contains important safety information and correct operation instructions. Read the manual carefully before you use the player in order to avoid any confusion.

## Copyright Information

Trademarks and trade names used in this instruction manual are owned by their respective companies or organizations.

Unauthorized duplication of any recordings whether downloaded from the internet or made from audio CDs is a violation of copyright laws and international treaties.

The making of unauthorized copies of copy-protected material, may be an infringement of copyrights and constitute a criminal offence. This equipment should not be used for such purposes.

## Important Safety Precautions

Always follow these basic safety precautions when using your player. This will reduce the risk of product damage and personal injury.

- Do not disassemble, repair or modify the player by yourself. Refer servicing to qualified personnel.
- This device contains a built- in battery, do not dispose of in fire.
- In the event that the battery is leaking, do not handle the device with your bare hands. Contact the service center for help since the liquid may remain in the player. If your body or clothes had contact with the battery liquid, wash it off thoroughly with water. Also, if some liquid gets into your eyes, do not rub your eyes but immediately wash them with clean water, and consult a doctor.
- Keep the player away from direct sunlight and any direct heat source.
- Do not expose the unit to rain or moisture.

## Connecting to a computer

## System requirements

You computer system must meet the following specifications:

- Pentium 200MHz or above
- Microsoft Windows 98SE/2000/ME/XP/Vista
- 120 MB of available hard disk space
- USB port supported
- CD-ROM drive


## Installing the drive for windows 98 SE

If your computer is running Windows ME/2000/XPNVista, DO NOT INSTALL THIS DRIVER
If your computer is running Windows 98 SE , you must install the driver provided on the CD before connecting the player to your computer.

1. Insert the installation $C D$ into the $C D-R O M$ driver.
2. Click on "Support".
3. Execute the " USB Disk Win98 Driver Version xxx.exe" file in the CD and follow the instructions in the window to complete the installation.
4. Restart the computer

Note: Make sure the player is disconnected from the computer when installing the drive.

## Connecting the player to a computer

Files can be transferred directly into the player using the USB data cable. Make sure your computer is powered on. Below is the procedure of connecting the player to a computer:

1. Plug the larger USB connector of the USB cable into the USB port on the computer.
2. Plug the other end (small) of the USB cable to the player.
3. The computer system detects "New hardware" and starts to install the driver automatically. Wait for the system to finish the installation.

When it has finished, "Emerson MP3" will be created in "My Computer".

## Transfer music and pictures

To download files such as music, pictures, or text from your computer, perform the following steps:

1. Open Windows Explorer or My Computer, and locate "Emerson MP3"
2. Select the files on your computer and simply move it into "Emerson MP3" in the usual way (drag-and-drop, copy-and-paste). After copying is completed, the data will be available on the MP3 player.
Note: Please do not disconnect the USB cable during loading, it may cause malfunction of the player and the files.
We recommend using Windows Media Player to organize and transfer music and pictures to your player. For more information regarding Windows Media Player, please refer to the Quick Start Guide.

## Disconnecting the USB cable

After completing the file transfer, please disconnect the USB cable the following way:
1 Double click the green arrow "Safely Remove Hardware" in the taskbar on the bottom right of the window.
2 Select "USB Device" and click "Stop".
3 When the "Stop a Hardware device" appears, click "OK" to disconnect the USB mass storage device. Then you can unplug the player safely.


## Charging the battery

The battery of the player charges automatically when the player is connected to the computer. Note: The computer must be turned on.
The battery of the player is 80 -percent charged in about two hours, and fully charged in about four hours. If you charge the player while loading files, it may take longer.
Indicates that the battery is full.
$\square$ Indicates low battery, and the player should be recharged as soon as possible.

## Important:

- Fully charge the player before using it for the first time.
- Charge the player right away when the "Low battery" message is displayed.
- Do not over charge or discharge the player. Over charging or discharging will shorten the battery life.
- The battery could be over discharged if the player is not used for a long time (over three months). To avoid over discharge, fully charge the player every two or three months and always keep the voltage of the battery above $50 \%$.


## Basic Operation

## Turning on/off

- To turn on the player, press and hold the [J]] button for two seconds.
- To turn off the player, press and hold the [J]] button for two seconds.


## Adjusting the volume

Press the $[\boldsymbol{+}]$ button to increase the volume. Press the [-] button to decrease the volume.

## Resetting the player

If a malfunction of the player occurs, take a metal pin, e.g. the end of a paper clip, and press it into the RESET hole to re-initialize the system of your player.

## Hold function

The hold function can help you lock all buttons to avoid accidental player operation.

- To lock all buttons of the MP3 player, slide the HOLD switch in the direction of the arrow. All buttons are disabled.
- To deactivate the lock function, slide back the HOLD switch.


## Selecting main menu or mode

To access the Main Menu, press and hold the [M] button for approx. 1 second. Use the $[\mathbf{L} \mathcal{K}]$ or [ $\boldsymbol{N} \boldsymbol{N}]$ button to select an item and press the [M]button to confirm your selection. All available options are listed in the Menu table (Next page).

## Listening to Music - Refer to the Quick Start Guide for information regarding Windows Media Player

## Turning on and playing

1. Make sure that the battery is charged, and that your earphones are properly connected.
2. Press and hold the [J] button to turn on the player. The display lights up and the MP3 player enters the Main menu with the Music option selected by default.
3. Press the $[\mathbf{M}]$ button to enter the Music mode.
4. Press the $[\mathrm{M}]$ button to start playing the music.


## Display

1. Remaining battery power indicator
2. Music indicator
3. Repeat mode indicator

## Pausing playback

While a song is playing, press the $[\mathrm{M}]$ button to pause the playback. To resume the playback, press the $[\mathrm{M}]$ button once again.

## Skipping tracks

- $\quad$ Press the $[\mathbf{L}]$ button to skip to the previous track.
- Press the [ $\boldsymbol{M}$ ] button to skip to the next track.


## Searching backward or forward within a track

- Press and hold the $[\mathcal{L}]$ ] button to search backward within a track.
- $\quad$ Press and hold the [ $\boldsymbol{N}$ ] button to search forward within a track.
- Once you release the pressed button, the file will be played back from the searched point.


## A-B function

A desired section of a track can be played back repeatedly by using the A-B function.

- While a track is playing, press the $[A-B / R E C]$ button to set the beginning point of the section. The icon $\overline{(\overline{G+P})}$ is displayed.
- Press the $[A-B / R E C]$ button again to set the ending point of the section. The icon $(\overline{\mathrm{G}+\mathrm{E}})$ is displayed and the selected section starts playing back repeatedly.
- To cancel the A-B repeat playback and return to the normal playback, press the $[A-B / R E C]$ button again.

Note: The A-B repeat function can only be used within the same track.

## Using the music menu

The music menu allows you to manage all factors of listening, such as repeating tracks, selecting equalizers, and so on.
Note: After finishing the music setting, press the [山] Jbutton to exit the music setting menu.

## To set play mode

The play mode setting enables you to select a play mode to enjoy the music in a desired order.

1. Press the [J)] button while listening to music. The music menu appears on the screen.
2. Press the $[\mathbf{L S}]$ or $[\mathbf{N}]$ button to select Repeat, and press the $[\mathbf{M}]$ button. The Repeat mode menu appears on the screen.
3. Press the $[\mathcal{L}]$ or [ $\boldsymbol{N}]$ ] button to select the desired mode as below and press the $[\mathbf{M}]$ button to confirm and exit.

- Normal: Play all saved music files in order once.
- Repeat One: Play the current or selected file repeatedly.
- Repeat All: Play all the music files in order repeatedly.
- Random \&Repeat All: Play all the files in random repeatedly.
- Folder Normal: Play all the files in the current folder in order once.
- Folder Repeat: Play all the files in the current folder repeatedly.
- Folder Random: Play all the files in the current folder in random.

## To set the equalizer

The equalizer setting enables you to select an equalizer from the six preset equalizer settings to suit the type of audio output or customize your personal equalizer effect.

1. Press the $[\mathcal{U}]$ button while listening to music. The music menu appears on the screen.
2. Use the $[\mathbf{K} \mathbf{T}]$ or $[\boldsymbol{N}]$ ] button to select Equalizer, and press the $[\mathbf{M}]$ button. The equalizer menu appears on the screen.
3. Use the $[\mathbb{L 4}]$ or $[\mathbb{L}]$ button to select the desired equalizer option: Normal, Pop, Rock, Classic, Jazz and Ultra Bass. Press the $[\mathbf{M}]$ button to confirm and exit.

To customize the EQ, select Custom, and press the [ $\mathbf{M}$ ] button. The Custom EQ menu appears on the screen.

Press the $[1 / 4]$ or [ $\boldsymbol{N}]$ ] button to navigate between value bars.
Use the [ $\mathbf{+}]$ or $[\mathbf{-}]$ button to adjust the value and press the $[\mathbf{M}]$ button to confirm.
After completing the setting, press the [J] button to exit


## To set 3D effect

1. Press the [ $\mathrm{U}_{\mathrm{J}}$ ] button while listening to music. The music menu appears on the screen.
2. Use the $[/ \mathbb{K}]$ or $[\boldsymbol{M}]$ button to select 3D, and press the $[\mathbf{M}]$ button. The 3D menu appears on the screen.
3. Use the [ $\mathbf{K 4}$ ] or [ $\mathbf{M} \boldsymbol{M}]$ button to select On or $\mathbf{O f f}$. Press the $[\mathbf{M}]$ button to confirm and exit.


## To set play rate

1. Press the $[\mathrm{U}]$ ] button while listening to music. The music menu appears on the screen.
2. Use the $[\mathbf{K} \mathbf{4}]$ or $[\boldsymbol{N}]$ button to select Play Rate, and press the $[\mathbf{M}]$ button. The play rate menu appears on the screen.
3. Use the $[14]$ or $[M]$ button to select a play rate from 1.00X, 1.14X, 1.33X, 0.67 X and 0.80 X . Press the [M] button to confirm and exit.

## To navigate music files

1. Press the [U] button while listening to music. The music menu appears on the screen
2. Use the $[\mathbf{K} \mathbf{4}]$ or $[\boldsymbol{N} \boldsymbol{H}]$ button to select File, and press the $[\mathbf{M}]$ button. The music file list appears on the screen.
3. Use the $[\mathbf{L S}]$ or $[\mathbf{D} \boldsymbol{M}]$ button to select a folder or file and press the $[\mathrm{M}]$ button to open the folder or play the selected file.

## Displaying lyric synchronously

This player supports lyrics display while playing the music. Only the lyrics in LRC format can be displayed. To add lyrics to the music, perform the following steps:

1. Choose an MP3/WMA file, for example "love music. Mp3".
2. Download the corresponding lyrics with extension "IIc" from the Internet.
3. Rename the lyrics file. Make sure that the lyrics filename is the same as the music file name. For example "love music.Irc"
4. Copy both files into the same folder on the player.
5. Start playback of the music file. The lyrics will be displayed on the screen synchronously while the music is being played.

## Viewing Pictures

This player supports the playback of pictures in formats of JPG and BMP.

1. Press and hold the $[\mathbf{M}]$ button to enter the main menu.
2. Use the $[\mathbf{L} \mathbf{4}]$ or $[\mathbf{L} \mid]$ button to select Photo and press the $[\mathbf{M}]$ button. The picture menu appears on the screen.
3. Use the $[\mathcal{L}]$ ] or [ $\boldsymbol{N}]$ ] button to select either Manual, Slide Show, or Thumbnail, and press the $[\mathbf{M}]$ button to view your pictures.

- Manual: To view pictures manually. Use the [ $[\mathcal{L}]$ or or $\boldsymbol{N} \boldsymbol{H}]$ button to display the previous or next picture.
- Slide Show: To play a slide show of all the pictures on the player.
- Thumbnail: To view pictures in thumbnails. Up to four pictures are displayed on the screen at a time. Use the $[\mathcal{L T}]$ or [ $[\boldsymbol{N}]$ button to navigate between pictures and press the [M]button to view the selected picture in full screen.

4. Press the [J] button to exit the picture view mode return to the previous menu.


## Watching Videos

This player supports the playback of converted videos in MTV format.

1. Press and hold the [ $\mathbf{M}$ ] button to enter the main menu.
2. Use the $[\mathbf{L 4}]$ or $[\mathbf{L D}]$ button to select Movie and press the $[M]$ button. The first video will appear on the screen.
3. Use the $[\mathbf{K 4}]$ or [ $\mathbf{N} \boldsymbol{M}]$ button to select a video and press the $[\mathbf{M}]$ button to play the selected video.

## Pausing playback



While a video is playing, press the $[\mathbf{M}]$ button to pause the playback.
To resume the playback, press the $[\mathbf{M}]$ button once again.


Stop mode Press the [J] ] button to stop playback.

## Skipping video files

Press the $[\mathbf{L K}]$ or $[\mathbf{L} \mid]$ button to skip to the previous or next video file.

## Searching backward or forward



Press and hold the $[\mathbf{L} \mathbf{4}]$ or $[\mathbf{H}]$ ] button to search backward or forward within a video file.

## Setting video repeat mode

You may select a mode to enjoy the movie in a desired order.

1. Press the $[\mathrm{J}]$ button to stop the playback.
2. Press the [J]] button again to open the video menu, and select Repeat and press the [ $\mathbf{M}]$ button.

3. Use the $[\mathbf{L K}]$ or $[\mathbf{H} \boldsymbol{H}]$ button to select the desired mode as below and press the $[\mathbf{M}]$ button to confirm.

- Normal: Play all saved files in order once.
- Repeat One: Play the current or selected file repeatedly.
- Repeat All: Play all the files in order repeatedly.
- Random \& Repeat: Play all the files in random repeatedly.

4. Press the $[\mathrm{U}]$ ] button to exit the video sub-menu.

## Recording Voice

In Mic.Record mode, you can activate the voice recording with integrated microphone. You also can directly press and hold [A-B/REC] button to start recording in Music or Voice mode.

1. Press and hold the $[\mathbf{M}]$ button to enter the main menu.
2. Use the $[\mathbf{L 4}]$ or $[\mathbf{L N}]$ button to select Mic.Record and press the [M] button. The recording screen appears and the player starts recording.
3. To pause the recording, press the $[\mathbf{M}]$ button. To resume the recording, press the $[\mathbf{M}]$ button again.
4. To save recording and return to main menu, press the [U] button. The player will go to the Voice playback interface.
The recorded files are saved in the MICIN.DIR folder of the MP3 player as WAV files (format: MIC0000X.WAV) and can be listened to in the Voice mode.
5. Press the $[\mathbf{M}]$ button to start playing the recorded files or press and hold the $[\mathbf{M}]$ button to exit the voice mode.

Note: Voice recording is automatically stopped when the memory of the player is full or the battery power is no longer sufficient. Data that has been already recorded is automatically saved.


## Listening to Recordings

All recordings can be played in the voice mode.

1. Press and hold the [ $\mathbf{M}$ ] button to enter the main menu.
2. Use the $[\mathbf{L U}]$ or $[\boldsymbol{L}]$ ] button to select Voice and press the $[\mathbf{M}]$ button. The screen displays the voice mode.
3. Press the $[\mathbf{M}]$ button to play the recorded files.

File selected, file searched, and playback function in the Voice mode correspond to the functions in the Music mode.


Note: To exit the Voice mode, press and hold the [ $\mathbf{M}$ ] button to return to the main menu.


## Reading E-book

This player only supports the playback of files in TXT format. Other formats must be saved as TXT format before transfer.

1. Press and hold the [ $\mathbf{M}$ ] button to enter the main menu.

2. Use the $[\mathbf{L 4}]$ or $[\boldsymbol{L D}]$ button to select a folder or file and press the $[\mathbf{M}]$ button to open the folderor view the selected file.

## Moving to previous/next page

- $\quad$ Press the $[\mathbf{K} \mathbf{4}]$ button to move to the previous page.

- Press the [ $\quad \mathrm{C}]$ button to move to the next page.


## Skipping to the next page automatically

- Press the $[\mathbf{M}]$ button while viewing the text. The player will skip to the next page after a short time automatically until reaching the last page. Press the [ $\mathbf{M}$ ] button to stop the automatic skipping.
Note:
- To return to the E-book list, press the [J]] button.
- The last page you read is saved as a bookmark automatically when you exit the E-book mode. The bookmark page will be displayed on the screen when you switch to E-BOOK mode next time.


## Settings

The unit settings can be customized by accessing the Settings Menu. The Settings Menu consists of several items where various functions can be selected concerning language, play mode, recording, contrast, time off , storage, reset, etc.

## Navigating the settings menu

This section describes how to access and change various features through the MP3 player settings menu.

1. Press and hold the [M] button to open the main menu.
2. Select Settings using the [ $\mid \mathbf{L} \mathbf{4}]$ or [ $\mathbf{N} \mid$ ] button and press the $[\mathbf{M}]$ button to open the sub-menu.
3. To select a submenu, press the [ $\mid \mathbf{N} \mathbf{4}]$ or [ $\mathbf{N} \boldsymbol{N}]$ button.
4. To enter a submenu, press the $[\mathrm{M}]$ button.
5. To save an option, press the $[\mathbf{L 4}]$ or $[\mathbf{N} \mid]$ button to select the option and press the $[\mathbf{M}]$ button to confirm.
6. To return to the previous directory, press the [J] button.


## Setting language

## Setting time off

## Deleting Files

In the Delete mode, you can delete the files and folders stored on your player without a computer.

1. Press and hold the [ $M$ ] button to enter the main menu.
2. Use the $[1 / 4]$ or $[M]$ button to select Delete and press the $[M]$ button. The file list appears on the screen.
3. Press the $[\mid \mathbf{4}]$ or $[\mathbf{N} \mid]$ button to navigate between files or folder.
4. To delete a file, select the file and press the [M] or [J] button.To delete a folder, select the folder and press the [ J ] button. The Delete menu appears on the screen.
5. Use the [ $\mid \mathcal{L}]$ or [ $N \mid$ ] button to select Yes (continue delete) or No (cancel delete), and press the [M] button to start deleting the files or exit without deleting.


## About

In the About mode, you can check and review the firmware version, total memory and free memory of the player.

1. Press and hold the [ $M$ ] button to enter the main menu.
2. Use the $[\mid \mathcal{L}]$ or $[\mathbf{N}]$ button to select About and press the $[M]$ button. The firmware version, total/free memory of the player is displayed on the screen.
3. Press any button to exit.


## Converting Video to MTV Format

This player supports the playback of videos in MTV format. Other formats (e.g. *.mpg, *.rm, ${ }^{*}$.rmvb, *.wmv) must be converted to MTV format. The "MTV Video Converter" is supplied on the CD to enable you to convert the other formats to MTV format.

1. Insert the provided CD to the CD -ROM drive of your computer.
2. Click on "Video Converter" and follow the instructions to download the converter to your desktop.
3. Double click on
4. Click on Input Video, and search for videos on your computer.
5. Double click on the video you would like to convert.
6. Click on Advanced Settings, and select $128 \times 128$ as the Output Frame Size.
7. Click on Output Video to select the destination for the converted video. You can send it directly to your player by selecting "Emerson MP3", and clicking OK, or the default setting will save the video to the MTV output folder on your computer.

- To get the best resolution and make your video playable on the player, you must select $128{ }^{\star 1} 128$ or less in the Output Frame Size box (Advanced Setting), and select MTV in the Output Format box.
