

- 9 Do not defeat the safety purpose of the polarized or grounding-type plug. A polarized plug has two blades with one wider than the other. A grounding type plug has two blades and a third grounding prong. The wide blade or the third prong are provided for your safety. ### Display for an audio CD


When you load an audio CD into the CD tray, the display shows the total number of tracks, the total playing time, and the music calendar. The music calendar displays the number of tracks on the audio CD. If the audio CD contains more than 14 tracks, a pext to 14.



### Display for a CD containing music files

When you load a CD containing music files into the CD tray, the display shows the total number of files and folders on the CD. If the total number of files on the CD is more than 99, the last two digits of the file total are displayed in the total number of files area and the first digit of the file total is displayed in the music calendar area.

For example, if the total number of files is 923, The display shows 23 in the total number of files area and 9 in the music calendar area.




# Setting up your CD player

### **Positioning your CD player**

Your CD player requires space for ventilation. For best performance:

- Do not install your CD player in an enclosed area.
- Do not block the ventilation openings on your CD player.
- Do not place anything on top of your CD player.
- Make sure that you allow 8 in. (20 cm) of space around both sides and the back of your CD player and 16 in. (40 cm) above your CD player for correct ventilation.



### **Connecting digital audio**

You can connect your CD player to a home theater or receiver using digital audio.


#### Note

You can use either digital or analog audio connections, depening on the connection available on your amplifier or receiver.

### To connect digital audio:

 Connect a digital optical cable (not included) to the **DIGITAL OUT OPT** jack on the back of your CD player and to the digital optical input jack on a receiver or sound system.

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### **Connecting analog audio**

You can connect your CD player to a home theater or receiver using analog audio.


#### Note

You can use either digital or analog audio connections, depening on the connection available on your amplifier or receiver.

### To connect analog audio:

 Connect a standard (analog) audio cable (included) to the ANALOG OUT L/R audio jacks on the back of your CD player and to the L/R audio input jacks on a receiver or sound system.

Back of CD player




### **Connecting headphones**

### To connect headphones:

 Plug headphones into the PHONES jack on the front of your CD player.

### Note

The headphone jack size is 1/4" (6.35 mm). You need an adatper to connect headphones with a 3.5mm audio jack connector.

### **Connecting power**

### To connect power:

• Plug the AC power cord into a power outlet.

#### Cautions

- Your CD player is not completely disconnected from power when the power cord is plugged into a power outlet. To completely disconnect power, unplug the power cord.
- Make sure that the power outlet is easily accessible.
- Unplug the power cord from the power outlet if your CD player will not be used for an extended period of time.


### **Installing remote control batteries**

### To install remote control batteries:

1 Press the battery compartment cover latch, then remove the cover.



Insert two AAA batteries into the battery compartment. Make sure that the + and – symbols on the batteries match the + and – symbols in the battery compartment.



3 Replace the cover.

### Cautions


- Make sure that you insert the batteries correctly.
- Do not use rechargable (Ni-Cd) batteries.
- Do not heat, open, or short-circuit batteries.
- · Do not throw batteries into a fire.
- Do not mix different types of batteries or mix old and new batteries.
- If the remote control does not function correctly or if the operating range becomes reduced, replace the batteries.



### Aiming the remote control

#### To aim the remote control:

• Point the remote control at the remote control sensor on the front of your CD player.



# **Using your CD player**

### Turning your CD player on or off

### To turn your CD player on or off:

- Press POWER on the front of your CD player. Your CD player turns on and enters standby mode.
- 2 Press ON/STANDBY to enter operating mode.
- 3 Press ON/STANDBY again to put your CD player in standby mode.

### Not

Your CD player has an automatic power save feature. When your CD player is in stop or pause mode for mode than 30 minutes, your CD player automatically switches to standby mode.

Press **ON/STANDBY** to enter operating mode again.

### Playable CDs and files

Your CD player can play the following types of CDs:

CD	Logo	Format or file type
Audio CD	COMPACT DIGITAL AUDIO	PCM
CD-R	DIGITAL AUDIO Recordable	Audio CD, MP3, WMA
CD-RW	DIGITAL AUDIO (Rewnitable)	Audio CD, MP3, WMA

- Your CD player supports CD-Rs and CD-RWs recorded in Audio CD (CD-DA), MP3, or WMA format.
- Your CD player can only play CD-Rs and CD-RWs recorded with ISO9660 format.
- Your CD player supports multi-session CDs. Some multi-session CDs may take a long time to load and some may not load at all.

### **Unplayable CDs**

- Your CD player may not play all CD-Rs and CD-RWs because of:
  - Incomplete CD finalization
  - Recording quality
  - Physical condition of the CD
  - Characteristics of the recording device
  - Authoring software
     See the operating instructions supplied with your recording device for more information.
- Some Audio CDs use copy protection that does not conform to the official CD standard. Your CD player cannot play these nonstandard CDs.

### Playable audio file formats

- MP3 (MPEG-1 Audio Layer-3).
  - Sampling frequency: 32, 44.1, 48 kHz.
  - Bit rate: 32 ~ 320 kbps.
  - Extension: mp3 and MP3.
  - Fixed bit-rate files are recommended. Variable bit-rate (VBR) files are playable, but playing time may be displayed incorrectly.
  - ID3 tag is not available.
- WMA (Windows Media Audio)
  - Sampling frequency: 32, 44.1, 48 kHz.
  - Bit rate: 32 ~ 320 kbps.
  - Extension: wma and WMA.
  - WMA tag is not available.

### Notes


- Folders can be up to ten levels deep.
- For some files, it may not be possible to use certain functions during playback.
- Files protected by DRM (Digital Rights Management) cannot be played.
- When the size of a file or folder is larger than your CD player's memory capacity, your CD player cannot recognize or play the file.
- MPEG Layer-3 audio coding technology is licensed from Fraunhofer IIS and Thomson.
- Windows Media and the Windows logo are trademarks or registered trademarks of Microsoft Corporation in the United States and/or other countries.

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### **Inserting CDs**

Your CD player can play:

- Standard 4.72-in. (12cm) CDs
- 3-in. (8 cm) CDs (placed on the inside circle of the CD tray)



#### To insert CDs:

- 1 Press (open/close) to open the CD tray.
- 2 Place a CD in the tray slot, label side up.
- **3** Press **DISC SKIP** to rotate the CD tray clockwise one position.
- **4** Place a CD in the next tray slot. You can place five CDs in the tray.
- 5 Press ♠ (open/close) to close the CD tray.

### **Playing a CD**

### To play a CD:

- 1 Insert a CD in the CD tray.
- 2 If you have more than one CD loaded in the CD tray, press DISC, then press the number (1 through 5) for the CD you want to play. Button presses must be within two seconds of each other.

### Note

When a CD is in a CD tray, the loaded CD indicator  $(\mathbb{C})$  lights on the display. When a CD is playing the CD playing indicator  $(\triangleright)$  on the display.

3 Press ► (play). The play indicator (►) lights on the display.

### **Controlling CD playback**

### To control CD playback:

- Press II (pause) to pause playback. The pause indicator (II) lights on the display. Press ► (play) to resume playback.
- Press (stop) to stop playback.
- Press 

  or 

  to fast reverse or fast forward.
- Press ◄ (previous) to go to previous track or file.
  If playback is mid-way through the track or file,
  the first time you press this button, your CD player
  goes to the beginning of the track or file. Press
  this button again to go to the previous track.
- Press **▶** (next) to go to the next track/file.

### Changing CDs in the CD tray during playback

You can change CDs in the CD tray while a CD is playing. For example, if you are playing the CD in the first (1) tray slot, you can change the CDs tray slots 2 through 5.

### To change CDs in the CD tray during playback:

- 1 Press ♠ (open/close) to open the CD tray.
- 2 If the CD you want to change is not visible, press DISC SKIP to rotate the CD tray clockwise one position.
- 3 Remove a CD that is not playing and insert another CD in the CD tray.
- **4** Press **≜** (open/close) to close the CD tray.

### Selecting a track or file for playback

### To select a track or file for playback:

 Press the number button for the track or file you want to play. If the track or file number has more than one digit, press the number buttons for the track or file. Button presses must be within two seconds of each other.

### For example:

- If the track or file number is 3, press 3.
- If the track or file number is 15, press 1, then press 5.
- If the track or file number is 123, press 1, press 2, then press 3.

## Selecting a folder on a CD containing music files

### To select a folder on a CD containing music files:

 Press FOLDER – to go to the previous folder or press FOLDER + to go to the next folder. The first file in the selected folder plays automatically.




## Displaying the elapsed and remaining track or CD time

#### Note

The time display only works with Audio CDs.

### To display the elapsed and remaining track or CD time:

 While an Audio CD is playing, press TIME one or more times.



Note

The time display is "--:--" in random mode.

### Playing CDs in random order

### To play CDs in random order:

- While a track is playing, press RANDOM. The "RANDOM" indicator lights on the display. Each time you press this button the random mode changes.
  - Press one time to play the tracks or files on the current CD randomly.
  - Press two times to play all the CDs randomly.
  - Press three times to cancel random mode and resume normal playback.

### Notes

- If a CD or folder contains more than 100 tracks or files, the CD or folder is skipped during random play.
- If you press a number button during random play, random mode is cancelled.

### Playing the first 10 seconds of tracks or files

### To play the first 10 seconds of tracks or files:

- While a CD is playing, press INTRO. The "INTRO" indicator lights on the display. Each time you press this button the Intro mode changes.
  - Press one time to play the first 10 seconds of each track or file on the currently playing CD.
  - Press two times to play the first 10 seconds of the first track or file on the all the CDs.
  - · Press three times to cancel Intro mode.

### Note

When playing a playlist you programmed, Intro mode is not available.

### Repeating a track, CD, or all CDs

### To repeat a track, CD, or all CDs:

While a track is playing, press REPEAT 1/F/ALL.
 Each time you press this button the repeat mode changes.

#### For an Audio CD:

- Press one time to repeat the current track.
- Press two times to repeat the current CD.
- Press three times to repeat all the CDs.
- Press four times to cancel repeat mode and resume normal playback.

### For a CD containing music files:

- Press one time to repeat the current file.
- Press two times to repeat the current folder.
- Press three times to repeat the current CD.
- Press four times to repeat all the CDs.
- Press five times to cancel repeat mode and resume normal playback.

#### Notes

- In random play mode, you can only repeat the current track or file.
- When playing a playlist you programmed, repeat mode is not available.

### Creating a playback loop

You can create a playback loop to repeat a section of a track or file.

### To create a playback loop:

- 1 Play the track or file until it reaches the starting point for your playback loop, then press A ↔ B. The "REPEAT" and "A<·>" indicators light on the display.
- 2 Continue playing the track or file until it reaches the ending point for your loop, then press A ↔ B. The "A<·>B" indicator lights on the display. Your CD player plays your playback loop repeatedly.
- 3 To resume normal playback, press A ↔ B.

### Notes

- A 
   → B repeat only works with a single track or file.
- A 
   → B repeat does not work in random mode or Intro mode.



### Programming a playlist

You can program a playlist of your favorite songs in the order you want to play them. Your playlist can have as many as 32 tracks or files.

Your playlist can include tracks from multiple discs.


### To program a playlist using one disc:

- 1 With playback stopped, press **PRO.** The "PROG" indicator blinks on the display.
- 2 Press 

  (previous) or 

  (next) to select the first track or file number for your playlist, then press PRO. to add the track or file to your playlist.


The track or file number and the assigned program number appears on the display.



- 3 Repeat Step 2 to add more tracks or files to your playlist.
- 4 When you have finished adding tracks or files, press ▶ (play) to play your playlist.

### To program a playlist using more than one disc:

- With playback stopped, press PRO. The "PROG" indicator blinks on the display.
- 2 Press **DISC**, then press the number (1 through 5) for the CD you want. Button presses must be within two seconds of each other.



3 Press ⋈ (previous) or ⋈ (next) to select the first track or file number for your playlist, then press PRO. to add the track or file to your playlist.

The track or file number and the assigned program number appears on the display.

- 4 Repeat Steps 2 and 3 to add more tracks or files to your playlist.
- 5 When you have finished adding tracks or files, press ▶ (play) to play your playlist.

### To view the track or file numbers in your playlist:

- In stop mode, press PRO. The first track or file number in your playlist appears on the display.
- 2 Press PRO. again to view the next track or file number. Each time you press this button, the next track or file number appears on the display.

## To change a track or file in your playlist to a different track or file:

#### Note

In the following task track 9 is replaced with track 10.

- 1 In stop mode, press PRO. The first track or file number in your playlist appears on the display.
- 2 Continue to press PRO. until the display shows the track number you want to replace in the playlist.



3 While the track or file number you want to replace is displayed, press 

(previous) or 

(next) to select the track or file number for the replacement track or file, then press PRO.

Press the number buttons to select the track or file number.

# Note Button presses must be within a few seconds of each other.

The replacement track or file number and the assigned program number appear on the display.



4 When the replacement track or file number disappears from the display, you can repeat these steps to replace another track or file.

### Deleting playlist tracks or files

### To delete all tracks or files in your playlist:

 Press and hold ■ (stop) for more than four seconds to delete all the tracks or files from your playlist.

### Note

You can also delete a playlist by opening the CD tray.

### To delete a specific track or file:

- 1 In stop mode, press **PRO.** The first track or file number in your playlist appears on the display.
- 2 Continue to press PRO. until the display shows the track number you want to delete from the playlist.
- 3 Press (stop) to delete the track or file from your playlist.



### Adjusting the display brightness

### To adjust the display brightness:

 Press **DIMMER** one or more times. You can select on, dim, or off.

### Note

If you press a button when the display is turned off, the display is automatically turned on.

# **Troubleshooting**

#### Caution

Do not attempt to repair your CD player. There are no user-serviceable parts inside.

### Note

If none of the following solutions works, try turning off your CD player, then turning it back on.

Problem	Possible cause	Possible solution
	The AC power cord is not connected securely.	Make sure that the AC power cord is securely plugged into the power outlet.
No power	The power outlet may be dead.	Test the power outlet by plugging a device, such as a lamp, into the outlet and turning the device on.
	The CD is loaded upside down.	Make sure that the CD is loaded with the label side facing up.
	The CD is dirty.	Clean the CD. See "Cleaning CDs" on page 10.
	The CD is defective or scratched.	Try another CD.
CD does not play	The CD is not compatible with your CD player.	Make sure that the CD is compatible. See "Unplayable CDs" on page 6.
	Music files on the CD are not in a compatible format.	Your CD player only plays MP3 or WMA music files. See "Playable audio file formats" on page 6.
	Playback may be paused.	If the <b>II</b> indicator appears on the display, press <b>▶</b> (play) to resume playback.
	Your home theater or receiver is not connected correctly or securely.	Check the cable connections. See "Connecting digital audio" on page 4 or "Connecting analog audio" on page 5.
No sound	Your amplifier or receiver is not operating correctly.	See the documentation that came with your amplifier or receiver.
		If more than one audio device is connected to your amplifier or receiver, make sure that your CD player is the selected device.
Poor or distorted sound	Your home theater or receiver is not connected correctly or securely.	Check the cable connections. See "Connecting digital audio" on page 4 or "Connecting analog audio" on page 5.
Sound skips	The CD may be dirty or scratched.	Try cleaning the CD. See "Cleaning CDs" on page 10. If cleaning the CD does not correct the problem, try another CD.
	Your CD player may be on a surface that is subject to vibration or bumping.	Move your CD player to a surface that is not subject to vibration and where it cannot be bumped.

Problem	Possible cause	Possible solution
Programming a playlist does not work	An error was made when programming the CD.	Repeat the programming task. See "Programming a playlist" on page 9.
	Your playlist may have too many tracks or files.	Make sure that you do not have more than 32 tracks or files in your playlist.

### **Handling CDs**

- To keep a CD clean, do not touch the play side (non-label side) of the CD.
- Do not attach paper or tape to the CD.





### **Cleaning CDs**

• Before playback, wipe the CD outwards from the center (not in a circle) with a clean cloth.



- If you cannot clean the CD with a dry cloth, wipe the CD with a slightly moistened, soft cloth, then dry it with a soft cloth.
- Do not use any solvents, such as paint thinner, benzine, commercially available cleaners, or anti-static spray designed for vinyl records.
