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Introduction

Congratulations on your purchase of high-quality Insignia Digital FM Clock Radio with Dock for iPhone5. This system represents the state of the art in clock radio design and is designed for reliable and trouble-free performance.

This *User Guide* explains how to correctly set up, operate, and get the best performance from your Insignia clock radio. Read this guide carefully before setting up your clock radio, then keep it handy for quick reference.


LCD Front Panel display



#	Item	Description
1	ALARM 1 indicator	When lit, indicates that alarm 1 is set.
2	TIME/ALARM display	In standby mode, shows the current time. In radio mode, shows the current freqency.
3	ALARM 2 indicator	When lit, indicates that alarm 2 is set.
4	SLEEP indicator	When lit, indicates that the sleep timer is set.
5	PM indicator	When lit, indicates that time shown on display is PM.



Top panel



#	Item	Description
1	Lightning connector	Connect your iPhone here to listen to it on the clock radio speakers.
2	iPhone [®] docking pad	Holds your iPhone while it's connected to the clock radio.
3	SOURCE button	Press repeatedly to cycle through the available sound sources (FM(rAd, iPhone(doc), and AUX IN(Au.).
4	신/ (STANDBY/ON) button	In alarm mode, press to silence the alarm for 24 hours. In radio mode, press to turn the radio on or off.
5	VOLUME +/- button	Press to increase or decrease volume.
6	TIME SET button	Press to set the time.
7	ALARM 1 button	Press to set Alarm 1. The Alarm 1 indicator lights.
8	PRESET button	When presetting stations, press to select the preset number. When listening to the radio, press to select a preset station.
9	► II (play/pause)/ MEM (memory) button	During iPhone playback, press to pause playback. Press again to resume playback. When presetting FM stations, press to memorize a station.
10	z ^Z SLEEP button	Press to set the sleep timer. You can select 90, 60, 45, 30, 15, or OFF . The time appears on the display.
11	Idea - HOUR/MIN - IDEA TUNING button	In time set mode, press to set the hours and minutes. In FM mode, press to tune the radio to the next or previous station. Press and hold to search for a station. In iPhone mode, press to skip to the next or previous track. Press and hold to go to a specific point on a track.
12	ALARM 2 button	Press to set Alarm 2. The Alarm 2 indicator lights.
13	SNOOZE/DIMMER button	When the alarm sounds, press to mute the alarm for nine minutes. Press and hold to adjust the display brightness.
14	LCD display	Shows the time, radio station, and indicator lights.

#	Item	Description
1	Stereo speakers	Provide sound for playback.
2	FM antenna wire	Improves FM radio reception.
3	AUX IN jack	Plug an external sound source, such as an MP3 player, into this connector using a 3.5mm plug.
4	USB jack	Plug a USB device into this connector to charge it (use for charging only - Max. 500 mA).
5	DC IN 5V jack	Plug the AC adapter into this connector.


Set up your clock radio

Install the backup batteries

The clock radio uses a backup battery system to provide continuous alarm operation and clock settings in the event of a power failure. If the backup batteries have been installed and a power failure occurs or the AC cord is accidentally disconnected, the display will not remain lit, but the current time and alarm time settings will be temporarily maintained. Otherwise, you must reset the time and alarm settings.

Make sure that the AC cord is connected. Otherwise all settings may be lost during battery replacement.

1 Turn your clock radio over so the bottom is facing up, then open the battery compartment cover located on the bottom of your clock radio by inserting your fingernail and lifting up on the cover.




- 2 Insert two "AA" batteries (included) into the battery compartment. Make sure that the + and – symbols on the batteries align with the + and – symbols inside the battery compartment.
- **3** Close the battery compartment.

Cau	ition
	 Do not recharge, short, disassemble, or heat the batteries, or dispose of in a fire.
	 Dispose of batteries in the proper manner, according to federal, state, and local regulations.
	 Remove the batteries when the charge is depleted or if your clock radio will be left unplugged for an extended period.
	 Battery chemicals can cause a rash. If the batteries leak, clean the battery compartment with a cloth. If chemicals touch your skin, wash immediately.
	 Do not use a mixture of old and new batteries.
	 Do not mix alkaline, standard (carbon-zinc), and rechargable batteries.

Connect the AC adapter

Make sure that the AC power outlet matches the AC adapter's power specifications (120 V \sim 60 Hz) prior to plugging in the adapter.


1 Plug the small DC power connector into the **DC IN 5V** jack on the back of your clock radio.



2 Plug the other end of the AC power adapter into a power outlet.

Set the clock

1 In standby mode (the time is shown on the display), press and hold the **TIME SET** button on the top of your clock radio for three seconds. The hour and minutes digits blink.



- 2 Press the IM HOUR button to set the correct hour.
- 3 Press the MIN **>>>** button to set the correct minutes.
- 4 Press the **TIME SET** button to confirm.


Use your clock radio

Before using your clock radio, make sure that all connections are secure, then plug the AC adapter into your clock radio and an AC power outlet.


Turn your clock radio on and off

- 1 Press 也小 (STANDBY/ON). Your clock radio turns on.
- 2 Press the **SNOOZE/DIMMER** button repeatedly to cycle through the available brightness levels (high, medium, and low) of the LCD.
- 3 Press ウリ (STANDBY/ON) again to switch your clock radio to standby mode.

Set and use the alarm



1 Press and hold the **ALARM 1** or **ALARM 2** button. The "ALARM 1" or "ALARM 2" indicator and the hours and minutes digits start to blink.



- 2 Press the Image HOUR button to set the hour.
- 3 Press the MIN >>> button to set the minutes.
- 4 Press the **VOLUME +/-** button to set the volume of the alarm.
- 5 Press the **SOURCE** button to set the alarm to wake to radio (rAd), iPhone (doc), or Buzzer (bU).
- 6 Press ALARM 1 or ALARM 2 to confirm and save the alarm settings. The alarm indicator lights.

Mute, turn off, or cancel the alarm

1 Press the **SNOOZE/DIMMER** button to mute the alarm for nine minutes.

- 2 Press any button (except **SNOOZE**) to turn the alarm off for 24 hours.
- **3** Press **ALARM 1** or **ALARM 2** to deactivate the alarm. The alarm indicator on the display goes off.

Use the sleep timer

- 1 When listening to the radio or your iPhone®, press the SLEEP button repeatedly to set the sleep timer. Settings include 90, 60, 45, 30, 15 minutes, or OFF. The radio or iPhone® automatically turns off after the specified amount of time.
- 2 To stop listening at any time, press the ウ/ (STANDBY/ON) button.

Play the radio

- 1 Press the 也川 (STANDBY/ON) button to turn on your clock radio, then press the **SOURCE** button repeatedly to select **FM** (rAd).
- **2** Stretch out the FM antenna on the back of your clock radio and move it around to improve reception.
- 3 Press → +OUR or MIN → to tune the radio to a higher or lower frequency.
- 4 Press and hold H HOUR or MIN HOUR or MIN HOUR or he next available higher or lower station.

Note The search may not stop at a station with a very weak signal.

- 5 Press the **VOLUME +/-** buttons to increase or decrease the volume. Adjust the volume to a comfortable level.
- 6 Press the ウ/ (STANDBY/ON) button to turn off your clock radio.

Use radio station presets

Your clock radio can store 10 station presets.

- 1 Turn on your clock radio, then press the **SOURCE** button repeatedly to select **FM** (rAd).
- 3 Press ►II (play/pause)/MEM (memory) button. The preset number flashes.
- 4 Press the **PRESET** button to select the preset number you want.

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- 5 Press ►II (play/pause)/MEM (memory) button again to store the station as a preset.
- 6 Repeat steps 1 through 5 to save additional stations as presets.

Recall radio station presets

- 1 Turn on your clock radio, then press the **SOURCE** button repeatedly to select **FM** (rAd).
- 2 Press the **PRESET** button repeatedly to select the preset station you want.

Listen to an external sound source

You can listen to an external sound source, such as a CD, MP3 player, or an iPhone[®], Android, or Windows phone on your clock radio.

Listen to an iPhone[®] (iPhone[®] 5, iPhone[®] 5s, or iPhone[®] 5c)

- 1 Make sure that your clock radio is turned off.
- 2 Carefully connect your iPhone[®] to the lightning connector in the iPhone[®] dock (you may need to remove your iPhone case or skin). Make sure that the connector plug is firmly inserted into the connector port of your iPhone[®].

Notes	
	 Always set the volume to the minimum when connecting or disconnecting other equipment.
	 Both your player and the clock radio have volume controls, both should be set to a comfortable listening level (if either is set too low you won't be able to hear your music).
	 When you connect your iPhone[®] to your clock radio, make sure that you insert it all the way.
	 Refer to the User Guide that came with your iPhone[®] for additional information.

- 3 Press the 0/| (Standby/On) button to turn on your clock radio.
- 4 Press the **SOURCE** button repeatedly to selectan iPhone[®] (**doc**). Your iPhone[®] starts playback automatically.
 - Press the **>I** (play/pause)/**MEM** (memory) button to pause playback, then press it again to resume playback.
 - Press the VOLUME +/- buttons on the clock radio to adjust the system volume.
 - Press the Image HOUR or MIN Image button to go to the next or previous track.
 - Press and hold the Image HOUR or MIN Image button to locate a specific point on a track.

5 Press the 也川 (STANDBY/ON) button to turn your clock radio off. The iPhone[®] will continue charging while in the dock.

Charge your iPhone[®]

The iPhone[®] charged while it is docked and your clock radio is powered on.

- Make sure that the AC adapter is connected to your clock radio.
- The iPhone[®] is charged regardless of the sound source selected on your clock radio.

	 Do not carry the clock radio with your iPhone[®] connected. You might drop it and damage the connector. 	
	 Do not touch or hit the iPhone[®] terminal pins or the connector pins directly. It might cause damage to the connector.

Listen to a CD or MP3 player

- 1 Make sure that your clock radio is turned off.
- 2 Connect the external sound source to the **AUX IN** jack on the back of your clock radio using a 3.5 mm audio cable (not included).
- 3 Press the 0/| (STANDBY/ON) button to turn on your clock radio.
- 4 Press the SOURCE button repeatedly to select AUX IN (Au.).
- **5** Start playback on the external sound source, then adjust the volume to a comfortable level.
- 6 Use your external sound source to control playback.

Clean your clock radio

- Use a soft, dry, clean cloth to clean the exterior of your clock radio.
- Do not let liquid drip into the inside of your clock radio.
- For stubborn stains, use a soft cloth dampened with a weak solution of mild detergent and water. Dry your clock radio immediately afterwards with a clean cloth. Do not use abrasive clothes, thinners, alcohol, or other chemical solvents, because they may damage the finish or remove the panel lettering.

Troubleshooting

Problem	Cause/Solution
No power	 Make sure the AC power adapter is connected securely and correctly to your clock radio and the power outlet. Make sure that the power outlet is working.
Cannot play an iPhone [®]	 Make sure that the iPhone[®] is firmly connected to the lightning connector on your clock radio. Make sure that the iPhone[®] is working. Test it before trying to connect it to the clock radio. Make sure that the firmware in your iPhone[®] is current. For more information, go to www.apple.com. Try turning up the volume. If either the clock radio or the iPhone is set to minimum volume, you may not be able to hear your music.
Cannot charge an iPhone [®]	 Make sure that the iPhone[®] is firmly connected to the lightning connector on your clock radio. Make sure the AC power adapter is connected securely and correctly to your clock radio and the power outlet.
No sound from the speakers	 Use the VOLUME +/- button to increase the volume. If you are using and external sound source, turn up the volume on the playback device. Make sure that the correct sound source has been selected. Make sure that the AC power adapter is connected securely and correctly to your clock radio and the power outlet. Make sure that your clock radio is turned ON.
Static or noise when playing the radio	 Make sure that the station is tuned correctly and that the station has a good signal. Try another station. Extend the antenna wire to improve the reception.
The sound is distorted	 Make sure that the volume level is not set too high. If you are using an external sound source, make sure that the material on the sound source is not distorted. Try a different external sound source. Make sure that the station is tuned correctly and that the station has a good signal.
The clock radio gets warm after extended play at high volume levels	Turn down the volume.
