



Printer Overview

This printer lets you print, copy, and scan pictures and documents. In addition, this printer supports networking, letting you access the printer over a wireless (Wi-Fi) network.

Components

Description

1	LCD	Displays pictures, messages, and menus; lifts for easy viewing
2	On/Off button	Turns the printer on or off
3	Home button	Displays the main menu, and toggles between screens
4	Navigation buttons	Used to navigate menus, scroll through pictures
5	Zoom buttons	Enlarge or reduce the size of the displayed picture
6	Start button	Begins copying, scanning, printing, maintenance task, and file transfer
7	Cancel button	Stops the current operation and returns to the menu; returns to previous item when navigating menus
8	Rotate button	Changes the orientation of the displayed picture; with the zoom function, changes the orientation of the red box that shows the area of the picture to be printed
9	OK button	Selects a menu item, accepts a zoom setting, and lets you continue with the current operation
10	Back button	Displays the previous screen

Home Center Software

KODAK Home Center Software is installed as part of the software installation on your computer. The Home Center icon will appear on your desktop. Use this icon to start Home Center Software.



Home Center Software for WINDOWS OS-based computers

On a WINDOWS OS-based computer, you can use Home Center Software to browse and edit pictures, print, copy, scan, order supplies, access the Extended User Guide, and configure your all-in-one printer from your computer. You can also access the KODAK Tips and Projects Center Web site or upgrade your printer with a newer version of software and/or firmware.

Clicking one of the three icons located in the upper-right corner of Home Center Software does the following:

Home - takes you to the main Home Center Software window from other functions within Home Center Software

Tools - displays menu options, including links to Kodak sites, troubleshooting, and maintenance functions

Help - displays a Help panel for Home Center Software

On a MACINTOSH Computer, Home Center Software has three panes: Select, Tools, and Maintenance. These panes let you do the following:

Select pane — select your printer from a list of connected printers and check the printer ink levels.

Tools pane — start a scan, select scanning settings, change Home Center Software settings, and restore all factory default settings.

Maintenance pane — print a test page, align and clean the printhead, and initiate an upload of diagnostic data for service personnel.

From any pane, you can order supplies from the KODAK Web site and view the status of your printer.

From the File menu of Home Center Software, you can check for software updates.

Configuring Your Printer

This chapter presumes that you have set up your printer and that you may or may not have installed the printer software.

This chapter tells you how to configure or change your printer settings and your network settings.

Configuring printer settings

Configuring basic NOTE: When you first power on the printer, the printer automatically steps you through the process of selecting the **Language** and **Country/Region**.

To set or change basic printer settings:

- 1. Press Home.
- 2. Press **v** to select **Printer Settings**, then press **OK**.
- 3. Press \frown to select one of the following settings:
 - Date and Time*
 - Time to Low Power
 - Press to change the time to energy-saving low power (select from 1 to 4 hours in 0.5 hour increments). After the Time to Low Power, the printer goes into a low-power mode.
 - Tagged Images Printing (see Printing tagged pictures, page 19)
 - Press b to select **On** or **Off**.

If you select **On**, when you are printing pictures, the printer LCD prompts you to verify that you want to print pictures that were tagged (or marked) using your camera. Different cameras use different terminology; KODAK Digital Cameras use "marked" images; others use either tagged images or DPOF.

- Language
 - Press **OK**, press **v** to select a language, then press **OK**.
- Country/Region
 - Press **OK**, press **v** to select a country or region, then press **OK**.
- Reset All Settings (see Resetting factory defaults, page 40)
- NOTE: Resetting factory defaults does not change the date and time, language, or country/region.
- 4. Press Back.

* You can also synchronize the printer's date and time to your computer from **Home Center Settings** under **Tools** in Home Center Software. Setting yourIf you have more than one printer, and after installation your all-in-one printer was
not the default printer, you can make your all-in-one printer your default printer.default printerIMPORTANT: For all operating systems, if you connect your printer with a USB cable and
with a wireless connection, your printer may be listed twice. Be sure to select

with a wireless connection, your printer may be listed twice. Be sure to select the correct printer. (The name of the printer plus a number indicates a wireless connection; for example, KodakESP5200+1133.)

For all computers and operating systems: If you haven't yet installed the printer software, insert the software CD that came with your printer and follow the on-screen instructions to install the software.

For WINDOWS XP OS-based computers

- 1. Select Start > Control Panel > Printers and Faxes.
- 2. Right-click your printer, and select **Set as Default Printer**.

For WINDOWS VISTA OS-based computers

- 1. Select Start > Control Panel > Hardware and Sound > Printers.
- 2. Right-click your printer, and select **Set as Default Printer**.

For WINDOWS 7 OS-based computers

- 1. Select Start > Control Panel > Hardware and Sound > Devices and Printers.
- 2. Right-click your printer, and select **Set as Default Printer**.

For MACINTOSH Computers

When a new printer is installed, it becomes the default printer. If your all-in-one printer is not the default printer:

- 1. From the dock, open **System Preferences**.
- 2. In the Hardware section, click Print & Fax.
- 3. Select your printer from the drop-down list next to **Default Printer**.

Configuring network settings

To connect your printer to an 802.11 wireless (Wi-Fi) network, see the information that came with your printer, or refer to the following information, as needed.

If you are unsure of how your network is configured, contact your Internet service provider or your network administrator for assistance.

Configuring a If you did not do so during printer setup, you can connect your printer to a wireless **network** network from the printer control panel. **connection**

Before you connect You need:

- A laptop or desktop computer equipped with a network interface card or wireless networking support.
- A working 802.11 wireless network. Kodak recommends that you use a wireless access point/router that uses Dynamic Host Configuration Protocol (DHCP).
- Your network name (SSID Service Set Identifier). You can obtain your SSID from the wireless access point, most commonly a router, using the router's embedded Web server. See the manufacturer's documentation provided with your wireless system for more information.
- Your Wired Equivalent Privacy (WEP) key or Wi-Fi Protected Access (WPA/WPA2) passphrase.
- To be sure to temporarily disable your firewall until the printer is successfully installed and communicating.

For assistance with any of the items listed above, contact your Internet service provider or your network administrator.

Connecting to a wireless network using the WiFi Setup Wizard on the printer to connect to your wireless network. Read the following procedures and use the one that is appropriate for your network setup.
 Connecting to a listed network
 See Before you connect to determine what is needed to connect your printer to the network. For assistance, contact your Internet service provider or your network administrator. To connect to a listed network using the WiFi Setup Wizard:

- 1. Press Home.
- 2. Press **v** to select **Network Settings**, then press **OK**.
- 3. With WiFi Setup Wizard selected, press OK.
- NOTE: The Wi-Fi radio is turned on automatically when you select WiFi Setup Wizard.

The printer searches for available wireless networks within range, then displays the list in order of signal strength. For example:

	NOTE: If there are more networks than can be shown on the LCD, a ♥ (page down) symbol appears in the bottom right of the display. If you don't see your network in the list or want to change your network, select Rescan for Wireless Networks, then press OK.

Press ▲, ▼, ◀ or ▶ to select the letters and numbers of your password, using the correct uppercase and lowercase letters. Press OK after each character. If your router supports Wi-Fi Protected Setup (WPS), you can use WPS Connect. connect to a Wi-Fi WPS lets you configure your printer for a wireless network by pressing buttons or entering a PIN.

To connect to a network using WPS:

1. Press Home.

- Press to select Network Settings, then press OK.
- 3. With WiFi Setup Wizard selected, press OK.
- NOTE: The Wi-Fi radio is turned on automatically when you select Wi-Fi Setup Wizard.
- 4. Press **v** to select **WPS Connect**, then press **OK**.
- 5. Select one of two methods of connecting:
- IMPORTANT: Before you press **OK** on the printer, make sure you know where the router's push button is, or where to enter the generated PIN. If necessary, consult your Internet service provider or router device manufacturer's documentation for more information.
 - To use push buttons:
 - a. With Push Button Configuration selected, press OK.
 - b. You will have two minutes to push the WPS button on your router (this may either be a physical button on the router or a virtual button in the router's software).
 - To enter a PIN:
 - a. Press **v** to select **Generate WPS PIN**, then press **OK**.
 - b. Go to your router's software and locate the PIN button.
 - c. Enter the PIN you received on the LCD into the PIN screen for your router.
- 6. When the confirmation message appears, press **OK**.
- 7. If you haven't yet installed the printer software, insert the CD that came with your printer in your computer and install the software.

The printer with a wireless connection is listed as the name of the printer plus a number (for example, KodakESP5200+1133).

Setting up an IP IMPOR address

IMPORTANT: You should only need to set up an IP address for your printer if you are having a problem with connecting. Typically, it is not necessary to set up an IP address. This procedure is for advanced users who know how to obtain the IP address for the printer.

All IP address entries have the following format: 000.000.000.000. Within each three-digit grouping, the number must be right-justified. If an address or subnet mask has only one or two characters between the periods, include one or two leading zeros in front of that number. For example:

The address as it may appear in your documentation	How to enter the address in the printer menu
149.89.138.149	149.089.138.149
149.2.40.149	149.002.040.149

To set up your IP address on the printer:

- 1. Press Home.
- 2. Press \bullet to select **Network Settings**, then press **OK**.
- 3. Press **v** to select **Advanced IP Address Setup**, then press **OK**.
- 4. Press **OK** again to continue.
- 5. Select one of the following, then press **OK**:
 - Dynamic (DHCP)
 - Automatic (Private)
 - Manual (Static)
- If you selected Manual (Static), you are prompted to enter an IP address, a Subnet Mask, a Gateway Address, and a DNS Server address. Press OK after each entry. Use the navigation buttons to enter each digit of the numbers. Consult your network administrator or Internet service provider for more information.

Verifying the network configuration

To verify that you are connected to your wireless network:

1. Press Home.

- 2. Press **v** to select **Network Settings**, then press **OK**.
- 3. Press **v** to select **View Network Configuration**, then press **OK**.

The wireless network settings appear on the LCD. If the printer is connected to your network, you will see the network name and the word CONNECTED.

- 4. To scroll through the information, press \checkmark .
- 5. When you are done, press **OK**.

Handling Paper

For the best photo printing results, use KODAK Photo Papers, which are optimized to work with KODAK All-in-One Printers.

For the best document printing results, use KODAK Document Papers or a paper with the COLORLOK Technology logo on the package. Use only paper that is designed for inkjet printers.

When handling paper:

- Hold the paper by the edges; avoid placing your fingerprints on it.
- Do not touch the glossy side of photo paper.
- Store paper flat, away from direct sunlight and heat.

Paper types

You can use:

- Plain paper 20 to 24 lb / 75 to 90 gsm
- Photo paper up to 12 mil (290 gsm)
- Card stock 110 lb / 200 gsm, max
- Envelopes most standard types
- Transparencies inkjet variety with white stripe
- Labels all inkjet varieties on 8.5 x 11-in. or A4 sheets
- Iron-on transfers all inkjet varieties on 8.5 x 11-in. or A4 sheets

Paper sizes

The printer accepts the following paper sizes:

- 4 x 6 in. / 101 x 152 mm
- 4 x 7 in. / 101 x 178 mm
- 4 x 12 in. / 101 x 305 mm
- 5 x 7 in. / 127 x 178 mm
- 8 x 10 in. / 203 x 254 mm
- 8.5 x 11 in. / 216 x 279 mm
- 8.5 x 14 in. / 216 x 356 mm
- A4 (8.27 x 11.69 in. / 210 x 297 mm)
- A5 (5.83 x 8.27 in. / 148 x 210 mm)
- A6 (4.13 x 5.83 in. / 105 x 148 mm)
- B5 (6.93 x 9.48 in. / 176 x 250 mm)

NOTE: Do not load paper smaller than 4×6 in. / 101 x 152 mm or A6.

Envelope sizes

The printer accepts the following envelope sizes:

- C5 (6.38 x 9 in. / 162 x 229 mm)
- C6 (4.5 x 6.38 in. / 114 x 162 mm)
- DL (4.31 x 8.69 in. / 110 x 220 mm)
- US #7¾ (3.88 x 7.5 in. / 98 x 190 mm)
- US #9 (3.88 x 8.88 in. / 98 x 225 mm)
- US #10 (4.13 x 9.5 in. / 105 x 241 mm)

IMPORTANT: Do not load envelopes with cutouts or with cellophane windows.

Loading paper

Loading plain The paper tray capacity is 100 sheets of plain paper.



To load plain paper:

1. Open the paper tray.




- 2. Pull out the paper tray extender until it is fully extended.
- 3. Lift the paper stop.
- 4. Make sure the left paper-edge guide is to the far left.



- 5. Carefully fan and stack the paper, then insert it into the tray.
- 6. Move the paper forward until it stops.

7. Move the left paper-edge guide until it touches the paper.




Loading photo paper

The paper tray capacity is 20 sheets of photo paper.

To load photo paper:

- 1. Remove any paper from the tray.
- 2. Carefully fan and stack the photo paper, then insert the paper (short side first) into the tray with the **logo side facing up**.
- 3. Move the paper forward until it stops.
- 4. Move the left paper-edge guide until it touches the paper.



Loading envelopes

The paper tray capacity is 20 envelopes.

To load envelopes:

- 1. Remove any paper from the tray.
- 2. Insert the envelope(s) into the tray with the flap up and against the right side of the tray.
- 3. Move the left paper-edge guide until it touches the envelope(s).



Printing Pictures

The quickest way to print pictures is from a memory card inserted into the printer.

Another way to print pictures is to use Home Center Software on your computer running the WINDOWS Operating System. Home Center Software lets you edit and enhance your pictures on your computer before printing. Open Home Center Software, select **Print Pictures**, then follow the on-screen instructions.

If you have a MACINTOSH Computer, print your pictures using KODAK EASYSHARE Software, iPhoto, or another picture-editing program.

Changing Print Photos Options / Defaults

You can change the print photos options for an individual picture or group of pictures, or you can change the settings and save them as the default.

To change print photos options:

- 1. Press Home.
- 2. If necessary, press **v** to select **View and Print Photos**, then press **OK**.
- 3. Press \triangleleft or \triangleright as needed to change the settings below.

- Variations of the memory cards listed above that require an adapter (for example, MEMORY STICK Duo, miniSD, and microSD)


IMPORTANT: If you use a memory card with an adapter, make sure you insert and remove the adapter and the memory card as a unit; do not remove the memory card while leaving the adapter in the printer.

Printing a picture using the default
If you use the default settings, one 4 x 6 in. /101 x 152 mm picture is printed. To print a picture:
1. Load photo paper with the logo side facing up (see Loading photo paper, page 14), and move the left paper-edge guide until it touches the paper.

2. Insert the memory card into the memory card slot.



- 3. Press **4** or **b** to display the picture you want to print.
- 4. Press Start to begin printing.



Printing pictures photo options

To print pictures with options other than the default settings (such as a different using non-default print size, black-and-white instead of color, or a date on the print):

> 1. Load photo paper with the logo side facing up (see Loading photo paper, page 14), and move the left paper-edge guide until it touches the paper.



- 2. Press Back.
- 3. If necessary, use the navigation buttons to select **View and Print Photos**.
- 4. Press OK.

- 9. Insert the memory card into the memory card slot.
- 10. Press ◀ or ▶ to select the picture you want to print, then press **OK**. A check mark on the LCD indicates the picture is selected.
- NOTE: To deselect the picture, press **OK** again.
- 11. To select additional pictures, press ◀ or ▶ until the picture is displayed, then press **OK**.
- 12. When you are done selecting pictures, press **Start** to begin printing.
- IMPORTANT: To prevent loss of data from your memory card, do not remove it from the printer while printing.

Printing tagged pictures

Some digital cameras let you tag (or "mark") pictures on the memory card for printing. This creates a tag that is recognized by the printer. If you choose to print tagged pictures, they will be printed according to the default settings on your printer (unless otherwise specified by the tag from the camera).

NOTE: Refer to your camera user guide to determine whether your camera supports tagged (also "marked" or "DPOF") functionality.

To print tagged pictures:

1. Load photo paper with the logo side facing up (see Loading photo paper, page 14), and move the left paper-edge guide until it touches the paper.

2. Insert the memory card into the memory card slot.



3. When the "Print tagged images?" message appears, press Start.

Printing To print a panoramic picture, load 4 x 12 in. / 101 x 305 mm paper, or US letter or A4 panoramic paper. pictures

Zooming and

Zooming and cropping lets you print a specific part of your picture. Use the zoom cropping pictures buttons to select a portion of your picture for printing. The crop window matches the aspect ratio of the selected output print size.



To zoom and crop a picture:

- 1. Load photo paper with the logo side facing up (see Loading photo paper, page 14), and move the left paper-edge guide until it touches the paper.
- 2. Insert the memory card into the memory card slot.



- 3. Press **(** or **)** to display the picture you want to crop.
- 4. Press **Zoom +** to enlarge the picture on the LCD. A red box shows the area that will be printed.

- NOTE: You can press **Zoom +** repeatedly to enlarge the picture in increments of 0.25 up to a magnification of 5X. Press **Zoom –** to decrease the magnification in increments of 0.25 back down to 1X.
- 5. Use the navigation buttons to move the picture on the LCD up, down, left, or right. Only the part of the picture in the red box will print.
- 6. After you have pressed the zoom button(s), press **Rotate** if you want to rotate the red box in 90 degree increments. This will determine the content that is printed.
- NOTE: Zooming and cropping does not change the saved picture on the memory card.
- 7. When you are satisfied with the picture, press **OK**. The picture appears in the original view with a red box around the portion of the picture that will print.
- 8. Press **Start** to begin printing.

Transferring pictures to a computer

You can transfer .jpg, .mov, and .wav files from a memory card in the printer to your computer. To transfer these files, the printer **must** be connected to your computer with a USB cable.

NOTE: If you have large video files or a large number of pictures (400 or more), we recommend that you use a memory card reader attached directly to your computer to transfer them.

- 1. Insert the memory card into the memory card slot on the printer.
- 2. Press **Back**.
 - 3. If necessary, use the navigation buttons to select **View and Print Photos**.
- 4. Press OK.
- 5. Press **v** to select **Transfer All to PC**, then press **OK**.
- 6. Press Start.
- 7. If your computer is connected to a wireless network and with a USB cable, select the USB-connected printer (no number after the printer name).
- 8. Follow the on-screen instructions on your computer.

Transferring pictures to a MACINTOSH Computer

- 1. Insert the memory card into the memory card slot on the printer.
- 2. Press Back.
- 3. If necessary, use the navigation buttons to select **View and Print Photos**.
- 4. Press **OK**.
- 5. Press **v** to select **Transfer All to PC**, then press **OK**.
- 6. Press Start.
- 7. If your computer is connected to a wireless network and with a USB cable, select the USB-connected printer (no number after the printer name).
- 8. Use iPhoto or Image Capture on your computer to complete the transfer.

Copying

You can copy documents and pictures with your all-in-one printer. The printer produces high-quality color or black-and-white copies on a variety of paper types (see Paper types, page 12).

Making a copy

To copy a document or a picture using the default settings:

1. Lift the scanner lid, and place the document or picture face down on the glass.



- 2. Close the lid.
- NOTE: Single-button document copy is a feature that lets you put paper on the scanner and immediately press **Start**, without following the remaining steps below. You can use this feature when the printer has been idle or when it is turned on; the printer automatically goes to Copy Document mode.
 - 3. Press Home.
 - 4. If needed, press **v** or **a** to select **Copy Document** or **Copy Photo**.
- 5. Press **Start** to begin copying.

Changing copy options

You can change the copy options for an individual copy, or you can change the settings for copying documents or copying photos, and save them as the defaults.

Adjusting copy settings

You can change the copy settings for individual copy tasks. A few of the common tasks are described below.

Enlarging or reducing a document

- To enlarge or reduce the size of your copy:
 - Lift the scanner lid, and place the document face down on the glass. Note the orientation of the paper on the glass and make sure the paper is flush to the edges.



- 2. Close the lid.
- 3. Press Home.
- 4. If needed, press **v** or **a** to select **Copy Document**.
- 5. Press OK.
- 6. Press **v** to select **Copy Size**.
- 7. Press **4** or **b** to select the enlargement or reduction you want.
- NOTE: If you select **Fit to Page**, the printer detects the size of the original on the scanner glass and the size of the paper in the paper tray, and automatically reduces or enlarges the original so that the copy fits on the paper
- 8. Press **Start** to begin copying.

Enlarging or reducing a photo

To enlarge or reduce the size of your copy:

- 1. Lift the scanner lid, and place the photo face down on the glass.
- 2. Close the lid.
- 3. Press Home.
- 4. If needed, press \frown or \blacktriangle to select **Copy Photo**.
- 5. Press OK.
- 6. Press 🖝 to select **Copy Size**.
- 7. Press \blacktriangleleft or \blacktriangleright to select the photo size you want.
- 8. Press **Start** to begin copying.

Darkening orIf the original document or picture is too light or too dark, you can make the copylightening copiesdarker or lighter.

To darken or lighten the copy:

1. Lift the scanner lid, and place the document face down on the glass.



- 2. Close the lid.
- 3. Press Home.
- 4. If needed, press **v** or **a** to select **Copy Document** or **Copy Photo**.
- 5. Press OK.
- 6. Press **v** to select **Brightness**.
- 7. Press ◀ to select a number below zero for a darker copy, or press ▶ to select a number above zero for a lighter copy.
- 8. Press **Start** to begin copying.

6 Scanning

Scanning converts the text and images from the documents and pictures that you place on the scanner glass into electronic data, and then sends the data to your computer. To scan with your all-in-one printer, it must be connected to a computer with a USB cable or a wireless network.

You save the scanned file(s) to your computer; you cannot save to a memory card in the printer.

Before you begin scanning

Change the default scan settings in the Home Center Software. (Click the Tool icon, then select **Printer Scan Settings**.) You can adjust the following settings for scanned pictures and documents:

- Color / black-and-white / gray scale
- Resolution (dpi)
- File format (.pdf, .rtf, .tif, .jpg for documents; .jpg, .bmp, .tif for pictures)
- Base name (by default, scanned files are named "scan1", "scan2", etc)
- Location (folder) where the scanned files will be saved

Before saving a scanned file, you can preview it in Home Center Software, and crop the output as desired. See the Home Center Software Help (? icon) for instructions.

Simple scanning

To scan a single document or picture:

1. Lift the scanner lid, and place the document or picture face down on the glass.



- 2. Close the lid.
- 3. Open Home Center Software, then:
 - On a WINDOWS OS-based computer, select **Scan Pictures and Documents**, then follow the on-screen instructions.
 - On a MACINTOSH Computer, select Tools > Scan Application, then follow the on-screen instructions.

Scanning multiple pictures simultaneously

Using Home Center Software, you can scan multiple pictures simultaneously and save them as separate files.

NOTE: For Home Center Software to interpret two or more pictures, the scan option must be set to Picture.

When scanning multiple pictures, leave space between the pictures so that the printer can detect the separate pictures. Any pictures that overlap are interpreted as a single picture.

Scanning multiple To scan multiple pictures simultaneously and save them as separate files: pictures with a 1. Lift the scanner lid, and place the pictures face down on the glass leaving space WINDOWS between the pictures. **OS-based** 2. Close the lid. computer 3. Open Home Center Software, then select Scan Pictures and Documents. 4. Open the Tools panel, if it is not open, by clicking the **Tools** icon. 5. Click Printer Scan Settings. 6. Select the **Picture** tab. 7. Select Automatically Detect Pictures, if it is not selected, then click OK. 8. Make sure **Picture** is selected, then follow the on-screen instructions. NOTE: Click the Help icon for additional instructions. **Scanning multiple** To scan multiple pictures simultaneously and save them as separate files: pictures with a 1. Lift the scanner lid, and place the pictures face down on the glass leaving space MACINTOSH between the pictures. Computer 2. Close the lid. 3. Open Home Center Software, then select the **Tools** tab. 4. Select Color Picture or Black and White Picture. 5. Click the **Scan Application** button. 6. Select **Automatically detect multiple pictures**, if it is not selected. 7. Click **Preview** or **Scan All**, and follow the on-screen instructions. NOTE: Click the Help icon for additional instructions.

Maintaining Your Printer

Your printer requires little maintenance. However, Kodak recommends cleaning the scanner glass and lid regularly to remove dust and fingerprints, which affect the quality and accuracy of scanning.

Except for cleaning the printer, keep the printer plugged in with AC power turned on. If you use a power strip, don't turn off the power strip.

Keep the printhead and ink cartridges in the printer at all times. This helps prevent damage to the printhead.

Service agreements are available in some countries. Contact dealers of KODAK Products for more information.

General care and cleaning

CAUTION:

Always disconnect the power to the printer before cleaning it. Do not use harsh or abrasive cleaners or organic solvents on the printer or any of its parts.

- To clean the printer, wipe the outside with a clean, dry cloth.
- Keep the surrounding area vacuumed and litter-free.
- Protect the printer from tobacco smoke, dust, sand, other small particles (such as crumbs), and liquid spills.
- Do not place objects on the printer.
- Keep the printer supplies away from direct sunlight and out of high-temperature environments.
- Do not allow chemicals, such as suntan lotion, to come into contact with the painted surface of the printer.
- If the printer has been exposed to bad weather or has water inside it, turn it off and let it dry completely. If this does not solve the problem, contact Kodak Service & Support.

Cleaning the scanner glass

For good quality copies and scans, ensure the printer's scanner glass and lid backing are clean; dust the exterior as needed.

CAUTION:

Do not use abrasives, acetone, benzene, or carbon tetrachloride on the glass, as these chemicals may damage it. Do not pour or spray liquid directly on the glass; the liquid might seep under the glass and damage the printer.

To clean the scanner glass:

1. Unplug the printer and raise the scanner lid.



- 2. Wipe the glass with a soft cloth or sponge, slightly moistened with a nonabrasive glass cleaner.
- 3. Dry the glass with a lint-free cloth.
- 4. When finished cleaning, plug in the printer.

Cleaning insideMinor debris can accumulate on the white document backing located under thethe scanner lidscanner lid.

CAUTION:

Do not use paper-based wipes, as they can scratch the underside of the scanner lid. Do not use harsh or abrasive cleaners or organic solvents on the printer or any of its parts.

To clean the white document backing under the scanner lid:

1. Unplug the printer and raise the scanner lid.



- 2. Gently clean the underside of the lid with a soft cloth or sponge, slightly moistened with a mild soap and warm water.
- 3. Dry the underside with a chamois or soft cloth.
- 4. If the white document backing needs further cleaning, use isopropyl (rubbing) alcohol on a soft cloth, then wipe thoroughly with a cloth damped with water to remove any residual alcohol.
- 5. When finished cleaning, plug in the printer.

Replacing ink cartridges


Your printer uses both black and color ink cartridges. You can check the approximate ink levels on the LCD (see Checking ink levels, page 40) or in Home Center Software. When an ink cartridge is out of ink, the printer LCD displays a message stating that the black or color ink cartridge needs replacing.

IMPORTANT: *Do not use non-Kodak brand or refilled ink cartridges.* To replace an ink cartridge:


- 1. Make sure your printer is on.
- 2. Lift the printer access door, and wait for the carriage to move to the access position.



The black and color ink cartridges are located in the printhead.




3. Pinch the latch on the ink cartridge and lift it out of the printhead.






- IMPORTANT: Insert the ink cartridge into the printhead immediately to prevent the printhead from drying out.

Replacing the printhead


IMPORTANT: Replacing the printhead is not a regular maintenance procedure. Replace the printhead only if you receive a new printhead from Kodak.

To replace the printhead:

- 1. Make sure your printer is on.
- 2. Lift the printer access door, and wait for the carriage to move to the access position.



- 14. Close the printer access door.

The printer detects the new printhead. Follow the instructions on the LCD to calibrate your printer.

Upgrading the printer software and firmware

	Using the latest software and firmware helps ensure optimal performance of your printer.
	When you upgrade to the latest version of Home Center Software, it comes with the latest drivers, which are programmed links between the computer and printer. The drivers allow communication between the printer, scanner, and computer.
	Firmware is data or programs that are written to the memory and control functionality of your printer.
	When you open Home Center Software, the software automatically checks for software and firmware updates (firmware updates on WINDOWS OS-based computers only). Use this procedure when you want to upgrade manually.
	NOTE: Your printer must be connected to the computer with a USB cable (not wirelessly) to upgrade firmware.

The LCD shows approximate levels of ink in the cartridges so you know when it's time to order replacement cartridges.

- 3. Press **v** to select **Reset All Settings**, then press **OK**.
- 4. When you see the message, "This will reset printer settings to factory defaults," press **OK**.

Basic troubleshooting

Some problems can be resolved quickly by power cycling the printer: Turn off your printer. Wait five seconds. Turn on the printer.
