




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Unpacking Your New DVD Player


Before using your new portable DVD player, you should unpack the contents of the box and check to make sure everything is present and undamaged.

To unpack the player:

- 1. Open the box. Remove the carrying case, which holds the player in one pocket and the accessories in the other.
- 2. Open the carrying case and remove the player and accessories.
- 3. Open the player and peel the protective plastic cover from the screen.
- 4. Check to ensure the accessories indicated below are included. If any items are missing or damaged, contact the seller immediately.




5. Open the disc receptacle by pressing the **OPEN** button, remove the paper laser protector, then close the receptacle.





7. Attach the battery to the rear of the player: Line up the four tabs on the battery with the four corresponding slots on the player, drop the tabs into the slots, then slide the battery toward the front of the display.

- 8. Connect one end of the power cord to a wall socket, and the other end to the power adapter.
- 9. Connect the power adapter to the IN 12V jack on the side of the player. The CHARGE INDICATION light on the battery should come on, indicating that the battery is charging.




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
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
Operating the Player



Turning the Player On and Off

Once a charged battery is attached to the player or the player is attached to a power outlet with the power adapter, turn the player on and off by sliding the POWER switch on the left side of the player to the appropriate position.





Inserting a Disc

The receptacle for DVDs and CDs is located directly beneath the screen.

To insert a disc:

- 1. Press the **OPEN** button to open the receptacle.
- 2. Snap the disc onto the spindle in the center.
- 3. Close the receptacle cover. The player will begin to play the disc.


Adjusting the Volume

The **VOL** knob on the left side of the player sets the speaker and headphones volume. To adjust the volume, swivel the knob in the appropriate direction.

Using Headphones

To listen to the audio using headphones, plug them into the PHONE jack on the left side of the player. The speakers will mute when headphones are plugged in.

To use two sets of headphones simultaneously, plug the earphones splitter (shown on page 2) into the PHONE jack, and then plug both sets of headphones into the splitter.



Adjusting Color Settings

You can adjust display color settings with the buttons directly below the player's screen. There are three color settings: Brightness, Contrast, and Color.

Press the **MODE** button to cycle through these, and press the **DOWN** and **UP** buttons to adjust the selected setting.

To reset the color settings, press **MODE** until **RESET** is highlighted and press either **DOWN** or **UP**.

The menu will disappear after a few seconds of inactivity.

Bringing Up the On-Screen Display

The On-Screen Display (OSD) gives information about the current disc and playback. To bring up the OSD, press the **OSD** button on the remote.

Accessing the Setup Menu

The Setup menu allows you to configure the operation of the player. You can change video, audio, and language settings, control access to mature programming, and configure other general display behavior. See "Configuring the Player" on page 23 for more information. To access the Setup menu, press the **SETUP** button.

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Playing DVDs

DVDs will play upon insertion. The player can perform all standard DVD playback and search functions.

The On-Screen Display

The DVD OSD has two modes:

The first mode (press **OSD** once) shows the current title, chapter, and playback time.

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Press OSD a third time to exit the OSD.

Navigating Menus

When in a DVD menu, use the arrow controls to navigate.

Press ENTER to select an item.

Press **MENU** to return to the previous menu.

Controlling Playback

Press once to stop the DVD at the current location, and twice to stop the DVD completely.

When the DVD is playing, press **II**▶ to pause it.

When the DVD is paused, press **II** to step forward one frame at a time.

Press 🕶 to return to the previous chapter.


Press ▶ to skip to the next chapter.

Press \blacktriangleleft to fast reverse the DVD. Press \blacktriangleright to fast forward the DVD. Repeated presses cycle through the speed options: $\times 2$, $\times 4$, $\times 8$, $\times 20$, and normal speed.

Press I to play the video at a slower speed. Repeated presses cycle through the speed options: $\times 1/2$, $\times 1/3$, $\times 1/4$, $\times 1/5$, $\times 1/6$, $\times 1/7$, and normal speed.

Press \blacktriangleright to return to normal play mode or to start playing the DVD again when it is stopped or paused.

Press MENU to return to the last DVD menu.



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Searching to a Location

You can search to a title, chapter, or time on the current disc using the **SEARCH** button.

To search to a location:

- 1. Press **SEARCH** to bring up the Search menu.
- 2. Use \blacktriangleleft and \blacktriangleright to select title, chapter, or time.
- 3. Enter the desired location.
- 4. Press ← J.

Repeating Chapters

Press **REPEAT** to cycle through the repeat modes: Off, Chapter, Title, and All. You can repeat an arbitrary section of video using the **A-B RPT** button.

To repeat an arbitrary selection:

- 1. Press **A-B RPT** once. "REPEAT A-" shows to mark the beginning of the section.
- 2. Press **A-B RPT** once more to mark the end of the section. "REPEAT A–B" will display on the screen.

The section will begin repeating and will continue until you press **A-B RPT** again.

Programming Playback Sequence

The **PROGRAM** button brings up the Program menu, which allows you to program playback sequence. There are 16 slots available.

To program playback sequence:

- 1. Press **PROGRAM** to bring up the Program menu.
- Select the first slot using the arrow controls, and enter the desired title (under the "T" column) and chapter (under the "C" column) numbers using the keypad.

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Select "CLEAR" and press — to clear the playback sequence and start over.

Playing Video CDs

Video CDs can contain video or still images such as photos. Your DVD player will play all standard Video CD formats.


Upon insertion, the player will read and begin to play the CD.

If there is a menu on the CD, it will appear, allowing you to navigate through the tracks stored on the CD. Otherwise, the player will begin playing the video back beginning with the first track.

If the CD contains still pictures, the player will display them as a slideshow.

The On-Screen Display

The Video CD OSD displays the current track, mute status, playback control status (PBC—the playback control status determines whether the disc menu is available), repeat mode, and playback time.



Navigating Menus

Press I and ▶ to scroll through menu pages.

To view an item, enter its number on the keypad.

Note: To view an item, the menu page containing the item must be visible before you enter the item's number.

Controlling Playback

Press once to stop the disc at the current location, and twice to stop the disc completely.

When the disc is playing, press **II** to pause it.

When the disc is paused, press II> to step forward one frame at a time.

Press 🛃 to return to the previous track.

Press ▶ to skip to the next track.


Press ◀ to fast reverse the video. Press ➡ to fast forward the video. Repeated presses cycle through the speed options: ×2, ×4, ×8, ×20, and normal speed.

Press I to play the video at a slower speed. Repeated presses cycle through the speed options: $\times 1/2$, $\times 1/3$, $\times 1/4$, $\times 1/5$, $\times 1/6$, $\times 1/7$, and normal speed.

Press \blacktriangleright to return to normal play mode or to start playing the disc again when it is stopped or paused.

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Searching to a Location





Upon insertion, the player will read and begin to play your Kodak Picture CD, displaying a slideshow of the images on the disc.

The OSD shows the current image number and repeat mode.

Press to stop slideshow playback and return to the menu.

When the disc is playing, press II > to pause it.

Press ► to start playing the slideshow again when it is stopped or paused.




To skip directly to an image, enter the image number on the keypad.

Navigating Menus

Press while the slideshow is playing to bring up the thumbnail menu, which displays thumbnails of the images on the disc.



Note: If you press ■ a second time while viewing the thumbnail menu, the player will display a list of media on the disc, as described in "Playing Media on Data CDs" on page 15. When this occurs, the thumbnail view will be unavailable until you eject and re-insert the disc.



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Press ₩ and ▶ to scroll through menu pages.

Use the arrow controls to select the desired image and press ← . Alternatively, enter the number of the desired image on the keypad. The selected image will display on the screen. Press ► to start a slideshow beginning with the selected image.

Transforming Images

Press ► to rotate the image 90° clockwise.

Press ◀ to rotate the image 90° counterclockwise.

Press \blacktriangle to flip the image vertically.

Press $\mathbf{\nabla}$ to flip the image horizontally.



Upon inserting a data CD, the player will display a menu showing all media files on the disc and allowing you to select files for playback.

The On-Screen Display


The OSD displays the current file number, mute status, repeat mode, and playback time.

Using the Menu

The menu allows you to navigate tracks and program playback sequence.

There are three views within the menu, listed at the bottom right of the screen, which allow playback of different types of media: audio (MP3), image (JPEG), and video (MPEG).

The top of the menu shows the path and filename of the currently selected file.



The left column gives a list of folders on the disc. When an image is selected in the right column, the left column shows a preview of the image.

The right column gives a list of files in the current folder.

To use the menu:

- 1. Use ▶ and ◀ to navigate to the media types at the bottom right of the screen and highlight the desired media type.
- 2. Press \leftarrow to select it.
- 3. Press ◀ until the left column is highlighted.
- 4. Use \blacktriangle and \triangledown to highlight the desired folder.
- 5. Press \leftarrow to enter the folder.
- 6. Press ► to highlight the right column.
- 7. Use \blacktriangle and \triangledown to highlight the desired file.
- Press ← to play back the audio/video or display the image. If the file is an image, you can press ► to start playback of a slideshow beginning with that image.

Using the Remote Control

The remote control can be used to control every aspect of the display's operation and includes more functionality than the controls on the player itself.


Replacing the Remote Battery

The remote requires a CR2025 battery, which is held in a small enclosure at the bottom of the remote.

To replace the battery:

- 1. Release the tab and pull the enclosure out of the remote.
- 2. Remove the old battery and replace it with the new battery. The positive (+) terminal should face the bottom of the remote.
- 3. Slide the enclosure back into the remote.

The Setup menu allows you to configure the operation of the player. You can change video, audio, and language settings, control access to mature programming, and configure other general display behavior.

To use the Setup menu:

- 1. Press the **SETUP** button to bring up the menu.
- 2. Once the menu appears, use the ◀ and ► buttons to navigate the submenus listed at the top of the menu.
- 3. Press ▼ to enter a sub-menu. (Press ▲ repeatedly to leave a sub-menu.)
- 4. Use ▲ and ▼ to select an item. A list of the options available for the currently selected item will show to the right.



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


Using the Player in a Vehicle

Your portable DVD player is designed to accommodate usage in a vehicle. A vehicle power adapter is included to power the player from your vehicle, and the carrying case can be adapted to attach the player to a seatback.

Connecting Power

To connect the player to the vehicle's power supply, attach one end of the included vehicle power adapter to the IN 12V jack on the player, and the other end to a cigarette lighter power outlet.




Attaching to a Seatback

The carrying case can be used to attach the player to a seatback, such as in a vehicle or airplane.

To attach the player to a seatback:

- 1. Slide the player (with battery attached) into the main pocket of the carrying case.
- 2. Open the player and secure the screen with the two small elastic straps on the flap of the carrying case.







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3. Attach the carrying case strap to the front set of plastic eyelets and tighten it around the base of the headrest.


Connecting the Player to Other Devices

You can connect your portable DVD player to an external display for a larger picture, or to an external audio system for better sound.

Connecting to a Separate Display

To connect to a separate display, attach the yellow end of the included video adapter cable to the composite video input on the display, and attach the other end to the VIDEO jack on the player.

To connect the audio output to the display as well, attach the red (right) and white (left) connectors on the included audio adapter cable to the display's audio input, and connect the other end of the cable to the AUDIO jack on the player.



Once the player is connected to the display, select the appropriate TV Type setting under the System Setup menu on the player (see "Configuring the Player" on page 23).




There are two outputs that can be used to connect to an external audio system: analog and digital. If your audio system supports digital audio, use the digital output, as it will provide better sound quality.

To connect to a digital (S/PDIF) system, use a 1/8"-to-TOSLINK™ or 1/8"-to-coaxial audio cable to connect the COAXIAL output on the player to a digital audio input on the audio









Using the Battery Pack

The battery life of the included battery pack is more than two and a half hours. It attaches to the rear of the player and may be charged separately or while connected to the player.

Connecting the Battery

To connect the battery to the player, align the notches on the battery with the holes on the bottom of the player, push the notches into the holes, and slide the battery and player together.




Disconnecting the Battery






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To charge the battery separately, attach the power adapter to the DC 12V IN jack on the battery itself.





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Troubleshooting
