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Introduction

Congratulations on your purchase of a high-quality Insignia product. Your NS-ES6112 represents the state of the art in shelf system design and is designed for reliable and trouble-free performance. Your shelf system also includes an iPod dock that lets you play iPod songs through your shelf system speakers.

Important safety instructions

- 1 Read these instructions.
- 2 Keep these instructions.
- **3** Heed all warnings.
- 4 Follow all instructions.
- **5** Do not use this apparatus near water.
- **6** Clean only with a dry cloth.
- 7 Do not block any ventilation openings. Install in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions.
- **8** Do not install near any heat sources such as radiators, heat registers, stoves, or other apparatus (including amplifiers) that produce heat.
- 9 Do not defeat the safety purpose of the polarized or grounding-type plug. A polarized plug has two blades with one wider than the other. A grounding type plug has two blades and a third grounding prong. The



- wide blade or the third prong are provided for your safety. If the provided plug does not fit into your outlet, consult an electrician for replacement of the obsolete outlet.
- 10 Protect the power cord from being walked on or pinched particularly at plugs, convenience receptacles, and the point where they exit from the apparatus.
- 11 Only use attachments/accessories specified by the manufacturer.
- 12 Use only with the cart, stand, tripod, bracket, or table specified by the manufacturer, or sold with the apparatus. When a cart is used, use caution when moving the cart/apparatus combination to avoid injury from tip-over.



- **13** Unplug this apparatus during lightning storms or when unused for long periods of time.
- 14 Refer all servicing to qualified service personnel. Servicing is required when the apparatus has been damaged in any way, such as power-supply cord or plug is damaged, liquid has been spilled or objects have fallen into the apparatus, the apparatus has been exposed to rain or moisture, does not operate normally, or has been dropped.




#	Component	Description
1	MEMORY/ALBUM button	In radio mode, press to store station presets. In MP3/WMA mode, press to go to the next album (folder). Press and hold to skip to the next track in an album.
2	BASS/TREB button	Press to adjust the Bass or Treble.
3	EQ button	Press to select the preset equalizer mode.
4	PLAY MODE button	In CD playback mode, press to cycle through the repeat options. In FM stereo mode, press to select MONO or STEREO .



#	Component	Description	
5	FUNCTION button	Press to select the play mode for your shelf system. Choices include AM, FM, CD, iPod® , or Line-in .	
6	▶■ I (play/pause)/PRESET button	In playback mode, press to begin playback. Press again to pause playback. Press again to resume playback. In radio mode, press to select a preset station.	
7	(stop)/BAND/TIME SET button	In playback mode, press to stop playback. In iPod [®] mode, press to pause playback. In radio mode, press to select AM or FM band. In standby mode, press to set the time.	
8	Remote control sensor	Point the remote control at this sensor to control the shelf system.	
9	(b) STANDBY/ON button	Press to turn your shelf system on. Press again to put your shelf system in standby mode.	
10	LCD	Displays status information, such as the time, radio band, track number, or playback mode.	
11	VOL.+/ button	Press to increase the volume.	
12	I◀◀ /TUNE- button	In CD or iPod® mode, press to go to the previous track. Hold the button to fast reverse a track. In radio mode, press to seek the previous (lower frequency) radio station. Press and hold to tune to the next lower frequency with a good signal.




#	Component	Description
1	DC IN 12 V jack	Connect the AC adapter to this jack.
2	LINE IN jack	Plug an external audio device, such as an MP3 player, into this jack to play sound from the device through your shelf system speakers.
3	Speaker jacks	Connect the wires from the left and right speakers to these jacks.



#	Component	Description
4	PHONE jack	Plug headphones into this jack. Note : When headphones are plugged in, no sound comes from the speakers.
5	FM antenna jack	Clip the FM antenna wire to this jack. Extend the antenna to improve the reception of FM broadcasts.



#	Component	Description
1	CD door switch	Press to open the CD door.
2	iPod [®] dock	Place your iPod [®] here to connect it to the shelf system. Make sure that you use the correct iPod [®] dock. For more information, see "Playing an iPod [®] " on page 19.








#	Component	Description
1	Clock backup battery compartment	Place a backup battery into this compartment to maintain the correct time and settings if the AC power fails.



Speakers (back)






#	Component	Description
1	Left speaker jacks	Connect the speaker to the main shelf system unit using the speaker wire to these jacks. Connect the red wire to the positive (+) jack and the black wire to the negative (-) jack.
2	Right speaker jacks	Connect the speaker to the main shelf system unit using the speaker wire to these jacks. Connect the red wire to the positive (+) jack and the black wire to the negative (-) jack.



Remote control



#	Button	Description
1	(b) STANDBY/ON button	Press to turn your shelf system on. Press again to put your shelf system in standby mode.
2	VOL.+/ button	Press to increase the volume.



#	Button	Description	
3	MEMORY/ALBUM button	In radio mode, press to store station presets. In MP3/WMA mode, press to go to the next album (folder). Press and hold to skip to the next track in an album.	
4	▶■ (play/pause)/PRESET button	In playback mode, press to begin playback. Press again to pause playback. Press again to resume playback. In radio mode, press to select a preset station.

12	►► /TUNE ► button	In CD or iPod® mode, press to go to the next track. Hold the button to fast forward a track. In radio mode, press to seek the next (higher frequency) radio station. Press and hold to tune to the next higher frequency with a good signal.	
13	set button (stop)/BAND/TIME	In playback mode, press to stop playback. In iPod [®] mode, press to pause playback. In radio mode, press to select AM or FM band. In standby mode, press to set the time.	
14	BASS/TREB button	Press to adjust the Bass or Treble.	
15	Battery tray	Remove tray, insert battery, then replace tray.	

Using the remote control

- Aim the remote control at the IR sensor lens on the front of your shelf system from a distance of up to approximately 23 feet (7m) away.
- Make sure that there are no obstacles between the remote control sensor on your shelf system and the remote control.
- Direct sunlight, an incandescent or fluorescent lamp, or any strong light shining on the remote sensor may prevent the sensor from receiving signals from the remote control.



Setting up your shelf system


Installing the backup batteries

To install backup batteries:

1 Turn your shelf system over, then open the door of the battery compartment (1).



2 Insert two (2) AAA batteries into the battery compartment. Make sure that you match the + and – symbols on the batteries with the + and – symbols in the battery compartment.





3 Reinstall and close the battery compartment and return your shelf system to the upright position.

Cautions:

Follow these precau tions when us ing batteries in this device:

- · Use only the size and type of batteries specified.
- Make sure that you follow the corre ct polarity as indicated in the battery compartment when installing batteries.
- Reversed batteries may cause damage to the shelf system.
- Do not mix different types of batteries together (for example, alkaline, rechargeable, and carbon zinc), or semi-used batteries with fresh ones.
- If your shelf system is not to be used for a long period of time, remove the batteries to prevent damage or injury from pos sible battery leakage.
- Do not try to recharge ba tteries not intended to be recharged, because they can overheat and rupture. (Follow battery manufacturer's directions.)
- Do not throw batteries into a fire. Dispose of used batteries as hazardous was te.

Notes

- The backup batteries are used to provide backup for your shelf system when AC power adapter is disconnected or there is a power failure.
- When the battery indicator appears in the display, you need to replace the batteries.

Installing the remote control battery

Warning

There is a danger of explosion if the battery is not replaced correctly. Replace with the same or equivalent type battery.

To install the remote control battery:

- 1 Turn the remote control over to the back side.
- 2 Push the release tab to the right and pull the battery tray out of the remote control.






3 If this is the first time you will be using the remote control, remove the insulation sheet that covers the battery.

-OR-

If you are replacing the battery, remove the old battery and insert a new lithium coin cell battery (CR2025) into the battery tray. Make sure that you match the + symbol on the battery with the + and symbol on the battery tray.



4 Slide the battery tray back into the remote control until it clicks into place.



Warning

- Store the battery in a place where children cannot reach it. If a child accidently swallows the battery, consult a doctor immediately.
- Do not recharge, short, disassemble, or heat the battery, or dispose of it in a fire. Doing any of these things may cause the battery to give off heat, crack, or start a fire.
- Do not leave the battery with other metallic materials. Doing this may cause the battery to give off heat, crack, or start a fire.
- When throwing away or saving the battery, wrap it in tape and insulate, otherwise, the battery may start to give off heat, crack, or start a fire.
- Dispose of battery in the proper manner, according to federal, state, and local regulations.
- If the remote control is not going to be used for an extended period of time, remove the battery.



Making connections

Connecting the AC adapter

Make sure that the AC power outlet matches the AC adapter's power specifications (100-240 V \sim , 50/60 Hz) prior to plugging in the adapter.

To connect the AC adapter:

- **1** Complete all other connections.
- 2 Plug the small DC power connector into the DC IN jack on the back of your shelf system.
- **3** Connect one end of the AC power cord to the adapter, then plug the other end into an AC power outlet.

Note

Use only the AC adapter supplied with your sheld system, which has the following specifications: DC 12 V 3.33 A
Unplug the adapter from the power outlet when not in use.

Connecting the speakers


Your shelf system comes with two (2) speaker cables with bare, soldered wires at each end.

To connect the speakers:

- 1 Press the lever on the red (+) jack on the back of one speaker, then insert one end of the red speaker cable into the jack.
- 2 Press the lever on one of the red (+) jacks on the back of your shelf system, then insert the other end of the red speaker cable into the jack.
- **3** Repeat Step 1 and Step 2 to connect the black speaker cable to the black (–) jacks on the speaker and the back of your shelf system.
- 4 Repeat Steps 1 through 3 to connect the other speaker.

Connecting an iPod®

Your shelf system came with six iPod® holders. Make sure that you select the correct holder for the iPod® you are connecting. The holder number is engraved on the front of the holder.





To connect an iPod[®]:

1 Select the appropriate iPod® dock adapter for your iPod®.

Notes

- iPod® dock adapter identification number is marked on the iPod® dock adapter.
- You can use the supplied dock adapter or your own adapter from Apple Inc.
- We recommend that you buy an appropriate dock adapter in case you lose one.
- 2 Make sure the shelf system and the iPod® are turned off.
- 3 Insert the iPod[®] into the dock adapter, then insert the dock adapter into the iPod[®] connector on the front of your shelf system. Press down gently on the dock adapter to make sure that the docking connector on the iPod[®] makes contact with the docking connector on the shelf system.

Note

- Always set the volume to the minimum when connecting or disconnecting other equipment.
- When you connect your iPod® to your shelf system, make sure you insert it all the way.

Connecting to an external sound source

You can listen to an external device, such as an MP3 player or other auxiliary device, through your shelf system speakers.

To listen to an external sound source:

1 Make sure that your shelf system is turned off.



- 2 Connect the LINE OUT jack on the external sound source to the LINE IN jack at the back panel of your shelf system using a stereo 3.5mm plug cord (not supplied).
- **3** Press **U STANDBY/ON** to turn on your shelf system.
- 4 Turn the volume down.
- 5 Press the **FUNCTION** button repeatedly to select **Line in**. "LINE" appears on the LCD and sound from the external device is played through your shelf system's speakers.
- 6 Start playback on the external sound source, then adjust the volume to a comfortable level.

Using your shelf system

Before using your shelf system, make sure all connections are good, then plug the AC adapter into your shelf system and an AC power outlet.

Turning your shelf system on and off

To turn on your shelf system:

- 1 Press & STANDBY/ON. Your shelf system turns on and starts playback in the last selected play mode.
- 2 Press & STANDBY/ON again to switch your shelf system to standby mode.

Selecting the play mode

To select the play mode:

Press FUNCTION repeatedly to cycle through the available play modes.
 Options include iPod[®], CD, Tuner (radio), or Line (external device). The selected mode appears on the LCD.

Adjusting the volume

To adjust the volume:

- Press MUTE to turn off the sound. Press MUTE or VOL.+/

 vol.-/ ▼ to turn the sound back on.



Setting the clock

To set the clock:

- 1 If your shelf system is on, press \circlearrowleft **STANDBY/ON** to switch your shelf system to standby mode.
- 2 Press the /BAND/TIME SET button on the front of your shelf system. HOUR starts blinking on the LCD.



- 3 Press ►► /TUNE+ or </br>
 /TUNE- repeatedly to set the hour.
- 4 Press the /BAND/TIME SET button again. MIN starts blinking on the LCD.
- 5 Press ►► /TUNE+ or /< /TUNE- repeatedly to set the minutes.
- **6** Press the **■** /**BAND/TIME SET** button again to save the time setting and return to standby mode.

Playing an iPod®

To play an iPod[®]:

- 1 Connect the iPod® to your shelf system using one of the iPod® docks included with the system (see Connecting an iPod® on page 16).
- 2 Press 🖰 **STANDBY/ON** to turn on your shelf system.
- 3 Turn the volume down.
- 4 Press the **FUNCTION** button to select **iPod**®. **iPod**® appears on the LCD and the iPod® starts playback.



5 Adjust the volume to a comfortable level.



Controlling iPod® playback

To control iPod° playback:

- Press ►I /PRESET to start or pause playback.
- Press ►►I /TUNE+ or I◄◄ /TUNE- to go to the next or previous iPod® track.
- Press and hold ►►! /TUNE+ or !◄◄ /TUNE- to search forward or backward on the iPod[®].

Charging your iPod®

The iPod[®] is charged while it is set on your shelf system and your shelf system is powered on.

- Make sure that the AC adapter is providing power to your shelf system.
- The iPod[®] is charged regardless of the sound source selected on your shelf system.
- See your iPod[®] instruction manual about the details of iPod[®] charging.

Caution

- The connector plug is protected with a cover when it is first purchased. Please remove the cover before operating the shelf system.
- Do not carry the shelf system with your iPod* connected.
 You might drop it and damage the connector.
- Do not touch or hit the iPod" terminal pins or the connector pins directly. It might cause damage to the connector part.
- If the iPod" does not play correctly, please update your iPod" software to the latest version. - For details about updating your iPod", check on the Apple web site: http://www.apple.com>.
- iPod* is a trademark of Apple Inc., registered in the U.S. and other countries.
- We are not responsible for any loss of or damage to your iPod® that might result from the use of this product.
- Sound distortion may occur when playing back audio sources with high recording levels. When distortion occurs, we recommend that you turn off the iPod® equalizer. For information on operating the iPod®, see the iPod® instruction manual.

Playing a disc


Your shelf system can play audio CD, CD-R, and CD-RW discs, and MP3 and WMA files.

To play a disc:


1 Press 🖰 **STANDBY/ON** to turn on your shelf system.



2 Slide the CD OPEN/CLOSE switch to open the CD compartment. OPEN appears on the LCD.



3 Insert a CD with the label facing toward the front of your shelf system, then close the door. **READ** appears on the LCD.



4 Press **FUNCTION** to select **CD**. Playback starts automatically.

Controlling disc playback

To control disc playback:

- Press ►I /PRESET on the remote control or the shelf system to start or pause playback.
- Press ►► / TUNE+ or I◄◄ /TUNE- to go to the next or previous track, or hold to search forward or reverse.
- Press /BAND/TIME SET to stop playback. When playback is resumed, it starts from the beginning of the disc.
- (MP3/WMA only) Press and hold MEMORY/ALBUM to skip to the next album and play the first track.
- (MP3/WMA only) Press **MEMORY/ALBUM** to skip forward one track at a time. When you reach the end of an album, your shelf system skips to the first track on the next album.
- Press **MODE** one or more times to select a playback mode. The corresponding icon appears on the LCD. You can select:
 - One Repeat Play—Repeats the track you are playing
 - Repeat Album—(MP3/WMA only) Repeats the currently playing album



- All Repeat Play—Repeats the entire disc
- Intro Play—Plays the first 10 seconds of each track
- · Random Play—Plays all tracks in random order

Playing the radio

To play the radio:

- 1 Press & STANDBY/ON to turn on your shelf system, then press FUNCTION to select TUNER.
- 2 Press /BAND/TIME SET to select FM or AM. The corresponding band appears on the LCD.
- 3 Press ►► /TUNE+ or I<- /TUNE- to select a frequency.
- **4** Press and hold ►►! /TUNE+ or !◄◄ /TUNE- for two seconds to automatically go to the next higher or lower frequency with a strong signal.
- 5 In FM mode, press PLAY MODE to select FM MONO or FM STEREO.
- 6 If you are listening to FM, stretch out the FM antenna on the back of your shelf system and move it around to improve reception.
 -OR-
 - If you are listening to AM, try turning your shelf system for better reception.
- **7** Adjust the volume to a comfortable level.

Storing radio station presets


Your shelf system can store 10 AM and 10 FM station presets.

To store radio station presets:

- 1 Press \circlearrowleft **STANDBY/ON** to turn on your shelf system, then press **FUNCTION** to select **TUNER**.
- 2 Press /BAND/TIME SET to select FM or AM. The corresponding band appears on the LCD.
- 3 Press ►► /TUNE+ or I /TUNE- to select a frequency.
- 4 Press MEMORY/ALBUM to save the station as a preset. PRESET and 01 appears on the LCD.



5 Press ►► / TUNE+ or I◀◀ /TUNE- to select the preset number (1 to 10) that you want to assign to the station preset.



6 Press MEMORY/ALBUM to save the station preset.

Changing a radio station preset frequency

To change a radio station preset:

- 1 Press \circlearrowleft **STANDBY/ON** to turn on your shelf system, then press **FUNCTION** to select **TUNER**.
- 2 Press /BAND/TIME SET to select FM or AM. The corresponding band appears on the LCD.
- 3 Press MEMORY/ALBUM. PRESET blinks on the LCD for five seconds, the preset frequency appears on the LCD, and your shelf system tunes to the station preset.
- 4 Press ►►! /TUNE+ or !◄◄ /TUNE- to tune to another preset while PRESET is blinking.
 - OR-

Press ►II/PRESET repeatedly to select the preset number (1 to 10).

Playing from an external device

To play from an external device:

1 Make sure that an external device is connected to your shelf system. For more information, see "Connecting to an external sound source" on page 17.



2 Turn on your shelf system, then press **FUNCTION** to select **LINE**. Sound from the device plays through your shelf system's speakers.



Selecting the equalizer mode


To select the equalizer mode:

 With your shelf system on, press EQ repeatedly to cycle through the available modes. You can select FLAT, JAZZ, POP, CLASSIC, or ROCK.

Adjusting the bass and treble

To adjust the bass and treble:

1 With your shelf system on, press **BASS/TREB**. The current bass setting appears on the LCD.



2 Press ►►I /TUNE+ or I◄◄ /TUNE- to adjust the bass. You can choose settings from -14 dB to +14 dB.



3 Press **BASS/TREB** again. **TREBLE** and the current treble setting appear on the LCD.



4 Press ►►I /TUNE+ or I◄◀ /TUNE- to adjust the treble. You can choose settings from -14 dB to +14 dB.

Displaying the time during playback

To display the time during playback:

 Press DISPLAY in iPod®, CD, TUNER, or LINE IN mode. The shelf system shows the current time on the LCD until you press DISPLAY again.

Troubleshooting

Problem	Cause/Solution
No power	 Make sure that the AC power adapter is fully inserted into the AC power outlet.
The remote control does not work	 The batteries may be dead. Change the batteries. The remote control is not aimed at the remote control sensor on the shelf system. Aim the remote control directly at the shelf system when you push the buttons.
Cannot connect an iPod [®]	 Make sure that the dock adapter you selected is compatible with your iPod°. Make sure that the dock adapter is correctly mounted on the shelf system.
Cannot play an iPod*	 Make sure that the iPod* is firmly inserted into the iPod* connector on your shelf system. Make sure that the iPod* is working. Test it before trying to connect it to the shelf system. Make sure iPod* mode is selected.



Problem	Cause/Solution
Cannot charge an iPod°	 Make sure that the iPod° is firmly inserted into the iPod° connector on your shelf system. Make sure that the AC adapter is plugged in and firmly connected to the DC IN port on your shelf system.
CD does not play or sound is intermittant	 Make sure that the disc is inserted correctly. Make sure that the disc is not dirty or defective. Make sure the pickup lens is not dirty. If moisture or condensation has accumulated inside your shelf system, let your shelf system warm up for 60 minutes so the liquid evaporates. The disc may not be compatible with your shelf system. Make sure that the CD door is completely closed. If you are using headphones, make sure they are connected securely. Make sure that CD mode is selected.
No sound from the speakers	 Make sure that the volume level is set correctly. Make sure that the sound is not muted. Make sure that the headphones are not connected.
The system does not respond when buttons are pressed	Remove and reconnect the AC power plug and switch on the system again.
Static or noise when playing the radio	 Make sure that the station is tuned correctly and that the station has a good signal. Try another station. If you are playing an AM station, rotate the shelf system to improve the reception. If you are playing an FM station, extend the antenna wire to improve the reception.
No sound from the external audio device	 Make sure that the device is firmly connected to the shelf system. Make sure that the shelf system is set to LINE IN mode. Make sure that the device is not locked by its HOLD button.



Maintaining

Cleaning discs

A dirty disc may not play correctly.

To clean a disc:

 With a soft cloth, wipe the disc in a straight line from the center to the edge.



Caution

Do not use any solvent, such as record spray, thinner, or benzene, to clean a disc.

Cleaning your shelf system

To clean your shelf system, follow these guidelines:

- Use a soft, clean dry cloth to clean the exterior of your shelf system.
- Do not let liquid drip into the inside of your shelf system.
- For stubborn stains, use a soft cloth dampened with a weak solution of mild detergent and water. Dry your shelf system immediately afterwards with a clean cloth. Do not use abrasive clothes, thinners, alcohol, or other chemical solvents, because they may damage the finish or remove the panel lettering.

Cleaning the pickup lens

To clean the pickup lens:

- 1 Open the CD door.
- 2 Use a camera lens brush/blower to blow dirt off the lens, then brush the lens to remove dirt and dust.
