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## Introduction

Congratulations on your purchase of a high-quality Insignia product. Your NS-HD01A represents the state of the art in HD Radio™ design and is designed for reliable and trouble-free performance.

## Important safety instructions

- Read these instructions.

- **5** Do not use this apparatus near water.
- 6 Clean only with dry cloth.

- 7 Do not block any ventilation openings. Install in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions.
- 8 Do not install near any heat sources such as radiators, heat registers, stoves, or other apparatus (including amplifiers) that produce heat.
- 9 Protect the power cord from being walked on or pinched particularly at plugs, convenience receptacles, and the point where they exit from the apparatus.
- **10** Only use attachments/accessories specified by the manufacturer.
- 11 Use only with the cart, stand, tripod, bracket, or table specified by the manufacturer, or sold with the apparatus. When a cart is used, use caution when moving the cart/apparatus combination to avoid injury from tip-over.

## **Additional safety information**

- Observe local laws regarding using earphones while driving a motor vehicle. Some locales allow only one ear to be covered by an earphone. Using the earphones while walking or jogging on a road or on a crosswalk can lead to a serious accident.

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- Do not leave your radio in temperatures above 104°F (40°C), such as in a sauna or a parked car.
- Using earphones or headphones for an extended time may cause serious damage to your hearing. If you are exposed to sound louder than 85dB for extended time, you may adversely affect your hearing. The louder the sound is, the more seriously damaged your hearing may be (an ordinary conversation is between 50dB to 60dB and road noise is approximately 80dB)
- You are strongly advised to set the volume level to medium (the medium level is usually less than 2/3 of the maximum).
- If you hear a ringing in your ear(s), lower the volume or stop using the earphones or headphones.
- Do not place your radio near magnetic objects.





1	<b>A</b>	Press to tune to the next higher frequency. Press and hold to fast-foward through frequencies. For more information, see "Manually tuning to a frequency" on page 17.
2	•	Press to tune to the next lower frequency. Press and hold to fast-reverse through frequencies. For more information, see "Manually tuning to a frequency" on page 17.
3	()	Press for about two seconds to turn your radio on or off. For more information, see "Turning your radio on or off" on page 13
4	KK	Press to automatically search for the next lower radio station. If the search reaches the bottom of the radio band, your radio goes to the top of the radio band and continues searching. For more information, see "Automatically tuning to a station" on page 15.



#	Item	Description
5	PS+	Press and release to go to the next higher preset station number. Press and hold to save the current station to the displayed preset number. If you save a station to a preset number that is already in use, the new station overwrites the old station. For more information, see "Setting a preset station" on page 17.
6	PS-	Press and release to go to the next lower preset station number. Press and hold to save the current station to the displayed preset number. If you save a station to a preset number that is already in use, the new station overwrites the old station. For more information, see "Setting a preset station" on page 17.
7	MENU	Press to access menu options. For more information, see "Using the menu" on page 20.
8	Ж	Press to automatically search for the next higher radio station. If the search reaches the top of the radio band, your radio goes to the bottom of the radio band and continues searching. For more information, see "Automatically tuning to a station" on page 15.
9	Enter	In HD Radio mode, press to switch between the normal display and guide display. For more information, see "Viewing the guide in HD Radio mode" on page 19.  In menu mode, press to confirm selections.



#	Item	Description
1	Earphone jack	Plug the included earphones into this jack.


#	Item	Description
1	CHARGE	Connect the included USB cable into this port and into a USB port on a computer to charge the built-in battery or to power your radio. For more information, see "Charging the battery" on page 10.



#	Item	Description
2	HOLD	Push this control in the direction of the arrow to lock the buttons to prevent accidental button presses. Push in the opposite direction to unlock the buttons. For more information, see "Locking the buttons" on page 19.
3	VOLUME+/-	Turn up to increase the volume or down to decrease the volume. For more information, see "Adjusting the volume" on page 14.
4	RESET	If your radio stops responding to button presses, press to reset your radio.

## **Using your radio**

## **Checking the battery level**

If the battery indicator on the LCD looks like this: <a> Image: Image the battery level</a> is low. Charge the battery by following the instructions below.

## Charging the battery

Your radio has a built-in battery that you charge from a USB port on a computer.

### To charge the battery:

- 1 Connect the included USB cable to a USB port on a computer, then connect the other end of the cable to the CHARGE port on your radio.
- 2 Turn on the computer.
  While the battery is charging, the following screen appears on your radio:





When charging is complete, the following screen appears:



The display automatically turns off after five minutes. You can disconnect your radio from the computer.

#### Note

If you press a button while the battery is charging, the normal display appears. If no button is pressed for 30 seconds (unless you change the LCD Off Time in the menu), the battery screen reappears.

## Using the belt clip

### To use the belt clip:

 Either place the radio into the belt clip and attach to your belt, or attach the belt clip to your belt, then place the radio into the belt clip.



## **Understanding radio modes**

Your radio has three radio modes: Analog (FM), "HD Radio", and RBDS (Radio Broadcast Data System).

### Analog (FM) mode

The Analog (FM) mode is the standard mode that has been in use for many years. The FM radio signal is an analog signal. When receiving an FM signal, the "FM" icon appears on the display.



### HD Radio mode

HD Radio mode is the new digital mode for FM. Many HD Radio stations have several sub-channels called "multicast channels." When receiving an HD Radio signal, the "HD" icon and the channel number appear on the display.





### **RBDS** mode

RBDS (Radio Broadcast Data System) mode provides additional functionality to FM radio reception by transmitting encoded analog information with the FM radio signal. This signal is decoded by an RBDS receiver and can provide a range of informational features including the station's name. The RBDS text is usually centered. When the text fills the display, it begins scrolling. When receiving an RBDS signal, the "RBDS" icon appears on the display.



## **Turning your radio on or off**

### To turn your radio on or off:

• Press () for two seconds. Your radio turns on and the following message appears on the display:





### Then one of the following screens appears:







Analog (FM) mode

To turn off your radio, press  $\bigcirc$  for about two seconds. The following message appears on the display:



## Adjusting the volume

#### Caution

Listening to your radio with the volume set too loud or using earphones for extended periods of time can damage your hearing. You should set the volume level to medium (the medium level is usually less than 2/3 of the maximum).



### To adjust the volume:

 Turn the VOLUME+/- control to increase the volume or down to decrease the volume. The volume indicator on the display shows the new volume level.







Automatically tuning to a station

## To automatically tune to a station in analog (FM) mode:

- Press >> to automatically tune to the next higher radio station. If the search reaches the top of the radio band, your radio goes to the bottom of the band and continues searching.
- Press 
   to automatically tune to the next lower radio station. If the search reaches the bottom of the radio band, your radio goes to the top of the band and continues searching.

## To automatically tune to a station in HD Radio mode:

 Press M to automatically tune to the next higher HD Radio station.



In ALL SEEK or HD SEEK mode, each time you press y, your radio goes to the next lower sub-channel of the current station. When your radio reaches the lowest sub-channel, it goes to the next lower station (analog or HD Radio).



The + after *HD1* indicates at least one higher sub-channel.



The absence of a + after HD3 indicates that 3 is the highest sub-channel.



The next higher or lower station may be a standard analog (FM) station.

In HD SEEK mode, each time you press , your radio goes to the next higher sub-channel. When your radio reaches the highest sub-channel, it goes to the first sub-channel of the next higher HD Radio station.

 Press K to automatically tune to the next lower HD Radio station.

## To automatically tune to a radio station in RBDS mode:

- - In HD SEEK mode, press >> to automatically tune to the next higher HD Radio station.
- Press 
   to automatically tune to the next lower radio station. If the search reaches the bottom of the radio band, your radio goes to the top of the band and continues searching.



## Manually tuning to a frequency

When you manually tune, your radio goes to the next or previous frequency regardless of whether a station is broadcasting on the frequency.

## To manually tune to a frequency in analog (FM) mode or RBDS mode:

- Press 

  for less than one second. Your radio goes to the next higher frequency. Each press of the button changes the frequency by 0.2 MHz.
- Press ▼ for less than one second. Your radio goes to the next lower frequency. Each press of the button changes the frequency by 0.2 MHz.
- Press and hold ▲ or ▼ to fast-forward or fast-reverse through frequencies.

## To manually tune to a frequency in HD Radio mode:

- Press 
   A for less than one second. Your radio goes
  to the next higher sub-channel for the current
  station. When your radio reaches the highest
  sub-channel, it goes to the the next higher
  frequency.
- Press ▼ for less than one second. Your radio goes to the lower sub-channel for the current station. When your radio reaches the lowest sub-channel, it goes to the the next lower frequency.
- Press and hold ▲ or ▼ to fast-forward or fast-reverse through sub-channels and frequencies.

## Setting a preset station

### To set a preset station:

1 Tune to the station you want to make a preset.

2 Press and hold **PS+** or **PS-**. The preset number blinks.



3 Press PS+ or PS- to increase or decrease the preset number.

When you find the preset number you want to use, press and hold PS+ or PS-. Preset Saved appears on the display and the station information is stored with the preset number.

5 To tune to a preset station, press PS+ or PS-.



## Locking the buttons

You can lock the buttons on your radio to prevent accidental button presses.

### To lock the buttons:

 Push HOLD in the direction of the arrow to lock the buttons to prevent accidental button presses. When the buttons are locked, a lock icon appears on the display.



 Push HOLD in the opposite direction to unlock the buttons. The lock icon disappears from the display.

## Viewing the guide in HD Radio mode

### To view the guide in HD Radio mode:

**1** When tuned to an HD Radio station, press **Enter**. The guide opens.



**2** Press **Enter** again to close the guide and return to the normal display.

## Using the menu

Your radio has a menu that lets you adjust radio options.

### To use the menu:

1 Press **MENU**. The menu opens.



- 2 Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight an option, then press Enter. You can select:
  - LCD Off Time—Lets you set the LCD off time.
    - Seek Mode—Lets you select the seek mode.
    - Version—Lets you view the MAIN and MODULE (DSP) software version numbers.
    - Factory Defaults—Lets you reset all settings to the factory defaults.
- **3** Press **≫** or **⋘** to adjust the option, then press **Enter**.
- **4** Press **MENU** to close the menu.



## Selecting the LCD time off mode

### To select the LCD time off mode:

1 Press **MENU** to open the menu.



2 Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight LCD Off Time, then press Enter.



- 4 Press **MENU** to close the menu.

#### Note

We do not recommended setting the LCD to **ON** because battery life is shortened.

## Setting the seek mode

#### To set the seek mode:

- 1 Press **MENU** to open the menu.
- 2 Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight Seek Mode, then press Enter.



- 3 Press >> or K
  to highlight ALL or HD, then press Enter. If you select ALL, your radio searches through all stations when you tune to frequencies or stations. If you select HD, your radio only searches through HD Radio stations when you tune to frequencies or stations.
- 4 Press MENU to close the menu.

## Viewing software version numbers

#### To view the software version numbers:

- 1 Press **MENU** to open the menu.
- **2** Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight **Version**, then press **Enter**.



**3** Press **MENU** to close the menu.



## Resetting options to factory defaults

### To reset options to factory defaults:

- 1 Press MENU to open the menu.
- 2 Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight Factory Default, then press Enter.



- 3 Press M or K to select YES or NO, then press Enter.
- 4 Press **MENU** to close the menu.

## **Troubleshooting**

Do not try to repair your radio yourself. Refer all servicing to qualified repair personnel.

Symptoms	Possible causes and solutions
The radio does not turn on	Battery is dead. Recharge the battery. For more information, see "Charging the battery" on page 10.
	There is moisture or condensation in your radio. Let your radio warm up to room temperature for 60 minutes, then try again.
Poor radio reception	The earphones work as an antenna and are not connected completely.  Make sure that the earphones are connected correctly, or pull out the earphones, then plug them into the jack again.



Symptoms	Possible causes and solutions
Intermittent sound	The earphones are not connected completely. Make sure that the earphones are plugged in completely and securely.
No sound	The earphones are not connected. Make sure that the earphones are plugged in completely and securely.
	The volume control may be turned down. Increase the volume.
Battery will not charge	The USB cable is not connected to your radio or a computer. Make sure that the USB cable is connected to your radio and a USB port on a computer.
	The USB port on the computer may not be working. Try a different USB port.
	The computer connected to your radio is not turned on. Turn on the computer.
Your radio stops working	Turn the power off and back on again, then start over. If powering off and back on again fails, press the reset button (you may need to insert the end of a bent paper clip into the reset hole on the side of your radio to do this).
The HD Radio™ sound keeps switching between Digital and Analog audio. HD Radio™ indicator keeps turning on and off.	You may be out of range of the HD Radio stations in your area.

### How long does the coverage last?

The Warranty Period lasts for 90 days from the date you purchased the Product. The purchase date is printed on the receipt you received with the Product.

### What does this warranty cover?
