




## Installation

### Step. 1

Before you begin, please turn off the computers you are going to connect to the MiniView™ Micro USB KVM.


If you have never installed a USB mouse and Keyboard on your computer before you may need to leave your PS/2 mouse and keyboard attached during the first boot-up after installing the GCS52U. After you have installed the KVM shutdown your computer and move the PS/2 mouse and keyboard to the GCS52U console port. You have now installed the unit.

- Connect your monitor VGA cable to the female VGA port (item# 1) on your MiniView<sup>™</sup> Micro.
- Connect your PS/2 keyboard directly into the PS/2 keyboard port (item# 2) on your MiniView<sup>™</sup> Micro.
- Connect your PS/2 mouse directly into the PS/2 mouse port (item# 3) on your MiniView<sup>™</sup> Micro.



### Step. 2

- 4.Connect the VGA cable (item# 4) that is built into the KVM cable of your MiniView<sup>™</sup> Micro to the VGA port on your computer.
- 5.Connect the USB cable (item# 5) that is built into the KVM cable of your MiniView<sup>™</sup> Micro to the USB port on your computer.

### Step. 3

Repeat Step 2 for your second computer.

### Step. 4

Turn the power of your computers on.

To switch between computers, tap the Scroll Lock key twice.

## Operation

### Operations

MiniView<sup>™</sup> Micro allows you to access the computers through Hot Key combinations from the keyboard.

#### 1. Selecting computers

You can toggle between the two computers by pressing and releasing the Scroll Lock key twice: [Scroll Lock]+[Scroll Lock].

#### 2. AutoScan Mode

The MiniView<sup>™</sup> Micro USB KVM offers AutoScan feature and allows you to monitor the activity of the connected computers without taking the trouble of switching yourself.

## Operation

### Operations con'd

To initiate the AutoScan mode, press and release the left Shift key, then press and release the right Shift key: [Left Shift] + [Right Shift].

NOTE: The interval between these two keys should be no more than 0.5 seconds.

Once the scanning begins, it continues until you press the [Space Bar] to exit AutoScan Mode. The port that was active at the time the scanning stopped would remain active.

Note: While AutoScan Mode is in effect, none of the keyboard keys except [Space Bar] will function. You must exit AutoScan Mode by pressing the [Space Bar] in order to use the keyboard for other purposes.

## Operation

### Operations con'd

You can customize the scan interval time with the following Hot Key combination: [Left Shift] + [Right Shift] + [S] + [n].

[*n*] represents a number from 1 to 4 which sets the desired scan interval as shown in the table below:

n	Scan Interval
1	3 seconds
2	5 seconds
3	10 seconds
4	20 seconds

## Troubleshooting

Symptom	Possible Cause	Action
Keyboard Not Responding*	Loose cables	Check all keyboard cable connections to make sure they are completely seated in the sockets
	Keyboard needs to be reset.	Unplug the keyboard from the Console Keyboard Port, then plug it back in.
	MiniView™ Micro needs to be reset	Turn off computers. Unplug the cables from the unit. Wait five seconds; then plug the cables back in and turn the computers on.
	MiniView™ Micro is in AutoScan mode	Press the Spacebar to exit AutoScan mode.
Pressing Hot Keys gets no response	Selected port connects to a powered-off computer	Resend the Hot Key command selecting a port that has a powered-on computer attached
	Hot Key sequence input incorrectly	Resend the Hot Key command - press and release each key in the sequence individually
	MiniView™ Micro is in AutoScan mode	Press the Spacebar to exit AutoScan mode.

## **Troubleshooting Con'd**

Symptom	Possible Cause	Action
Mouse not detected, or does not respond correctly	Loose Cables	Check all mouse cable connections to make sure they are completely seated in the sockets.
	Mouse needs to be reset	Unplug the mouse from the Console Keyboard Port, then plug it back in.
	MiniView™ Micro needs to be reset	Turn off computers. Unplug the cables from the unit. Wait five seconds; then plug the cables back in and turn the computers on.
	Incorrect Mouse Driver	Check your Device Manager to be sure that the correct driver for your mouse (obtained from the manufacturer, or supplied by the operating system) has been installed.
Video Problems	Resolution and/or bandwidth set too high	Select a lower resolution and/or bandwidth.
