

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

# Playing a Disc



### Using Rechargeable Batteries

- Lift the cover of player and remove the covers of batteries compartment.
- Insert two rechargeable batteries (stick type) by matching the + and polarity (see diagram below) in the battery compartments and close the covers.



### Using External battery pack



The external battery pack can be attached as shown in the figure. Two AA size alkaline batteries are used in the external battery pack.

#### CAUTION! -


- Do not mix rechargeable batteries with non-rechargeable batteries in the batteries compartments.
- Do not use different types of rechargeable batteries together other than what comes with the console.
- When the batteries will not be used for a long time, remove them.
- If battery leakage occurs, wipe off any deposit in the battery compartment and install new batteries.
- Do not charge non-rechargeble batteries.

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

## **Operating the FM Tuner**







- Selecting Frequency(FM 87.5MHz ~ 108MHz)
  - 1) To change frequency, press and release the Navi/Menu jog switch | or | >>|. (ex:87.5 87.6)



- 2) Auto Scan function: To select memorized channel, push the Navi/Menu jog switch and find the memorized channel by scrolling | ✓ or ► ► |. (ex:89.1 – 91.9)
- 3) PRESET Mode: To select memorized channel, push the Navi/Menu jog switch and find the memorized channel by scrolling |◄◄ or ▶▶|. (Method to save channels: Refer to page 11)

#### BEEP VOLUME

: Configure beep sound (ON/ 0 for OFF) with volume level.



#### RESUME

: When activated, player returns to the same settings after STOP or Power OFF.



#### SOUND FADE IN

: When activated, volume increases gradually at playback mode to prevent sudden loudness.



#### LANGUAGE(Supports 37 languages)

: When activated, displays proper fonts for tracks and ID3 tag information.



#### CD ANTI-SHOCK

: Pre-buffering technology applied to minimize the skipping from external shock. Playing Audio CD: Select 180 seconds to maximize skip protection, select 45 seconds to maximize battery life.

Playing Compressed Digital Audio: Always activate in 480 seconds.



#### BACK-LIGHT(SEC)

BUTTON: Backlight is on.

ADAPTER: If the adapter is connected, backlight is always on and if the adapter is disconnected, backlight is on whenever you press the button.



0 : Backlight is off. 21 : Backlight is always on. Select BUTTON or ADAPTER by using ▶II button and adjust the lighting time by using I◄◀ or ▶▶I button.

#### LCD CONTRAST

: Adjust LCD contrast of remote control.



TAG INFORMATION

#### TAG INFORMATION

ON: Displays track with ID3 tag information or with lyrics if there are lyrics.

OFF: Displays track with file name.

When you set off the tag information, the track is played and the next track can be displayed with ID3 tag information.



DISPLAY

CAPTION OFF: You can turn off lyric display of synchronized MP3.

After clicking ENTER button, the displayed tag information preference can be by using I◄◄ or ▶►I button.

#### TIME

Normal: Display elapsed time. Remain: Display remaining time.

**Note**: If the track format is VBR (Variable Bit Rate), the remaining time may not be accurate.



#### BATTERY INDICATOR

Adjust level of battery indicator.

If select lower number, the level of battery indicator is higher. And if select higher number, the level of battery indicator is lower.



### ■ TIMER(Set Auto Power Off)

#### SLEEP POWER OFF

: Automatically power off after fixed time (Time range can be set from 0 to 99 minutes).

By using ►II button, You can select beep sound to ON or OFF.




Use I or ▶▶I button to adjust time.

#### STOP POWER OFF

: Automatically power off at stop mode. (1~60 minutes)


#### INTRO MODE

Intro: Play beginning 10 seconds of each track. Intro Highlight: Plays 10 seconds from the spot 1 minute was played for each track in sequential order. For example, song A plays 10 seconds from 1 minute into the song, so the highlight ends at 1 minute 10 seconds. Then song B plays 10 seconds from 1 minute into the song, so the highlight ends at 1 minute 10 seconds, and so forth with each track.



#### STUDY MODE

: 5 SEC/10 SEC : When you press STOP, it goes back 5 or 10 seconds. It will work as Interval repeat when you slide 10 10/+10.



#### STUDY MODE

BEEP: This mode has been devised for the visually impaired.

It allows the user to know each button's movement using a beep sound. When 5 SEC MODE is set it will forward to the next 5 seconds within the song with a short slide of the -10/+10 lever toward +10. 10 SEC MODE performs the same function, and forwards to the next 10 seconds in the song.



#### BOOKMARK

This is the function for fast search by using BOOKMARK.

Bookmark function is activated under the Study mode. Long slide of -10/+10 lever to -10 will add/delete/move the bookmark.

Bookmark Add: Long slide -10/+10 lever to -10 and click PROG/EQ button to add the present location into the bookmark.

Bookmark Delete: Long slide -10/+10 lever to -10 and click MODE/CD/FM button to delete the present location from bookmark. Whenever you press Mode/CD/FM button, the bookmark will be deleted in backward sequence.

Moving to next bookmark: Long slide -10/+10 lever to -10 and press ▶▶I jog lever to move to the next bookmark.

Moving to previous bookmark : Long slide -10/+10 lever to -10 and press | ◀ jog lever to move to the previous bookmark.

Bookmarks can be reserved up to 20 on a disc.





#### BASS BOOST

: Bass Boost switch is from 0 to 12dB. 12dB equals maximum bass boost.



#### BASS CORNER FREQUENCY


: Bass Boost frequencies are 50HZ, 100Hz and 200Hz.

Bass boost function is effective under the frequency range configured. Maximized at 200Hz.



#### TREBLE BOOST

: Treble boost level is from o to 12dB.



#### **■ TREBLE CORNER FREQUENCY**

: Treble boost frequencies are 2 kHz, 4kHz and 7 kHz.

Treble boost function is effective over the frequency range configured. Maximized at 2kHz.



## Using AC POWER ADAPTER

- Use only the AC Power Adapter supplied with the player.
- Connect the adapter to the 4.5V DC jack on the player and into an AC outlet.



# ■ Power Supply(Rechargeable Batteries)mX™

### Recharging Method

- Rechargeable function can be activated while the rechargeable batteries are in the player and the AC adapter is connected to the player.
- Power Off activates rechargeable function displaying Charge mode on LCD when plugged into AC adapter.
- While in Charge Mode, long press of stop button turns the POWER OFF.
- 1) Install rechargeable batteries.
- 2) Connect the AC adapter to the player
- 3) Press Play to power on the player.
- 4) Press and hold Stop to display the Charge menu on the LCD. (During CD or FM playback, pressing and holding the Stop button shifts the player to Charge mode).




LCD - Menu movement is made by toggling the I◀ , ▶►I button and short clicking the Stop button. Batteries automatically begin charging after 1 minute without a menu selection when the AC adapter is connected.



The player automatically powers off when done charging. (While in Charge mode, a long press of the Stop button turns the power OFF).

# **Trouble Shooting**

Should any problem persist after you have checked these symptoms, consult your iRiver dealer.

No Power On	<ul> <li>Connect adapter to test the battery life.</li> <li>Check whether the HOLD switch on player or remote is ON (Switch to OFF position)</li> <li>Check whether the player lid is opened.</li> <li>Check whether the rechargeable batteries are not charged.</li> </ul>
"No DISC" displayed on LCD	<ul> <li>Check whether CD is inserted label side up.</li> <li>Check whether the CD is dirty or defective (clean it or change to new CD).</li> <li>Check whether defects are attached in optical lens (remove the dirt with soft cloth).</li> <li>Check whether moisture condensation has occurred (leave the CD player aside for several hours until the moisture evaporates).</li> <li>Message may occur due to the characteristic deviation between CD-RW recorder and CD-R/RW disc (burn the disc at low speed).</li> <li>Use packet write disc with full formatting enabled.</li> </ul>
No Sound or noise is heard	<ul> <li>Check whether VOLUME is set to "0". Connect the earphones/remote plug firmly.</li> <li>Check whether plug is dirty. Clean the plug with a dry and soft cloth.</li> <li>Corrupted MP3, WMA file may have a static noise or sound cut off.</li> <li>Continuous and excessive impact may keep the MP3, WMA and audio CD from properly playing.</li> </ul>

# Trouble Shooting

AC adapter does not work.	<ul> <li>Check whether the plug is connected to the proper jack on the player.</li> </ul>
Remote control does not work.	<ul> <li>Check whether the HOLD switch is ON(Switch to OFF position.)</li> <li>Connect the earphones/remote plug firmly.</li> </ul>
Battery lifetime differs	<ul> <li>Check whether the player is using appropriate rechargeable batteries.</li> <li>Ensure the rechargeable batteries are fully charged.</li> </ul>
Characters in LCD are corrupted.	Check out Menu → Display → Language and confirm whether the right language has been selected.
Poor FM Reception	<ul> <li>Adjust the position of the player and remote control.</li> <li>Avoid use near other electronic devices as it may cause interference.</li> <li>Use of remote control will improve reception as it functions as an antenna.</li> </ul>
Recharging does not work.	<ul> <li>Check whether the adapter plug is properly connected.</li> <li>Review steps on page 34.</li> </ul>

#### Disc



On Handling Disc Avoid touching the surface(bright side) where data is stored.



**Disc Cleaning** Avoid cleaning the disc surface. If necessary, clean with a soft cloth in directions described.



Do not stick papers or tape labels onto the surface(bright side).



Avoid using chemicals to clean the surface.

## On Safety

- Should any solid objects or liquid fall into the console, unplug it and have it checked by qualified personnel before operating it any further. Do not put objects in the DC IN 4.5V jack(External Power output).
- Use only the adapter provided with the player.



- Keep the lens on the SlimX clean and do not touch it. If you do so, the lens may be damaged and the SlimX will not operate properly.
- Do not put any heavy object on top of the SlimX. The SlimX and the CD may be damaged.
- Do not leave the SlimX in a location near heat sources, or in a place subject to direct sunlight, excessive dust or sand, moisture, rain, mechanical shock, unleveled surface, or in a car with its windows closed.
- If the SlimX causes interference to the radio or television reception, turn off the SlimX or move it away from the radio or television.

### On Headphones and Earphones

Road Safety

Do not use headphones/earphones while driving, cycling, or operating any motorized vehicle. It may create a traffic hazard and is illegal in some areas. It can also be potentially dangerous to play your headsets at high volume while walking, especially at pedestrian crossings. You should exercise extreme caution or discontinue use in potentially hazardous situations.

- Preventing hearing damage Avoid using headphones/earphones at high volume. Hearing experts advise against continuously loud and extended play. If you experience a ringing in your ears, reduce volume or discontinue use.
- Consideration for others Keep the volume at a moderate level. This will allow you to hear outside sound and to be considerate to the people around you.

- During playback, CDs damaged with dirt or a scratch may make a pop sound, clipping sound, or cut off.
- Tracks with damaged or corrupted parts are skipped or forwarded to next track.
- Supported file types will have the extension MP3, WMA or ASF.
- Directories and files are sorted in alphabetical order.
   Use the Navigation mode to select the tracks wanted.
- A total of 255 directories and 999 tracks within a disc can be recognized.
- Track information is displayed by filename or ID3 Tag information.


