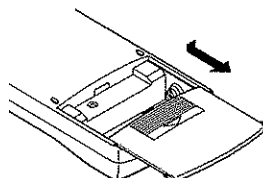

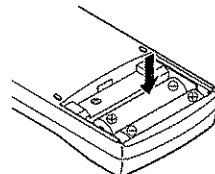
Operation of remote control unit

Loading batteries

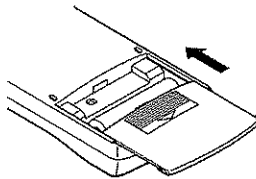
1 Remove the cover.



2 Insert batteries.



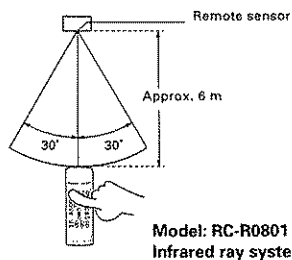
3 Close the cover.



- Insert two AA-size (R6 / SUM-3) batteries as indicated by the polarity marking.

Operation procedure

Plug the power cord of the system into an AC wall outlet, and press the **POWER** key on the remote control unit to turn the power on. When the power is turned on, press the key of the source component to be operated.



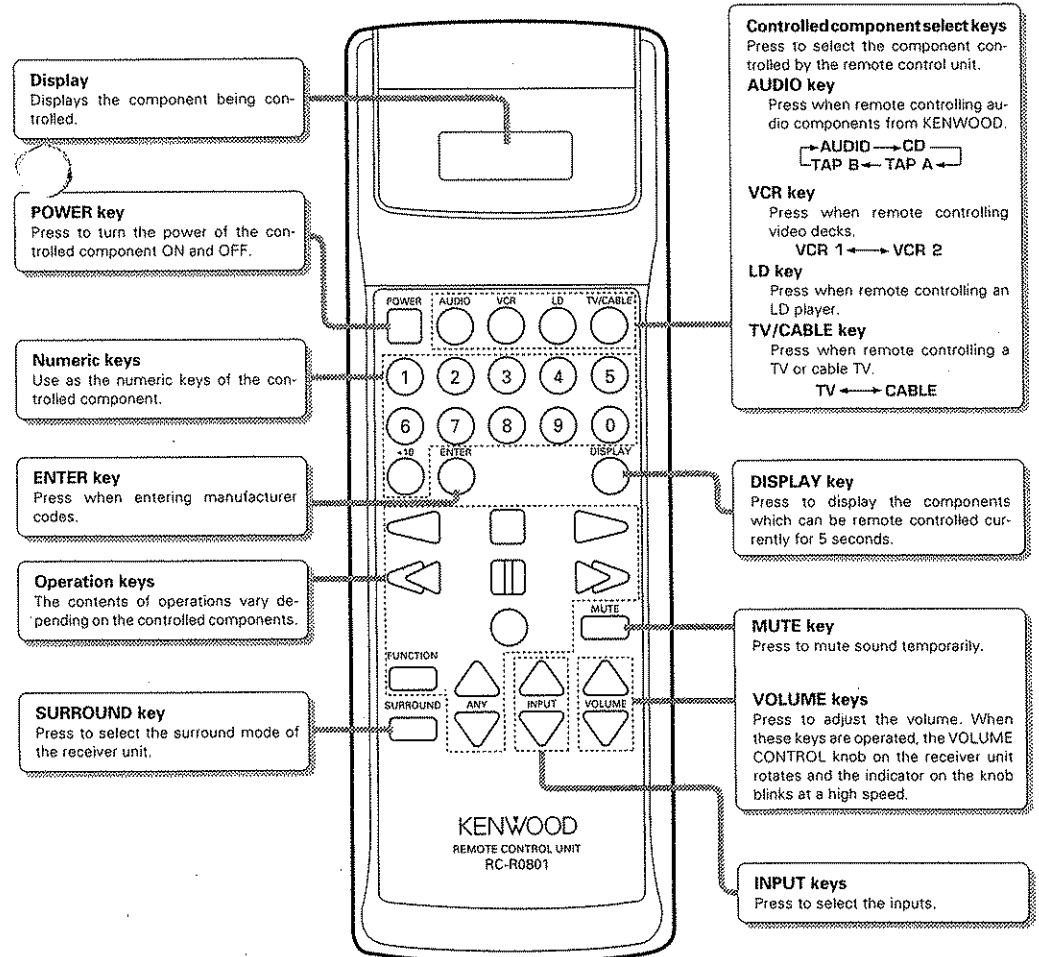
- When two operation keys on the remote control unit are pressed successively, press each key securely reserving an interval of more than 1 second for each press.
- Components connected via the system control cords, such as the CD player, can also be remote-controlled. In this case, please read the instruction manual supplied with your CD player.
- When the batteries are exhausted and replacement becomes necessary, replace them with alkaline batteries (LR6).

Notes

1. The supplied batteries are intended for use in operation checks. Therefore, their lives may be shorter than ordinary batteries.
2. When the remote-controllable distance gets shorter than before, replace both batteries with new ones.
3. Malfunction may occur if direct sunlight or the light of a high-frequency lighting fluorescent lamp enters the remote control light sensor. In such a case, change the system installation position to prevent the malfunction.

Keys and controls

This unit can remote control KENWOOD CD player and cassette deck which are connected through system control cords. In addition, it can also control video components from other manufacturers than KENWOOD by recalling the manufacturer codes preset with it. For the method of recalling maker codes and the operating procedure, refer to page 6.

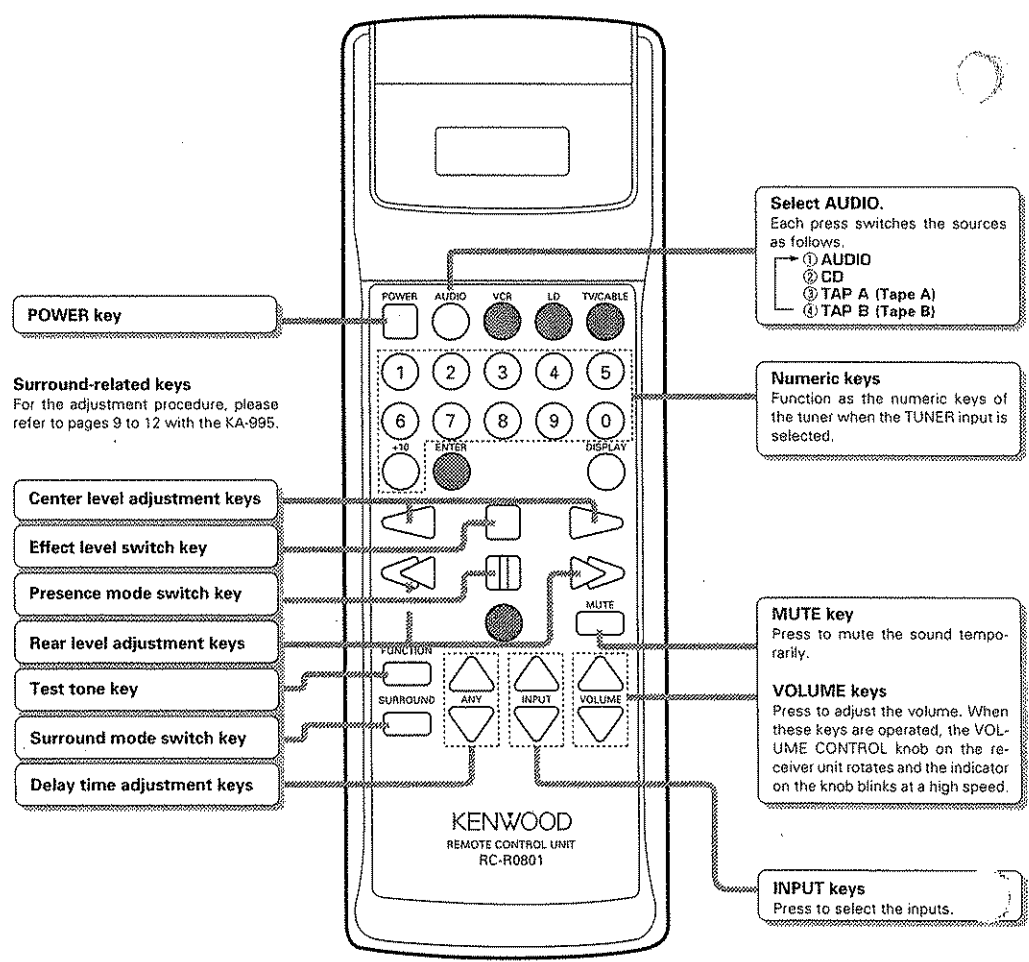
4 Operating the KA-995

This unit can remote control KENWOOD CD player and cassette deck which are connected through system control cords. In addition, it can also control video components from other manufacturers than KENWOOD by recalling the manufacturer codes preset with it. For the method of recalling maker codes and the operating procedure, refer to page 6.

Operating the KA-995

- ① Press the **AUDIO** key to display "AUDIO".
- ② Press the **POWER** key to turn the power of the main unit (KA-995) ON.
- ③ Press operation keys.

* The keys covered with  are not used in the operation of the receiver.



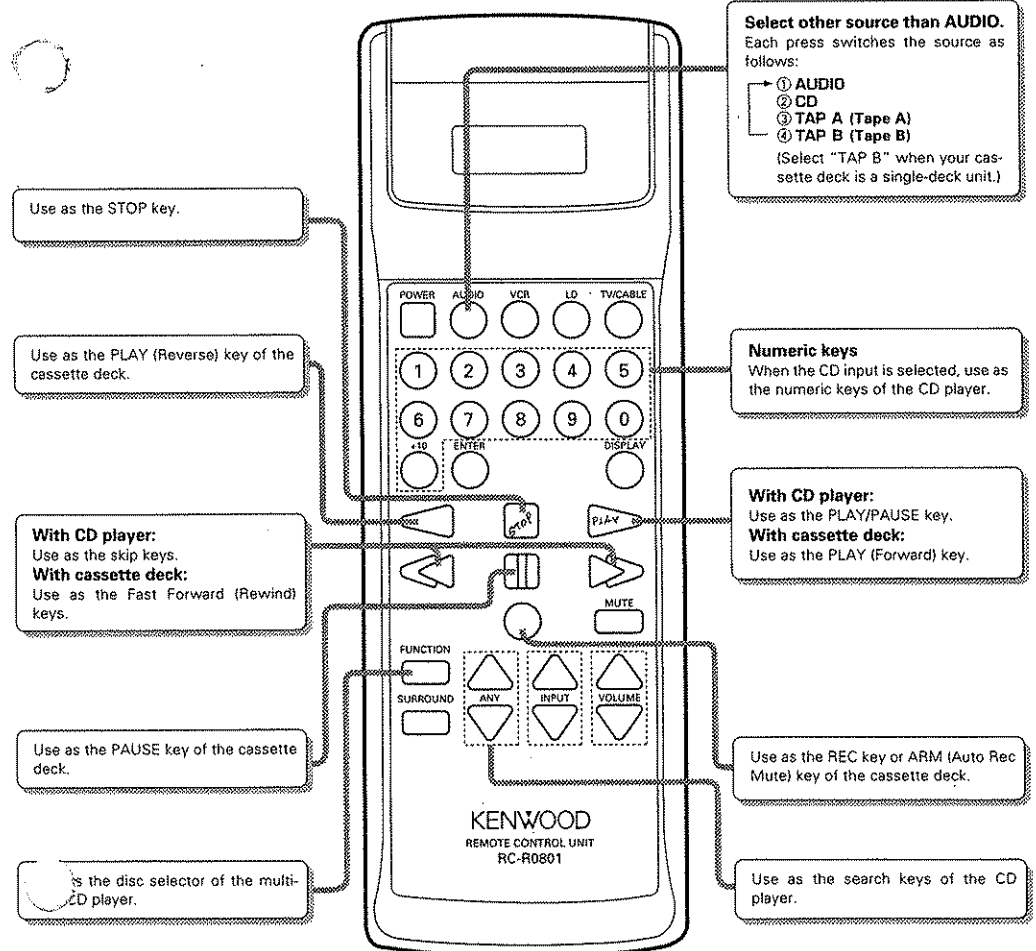

Operating the CD player or cassette deck

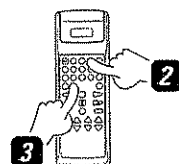
This unit can remote control KENWOOD CD player and cassette deck which are connected through system control cords.

To control KENWOOD CD player or cassette deck:

- ① Press the AUDIO key to select "CD" "TAP A" or "TAP B".
- ② Press the operation keys.



Preset operation

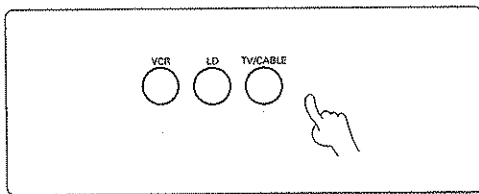


1 Find the set-up code of the component to be registered.

Refer to the set-up code list on pages 10 and after to find the set-up code of the component to be registered.

Example: To register a VCR from KENWOOD, 056, 061 or 082

2 Set the display for the component to be registered.

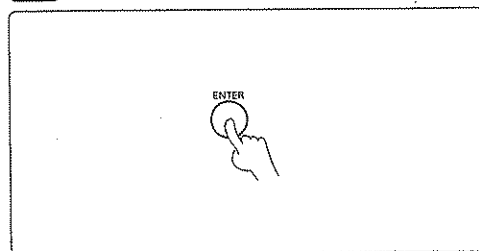


Each press of each key switches the display as follows:

	Displayed characters
VCR	VCR 1 ↔ VCR 2
LD	LD
TV/CABLE	TV ↔ CABLE

Example: Press the VCR key to select "VCR1" or "VCR2".

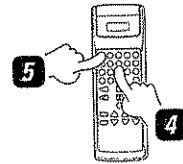
3 Press the ENTER key.



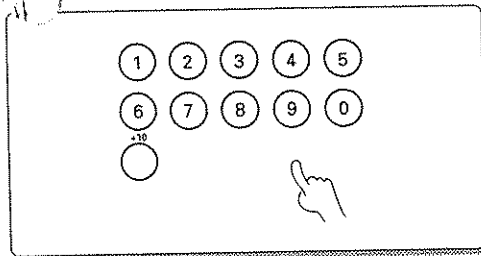
The display shows "SET".



Go to step 4 within 5 sec.



Enter the set-up code.



Enter with numeric keys.

Example: 0 5 6

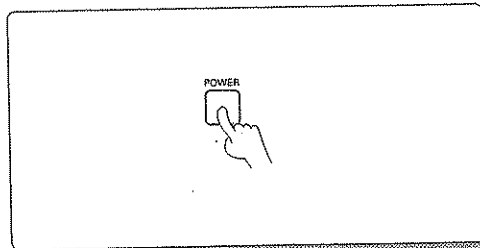
The displayed number disappears in about 1 second, at which time the code is set.

If you commit a mistake, wait until the displayed number disappears and restart from step 2.

If "SET" is displayed, a wrong code has been entered. Enter the correct code.

Point to the preset component and press the POWER key.

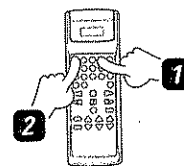


The operation is complete if the power of the preset component is turned ON. If the component does not work, return to step 1 and preset another preset code.

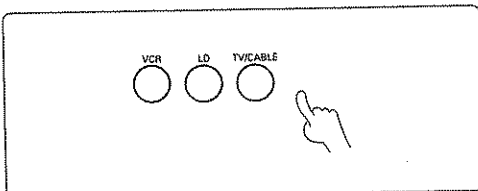
Note

The set-up codes are designed to be compatible with several models, but there may be some incompatible models. (With some models, only some of the functions can be operated.)

Operating the preset component



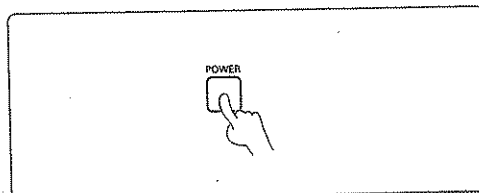
1 Set the display for the component to be registered.



Each press of each key switches the display as follows:

	Displayed characters
VCR	VCR 1 ↔ VCR 2
LD	LD
TV/CABLE	TV ↔ CABLE

2 Point to the preset component and press the POWER key.



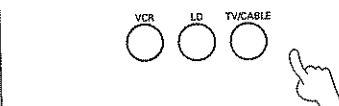
3 Operate the keys.

Operate referring to the remote control key correspondence table on page 9.

To turn the power OFF

① Set the display for the component to be turned OFF.

② Press the POWER key.
