



IMPORTANT SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

Before using the unit, be sure to read all operating instructions carefully. Please note that these are general precautions and may not pertain to your unit. For example, this unit may not have the capability to be connected to an outdoor antenna.

1. READ INSTRUCTIONS

All the safety and operating instructions should be read before the product is operated.

2. RETAIN INSTRUCTIONS

The safety and operating instructions should be retained for future reference.

3. HEED WARNINGS

All warnings on the product and in the operating instructions should be adhered to.

4. FOLLOW INSTRUCTIONS

All operating and use instructions should be followed.

5. CLEANING

Unplug this product from the wall outlet before cleaning. Do not use liquid cleaners or aerosol cleaners. Use a damp cloth for cleaning.

6. ATTACHMENTS

Do not use attachments not recommended by the product's manufacturer as they may cause hazards.

7. WATER AND MOISTURE

Do not use this product near water- for example, near a bathtub, washbowl, kitchen sink, or laundry tub, in a wet basement, or near a swimming pool.

8. ACCESSORIES

Do not place this product on an unstable cart, stand, tripod, bracket, or table. The product may fall, causing serious injury and serious damage to the product. Use only with a cart, stand, tripod, bracket, or table recommended by the manufacturer or sold with the product. Any mounting of the product should follow the manufacturer's instructions, and should use a mounting accessory recommended by the manufacturer.

8A. An appliance and cart combination should be moved with care. Quick stops, excessive force, and uneven surfaces may cause the appliance and cart combination to overturn.

9. VENTILATION

Slots and openings in the cabinet and in the back or bottom are provided for ventilation and to ensure reliable operation of the product and to protect it from overheating. These openings must not be blocked or covered. The openings should never be blocked by placing the product on a bed, sofa, rug, or other similar surface. This product should never be placed near or over a radiator or heat source. This product should not be placed in a built-in installation such as a bookcase or rack unless proper ventilation is provided or the manufacturer's instructions have been adhered to.

10. POWER SOURCES

This product should be operated only from the type of power source indicated on the marking label. If you are not sure of the type of power supply to your home, consult your appliance dealer or local power company. For products intended to operate from battery power, or other sources, refer to the operating instructions.

11. GROUNDING OR POLARIZATION

This product is equipped with a polarized alternating-current line plug (a plug having one blade wider than the other). This plug will fit into the power outlet only one way. This is a safety feature. If you are unable to insert the plug fully into the outlet, try reversing the plug. If the plug should still fail to fit, contact your electrician to replace your obsolete outlet. Do not defeat the safety purpose of the polarized plug.

12. POWER-CORD PROTECTION

Power-supply cords should be routed so that they are not likely to be walked on or pinched by items placed upon or against them, paying particular attention to cords at plugs, convenience receptacles, and the point where they exit from the appliance.



IMPORTANT SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS (CONTINUED)

13. LIGHTNING

To protect your product from a lightning storm, or when it is left unattended and unused for long periods of time, unplug it from the wall outlet and disconnect the antenna or cable system. This will prevent damage to the product due to lightning and power-line surges.

14. POWER LINES

An outside antenna system should not be located in the vicinity of overhead power lines or other electric light or power circuits, or where it can fall into such power lines or circuits. When installing an outside antenna system, extreme care should be taken to keep from touching such power lines or circuits as contact with them might be fatal.

15. OVERLOADING

Do not overload wall outlets and extension cords as this can result in a risk of fire or electric shock.

16. OBJECT AND LIQUID ENTRY

Never push objects of any kind into this product through openings as they may touch dangerous voltage points or short out parts that could result in fire or electric shock. Never spill or spray any type of liquid on the product.

17. OUTDOOR ANTENNA GROUNDING

If an outside antenna is connected to the product, be sure the antenna system is grounded so as to provide some protection against voltage surges and built-up static charges. Section 810 of the National Electric Code, ANSI/NFPA 70, provides information with respect to proper grounding of the mast and supporting structure, grounding of the lead-in wire to an antenna discharge product, size of grounding conductors, location of antenna discharge product, connection to grounding electrodes, and requirements for grounding electrode.

18. SERVICING

Do not attempt to service this product yourself as opening or removing covers may expose you to dangerous voltage or other hazards. Refer all servicing to qualified service personnel.

19. REPLACEMENT PARTS

When replacement parts are required, be sure the service technician uses replacement parts specified by the manufacturer or those that have the same characteristics as the original part. Unauthorized substitutions may result in fire, electric shock or other hazards.

20. SAFETY CHECK

Upon completion of any service or repairs to this product, ask the service technician to perform safety checks to determine that the product is in proper operating condition.

21. WALL OR CEILING MOUNTING

The product should be mounted to a wall or ceiling only as recommended by the manufacturer.

22. DAMAGE REQUIRING SERVICE

Unplug the product from the wall outlet and refer servicing to qualified service personnel under the following conditions: a. When the power-supply cord or plug is damaged.

- b. If liquid has been spilled, or objects have fallen into the product.
- c. If the product has been exposed to rain or water.

d. If the product does not operate normally by following the operating instructions. Adjust only those controls that are covered by the operating instructions, as an adjustment of other controls may result in damage and will often require extensive work

by a qualified technician to restore the product to its normal operation.


- e. If the product has been dropped or the cabinet has been damaged.
- f. When the product exhibits a distinct change in performance this indicates a need for service.

23. HEAT

The product should be situated away from heat sources such as radiators, heat registers, stoves, or other products (including amplifiers) that produce heat.

24. NOTE TO CATV SYSTEM INSTALLER

This reminder is provided to call the CATV system installer's attention to Article 820-40 of the NEC that provides guidelines for proper grounding and, in particular, specifies that the cable ground shall be connected to the grounding system of the building, as close to the point of cable entry as practical.




EXAMPLE OF ANTENNA GROUNDING AS PER NATIONAL ELECTRICAL CODE


POWER SOURCE

Insert the AC plug (with the 2 blades) into a conveniently located AC outlet having 120V, 60 Hz.

NOTE: The AC plug supplied with the unit is polarized to help minimize the possibility of electric shock. If the AC plug does not fit into a nonpolarized AC outlet, do not file or cut the wide blade. It is the user's responsibility to have an electrician replace the \leq obsolete outlet.




LOCATION OF CONTROLS



- 1. **POWER Button -** Press to turn the TV on; the Power indicator will light red. Press again to turn the TV off; the Power indicator will go off.
- 2. MENU Button Press to access the On-Screen menu.
- **3. TV/CATV Button –** Press to switch between the TV and the CATV (Cable TV) mode.
- 4. TV/AV Button Press to switch between the TV and the video inputs.
- 5. VOLUME Up/Down Buttons Press to raise or lower the volume.
- 6. CHANNEL Up/Down Buttons Press to select a channel.
- 7. **Power/Timer Indicator** Lights red when the TV is on. Lights orange when the TV is on and the On Timer option is on. Lights green when the TV is off, and the On Timer is on.
- 8. REMOTE SENSOR



- **10. AV3 AUDIO/VIDEO IN Jacks** Audio and Video signal cables from an external source can be connected here. AV button must be set to VIDEO3.
- **11. Headphone Jack** Headphones (3.5mm) can be connected here for private listening.

REAR PANEL




- 12. S-VIDEO IN Jack (Rear of Unit) Connect an external unit that utilizes an S-video cable to this jack.
- 13. VHF/UHF IN Jack (Rear of Unit) Connect a VHF/UHF antenna, CATV, VCR, satellite, etc. cable to this jack.
- 14. AV AUDIO/VIDEO OUT Jacks Audio and Video signal cables from an external source can be connected here. AV button must be set to regular TV or CATV.
- **15.** AV1 AUDIO/VIDEO IN Jacks Audio and Video signal cables from an external source can be connected here. AV button must be set to VIDEO1.
- **16. AV2 AUDIO/VIDEO IN Jacks** Audio and Video signal cables from an external source can be connected here. AV button must be set to VIDEO2.
- AV2 (DVD) Cr,Cb,Y IN Jacks Cr, Cb, Y signal cables from an external source can be connected here. AV button must be set to VIDEO2.



BATTERY INSTALLATION




BATTERY PRECAUTIONS

Follow these precautions when using batteries in this device:

- 1. Use only the size and type of batteries specified.
- 2. Be sure to follow the correct polarity when installing the batteries as indicated in the battery compartment. Reversed batteries may cause damage to the device.
- 3. Do not mix different types of batteries together (e.g. Alkaline and Carbon-zinc) or old batteries with fresh ones.
- 4. If the device is not to be used for a long period of time, remove the batteries to prevent damage or injury from possible battery leakage.
- 5. Do not try to recharge batteries not intended to be recharged; they can overheat and rupture. (Follow battery manufacturer's directions.)

EFFECTIVE DISTANCE OF THE REMOTE CONTROL TRANSMITTER



NOTES:

- When there is an obstacle between the TV and the transmitter, the transmitter may not operate.
- When direct sunlight, incandescent lamp, fluorescent lamp or any other strong light shines on the REMOTE SENSOR of the TV, the remote operation may be unstable.

FAQs:

Why is the remote control not working properly?


- The remote control is not aimed at the sensor.
- The remote control is too far away from the remote sensor.
- There is too much light in the room.
- There is an obstacle in the path of the beam.
- The batteries are weak or dead.
- The batteries are inserted incorrectly.
- The TV is not plugged in.
- The proper Function button is not pressed. For Example, press the TV button to use the remote to operate the TV.

CUSTOMIZING YOUR REMOTE CONTROL


Your TV comes equipped with a universal remote control. In addition to controlling the TV, this universal remote can also operate a VCR, DVD player and a cable box (even if your units are made by manufacturers other than Memorex). If you accidentally change the program for your TV, simply use 0001 as the television code.

SETTING UP YOUR REMOTE TO OPERATE YOUR VCR, DVD AND/OR CABLE BOX




IMPORTANT: After pressing another function button and using an external unit (such as a VCR), you must press the TV Function button again to operate the TV.

AUTO SEARCH PROCEDURE



and hold the CH+ and the VOL– buttons at the same time until the red Program indicator at the top of the remote lights.



Press the POWER button **①** and the Auto Search mode will begin.

Press the desired Function button $\boldsymbol{\Theta}$, or hold the CH+ and VOL– buttons together to exit the search mode.



CABLE (CATV)/SATELLITE CONNECTIONS

This TV has an extended tuning range and can tune most cable channels without using a Cable TV converter box. Some Cable TV companies offer "premium pay channels" in which the signal is scrambled. Descrambling these signals for normal viewing requires the use of a descrambler device which is generally provided by the cable company.


FOR SUBSCRIBERS TO BASIC CABLE TV SERVICE

For basic cable service not requiring a converter/descrambler box, connect the CATV 75 ohm coaxial cable to the VHF/UHF jack on the rear of the TV.




FOR SUBSCRIBERS TO SCRAMBLED CABLE TV SERVICE OR SATELLITE

If you subscribe to a satellite service or a cable TV service which requires the use of a converter/descrambler box, connect the incoming 75 ohm coaxial cable to the converter/descrambler box. Using another 75 ohm cable, connect the output of the converter/descrambler or satellite box to the antenna jack on the TV. Follow the connections shown below. Set the TV/VCR to the output channel of the converter/descrambler or satellite box (usually 3 or 4) and use the converter/descrambler or satellite box to select channels.



FOR SUBSCRIBERS TO UNSCRAMBLED BASIC CABLE TV SERVICE WITH SCRAMBLED PREMIUM CHANNELS

If you subscribe to a satellite service or a cable TV service in which basic channels are unscrambled and premium channels require the use of a converter/descrambler box, you may wish to use a signal splitter and an A/B switch box (available from the cable company or an electronic supply store). Follow the connections shown below. With the switch in the "B" position, you can directly tune any nonscrambled channels on your TV. With the switch in the "A" position, tune your TV to the output of the converter/descrambler box (usually channel 3 or 4) and use the converter/descrambler box to tune scrambled channels.

CLOSED CAPTIONS

WHAT IS CLOSED CAPTIONING?

This television has the capability to decode and display Closed Captioned television programs. Closed Captioning will display text on the screen for hearing impaired viewers or it will translate and display text in another language.

CLOSED CAPTIONING WITH A VCR

Closed Captioned programs can be recorded and played back on a VCR with the Closed Captioned text intact. The Closed Captioned text will disappear during Cue (Fast Forward Search), Review (Rewind Search) and Pause modes or if the VCR tracking is not adjusted properly.

TO VIEW CLOSED CAPTIONS

Enter the CUSTOM MENU and select CLOSED CAPTION. Scroll down and select the desired settings:

DISPLAY: Turns the captions On or Off.

MODE: Select either C.C (Captions) or TEXT (Full screen text) as follows:

CAPTIONS: This Closed Caption Mode will display text on the screen in English or another language. Generally, Closed Captions in English are transmitted on Captions 1 and Closed Captions in other languages are transmitted on Captions 2.

TEXT: The Text Closed Caption Mode will usually fill the screen with a programming schedule or other information.

CHANNEL: Select between the 4 closed caption channels.

After selecting a Closed Caption Mode, it will stay in effect until it is changed, even if the channel is changed. If the Captions signal is lost due to a commercial or a break in the signal, the Captions will reappear when the signal is received again. If the channels are changed, the Captions will be delayed approximately 10 seconds.

The Captions will appear in places on the screen where they will least interfere with the picture, usually on the bottom of the screen. News programs will usually show three-line Closed Captions which scroll onto the screen. Most other shows provide two or three lined Captions placed near the character who is speaking so the viewer can follow the dialogue.

Words in italics or underlined describe titles, words in foreign languages or words requiring emphasis. Words that are sung usually appear enclosed by musical notes.

For television programs broadcasting with Closed Captions, look in your TV guide for the Closed Captions symbol (CC).


NOTES:

- When selecting Closed Captions, the captioning will be delayed approximately 10 seconds.
- Misspellings or unusual characters may occasionally appear during Closed Captioning. This is normal with Closed Captioning, especially with live programs. This is because during live programs, captions are also entered live. These transmissions do not allow time for editing.
- When Captions are being displayed, on-screen displays, such as volume and mute may not be seen or may interfere with Closed Captions.
- Some cable systems and copy protection systems may interfere with the Closed Caption signal.
- If using an indoor antenna or if TV reception is very poor, the Closed Caption Decoder may not appear or may appear with strange characters or misspelled words. In this case, adjust the antenna for better reception or use an outdoor antenna.

Does the clock have to be set before using the On and Off Timers? Yes, the clock must be set.

When I press a button on the remote, the TV does not respond? Refer to the FAQ's on page 7. Make sure that you press the TV Function button to use the remote control to operate the TV.

RECEPTION DISTURBANCES

Most types of television interference can be remedied by adjusting the height and position of the VHF/UHF antenna. Outdoor antennas are recommended for best results if not using cable or a satellite. The most common types of television interference are shown below. If one of these symptoms appear when the TV is connected to a Cable TV system, the disturbance may be caused by the local cable company broadcast.

IGNITION:

Black spots or horizontal streaks may appear, picture may flutter or drift. Usually caused by interference from automobile ignition systems, neon lamps, electric drills and other electric appliances.

GHOSTS:

Ghosts are caused by the television signal following two paths. One is the direct path and the other is reflected from tall buildings, hills or other objects. Changing the direction or position of the antenna may improve the reception.

SNOW:

If your receiver is located in the fringe area of a television station where the signal is weak, your picture may be marred by the appearance of small dots. When the signal is extremely weak, it may be necessary to install an external antenna to improve the picture.

RADIO FREQUENCY INTERFERENCE:

This interference produces moving ripples or diagonal streaks, and in some cases, causes loss of contrast in the picture.

PICTURE SIZE VARIATION:

A slight picture size variation is quite normal when you adjust the CONTRAST or BRIGHTNESS setting.
