1. READ INSTRUCTIONS

All the safety and operating instructions should be read before the product is operated.

2. RETAIN INSTRUCTIONS

The safety and operating instructions should be retained for future reference.

3. HEED WARNINGS

All warnings on the product and in the operating instructions should be adhered to.

4. FOLLOW INSTRUCTIONS

All operating and use instructions should be followed.

5. CLEANING

Unplug this product from the wall outlet before cleaning. Do not use liquid cleaners or aerosol cleaners. Use a dry cloth for cleaning.

6. ATTACHMENTS

Do not use attachments not recommended by the product's manufacturer as they may cause hazards.

7. WATER AND MOISTURE

15. OVERLOADING


Do not overload wall outlets and extension cords as this can result in a risk of fire or electric shock.

16. OBJECT AND LIQUID ENTRY

PRECAUTIONS

NOTES ON HANDLING:

- When shipping the player, always use the original shipping carton and packing materials. For maximum protection, repack the unit as it was originally packed at the factory.
- Do not use volatile liquids, such as insect spray, near the player. Do not leave rubber or plastic products in contact with the player for a long time. They will leave marks on the finish.
- The top and rear panels of the player may become warm after a long period of use. This is normal and not a malfunction.
- When the player is not in use, be sure to remove the disc and turn off the power.
- If you do not use the player for a long period, the unit may not function properly in the future. Turn on and use the player occasionally.
- Do not insert fingers or any other objects into the cassette-loading slot. Do not spray cleaner or wax directly on the VCR or use forced air to remove dust.
- Avoid places subject to strong vibration. Use in a horizontal (flat) position only.
- When you finish operating the unit, always unload the cassette and turn off the power.
- To protect the player during a lightning storm, unplug the AC power cord from the wall outlet. Do not touch the antenna leads.

NOTES ON LOCATING THE UNIT:

• When you place this player near a TV or radio, the playback picture may become poor and the sound may be distorted. In this case, move the player away from the TV or radio.

NOTES ON CLEANING:

Use a soft, dry cloth for cleaning.

- For stubborn dirt, soak the cloth in a weak detergent solution, wring well and wipe. Use a dry cloth to wipe it dry. Do not use any type of solvent, such as thinner and benzene, as they may damage the surface of the player.
- If you use a chemical-saturated cloth to clean the unit, follow that product's instructions.

Warning: Cleaning and adjustment of lenses and/or other components of playback mechanism should be performed by a qualified service technician.

TO OBTAIN A CLEAR PICTURE:

DVD: The DVD player is a high technology, precision device. If the optical pick-up lens and disc drive parts are dirty or worn down, the picture quality becomes poor. To obtain a clear picture, we recommend regular inspection and maintenance (cleaning or parts replacement) every 1,000 hours of use depending on the operating environment. For details, contact your nearest dealer.

VCR: See page 55 for video head cleaning instructions.

NOTES ON MOISTURE CONDENSATION:

Moisture condensation damages the player. Please read the following carefully.

 Moisture condensation occurs, for example, when you pour a cold drink into a glass on a warm day. Drops of water form on the outside of the glass. In the same way, moisture may condense on the optical pick-up lens inside this unit, one of the most crucial internal parts of the player.

Moisture condensation occurs during the following cases:

- When you bring the player directly from a cold place to a warm place.
- When you use the player in a room where you just turned on the heater, or a place where the cold wind from the air conditioner directly hits the unit.
- In summer, when you use the player in a hot and humid place just after you moved the unit from an air conditioned room.
- When you use the player in a humid place.


Do not use the player when moisture condensation may occur.

 If you use the player in such a situation, it may damage discs and internal parts. Remove the disc, connect the power cord of the player to the wall outlet, turn on the player and leave it "ON" for two or three hours. After two or three hours, the player will have warmed up and evaporated any moisture. Keep the player connected to the wall outlet and moisture condensation will seldom occur.

POWER SOURCE


Insert the AC plug (with the 2 blades) into a conveniently located AC outlet having 120V, 60Hz.

NOTE: The AC plug supplied with the unit is polarized to help minimize the possibility of electric shock. If the AC plug does not fit into a nonpolarized AC outlet, do not file or cut the wide blade. It is the user's responsibility to have an electrician replace the obsolete outlet.



BATTERY INSTALLATION




- 1. Open the Battery Compartment cover by pushing in on the tab and lifting it out.
- 2. Install two (2) "AA" batteries (not included), paying attention to the polarity diagram in the Battery Compartment.
- 3. Replace the Battery Compartment cover.

BATTERY PRECAUTIONS

Follow these precautions when using batteries in this device:


- 1. Use only the size and type of batteries specified.
- 2. Be sure to follow the correct polarity when installing the batteries as indicated in the Battery Compartment. Reversed batteries may cause damage to the device.
- 3. Do not mix different types of batteries together (e.g. Alkaline, Rechargeable and Carbon-zinc) or old batteries with fresh ones.
- 4. If the device is not to be used for a long period of time, remove the batteries to prevent damage or injury from possible battery leakage.
- 5. Do not try to recharge batteries not intended to be recharged; they can overheat and rupture. (Follow battery manufacturer's directions.)

EFFECTIVE DISTANCE OF THE REMOTE CONTROL TRANSMITTER




- When there is an obstacle between the unit and the transmitter, the transmitter may not operate.


CONNECTING THE UNIT TO A TV USING THE S-VIDEO OUTPUT JACK (FOR DVD ONLY)

- · Set the TV's TV/VIDEO button or switch to the VIDEO setting.
- When connecting, refer to the owner's manual of the TV, as well as this manual.
- When connecting, make sure the power is off and both units are unplugged before making any connections.
- If your TV only has one audio input, the use of a "Y" connector may be necessary. Visit your local electronics supply store.
- Set the VIDEO OUT Option (on the GENERAL Menu Page) to S-VIDEO if using the S-Video Out jack.
- The connections on this page can only be used for DVD Playback, not for VCR playback.
- If using a TV with a blue screen option, turn the option off on the TV for best results.
- Connect a cable, etc. signal as described on pages 13 and 14 to use the tuner capabilities of this unit.
- The S-VIDEO output jack connection can only be used for DVD playback, not for VCR or TV mode.

CONNECTING THE UNIT TO A TV USING THE Y, Pb/Cb, Pr/Cr JACKS



NOTES FOR CONNECTING:

- Set the VIDEO OUT Option (on the GENERAL Menu Page) to YUV if using the Component Video Out jack.
- Your TV must have Y, Pb, Pr or Y, Cb, Cr Input jacks.
- Set the TV's TV/VIDEO button or switch to the VIDEO setting.
- When connecting, refer to the owner's manual of the TV, as well as this manual.
- When connecting, make sure the power is off and both units are unplugged before making any connections.
- Component Y, Pb/Cb, Pr/Cr Jacks can only be used for DVD Playback, not for VCR or TV mode.
- If using a TV with a blue screen option, turn the option off, on the TV for best results.

PROGRESSIVE (Y, PB, PR) VIDEO OUT:

Use these jacks to connect to a TV with progressive video input jacks, then set the PROGRESSIVE SCAN switch to ON. Progressive Scan is a video scanning system that displays all lines in a frame in one pass, as opposed to the traditional system, interlaced scan. This connection provides optimum quality. To ensure maximum picture quality, use three video-grade cables for connections. Note that it is essential to match the color-coded connectors with a compatible TV.


525 LINE DIGITAL PROGRESSIVE-SCAN COMPONENT VIDEO OUTPUT

Compared to standard interlaced video, Progressive Scan effectively doubles the amount of video information fed to your TV or monitor. The result is a stable, flicker-free image. (Check your TV/monitor for compatibility with this feature.) For the very highest picture quality, try watching a movie on DVD-Video on a Progressive-Scan compatible TV.

- If you connect a TV that is not compatible with a Progressive Scan signal and set the PROGRESSIVE SCAN switch to ON, you will not be able to see any picture at all or "PSCAN" will appear on the screen. Slide the PROGRESSIVE SCAN switch to the OFF position to turn the progressive scan function off.


CARE AND MAINTENANCE

Caring for Discs

• Treat the disc carefully. Handle the disc only by its edges. Never allow your fingers to come in contact with the shiny, unprinted side of the disc.



- Do not attach adhesive tape, stickers, etc. to the disc label.
- Clean the disc periodically with a soft, lint-free, dry cloth. Never use detergents or abrasive cleaners to clean the disc. If necessary, use a CD cleaning kit.
- If a disc skips or gets stuck on a section of the disc, it is probably dirty or damaged (scratched).
- When cleaning the disc, wipe in straight lines from the center of the disc to the outer edge of the disc. Never wipe in circular motions.



- Discs should be stored in their cases after each use to avoid damage.
- Do not expose discs to direct sunlight, high humidity, high temperatures or dust, etc. Prolonged exposure or extreme temperatures can warp the disc.
- Do not stick or write anything on either side of the disc. Sharp writing instruments, or the ink, may damage the surface.

Cleaning the Unit

- To prevent fire or shock hazard, disconnect your unit from the AC power source when cleaning.
- The finish on your unit may be cleaned with a dust cloth and cared for as other furniture. Use caution when cleaning and wiping the plastic parts.
- Mild soap and a damp cloth may be used on the front panel.

VIDEO HEAD CLOGGING/CLEANING

VIDEO HEAD CLOGGING

The video heads are the means by which the VCR reads pictures from the tape during playback. In the unlikely event that the heads become dirty enough to be clogged, no picture will be played back. This can easily be determined if, during playback of a known good tape, there is good sound, but no picture (picture is extremely snowy). If this is the case, have the video cassette recorder checked by qualified service personnel.

VIDEO HEAD CLEANING

This VCR has a built-in head cleaning system that cleans the heads whenever a tape is inserted or ejected. However, cleaning still may be necessary when the playback picture becomes unclear. The heads can get dirty when playing poor quality or damaged tapes. If the heads require cleaning, use a equivalent high quality chemical non-abrasive (wet) head cleaning tape or have them cleaned professionally. If playing a head cleaning tape in the VCR once does not improve the picture, play it several times before requesting service.

• DO NOT ATTEMPT TO CLEAN THE VIDEO HEADS OR SERVICE THE UNIT BY REMOVING THE TOP COVER.

- Video heads may eventually wear out and should be replaced when they fail to produce clear pictures.
- To help prevent video head clogging, use only good quality Video Cassette Tapes. Disregard worn out tapes.
