Selecting fine audio equipment such as the unit you've just purchased is only the start of your musical enjoyment. Now it's time to consider how you can maximize the fun and excitement your equipment offers. This manufacturer and the Electronic Industries Association's Consumer Electronics Group want you to get the most out of your equipment by playing it at a safe level. One that lets the sound come through loud and clear without annoying blaring or distortion and, most importantly, without affecting your sensitive hearing.

Sound can be deceiving. Over time your hearing "comfort level" adapts to higher volumes of sound. So what sounds "normal" can actually be loud and harmful to your hearing. Guard against this by setting your equipment at a safe level BEFORE your hearing adapts.

To establish a safe level:

- · Start your volume control at a low setting.
- Slowly increase the sound until you can hear it comfortably and clearly, and without distortion.

Once you have established a comfortable sound level:

BATTERY INSTALLATION

When the bars in the battery indicator (in the display) become low (see Figure 1), replace the battery as follows.

1. Remove the top cover by pressing the Open button, then lifting the top cover up to remove it as shown in Figure 2.

 Insert one (1) "AAA" battery (positive side facing the bottom of the unit and negative side facing the top) as shown in Figure 3, making sure to close the battery latch (press down the battery latch and slide the latch until it locks in place). An alkaline battery is recommended

for the longest playing time.

3. Put the top cover back on until it snaps in place.

NOTE: Each time after you have replaced the battery, when you turn on the unit again, it will search the music files to update the index. It will take approx. several seconds to update the index; this updating time depends on the number of music files in the SD/MMC card and in the internal memory.

BATTERY PRECAUTIONS

Follow these precautions when using a battery in this device:

- 1. Use only the size and type of battery specified.
- 2. Be sure to follow the correct polarity when installing the battery as indicated. Reversed batteries may cause damage to the device.
- 3. If the device is not to be used for a long period of time, remove the battery to prevent damage or injury from possible battery leakage.
- Do not try to recharge batteries not intended to be recharged; they can overheat and rupture. (Follow battery manufacturer's directions.)

INSTALL "DIGITAL AUDIO PLAYER" SOFTWARE

TO INSTALL THE "DIGITAL AUDIO PLAYER" CD SOFTWARE

For Windows ME, Windows2000 or Windows XP:

Windows will automatically detect the audio player without installing the CD software when the USB cable is connected.

For Macintosh OSX:

Macintosh OSX will automatically detect the audio player without installing the CD software. Do not install the software when using a Macintosh.

For Windows98SE:

The USB mass storage function will not be activated without driver installation. To activate the USB mass storage function, please use the installation CD-Rom to install the driver.

For Windows 98SE, if you are connecting your player to your computer for the first time, please follow these instructions:

Procedure to Install Player Driver

 Insert the Installation CD-Rom into the CD Drive, then the installation screen will appear. If the installation screen doesn't automatically appear, doubleclick my computer then doubleclick on the CD drive, then the installation screen will appear. Click on the Windows 98 firmware icon. Then click on the MMP8564 icon.

2. At the Welcome screen, click NEXT.

 Read the License Agreement. If you accept the terms of the license agreement, select and dot the circle at the left of "I accept the terms of the license agreement". Then click NEXT.

4. At the Setup screen, click NEXT. It is recommended to leave the destination folder as it is.

5. At the Program Folder screen, click NEXT. It is recommended to leave the program folder as it is.

6. Click "Install" to start the installation.

WINDOWS MEDIA PLAYER 10 INSTALLATION

Windows Media Player 10 is for use with Windows XP only. For Windows ME and Windows 2000, please install Windows Media Player 9. For Windows 98SE, please visit **www.Microsoft.com** to download the corresponding Windows Media Player for your computer.

Once you have installed Windows Media Player 10, you can transfer MP3 files, WMA files, WMA files with DRM 9 or DRM 10 to your player using the "Sync" function.

- Insert the Installation CD-Rom into the CD Drive, then the installation screen will appear. If the installation screen doesn't automatically appear, double-click "My Computer" then double-click on the CD drive, then the installation screen will appear. Click on the Windows Media Player 10 Setup icon.
- 2. Installation will begin.
- 3. Read the License Agreement, then click I ACCEPT.

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DOWNLOADING AND TRANSFERRING FILES

TRANSFERRING FILES

You can download digital music files from the Internet or use encoding software to convert music that you have on an audio CD into MP3 or WMA format. Once these files are stored on your computer you can easily copy them to your player.

For Windows XP, if you already installed Windows Media Player 10, you can transfer music files (MP3, WMA, WMA



files with DRM 9 or DRM 10) to the player through the "Sync" function of Windows Media Player 10. Connect your

computer to the USB port on your computer using the USB cable. "Removable Disk" will appear in your "My Computer" folder which indicates the player is connected. Also, the player will display the above figure. Then, follow the



procedure on page 17 to transfer music files to the player.

For Windows ME, Windows 2000, Windows 98 or Windows XP (without Windows Media Player 10), transfer music files as follows:

- 1. Connect your player to the USB port on your computer using the USB cable as shown above.
- 2. A "Removable Disk" window will automatically pop-up on your computer screen.
- 3. To add more files and songs to your player, simply drag and drop MP3 or WMA files from anywhere on your computer into the "Removable Disk" window.

IMPORTANT: A WMA file with DRM 9 or DRM 10 will not play back if you directly drag and drop it into the "Removable Disk" window. You must use Windows Media Player 10 to transfer copy-protected files as described on page 17.

DOWNLOADING AND TRANSFERRING FILES (CONT.)

TRANSFERRING AUDIO FILES TO YOUR DIGITAL AUDIO PLAYER USING A MACINTOSH COMPUTER

Make sure to use a Macintosh computer with an operating system of 10.0 or layer to transfer audio files.

- 1. Turn on your computer.
- 2. Turn on your digital audio player.
- 3. Connect the smaller end of the cable to the USB jack on the player and the larger end of the cable to the USB port on your Macintosh.
- 4. Your computer will automatically recognize your player and mount a hard disk icon onto your desktop.
- Locate the folder where your audio files are stored on your computer's hard drive. Simply drag and drop the audio files onto the mounted hard disk drive icon of your digital audio player located on your desktop.
- 6. After you have finished your transfer, put away the digital audio player hard disk icon(s) by dragging it to the Trash icon or Control-click its icon and choose Eject from the File menu or select Eject from the File drop-down menu located at the top of your screen. You can also use the keyboard shortcuts by selecting the digital audio player hard disk icon and pressing the Command-E keys.
- 7. Your player is ready to play the files you transferred.

DOWNLOADING AND TRANSFERRING FILES (CONT.)

For Windows XP, you can also utilize the previously installed Windows Media Player 10 software to convert music on an audio CD into MP3 or WMA format as follows:

 Open the Windows Media Player 10 Browser, then click on the "Rip" icon on the top tool bar. Insert a Music CD into the CD-Rom drive of your computer.

NOTE: For Windows 98SE, Windows ME and Windows 2000, please use the Windows Media Player 9 to convert music on an audio CD into MP3 or WMA format.

- 2. Click on the "Tools" menu option at the top menu bar, then click on "Options"; the Option setting menu will appear. Click on Rip Music and set the Rip Music to the desired location on your computer. Then, set the desired format for the newly ripped music (MP3 format or Windows Media Audio format). Adjust the audio quality as desired. When finished, click "OK" to confirm the settings.
- Click on the "Rip Music" icon to start ripping the music to your computer.
- When the music tracks are ripped; connect the player to your computer. Open the "Removable Disk" window and open the ripped music location window.

- To add the transferred/ripped music files/songs to your player simply drag and drop the MP3 and/or WMA files into the "Removable Disk" window.
- 6. When the files are finished loading into the player, follow the "Safely Remove Hardware" procedure as shown on page 18.

DOWNLOADING AND TRANSFERRING FILES (CONT.)

TRANSFERRING MP3/WMA FILES AND WMA FILES WITH DRM 9 OR DRM 10 USING THE WINDOWS MEDIA PLAYER 10 (FOR WINDOWS XP ONLY)

To transfer MP3 files/WMA files/WMA files with DRM 9 or 10 to the player, follow the procedure described below using the previously installed Windows Media Player 10. Before beginning the procedure please turn the unit on and connect the unit to the computer as previously described.

- 1. Open the "Windows Media Player Browser 10" and click on "Sync".
- Click on the "Sync List" pull-down menu to locate the music files you wish to download. Then make sure to tick the box next to the files.
- Select the Portable Device ("Removable Disk") that you want to copy to from the right side drop-down menu. Click "Start Sync" to start transferring music files to the player.
- After finished transferring all the desired files to your unit, follow the "Safely Remove Hardware" procedure on the next page.

NOTES:

- For WMA files with DRM 10, you can only use Windows Media Player 10 to transfer files to your player.
- For WMA files with DRM 10, the files will not be played if you transfer the files into the SD/MMC card's memory. You must transfer the WMA files with DRM 10 to the player's internal memory for playback.
- For Windows ME and Windows 2000, please use Windows Media Player 9 to transfer WMA files with DRM 9 to the player. For Windows 98SE, please visit www.Microsoft.com to download the corresponding Windows Media Player to transfer music files to the player.





SAFELY REMOVE HARDWARE

SAFELY REMOVING YOUR PLAYER FROM THE COMPUTER

NOTE: To avoid damage to your player or data loss, always follow the procedure listed below before disconnecting your player from the USB port on your computer.

Using your mouse, double click the "Safely Remove Hardware" icon on the task bar.

From the "Safely Remove Hardware" window, select "USB Mass Storage Device" and click the "Stop" button. The "Stop a Hardware Device" window will pop-up as shown:

Click "OK". When the "Safe to Remove Hardware" window is displayed, you may remove the player from the USB cable or remove the USB cable from the computer.

NOTES:

- If the "Safely Remove Hardware" icon is not displayed on the task bar, please double click on My Computer. Right click on "Removable Disk" and left click on "Eject". Then it is safe to remove the player from the computer.
- The "Safely Remove Hardware" procedure is not necessary for Win98 and Win98SE users.

DOWNLOADING AND TRANSFERRING FILES (CONTINUED)

EXTERNAL MEMORY CARD

TO AVOID DAMAGE, make sure the unit is off before inserting or removing the card.

- 1. Remove the top cover by pressing the Open button, then lifting the top cover up to remove it as shown in Figure 1.
- 2. Insert a SD/MMC memory card (not included) up to 1GB, label side facing the rear of the player, as shown in Figure 2.
- 3. Connect the USB cable as described previously.
- Drag MP3 and WMA files into the SD/MMC memory card's "Removable Disk" window.

NOTE: A WMA file with DRM will not playback if you directly drag and drop it into the "Removable Disk" window. See page 17 for downloading WMA files with DRM from the computer to your player.

- To remove the SD/MMC memory card, *turn the unit off*, then push the edge of the card and the card will spring out. Carefully remove the card, as shown in Figure 3.
- 6. Replace the top cover until it snaps in place.

NOTE:

- If the external card is inserted, removed or replaced, the unit will search the music files to update the index when the unit is turned on again.
- If the external card is inserted, the memory card indicator will appear at the top side of the display while in the Music Player mode.
- While the player is on, if the SD/MMC card is removed or inserted, "Unload the Card?" or "Load the card?" will appear in the display. Press the Navigation control to select YES to reload or load the SD/MMC card to update the player.

OPERATION

TURNING THE POWER ON/OFF

LOCK SWITCH



Turn the unit on by pressing the Power On/Off/ Stop button; the Memorex start screen will appear in the display temporarily. Then the Music Player menu will appear and the MP3/WMA track's information will appear in the display. To turn the unit off, press and hold the Power On/Off/Stop button; "Hold Down To Power Off" will appear in the display. The unit will turn off after it counts up from one to three. Do not release the Power On/Off/Stop button until the unit turns off.



With the unit on, press and hold the MENU/Lock button until LOCKED appears in the display; no buttons will function. This is useful when you do not want the track changed by accidentally pressing a button. Press and hold the MENU/Lock button until UNLOCKED appears in the display to cancel the Lock function.

NOTE: After you have transferred music files to the player, when you turn on the player, the "Memorex" start screen will appear in the display temporarily followed by "Internal Updating Music Library" and "Create New Music Playlist" (if a SD/MMC card is inserted, "Ext card checking changes in music content" will appear in the display temporarily). It will take several seconds to several minutes to update the player's library or the music files depending on the number of songs that you transferred to the player. When done, the Music Player menu will appear in the display.

TO LISTEN TO THE FM RADIO



TO ADD PRESETS









Select a desired Preset by pushing the Navigation control towards \blacktriangle or \blacktriangledown **0**, then press the Navigation control **0**. Select Yes (confirm adding the station to the Preset) or No (cancel adding the station to the Preset) by pushing the Navigation control towards $\triangleleft/\triangleleft$ or \vdash **0**, then press the Navigation control **0**. To exit the FM menu, press the Menu/Lock button **9**.

TO LOAD PRESETS

While in FM Playback mode, press the Menu/Lock button $①$; the FM Menu will appear. Push the Navigation control towards \blacktriangle or \blacktriangledown $②$ to select Load Preset, then press the Navigation control $③$.	Select a desired Preset by pushing the Navigation control towards \blacktriangle or \blacktriangledown , then press the Navigation control. NOTE: You can also push the Navigation control towards \blacktriangle (for Preset Up) or \blacktriangledown (for Preset Down) to select the desired preset station while in the FM playback mode (with the radio frequency in the display).

AUTO SCAN:

While in FM Playback mode, press the Menu/Lock button; the FM menu will appear. Push the Navigation control towards \blacktriangle or \checkmark to select Auto Scan then press the Navigation control. The unit will automatically scan and set the available stations into Presets 1 through 20. Then Preset 1 will appear with the corresponding frequency tuned in.

NOTE: During Auto Scan, " 🚇 " will appear in the display. Download from Www.Somanuals.cop, All Manuals Search And Download.

TO DELETE ONE PRESET







While in FM Playback mode, press the Menu/Lock button \bullet ; the FM Menu will appear. Push the Navigation control towards \blacktriangle or \blacktriangledown O to select Delete One, then press the Navigation control O.

Push the Navigation control towards ▲ or ▼ to select the Preset station which you want to delete and press the Navigation control. Select YES (delete the Preset) or NO (cancel deleting the Preset) by pushing the Navigation control towards

TO DELETE ALL PRESETS



TO LISTEN TO MP3s/WMAs/WAVs





Turn the unit on by pressing the Power On/Off/Stop button; the Memorex start screen will appear in the display temporarily. Then the Music Player menu will appear and the MP3/WMA's track information will appear in the display.



Press the Play/Pause ►II button **①** to start playback; the MP3 information will appear/scroll across the display. Press the VOLUME +/-buttons **②** to increase or decrease the volume. To stop playback, press the Power On/Off/Stop button **③**; the Stop indicator will appear.

If the unit is in the FM mode, press the MENU/Lock button $\mathbf{0}$; the FM menu will appear in the display. Push the Navigation control towards \mathbf{A} or $\mathbf{\nabla}$ $\mathbf{0}$ to select Exit, then press the Navigation control $\mathbf{0}$ to select it. The Main menu will appear in the display. Select "Play Now" by pushing the Navigation control towards \mathbf{A} or $\mathbf{\nabla}$ $\mathbf{0}$, then press the Navigation control $\mathbf{0}$; the Music Player menu will appear.



To turn the unit off, press and hold the Power On/Off/Stop button; "Hold Down To Power Off" will appear in the display. The unit will turn off after it counts up from one to three. Do not release the Power On/Off/Stop button until the unit turns off. **NOTE:**

• See pages 8-17 for information on uploading MP3, WMA and WAV files to this unit.

NOTE (AUTO RESUME): Each time you exit the Music Player mode or turn the unit off, when the unit is turned back on or you enter the Music Player mode again, this unit will resume at the beginning of the last track which was playing before turning the power off or changing mode.

TO PAUSE PLAYBACK





During playback, if you wish to pause the file momentarily, press the Play/Pause ►II button; playback will pause, the Pause indicator will appear and the timer will stop counting.



Press the Play/Pause ►II button again to resume playback; the sound will return, the Play indicator will appear and the timer will start counting again.

TO SELECT/BROWSE THROUGH THE FILES



FORWARD/REVERSE SKIP



During playback, push the Navigation control towards \blacktriangleright / \blacktriangleright to advance the player to the beginning of the next file. Push the Navigation control towards \blacktriangleright / \blacktriangleright repeatedly to advance the player to higher-numbered files.

During playback, push the Navigation control towards ◄/◀ to move the player back to the beginning of the currently playing file. Push the Navigation control towards ◄/◀ repeatedly to move the player back to lower-numbered files.

Press the MENU/Lock button 0 ; the Main menu will appear. Scroll to Stopwatch by pushing the Navigation control towards \blacktriangle or $\mathbf{\nabla} \mathbf{Q}$, then press the Navigation control \mathbf{Q} .	Press the Navigation control to start the timer; the timer will then start counting up. Press the Navigation control to stop the timer; the timer will then stop counting.

Press the Navigation control to reset the timer to "0:00:00:00" and start the timer again. You can also select another timer by pushing the Navigation control towards \blacktriangle or \checkmark . To reset the timer , push the Navigation control towards \blacktriangleright or \checkmark . To reset the timer , push the Navigation control towards \succ <i>in</i> for two seconds and then release; the timer will be reset. To reset all the timers , push the Navigation control towards \blacktriangle or \checkmark repeatedly to select "Clear lap times" then press the Navigation control to reset all the timers. Formatting the Player

WARNING! Do not format this player unless it stops working and you are instructed to do so by technical support personnel.

- 1. Use the USB cable to connect the player and the computer.
- Double click on My Computer, then right click "Removable Disk" and left click on "Format".
- At the "Format" window, select "FAT 32" from the file system pull-down menu, then click "Start" to format the unit (see figure above).

NOTE: Make sure you have selected "FAT 32" at the file system pull-down menu; otherwise, after formatting, the player will not work properly.



Then, click OK to confirm and the player will start to format. When finished, click "Close" to close the Format window.

UPDATING THE FIRMWARE

WARNING! Do not update the firmware unless you are experiencing problems with your digital audio device. Incorrect or faulty firmware installation will cause the player to stop functioning.

- 1. Download the updated firmware at www.memorexelectronics.com.
- 2. Unzip the file, then double click setup.exe in the Desktop folder to install the software to your computer.
- 3. Connect the player to the computer using the supplied USB cable and the installation screen will appear. (If the installation screen does not appear, unplug the USB cable and turn off the unit). Connect to the computer again and press and hold the Power On/Off/Stop button until the installation screen appears.
- 4. Follow the on-screen instructions to install the driver.
- When finished, click START and locate the newly installed software "Stop Sime II" and select "Firmware Download".

RESETTING THE UNIT

To reset the unit, open the top cover, remove the battery for a few seconds and then replace it. This will reset the unit but all the default settings (i.e. Radio Presets, Play mode, Equalizer, Contrast, Power Savings, etc.) will be saved in the unit.
