## 9. VENTILATION



## **PRECAUTIONS**

## **NOTES ON HANDLING:**

- When shipping this unit, always use the original shipping carton and packing materials. For maximum protection, repack the unit as it was originally packed at the factory.
- Do not use volatile liquids, such as insect spray, near the player. Do not leave rubber or plastic products in contact with the DVD player for a long time. They will leave marks on the finish.
- The top and rear panels of the player may become warm after a long period of use. This is normal and not a malfunction.
- When the player is not in use, be sure to remove the disc and turn off the power.
- If you do not use the player for a long period, the unit may not function properly in the future. Turn on and use the player occasionally.

## NOTES ON LOCATING THE UNIT:

 When you place this unit near another TV or a radio, the playback picture may become poor and the sound may be distorted. In this case, move the player away from the other TV or the radio.

## **NOTES ON CLEANING:**

## Use a soft, dry cloth for cleaning.

- For stubborn dirt, soak the cloth in a weak detergent solution, wring well and wipe. Use a dry cloth to wipe it dry. Do not use any type of solvent, such as thinner and benzene, as they may damage the surface of the player.
- If you use a chemical-saturated cloth to clean the unit, follow that product's instructions.

**Warning:** Cleaning and adjustment of lenses and/or other components of playback mechanism should be performed by a qualified service technician.

## TO OBTAIN A CLEAR PICTURE:

The DVD player is a high technology, precision device. If the optical pick-up lens and disc drive parts are dirty or worn down, the picture quality becomes poor. To obtain a clear picture, we recommend regular inspection and maintenance (cleaning or parts replacement) every 1,000 hours of use depending on the operating environment. For details, contact your nearest dealer.

## **NOTES ON MOISTURE CONDENSATION:**

# Moisture condensation damages this unit. Please read the following carefully.

 Moisture condensation occurs, for example, when you pour a cold drink into a glass on a warm day. Drops of water form on the outside of the glass. In the same way, moisture may condense on the optical pick-up lens inside this unit, one of the most crucial internal parts of the player.

# Moisture condensation occurs during the following cases:

- When you bring this unit directly from a cold place to a warm place.
- When you use this unit in a room where you just turned on the heater, or a place where the cold wind from the air conditioner directly hits the unit.
- In summer, when you use this unit in a hot and humid place just after you moved this unit from an air conditioned room.
- When you use this unit in a humid place.

# Do not use this unit when moisture condensation may occur.

 If you use this unit in such a situation, it may damage discs and internal parts. Remove the disc, connect the power cord of this unit to the wall outlet, turn on this unit and leave it "ON" for two or three hours. After two or three hours, this unit will have warmed up and evaporated any moisture. Keep this unit connected to the wall outlet and moisture condensation will seldom occur.


Insert the small end of the AC adapter into the jack on the rear of the unit. Insert the other end (with the 2 blades) into a conveniently located AC outlet having 120V AC, 60Hz.


## INSTALLATION

## **INSTALLING THE UNIT UNDER A CABINET**


The suggested mounting position of the unit is under a wall cabinet, but it can be installed under many areas. There should be at least 2-1/2" distance between the unit and the wall to allow for connections and ventilation.

#### **IMPORTANT NOTES:**


- · Since the unit is rather heavy, be careful while mounting.
- To reduce risk of fire, do not place any heating or cooking appliance beneath the unit, especially while the LCD screen is open.
- Mount the unit so that its AC adapter can be plugged directly to a wall outlet.
- Do not use a converter or extension cord.



Cut the template and place inside the cabinet with the template border marked "FRONT" along the front edge of the cabinet, then use adhesive tape to fix the template. Drill four 1/4" diameter holes as shown on the template. Remove template when finished.




If the cabinet bottom is 3/4" thick, then use the spacers turned upwards as shown.




With a screwdriver (not an electric screwdriver or drill), fasten the four screws into the spacer holder holes (or fasten the screw to your set if spacers were not needed). Start screwing at two opposite corners of the unit for better support.


- Install the unit as far as possible from a source of noise; i.e., a refrigerator, microwave oven, fluorescent lamp, etc.
- · Please allow ample space on each side for the speakers.
- Keep unit away when drilling to avoid getting wood shavings in the ventilation holes.
- Drill from bottom up if there is not enough room in the cabinet.



Measure the height of the cabinet bottom and overhang. If the cabinet bottom is 1" thick, then the spacers are not necessary, use screws only as shown.




If the cabinet bottom is 3/8" to 1/2" thick, then use the spacers turned downwards as shown.



Push the release latch, pull down the screen to a maximum of 180° and rotate.







## **BATTERY INSTALLATION**




- 1. Remove the Battery Compartment by pressing in on the tab and pushing out.
- 2. Install a CR2025 battery, paying attention to the polarity diagram in the Battery Compartment.
- 3. Replace the Battery Compartment.

## **BATTERY PRECAUTIONS**

Follow these precautions when using a battery in this device:

- 1. Warning-Danger of explosion if battery is incorrectly replaced. Replace only with the same or equivalent type.
- 2. Use only the size and type of battery specified.
- 3. Be sure to follow the correct polarity when installing the battery as indicated next to the battery compartment. A reversed battery may cause damage to the device.
- 4. If the device is not to be used for a long period of time, remove the battery to prevent damage or injury from possible battery leakage.
- 5. Do not try to recharge a battery not intended to be recharged; it can overheat and rupture. (Follow battery manufacturer's directions.)


## **NOTES:**

## **ANTENNA CONNECTIONS**

#### AM ANTENNA:

Connect the black AM Loop Antenna wire to the black AM Antenna terminal and the white AM Loop Antenna wire to the white AM Antenna terminal.




Extend the AM Loop Antenna wire.



Connect the AM Loop Antenna's black wire to the black terminal and the white wire to the white terminal at the rear of the main unit. Make sure the wires are inserted correctly into the terminals as shown.



At the bottom of the AM Loop Antenna, rotate the stand to the rear and then push the stand to the front.



Insert the tabs into the gaps in the stand. Remember to fully extend the AM Loop Antenna wire and locate it away from the main unit, AC adaptor and other equipment for better reception and to prevent interference.

## **FM ANTENNA:**

For best FM reception, extend the FM Wire Antenna to its full length


## **NOTES:**

- To improve the AM signal, move the AM Loop Antenna away from the system, AC Adaptor and other equipment.
- To improve FM signal, extend FM antenna fully and keep the FM antenna as horizontal as possible after connection.

## **OUTDOOR VHF/UHF ANTENNA CONNECTION (ANTENNA NOT INCLUDED)**

Follow the instructions for the type of antenna system you intend to use.

## Combination VHF/UHF Antenna (Single 75 ohm cable or 300 ohm twin-lead wire)




Connect the 75 ohm cable from combination VHF/UHF antenna to the antenna jack.

#### OR


If your combination antenna has a 300 ohm twin-lead wire, use a 300-75 ohm matching transformer (NOT SUPPLIED).

## Combination VHF/UHF Antenna (Separate VHF and UHF 300 ohm twin-leads)



Connect the UHF twin-lead wire to a combiner (NOT SUPPLIED). Connect the VHF twin-lead to a 300-75 ohm matching transformer (NOT SUPPLIED). Attach the transformer to the combiner. Attach the combiner to the antenna jack.

## Separate VHF/UHF Antennas




Connect the 75 ohm cable from the VHF antenna and the UHF antenna twin-lead wire to a combiner (NOT SUPPLIED). Attach the combiner to the antenna jack. **NOTE:** If your VHF antenna has a twin-lead wire, use a 300-75 ohm matching transformer, then connect the transformer to the combiner.

## **CONNECTION USING AUDIO/VIDEO CABLES:**


Follow the instructions below to connect an external unit, such as a VCR or second DVD player, to your unit using Audio/Video cables. (CABLES NOT INCLUDED.)




- 1. Connect the cable, satellite or incoming antenna to the VHF/UHF IN jack on the rear of the VCR.
- 2. Connect the left and right audio cable from the external unit's Audio OUT jacks to this unit's AUDIO IN jacks. Connect the external unit's Video OUT jack to this unit's VIDEO IN jack.
- 3. Press the AUX button on the remote to select the auxiliary input ("AUX IN" will appear in the display) and press PLAY on the external unit.

## **ADJUSTING THE SCREEN**

Adjust the 8" TFT LCD screen as follows:



Push the area as shown in the step above and pull down the screen to a maximum of 180°.



Rotate the screen to a maximum viewing angle of 270°.




## **DVD**

Data on most DVDs is divided into sections called "titles" and then into subsections called "chapters", each of which is given a title or chapter number. Some features of this DVD player will not operate with some DVD discs as they are preset. If a function you selected does not run as desired, refer to the manual accompanying the DVD disc.



## **AUDIO CD**

Data on an audio CD is divided into sections called "tracks", each of which is given a track number.



#### MP3 CD

When playing an MP3, the selected file will appear in the display and the unit will list the folders/tracks. MP3 is the abbreviation of "MPEG1 Audio Layer 3". MPEG Audio is a format that compresses the audio portion only. **IMPORTANT NOTES:**


With the power on, press and hold the CLOCK button; the hours digits will blink in the display.




Within five seconds, press the Navigation  $\blacktriangle$  **1** and/or  $\blacktriangledown$  **2** button to set the current hour. Make sure to set the correct AM/PM setting.



Press the CLOCK button again; the minute digits will blink.



Press the Navigation  $\blacktriangle$  0 and/or  $\blacktriangledown$  2 button to set the current minute.



Press the CLOCK button again and the clock will be set.



## WHAT IS CLOSED CAPTIONING?

This unit has the capability to decode and display Closed Captioned television programs. Closed Captioning will display text on the screen for hearing-impaired viewers or it will translate and display text in another language.

## **CLOSED CAPTIONING WITH A VCR**

Closed Captioned programs can be recorded and played back on a VCR with the Closed Captioned text intact. The Closed Captioned text will disappear during Cue (Fast Forward Search), Review (Rewind Search) and Pause modes or if the VCR tracking is not adjusted properly.

## **ANALOG CAPTIONS**

Please see the next page for setting the Analog Caption.

**CC1:** This Closed Caption mode will display text on the screen in English or another language. Generally, Closed Captions in English are transmitted on Captions 1.

**CC2-4** These Closed Caption modes will display text on the screen in English or another language. Generally, Closed Captions in another language is transmitted on these channels.

**TEXT:** The Text Closed Caption Modes will usually fill the screen with a programming schedule or other information. Select T1, T2, T3 or T4.

## **DIGITAL CAPTIONS**

Please see the next page for setting the Digital Caption.

**SERVICE 1-6:** These Closed Caption modes will display text on the screen in English or another language. Generally, Closed Captions in English are transmitted on Service 1 and Closed Captions in other languages are transmitted on Service 2 through 6.

After selecting a Closed Caption Mode, it will stay in effect until it is changed, even if the channel is changed. If the Captions signal is lost due to a commercial or a break in the signal, the Captions will reappear when the signal is received again. If the channels are changed, the Captions will be delayed approximately 10 seconds.

The Captions will appear in places on the screen where they will least interfere with the picture, usually on the bottom of the screen. News programs will usually show three-line Closed Captions which scroll onto the screen. Most other shows provide two or three lined Captions placed near the character who is speaking so the viewer can follow the dialogue.

Words in italics or underlined describe titles, words in foreign languages or words requiring emphasis. Words that are sung usually appear enclosed by musical notes.

For television programs broadcasting with Closed Captions, look in your TV guide for the Closed Captions symbol (CC).

#### NOTES:

- When selecting Closed Captions, the captioning will be delayed approximately 10 seconds.
- Misspellings or unusual characters may occasionally appear during Closed Captioning. This is normal with Closed Captioning, especially with live programs. This is because during live programs, captions are also entered live. These transmissions do not allow time for editing.
- When Captions are being displayed, on-screen displays, such as Mute, may not be seen or may interfere with Closed Captions.
- Some cable systems and copy protection systems may interfere with the Closed Captioned signal.
- If using an indoor antenna or if TV reception is very poor, the Closed Caption Decoder may not appear or may appear with strange characters or misspelled words. In this case, adjust the antenna for better reception or use an outdoor antenna.

#### FAQs:

When I press the MUTE button, the captions do not appear, is this normal?

Yes, this is normal for this unit. Once the display information disappears, the captions will continue.

I entered the Captions mode, but no captions are appearing, why?



# MP3 FAQs (Frequently Asked Questions) Please read before playing an MP3 disc.

What is an MP3 file?

An MP3 file is a computer format that makes a usually large music file into a smaller one which is more convenient to download and share.

Can I record my own MP3 CDs?

Yes, but you need a CD recorder, which is available from your local computer store.

Where can I find MP3 files?

MP3 files are available on the Internet.

Can this unit read regular music CDs?

Yes, it can. However, you cannot mix MP3s and WAV files on the same CD. If you do this, the CD Player will play only the MP3 files. Can I use the MP3 extension for non-audio data files?

No, this may result in serious malfunction and harmful noise interference.


Can I mix MP3 files with other file types on the CDR?

Yes, but your CD player will ignore those files and read only the MP3 files on the CDR.


Does this unit support subdirectories (subfolders)?

Yes, it can read MP3 files from subfolders.


### PICTURE CD OPERATION



Press the Power button **1** to turn on the unit; the STANDBY indicator will go out. Press the DISC button **2** to select the DVD mode.




Press the OPEN/CLOSE button to open the compartment. Insert an picture CD with the label side facing up into the disc tray. Press the OPEN/CLOSE button to close the compartment.



After loading a picture CD, the pictures will automatically show as a slideshow on the screen. (If playback does not start automatically, press the ENTER/Play/Pause ( $\blacktriangleright II$ ) button  $\bullet$  to start playback.) Press the Navigation  $\blacktriangleright$ /Search  $\blacktriangleright$  or Navigation  $\blacktriangleleft$ /Search  $\bullet$  buttons  $\bullet$  to select the next or previous picture. After the slideshow is done, it will go to thumbnail view. You can press the Stop ( $\blacksquare$ ) button  $\bullet$  to stop the slideshow before it is finished; then the thumbnail view will appear. In thumbnail view, you can press the Navigation ( $\blacktriangleleft$ , $\blacktriangleright$ , $\blacktriangle$ , $\blacktriangledown$ ) button  $\bullet$  to select the desired picture or go to the next/previous page. Select the desired picture and then press the ENTER/Play/Pause ( $\blacktriangleright II$ ) button  $\bullet$  to view it.

#### ADJUSTING THE PICTURE




Press the BAND button  $\bullet$  on the main unit repeatedly to select one of the video options, BRIGHTNESS, Saturation and Screen type (Wide Screen or normal). Adjust as desired using the Navigation ( $\blacktriangleleft$ , $\blacktriangleright$ ) buttons  $\bullet$ .

#### **NOTES:**

- You can rotate the picture on-screen using the Navigation (◄,►, ▲,▼) buttons during slideshow playback.
- Press the CLOCK button to show the time in the display.

#### PLAYBACK OF A UNIT CONNECTED TO THE AV JACKS




Press the POWER button **1** to turn on the unit. Press the AUX button **2** to select the AV mode and then start playback of the AV unit.




# **CARE AND MAINTENANCE**

#### **Caring for Discs**

 Treat the disc carefully. Handle the disc only by its edges. Never allow your fingers to come in contact with the shiny, unprinted side of the disc.



- Do not attach adhesive tape, stickers, etc. to the disc label.
- Clean the disc periodically with a soft, lint-free, dry cloth. Never use detergents or abrasive cleaners to clean the disc. If necessary, use a CD cleaning kit.
- If a disc skips or gets stuck on a section of the disc, it is probably dirty or damaged (scratched).
- When cleaning the disc, wipe in straight lines from the center of the disc to the outer edge of the disc. Never wipe in circular motions.



- · Discs should be stored in their cases after each use to avoid damage.
- Do not expose discs to direct sunlight, high humidity, high temperatures or dust, etc. Prolonged exposure or extreme temperatures can warp the disc.
- Do not stick or write anything on either side of the disc. Sharp writing instruments, or the ink, may damage the surface.

#### **Cleaning the Unit**

- To prevent fire or shock hazard, disconnect your unit from the AC power source when cleaning.
- The finish on your unit may be cleaned with a dust cloth and cared for as other furniture. Use caution when cleaning and wiping the plastic parts.
- Mild soap and a damp cloth may be used on the front panel.
