
Install Batteries



- 1. Pull lock tab down and lift door up (towards you) to remove battery
- Insert four "AAA" batteries. Position batteries according to polarity markings.

Note: When batteries are low or need charging the BATTLOW indicator will blink. Replace alkaline batteries.





Operation

Turning On Your Unit

Rotate ON - OFF Volume Control "clockwise"

An audible "TONE" will indicate the unit is on and then the LCD will go through a 3 second self-test and then go to operational mode.






Operational Mode

Note: Whenever the unit is on, you can receive communications.

Auto Battery Power Saver

Your unit has a unique circuit designed to extend battery life. If there are no transmissions within 5 seconds, the unit will automatically switch to battery save mode.




Note: The Auto Battery Save Circuit does not effect the unit's ability to receive incoming transmissions.

Select Main Channel (1-14)

Rotate ON - OFF Volume Control "clockwise"

1.) An audible "tone" will indicate the unit is on and then the LCD will go through a 3 second self-test and then go to operational mode.



2.) Select channel by pushing and releasing Channel (Up/Down) buttons.

Channel Scan

Push and hold the **Channel** (Up/Down) buttons for fast channel advance To stop Channel Scan, press **PTT** or **Enter** button.

Note:


- 1) Unit must be on same channel and subchannels to communicate
- 2) Channels 8-12 generally are less used and give better results for communications in most areas.

Operation

Select CTCSS Subchannel (00-38)


The CTCSS Subchannel allows the user to utilize a less used channel range (00-38) within a main channel.

- Rotate ON OFF Volume Control "clockwise".
 An audible "tone" will indicate the unit is on and then the LCD will go through a 3 second self-test and then go to operational mode.
- 2.) Select main channel by pushing and releasing **Channel** (Up/Down) buttons.


3.) Push and release **FUNC**, button. Small numbers flash next to channel display on LCD.




Note: CTCSS (Continuous Tone Controlled Squelch System) is an advanced subcoding system that allows segmentation of a main channel.

Operation

4.) Select subchannel number by pushing and release Channel buttons.




 When desired subchannel is displayed push and release Enter button.




Calling Another Party

To alert another party that you wish to communicate:

 Turn on your MK 1970 2-way radio. An audible "tone" will indicate the unit is on. The LCD will go through a 3 second self test and then to operational mode.




2.) Select desired channel by pushing and releasing Channel buttons.



Note: Both the calling and receiving units must be on same channel and subchannel for the call function to work

Operation

3.) Push and release Call Button. The J indicator icon will flash and the icon will remain on for 3 seconds. The unit you are calling will hear a 2 second ring tone.



Note: Your incoming "Call" audio ringing level is dependent on your unit's volume setting.


4.) Wait for the party's response or proceed to "Talking To Another Party" section on next page.

Talking to another party


To send your outgoing message:

Internal VOX function

1.) Turn on your MK 1970 2-way radio. An audible "tone" will indicate the unit is on. The LCD will go through a 3 second self test and then to operational mode with Internal VOX function.



2.) Push and hold PTT button or speak to microphone.



Note: While PTT button is depressed you cannot receive incoming calls.


Internal VOX function cannot disable.

Operation

3.) The 🦹 icon will appear.



- 4.) Hold mic about 2 inches from mouth. Speaker in a normal voice.
- 5.) Release PTT button and listen for response.



Note: When you release the PTT button, the person you are talking to will hear a tone indicating that it's ok to talk. See talk Confirmation Tone section.


Talk Confirmation Tone


Your listener will hear an audible tone when you release the PTT button. This alerts the other party that you are finished talking and it's OK for them to begin talking.

To set tone press and hold **Enter** button for 2 seconds. \mathcal{F} icon appears. To cancel press and hold **Enter** button again. \mathcal{F} icon disappears

Listening For Another Party

When finished talking





1.) Release PTT button to receive incoming transmissions.

Your MK 1970 is always in listening mode when the PTT button is not pressed and you are not in function mode. See Advanced Features section.

Note: While PTT button is depressed you cannot receive incoming calls.


Operation

Auto Squelch

Your MK 1970 is equipped with Auto Squelch, which automatically shuts off weak transmissions and unwanted noise due to terrain conditions or if you have reached your range limit.

Monitor

Auto squelch can be temporarity removed to allow all signals to enter by pressing the **M** button (Monitor).




1.) Push and hold the **M** button allow all signals to enter.

External Microphone / Speaker Jack


External Microphone Jack (Activate Voice Activation Function)

Your MK 1970 can be fitted with an external microphone freeing your hands for other tasks. To attach the external microphone.

1.) Open Mic/Spkr tab on top of unit.



2.) Insert jack into the Mic port. Voice-activation function will automatically turn ON.



3.) Unplug Mic. plug to activate internal voice-activated hand-free transmission. (Internal VOX)


Note: External microphone and external speaker is not included with this unit

Advanced Features

Lock Function

The purpose of the LOCK function is to lock most buttons to avoid accidental operation.

To engage the LOCK function:



- 1) Push and hold Lock button for 2 seconds. ← icon appears. Most buttons are locked.
- 2) To "unlock" push and hold **Lock** button for 2 seconds again. Button are "unlock" and •• icon disappears.


Note: Call button, Monitor button and PTT button do not lock are fully operational while the unit is locked. The unit cannot lock while in function mode.

Note:

In case you hear "beep "while beep indicator does not show on the LCD Display, turn off and turn on the unit for reset

Advanced Features

BEEP Function



Set Beep

- 1.) Press the Function button.
- 2.) Press the Lock button. BEEP icon appears.
- 3.) Press the Enter button to turn on BEEP.

Cancel Beep

- 1.) Press the Function button.
- 2.) Press the Lock button. BEEP icon disappears.
- 3.) Press the Enter button to turn off BEEP.



Lamp Control

The lamp is used to illuminate the Liquid Crystal Display. It turns ON every time you press the MONITOR button. The lamp will go out after 3 seconds.



If you press the MONITOR button while the lamp is currently ON, the lamp will discontinue to illuminate. Press the MONITOR button again and the lamp will once again illuminate for 3 seconds. *Note:*

The amount of power consumed with lamp continuously ON is slightly more than with lamp OFF.
