## Operating safety

Warning

Any alterations made to electronic components and the software can cause malfunctions.

The radio, amplifier, CD changer, satellite radio, telephone*, navigation module and voice control system* are interconnected. When one of the components is not operational or has not been removed/replaced properly, the function of other components may be impaired.

This condition might seriously impair the operating safety of your vehicle.

We recommend that you have any service work on electronic components carried out only by qualified personnel.
Warning
In order to avoid distraction which could
lead to an accident, the driver should enter
system settings with the vehicle at a stand-
still and operate the system only when road
and traffic conditions permit.
Bear in mind that at a speed of just
30 mp/h (approximately $50 \mathrm{~km} / \mathrm{h}$ ), your car
is covering a distance of 44 feet (approxima-
tely 14 m) every second.
COMAND supplies you with information to
help you select your route more easily and
guide you conveniently and safely to your
destination. For safety reasons, we encoura-
ge the driver to stop the vehicle in a safe
place before answering or placing a call, or
consulting the COMAND screen to read na-
vigational maps, instructions, or downloa-
ded information.

While the navigation system provides directional assistance, the driver must remain focused on safe driving behavior, including attention to traffic and street signs, and should utilize the system's audio cues while driving.

The navigation system does not supply any information on stop signs, yield signs, traffic regulations or traffic safety rules. This always remains your personal responsibility when you drive. DVD maps do not cover all areas nor all routes within an area.

## Calling up main menus

- Press Audio.

Satellite radio ( $\triangleright$ page 92):

- Press

SAT

Telephone* ( $\triangleright$ page 108):

- Press tel

Navigation ( $\triangleright$ page 130):

- Press NaV.

Service ( $\triangleright$ page 184):

- Press serv.


## Menu display

A display may consist of three areas.
Example: FM menu

(1) Soft key sections
(2) Main area
(3) Status bar

The functions currently assigned to the soft keys are displayed in the soft key sections (1).

## (i)

A maximum of five soft keys may be displayed on each side of the main area (2).

## Menu system

The main area (2) shows messages and settings.
You can change the settings by operating the system.

The status bar (3) is divided into three areas.

Left side:
The current operating mode is indicated. In this example: Radio

## Center:

The status of the current operating mode or other selectable functions are indicated.

In this example:

- $F M=$ current waveband
- 9 = memory location of station, e.g. "9"

Right side:
General status information is indicated independent of the operating mode.
In this example:

- Ready = Telephone* is ready for operation
- $\square \square \square]=$ Reception strength of the mobile phone


## Menu functions and submenus

Using the soft keys, functions can be switched ON or OFF, or submenus can be called up.

Example: Radio main menu:


- The FM/AM soft key switches between FM and AM band.
- The Scan soft key starts/stops the channel scan.

In some situations, soft keys may not have any function and are not operational. A soft key without function appears shaded out.

## Exiting from submenus

Use the Back soft key to exit a submenu.
The display switches to the next higher menu level.
The system will save all changes you have made. There are exceptions in which pressing the Back soft key will not result in the settings being saved. The exceptions are expressly described on the following pages.

You have the following options to control the system:

- at the COMAND
- at the multifunction steering wheel (refer to vehicle Operator's Manual)
- using the Voice control system* (refer to separate operating instructions for further information)

This Operator's Manual describes the control at the COMAND.
Unless otherwise indicated, the descriptions and illustrations refer to the COMAND.

## Switching the COMAND control unit on and off

## Switching on

- Turn the key in the steering column lock to position 1 or 2.
or
- Press -wr

In both cases, the system will activate the operating mode which was active when the system was switched off.

If the key is not in the steering lock in position 1 or 2 , the system will automatically stop after around 30 minutes. A warning is displayed prior to the system switching off.

## Switching off

- Turn the key in the steering column lock to position 0 and pull the key out.
or
- Press -wis.


## Volume

The volume is adjusted jointly for the telephone*, the navigation system and the Voice control system.

The volume setting applies to other operating modes as well: Radio, CD, CD changer, MP3-CD and DVD.

When you adjust the volume, the system will automatically store the setting for the current operating mode. The volume for the navigation announcements can only be changed while an announcement is being made.

## Adjusting the volume

- At the COMAND, turn the rotary control at the key.
or
- Press $\boldsymbol{+}$ or $\boldsymbol{-}$ on the multifunction steering wheel.

The volume is turned up or down depending on the direction of rotation or the key pressed.
The system remembers the volume setting when it is switched off.
When the system is switched on again, the volume may be lower than at the time when the system was switched OFF.

This will be the case when the volume was adjusted to a value outside a certain range when the system was switched off.

The automatic volume control feature adjusts the volume depending on:

- vehicle speed


## or

- ambient noise inside the vehicle
- other parameters (e.g. windows open or closed)

Different balance settings can be set for navigation and telephone*.

The balance settings for navigation announcements are described at "Audio settings for the navigation announcements" ( $\triangleright$ page 133).

When you change balance settings, the system will automatically save the settings for the current operating mode and others.

In Radio, CD, CDC, MP3-CD, DVD or satellite radio operation:

- Press the Balance soft key.

Cross-hairs are displayed. The horizontal line indicates the balance setting. You can now make balance settings.

Quick reference COMAND

- Press $\boldsymbol{4}$ or $\boldsymbol{\nu}$.

Move the cross-hairs horizontally and adjust the balance.

- Press $\circledast$ or the Back soft key. or
- Wait until the display changes.

The new setting is saved.

Different bass and treble settings are possible for the following operating modes:

- Radio operation (FM and AM band)
- Single CD operation (CD ©)
- $\quad C D$ changer operation (CD ©))
- MP3-CD operation
- DVD operation
- Satellite radio operation
- Navigation operation

The Bass/Treble settings for navigation announcements are described at "Audio settings for the navigation announcements" ( $\triangleright$ page 133).

When you adjust Bass or Treble, the system will automatically save the settings for the current operating mode.

In Radio, CD, CDC, MP3-CD, DVD or satellite radio operation:

- Press the Bass or Treble soft key.

The Bass or Treble menu will appear. You can now make bass or treble settings ( $\triangleright$ page 38).

- Press $\boldsymbol{\square}$ or $\boldsymbol{\nabla}$.

Bass or Treble is adjusted.

The sound functions will be available for the following operating modes.

- Radio operation
- Single CD operation (CD ©)
- $\quad C D$ changer operation (CD ©))
- MP3-CD operation
- DVD operation

The following sound functions are available:

- Factory Setting: COMAND set the sound functions to factory setting for the active source mode.
- Default: COMAND set the sound linear for the center of the vehicle.
- Speech optimized:

Playback optimized for language comprehensibility.
You can use different sound functions for the modes mentioned above.

Example:
For CD operation the function Default, for DVD operation the function Speech optimized.

In Radio, CD, CDC, MP3-CD, DVD or satellite radio operation:

- Activate the main menu for the respective operating mode ( $\triangleright$ page 31).
- Press the Sound soft key. The Sound menu appears.

- If an audio submenu is displayed, press the Back soft key until the Audio menu is displayed.
or
- Press AUDIO again.


## Selecting an audio source

- In the Audio menu, press the soft key for the desired audio source, e.g. Radio.


## Muting

## Switching On

- Press mute.

The system mutes the active audio source.

## Switching off

- Press mute again.
or
- Press Audio, sat , -seek or seekt or any of the available soft keys for the active audio source.

## Weather Band (WB)

- In the FM or AM Radio main menu, press the WB soft key.

An automatic scan is starting and the COMAND plays and displays the first strong WB station.

## Automatic seek tuning

- Press -seek or seekt.
or
- Press $\boldsymbol{\Delta}$ or $\boldsymbol{\nabla}$.

FM and AM Bands, Weather Band (WB)
The radio will tune in to the next receivable station (FM, AM) or channel (WB) with descending/ascending frequency depending on the direction of seek.

WB
Alternatively, you can select the channel directly:

- Press a number keythrough R 7 Res. (1)

The selected channel is not shown in the status line.

## Manual tuning (FM, AM)

- Activate the desired wave band ( $\triangleright$ page 43).
- Press -seek or SEEKt longer than 2 seconds.

The function is active.
or

- Press $\boldsymbol{4}$ or $\boldsymbol{\nabla}$

The frequency will change by the tuning increments for the respective
waveband each time one of the buttons is pressed.

## FM Band

The frequency displayed will change in increments of 0.2 MHz .

## AM Band

Tuning will take place in increments of 10 kHz.

## Station selection via number keypad (presets)

## FM and AM Bands

- Press one of the number keys, such as ABC briefly.

The radio will tune to the frequency assigned to that memory location. If none has been set by you, the radio will not change the station.

FM and AM presets are independent and can only be accessed while in the corresponding band.

Saving stations for FM and AM ( $\triangleright$ page 48).

## Station selection via direct frequency entry (FM, AM)

E.g.: 102.7 MHz in the FM band

- Activate the desired waveband ( $\triangleright$ page 43).
- Press $\square$
An input line will appear.
- Enter the desired frequency with the number keys within 8 seconds, e.g.


The station you have selected will begin to play.

## FM, AM band

Entries outside the frequency range are not possible.

If you do not make another entry within 8 seconds, the function will be canceled and you will listen to the station last tuned to.

## Automatic station scan (FM, AM)

The stations in a given waveband (FM, AM) can be scanned one after the other for 8 seconds each.

The scan function stops automatically when the first station received has been scanned twice.

1
Station scan performs two runs. During the first run, stations with good reception are played. During the second run, stations with weaker reception are played.

## Start scan function

- Activate the desired wave band ( $\triangleright$ page 43).
- Press the Scan soft key.

The scan function will begin. Scan will appear in black lettering.

## End scan function and play a station

- Press the Scan soft key again if you hear the desired station.

## Multi session CDs

With multisession CDs, the content of the first session determines how COMAND treats the CD.

For example, if the first session contains data in audio CD format and the second session contains data in MP3 format, COMAND will treat the CD as a conventional audio CD.

File structure
When creating a MP3 CD, you can organize MP3 tracks into folders. A folder can also contain additional folders.
A CD may have a maximum of 255 folders in total.
A maximum of 255 tracks are permissible per folder.
Mathematically a maximum of 65025 tracks would result. However, this amount is usually not reached since MP3 requires approx. 1 MB storage per minute recorded. Therefore a maximum of 1000 tracks will be displayed by COMAND.

Track names and folder names
When creating an MP3 CD, you can assign names to the MP3 tracks and folders.
COMAND uses these names in MP3 mode for the corresponding display.

Please note the following when assigning folder and track names:

- Track and folder names must contain at least 1 character.
- Track names may contain up to fifty characters. If a name exceeds this character limit, COMAND will not be able to display it in full.
- Track names must have the extension "mp3".
- A period must appear between the track name and the file extension.

Example of a correct track name: Track 1.mp3

Empty folders or folders containing data other than MP3 tracks will not be displayed by COMAND.
If MP3 or audio CD files are stored in the root directory itself, the root directory also counts as a folder. COMAND will then display the root directory name as a folder name.

## Permissible MP3 formats

COMAND supports the MPEG 1
AudioLayer3 format.

In everyday speech, this format has been replaced by the designation "MP3".

## Permissible bit and scan rates

- Scan rates from $24 \mathrm{kHz}-48 \mathrm{kHz}$

It is recommended to use MP3 tracks with a bit rate of 128 kbps or higher and with a scan rate of 44.1 kHz or higher. Lower rates may impair quality.

## Tips on copyright

The music tracks that you can create for play back in MP3 mode are generally copyright-protected under applicable international and national laws.

In many countries, the reproduction of copyrighted material is not permitted, even if only for personal use, without the express prior consent of the copyright holder.

Please check the current copyright laws for your country and comply with them.

These restrictions do not apply for example to your own compositions and recordings, or for recordings for which authorization has been obtained from the copyright holder.

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## $\nabla$ DVD operation



In order to avoid distraction which could lead to an accident, the driver should insert DVDs with the vehicle at a standstill and operate the audio system only if permitted by road, weather and traffic conditions.

Bear in mind that at a speed of just 30 mph (approximately $50 \mathrm{~km} / \mathrm{h}$ ), your car covers a distance of 44 feet (approximately 14 m ) every second.


The CD/DVD drive is a Class 1 laser products. There is a danger of invisible laser radiation when you open or damage the cover.

Do not remove the cover. The CD/DVD drive does not contain any parts which can be serviced by the user. For safety reasons, have any necessary service work performed by qualified personnel.

Your CD/DVD drive has been designed to play CDs/DVDs which correspond to the IEC 60908 standard. You can therefore only use CDs with a maximum thickness of 1.3 mm .

If you insert thicker data carriers, e.g. ones that have data on both sides (one side with DVD data, the other side with audio data), they cannot be ejected and will damage the drive.

## Automatic screen off

The COMAND system is capable of playing DVDs. However, in order to avoid driver distraction, the video function is disabled and no images will be shown on the COMAND screen.

The COMAND system is capable of playing DVDs. However, in order to avoid driver distraction, the video function is disabled and no images will be shown on the COMAND screen.

## Changing the aspect ratio

The system will automatically select the appropriate aspect ratio when a DVD is played back.
You can manually change the aspect ratio during playback of the DVD. To do this, use the top left soft key. The soft key changes each time you press it.

The soft key indicates the aspect ratio to which you will change when you press the soft key.
Zoom is useful to watch movies in cinematic aspect ratio. You can use the function to reduce the width of the black bars at the top and bottom.

In this case, select the camera view in the DVD menu.

Some DVDs supporting different camera views don't offer a switch option. In this case, select the camera view in the Settings menu.

The respective setting is changed.

## Selecting a movie

If several movies are on the DVD, you can select a movie directly.

Service might also not be available in certain places (e.g., in tunnels, parking garages, or within or next to buildings) or near other technologies.

If the Satellite radio function has not yet been subscribed to or not subscribed again, you have to contact the satellite radio service provider.

One of the two following screens will appear:

- the Service information display

The Satellite radio main menu displays the Weather channel. You cannot select any other station.

In chapter "Telephone", you will find detailed information regarding the telephone*, including emergency call.

Radio transmitters, such as a portable telephone or a citizens band unit should only be used inside the vehicle if they are connected to a separate exterior antenna that has been approved by Mercedes-Benz.

If you have a Mercedes-Benz specified integrated mobile telephone (TDMA/ CDMA or GSM) and the telephone is inserted in the cradle, the telephone functions can be used as follows:

- at the COMAND
- at the multifunction steering wheel
- with the Voice control system*

This instruction manual describes the operation at the COMAND. Unless otherwise indicated, the descriptions and illustrations refer to the COMAND.
Operation at the mobile phone and operation with the Voice control system* are described in separate operating guides. Refer to the vehicle Operator's Manual for operation of the telephone using the multifunction steering wheel.

Which soft key functions are available depends on the mobile phone variant.

## i

In certain menus, the COMAND can display date and time of the calls.

The COMAND can display phone number and name of the other party (e.g. if the COMAND detects an incoming call, but also in other menus). For the number to be displayed, the number information must be transmitted with the incoming call. The same goes for the name display which additionally requires that the caller's number and name are saved in the phone book.

No ring or DTMF tones will be heard when a phone set to silent mode is inserted into the cradle.
For ringtone settings, refer to the separate operating instructions for the mobile phone.

- Please read the chapter "Telephone" first before attempting to operate your telephone.
- Please also read the important notes in the telephone and Voice control system* operating manuals.
- Always drive with extreme caution when you operate the telephone hands-free.
- For safety reasons, you should not use the mobile telephone handset to make a call while driving the vehicle.

If the signal strength is very weak (display in the symbol bar of all menus):
Wait until reception improves before making a call.

- Close the windows and reduce all outside noise as much as possible when you use hands-free operation.

- Also make sure that the air vents are not pointed in the direction of the microphones located in the overhead control panel near the rear view mirror. Adjust air vents and/or reduce blower speed if necessary.
- A brief disconnection from the cellular network is not a malfunction, as this can occur when the network switches areas. The phone will automatically try to sign on to a network again.
- If the message Enter Unlock Code: appears, enter the unlock code to enable all telephone functions ( $\triangleright$ page 104). If you do not do so, only the emergency call (911) is available.

GSM mobile phone

- If the message Enter PIN: on the COMAND appears, enter the PIN-code to enable the telephone functions ( $\triangleright$ page 104). If you do not do so, only the emergency (911) call is available on the COMAND.

In the following situations, it is not possible or not yet possible to use the telephone:

- The telephone is already unlocked but is not or not yet registered in the network.

The message no Serv. appears in the status bar. The telephone will try to register into an existing network. If the network is available, the telephone will be ready for use.

The above message also appears

- if the network is no longer available due to weak signals
- if you try to make a call (message Service Unavailable appears for 8 seconds)
- The message Activating Telephone Please Wait appears.
COMAND prepares the telephone for use. Select other system functions, e.g. radio, by pressing the corresponding button or wait until the telephone is active.
- The message Telephone Unavai1 able appears if telephone* is not installed or a malfunction has occured.

Please contact an authorized Mercedes-Benz Center.

- The message Telephone Not Inserted appears if the mobile phone is not inserted in the cradle.

Please connect the mobile phone.

Depending on power state of the phone it may take up to 8 seconds from phone insertion until this message disappears (e.g. if a powered-off phone is inserted).

GSM mobile phone

- If the message Check SIM Card (Emergency Call "911" Only Possible With Tel.):
- Insert the SIM card into the mobile phone (Telephone Operating Manual).

The descriptions and illustrations in this section are based on the use of fully compatible Mercedes-Benz approved mobile phones and cradles that do not utilize Bluetooth ${ }^{\circledR}$ technology to communicate with each other. If your vehicle is equipped with integrated Bluetooth $®$ functionality, a Bluetooth ${ }^{\circledR}$ capable mobile phone, headset, Laptop, PDA, etc. is required to utilize those features.

## Warning

For safety reasons, you should only enter a destination when the vehicle is stationary. When the vehicle is in motion, a passenger should enter the destination. Study manual and select route before driving.

Do not watch display screen or operate buttons while the vehicle is in motion - let voice instructions guide you. Stop at a safe location before using buttons or making corrections.

Traffic regulations always have priority over any route recommendations given.

Bear in mind that at a speed of just 30 mph (approximately $50 \mathrm{~km} / \mathrm{h}$ ), your car is covering a distance of 44 feet (approximately $14 \mathrm{~m})$ every second.

The route calculated by COMAND is a recommendation on how to best reach your selected destination.

During route guidance, you will not receive any information on

- Traffic lights
- Stop and yield signs
- Parking or stopping zones
- One-way streets
- Narrow bridges
- Similar traffic regulation data

You should therefore always strictly observe traffic regulations while driving. Drive carefully and always obey traffic laws and road signs even if they contradict COMAND instructions.

## Warning

The Navigation DVD module contains a Class 1 laser product. There is a danger of invisible laser radiation if the cover is opened or damaged.
Do not remove the cover. The Navigation DVD module does not contain any parts serviceable by the user. For safety reasons, have any necessary service work performed only by qualified personnel.

## Navigation DVD

COMAND calculates the route with the help of data that is stored on the navigation DVD.

Only use Mercedes-Benz navigation DVDs. Using other navigation DVDs or CDs will cause malfunctions and/or damage.

Because of changes in local traffic patterns (e.g. road works) and/or incomplete data, errors in calculation may occur.

As a result, the recommended route may deviate from the ideal route. The data stored on the DVD only reflects local conditions at the time of DVD production. DVD maps do not cover all areas nor all routes within an area.

GPS (Global Positioning System) signals received make it possible to determine the current vehicle position.

Deviations from the actual position may occur

- if the reception of GPS signals is disturbed e.g. in parking garages and tunnels
- if road conditions are bad
- depending on the vehicle's condition

The system will need some time to determine its location after the car has been transported. The time required for the system to do so varies from case to case.

You can only select admissible numbers. The number selected appears magnified.

- Press the Delete soft key if necessary.
The number last entered is deleted.
Selecting a House Number Area


Do not confuse the Delete soft key (deletion of the last character) with the Back soft key (deletion of the complete entry).

- Press ${ }^{*}$ longer than 2 seconds to confirm.

You will hear a confirmation beep if the beep tones option was activated in the system settings ( $\triangleright$ page 217).
The Start Route Guidance menu ( $\triangleright$ page 151 ) or a list for selecting a house number or a house number area will appear.

- Press ©

The Start Route Guidance menu will appear ( $\triangleright$ page 151).

## Entering a parking

After entering the destination street ( $\triangleright$ page 141 ) or selecting a city center ( $\triangleright$ page 140), you can select parking nearby.

Route calculation can take some time, depending on the distance to the destination.

During route calculation, CALC RTE and an arrow pointing towards the destination are displayed.

Route guidance begins when route calculation is complete.

## Recalculating an existing route

The system will calculate a new route during active route guidance if the driver does not follow the route guidance.
NEW RTE is displayed during recalculation. The arrow is not filled out.

## Voice instructions

## Warning

Voice instructions are intended to direct you while driving without diverting your attention from the road and driving.
Always use this feature instead of consulting the map display for directions. Consulting the map displays for directions may cause you to divert your attention from driving and increase the risk of an accident.

After route calculation, the system assists route guidance using pictorial displays ( $\triangleright$ page 152 ) and voice instructions.

## Repeating current voice instructions

If you have not understood a navigation announcement, you can at any time have a current announcement repeated.

- Press RPT.

The current navigation announcement is repeated.

- Press mute.

The current announcement is stopped. You will hear the next navigation announcement normally.

## Switching voice instructions On/Off

## Switching off

- During a navigation announcement press MUTE for 2 seconds.

The message Voice Announcements Muted will appear briefly. Further route guidance takes place using only the symbols in the display. If a new route guidance cycle is started, the announcements are automatically switched on again.

## Partially digitized areas

The digital map may contain areas that are only partially digitized although they are within a digitized region.
Warning

Due to incomplete digitization, the route shown on the map may differ from the actual road/traffic situation.

If you follow the route shown on the map, for example, it is possible that you could drive the wrong way down a one-way street, that a street cannot be driven on or that the road is of questionable quality.

When using route guidance on a unverified road in a partially digitized area, you must therefore be sure to observe all relevant traffic regulations and the course of the road.

Drive carefully and keep in mind that all relevant traffic regulations and the course of the road always take priority over the route shown on the map.

## If the destination is within a partially digitized area

COMAND guides you through fully digitized areas for as long as possible. Route guidance is conducted in the usual manner, i.e. with navigation announcements and route guidance displays.
Before the vehicle reaches a partially digitized area, COMAND notifies you of this with the following announcements:

- "Be prepared to enter an area where turn by turn guidance cannot be provided."
- "In 700 feet you will enter an area where turn by turn guidance cannot be provided."

The indicated distance can be seen here by way of example. In reality, it may be different.

- "You are about to enter an area where turn by turn guidance cannot be provided."

When you call up the route info to this type of destination, ( $\triangleright$ page 160) the following data shown there may differ from the actual situation:

- Estimated time of arrival
- Distance to the destination


## Route guidance within a partially digitized area

If you start route guidance in this type of area, you will hear the following announcements:

- "You are currently in an area where turn by turn guidance cannot be provided."
- "Please follow the arrow on the display."

Route guidance is provided by means of a direction arrow showing the compass heading to the destination. COMAND will not generate automatic navigation announcements.

If you try to repeat the current voice instruction manually, ( $\triangleright$ page 151) you will hear the announcement "You are currently in an area where turn by turn guidance cannot be provided.".
During route guidance, the display is divided. On the right-hand side you will see the direction arrow showing the compass heading to the destination. On the left-hand side of the display you will see the map with the suggested route. The suggested route is highlighted blue. However, it may not be possible to follow the suggested route because, for example, the road is closed or not open for car traffic.
Current vehicle location and direction of travel
(2) Arrow indicates the direction of the destination and the distance to destination

If, during route guidance, COMAND leads you back into a fully digitalized area, route guidance will simply continue in the usual manner.

## Off-road and off-map

## Route guidance to an off-road destination

Warning

The COMAND navigation system may direct you to off-road routes that your vehicle may not be capable of traversing through without damaging your tires, wheels or vehicle. It is the driver's sole responsibility to determine the suitability of the route. Off-road routes may be of varying conditions and their appropriateness for use may be affected by various factors such as time of day, time of year and immediate weather conditions that cannot be judged or taken into consideration by the COMAND system.

COMAND can guide you to destinations within the area covered by the digital map, even if a destination is not located at a road known to the system.

These destinations are shown as off-road destinations, which you can enter using the map, for example.

In these cases, COMAND guides you for as long as possible with navigation announcements and displays on roads known to the system.

Shortly before you reach the last known point in the digitized road network, you will hear the announcement "The destination is nearby. Follow the arrow on the display".

You will then see an arrow that indicates the direction to the off-road destination. When the off-road destination is close to the road, "Area of dest. reached" appears in addition below the arrow.

The section of the route from the last known point on the map to the off-road destination is highlighted blue. It simply shows the direction to the off-road destination without taking into account any type of obstacles in the way.

At the start of the route guidance, you will see the "Off Road" message and a direction arrow. The direction arrow shows the compass heading to the actual destination.

The route is highlighted blue from the nearest road known to the system.

As soon as the vehicle is back on a road known to the system, route guidance continues in the usual way.

## Route guidance from an off-map location to a destination

If the vehicle position is outside the area covered by the digital map, then the vehicle is in an off-map location.

COMAND is also able to guide you to a destination from such a location.

At the start of the route guidance, you will see the "Off Map" message and a direction arrow. The direction arrow shows the compass heading to the actual destination.

The route is highlighted blue from the nearest road known to the system.

As soon as the vehicle is back on a road known to the system, route guidance continues in the usual way.

## Off-road during route guidance

The road layout may differ from the data on the digital map, due to road construction measures, for example.

In such cases, the system cannot allocate the vehicle's position to the digital map and the vehicle is therefore in an off-road position.

The "Off Road" message and an arrow showing the compass heading to the destination appear on the display.

As soon as the system can allocate the vehicle position's to the map again, route guidance continues in the usual way.

## Tele Aid

Tele Aid incorporates the following functions:

- Emergency call
- Roadside Assistance
- Information call
- Remote Door Unlock
- Stolen Vehicle Recovery

To use Tele Aid, the Tele Aid service must be subscribed to and properly activated. If you have any questions regarding activation, please call the Response Center at 1-800-7569018 (in the USA) or 1-888-923-8367 (in Canada).
The Tele Aid system is operational provided the Tele Aid service was subscribed to and properly activated.
Additionally, the vehicle's battery must be charged, properly connected, not damaged and cellular service and GPS coverage must be available.

## General

The speaker volume of a Tele Aid call can be adjusted using the volume control on the COMAND ( $\triangleright$ page 110) or the + and - buttons on the multifunction steering wheel.

During a Tele Aid call, all audio sources are muted. The telephone is turned off and no SMS messages can be received or transmitted.

During a Tele Aid call, the used Network Type ("A" for analog network or "D" for digital network) and the signal strength are displayed on the lower right corner of the COMAND display.

## Emergency call

An emergency call is initiated automatically in the event emergency tensioning devices (ETDs) or air bags are deployed. An emergency call can also be initiated manually by pressing the sos button. Refer to your vehicle Operator's Manual for additional information.

Once the emergency call is in progress, the indicator lamp in the sos button will begin to flash. The message Connecting Call appears on the display and all audio resources are muted.
When the connection is established, the message Cal 11 Connected appears on the display. A voice connection between the Response Center and the vehicle occupants is established soon after the emergency call has been initiated.

## Tele Aid

If the Tele Aid system could not establish a voice connection to the Response Center (e.g. the relevant cellular phone network is not available) the message Call failed appears.
Should this occur, assistance must be summoned by other means.

During an active emergency call, switching to another application is not possible.

## Terminating the connection

The connection can only be terminated by the Response Center who has answered the call.


If you feel at any way in jeopardy when in the vehicle (e.g. smoke or fire in the vehicle, vehicle in a dangerous road location), please do not wait for voice contact after you have pressed the button. Carefully leave the vehicle and move to a safe location. The Response Center will automatically contact local emergency officials with the vehicle's approximate location if they receive an automatic SOS signal and cannot make voice contact with the vehicle occupants.

## Roadside Assistance

Roadside Asssistance will assist if technical problems with your vehicle are experienced.
Roadside Assistance can only be requested manually by pressing the button. Refer to your vehicle Operator's Manual for additional information. After initiating Roadside Assistance, the message Connecting Call will appear on the display and the connection to a Mercedes-Benz Roadside Assistance Center is established. All audio sources are muted.

If the connection is established, the message Ca 11 Connected will appear and a voice connection between the Roadside Assistance Center and the vehicle occupants is established soon after.

If the Tele Aid system could not establish a voice connection to a Mercedes-Benz Roadside Center (e.g. the relevant cellular phone network is not available). The message Call failed appears.

During an active Roadside Assistance call, switching to another application (e.g. Navigation) is possible.

## Terminating the connection

Roadside Assistance calls can be terminated using the $\xrightarrow[\sim]{-}$ button on the multifunctional steering wheel or the END key on COMAND. The call can also be terminated by the Roadside Assistance Center.

The COMAND reverts to the system last active before a Tele Aid call was initiated.

## Information call

Pressing the button, a call to the Mercedes-Benz Customer Assistance Center will be initiated. Information regarding the operation of your vehicle, the nearest authorized Mercedes-Benz Center or Mercedes-Benz USA products and services is available to you.
Refer to your vehicle Operator's Manual for additional information.
After initiating an Information call, the message Connecting Cal 1 will appear on display. The system is then establishing a connection to the Mercedes-Benz Customer Assistance Center. All audio sources are muted.
If the connection is established, the message Cal 11 Connected will appear and a voice connection between the Roadside Assistance Center and the vehicle occupants is established soon after.

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## Audio source

This includes the systems radio, CD (CD drive in the control unit, CD changer), MP3-CD and DVD (only audible).

## Autostore

Enters the stations with the best reception (signal strength) into the autostore memory in order of their reception quality (from strong to weak).

## Balance

Defines sound-center left/right.

## Bird's-eye view

The map is shown in three dimensions with sky and horizon.

## Bit rate (MP3)

Measurement of transmission speed.
Indicates the number of bits transmitted per time unit.

## Bluetooth®

Wireless personal area networks that provide a way to connect and exchange information between devices such as mobile phones, laptops, PCs, etc. over a short-range radio frequency.

## COMAND

(Cockpit Management and Data System)
Information and operating center for vehicle sound and communications systems, including the radio and CD/DVD player, as well as for other optional equipment (CD changer, telephone*, etc.).

## CD

(Compact Disc)
Digital storage medium in disc form.

## CD-R

(CD Recordable)
->CD which can be written to once, read many times but not deleted.

CD-RW
(CD Rewritable)
$\rightarrow C D$ which can be read, written to and deleted many times.

## DVD

(Digital Versatile Disc)
Digital storage medium for storing large amounts of data.

## DVD-R

(Digital Versatile Disc Recordable) ->DVD which can be written to once and read many times.

## DVD+R

(Digital Versatile Disc Recordable) $\rightarrow$ DVD which can be written to once and read many times.

## DVD-RW

(Digital Versatile Disc Rewritable) ->DVD which can be read, written to and deleted many times.

## DVD+RW

(Digital Versatile Disc Rewritable) ->DVD which can be read, written to and deleted many times.

## Emergency call

This function places a call to a local 911 provider. It does not initiate a ->Tele Aid call. Please note that the 911 emergency call system is a public service. Using it without due cause is a criminal offense.

## GPS

(Global Positioning System)
Satellite-based system for relaying geographic location information to and from vehicles equipped with special receivers. Employs DVD digital maps for navigation.

## Heading Up

Dynamic map alignment, map is displayed facing driving direction pointing up.

## ID3 tag

Additional information which may be included in MP3 files (e.g. title, artist, album).

## ISO9660

A standard file system for recording data on CDs.

## Joliet

Standard for recording data on CDs; an extension of ISO 9660.

## MP3

The term used in everyday speech for ->MPEG1 Audio Layer 3.

## MPEG 1 Audio Layer 3

A means of compressing digital audio data.

## Multi session

A method for recording data, e.g. for CDs. Data is written to the CD in a number of sessions.

## Navigation DVD

Contains all the destination addresses (town, road, intersection, house number, special destinations) and the digital map material for a country or a region for destination entry, route calculation and destination guidance.

## North Up

The map is displayed facing north during route guidance.

## POI (Point of Interest)

Points of Interest include service stations, rest areas, parking lots, hospitals, sight-seeing points, etc.

## Provider

is the network operator who makes available (provides) telephone services

## PUK (Personal Unblocking Key)

must be entered if the wrong PIN was entered three consecutive times.

## Roaming

For this function, the mobile phone uses the network of a contract partner. There are home type and non-home type systems. The Roaming indicator in the COMAND display indicates that a call is being made using a non-home type system.

## Root directory

The uppermost directory on a storage medium.

## Scan rate (MP3)

Indicates the frequency at which voltage samples are taken during the conversion of an analog signal into a digital signal. The analog-to-digital converter converts the samples into digital signals.

## Service source

This includes the systems telephone*, navigation (voice output during destination guidance) and ->Voice control system

## SIM

(Subscriber Identity Module) Card provided by the GSM telephone service provider. Necessary for accessing a mobile communication network.

## SMS

(Short Message Service)
With this function you can receive, read and delete short text messages (if SMS service is provided by your carrier)

## Soft keys

Keys that activate different functions. Function of key depends on the selected operating mode.

## Surround

Playback method resulting in an improved spatial listening experience compared to conventional stereo playback.

## Tele Aid

(Telematic Alarm Identification on Demand)
The Tele Aid system consists of three types of response: automatic and manual emergency, roadside assistance, and information. Tele Aid is initially activated by completing a subscriber agreement and placing an acquaintance call. Refer also to the vehicle operating instructions.

The Tele Aid system is operational provided that the vehicle's battery is charged, properly connected, not damaged, and cellular and GPS coverage is available.

## UDF

(Universal Disc Format)
Standard for recording data on e.g. DVDs.

## Glossary

## Unlock code

Your unlock code prevents unauthorized persons from using your telephone. The unlock code is a number string, which you have to enter when switching on the telephone.

## Voice output

During a trip, apart from visual informations (symbol or map displays), COMAND also provides all of the necessary spoken route information via voice output.

## Voice control system*

One of the service sources of COMAND.
As a voice-operated control system, it controls the COMAND systems via voice. Refer to the separate operating instructions.

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
