
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

Side Connections Panel

There are four jacks on the lower-right front side of your TV that make connecting Audio/Video devices like video games and camcorders very simple.

The jacks are like those found on the back jack connection panel. This means that most equipment that connects to those types of jacks on the rear jackpack, may be connected to the Side connection panel (FRONT VIDEO).


To use the Side jacks as the signal source, select them using Input source menu as described on page 25. They will be named "FRONT VIDEO" in the Input source menu.

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
When you select Front Video or Front S-Video, the Front Audio inputs are automatically selected as well.



Do not connect to both Video and S-Video at the same time. Connect either Video or S-Video only.




VCR Connections

Locate the Cable jack on the back of your TV. Connect this to out jack on the back of your VCR.

Or find the composite video and audio jacks on the back of your VCR, and connect them following the instructions provided with your equipment.

You may connect either the composite video or the S-Video cables to your TV. (Do not connect BOTH the composite and the S- Video cables. In the event that you connect both composite and the S-Video cables, only the S-Video will work.)






To hear stereo sound from cable or your VCR, you will need to connect A/V cables as well as the wire that runs from the VCR to your TV.

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



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

Hook up Variable Audio Output, L-Audio-R to Amplifier system for Left/Right front speaker sound.

Locate the Variable Audio Out jacks on the back of your TV and the Input jacks on the back of your stereo's amplifier.

Connect the two jacks, making sure that the right and left channels are connected correctly.

Set up your speakers through your analog stereo amplifier, according to the instructions provided with the amplifier.



Digital Audio Output

Send the TV's audio out to external audio equipment (stereo system) via the Digital Audio Output Optical port.



Connect one end of an optical cable to the TV Digital Audio Optical Output port.

Connect the other end of the optical cable to the digital audio optical input on the audio equipment.

- This DTV supports HDCP(High-bandwidth Digital Contents Protection) Protocol for DTV(480p, 720p, 1080i) modes.
- When you Connect with HDMI Source Devices (DVD Player or Set Top Box) supporting Auto HDMI function, automatically, support Plug & Play and then set the HDMI Source Devices(1920 x 1080i). After reading in HDMI Source Devices using Display Data Channel(DDC) Protocol, EDID stored in DTV is used. If HDMI Source Devices not supported Auto HDMI/DVI is been, the Resolution is setted, manually.
- To get the best picture quality, adjust the DVD Player or Set Top Box output resolution to 1920 x 1080i.
- When Source Devices have DVI Output Connector, you must connect audio with separated cable. (Refer to <How to connect>)
- The HDMI is not supported in 480i source.

How to connect

- 1. When Source Devices(DVD Player or Set Top Box) support HDMI.
- If Source Devices have HDMI Output Connector, Source Devices connect to DTV with HDMI Cable .(not supplied with the product).
- If Source Devices support Auto HDMI, automatically, Source Devices divert output resolution in 1920 x 1080i. But if not, resolution divert Manually Setting for reference Manual of Source Devices.
- To get the best picture quality, adjust the DVD Player or Set Top Box output resolution to 1920 x 1080i.
- Because HDMI sends Digital Video and Audio with one cable, need not especial Audio Cable for using HDMI Cable.

2. When Source Devices(DVD Player or Set Top Box) supports DVI.

- If Source Devices have DVI Output Connector, Source Devices connect to DTV with HDMI to DVI Cable (not supplied with the product).
- If Source Devices support Auto DVI, automatically, Source Devices divert output resolution in 1920 x 1080i. But if not, resolution divert Manually Setting for reference Manual of Source Devices.
- To get the best picture quality, adjust the DVD Player or Set Top Box output resolution to 1920 x 1080i.
- In this case, Audio use other cable. When Source Devices have Fiber Optic Digital Audio Output Connector, Digital Audio DVI Input(DVI) of DTV connect to Fiber Optic Digital Audio Cable (not supplied with the product) or when Source Devices have Analog Audio Output Connector, RGB/DVI Audio Input of DTV connect to Audio Cable (not supplied with the product). And then you can listen to normal Audio.




How to use


- 1. Connect the HDMI Source Devices (DVD Player or Set Top Box) and the TV set.
- 2. Turn on the display by pressing the ON/OFF button on the TV set and HDMI Source Devices remote control.
- 3. Check the image on your TV set. There may be noise associated with the resolution, vertical pattern, contrast or brightness in HDMI Source Devices. If noise is present, change the HDMI Source Devices to another resolution, change the refresh rate or adjust the brightness and contrast on the menu until the picture is clear.

If you have done so, remove the back of the remote and install in two AA batteries. Make sure batteries are properly installed (check the +/- symbols).





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


With the remote control in hand, press the POWER button to turn your TV on.

Press ENTER button to begin the channel search. Note: Allow EZ Scan to complete the channel search cycle for TV, DTV, CATV, CADTV, etc.





Channel Edit





Create two different types of channel lists in memory: "Custom list" and "Favorite channel list" from the default channel list made in the EZ scan menu.

A custom list can be created by toggling each channel on or off with the
(Enter) key. Once a channel is highlighted, you will be able to see whether the channel is currently added or deleted by referring to the small window at the top-left corner of the screen. You can create your own favorite channel list with up to 20 channels. It appears at the bottom-left corner of the screen. Use the FAV button on the remote control when a channel is highlighted, to add or delete the channel in the favorite channel list.

Press the MENU button on the remote control, then use the UP/DOWN arrow button to select the SETUP menu.

> Press the RIGHT arrow button to access the SETUP menu.

Use the UP/DOWN arrow button to select Ch.Edit and then press the RIGHT arrow button.

You will now see a screen filled with channel numbers and a preview picture. Use the UP/DOWN and LEFT/RIGHT arrow button to select a channel, then use the

button to add or delete it. Press FAV to add the channel to the Fav List.

Press EXIT button to return to TV viewing or press MENU button to return to the previous menu.

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

DTV Signal

Lets you know how strong your DTV signal is and whether you need to adjust your antenna or digital cable input. The higher the signal strength, the less likely you are to experience degradation. Using the SIGNAL button Press the SIGNAL button on the remote control. View the on-screen signal strength moni-2 tor to see the quality of the signal being received. 3 Press exit button to return to TV viewing. Even the installation direction of the TV set may affect color purity. Stripes may appear on the screen or the color may not be equal in the corners. You can restore color quality by operating the Degauss. Press the MENU button on the remote






Unless a button is pressed within two hours after the TV is turned on by the On Timer function, the TV will automatically turn off.






Sleep Timer Setup

Aspect Ratio Control

Lets you choose the way that an analog picture with a 4:3 aspect ratio is displayed on your TV with a 16:9 ratio. When you receive an analog picture with a 4:3 aspect ratio on your 16:9 TV, you need to specify how the picture is to be displayed according to your preference.

Using the RATIO button



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Use the RATIO button to select the desired picture format.

Each press of the RATIO button changes the picture format. Your options are: Set By Program, 4:3, 16:9, Horizon, Zoom1, Zoom2, and Cinema Zoom.

Press EXIT to save and return to TV viewing.

Using the menu

Press the MENU button on the remote control, then use the UP/DOWN arrow button to select the OPTION menu.

Press the RIGHT arrow button to go to the OPTION menu.

- Use the UP/DOWN arrow to choose the Aspect Ratio option, then press the RIGHT arrow button.
 - Use the UP/DOWN arrow button to select the desired picture format.
 - Use the UP/DOWN arrow button to adjust the enlarge proportion of Cinema Zoom. The adjustment of range is 1~16.
 - Press EXIT button to return to TV viewing or press MENU button to return to the previous menu.



When you receive a picture with a 16:9 aspect ratio, you can't specify horizon aspect ratio.

If you select a horizon during receiving a 4:3 aspect ratio, 16:9 aspect ratio is worked as set by program.

A password is required to gain access to this menu if the Lock System is activated.



- Lock System: Activates or disables the blocking scheme you set up previously.

- Block Ch.: Blocks any channels that you do not want to watch or that you do not want your children to watch.
- Movie Rating (MPPA): Blocks movies according to the movie ratings limits specified, so children cannot view certain movies. You can set the ratings limit by blocking out all the movies with the ratings above a specified level. Keep in mind that the movie ratings limit only applies to movies shown on TV, not TV programs, such as soap operas.
- TV Rating-Children: Keeps children from watching certain TV programs among only the programs intended for children, according to the ratings limit. The children rating does not apply to other TV programs. Unless you block certain TV programs intended for mature audiences in the TV Rating - sub menu, your children can view those programs.
- TV Rating-General: Blocks certain TV programs that you and your family do not want to view, based on the ratings.
- Aux. Block: Enables you to select a source for blocking among the source devices you have hooked up.

Programming the Remote

The remote control for your HD receiver is a multibrand or universal remote control. It can be programmed to operate most remote-controllable devices of other manufacturers.

Note that the remote control may not control all models of other brands.

Test your remote control.

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To find out whether your remote control can operate the component without programming, turn on the component such as a VCR and press the corresponding mode button (VCR) on the remote control, while pointing at the component. Test the **POWER** and **CH** +/- buttons to see if the component responds properly. If not, the remote requires programming to operate the device.

Turn on the component to be programmed, then press the corresponding mode button on the remote control.


Press the POWER and MUTE buttons simultaneously, the remote control is ready to be programmed for the code.

- There are two ways to find the right code for the component.
- A. If you press the CH +/- buttons repeatedly, the codes will change one at-a-time. Press the POWER button after each code change. If the right code is found, the device will turn off.
- B. Enter a code number using the number buttons on the remote. Programming code numbers for the corresponding component can be found on the following pages.

Again, if the code is correct, the device will turn off.

Press the EXIT button to store the code.

Test the remote control functions to see if the component responds properly. If not, repeat from step 2.

Maintenance

Early malfunctions can be prevented. Careful and regular cleaning can extend the amount of time you will have your new TV. Be sure to turn the power off and pull out the power cord before you begin any cleaning.

SCREEN CLEANING

- 1. Here's a great way to keep the dust off your screen for a while. Wet a soft cloth in a mixture of lukewarm water and a little fabric softener or dish washing detergent. Wring the cloth until it's almost dry, and then use it to wipe the screen.
- 2. Make sure the excess water is off the screen, and then let it air-dry before you turn on your TV.

CABINET CLEANING

- 1. Use a soft cloth with a mild soap solution to wipe the cabinet.
- 2. Rinse the cloth and wipe the cabinet again.
- 3. Let the cabinet air-dry before turning the TV on.

EXTENDED ABSENCE



If you expect to leave your TV dormant for a long time (such as a vacation), unplug the power cord from the wall power outlet to protect against possible damage from lightning or power surges. If you use an off-air antenna, you may also want to disconnect it from the back of your TV before leaving.

PICTURE INTERFERENCE

Even though you may be getting cable, the signal may be weak, which means the quality of your picture may suffer due to other factors. If there are problems with the image on your TV, consult the Troubleshooting guide on the following pages. You may also want to contact your cable service provider to determine if the problem is from the cable service.

VIDEO GAMES AND OTHER FIXED-PATTERN DISPLAYS

If you use your TV to play video games or for other uses that involve single, fixed images, such as a photo-CD player, you should avoid setting the Brightness level too high.

If static images, like network identification icons or patterns, are left on the screen for a long time period, they may leave a permanent impression on the TV screen. You can reduce the chance of this happening by

limiting the amount of time you use the fixed-image display, and by reducing the contrast and brightness levels.



If you unplug your TV, you may have to reset the clock using the Time menu described earlier.

75 OHM RF CABLE	The round cable that comes from an off-air antenna or cable service provider. Each end looks like a hex shaped nut with a wire sticking through the middle, and it screws onto the threaded jack on the back of your TV.
A/V CABLES	Audio/Video cables. Three cables - Right audio (red), Left audio (white), and Video (yellow). A/V cables are used for stereo playback of videocas- settes and for higher quality picture and sound from other A/V devices.
A/V DEVICE	Any device that produces video or sound (VCR, DVD, cable box, or television).
ADD	This function lets you add new channels to the channel list in memory that you'll scroll through when using your remote.
AMPLIFIER	An external device that amplifies sound from a television, CD player, VCR, DVD or other A/V device.
ANALOG TV	Traditional method of representing a television signal as a replica (analog) of the original picture and sound.
ANTENNA	The physical receiver of television signals sent over the air. A large metal piece of equipment does not always have to be visible for your home to be using an antenna.
ASPECT RATIO	The ratio of the horizontal dimension to the vertical dimension of a pic- ture. Standard television in the U.S. today is generally transmitted and displayed in a 4:3 aspect ratio. High-Definition television will normally be formatted in a wider aspect ratio, assumed to be 16:9.
CAPTIONS	A form of subtitling that writes out the dialog for your program on the screen.
DELETE	This function lets you remove channels that you don't watch from the channel list in memory.
DIGITAL TV (DTV)	A new method of representing a television signal as a series of binary numbers (1s and 0s). This method allows the signal to be manipulated to eliminate redundancy and dramatically increase picture and sound quality.
DOLBY DIGITAL	Dolby Digital Cinema Sound is made possible by a new digital coding tech- nique called Dolby AC-3. Dolby AC-3 produces high-quality, 5.1 channel surround sound which is six discrete separate channels for a full range of sound. Each channel can carry a different signal simultaneously (front center, front left, front right, surround left, surround right and subwoofer).

MODE	The mode determines the type of device (TV, VCR, Cable, etc.) that the remote is controlling; remote operating mode.
MONO SOUND	Mono (monaural) sound is one channel of sound. On more than one speaker, all the speakers play the same audio.
OUTPUT	Refers to the jack that sends a signal out of a VCR, DVD, or other A/V device.
