LG offers you a limited warranty that the enclosed subscriber unit and its enclosed accessories will be free from defects in material and workmanship, according to the following terms and conditions:

## TU750 User Guide

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### Guidelines for safe and efficient use

Please read these simple guidelines. Not following these guidelines may be dangerous or illegal.

## Exposure to radio frequency energy

Radio wave exposure and Specific Absorption Rate (SAR) information This mobile phone model TU750 has been designed to comply with applicable safety requirements for exposure to radio waves. These requirements are based on scientific guidelines that include safety margins designed to assure the safety of all persons, regardless of age and health.

 The radio wave exposure guidelines employ a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR. Tests for SAR are conducted using standardised methods with the phone transmitting at its highest certified power level in all used frequency bands.

- While there may be differences between the SAR levels of various LG phone models, they are all designed to meet the relevant guidelines for exposure to radio waves.
- The SAR limit recommended by the International Commission on Non-Ionizing Radiation Protection (ICNIRP) is 2W/kg averaged over 10g of tissue.
- The highest SAR value for this model phone tested by DASY4 for use at the ear is 0.612 W/kg (10g).
- SAR data information for residents in countries/regions that have adopted the SAR limit recommended by the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers (IEEE), which is 0.833 W/kg averaged over 1g of tissue.

## Product care and maintenance

#### **↑** WARNING

Only use batteries, chargers and accessories approved for use with this particular phone model. The use of any other types may invalidate any approval or warranty applying to the phone, and may be dangerous.

- Do not disassemble this unit. Take it to a qualified service technician when repair work is required.
- Keep away from electrical appliances such as TVs, radios, and personal computers.
- The unit should be kept away from heat sources such as radiators or cookers.
- Do not drop.

- Do not subject this unit to mechanical vibration or shock.





## Installing the SIM card and battery

#### 1 Remove the battery cover

Press and hold down the battery release button at the top of the phone, and lift off the battery cover.



Note: For your convenience, we recommend that you use the battery cover to remove the battery instead of your fingernail.

MARNING: Do not remove the battery when the phone is switched on, this can damage the phone.

#### 2 Remove the battery

Hold the top edge of the battery and, using the battery cover, lift it from the battery compartment.





## Installing the SIM card and battery

#### 3 Install the SIM card

Slide the SIM card into the SIM card holder. Make sure that the gold contact area on the card is facing downwards. To remove the SIM card, pull it gently in the opposite direction.



#### 4 Install the battery

Insert the top of the battery first into the top edge of the battery compartment. Ensure that the battery contacts align with the terminals on the phone. Press the bottom of the battery down until it clips into place.



#### 5 Charging your phone

Slide back the cover of the charger socket on the side of your TU750. Insert the charger connector to the phone ('B' side of the connector has to be facing up when connecting to the phone) and then plug into the wall socket. Your TU750 will need to be charged until a message reading "Battery full. Please unplug charger to save energy" appears on the screen.

**Important!** You should insert the battery before charging.

## Memory card

#### Installing a memory card

You can expand the memory available on your phone by using a microSDTM memory card. The TU750 will support up to a 16 GB microSDTM memory card.

**TIP!** A memory card is an optional accessory.

- 1 Remove the battery cover as before.
- 2 Unlock the microSD™ compartment by sliding it into the 'Open' position (as printed on the microSD™ compartment cover). This will allow the cover to open so that you can add a microSD™ card to your phone. Insert a microSD™ card with the gold contact area facing downwards. Close the memory card cover so that it clicks shut.

3 Replace the phone cover back on to the phone.



**Note:** If your memory card has existing content it will automatically be filed in the correct folder. For example, videos will be accessible from the My Videos folder.

#### General Functions

#### Making a Call

- Make sure your phone is powered on.
- 2 Enter a phone number including the area code. To edit a number on the display screen, simply press the C→ key to erase one digit at a time.
  - Press and hold the C→ key to erase the entire number.
- 3 Press the SEND] key to call the number.
- 4 When finished, press the •• [END] key.

#### Making a Call with the Send Key

- 1 Press the [SEND] key, and the most recent incoming, outgoing and missed phone numbers will be displayed.
- 2 Select the desired number by using the navigation touch pad.
- 3 Press the [SEND] key.

#### **Making International Calls**

- 1 Press and hold the key and the international access character '+' will appear.
- 2 Enter the country code, area code and the phone number.
- 3 Press the ISEND] key.

#### **Ending a Call**

When you have finished a call, press the [END] key.

#### Making a Call from the Contacts

You can store frequently called names and phone numbers in the SIM card as well as in the phone memory known as the Contacts.

You can dial a number by simply

selecting a name in the contacts and pressing the [SEND] key.

#### Making a video call

You can make a video call in a 3G-covered service area if the user you are calling also has a 3G video phone in a 3G-covered service area. You can also receive video calls. To make a video call, do the following.

- 1 Enter the phone number, as before.
- 2 If you do not want to use the speakerphone, ensure you have the headset plugged in.
- 3 To start the video function, press the left soft key **Video Call**. You will be notified that you will need to close other applications to make the video call

**Note:** The video call may take some time to connect. Please be patient. While the video call is connecting, you will see your own image; after the other party has answered, their image will be displayed on the screen.

- **4** Adjust the camera position if necessary.
- 5 Press to finish the call, or close the handset

## Changing your video call settings

- 1 Press , select Settings and choose **Call**.
- 2 Select Video call.
- 3 Choose the settings of your video calling. Determine whether to Use Substitute Image and select one, switch on the Mirror (so you can see yourself on screen).

## Making a video call from Contacts

It is easy to call anyone whose number you have stored in your Contacts.

Press the down navigation key to access the contacts list. Scroll to your chosen contact. Press the right soft key Options and select Make Video Call. Press the key to finish the call.

#### **General Functions**

#### **Adjusting the Volume**

During a call, if you want to adjust the earpiece volume, use the side volume keys of the phone.

In idle mode, you can adjust the ring volume using the side volume keys.

#### **Answering a Call**

When you receive a call, the phone rings and the phone icon appears on the screen. If the caller can be identified, the caller's phone number (or name if stored in your Address Book) is displayed.

1 Press the (SEND) key or the left soft key to answer an incoming call. If Any Key has been set as the Answer Mode (Menu > 9 > 5 > 3), any key press will answer a call except for the (END) key or the right soft key.

2 End the call by pressing the (END) key.

**Note:** You can answer a call while using the Address Book or other menu features.

#### Vibrating Mode (Quick)

Vibrating Mode can be activated by pressing and holding down the starl key.

#### Signal Strength

If you are inside a building, being near a window may give you better reception. You can see the strength of your signal by the signal indicator on your phone's display screen.

#### **Entering Text**

You can enter alphanumeric characters by using the phone's keypad. For example, storing names in the Address Book, writing a message or scheduling events in the calendar all require text to be entered.

The following text input modes are available on the phone.

#### T9 Mode

This mode allows you to enter words with only one keystroke per letter.

Each key on the keypad has more than one letter. The T9 mode automatically compares your keystrokes with an internal linguistic dictionary to determine the correct word, thus requiring far fewer keystrokes than the traditional ABC mode

**Note:** You can select a different T9 language from the Options menu. The default setting on the phone is the T9 disabled mode.

#### **Changing the Text Input Mode**

You can check the current text input mode in the upper right corner of the screen.

#### ABC Mode

This mode allows you to enter letters by pressing the key labeled with the required letter once, twice, three or four times until the letter is displayed.

#### 123 Mode (Numbers Mode)

Type numbers using one keystroke per number. To change to 123 mode in a text entry field, press the key until 123 mode is displayed in the upper right corner.

A long press of the key toggles between the Abc and T9 modes.

#### **Symbol Mode**

The Symbol Mode enables you to enter various symbols or special characters. To enter a symbol, press the [Star] key. Use the navigation touch pad to select the desired symbol and press the [OK] key.

#### **General Functions**

#### Using the T9 Mode

The T9 predictive text input mode allows you to enter words easily with a minimum number of key presses. As you press each key, the phone begins to display the characters that it thinks you are typing based on a built-in dictionary. As new letters are added, the word changes to reflect the most likely candidate from the dictionary.

- 1 When you are in the T9 predictive text input mode, begin entering a word by pressing keys to . Press one key per letter.
  - -The word changes as letters are typed - ignore what is displayed on the screen until the word is typed completely.
  - If the word is still incorrect after typing completely, press the key or the right soft key [Next] once, or more if needed, to cycle through the other word options.

- If the desired word is missing from the word choices list, add it by using the ABC mode.
- 2 Enter the whole word before editing or deleting any keystrokes.
- 3 Complete each word with a space by pressing the key or the right navigation key.

To delete letters, press **C·**◆.

Press and hold down **C·**◆ to erase whole letters at once.

**Note:** Pressing the [END] key will save your unsaved message in the Drafts folder.

#### Using the ABC Mode

Use the keypad keys to enter your text.

- 1 Press the key labeled with the required letter:
  - Once for the first letter
  - Twice for the second letter
  - And so on

2 To insert a space, press the the sey once. To delete letters, press the the sey. Press and hold down the the sey to erase whole letters at once.

## Using the 123 (Numbers) Mode

The 123 Mode enables you to enter numbers in a text message (a telephone number, for example) more quickly. Press the keys corresponding to the required digits before manually switching back to the appropriate text entry mode.

#### **T9 dictionary**

The T9 dictionary is a feature that allows the user to add any unique or personal words to the T9 standard language database. The T9 dictionary function can be selected from the Text Entry Settings sub menu under the right soft key menu [Options]. Within the T9 dictionary function, the user can add, modify, delete or reset personal words.

#### In-Call Menu

Your phone provides a number of control functions that you can use during a call. To access these functions during a call, press the right soft key [Options].

#### **During a Call**

The menu displayed on the handset screen during a call is different from the default main menu displayed when in the idle screen, and these options are described below.

#### **Making a Second Call**

You can select a number you wish to dial from the Contacts, to make a second call. Press the right soft key then select Contacts. Then, you can press SEND key to make a second call

#### **Swapping Between Two Calls**

By using one of three methods, you can switch between two calls.

- 1 Press the SEND] key.
- 2 Press the right soft key and then select "Swap Calls."
- 3 Press Up/Down on the navigation touchpad.

#### **Answering an Incoming Call**

To answer an incoming call when the handset is ringing, simply press the 「SEND] key. The handset is also able to warn you of an incoming call while you are already on a call. A tone sounds in the earpiece, and the display will show that a second call is waiting. This feature, known as Call Waiting, is only available if your network supports it.

If Call Waiting is turned on, you can put the first call on hold and answer the second call by pressing the [SEND] key.

#### In-Call Menu

#### Rejecting an Incoming Call

You can reject an incoming call without answering by simply pressing the •[END] key.

#### Muting the Microphone

You can mute the microphone during a call by pressing the left soft key [Mute]. The handset can be unmuted by pressing the left soft key [Unmute]. When the handset is muted, the caller cannot hear you, but you can still hear the caller.

#### **Using the Speakerphone**

You can use the integrated Speakerphone during a call by pressing the key. The loudspeaker is automatically deactivated when you end the call.

warning: Due to increased volume levels, do not place the phone near your ear while the speakerphone is enabled.

#### **Conference Calls**

The conference service provides you with the ability to have a simultaneous conversation with more than one caller. The conference call feature can be used only if your network service provider supports this feature.

A conference call can only be set up when you have one call active and one call on hold, meaning both calls must have been answered. Once a conference call is set up, calls may be added, disconnected or separated (that is, removed from the conference call but still connected to you) by the person who set up the conference call. These options are all available from the In-Call menu.

The maximum number of callers in a conference call is five. Once started, you are in control of the conference call, and only you can add calls to the conference call.

#### Making a Second Call

You can make a second call while currently on a call simply by entering the second number and pressing the \(\bullet\) [SEND] key. When the second call is connected, the first call is automatically placed on hold. You can swap between calls by pressing the \(\bullet\) [SEND] key.

#### Setting Up a Conference Call

To set up a conference call, place one call on hold, then conference in the second active call by pressing the right soft key [Options] and select the Join Calls sub menu option from the Conference Call menu.

#### Activate the Conference Call on Hold

To activate a conference call on hold, press the \(\bullet\) [SEND] key.

#### Adding Calls to the Conference Call

To add a call to an existing conference call, press the right soft key, and then select the Join Calls sub menu from the Conference Call option.

#### Private Call in a Conference Call

To have a private call with one caller from a conference call, press the right soft key and select Private Call from the Conference Call option. When the numbers of the callers are displayed, select the one you wish to speak in private with.

#### **Ending a Conference Call**

The currently active conference call can be disconnected by pressing the [END] key.

# **Voice Command** (Menu 3.3.1) Voice command is the function

whereby your phone's voice recognition engine identifies the voice of the user and carries out the requested commands. When the user operates the voice command function, there are five possible commands, call <Name or Number>, Listen to Voicemail, Missed Calls, Messages and Time and date. To activate the Voice Command function, hold down the C. Clear Key while the phone is in Standby Mode.

- 1 Call <Name or Number>: This function is activated only when the user says the command "Call" followed by the name stored in the address book or specified phone number. #### Outbox

Menu 6.6

Outbox is a temporary storage place for messages waiting to be sent. When you press the [SEND] key, you can make a call to the number of the recipient number of the selected message.

If the message is not sent from the Outbox, you will receive a sound alert along with a Message Sending Failure notice on the screen. Another attempt will be made to send the failed message and after two unsuccessful attempts, the message will no longer be sent automatically. In order to send the message that has failed, you must press the left soft key [Resend] to resend the message.

After the maximum number of Send attempts has been reached, the Send function has failed. If you were trying to send a text message, open the message and check that the Sending options are correct.

When the message Send has failed, the following [Options] are available in the Outbox list.

**View Status:** Shows the status of each message.

**Delete:** Deletes the selected message which has failed.

**Edit:** Allows you to edit the selected message.

**Select Multiple:** Allows you to select multiple messages from the list.

**Message Details:** Allows you to view the information on the message.

Sent Menu 6.7

This is where you can view the lists and contents of sent messages and also verify if transmission was successful.

The following [Options] are available.

**Delete:** Deletes the selected message from the Sent list.

**Select Multiple:** Allows you to select multiple messages from the list.

**Message Details:** Allows you to view information on the message. **Make Video Call:** For more

details, refer to Making a video call (page 18).

Call Voicemail Menu 6.8

This menu provides you with a quick way of accessing your voice mailbox (if provided by your network).

This may already be available; to check the voicemail, press and hold the key.

**Note:** Please check with your network service provider for details of their service in order to configure the handset accordingly.

# Message Settings Menu 6.9

To set the message, select Menu > Messages > Message Settings.

### **Message Alert**

You can set the Sounds and Alert Type here.

# Signature

This feature allows you to create your Text signature. You can use symbols, templates and contacts as part of the signature.

#### **Text Templates**

There are 6 predefined messages in the list. You can view and edit the template messages or create new messages.

The following [Options] are available.

- Send: Allows you to send the selected template via Message.
- Delete: Allows you to delete the selected template message.
- Edit: Allows you to edit the selected template message.
- Delete All: Deletes all messages in the folder.

Message Center Number: If you want to send a text message, you can get the address of the SMS center by using this menu.

**Message Subject:** You can enter the SMS Subject when this menu is selected.

**Reply via Same Message Centre:** You can set **On** or **Off**.

**Insert Signature:** You can insert your own created signature.

# **Multimedia Message**

**Multimedia Templates:** The preset multimedia templates are available.

**Priority:** You can choose to set the priority of the message.

**Message Subject:** You can enter the MMS Subject when this option is selected.

Validity Period: This network service allows you to decide how long your multimedia messages will be stored at the message center. **Send Read Receipt:** Allows you to send a message; read confirmation mail for a Multimedia Message.

#### **Download Options**

- Download Without Ask: Allows Multimedia Messages to be downloaded automatically.
- Always Ask: You can download a multimedia message manually.
- Discard: Used when the user rejects download of the Multimedia Message.

**Message Center:** The details for the Multimedia gateway are pre-loaded onto your handset and should not be changed.

#### Voicemail Number

This menu allows you to check the voicemail center number if this feature is supported by Rogers. Please check with Rogers for details of their service in order to configure the handset correctly.

#### **Service Message**

You can set the Service option to determine whether or not you will receive service messages.

- Save Without Ask: Allows Multimedia Message to be downloaded automatically.
- Ask Always: You can download a Multimedia Message manually.
- Discards: Used when user reject to download Multimedia Message.

# Messages

#### Info. Service

Info. Service messages are text messages delivered by the network to your handset. They provide general information such as weather reports, traffic news, tax, pharmacies, and stock prices. When you receive an info. service message you will see a popup message show you that or the info. service message is directly displayed.

- Receive: You can set the reception status.
- -Topics: To create a new topic, press the left soft key[New]. If you already have topics, you can edit, delete them by pressing the right soft key[Options].
- Languages: THis option lets you select the prefered languages.
   Info. service message will be displayed in the selected languages.

#### Internet

This menu shows how to access the Internet by launching the WAP browser.

**Note:** Check the availability of WAP services and pricing with your network operator and/or the service provider whose service you wish to use. Service providers will also give you instructions on how to use their services.

Once connected, the homepage is displayed. The content depends on the service provider.

To exit the browser at any time, press the [END] key and tap [Yes]. The idle screen is displayed.

This menu allows you to save and manage contact address information. The Contact List's functions allow you to add a new address or search saved contact addresses by name.

#### New Contact Menu 8.2

This menu allows you to add a new contact address. You can enter contact address information including name, phone numbers, email addresses, group information items, memos, ring tones and images (photographs).

This menu allows you to manage group information. By default, there are 4 groups: family, friends, colleagues and school. You can also configure a ring tone for a group so that the group ring tone sounds when a call from a specific contact address within that group is received and there is no ring tone configured for the specific contact address.

#### Speed Dial List Menu 8.4

This menu allows you to configure the speed dial numbers. You can select a number from 2 to 9 as a speed dial. You can configure speed dial numbers for any of the 8 numbers for a specific contact address so that a contact address may have multiple speed dial numbers.

# Contacts Management Menu 8.5

This menu allows you to copy all of the information from your SIM card, e.g. name, handset number, etc. to your handset. If a name is duplicated during the copying operation, the information is also duplicated.

You can copy the entry from the SIM card to the phone memory. You can copy the entry from the handset memory to the SIM card (not all the data will be copied).

You can delete all entries in the SIM card or the Handset. Press the [END] key to return to standby mode.

#### **Service Dial Numbers**

Menu 8.6

You can view the list of Service Dialing Numbers (SDN) assigned by your network provider. Such numbers could include the emergency services, directory assistance and voice mail numbers.

- 1 Select the Service dial number option.
- 2 The names of the available services will be shown.

### My Numbers Menu 8.7

This displays your phone numbers stored in the SIM card.

#### Audio & Ring Tunes Menu 9.1

There are 5 sound modes: General, Vibrate All, Alarm Only, Silent All and Ear Mic.

All modes can be changed from the Volume menu under Ringtone. In addition, pressing and holding the [Star] key on idle screen mode switches between Normal mode and Vibrating mode. Ear Mic is available when respective instruments are attached.

#### **Get New Ring Tunes**

Connects to Roger's Ringtone Shops.

#### Volume

This menu controls Ringtone & Alerts, Multimedia, Call and Keypad volume

#### Ring Tunes

**Sounds:** Shows and plays ring tones. These can be downloaded ring tones from Ringtone shops.

**Alert Type:** Supports 3 ring alert types. Ring, Ring and Vibration and Ring after Vibration.

Increasing Ring Tunes: Allows you to select an Increasing Ringtone type which is played when you receive an incoming call. You can elect to turn this On or Off.

#### **Message Tone**

**Sounds:** Shows and plays message tones. These can be downloaded ring tones from Ringtone shops.

**Alert Type:** Supports 6 message alert types: Ring Once, Ring Every 2 Min., Ring Every 15 Min., Ring & Vibrate, Vibrate and Silent.

**Note:** Full length music tracks cannot be set as either ringtones or message tones.

#### **Alert Tone**

**Sounds:** Allows you to select a set of alert tones. Supports 2 alert tone types, Alert Tone 1 and Alert Tone 2.

**Alert Type:** You can elect to turn Alert Tones to Ring or Silent.

#### **Keypad Tone**

This menu option allows you to select a tone that the phone sounds when a key is pressed. You can select an option from Melody and Voice.

#### **Power On/Off Tones**

You can elect to turn Power On/Off Tones to Ring or Silent.

#### **Phone Settings**

Menu 9.2

#### **Date & Time**

**Set Date:** This allows you to enter the day, month and year. You can change the date format via the Date Format menu option.

#### **Date Format:**

ddd, MM DD (day, month date) MM/DD/YYYY (month/date/year) DD/MM/YYYY (date/month/year) YYYY/MM/DD (year/month/date)

**Set Time:** This allows you to enter the current time. You can choose the time format via the Time Format menu option.

Time Format: 12 Hours/24 Hours
Auto Update: Select On to set the
phone to automatically update
the time and date according to the
current local time zone.

#### Languages

You can change the language for the display text on your phone. This change will also affect the Language Input mode.

#### **Set Shortcuts**

You can change the preferences on the Shortcuts that are currently assigned for your navigation key Touchpad.

#### **Auto Key Lock**

This allows you to set the amount of time before your Keys lock automatically.

#### **Set Flight Mode**

This allows you to use only the phone's features that do not require the use of the wireless network when you are in an airplane or in places where the wireless network is prohibited. If you set the flight mode on, the icon will be displayed on the screen instead of the network signal icon.

**On:** You cannot make (or receive) any calls, including emergency calls or use other features that require network coverage.

**Off:** You can deactivate the flight mode and restart your handset to access the network.

#### Security

Various codes and passwords are used to protect the features and settings of your phone. They are described in the following sections.

#### **Phone Lock**

You can use a security code to avoid unauthorized use of the phone. If you set phone lock to When Power On, the phone will request a security code whenever you switch the phone on. If you set the phone lock to When SIM Card Changed, your phone will request a security code only when you change your SIM Card. If you set the phone lock to Lock Phone Now, your phone will lock immediately.

#### **PIN Code Request**

When the PIN code request feature is set to 'On', you must enter your PIN each time you switch the phone on. Consequently, any person who does not have your PIN cannot use your phone without your approval.

**Note:** Before setting the PIN code request feature to Off, you must enter your PIN.

The following options are available:

**On:** You must enter the PIN each time the phone is switched on.

**Off:** The phone connects directly to the network when you switch it on.

#### Fixed Dial Number

This allows you to restrict your outgoing calls to selected phone numbers, if this function is supported by your SIM Card. The PIN2 code is required.

#### FDN On/Off

- On: You can only call phone numbers stored in the FDN List.
   You must enter your PIN2.
- Off: You can call any number.

#### FDN List

**Note:** Not all SIM Cards have a PIN2. If your SIM Card does not, this menu option is not displayed.

#### **Change Codes**

#### **Reset Settings**

This function allows you to restore factory settings. To do this, you need the security code.

Master Reset: Restores the settings (e.g.: Audio, Display, Language, Date & Time, Bluetooth® Settings) stored in the handset memory to default

Master Clear: Deletes downloaded/ user created contents (e.g.: images, videos) from Handset content and the External Memory card.

#### Phone

- Deletes all downloaded/user created Images and Videos & Sounds from the Handset Memory.
- Restores Deletes Personal Information stored in the handset memory (e.g.: address book, messages, tasks, alarm, Calendar schedules) to default values.

- Restores the settings stored in the handset memory to the default values
- Memory Card: Deletes all contents from the External Memory Card.

#### Display

Menu 9.3

#### **Get New Graphics**

Connects to Roger's graphic download site.

#### Wallpapers

From this menu you can select to have a picture for a background or a Solid Colour.

#### **Fonts**

You can configure the font size and Colour of the numbers which appear in the home screen when you make a call.

**Dialing Fonts:** You can configure the font size and color of the numbers which appear in the home screen when you make a call.

#### Clocks & Calendar

This feature allows you to select the Clock or Calendar display that appears on the standby screen.

#### **Brightness**

You can set the brightness of the display screen and the keypad. The default setting is on Automatic: this phone comes equipped with a light sensor that automatically adjusts the brightness depending on your surrounding environment.

#### **Backlight Timer**

Use this to set the duration of the backlight of Display and Keypad.

#### Colour Schemes

You can change the Colour of the menu, soft key area, title bar area and cursor by changing the Colour Schemes. You can select Black or White Schemes.

#### Menu Styles

You can configure the menu style to lcon style or List style.

#### Touch Keypad Menu 9.4

You can set the Touch light style and Response Type such as Vibration Only, Sound Only, Sound & Vibration and Silent.

#### Call

Menu 9.5

#### Call Forwarding

When this network service is activated, you can direct your incoming calls to another number, for example, to your voice mailbox number. For details, contact Rogers. Select one of the divert options, for example, select If Busy to divert voice calls when your number is busy or when you reject an incoming call.

The following options are available:

#### Voice Calls

**All Voice Calls:** Diverts voice calls unconditionally.

**If Busy:** Diverts voice calls when the phone is in use.

**If No Answer:** Diverts voice calls which you do not answer.

**If Out of Reach:** Diverts voice calls when the phone is switched off or out of coverage.

#### Video Calls

**All Video Calls:** Diverts video calls unconditionally.

**If Busy:** Diverts video calls when the phone is in use.

**If No Answer:** Diverts video calls which you do not answer.

**If Out of Reach:** Diverts video calls when the phone is switched off or out of coverage.

#### **Call Barring**

The ability to restrict outgoing and incoming calls.

#### **Send My Number**

This network service allows you to set your phone number to be displayed On or hidden Off from the person you are calling. You can select Set by Network if you prefer to have different settings for different service providers.

#### **Auto Redial**

Select On, your phone redials the number you're trying to call up to 10 times after you hear a quick, busy signal. Press [END] to stop the call attempts.

This feature attempts to redial numbers that are engaged due to the wireless network. It does not redial numbers to an engaged party.

**Note:** There will be no alert indicating the call has been connected. You must stay on the line to hear when the call is connected.

#### **Answer Mode**

This allows you to determine how to answer the phone.

Any Key: You can answer an incoming call by tapping the ← [SEND] or ← [Clear] Key. except the ← [END] key.

**Send Key Only:** You can only answer an incoming call by pressing the SENDI kev.

**Slide Open:** You can slide open the phone to answer an incoming call.

#### Minute Minder

This option allows you to specify whether the phone will beep every minute during an outgoing call to keep you informed of the length of the call.

#### Select Line

#### **Call Waiting**

The network will notify you of a new incoming call while you have a call in progress. Select Activate to request the network to activate call waiting, Deactivate to request the network to deactivate call waiting or View Status, to check if the function is active or not.

#### **Call Reject**

This menu allows you to enable or disable call reject for all numbers or a specific number.

Call Reject On/Off: This feature allows you to choose whether to reject the incoming calls unconditionally by disconnecting. When the Reject All Calls option is set, all incoming calls are routed directly to Voicemail. Reject on List allows you to enable Call Reject for the numbers saved on your Call Reject List (Menu 9.5.7.2).

#### Bluetooth®

Your phone has built-in Bluetooth® wireless technology, which makes it possible for you to connect your phone wirelessly to other Bluetooth® devices such as a handsfree device, PC, PDA, a remote screen or other phones. The devices registered in your phone can only be connected one at a time. (To make a connection to the same type of device or change Bluetooth® preferences, disconnect the existing device first.)

You can have a conversation via a cordless Bluetooth® hands-free phone or browse the Internet, wirelessly connected, via a mobile phone.

You can also exchange, for example, business cards, calendar items and pictures.

#### Hands-free profile

This icon appears when the hands-free profile is used between the hands-free device This allows you to call using a Bluetooth® connection

#### A2DP profile

This icon appears when the A2DP profile is used between the stereo headset device and the phone. This allows you to listen to an audio clip. A2DP is the Advanced Audio Distribution Profile, which provides support for streaming either mono or stereo audio using Bluetooth®.

### Hands-free + A2DP profile

This icon appears when both profiles of the hands-free and the A2DP are used between the compatible device and the phone. This allows you to call and listen to an audio clip using a Bluetooth® connection.

When using each device, see the manual that comes with the device

Note: We recommend that your phone and the Bluetooth® device you are communicating with should be no more than 10 meters apart. The connection may be improved if there are no solid objects between your phone and the other Rluetooth® device

Turn On/Off: This menu sets the Bluetooth® on or off.

#### Turn visibility On/Off

- Selecting the On option exposes your phone to other Bluetooth® devices.
- Selecting Off shows your phone to already-paired devices only.

Search New Device: This function allows you to search for and add new devices

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**My Devices:** This function allows you to view the list of all devices that are paired with your phone.

- Select the [New] key to search for the device that can be connected, and which is also within range.
- 2. If you want to stop searching, press the right soft key [Cancel].
- 3. All of the devices found are displayed.

Select the desired device by pressing the [OK] key and entering the password.

**My Bluetooth® Info:** This menu allows you to configure the profile for Bluetooth®.

- My Device Name: Allows you to change the handset's name, this can be seen by other Bluetooth® devices.
- Supported Services: Shows you all services that the handset supports.

#### **USB Connection Mode**

You can transfer files from a compatible PC to the memory in your phone using the Mass Storage. When you connect the phone to a PC using the USB cable, this will be displayed as a removable disk through Windows Explorer.

The USB Connection Mode determines how your Phone will communicate with other USB devices when they are connected with a USB cable.

#### Internet Profiles

This menu shows the Internet Profiles. You can add, delete and edit Internet Profiles by using the Options Menu. However, you cannot delete or edit default configurations provided by Rogers.

#### **Access Points**

This menu shows the Access Points. You can register, delete and edit by using the Options Menu. However, you cannot delete or edit default configurations provided by Rogers.

#### **Network Selction**

- Automatic: This function automatically searches for the network and registers the handset to the network.
- Manual: This function enables you to search the network list and specify which network to attempt registration with.

#### Preferred Network List

You can select preferred network lists to display it saved in the current SIM Card and can edit the current preferred network list.

\*: Shown only if supported by SIM Card.

#### Memory

Menu 9.7

#### **Used Space**

This function shows the status of the user memory of the handset.

#### **Phone Common**

This function shows the Memory Status of the phone and the memory being used by Audio, Image, Video, Multimedia Message, Java and Others Files.

#### **Phone Reserved**

This function shows the status of the reserved memory for the user (Text Message, Contact, Calendar, Tasks, Notepad).

#### **Memory Card**

If your phone has a multimedia memory card in the card slot, you can save images, sounds and videos on the memory card. You can check the current status of the external memory card in the Memory status menu.

#### SIM Card

This function shows the status of the SIM Card user memory.

#### **Set Storage Defaults**

You can assign the default storage to Phone Memory or Memory Card.

### **Application Settings Menu 9.8**

This Menu allows you to adjust the settings to the following features on the phone.

#### Messaging (Menu 9.8.1)

For more details, refer to Message Settings.

Browser (Menu 9.8.2)

#### Accounts

This includes the network information used to connect the browser to the Internet. Select the desired account by tapping the screen, then tap [Activate]. This will activate the account that will be used for future connections. MEdia Net is the predefined account that is set as default.

**Activate:** Select the account among the list of accounts, so it can be used for future connections.

**View:** Allows you to see the specific account information.

The following options will be available when you press on the right soft key [Options]:

**Edit:** Allows you to change the account information.

**Delete:** Allows you to delete the account.

**Note:** You cannot edit and delete pre-installed accounts. In order to create a new account, please fill in the network information.

- Account Name: Name associated with new account.
- 2. Homepage: Homepage URL.
- Internet Profile: You can choose one from the Internet profiles.

Note you can choose a Internet profile by selecting the list option on the center key.

#### Note:

- Rogers has provided default settings regarding account information.
- Creating or editing an account requires caution. The browser cannot connect to the Internet if the account information is incorrect.

#### Appearance

You can choose the settings of the browser appearance (Text size, Character Encoding, Scrolling Control, Show Image, Java Script).

#### Cache

The web pages you have accessed are stored in the memory of the phone.

**Clear Cache:** Remove all cached data in the memory.

**Allow Cache:** Set a value to determine whether a connection attempt is made through the cache or not

**Note:** A cache is a buffer memory, which is used to store data temporarily, especially when it is online.

### Settings

#### **Cookies**

The information of services you have accessed are stored in what is called a Cookie.

From this Menu you can choose to Allow Cookies, or to Delete Cookies that are already on your phone.

#### **Screen Settings**

You can change the settings of browser screen (Rendering mode, Zoom, Mini-Map).

#### Security

A list of the available certificates is shown.

**Certificates:** You can see the list of certificates and view them in detail.

**Clear Session:** Removes the secure session.

#### **Navigation Mode**

You can change the methods of browser navigation.

**4 Way Navigation:** The cursor of the browser moves scroll amounts or follows hyperlinks.

**Mouse Pointer:** You can move the cursor like a mouse pointer.

#### **Secure Pop-up**

You can control the pop-up which indicates a secure page or not.

#### **Browser Shortcut**

If this is set to On, you can use the browser more quickly and conveniently with the key pad in the phone. If Shortcut is on, the following number of buttons is available.

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Games & Applications (Menu 9.8.3) This menu displays the list of Java programs downloaded using WAP. All previously downloaded programs can be selected, deleted or viewed in detail within the Application menu.

Voice Command (Menu 9.8.4) Voice command is the function whereby your phone's voice recognition engine identifies the voice of the user and carries out the requested commands. When the user operates the voice command function, there are five possible commands, call <Name or Number>, Listen to Voicemail, Missed Calls, Messages and Time and date. To activate the Voice Command function, hold down the **C**⋅**→** Clear Key while the phone is in Standby Mode.

- 1 Call <Name or Number>: This function is activated only when the user says the command "Call" followed by the name stored in the address book or specified phone number. The voice engine inside the handset recognizes the user's utterance and displays name lists or phone numbers from the phone's address book. However, interfering noise might cause a problem displaying candidates. Additionally, the user has the option to superimpose a number type at the end, such as "mobile", "home" or "office."
- 2 Listen Voicemail: this command is activated when the user says the words "Listen Voicemail." The user will then be automatically connected to your voicemail.

3 Missed Calls: this command is activated when the user says the words "Missed Calls."The mobile phone presents missed call lists.

#### commands available to user

- yes: make the phone call
- **no:** move to the next missed
- cancel: go back to the main voice command menu
- exit: terminate voice command
- 4 Messages: this command is activated when the user says the word "Messages." Mobile phone displays details of unread SMS or MMS messages.

#### commands available to user

- yes: make the phone call
- no: move to the next unread message
- **cancel:** go back to the main voice command menu
- exit: terminate voice command

5 Time & Date: this command is activated when the user says the words "time and date." The phone displays the current local time and date.

# The voice command also has menu options

#### mode

- speed: voice command is abbreviated
- normal: voice command is played normally

#### train

- answer: enables the user to train for answers used via voice command
- number: enables the user to train the voice command for numbers used

#### best match

- 1 match: the most likely match will be displayed, finding a number from the address book
- 4 matches: the four most likely matched names will be displayed, finding a name from the address book

#### Sensitivity

- High: Operation and performance of the voice recognition engine is rarely affected by the user's voice command and surrounding sound
- Medium: Operation of voice recognition engine is normally affected by user's voice command and surrounding sound.
- Low: Operation of voice recognition engine is strongly affected by user's voice command and surrounding sound.

#### Speakerphone mode

- automatic on: When this option is selected, sound is loud enough so you can hear the output when the phone is away from the ear, at a distance.
- off: When this option is selected, sound is quieter, and cannot be heard when the phone is away from the ear, at a distance.

#### Recent Calls

This shows recent calls categorized to All/Missed/Dialed/Received by tab

#### Phone Information Menu 9.9

This menu is used to view My Numbers, Manufacturer, Model Name, Device ID, Hardware Version, Software Version, Language and DM Client Version.

### PC Sync

You can synchronise your PC with your phone to make sure all your important details and dates match, and also as a backup to put your mind at ease.

# Installing LG PC Suite on your computer

- 1 From the standby screen press and choose Settings.
- 2 Select Connection, then select USB connection mode. Music: Music Sync mode.

Others: Data Service mode.

- 3 Insert the supplied CD into your PC. Click on the LG PC Suite Installer which will appear on your screen.
- 4 Select the language you would like the installer to run in and click LG PC Suite.
- 5 Follow the instructions on the screen to complete the LG PC Suite Installer wizard.

6 Once installation is complete, the LG PC Suite icon will appear on your desktop.

# Connecting your phone and PC

- 1 Connect the USB cable to your phone and your PC.
- 2 Double click on the LG PC Suite lcon on your desktop.
- 3 Click on Connection Wizard and USB
- 4 Click on Next, then Next again, and Finish. Your phone and PC are now connected.

# Backing up and restoring your phone's information

- Connect your phone to your PC as outlined above.
- 2 Click on the Backup icon, and select Backup or Restore.

- 3 Mark the contents you would like to back up or restore. Select the location you would like to backup information to, or restore information from. Click Start.
- **4** Your information will be backed up or restored.

# Viewing your phone files on your PC

- · Microsoft Windows XP or Vista.
- Windows Media Player 11 or higher.
- USB Connection mode should be active and Music Sync mode should be on.

# Using your phone as a mass storage device

Your phone can only be used as a mass storage device if you have a memory card inserted.

- Disconnect your phone from your PC.
- 2 From the standby screen, press and choose Settings.
- 3 Select Connection, then select USB connection mode.

- 4 Highlight Mass storage and press
- 5 Connect your phone to your PC. Your phone will read: Connecting as Mass Storage... followed by Connected as Mass Storage Mode. Do not disconnect during transfer.
- 6 All of your phone files will automatically be stored onto your PC hard drive.

**Note:** Your phone must be unplugged from your PC to initiate Mass Storage.

Note: Mass storage backs up content saved on your memory card only, not your handset memory. To transfer the contents of your handset memory (e.g. contacts) you'll need to synchronise using PC Sync.

There are a variety of accessories available for your mobile phone, some of which may be sold separately. You can select these options according to your personal communication requirements. Consult your local dealer for availability.

#### **Travel Adapter**

This adapter allows you to charge the battery. It supports standard US 120 Volt 60Hz outlets.



#### **Battery**

Standard battery is available.



#### **Vehicle Power Adapter**

Allows hands-free operation. Includes earpiece and microphone.

No connection to the network	Signal weak Outside GSM network	Move higher to a window or open space. Check service provider coverage map.
Codes do not match	When you want to change a security code you have to confirm the new code by entering it again. The two codes that you have entered do not match.	Contact your Service Provider.
Function cannot be set	Not supported by Service Provider or registration required	Contact your Service Provider.
Calls not available	Dialling error New SIM card inserted Charge limit reached	New network not authorised. Check for new restrictions. Contact Service Provider or reset limit with PIN 2.

Message	Possible causes	Possible Corrective measures
Phone cannot be switched on	On/Off key pressed too briefly Battery empty Battery contacts dirty	Press On/Off key for at least two seconds. Charge battery. Check charging indicator in the display. Clean contacts.
Charging error	Battery totally empty	Charge battery.
	Temperature out of range	Make sure the ambient temperature is right, wait for a while, and then charge again.
	Contact problem	Check power supply and connection to the phone. Check the battery contacts, clean them if necessary.
	No mains voltage	Plug in to a different socket or check voltage.
	Charger defective	If the charger does not warm up, replace it.
	Wrong charger	Only use original LG accessories.
	Battery defective	Replace battery.
Phone loses network	Signal too weak	Reconnection to another service provider is automatic.
Number not permitted	The Fixed dial number function is on.	Check settings.

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
