Setting up (Back Panel)



About Player

ALARM (SNOOZE)
With the ALARM function you can turn CD play and radio reception on or off at a desired time. (see Use your player as an alarm clock)

CLOCK (SNOOZE)
For setting the clock and checking the time. (see Setting the Clock)

-TUNING+ / TUNING-
For storing radio stations. (see Listening to the radio)

▶/|| / MO./ST.
Starts or pauses playback.

■ STOP
Stops playback.

!Pod DOCK

CD slot loader

- Do not force a disc into the CD slot.
- Do not pull or push a disc while a disc is ejected.
- Press **▶ EJECT** again to reinsert the disc after ejecting it.

Ejects or inserts the CD from the slot loader.

Control the volume when using any function.

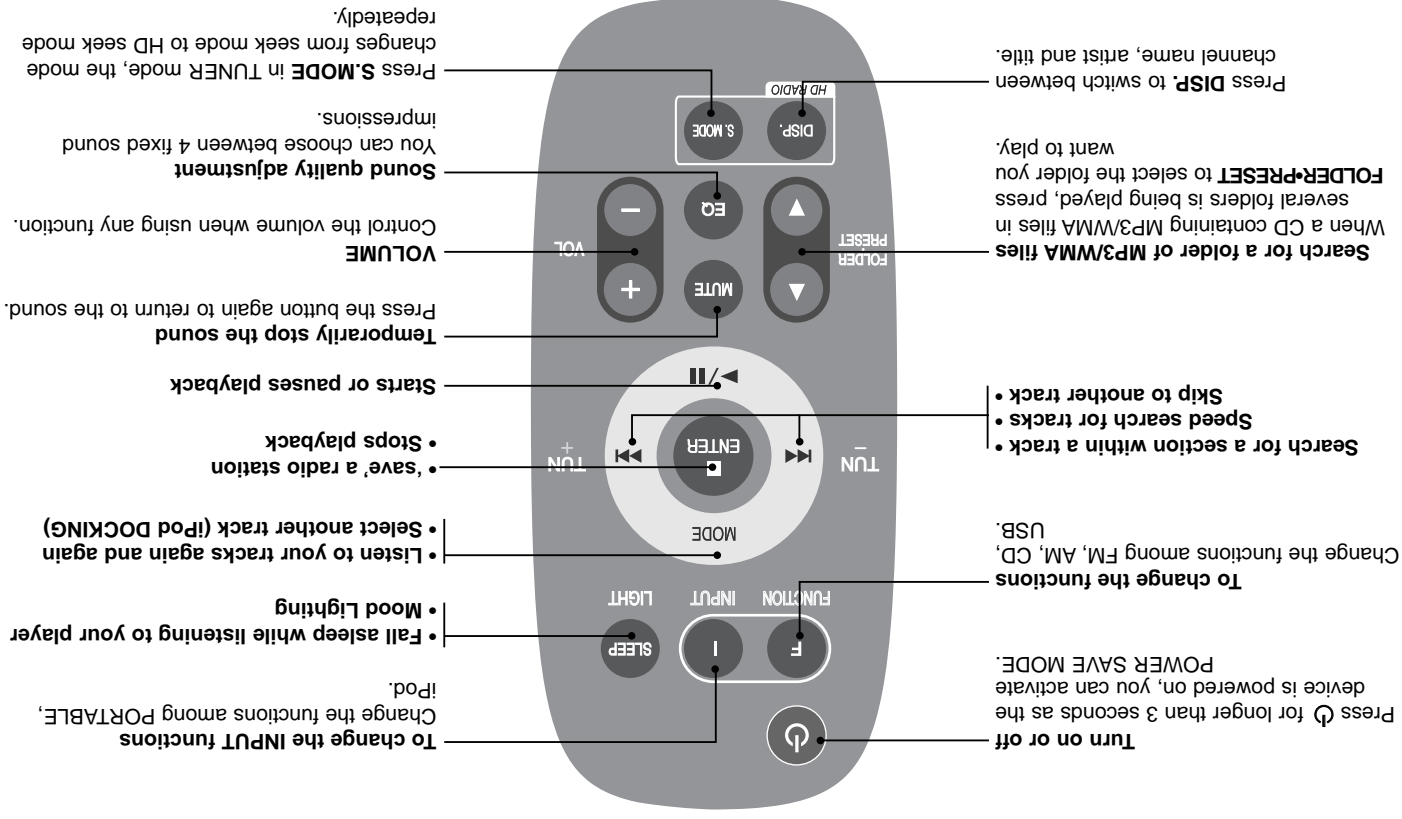

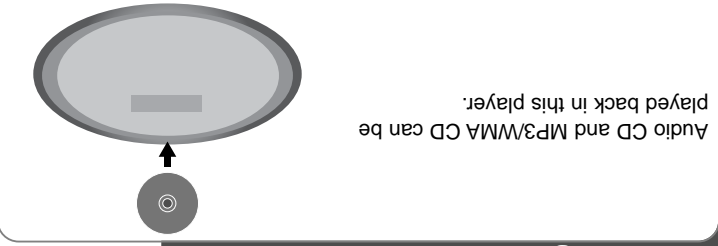

Listening to CDs



Audio CD and MP3/WMA CD can be played back in this player.

Listening to CDs - more you can do

1. Insert the CD:	▲ EJECT	ON REMOTE
2. Select the CD function: The display will show the total number of tracks (files).	FUNC/INPUT	ON REMOTE
3. Start the CD playing:	▶/	ON REMOTE
4. To stop a CD playing:	■ STOP	ON REMOTE

Pause or restart a CD
Press ▶/|| on either the player or the remote control during playback. Press this button again to resume play.

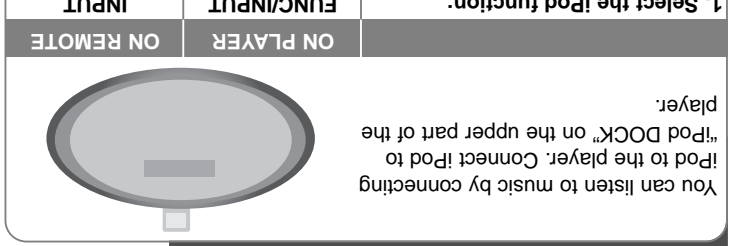
Search for a section within a track
Hold ◀◀/▶▶/▶▶ on either the player or the remote control during playback.

Speed search for tracks
Hold ◀◀/▶▶/▶▶ on either the player or the remote control only in stop status. Track skips continuously in turn.

Skip to another track
Press ◀◀/▶▶/▶▶ on either the player or the remote control.

Listen to your tracks again and again
Press **MODE** on the remote control repeatedly, the display changes in the following order, RPT 1 - RPT ALL - RANDOM - OFF.

iPod DOCKING



You can listen to music by connecting iPod to the player. Connect iPod to "iPod DOCK" on the upper part of the player.

iPod DOCKING - more you can do

1. Select the iPod function:	FUNC/INPUT	ON REMOTE
2. "iPOD" displays:	▶/	ON REMOTE
3. Start the playing:	▶/	ON REMOTE
4. Before disconnecting the iPod, change to any other function by pressing:	FUNC/INPUT	ON REMOTE
5. Remove iPod:	FUNC/INPUT	ON REMOTE

Pause or restart an iPod
Press ▶/|| on either the player or the remote control during playback. Press this button again to resume play.

Search for a section within a track
Hold ◀◀/▶▶/▶▶ on either the player or the remote control during playback.

Skip to another track
Press ◀◀/▶▶/▶▶ on either the player or the remote control.

Select another track
Press **MODE** on the remote control, you can move to the previous list.

FOLDER-PRESET on the remote control, you can move to a desired item. Then, press **ENTER** on the remote control, you can confirm it.

NOTE :

- When the connection with iPod is not good and the remaining battery is insufficient, the message "ERROR" is displayed.
- iPod is automatically charged when connected to the player.



HD Radio Reception

Digital HD broadcasting offers higher sound quality than analog radio. On it, you can select additional digital information and listen to FM with the same quality as that of CD, FM with the same quality as that of AM, and various kinds of programs. Any other signal interruption that was produced on analog AM and FM is absent. When toggling **S.MODE** on the remote control on TUNER mode, the mode is changed into SEEK (seek mode) and HD SEEK (HD seek mode) repeatedly.

- **SEEK** : searches frequencies for analog & digital broadcasting
- **HD SEEK** : searches frequencies for digital broadcasting

When searching channels with **◀◀/▶▶** for longer than 1 second, both analog and digital broadcasting signals are searched. The signal is changed in the following order; analog -> digital. When digital signals are detected, "HD" indicator is turned on. Whenever toggling **DISP**, channel name, artist, title are selected repeatedly. Press **◀◀/▶▶** while HD Radio broadcasting signal is received, sub channels are changed.

Listening to the radio

Listening to the radio Look for radio stations automatically

Press **◀◀/▶▶** on either the player or the remote control for more than 0.5 second. The tuner will scan automatically and stop when it finds a radio station.

Delete all the saved stations

Press and hold **■ ENTER** on the remote control for two seconds. "ERASE" shows. Press **■ ENTER** on the remote control to erase all the saved stations.

Choose a 'preset number' for a radio station

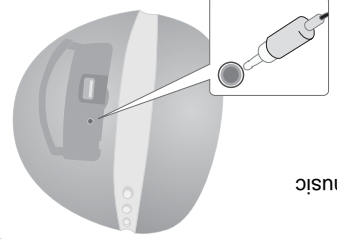
Select a station you want by pressing **◀◀/▶▶**. Press **■ ENTER**, the station flashes. Press **FOLDER•PRESET** on the remote control to select the preset number you want. Press **■ ENTER** to save it.

To improve poor FM reception

Press **MO/ST** on the player. This will change the tuner to mono and usually improve the reception. Make sure antenna is connected securely.

Listening to music from your portable player

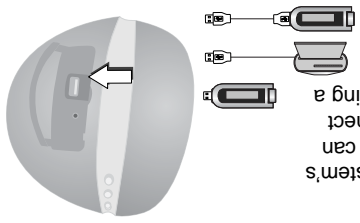

Connecting your portable USB player

The advantage of connecting your portable USB player through the system's USB port is that the portable device can be controlled from the system. Connect the portable player to the system using a USB cable (not supplied).

Use your player as an alarm clock

Press and hold **ALARM** on the player for two seconds. Press **⏮/⏭** repeatedly, the display changes in the following order, AM, FM, CD, USB.

Press **ALARM** when the function you want to be woken by is showing. Next, you set the time to get alarm activated. Use **⏮/⏭** to change the hours and minutes and **ALARM** to save.

Next, the volume (VOL) setting display appears. Use **⏮/⏭** to change the volume and **ALARM** to save. The clock icon shows that the alarm is set. Switch the system off. When the system is turned off, you can check the time the alarm is set for by pressing **ALARM**. You can also turn the alarm on and off by pressing **ALARM**.

NOTES :

- If you don't set clock, the alarm function doesn't work.
- When any button is not pressed for longer than 5 minutes with the alarm beeping, the alarm is automatically canceled.

SNOOZE function

This function wakes you up every 5 minutes if you do not turn off the alarm. When alarm is on and you press **CLOCK** or **ALARM**, CD or USB is changed into pause & mute. The tuner is on mute mode for 5 minutes and then changed into play & mute off.

About MP3/WMA

MP3/WMA Disc compatibility with this unit is limited as follows:

- Sampling Frequency : 8 - 48 kHz (MP3), 32 - 48 kHz (WMA)
- Bit rate : 8 - 320 kbps (MP3), 48 - 320 kbps (WMA)
- CD-R physical format should be "ISO 9660"
- If you record MP3/WMA files using the software which cannot create a FILE SYSTEM, for example "Direct-CD" etc., it is impossible to playback MP3 files. We recommend that you use "Easy-CD Creator", which creates an ISO 9660 file system.
- Do not use special letters such as "/ : * ? " > <" etc.
- Even if the total number of files on the disc has more than 1000, it will only show up to 999.

Mood Lighting

Press **SLEEP** on the remote control repeatedly, the display changes in the following order, SLP OFF - LIGHT - corresponding icons. Press **⏮/⏭** repeatedly on LIGHT, the display changes in the following order, L--1 → L--2 → L--3 → L--OFF.

SLP OFF (dimmer OFF).
 SLP 90 (dimmer ON) → SLP 80 (dimmer ON) → SLP 70 (dimmer ON) → SLP 60 (dimmer ON) → SLP 50 (dimmer ON) → SLP 40 (dimmer ON) → SLP 30 (dimmer ON) → SLP 20 (dimmer ON) → SLP 10 (dimmer ON)

Fall asleep while listening to your player

Press **SLEEP** on the remote control repeatedly, the display changes in the following order, SLP OFF - LIGHT - corresponding icons. Press **⏮/⏭**
