# Remote control



#### **Remote Control Preparation**

## Inserting the batteries



Make sure to match the "+" and "-" of the batteries with the marks inside the battery compartment.

## 3. Close the cover.




#### Notes:

Improper use of batteries may cause battery leakage and corrosion. To operate the remote control correctly, follow the instructions below:

- Do not insert the batteries in the wrong direction.
- Do not charge, heat, open, or short-circuit the batteries.
- Do not throw batteries into a fire.
- Do not leave dead batteries in the Remote Control.
- Do not use different types of batteries together, or mix old and new batteries.
- If you do not use the remote control for a long period of time, remove the batteries to avoid possible damage from battery corrosion.
- If the remote control does not function correctly or the operating range is reduced or limited substantially, replace all batteries with new ones.
- If battery leakage occurs, clean the battery compartment, then insert new ones.

## **Using the Remote Control**

Point the remote control at the remote sensor.




Note: Do not expose the remote sensor of this DVD Player to strong light sources, such as direct sunlight.

#### Notes:

- Point the remote control directly at the DVD player's remote sensor.
- Do not leave the remote control in an extremely hot or humid place.
- Do not spill water or put anything wet on the remote control.
- Battery life is on average 1 year normal conditions.

# Connecting to a TV Set




#### Notes:

- There are two ways of connecting this DVD Player's AV output to the TV set:

  1. Composite video cable and left/right audio cable.

  2. Component video cable and left/right audio cable [set the (Video Type) to (Y, Pb, Pr)].


# Connecting to an AV Amplifier with 2 Channel Analog Audio Input



#### Notes:

- 1. Set the TV to the AV input connected to the DVD player.
- 2. Set the amplifier to the AV input connected to the DVD player.

# Connecting to an AV Amplifier with Digital Audio Input



- Select the Digital Coaxial Audio output.
   Set the DVD player's audio out to ALL or PCM mode.
   Set the amplifier to the AV input connected to the DVD player.

#### **DVD Playback**

#### Preparation

- Turn the TV set ON and select "Video" as the TV input.
- Turn the stereo system ON if the player has been connected to one.

#### Basic Playback

- 1 Press the **<POWER>** button once to turn the DVD player on.
- 2 Press the <OPEN/CLOSE> button to open the disc tray.
- 3 Place a disc into the tray.
  - Hold the disc without touching its surfaces, position it with the printed title side facing up, align it with the guides, and place it in its proper position.
- 4 Press the <OPEN/CLOSE> button.
- The disc tray closes and the DVD player starts playback if the disc does not have a menu recorded on it.
- If the disc has one or more titles recorded on it, a menu screen will appear on the TV screen.

#### <<NOTE>>

Proceed with steps 5 and 6 when a menu is available on the disc.

Press <LEFT> / <RIGHT> / <UP> / <DOWN> or the number button(s) to select the desired menu item.

To select a title, press the corresponding chapter number on the remote, 1-9 or 10+ and then 10-99

#### <<NOTE>>

To select a title, input the number, i.e. 1 for chapter 1, 10 for chapter 10, etc.

6 Press the <ENTER> button.

The DVD player will now start playback of the selected item.

#### Stopping Playback and Returning to The Menu Screen (If a Menu Screen is Available on The Disc)

Press the **<MENU>** button. The DVD player stops playback and then displays the menu screen for the disc. After operation:

When the DVD player is not in use, remove the disc and press the <**POWER>** button on the remote control to put the player in stand-by mode (OFF). When in stand-by mode, the power indicator on the DVD player turns red.

#### <<NOTE>>

- The disc continues to rotate while the menu is displayed even after the player has finished playing a
  particular disc. When no further selections are to be played, be sure to press the STOP button to clear the
  menu screen.
- If the disc is placed upside down (and it is a single sided disc), the player will display "NO DISC" on the screen.

#### <<For your reference>>

When the "(11)", icon appears, while a button is being operated, it means that the corresponding operation is not allowed by the disc.

# **DVD Playback (Continued)**

#### Stopping Playback

To stop playback, press the **<STOP>** button.

#### Fast Forward and Rewind

Press the <REW> or <FF> buttons to Rewind or Fast Forward during playback.

- Normal playback is resumed when you press the <PLAY> button.
- The speed of advance (i⊳ x2, i⊳ x4, i⊳ x8, i⊳ x16 and i⊳ x32) or reverse (4x2, 4x4, 4x8, 4x16 and 4x32) changes for each press of the <FF> or <RWD> button.

## Skipping Ahead or Backwards through Chapters

You can skip ahead or backwards through chapters.

#### Skipping Ahead

Press the **<NEXT>** button during playback.

This will skip a chapter each time you press the button.

#### Skipping Backwards

Press the  $\P$  button during playback.

When you press the button once midway through a chapter, this DVD player returns to the beginning of the chapter being played. The player skips a chapter each time you press the button.

## Still Picture (PAUSE)

Press the <PAUSE> button

The screen will become still (paused).

To return to normal playback

Press the <PLAY> button.

#### Frame Advance (STEP)

Press the **<STEP>** button during playback.

The disc is advanced by one frame each time you press the button.

To return to normal playback.

Press the <PLAY> button.

#### Slow-Motion Playback

Press the  ${\bf <SLOW>}$  button during playback.

The playback speed changes (  $\blacktriangleright$  1/2,  $\blacktriangleright$  1/4,  $\blacktriangleright$  1/8,  $\blacktriangleright$  1/16 and  $\blacktriangleright$  1/32) each time you press the SLOW button.

To return to normal playback

Press the <PLAY> button.

Note: The sound is muted while in Slow-Motion playback.

## **Direct Selection of Scenes**

#### Selecting Scenes by Time

- 1 Press the <SEARCH> button during playback.
- 2 Press the <RIGHT> button to move the cursor to the time box.

Press the **<SEARCH>** button to see other information (Time stamp, chapter, etc.).

- 3 Press the **<ENTER>** button and the time box will turn yellow.
- 4 Press the number button(s) to specify the starting position.

#### Example:

5

To locate "01 hr. 50 min. 00 sec.", press "0", "1", "5", "0", "0" and "0".

Press the <PLAY> button

The DVD player starts playback from the specified position.

To return to normal playback

Press the **<SEARCH>** button until the time box disappears.

 Some discs may not start from the specified position even when the steps above have been performed correctly.

#### <<For your reference>>

- When the "fill" icon appears, while a button is being operated, it means that the corresponding operation is not allowed by the disc.
- To exit the scene selection screen, press the <SEARCH> button until the time box turns white.

## Repeat Playback

#### Repeat Viewing

1 Press the <REPEAT> button during playback to perform this function.

The repeat box will appear in the top right corner of the screen with four available repeat options to select:

Chapter: Repeat chapter Title: Repeat title Disc: Repeat disc Off: Repeat cancelled

To return to normal playback

Press the **<REPEAT>** button until the box disappears.

#### <<NOTE>>

- Repeat playback works only with discs that have an elapsed playing time which will appear on the display during playback.
- Repeat playback may not work correctly with some DVDs.

#### Repeating Sections Between Two Specific Points (A-B Repeat)

- 1 Press the <A-B> button during playback at the point where repeat play is to start (A).
  - "Repeat A" appears on the right corner of the screen.
- 2 Press the <A-B> button again at the point where repeat play is to end (B).

"Repeat A-B" appears on the right corner of the screen. Repeat playback of points A to B starts playback.

To return to normal playback

Press the <A-B> button until "Off" appears.

Note: When the DVD Player is playing an MP3 disc, this feature will not function.

#### **Convenient Functions**

#### Displaying the Information of the Scene

During DVD playback, press the <TITLE> button and the selection of the DVD will appear. Use the <LEFT>/<RIGHT>/<UP>/<DOWN> buttons to move the selection mark to the desired menu. Then press the <ENTER> or <PLAY> buttons to confirm the selected content. (This may lead to a submenu, in which case use the previous buttons to make a selection.

Note: This function depends on the menu properties of the disc. Some discs do not have menus.

#### Displaying a Scene with the Zoom Function

The ZOOM function enables you to take a closer look at the scene while you are watching a movie.

- 1 Press the <ZOOM> button during playback, a zoom window box will appear on the top right side of the screen.
- 2 Press the <ZOOM> button repeatedly to see the scene in difference sizes.
- 3 Press the <LEFT>/<RIGHT>/<UP>/<DOWN> buttons to select your preferred scene using the zoom function.

To return to normal playback

Press the **<ZOOM>** button repeatedly until the zoom window box disappears.

#### Viewing From Another Angle

Some DVD discs may contain scenes which have been shot simultaneously from a number of different angles. For these discs, the same scenes can be viewed from each of these different angles using the <a href="ANGLE">ANGLE</a>> button. (The recorded angles vary depending on the disc programming).

Press the <ANGLE> button during playback, the angle window box will appear on the left side of the screen.

Press the **<ANGLE>** button again to view different angles.

To return to normal playback

 $\label{press} \mbox{Press the $$<$ ANGLE>$ button repeatedly until the angle window box disappears.} \\$ 

## <<NOTE>>

- ANGLE will only function on discs where different angles have been recorded.
- The viewing angles are shown on the player's display where you can select one for viewing.

## **Convenient Functions (Continued)**

#### Using the MENU Function

- 1 Press the <MENU> button.
  - A DVD menu will appear displaying options currently available for selection. You may now select one of the options available.
- Press the <LEFT>/<RIGHT>/<UP>/<DOWN> buttons or the number button(s) to select the preferred item.

#### <<NOTE>>:

The menu options vary depending on the discs being played.

#### To Mute the DVD Player

In some cases, you may wish to mute this DVD player. This player provides a MUTE function for your convenience

- 1 Press the <MUTE> button during playback and a MUTE icon will appear in the left corner of the screen.
- When the MUTE icon appears on the screen, this DVD player has been muted and no sound will be heard from your speakers. To resume the sound, press the <MUTE> button again.

# **Convenient Functions (Continued)**

#### Playing Picture CDs and JPEG picture CDs

This DVD Player can play CD's and JPEG Pictures on your television.

#### Basic Playback

Load a picture CD into the tray.

After a few seconds, the player will automatically play your pictures in a slide show.

#### 700n

- Press the <ZOOM> button repeatedly to view the pictures in different sizes. There are five sizes to select: 25%, 50%, 100%, 150% and 200%.
- 2 Press the <LEFT>/<RIGHT>/<UP>/<DOWN> buttons to view different parts of the picture in zoom mode.
- 3 Press the <NEXT> or <PREV> buttons to scroll between pictures.

#### Pause, Next and Prev.

1 Press the <PAUSE> button to the slide show.

To resume the slide show.

Press the <PLAY> button again.

2 Press <NEXT> or <PREV> to scroll between pictures.

#### Rotating

1 When the picture is paused, Press the <LEFT>/<RIGHT>/<UP>/<DOWN> buttons to rotate the picture by 90 degrees.

#### Language Setup

NOTE: Please refer to the OSD instructions to perform the following setting instructions.


On Screen Display (OSD) Language Setting: Allows you to set various languages for the on screen display.

DVD Menu Language Setting: You can select a language that has been recorded on the disc menu.

AUDIO Soundtrack Language Selection [DVD]: You can select a preferred soundtrack language that has been recorded on the DVD.

SUBTITLE Language Selection [DVD]: You can select a language to be displayed in subtitles that has been recorded on the DVD.

- 1 Press the **SETUP**> button while no DVD is currently being played.
- ${\bf 2} \qquad \hbox{Press the $<$UP$>/$<$DOWN$> button to select "Language Setup", and then $$press the $<$ENTER>$ button.}$
- 3 Press the <UP>/<DOWN> button to select "OSD", and then press the <ENTER> button.
- 4 Press the <UP>/<DOWN> button to select the preferred language.
- 5 Press the <ENTER> button.
  - \*To return to the SETUP MENU screen
  - --- Press the <LEFT> button.
  - \*To finish the setup operation
  - --- Press the **<SETUP>** button to exit or select EXIT from the SETUP MENU screen.






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#### TV Type Setting

The type of TV set (4:3 or 16:9) connected to this DVD player can be selected.

- 1 Press the **<SETUP>** button while no DVD is currently playing.
- 2 Press the <UP>/<DOWN> button to select "Screen Setup", then press the <ENTER> button.
- 3 Press the **<UP>/<DOWN>** button to select "TV Type", then press the **<ENTER>** button.
- 4 Press the <UP>/<DOWN> button to select the preferred TV display.
- Press the **<ENTER>** button. 5

- --- Press the <LEFT> button.
- \*To finish the setup operation
- --- Press the **<SETUP>** button to exit or select EXIT from the SETUP MENU screen.

4:3 Pan Scan
Select 4:3 PS for a conventional size TV set. Video material formatted in the pan & scan style has the left and right edges trimmed.



4:3 Letter Box Select 4:3 LB for a conventional size TV set, Black bands appear at top and bottom of screen (letter-box style).



# 16:9 Wide

Select 16:9 for a wide-screen TV set. Played in "FULL" size.


Setting the wide-screen TV to "FULL" mode is also necessary.

- Wide or full screen shows the complete viewing display of the video source. No edges have been cropped to fit the display.




TV System Setting: The DVD player provides "PAL", "NTSC" and "AUTO" settings for your selection. When connecting the DVD player to your TV, set the "TV SYSTEM" from the on-screen display to the format that is compatible with your TV's system. Set to "AUTO" if your system is a multi-region TV system that supports both PAL and NTSC.

- 1 Press the **<SETUP>** button while no DVD is currently playing.
- 2 Press the <UP>/<DOWN> button to select "Screen Setup", then press the <ENTER> button.
- 3 Press the <UP>/<DOWN> button to select "TV System", then press the <ENTER> button.
- 4 Press the <UP>/<DOWN> button to select the appropriate setting.
- 5 Press the <ENTER> button.
  - \*To return to the SETUP MENU screen
  - --- Press the **<LEFT>** button.
  - \*To finish the setup operation
  - --- Press the **<SETUP>** button to exit or select EXIT from the SETUP MENU screen.




## Video Output: Supports Component Video (YPbPr)

- 1 Press the **<SETUP>** button while no DVD is currently playing.
- 2 Press the <UP>/<DOWN> button to select "Screen Setup", then press the <ENTER> button.
- 3 Press the <UP>/<DOWN> button to select "TV System", then press the <ENTER> button.
- 4 Press the <UP>/<DOWN> button to select the appropriate setting.
- 5 Press the <ENTER> button.
  - \*To return to the SETUP MENU screen
  - --- Press the **<LEFT>** button.
  - \*To finish the setup operation
  - --- Press the **<SETUP>** button to exit or select EXIT from the SETUP MENU screen.



If your TV supports (YUV), you can select this setting to obtain a better picture.
If the DVD Player is currently not in [P-SCAN] mode, a dialog box appears letting you choose to select [P-SCAN] Yes or No.




You must make sure that the current TV supports the Progressive scan [P-SCAN] function. You must also make sure the connections used to connect the player to the TV are proper connections capable of the progressive scan function.

Brightness Setting: You can manually adjust the brightness of the screen.

- 1 Press the **<SETUP>** button while no DVD is currently playing.
- 2 Press the <UP>/<DOWN> button to select "Screen Setup", then press the <ENTER> button.
- 3 Press the <UP>/<DOWN> button to select "TV System", then press the <ENTER> button.
- 4 Press the <UP>/<DOWN> button to select the appropriate setting.
- 5 Press the <ENTER> button.
  - \*To return to the SETUP MENU screen
  - --- Press the **<LEFT>** button.
  - \*To finish the setup operation

#### **Brightness**

There are 3 levels of brightness. [NORMAL], [BRIGHT], or [SOFT].



- 1 Press the **<SETUP>** button in the stop mode.
- 2 Press the <UP>/<DOWN> button to select "Audio Setup", and then press the <ENTER> button.
- 3 Press the <UP>/<DOWN> button to select "Digital Out", and then press the <ENTER> button.
- 4 Press the <UP>/<DOWN> button to select the preferred digital out setting.
- 5 Press the **<ENTER>** button.


#### Parental Control Setting [DVD]

A built-in parental control setting enables you to lock videos that you do not want children to view. For example, setting the rating limit to PG-13 will prevent the unit from playing videos rated R, NC-17 or X unless the correct password is entered.

- 1 Press the **SETUP**> button while no DVD is currently playing.
- 2 Press the <UP>/<DOWN> button to select "Custom Setup", then press the <ENTER> button.
- 3 Press the <UP>/<DOWN> button to select "Parental Ctrl", then press the <ENTER> button.
- 4 Enter a 4-digit password before selecting ratings and press the **<ENTER>** button.

Factory pre-set password: 0000

- You need to enter "0000" to set the rating when using this DVD Player for the first time.
- 5 Press the <UP>/<DOWN> buttons to select the preferred rating.
- 6 Press the <ENTER> button.



# << Rating Explanations >>:

- Only titles with a parental control setting of 1 or less are allowed to play
- 2. Only titles with a parental control setting of 2 or less are allowed to play
- 3. Only titles with a parental control setting of 3 or less are allowed to play
- 4. Only titles with a parental control setting of 4 or less are allowed to play
- Only titles with a parental control setting of 5 or less are allowed to play



#### Password Setting [DVD]

- 3 Press the <UP>/<DOWN> button to select "Password", then press the <ENTER> button.
- 4 Enter your old password and then press the <ENTER> button. (Factory pre-set password: 0000)

- 6 Re-enter your password to verify it and then press the <ENTER> button.







## **Program Play**

This function can set a play order when playing a DVD. If the DVD player is set in the PBC/Navigation ON mode, then it will display "invalid". If it is in PBC/Navigation OFF mode, then it will display the screen below.





Use the number keys and the UP/DOWN/LEFT/RIGHT buttons to select the title or chapter you wish to put into the play order. After inputting your selections, press PLAY to begin the sequence of your play order.

NOTE: The maximum number of tracks you can set for the player order is 20.



In Program Mode, the selected file will show a yellow background and reversed text colour. You can select the song or picture you want. For example: user selects test\_5\_01 test\_5\_03, and test\_5\_06 (three files). This DVD Player will play only the three files selected.

To select a file, press ▶ to add it to the program list. The DVD Player will outline your selection with a red rectangle. If you want to remove a file from your selection, then move the cursor to the file you wish to remove and press ▶ again. The file you selected will be removed from the play list.

When you want to play the selected files in Program Mode, press the  $\,\blacktriangleright\,$  button and then press the  $\,\blacktriangleright\,$  button again to play.

When you want to know which files have been selected, and delete files that have been selected. Move the cursor to your list in the Program Mode, and press the ▶ button to enter the Program List. The buttons below the List become Delete All and Return. Press the ▶ button to edit and delete.
