# Charge the battery



- Risk of product damage! Ensure that the power supply voltage corresponds to the voltage printed on the back or the underside of the player.
- Use only the supplied AC adaptor to charge the battery.
- 1 Slide the **POWER ON/OFF** switch to **OFF** position.
- 2 Connect the supplied AC adaptor to the player and to the AC outlet.



- → The red charge indicator turns on. It takes about 4 hours to fully charge the battery.
- → When the battery is fully charged, the red charge indicator turns off.



- You can only charge the battery when the temperature is between 0°C and 35°C.
- When headphones are connected to the DVD player, the fully charged battery lasts about 2.5 hours.
- To maximize battery life, recharge the battery immediately once the battery is fully discharged.
- · When the player is not in use, turn it off.

# Install remote control battery



- Risk of explosion! Keep batteries away from heat, sunshine or fire. Never discard batteries in fire.





 Connect an amplifier with a Dolby digital stereo system only with the yellow end of AV cable



# Select OSD language

You can choose a diffrent language for the on-screen display text.

# Turn on

Slide the **POWER ON/OFF** switch to the **ON** position.

→ The green power indicator turns on.

# Play discs

- 1 Press OPEN on the player.
- 2 Insert the disc with label side facing up.
- **3** Push down to close the disc compartment.
  - → Play starts automatically. If not, press **OK** or **>II**.
  - If a menu appears, select an item, then press **OK**to start play.
  - To pause, press PLAY/PAUSE ► II. Press again to resume play.
  - To view disc information, press OSD DISPLAY.
  - To stop, press STOP

     twice.

# Play options

# Skip to a title/track/chapter

- To select the previous/next title, track or chapter, press I◀◀ or
   ▶I.
- To skip directly to any title/track/chapter, enter the corresponding number with the numerical keys (0-9) or press GO TO, then press OK.

#### Search

- To start search within video/audio, press and hold ►►I or I◄
   Briefly press I◄
   or ►►I during search to select a search speed.
- Press ►II or **OK** to resume normal play.

# Select audio language

For DVDs that contain two or more audio languages.

 During play, press AUDIO LANGUAGE repeatedly until the language is selected.

# Repeat

 During play, press REPEAT repeatedly to select the following repeat options:

#### For DVD

- [Repeat Chapter]
- [Repeat Title]
- [Off]

### For CD/VCD/SVCD

[Repeat Single]

- [Repeat All] (entire disc)
- [Off]

#### For JPEG/MP3

- [Repeat Single]
- [Repeat All] (current folder)
- [Off]



For VCD/SVCD, if PBC is on, you cannot repeat items.

# Repeat a section

You can repeat a specific section of audio/video within a title/chapter/track (repeat A-B).

- 1 During play, at the chosen start point, press **REPEAT A-B**.
- 2 At the chosen end point, press REPEAT A-B again.
  - → The selected section plays repeatedly.
- **3** Press **REPEAT A-B** to cancel.

# Zoom

For DVDs,VCDs and JPEG CDs, you can zoom in and out for video images or pictures.

- 1 Press **ZOOM** repeatedly to zoom in and out.
- When the video image or picture is enlarged, press A, V, ►►I, I◄I to pan through it.

#### Select audio mode

When you play VCDs, you can select an audio mode. Press AUDIO LANGUAGE repeatedly to select audio channel: [Left], [Right], [Mix] or [Stereo].

# Rotate pictures

For JPEG CDs only. While the JPEG is displayed:

- Press ▲ to rotate counter-clockwise.
- Press ▼ to rotate clockwise.

#### Activate PBC

For VCDs (version 2.0 only) and SVCDs.

- 1 Press MENU.
- 2 Select PBC ON.
  - → The disc menu (if available) appears.
- · During playback,
  - Press I◄ after the first 5 seconds, play starts from the beginning of the current track.
  - Press I within the first 5 seconds, play goes to the previous track.
  - To return to the menu screen, press RETURN.



• If PBC is on, you cannot use numeric keypad (0-9) to select a track.

  - [Movie expand 16:9]: The picture is enlarged to 16:9 format. A large part of the top and bottom of the picture is trimmed. Select this when playing pictures which have black band at the top and bottom (letterbox format).

- [Widescreen]: The picture is displayed in the original proportion of images transmitted in 16:9 format.
- 4 Press **OK** to confirm.
- 5 Press SETUP to exit.



If you play a 4:3 picture in Widescreen mode, it stretches horizontally.

#### Select view mode

- 1 Press **SETUP**, then select **[Video]**.
- 2 Press ▶▶I, then select [View Mode].
- **3** Press **OK**, then select an option:
  - [Original]: Fit the original screen size (for JPEG only)
  - [Auto Fit]: Take the minimum value of horizontal and vertical fit scale ratio (like letter box)
  - [Pan Scan]: Take the maximum value of horizontal and vertical fit scale ratio.
- 4 Press **OK** to confirm.
- 5 Press SETUP to exit.

# Select picture contrast

- 1 Press **SETUP**, then select **[Video]**.
- 2 Press ▶▶I, then select [Smart Picture].
- 3 Press **OK**, then select an option:
  - [Standard]: Select the preset picture setting.

- [Vivid]: Make the picture brighter.
- [Cool]: Make the picture softer.
- [Personal]: Personalize your picture color by adjusting brightness, contrast and color:

# Select audio options

## Restrict access

Depending on the DVD, you may be asked to change the parental level while playing the disc. The rating levels are from 1 to 8 and are country dependent. You can prohibit the playing of certain discs that

  - [4. PG-13]: Unsuitable for children under age 13.
  - [5. PG-R]: Parental Guidance; recommended that parents restrict children under 17 from viewing.
  - [6. R]: Restricted; recommended only when supervised by a parent or adult guardian.
  - [7. NC-17]: No Children under age 17; not recommended viewing for children under age 17.
  - [8.Adult]: Mature Material; should be viewed only by adults.
- **5** Press **OK** to confirm.
- 6 Press SETUP to exit.

# Change password

  - For the first time, enter 0000 as the password.

# Select JPEG play options

You can display JPEG files as a slideshow, where they appear one after another automatically.

  - [Slideshow]: Activate/deactivate slideshow.
  - [Frequency]: Select intervals for JPEG play.
  - [Transition]: Select display mode for JPEG play.

# 6 Troubleshooting

#### No power

- Ensure that both plugs of the mains cord are properly connected.
- Ensure that there is power at the AC outlet.
- Check if the built-in battery is drained.

#### Distorted picture

- Clean the disc. With a clean, soft, lint-free cloth, wipe the disc outwards from the center.
- Make sure that the video output format of the disc is compatible with the TV.
- Change the video output format with DVD AV OUT to match yourTV or program.
- The LCD is manufactured using high precision technology. You
  may, however, see tiny black points and/or bright points (red,
  blue, green) that continuously appear on the LCD. This is a
  normal result of the manufacturing process and does not
  indicate a malfunction.

#### No sound

Ensure that the AV cable is connected correctly.

## Cannot play disc

- Ensure the disc label is upwards.
- Clean the disc. With a clean, soft, lint-free cloth, wipe the disc outwards from the center.
- Check if the disc is defective by trying another disc.

# No response to the remote control

- Ensure that the path between the remote control and the player is clear from obstacles.
- From a close distance, point the remote control directly at the player.

- Replace the remote control batteries.
- The function does not work for this disc. Refer to the disc instructions.

## The player feels warm

 When the player is in use for a long period of time, its surface will be heated. This is normal.
