
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


Setup

Finding a suitable location

- Place the set on a flat, hard and stable surface. Do not place the set on a carpet.
- Do not position the set on top of other equipment that might heat it up (e.g., receiver or amplifier).
- Do not put anything under the set (e.g., CDs, magazines).
- Install this unit near the AC outlet and where the AC power plug can be reached easily.

Space for ventilation

 Place the apparatus in a location with adequate ventilation to prevent internal heat build up. Allow at least 10 cm (4.0") clearance from the rear and the top of the set and 5cm (2.0") from the left and right to prevent overheating.



Avoid high temperatures, moisture, water and dust

- Apparatus shall not be exposed to dripping or splashing.
- Do not place any sources of danger on the apparatus (e.g., liquid filled objects, lighted candles).

Cleaning discs

Some problems occur because the disc inside the recorder is dirty (frozen picture, sound disruptions, picture distortions). To avoid these problems, discs should be cleaned on a regular basis.

To clean a disc, use a micro fibre cleaning cloth and wipe the disc from the center to the edge in a straight line.





CAUTION!

Do not use solvents such as benzene, thinner, commercially available cleaners, or anti-static sprays intended for analog discs. Since the optical unit (laser) of the DVD recorder operates at a higher power than regular DVD or CD players, cleaning CDs intended for DVD or CD players may damage the optical unit (laser). Therefore, refrain from using a cleaning CD.











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Connections

Connecting to television





IMPORTANT!

- You only need to make one video connection from the following options, depending on the capabilities of your television.
- Connect the DVD player directly to the television.

Using Composite Video sockets (CVBS)

- Use the composite video cable (yellow) to connect the DVD player's CVBS (VIDEO) socket to the video input jack (or labeled as A/V In, Video In, Composite or Baseband) on the television (cable supplied).
- 2 To hear sound of this DVD player through your TV, use the audio cables (white/red) to connect AUDIO OUT (L/ R) sockets of the DVD player to the corresponding AUDIO IN sockets on the television (cable supplied).

IMPORTANT!

 The progressive scan video quality is only possible when using YPbPr and a progressive scan television is required.

Using Component Video sockets (YPbPr)

- Use the component video cables (red/blue/green) to connect the DVD player's YPbPr sockets to the component video input sockets (or labeled as YPbPr) on the television (cable not supplied).
- To hear sound of this DVD player through your TV, use the audio cables (white/red) to connect AUDIO OUT (L/ R) sockets of the DVD player to the corresponding AUDIO IN sockets on the television (cable supplied).
- 3 Proceed to page 18 for detailed progressive scan setup.

TIPS: Before making or changing any connections, make sure that all the devices are disconnected from the power outlet.

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

Connecting the power cord




IMPORTANT!

- If your television only has a single Antenna In jack (or labeled as 75 ohm or RF In,) you will need an RF modulator in order to view the DVD playback on the television. See your electronics retailer for details on RF modulator availability and operations.

Using an accessory RF modulator

- Use the composite video cable (yellow) to connect the DVD player's CVBS jack to the video input jack on the RF modulator.
- Use the RF coaxial cable (not supplied) to connect the RF modulator to your television's RF jack.
- To hear sound of this DVD player through your TV, use the audio cables (white/red) to connect AUDIO OUT (L/ R) sockets of the DVD player to the corresponding AUDIO IN sockets on the RF modulator (cable supplied).



After everything is connected properly, plug in the AC power cord to the power outlet.

Never make or change any connections with the power switched on.

When no disc is loaded, press STANDBY ON on the DVD player front panel.

"NO DISC" may appear on the display panel.




Connecting to an stereo system



Stereo system has right/ left Audio In sockets

- Select one of the video connections (CVBS VIDEO IN, COMPONENT VIDEO IN) depending on the options available on your TV.
- Use the audio cables (white/red) to connect AUDIO OUT (L/R) sockets of the DVD Player to the corresponding AUDIO IN sockets on the stereo system (cable supplied).

Connecting to a digital AV receiver



Receiver has a PCM, Dolby Digital or MPEG decoder

- Select one of the video connections (CVBS VIDEO IN, COMPONENT VIDEO IN) depending on the options available on your TV.
- 2 Connect the COAXIAL jack of the DVD player to the corresponding Digital Audio In socket on your receiver (cable not supplied).
- 3 Set the DVD player's digital output to PCM or ALL depending on the capabilities of your receiver (see page 30 {Digital Out}).

 If the audio format of the Digital Output does not match the capabilities of your receiver, the receiver will produce a strong, distorted sound or no sound at all.

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


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

Front and Rear Panels



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


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Getting Started

Step I: Inserting Batteries




- 1 Open the battery compartment.
- ② Insert two batteries type R03 or AAA, following the indications (+ -) inside the compartment.
- 3 Close the cover.

CAUTION!

- Remove batteries if they are exhausted or if the remote is not to be used for a long time.
- Do not use old and new or different types of batteries in combination.
- Batteries contain chemical substances, so they should be disposed of properly.

Using the remote control to operate the system



- Aim the remote control directly at the remote sensor (IR) on the front panel.
- ② Do not put any objects between the remote control and the DVD player while operating the DVD player.

Step 2 : Finding your viewing channel

- Press STANDBY-ON () on the DVD player to turn it on.
- 2 Turn on the TV and set it to the correct video-in channel. You should see the blue DVD background screen.
 - → Usually these channel are between the lowest and highest channels and may be called FRONT, A/V IN, VIDEO. See your TV's manual for more details.
 - Or, you may go to channel I on your TV, then press the Channel down button repeatedly until you see the Video In channel.
 - Or, the TV remote control may have a button or switch that chooses different video modes.
 - → Or, set the TV to channel 3 or 4 if you are using an RF modulator.
- If you are using external equipment, (e.g. audio system or receiver), turn it on and select the appropriate input source for the DVD player output. Refer to the equipment user's manual for detail.








Getting Started (continued)

Step 3 : Setting up Progressive Scan feature

(for Progressive Scan TV only)
The progressive scan displays twice the number of frames per seconds than interlaced scanning (ordinary normal TV system). With nearly double the number of lines, progressive scan offers higher picture resolution and quality.

Before you start...

- Ensure that you have connected this
 DVD player to a progressive scan TV using the Y Pb Pr connection (see page 12).
- Ensure that you have completed the basic installation and set-up.
- Turn on your TV and set to interlace mode (refer to your TV user manual).
- Press POWER on the remote control to turn on the DVD player.
- Select the correct video-in channel.→ The DVD background menu appears.
- 4 Press SETUP.
- **⑤** Press **◆ ▶** to select **{VIDEO SETUP}**
- 6 Press ▲ ▼ repeatedly to select { VIDEO OUT }.




- Press ► to select { P-SCAN YPBPR }, then press OK.
 - → The menu will appear on the TV.



8 Press ◀ to select { OK } and press OK to confirm.

There will be a distorted picture on the TV at this state until you turn on the progressive scan mode on your TV.

- Turn on your TV progressive scan mode (refer to your TV user manual).
 - → The menu will appear on the TV.



Press ◀ to select { OK } and press OK to confirm.

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The setup is now completed and you can start enjoy the high quality picture.

To deactivate Progressive Scan manually:

Wait for 15 seconds for auto recovery.

Tip

- There are some progressive scan TVs and High-Definition TVs that are not fully compatible with this unit, resulting in the unnatural picture when playing back a DVD VIDEO disc in the progressive scan mode. In such a case, turn off the progressive scan feature on both the DVD player and your TV.

TIPS: The <u>underlined option</u> is the factory default setting.

Press ◀ to go back to previous menu item. Press **SETUP** to exit the menu item.

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Getting Started (continued)

Step 4 : Selecting the matching color system

The color system of the DVD player, disc and TV should match in order for the disc to play. Before changing the TV system, determine the color system of your TV.



- Press SETUP.
- ② Press ◀ ▶ to select { SYSTEM SETUP }
- ③ Press ▲ ▼ to select { TV SYSTEM }, then press ▶.
- 4 Use ▲ ▼ to select one of the options below:

{ **PAL** }

Select this if the connected TV has the PAL color system. It will change the video signal of an NTSC disc and output it to PAL format.

{ NTSC }

Select this if the connected TV has the NTSC color system. It will change the video signal of a PAL disc and output it to NTSC format.


{ MULTI }

Select this if the connected TV is compatible with both NTSC and PAL (multi-system). The output format will be in accordance with the video signal of the disc.

5 Select an item and press OK.

Tip:

 Before changing the current TV color setting, ensure that your TV supports the 'selected TV System'.

Step 5: Setting the language

The language options are different depending on your country or region. It may not correspond to the illustrations shown on the user manual.

On-screen display (OSD) language


Select this to change the language of this DVD player screen display menu. The menu language (on-screen display) for the system will remain as you set it.



- Press SETUP.
- ② Press ◀ ► to select { LANGUAGE SETUP }.
- 3 Press ▲ ▼ to highlight { OSD LANGUAGE }, then press ▶.
- Use ▲ ▼ to select a language and press OK.

Audio, Subtitle and Disc menu languages

You can choose your preferred language or soundtrack from audio, subtitles and DVD menu languages. If the selected language is not available on the disc, the disc's default language will be used instead.



- Press SETUP.
- ② Press ◀ ▶ to select { LANGUAGE SETUP }.
- ③ Press ▲ ▼ to highlight one of the options below, then press ►.

{ AUDIO LANG }

Select this to change disc soundtrack language.

{ SUBTITLE LANG }

Select this to change the subtitle language.


{ DISC MENU }

Select this to change the language of the disc menu.

- 4 Use ▲ ▼ to select a language and press OK to confirm.
- 6 Repeat steps 3 4 for other language settings.

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Playback from Disc





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Glossary

Analog: Sound that has not been turned into numbers. Analog sound varies, while digital sound has specific numerical values. These jacks send audio through two channels, the left and right.

Aspect ratio: The ratio of vertical and horizontal sizes of a displayed image. The horizontal vs. vertical ratio of conventional TVs. is 4:3, and that of wide-screens is 16:9.

AUDIO OUT Jacks: Jacks on the back of the DVD System that send audio to another system (TV, Stereo, etc.).

<u>Bit Rate</u>: The amount of data used to hold a given length of music; measured in kilobits per seconds, or kbps. Or, the speed at which you record. Generally, the higher the bit rate, or the higher the recording speed, the better the sound quality. However, higher bit rates use more space on a Disc.

<u>Chapter</u>: Sections of a picture or a music piece on a DVD that are smaller than titles. A title is composed of several chapters. Each chapter is assigned a chapter number enabling you to locate the chapter you want.

<u>Component Video Out Jacks</u>: Jacks on the back of the DVD System that send high-quality video to a TV that has Component Video In jacks (R/G/B, Y/Pb/Pr, etc.).

<u>Disc menu</u>: A screen display prepared for allowing selection of images, sounds, subtitles, multi-angles, etc recorded on a DVD.

<u>Digital</u>: Sound that has been converted into numerical values. Digital sound is available when you use the DIGITAL AUDIO OUT COAXIAL or OPTICAL jacks. These jacks send audio through multiple channels, instead of just two channels as analog does.

DivX 3.11/4.x/5.x/6.x: The DivX codec is a patent-pending, MPEG-4 based video compression technology, developed by DivXNetworks, Inc., that can shrink digital video to sizes small enough to be transported over the internet, while maintaining high visual quality.

<u>Dolby Digital</u>: A surround sound system developed by Dolby Laboratories containing up to six channels of digital audio (front left and right, surround left and right, center and subwoofer).

JPEG: A very common digital still picture format. A still-picture data compression system proposed by the Joint Photographic Expert Group, which features small decrease in image quality in spite of its high compression ratio.

MP3: A file format with a sound data compression system. ÒMP3Ó is the abbreviation of Motion Picture Experts Group I (or MPEG-I) Audio Layer 3. By using MP3 format, one CD-R or CD-RW can contain about I0 times as much data volume as a regular CD can.

<u>Multichannel</u>: DVD is specified to have each sound track constitute one sound field.

Multichannel refers to a structure of sound tracks having three or more channels.

Parental Control: A function of the DVD to limit playback of the disc by the age of the users according to the limitation level in each country. The limitation varies from disc to disc; when it is activated, playback will be prohibited if the software's level is higher than the user-set level.

PCM (Pulse Code Modulation): A system for converting analog sound signal to digital signal for later processing, with no data compression used in conversion.

Playback control (PBC): Refers to the signal recorded on video CDs or SVCDs for controlling reproduction. By using menu screens recorded on a Video CD or SVCD that supports PBC, you can enjoy interactive-type software as well as software having a search function.

<u>Progressive Scan</u>: It displays all the horizontal lines of a picture at one time, as a signal frame. This system can convert the interlaced video from DVD into progressive format for connection to a progressive display. It dramatically increases the vertical resolution.

Region code: A system for allowing discs to be played back only in the region designated beforehand. This unit will only play discs that have compatible region codes. You can find the region code of your unit by looking on the product label. Some discs are compatible with more than one region (or ALL regions).

<u>Title</u>: The longest section of a picture or music feature on DVD, music, etc., in video software, or the entire album in audio software. Each title is assigned a title number enabling you to locate the title you want.

<u>VIDEO OUT jack</u>: Jack on the back of the DVD System that sends video to a TV.
