#### **Batteries**



- Insert so the poles (+ and –) match those in the remote control.
- Do not use rechargeable type batteries.

- attempt to recharge alkaline or manganese batteries.
- use batteries if the covering has been peeled off.

Remove if the remote control is not going to be used for a long period of time. Store in a cool, dark place.


#### Preparation

Ensure the stands meet these conditions before purchasing them.

- Observe the diameter and length of the screws and the distance between screws as shown in the diagram.
- The stands must be able to support over 5 kg (11 lb.).
- The stands must be stable even if the speakers are in a high position.



Attach the stands with these holes.



#### Notes on speaker use

- You can damage your speakers and shorten their useful life if you play sound at high levels over extended periods.
- Reduce the volume in the following cases to avoid damage.
- When playing distorted sound.
- When the speakers are receiving howling from a record player, noise from FM broadcasts, or continuous signals from an oscillator, test disc, or electronic instrument.
- When adjusting the sound quality.
- When turning the unit on or off.

#### If irregular coloring occurs on your television

These speakers are designed to be used close to a television, but the picture may be affected with some televisions and setup combinations.

#### If this occurs, turn the television off for about 30 minutes.


The television's demagnetizing function should correct the problem. If it persists, move the speakers further away from the television.







Press again to replace the position.

This position is saved even if you turn the unit off, change the source or change discs. When you turn the unit on, reselect CD" or reinsert the disc whose position you memorized, "RESUME" lights on the display. Press [▶] (play) to start play from the memorized position. The position is cleared.

- After changing the source or selecting another disc, re-selecting the disc tray with the memorized position automatically starts playback.

### **Glossary**

#### **Decoder**

A decoder restores the coded audio signals on DVDs to normal. This is called decoding.

#### **Dolby Digital**

This is a method of coding digital signals developed by Dolby Laboratories. Apart from stereo (2-channel) audio, these signals can also be multi-channel audio. A large amount of audio information can be recorded on one disc using this method.

#### **DTS (Digital Theater Systems)**

This surround system is used in many movie theaters around the world. There is good separation between the channels, so realistic sound effects are possible.

#### Dynamic range

Dynamic range is the difference between the lowest level of sound that can be heard above the noise of the equipment and the highest level of sound before distortion occurs.

#### Film and video

DVD-Videos are recorded using either film or video. Usually, film is recorded at 24 frames per second, the rate movies are filmed at, while video is recorded at 30 frames per second.

#### Frame still and field still

Frames are the still pictures that go together to make a moving picture. There are about 30 frames shown each second.

One frame is made up of two fields. A regular television shows these fields one after the other to create frames.

A still is shown when you pause a moving picture. A frame still is made up of two alternating fields, so the picture may appear blurred, but overall quality is high.

A field still is not blurred, but it has only half the information of a frame still so picture quality is lower.

#### Interlace and progressive output

NTSC, the video signal standard, has 480 interlaced (I) scan lines, whereas progressive scanning uses twice the number of scan lines. This is called 480P. The video signals output from this unit's COMPONENT VIDEO OUT terminals (Y,  $P_{\text{B}},\ P_{\text{R}}$ ) allow you to enjoy higher quality pictures than if the signals were output from the VIDEO OUT terminal or S-VIDEO OUT terminal.

#### I/P/B

MPEG 2, the video compression standard adopted for use with DVD-Video, codes frames using these 3 picture types.

- I: Intra coded picture
  - This picture has the best quality and is the best to use when adjusting the picture.
- P: Predictive coded picture
  - This picture is calculated based on past I or P-pictures.
- B: Bidirectionally-predictive coded picture
  - This picture is calculated by comparing past and future I and P-pictures so it has the lowest volume of information.

#### Linear PCM (pulse code modulation)

These are uncompressed digital signals, similar to those found on CDs.

#### Playback control (PBC)

If a Video CD has playback control, you can select scenes and information with menus.

#### WMA, MP3, JPEG and CD text information

- Discs must conform to ISO9660 level 1 or 2 (except for extended formats).
- This unit is compatible with multi-session but if there are a lot of sessions it takes more time for play to start. Keep the number of sessions to a minimum to avoid this.
- The order in which tracks appear in the menus may differ from the order shown on your computer.

#### WMA


