- DO NOT OPEN THE MONITOR. There are no user serviceable parts inside and opening or removing covers may expose you to dangerous shock hazards or other risks. Refer all servicing to qualified service personnel.
- Do not spill any liquids into the cabinet or use your monitor near water.
- Do not insert objects of any kind into the cabinet slots, as they may touch dangerous voltage points, which can be harmful or fatal or may cause electric shock, fire or equipment failure.

**Image Persistence:** Image persistence is when a residual or "ghost" image of a previous image remains visible on the screen. Unlike CRT monitors, LCD monitors' image persistence is not permanent, but constant images being displayed for a long period of time should be avoided.

To alleviate image persistence, turn off the monitor for as long as the previous image was displayed. For example, if an image was on the monitor for one hour and a residual image remains, the monitor should be turned off for one hour to erase the image.

**NOTE:** As with all personal display devices, NEC DISPLAY SOLUTIONS recommends using a moving screen saver at regular intervals whenever the screen is idle or turning off the monitor when not in use.



#### CORRECT PLACEMENT AND ADJUSTMENT OF THE MONITOR CAN REDUCE EYE, SHOULDER AND NECK FATIGUE. CHECK THE FOLLOWING WHEN YOU POSITION THE MONITOR:



- For optimum performance, allow 20 minutes for warm-up.
- Adjust the monitor height so that the top of the screen is at or slightly below eye level. Your eyes should look slightly downward when viewing the middle of the screen.
- Position your monitor no closer than 40 cm and no further away than 70 cm from your eyes. The optimal distance is 50 cm.
- Rest your eyes periodically by focusing on an object at least 20 feet away. Blink often.
- Position the monitor at a 90° angle to windows and other light sources to minimize glare and reflections. Adjust the monitor tilt so that ceiling lights do not reflect on your screen.
- If reflected light makes it hard for you to see your screen, use an anti-glare filter.
- Clean the LCD monitor surface with a lint-free, non-abrasive cloth. Avoid using any cleaning solution or glass cleaner!
- Adjust the monitor's luminance and contrast controls to enhance readability.
- Use a document holder placed close to the screen.
- Position whatever you are looking at most of the time (the screen or reference material) directly in front of you to minimize turning your head while you are typing.
- Avoid displaying fixed patterns on the monitor for long periods of time to avoid image persistence (after-image effects).
- Get regular eye checkups.
- **NOTE:** This model is set up in the factory so that the NEC logo is briefly displayed after the monitor is powered on. This feature can be turned on or off in the Advanced OSD. In case you find such bright Brand Logo annoying in your reading room environment, you may easily switch this off.
  - By keeping the "EXIT" button pressed while this logo is displayed, the BOOT LOGO menu will appear. It is possible to change the BOOT LOGO setting to OFF.

#### Ergonomics

To realize the maximum ergonomics benefits, we recommend the following:


- Adjust the luminance until the background raster disappears.
- Do not position the Contrast control to its maximum setting.
- Use the preset Size and Position controls with standard signals.
- Use the preset Color Setting.
- Use non-interlaced signals with a vertical refresh rate of at least 60 Hz.
- Do not use primary color blue on a dark background, as it is difficult to see and may produce eye fatigue due to insufficient contrast.

#### **Cleaning the LCD Panel**

- When the liquid crystal panel is stained with dust or dirt, please wipe gently with soft cloth.
- Please do not rub the LCD panel with hard or coarse material.
- Please do not apply pressure to the LCD surface.
- Please do not use OA cleaner as it will cause deterioration or discolor on the LCD surface.

#### **Cleaning the Cabinet**


- Unplug the power supply
- Gently wipe the cabinet with a soft cloth
- To clean the cabinet, dampen the cloth with a neutral detergent and water, wipe the cabinet and follow with a dry cloth.
- **NOTE:** Many plastic parts are used on the surface of the cabinet. DO NOT clean with benzene, thinner, alkaline detergent, alcoholic system detergent, glass cleaner, wax, polish cleaner, soap powder, or insecticide. Do not touch rubber or vinyl to the cabinet for a long time. These types of fluids and fabrics can cause the paint to deteriorate, crack or peel.

## **Quick Start**

To attach the LCD monitor to your system, follow these instructions:

- NOTE: Make sure to read "Recommended Use" before installation. In order to display the maximum resolution, a display controller is required which can output a resolution of 1200 x 1600 (in portrait mode) or 1600 x 1200 (in landscape mode) for MD212MC and 1536 x 2048 (in portrait mode) or 2048 x 1536 (in landscape mode) for MD213MC/MD213MG. We recommend using a digital input.
- 1. Turn off the power to your computer.
- Connect the DVI signal cable to the connector of the display card in your system (Figure A.1). Tighten all screws. We recommend using a digital input. If you use an analog input, connect the 15-pin mini D-SUB to DVI-A signal cable (not included) or D-SUB to D-SUB cable (not included) (only for MD212MC) to the connector of the display card in your system (Figure A.2).




- 3. Rotate the screen to portrait mode. Refer to the "Screen rotation" section in this manual.
- 4. Place hands on each side of the monitor to tilt the LCD panel to a 30° angle and lift up to the highest position (**Figure C.1**).
- 5. Connect all cables to the appropriate connectors (Figure C.1).
- **NOTE:** Incorrect cable connections may result in irregular operation, damage display quality/components of LCD module and/or shorten the module's life.
- 6. To keep the cables neatly organized, place them into the cable management system that is built into the stand. Place the power cable into the specific hooks as indicated (**Figure C.2**).

Place the DVI cable and the 15-pin mini D-Sub to DVI-A cable (not included) into the hooks as indicated (**Figure C.3**). When using the monitor in Landscape mode, place the DVI cable and the 15-pin mini D-Sub to DVI-A cable (not included) into the hooks as indicated (**Figure C.4**).

7. Make sure all cables are resting flat against the stand (Figure C.3).

Please check Tilt, Raise and Lower monitor screen and screen rotation when you manage cables.








- 8. Hold all cables firmly and place the cable cover onto the stand (Figure D.1). To remove the cable cover, lift the cover off as shown in Figure D.2.
- 9. Connect one end of the power cord to the AC inlet on the back of the monitor and the other end to the power outlet.
- NOTE: Please refer to Caution section of this manual for proper selection of AC power cord.





10. Turn on the monitor with power switch on the top (Portrait) or left side (Landscape) of the monitor (**Figure E.1**). Turn on the computer.

NOTE: DO NOT switch on/off repeatedly.

- 11. No-touch auto adjust automatically adjusts the monitor to optimal settings upon initial setup for most timings. For further adjustments, use the following OSD controls:
  - Auto Contrast (Analog input only)
  - Auto Adjust (Analog input only)

Refer to the **Controls** section of this User's Manual for a full description of these OSD controls.

**NOTE:** If you have any problems, please refer to the **Troubleshooting** section of this User's Manual.




#### **Raise and Lower Monitor Screen**

The monitor may be raised or lowered in either Portrait or Landscape mode.

To raise or lower screen, place hands on each side of the monitor and lift or lower to the desired height (Figure RL.1).

NOTE: Handle with care when raising or lowering the monitor screen.




#### **Screen Rotation**

Before rotating, the screen must be raised to the highest level to avoid knocking the screen on the desk or pinching with your fingers.

To raise the screen, place hands on each side of the monitor and lift up to the highest position (**Figure RL.1**). To rotate screen, place hands on each side of the monitor screen and turn clockwise from Landscape to Portrait or counterclockwise from Portrait to Landscape (**Figure R.1**).

To rotate OSD menu between landscape and portrait, refer to "Controls" section.

NOTE: After screen rotation, please execute "Self Calibration" and "Gamma Adjust".

#### Flexible Arm Installation

This LCD monitor is designed for use with a flexible arm.

To prepare the monitor for alternate mounting purposes:

- . Refer to instructions included with the flexible arm for detailed instructions.
- To fulfill the safety requirements the monitor must be mounted to an arm, which guaranties the necessary stability under consideration of the weight of the monitor.

#### **Remove Monitor Stand**

1. Remove the cable cover.




2. Disconnect all cables.

NOTE:

Front sensor

- 3. Place hands on each side of the monitor and lift up to the highest position.
- 4. Make sure to rotate the screen 90° counter clockwise to the landscape position.
- 5. Place monitor face down on a non-abrasive surface. Be sure to not apply any stress or pressure to the front sensor. To avoid this, lay the display face down on a desk or table with the front sensor situated off the edge (Figure S.1).
- 6. Remove the 4 screws connecting the monitor to the stand (Figure S.2). Reverse process to reattach stand.









#### Mount Flexible arm

- 1. Change the 4 screws that were removed from the stand removal to attach the flexible arm to the monitor (Figure F.1).
- Caution: When mounting, use ONLY the screws (4 pcs) that were removed from the stand to avoid damage to the monitor or stand.
  - The monitor should only be used with an approved arm (e.g. GS mark).
  - When using mounting accessories (e.g. VESA (100 x 100), • use M4 size screws (Length: bracket thickness + 10mm). Recommended Fasten Force: 98 - 137N•cm
  - To avoid blocking vent, keep adequate space above and behind the monitor when using with flexible arm.






## The OSD (On-Screen Display) control buttons are located on the back of the monitor:

To access OSD menu, press the EXIT button. To change signal input, press the SELECT button.

**NOTE:** OSD must be closed in order to change signal input.





1 LED	Indicates that the power is on.
2 RESET	Resets the OSD back to factory settings. NOTE: With no input signal on the screen, press RESET button for at least 3 seconds to display the visual inspection (grayscale) drawing and check the display performance.
3 SELECT	Enters the OSD Control menu. Enters OSD sub menus. Changes the input source when not in the OSD Control menu.
4 UP/DOWN	Navigates up or down through the OSD Control menu.
5 LEFT/RIGHT	Navigates to the left or right through the OSD Control menu.
6 EXIT	Access OSD menu. Exits the OSD sub menu. Exits OSD Control menu.
7 AMBIENT LIGHT SENSOR	Detects the level of ambient light, allowing the monitor to make adjustments to various settings. Do not cover this sensor.
8 FRONT SENSOR	Detects luminance changes over time. Used for standalone and network controlled calibrations and conformance tests.
9 SENSOR PORT	For optional external sensor used for self calibration and copy calibration.
10 KEY GUIDE	The Key Guide appears on screen when the OSD control menu is accessed. The Key Guide will rotate when the OSD control menu is rotated.

#### SETTING OSD LANGUAGE

- Set the OSD language before using OSD functions.
- To access the "LANGUAGE SELECTION" menu, press control key (LEFT/RIGHT or UP/DOWN or EXIT).
- Press the LEFT/RIGHT or UP/DOWN buttons to select the desired OSD language.
- To exit from this OSD menu, press EXIT button.
- **NOTE:** Setting the OSD language is only necessary upon initial setup. The OSD language will stay the same until changed by the user.



#### Luminance/Contrast Controls

#### LUMINANCE

Adjusts the overall image and background screen luminance. When LUMINANCE is adjusting the numerical values blinks.

#### AUTO CONTRAST (Analog input only)

Adjusts the image displayed for non-standard video inputs.

#### BLACK LEVEL (Analog input only)

Adjust the black level manually.

#### Auto Adjust (Analog input only)

Automatically adjusts the Image Position and V.Size (H.Size) settings and Fine settings.

#### **Image Controls**

#### LEFT / RIGHT

Controls Horizontal Image Position within the display area of the LCD.

When digital QXGA (1536 x 2048 or 2048 x 1536) of the medical monochrome signal is connected, this function does not operate (MD213MC/MD213MG only).

#### DOWN / UP


Controls Vertical Image Position within the display area of the LCD.

When digital QXGA (1536 x 2048 or 2048 x 1536) of the medical monochrome signal is connected, this function does not operate (MD213MC/MD213MG only).

#### V.SIZE (H.SIZE) (Analog input only)

Adjust the horizontal size by increasing or decreasing this setting.

If the "AUTO Adjust function" do not give you a satisfactory picture setting, a further tuning can be performed using the "V.SIZE (H.SIZE)" function (dot clock). For this a Moiré test pattern could be used. This function may alter the width of the picture. Use Left/Right Menu to center the image on the screen. If the V.SIZE (H.SIZE) is wrongly calibrated, the result would look like the left drawing. The image should be homogeneous.




#### FINE (Analog input only)

Improve focus, clarity and image stability by increasing or decreasing this setting.

If the "Auto Adjust function" and the "V.SIZE (H.SIZE)" function do not give you a satisfactory picture setting, a fine tuning can be performed using the "Fine" function.

For this a Moiré test pattern could be used. If the Fine value is wrongly calibrated, the result would look like the left drawing. The image should be homogeneous.



#### **EXPANSION**

Sets the zoom method.

## Calibration

Before proper calibration can be performed, display should warm-up for a minimum of 30 minutes. If trying to start calibration before the monitor is warmed-up, a warning will appear on the screen (Figure 1).






- **NOTE:** Refer to the Key Map (**Figure A**) when changing settings during the calibration. Self calibration and Copy calibration can only be performed using the X-Rite i1 display2 sensor. During calibration activities and during normal operation, do not change the digital input. Always use the SAME digital input.
- **NOTE:** With no input signal on the screen, press LEFT and RIGHT button at the same time more than 3 seconds. The CALIBRATION menu will appear.

#### **Self Calibration**

1. To show the CALIBRATION menu, plug-in the USB sensor to the sensor port (Figure 2) or select CALIBRATION in the advanced menu (page 20).

- 6. Press SELECT to start the calibration. Front sensor calibration may take several minutes depending on user setting.


#### **Copy Calibration**

1. To show the CALIBRATION menu, plug-in the USB sensor to the sensor port (Figure 7) or select the CALIBRATION in the advanced menu (page 20).





- **NOTE:** Display A must display a white screen. Enter the Advanced OSD by pressing RESET and EXIT. Use LEFT and RIGHT keys to move into Tag A and select SELF TEST MODE.
- 2. Select COPY in the Mode selection in Display B (Figure 9).
- 3. Select ON or OFF in the SELF selection. If ON selected, SELF Calibration execute with COPY Calibration. Select the target GAMMA. Please select the same target GAMMA as Display A. Press SELECT to go to the next section.
- 4. The procedure will ask for the USB sensor to be placed on the center of the Display A panel (**Figure 10**). Tilt the display panel approximately 5° backward and place the USB sensor in the center of the display panel (**Figure 7**).




- 5. Press SELECT on Display B to start reading the white point\* and luminance information of Display A.
- 6. After copying the Display A information, the target luminance and target chromaticity coordinates will be stored and displayed in the OSD of Display B. The target value is not adjustable (**Figure 11**).
- 7. Remove USB sensor from source Display A and place in the center of Display B (Figure 8).

- 8. Press SELECT to start the copy calibration. Copy calibration may take several minutes depending on the user settings.





## Troubleshooting

#### No picture

- The signal cable should be completely connected to the display card/computer.
- The display card should be completely seated in its slot.
- Power Switch and computer power switch should be in the ON position.
- Check to make sure that a supported mode has been selected on the display card or system being used. (Please consult display card or system manual to change graphics mode.)
- Check the monitor and your display card with respect to compatibility and recommended settings.
- Check the signal cable connector for bent or pushed-in pins.
- Check the signal input, "DVI-D", "DVI-I" or "D-SUB" (only for MD212MC).

#### Power switch does not respond

• Unplug the power cord of the monitor from the AC outlet to turn off and reset the monitor.

#### **Image Persistence**

- Image persistence is when a residual or "ghost" image of a previous image remains visible on the screen. Unlike CRT
  monitors, LCD monitors' image persistence is not permanent, but constant images being displayed for a long period of
  time should be avoided. To alleviate image persistence, turn off the monitor for as long as the previous image was
  displayed. For example, if an image was on the monitor for one hour and a residual image remains, the monitor should
  be turned off for one hour to erase the image.
- **NOTE:** As with all personal display devices, NEC DISPLAY SOLUTIONS recommends using a moving screen saver at regular intervals whenever the screen is idle or turning off the monitor when not in use.

#### Message "OUT OF RANGE" is displayed (screen is either blank or shows rough images only)

- Image is displayed only roughly (pixels are missing) and OSD warning "OUT OF RANGE" is displayed: Either signal clock or resolution is too high. Choose one of the supported modes.
- OSD warning "OUT OF RANGE" is displayed on a blank screen: Signal frequency is out of range. Choose one of the supported modes.

#### Image is unstable, unfocused or swimming is apparent

- Signal cable should be completely attached to the computer.
- Use the OSD Image Adjust controls to focus and adjust display by increasing or decreasing the FINE adjustment. When the display mode is changed, the OSD Image Adjust settings may need to be readjusted.
- Check the monitor and your display card with respect to compatibility and recommended signal timings.
- If your text is garbled, change the video mode to non-interlaced and use 60Hz refresh rate.

#### LED on monitor is not lit (no green or amber color can be seen)

• Power Switch should be in the ON position and power cord should be connected.

#### Display image is not sized properly

- Use the OSD Image Adjust controls to increase or decrease the Coarse adjustment.
- Check to make sure that a supported mode has been selected on the display card or system being used. (Please consult display card or system manual to change graphics mode.)

#### No Video

- If no video is present on the screen, turn the Power switch off and on again.
- Make certain the computer is not in a power-saving mode (touch the keyboard or mouse).

#### Self Diagnosis

- The LCD display is equipped with the ability to self diagnose abnormalities. When the LCD detects a problem, the LED on the back flashes in a pattern of long and short blinks, depending on the type of problem detected.
- If the LED indicates a problem, please refer service to qualified personnel.
