#### FCC REQUIREMENTS

NEC America, Inc. VisuaLink 128/VisuaLink 384

#### **TYPE OF SERVICE**

The VisuaLink 128 and the VisuaLink 384 are stand-alone devices that allow multimedia conferencing by transmitting video, audio and data to remote locations over the ISDN Basic Rate interface. The VisuaLink 128 and VisuaLink 384 connect to the ISDN digital network through separately-registered NTI equipment. They provide POTS ports which allow a customer-provided 2500-type telephone access to the digital network.

This equipment complies with Part 68 of the FCC Rules. The equipment label will appear on the rear exterior panel of the unit and will provide the FCC Registration Number, NEC trade name, model number, serial number or date of manufacture and the country of origin.

#### **TELEPHONE COMPANY PROCEDURES**

The goal of the telephone company is to provide you with the best service it can. In order to do this, it may occasionally be necessary for them to make changes in their equipment, operations, or procedures. If these changes might affect your service or the operation of your equipment, the telephone company will give you notice, in writing, to allow you to make any changes necessary to maintain uninterrupted service.

If you have any questions about your telephone line, such as how many pieces of equipment you can connect to it, the telephone company will give you notice, in writing, to allow you to make any changes necessary to maintain uninterrupted service.

In certain circumstances, it may be necessary for the telephone company to request from you concerning the equipment which you have connected to your telephone line. Upon request of the telephone company, provide the FCC registration number and the ringer equivalence number (REN) of the equipment which is connected to your line; both of these items are listed on the equipment label The sum of all of the REN's on your telephone lines should be less than five in order to assure proper service from the telephone company. In some cases, a sum of five may not be usable on a given line.

#### **IF PROBLEMS ARISE**

If any of your telephone equipment is not operating properly, you should immediately remove it from your telephone lines, as it may cause harm to the telephone network. If the telephone company notes a problem, they may temporarily discontinue service. When practical, they will notify you in advance of this disconnection. If advance notice is not feasible, you will be notified as soon as possible. When you are notified, you will be given the opportunity to correct the problem and informed of your right to file a complaint with the FCC.

1.1 Applying for ISDN<br/>BRIThis device cannot be used unless a connection to ISDN BRI Communication<br/>Line is provided. Verify that a ISDN line exists before the CODEC is installed.

What to watch out for when filling out an ISDN BRI application:

#### As defined by Bellcore; the ISDN BRI simplified ordering code is EZ-ISDN1.

- The ISDN BRI protocol national ISDN-1.
- The ISDN BRI service must be tariffed and available from the customer's local central office.
- The D-Channel should not permit X.25 packet data.
- The ISDN BRI service must allow videoconferencing calls to be dialed on either B-Channel or on both simultaneously.
- Both B-Channel must carry circuit switched videoconferencing data.
- The ISDN BRI line required one or two different SPID numbers.
- The ISDN BRI service must be automatic Terminal Endpoint Identifiers (TEIs).

- Call number identification
- Redirecting number delivery





#### **Chapter 2 Introduction of VisuaLink**

2.1 About your VisuaLink The VisuaLink 128 and the VisuaLink 384 are devices that easily realize a multimedia conference by transmitting video, audio, and data to a remote location with the use of BRI service. The VisuaLink 128 and VisuaLink 384 provide a low-end TV conference for a small group of people when connected to a hands-free telephone. In addition, with a connection with a PC, a TV conference using data conference application such as an electric presentation will be available. The VisuaLink 128 and VisuaLink 128 and VisuaLink 384 also provide a high-performance model with a built-in echo canceller applicable for video conferences with microphones and speakers in a conference room.

2.1.1 The characteristics of VisuaLink 128 are


- You can use it as a high quality TV phone by connecting a TV, telephone, and video camera.
- You can use it as a serious business videoconference system by connecting optional video camera, microphone, and speakers.
- You can easily operate it from a telephone or a remote controller.
- You can connect any PC model for a conference with a PC. (However, a data conference software is required in your PC. Please contact to sales rep. to get information for what type of software is available for the data conference with the VL128.

2.1.2 The characteristics of VisuaLink 384 are the same as those for the VisuaLink 128 listed above, plus

- It has an internal IMUX.
- You can connect to three (3) NT-1s.

#### 2.2 Front Panel Description

This section briefly describes names and features of the VisuaLink 128 and VisuaLink 384.



#### ① POWER Switch

The push-button switch is used to turn on and off the main power. When the power is on, the power lamp will be lit.

- Remote controller optical receiver
   This is a optical receiver, which receives signal from remote controller.

Power Lamp (power) : a green light will eluminate when the power is ON. When the VisuaLink is powered OFF, there is no light.


Line connection status lamp (LINE)

④ Head set terminal


The head set jack is used to connect an optional headset.








From top left to down followed by top right to down.

- (a) MENU button Displays the configuration menus on-screen.
- (b) CALL button Displays the line connection menu.
- (c) HANG UP button Hangs-up the video conference line.
- (d) CALL PAGE button Allows for scrolling of on-screen menus.
- (e) CAMERA CONTROL button Provides Pan/Tilt control of the camera. In addition, provides up down/left/ right control of the cursor when the menu is displayed.




- (f) NUMERICAL button Used to enter preset dialing numbers and camera presets.
- (g) STATUS button Displays local time and conference status on-screen.
- (h) MUTE button Toggles between muting and unmuting the local mics.
- (i) VOLUME button Allows adjustment of the audio output.
- (j) CANCEL button Cancel the last entered using the on-screen menus.
- (k) ENTER button Stores a value set by the user.

- 5. NEAR END button Activates local camera control.




- 6. SNAPSHOT VIEW button Displays the graphic camera image.

After completing the external phase, start the initial setting of VisuaLink.

- **3.1 Preparation** ① Put the attached two batteries in the attached remote controller.
  - <sup>②</sup> Turn the VisuaLink and all external equipment power in the **ON** position.
  - ③ Position the TV monitor and the VisuaLink system so that they can be viewed.
- **3.2 Turn Power ON or** The VisuaLink can be turned **ON** or **OFF** by the **POWER SWITCH** on the front. **OFF**



Turning on the power:

Press the **POWER SWITCH** on the front of the VisuaLink. While the unit is powering up, the green LED power lamp and Line B1 and B2-B6 light simultaneously. While the system is in an initialize state, a blue screen with the message **Please wait for a while** will be displayed on the monitor. When the VisuaLink has completed its initialization, the message will disappear and be replaced with a preview video image. In addition the B1 and B2-B6 LEDs will be extinguished.

- *Note 1:* Unstable picture and sound may momentarily be output at the start of the initialization.
- *Note 2:* If Line B1 B2-B6 LEDs do not extinguish after initialization (about 30 seconds), please turn power **OFF** and then back to the **ON** position.

#### **Turning power OFF:**

When the **POWER SWITCH** is pressed while the power is in the **ON** position, the power turns **OFF**. The power lamp extinguishes when the power is **OFF**.

## **Chapter 4 Application Setup**

**4.1 Guidelines** The following are key points when installing the VisuaLink.

- (1) The VisuaLink should be installed on a flat surface. It is not recommended that the unit be installed on its side.
- (2) Please allow for 2 inches (6 centimeters) on both sides of the equipment for ventilation.
- (3) Allow the front of the unit to be visible.

The following are the specifications for the IR receiver/transmitter.

- (1) The receiver is able to receive an IR signal up to 20 feet (6 meters).
- (2) The IR receiver should be able to receive a signal at an angle of 30 degrees or less from the left to right.
- (3) The IR receiver should be able to receive a signal at an angle of 15 degrees or less from the top to bottom.

Please place only light objects on the equipment such as a telephone.

**4.2 Hardware** The preceeding sections will give step by step procedures for the installation of the VisuaLink system in specific applications. Pick the application and follow the instructions. This section gives a description on how to setup a VisuaLink as a stand alone.




Figure 4-1: Connection Diagram for VisuaLink 128





Figure 4-2: Connection Diagram for VisuaLink 384

#### **③** Connect a microphone to the VisuaLink.

Plug the 3 1/2 mini connector into the VisuaLink connection marked MIC1.

#### (4) Connect the Video Camera to the VisuaLink.

Using the provided video cable, plug one end into the connection marked **VIDEO IN** on the D30 camera. Plug the other end of the video cable into the VisuaLink connection labeled **VIDEO IN 1**.

#### **©** Connect the camera control to the VisuaLink.

With a 8 pin minidin to 8 pin minidin, plug one end into the D30 camera connection marked **VISCA IN**. Plug the other end into the VisuaLink connection marked **SERIAL 1**.

#### **6** Connect the camera power.

Plug the Camera AC Power to the AC Power Strip at the bottom of the cabinet.

#### O Connect the VisuaLink AC Power.

Using the provided AC transformer power cable, plug the power cable into the VisuaLink connection marked **DC-IN-5V**. Plug the other end into the AC Power Strip.




Figure 4-3: Connection Diagram for VisuaLink 128





Figure 4-4: Connection Diagram for VisuaLink 384




Figure 4-5: Connection Diagram for VisuaLink 128




Figure 4-6: Connection Diagram for VisuaLink 384






Figure 4-7: Equipment Placement


In this chapter you will learn to make and receive calls. The Dialing Directory is a phone book that you create, listing the names and phone numbers of the sites that you can call. Once you have entered these names and numbers into the Dialing Directory, you can call a site by either Directory dialing or speed dialing. The final section is how to receive a call on your VisuaLink.

- 6.1 Place a Manual<br/>CallYou can manually dial a call by pressing the buttons on the handheld remote the<br/>same way you dial a telephone.
  - ① To manually dial a call, press the CALL button.
  - *Note:* With video calls, you may have to enter two (2) telephone numbers instead of one due to the ISDN BRI network connections often consist of two (2) lines within one ISDN cable.

- 6.2 Set Speed Dial Number
   The Dialing Directory is a phone book that you create, listing the names and phone numbers of the remote sites. It makes dialing calls faster and easier. When you add a new directory entry, you enter the site name and the phone number. When you add an entry, the speed dial directory assigns a speed dial number for that site. The next time you want to call that site, you can simply type in the speed number or highlight the site name.

#### 8.2 Volume Control



Also, if the volume of the monitor is too high or too low, the people at the far-end may hear echo. In general, leave the monitor volume level set to about middle position. If the far-end does hear echoes, turn the near-end monitor volume down until the echo disappears.

### 8.3 Muting Your Microphone

If you want to speak privately to someone at your site during your videoconference, you can mute your microphone.





8.4 Switching Monitor Screens
 During a Video conference, you may want to see a preview of local site to transmit or a still-picture in addition to seeing pictures sent from the remote. Use the Monitor Switching Feature. The user is able to switch the picture at the local site.

8.4.1 Preview the Local image

Previewing simply means looking at the image from your main camera or your document camera so that you can make any adjustments before the videoconference starts. For example, you may want to zoom the main camera in or out or point it at a different location.

- ① Choose the camera, using the MAIN CAM or CAM 2 button.
- 2 Press the **PREVIEW** button.









- *Note 2:* Please refer to Section 7.2 Picture-in-Picture Menu to change the PIP display position.
- 8.6.2 Delete the PIP
- ① Press the **PIP** button.






8.7 Send a Snapshot During a meeting, you may want to distribute copies of a diagram or pass around an illustration so that everyone can take a closer look at what you are discussing. You can do the same in a videoconference by sending a snapshot. A snapshot is a picture like an electric photograph that you can send to the far-end.

- 8.7.1 Send a snapshot
- ① Press either the MAIN CAM or CAM 2 button to view the image from the camera.






- ② Adjust the image using the CAMERA CONTROL and/or ZOOM button; keep doing this until the camera is showing the image exactly the way you want it.
- ③ Press **SEND** button in the **SNAPSHOT** area. The snapshot appears on the far-end screen and on your screen and whatever you were viewing at the far-end appears in your PIP. Whenever a snapshot appears, you also see the message **STILL** at the upper left corner of the screen. This is your indication that a **STILL** is being shown in the monitor.







  - ① Press **NUMBER** button (1 to 9).
  - *Note 1:* The camera moves to a stored position, and the speaker's name is displayed. The speaker's name is displayed not only at the local room but also on the monitor at the remote location.
  - *Note 2:* Menu cannot be displayed while the preset is activated.



8.10 Pointer Display Pointer is used to highlight an area on the video monitor. The pointer can be displayed on documents, diagrams and motion video. The pointer is controlled on a first come, first served bases. Control can only be surrendered when the pointer button is released.

### Appendix D How to Order ISDN BRI

This appendix contains the minimum ISDN BRI specification that the VisuaLink can operate. If you should have any question about the ISDN ordering procedure, please call your videoconferencing provider.

The ISDN configuration can be a complicated process. Things to remember when ordering your ISDN.

- The VisuaLink only uses one type of ISDN, BRI.
- The How to configure the ISDN BRI form provides most of the information you need to configure your system for ISDN service

### How to Configure the ISDN BRI

The key to making configuration as easy as possible is getting the right information from your network service provider. In addition to providing your network service provider with the correct your specification. When ordering your ISDN NEC recommends that you go through the following ISDN ordering procedure to assure accurate information from your network service provider has been received and provided.

1. The videoconferencing user fills out the following. The user then forwards this information and the Network provider information to the Network provider.

The Site location where the ISDN BRI service will be installed:

*Note:* You will need to plug your videoconferencing system into a device called an NT1 before you plug the system into your ISDN BRI wall jack. This assumes that the ISDN BRI service will be coming directly from the Telco and not an inhouse switch (such as NEAX2400 or 2000). You must identify who will be providing the NT1.

2. The network provider provisions the correct ISDN BRI and completes the following list of questions.

### **ISDN BRI Service Specification needed:**

### As defined by Bellcore; the ISDN BRI simplified ordering code is EZ-ISDN1.

- The ISDN BRI protocol National ISDN-1
- The ISDN BRI service must be terrified and available from the customer's local central office.
- The D channel should not permit X.25 packet data
