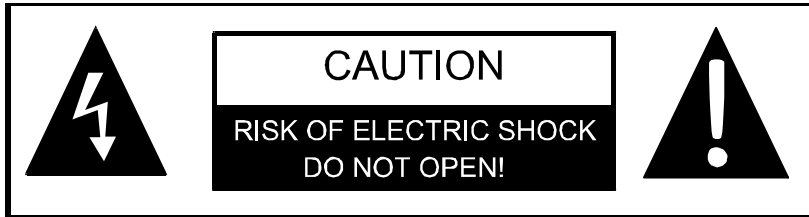

POWER SUPPLY:


Connect the supplied adapter to the side of the DVD player in the slot marked "Power In". Plug the two-prong end of the power cord to an AC100-120V outlet. If you have difficulty inserting the plug, turn it over and reinsert it, if the unit will not be used for a long time, disconnect the plug from the outlet.

Before plugging the power cord into an AC outlet, make sure that all the connections have been made.

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View of Front Panel



- 1. +/- button**
Press to adjust the value of brightness and color.
- 2. AUDIO/ FUNC button**
Press AUDIO button to select different languages when a DVD disc which contains multiple audio languages is played. Press AUDIO button to select different audio track when a CD disc is played.
Press the FUNC button to change the brightness and color level. Press FUNC button and hold for 1-2 seconds to change the aspect ratio between 16:9 and 4:3.
- 3. SLOW/ A-B Repeat button**
Press SLOW button to activate the slow playback function.
Press A-B Repeat button to play a certain selected segment repeatedly.
- 4. TITLE/ SETUP button**
Press TITLE button to access to or exit from the title menu if it exists in the disc.
Press SETUP button to enter the player's system setup.

Press MENU button to access to or exit from the menu.

Press SOURCE button to shift between AV MODE and DVD mode.

6. ■ / ►|| button

Press ►|| once to pause the playback and press it again to resume the playback.

7. Remote Control Sensor

Receive the signal from the remote control for operation.

8. ►► ◀◀ ◀◀ button

Press ►► button to select different options or to search forward fast.

Press ◀◀ button to select different options or to search backward fast.

Press ◀◀ button to select different options or to return to the previous list, track or chapter.

Press ►► button to select different options or to skip to the next list, track or chapter.

Press to access playback or confirm your selection.

- 1. Volume Control**

- 4. Video input/output Jack**
For connecting an external monitor / video source.
- 5. DC 9.5V Input Jack**
For connecting Power supply / Car Adapter.
- 6. OPEN Switch**
Push to open the disc tray cover.
- 7. Disc tray cover**
When the disc is loaded gently, press the cover to close it.

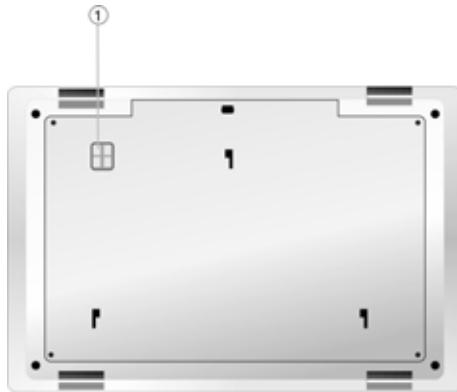

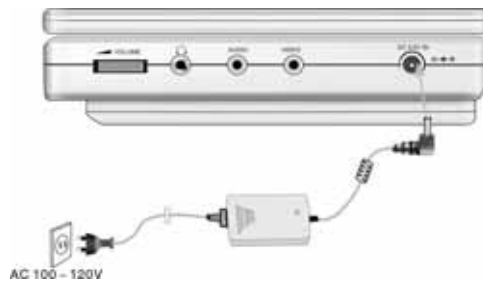

1. Rechargeable Battery Contacts

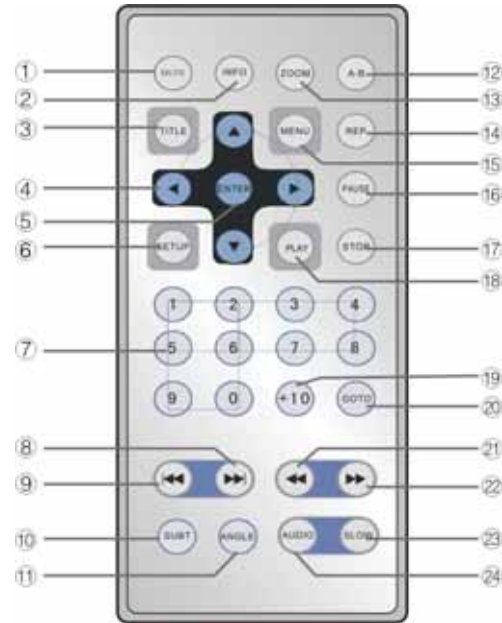
For connecting the rechargeable battery pack. You can use the AC adapter to charge the battery as shown below.



Note:

- **This unit comes without rechargeable battery. Please buy corresponding rechargeable battery separately.**
- Before charging, make sure that the power switch on the left side of the unit is switched off.
- When charging the battery pack, the charge light at the pack side will turn red. When the charging is complete, the light will turn green.

View of Remote Control



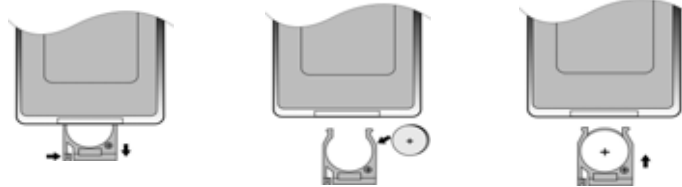
1. **MUTE button**
Press to turn off or on the speaker output.
2. **INFO button**
Press repeatedly to display or conceal the detailed information of the disc during playback.
3. **TITLE button**
Press to access to or exit from the title menu if it exists in the disc.
4. **Direction button**
Press to select different options.
5. **ENTER button**
Press to access playback or confirm your selection.
6. **SETUP button**
Press to enter the player's setup menu.
7. **0-9 number buttons**
Press to select number.

8. **▶▶ NEXT button**
Press to skip to the next list, track or chapter.
9. **◀◀ PREV button**
Press to return to the previous list, track or chapter.
10. **SUBT button**
When playing a DVD coded with multi-subtitles, press to select a subtitle language or to turn subtitles off.
11. **ANGLE button**
Press to access various camera angles if the DVD disc contains multiple camera angles.
12. **A-B button**
Press to play a section of the disc from point A to point B. Press once to select the starting point A, press again to select the end point B. During A-B repeat playback, press this button to stop the repeat.
13. **ZOOM button**
Press to realize various zoom functions.
14. **REP button**
Press to repeat a chapter, title, and cancel the repeat in sequence.
15. **MENU button**
Press to access to or exit from the menu during playback.
16. **PAUSE button**
Press to pause playback. Press the PLAY button to resume normal playback.
17. **STOP button**
Press to stop playback. Then press the PLAY button to resume playback from the stopped spot. Press this button twice to stop playback completely.
18. **PLAY button**
Press to start playback.
19. **+10 button**
Press this button first and then the additional number buttons as needed to select number greater than 9.
20. **GOTO button**
Press to select the desired title, chapter or playback start time.
21. **◀◀ REV SCAN button**
Press to search backward fast during playback.
22. **▶▶ FWD SCAN button**
Press to search forward fast during playback.
23. **SLOW button**
Press to activate slow playback function.
24. **AUDIO button**
Press to select different languages when a DVD disc with multiple audio languages is played. Press to select different audio track when a CD disc is played.

Installation Steps

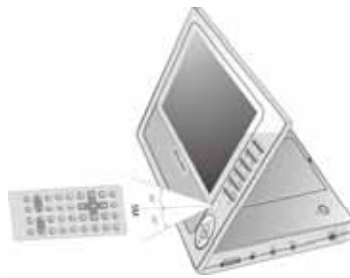
Follow the steps below to install the battery.

1. Pull the battery holder out from the remote control in the direction of the arrow.
2. Load a new battery properly with the (+) side up.
3. Insert the battery holder back into the remote control.



Use of Remote Control

Point the remote control unit from no more than about 5m from the remote control sensor and within about 60 degrees of the front of the unit.



Note

- The battery will last for about 1 year under normal use (at room temperature).
- Improper use of the battery may cause overheating, explosion or ignition, which can result in an injury or a fire. Battery leakage may damage the remote control.
- Do not expose the remote control unit to direct sunlight.
- Do not recharge, disassemble, deform or heat the battery.
- Do not put the battery in fire or water.
- Immediately replace the exhausted battery.
- Take out battery when the remote is not in use for a long time.

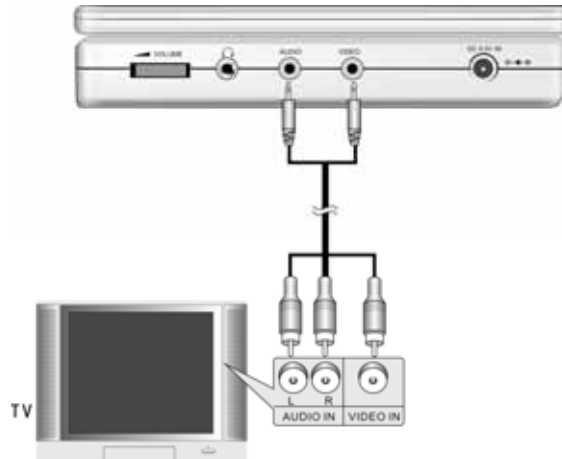
System Connections

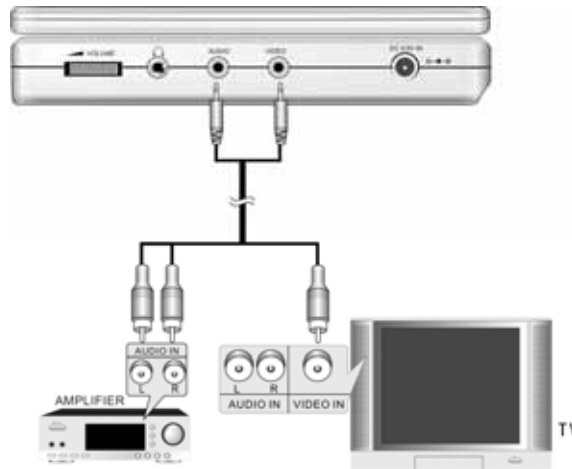
Audio/Video connections

NOTE:

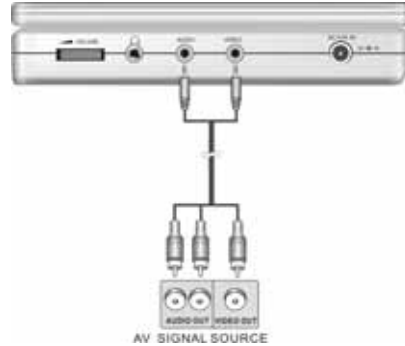
- Excessive loud volume could damage your hearing.

- When headphone is connected, the speakers will automatically turn off.

System Connections

Connecting to External AV Source

The unit supports AV signal input function. Please use the audio/video cable to connect the unit to the external AV signal source such as a DVD, VCR etc. after connecting, press SOURCE button on the front panel to select AV mode.

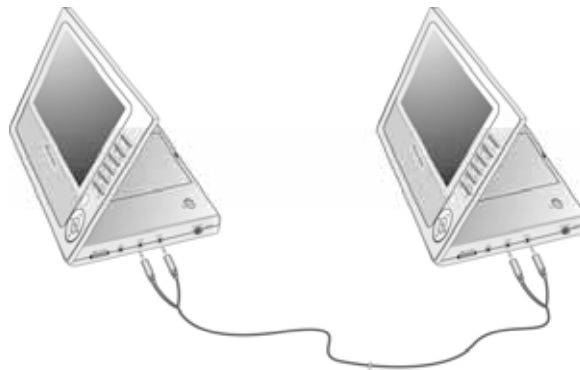
Note: Noise may occur in speakers when there is an external audio signal input while playing a DVD disc. Unplug the audio cable to clear the noise.



Connecting to DVD Player

Audio/Video connections

Follow the drawings below to connect a DVD player to another same unit by using the audio/video cable that is the same as the figure below. If one of the DVD players is playing, you can enjoy simultaneously at another unit.



Using the AC Adapter

The player is supplied with an AC adapter for powering the unit and charging the battery.

1. Connect AC adapter to the right side of the DVD player in the jack marked DC 9.5V IN, as shown on the right.
2. Plug the other end of the power cord into the wall AC outlet.



NOTE: Turn player's power off before unplugging.

Using of Car Adapter

The player is supplied with a Car Adapter for powering two units while in a vehicle.

Connect the Car Adapter Power Plug to the units' power jacks and plug the other end to the vehicle's cigarette socket. As shown on the right.





Attention

- Do not operate the units or view video software while driving a vehicle.
- Place the units in a proper position for viewing.
- Disconnect the players from the Car Adapter when starting the vehicle.

Operation methods of some DVD discs are specified by the software manufacturer. Please follow the instructions of those discs.

Care of Discs

Holding Discs

Do not touch the playing surfaces when loading or removing discs. Hold the disc as right picture.



Cleaning

Fingerprints or stain on the disc may affect the quality of sound and picture. To clean your discs, use a soft clean cloth to wipe them. If necessary, moisten a soft cloth with diluted neutral detergent to remove heavy dirt or fingerprints.



Do not wipe in a circular direction as the figure in the right middle (concentric scratches on the disc groove tend to cause noise). Gently wipe from the center of the disc to the outer edge as the right figure.

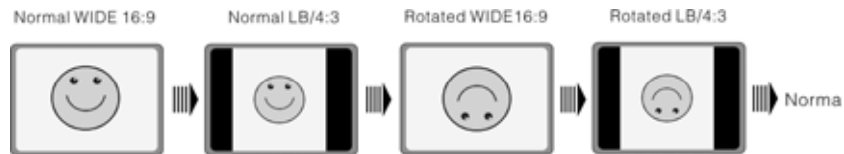
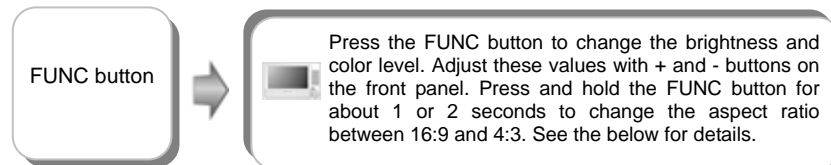
Pre-operation

1. Connect the unit to power supply through the provided AC adaptor.
2. Switch "POWER ON/OFF" to "ON" on the left panel to turn on the DVD player.
3. Press OPEN button on the unit to open the disc tray cover, put a disc in the disc tray with printed side facing up. Close the disc cover. (See below)



4. The player will read the disc automatically.
5. Adjust the volume with the VOLUME control on the right panel to the desired level.
6. To turn the player off, switch the "POWER ON/OFF" on the left panel to "OFF".

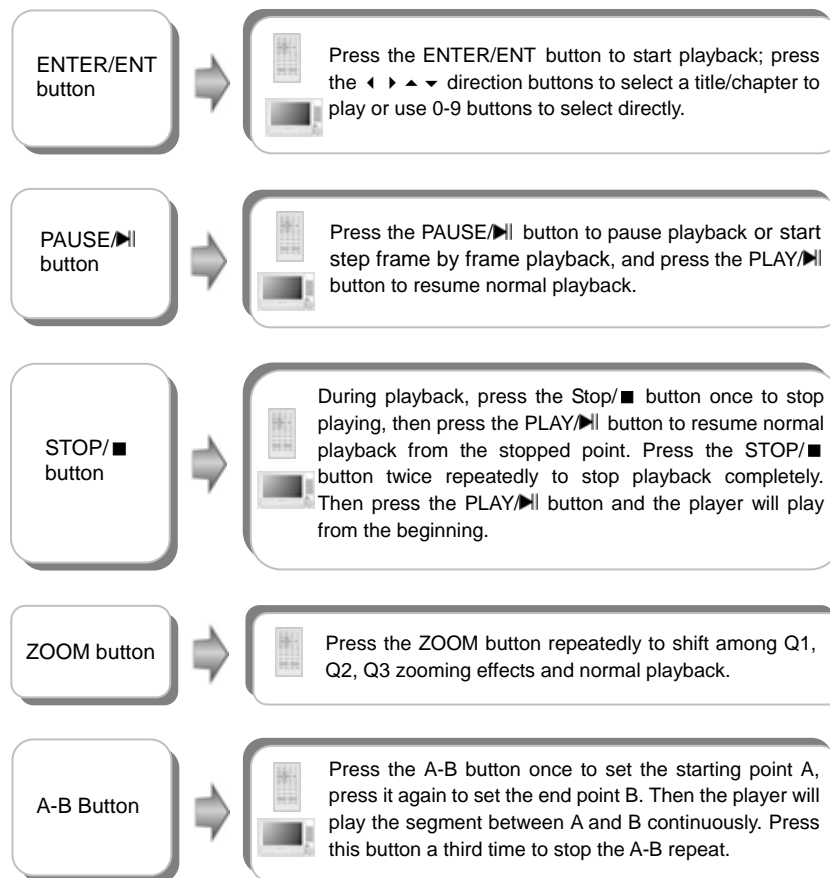

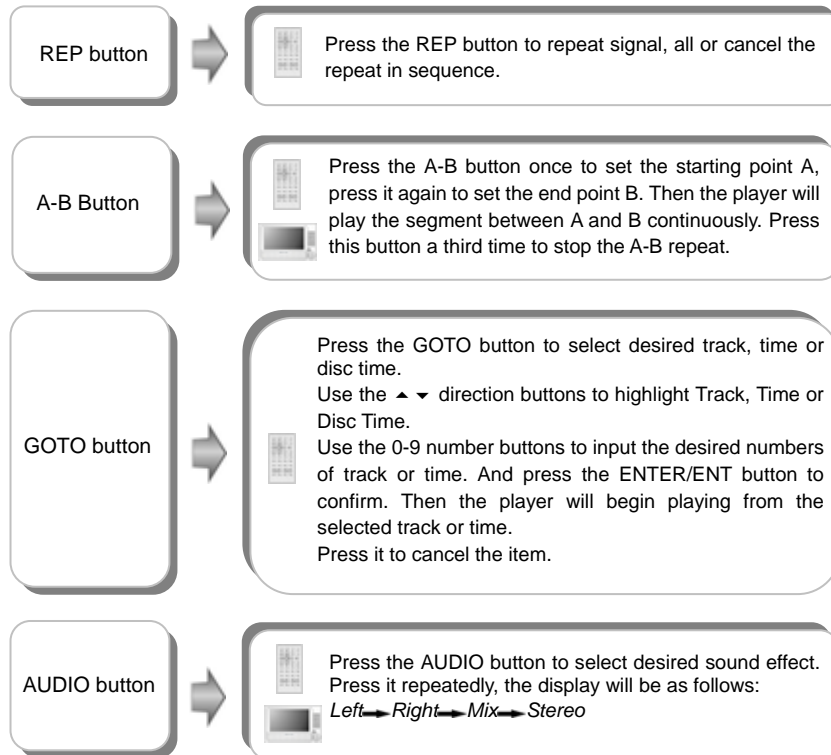
CD Playback

When a CD disc is loaded, the player will read the disc. Then a playback menu will appear on the screen and the player will play the disc automatically by the default sequence of the disc. You can use the **⏮** **⏭** buttons to select the desired track. Or press the number buttons to input the number of the desired track first and then press the ENTER/ENT button to confirm to play.

JPEG Playback

Pre-operation

1. Load a JPEG in the disc tray, the player will read the disc automatically.
2. The screen displays the root folder with several subdirectories/subfolders. Press the ENTER/ENT button to enter. Use the ▲ ▼ buttons to select a desired folder and press the ENTER/ENT button to confirm your selection.
3. The screen enters the selected subfolder with several pictures. Press the ▲ ▼ buttons to select the desired picture and press the ENTER/ENT button to enter the playback.
4. Press the ▲ ▼ buttons to highlight  .., then press the ENTER/ENT button to return to the last folder or directory.

NOTE: Many discs have other items besides pictures.

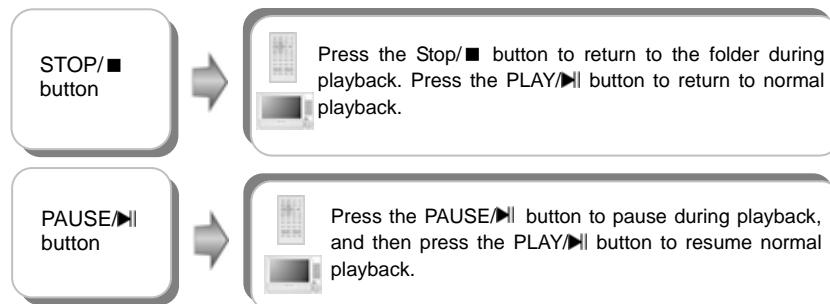
Filter and Repeat setup

Under the folder mode, press the direction buttons to highlight "Filter" and you can change its settings according to the steps below:


1. Press the ENTER/ENT button to enter the setup menu.
2. Press the ▲ ▼ button to select the item you want to set.
3. Press the ENTER/ENT button to select or cancel.
4. Press the ◀ button to exit.


Under the folder mode, press the direction buttons to highlight "Repeat" and press ENTER/ENT button repeatedly to change its setting. You can also press the REP button on the remote control to change its setting.

◀◀&▶▶ buttons →  During playback, press the ◀◀ button to go to the previous picture; press the ▶▶ button to go to the next picture.

REP button →  Press the REP button to repeat single, folder or cancel the repeat in sequence.

Picture Rotate

 During browsing a picture, you can use the direction buttons to rotate the current picture.

Press the ▶ button to rotate the current picture 90° clockwise, as shown below:



Press the ▼ button to rotate the current picture 180° clockwise, as shown below:



Press the ◀ button to rotate the current picture 270° clockwise, as shown below:



System Setup

You can change the default settings of this unit to customize its performance to your own preference. Read this section to learn how to set up the system.

Follow the steps below to set up your system:

1. Press the SETUP button and the setup menu will appear on the screen.
2. Press the ▲ ▼ buttons to select a sub-menu that you want to set up and press the ► button to enter the menu.
3. Press the ◀ button to return to the previous menu. Or press the SETUP button again at any time during the setting to exit from the setup menu.

Language setup

1. OSD language

This item is used to set the OSD (on-screen display) language.

Press the ▲ ▼ buttons to highlight this item. Press the ENTER/ENT or ► button to enter the setup of this item.

There are several languages for you to choose. Press the ▲ ▼ buttons to choose the proper one. Press the ENTER/ENT button to confirm your selection and return.

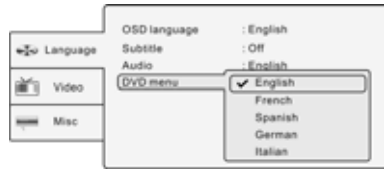
2. Subtitle

Press the \blacktriangle \blacktriangledown buttons to choose the proper one. Press the ENTER/ENT button to confirm your selection and return.



3. Audio

This item is used to set the audio output language. Press the \blacktriangle \blacktriangledown buttons to highlight this item. Press the ENTER/ENT or \blacktriangleright button to enter the setup of this item. There are several languages for you to choose. Press the \blacktriangle \blacktriangledown buttons to choose the proper one. Press the ENTER/ENT button to confirm your selection and return.



4. DVD menu

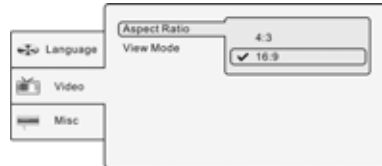

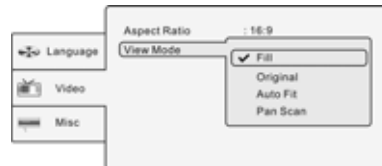

1. Aspect Ratio

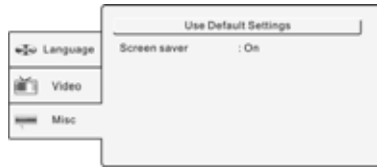
This item is used to set aspect ratio. Press the ▲ ▼ buttons to highlight this item. Press the ENTER/ENT or ► button to enter the setup of this item. Press the ▲ ▼ buttons to choose 4:3 or 16:9. Press the ENTER/ENT button to confirm your selection and return.
NOTE: Select 4:3 when a 4:3 TV is connected. Select 16:9 when a 16:9 wide screen TV is connected.



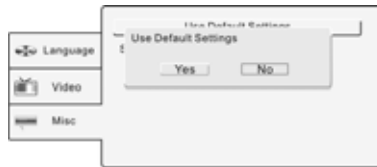
2. View Mode

This item is used to set the video mode of the unit screen display. Press the ▲ ▼ buttons to highlight this item. Press the ENTER/ENT or ► button to enter the setup of this item. There are several items for you to choose. Press the ▲ ▼ buttons to choose the proper one. Press the ENTER/ENT button to confirm your selection and return.

Misc setup



Press the SETUP button and press the ▲ ▼ buttons to select Misc. The screen will display as shown left.



1. Use Default Settings

This item is used to reset the unit to the default. Press the ▲ ▼ buttons to highlight this item. Press the ENTER/ENT button to enter the setup of this item.

Use the ◀ ▶ buttons to choose Yes or No and press the ENTER/ENT button to confirm

Choose Yes, all the setting of the unit will return to the default status; choose No, it will return.



2. Screen saver

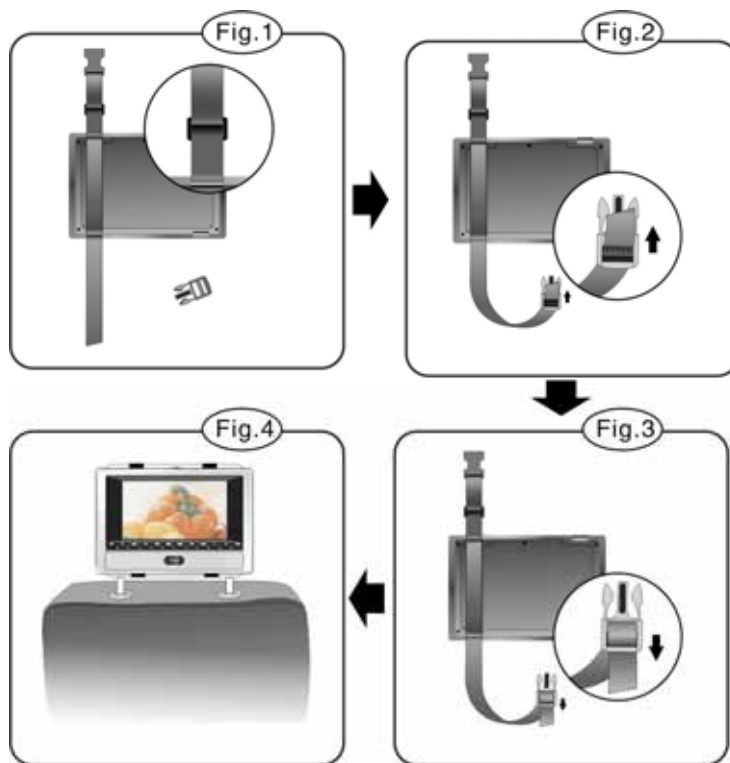
This item is used to set screen saver On or Off. Press the ▲ ▼ buttons to highlight this item. Press the ENTER/ENT or ▶ button to enter the setup of this item.

Press the ▲ ▼ buttons to choose On or Off. Press the ENTER/ENT button to confirm your selection and return.

Usage of straps

Follow the steps below to fix the DVD Player onto a car seat headrest.

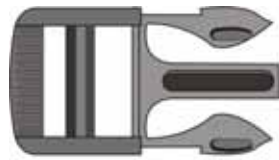
1. Place the DVD player on a soft and smooth surface with the bottom facing up.
2. Loosen the strap and remove the buckle from the strap.
3. Insert the strap through the holes as the Fig.1. Make sure the inside of the strap faces up.
4. Thread the strap into the buckle as Fig.2 and Fig.3. After threading, make sure the outside of the buckle faces up.



Usage of straps

5. Repeat these steps for the other strap.
6. Adjust the length of the strap according to the backrest of the seat.
7. Fasten the straps on the headrest of the seat as in Fig.4. Make sure the two straps are between the headrest support rods (if your car has them).

NOTE: The drawings show the outside and the inside of the buckle and the strap.

Definitions

Letterbox screen

This refers to a screen on which the playback picture of wide-screen DVDs appears with black bands running along the top and bottom.

Pan & Scan screen

This refers to a screen on which the playback picture of wide-screen DVDs is cut off at the left and right sides.

Title, Chapter (DVD)

DVDs are divided into some large sections (titles) or some small sections (chapters). Each section is numbered: these numbers are called "Title number" or "Chapter number".

CDs are divided into some sections (tracks). Each section is numbered; these numbers are called "Track number".

JPEG

JPEG is a common picture format that has small file size and low quality loss rate of picture. Hundreds of pictures can be stored in a disc in this format. In order to utilize real digital album, use film to make a "PICTURE CD" in JPEG format.



Troubleshooting

Take steps described in the tables below to solve simple problems before contacting after-sales service.

If You Suspect Something Wrong, immediately turn the power off. Disconnect the power connector and check that there is neither smoke nor heat from the unit before asking for repairs. Never try to repair the unit by yourself because it is dangerous to do so.

Other possibilities:
