6. Never Touch this Unit with Wet Hands

7. Installing this Unit

- Install this unit in a well-ventilated location.

8. Care

Occasionally, you should dust this unit all over with a soft cloth. For stubborn stains, use a soft cloth dampened with a weak solution of mild detergent and water. Dry the unit immediately afterwards with a clean cloth. Do not use abrasive cloths, thinners, alcohol, or other chemical solvents, because they may damage the finish or remove the panel lettering.

9. Handling Notes

- If you need to transport this unit, use the original packaging to pack it how it was when you originally bought it.
- Do not use volatile liquids, such as insect sprays, near this unit. Do not leave rubber or plastic items on this unit for a long time, because they may leave marks on the case.
- This unit's top and rear panels may get warm after prolonged use. This is normal.
- When you've finished using this unit, remove all discs and turn off the power.
- If you do not use this unit for a long time, it may not work properly the next time you turn it on, so be sure to use it occasionally.

10. To Obtain a Clear Picture

This unit is a high-tech, precision device. If the lens on the optical pickup, or the disc drive mechanism becomes dirty or worn, the picture quality may be affected. To maintain the best picture quality, we recommend regular inspection and maintenance (cleaning or worn part replacement) every 1,000 hours of use depending on the operating environment. Contact your Onkyo dealer for details.

11. Moisture Condensation

Moisture condensation may damage this unit.

Read the following carefully:

When you take a glass containing a cold drink outside on a summer's day, drops of water, called condensation, form on the outside of the glass. Similarly, moisture may condense on the lens of the optical pickup, one of the most important parts inside this unit.

- Moisture condensation can occur in the following situations:
 - The unit is moved from a cold place to a warm place.
 - A heater is turned on, or cold air from an air conditioner is hitting the unit.
 - In the summer, when this unit is moved from an air conditioned room to a hot and humid place.
 - The unit is used in a humid place.
- Do not use this unit when there's the possibility of moisture condensation occurring. Doing so may damage your discs and certain parts inside this unit. If condensation does occur, remove all discs and leave this unit turned on for two to three hours. By this time, the unit will have warmed up and any condensation will have evaporated. To reduce the risk of condensation, keep this unit connected to a wall outlet.

- The DV-CP802 will play only Region 1 NTSC DVD-Video discs.
- Some audio CDs feature copy protection that doesn't conform to the official CD standard. Since these are nonstandard discs, they may not play properly on the DV-CP802.
- The DV-CP802 supports CD-R and CD-RW discs recorded in Video CD format, audio CD format, or ISO9660 Level 2 format with MP3 and JPEG files. It also supports DVD-R and DVD-RW discs recorded in DVD-Video or DVD-Audio format. However, some CD-R/RW and DVD-R/RW discs may not work properly for any of the following reasons: incomplete disc finalization, disc burner characteristics, disc characteristics, the disc is damaged or dirty. See the manual supplied with your disc burner for more information. Condensation or dirt on the optical pickup lens can also affect playback.

Unsupported DVD Features

The DVD standard offers many special features, including multiple soundtracks, subtitles, camera angles, and so on. However, not all discs use all of these features. When you attempt to use a feature that is not used by the current disc, for example, you press the remote controller's [AUDIO] button while playing a disc with only one soundtrack, this icon will appear onscreen, indicating that the feature is not supported by the current disc. Similarly, if a disc uses features that are not supported by the DV-CP802, for example, spe-

The DV-CP802 supports Version 1.1 and Version 2.0 of the Video CD standard. Version 2.0 supports PBC (Playback Control).



DVD-Video discs typically contain one or more titles, which may be subdivided into chapters.




■ DVD-Audio

DVD-Audio discs contain groups and tracks.



■ SACD

SACDs have two separate areas for storing audio tracks—one for multichannel audio, the other for 2-channel stereo audio. In addition, hybrid SACDs have an extra layer for playback in standard CD players. You can specify how the DV-CP802 plays SACDs on page 55.



■ VCD

VCDs contain tracks.




■ CD

CDs contain tracks.



■ MP3

MP3 discs contain MP3 tracks organized into folders.



■ JPEG

JPEG discs contain pictures organized into folders. The DV-CP802 handles JPEG files as tracks.



MP3 & JPEG Compatibility

- The DV-CP802 can play/display MP3 and JPEG files recorded on CD-R and CD-RW discs.
- Discs must be in ISO9660 Level 2 format (folders can be up to eight levels deep).
- · Discs must be finalized.
- The DV-CP802 can only recognize the first session on multisession discs.
- You can determine the order in which the DV-CP802 plays/displays your MP3 songs and JPEG pictures by prefixing file and folder names with a three-digit number. For example 001.Root, 002.Folder, and so on, and 001.Track.mp3, 002.Track.mp3, and so on.
- Only the first eight characters of folder and track names (excluding the filename extension) are displayed.
- The folder numbered "001" appears as "ROOT" in the Disc Navigator.
- The DV-CP802 supports up to 999 folders and up to 672 files per folder.
- If you try to play an incompatible file, the message "This format cannot be played" appears on the display.

■ MP3

- MP3 files must be MPEG1 Audio Layer 3 format, 44.1 or 48 kHz, fixed bit-rate.
- MP3 files must have a ".mp3" or ".MP3" filename extension.
- Variable bit-rates (VBR) from 64 kbps to 384 kbps are supported. (Playing times may display incorrectly with VBR.)

■ JPEG

- JPEG files must have a ".jpg" or ".jpeg" filename extension (either uppercase or lowercase is OK).
- Baseline JPEG files are supported. Progressive JPEG files are not.
- Only JPEG files with the following brightness/color difference ratios are supported: 4:4:4, 4:2:2, and 4:1:1.
- JPEG files must be less than 5 megabytes in size.

Handling Discs

 Never touch the underside of a disc. Always hold discs by the edge, as shown.



 Never attach adhesive tape or sticky labels to discs.



Cleaning Discs

 For best results, keep your discs clean. Fingerprints and dust can affect the sound or picture quality and should be removed as follows. Using a clean soft cloth, wipe from the center outwards, as shown. Never wipe in a circular direction.





- To remove stubborn dust or dirt, wipe the disc with a damp soft cloth, and then dry it with a dry cloth.
- Never use solvent-based cleaning fluids, such as thinner or benzine, commercially available cleaners, or antistatic sprays intended for vinyl records, because they may damage the disc.

Storing Discs

- Don't store discs in places subject to direct sunlight, or near heat sources.
- Don't store discs in places subject to moisture or dust, such as in a bathroom or near a humidifier.
- Always store discs in their cases and vertically. Stacking, or putting objects on unprotected discs may cause warping, scratches, or other damage.

Terminology


- CD-R (compact disc recordable): A type of CD that can be recorded only once. Can be used for VCD, CD, MP3, or JPEG.
- CD-RW (compact disc rewritable): A type of CD that can be recorded over and over again. Can be used for VCD, CD, MP3, or JPEG.
- **Chapter:** Titles on DVD-Video discs can be subdivided into chapters.
- Component video: A video connection format that separates the luminance (Y) and color difference signals (PR, PB), providing better picture quality than S-Video.
- Composite video: A video connection format that combines the luminance and color signals together.
- **Direct Digital Path:** Unique Onkyo technology that uses dedicated shielded cables to connect the digital audio outputs, protecting the digital output signals against the possibility of noise and interference.
- **Dolby Digital:** Once known as *AC-3*, this is the designated surround sound format for DVD-Video, HDTV, and select digital broadcasts (cable, satellite, over-theair). A Dolby Digital bitstream may contain mono, stereo, Dolby Surround, or 5.1-channel audio information.
- **Dolby Pro Logic:** The decoders used in home theater equipment to decode Dolby Surround material. *See* Dolby Surround.
- **Dolby Surround:** The original Dolby surround-sound format uses matrix encoding to deliver four channels (left, right, center, and surround) over two audio channels. Can be used with VHS video, analog TV, and other analog stereo systems. The movie theater version is known as *Dolby Stereo*.
- **Downmixing:** The process of mixing multiple audio channels into fewer channels. For example, a 5.1-channel surround mix can be downmixed into two channels for reproduction on stereo systems.
- **Downsampling:** The process of reducing the sampling rate of digital audio.
- DTS (Digital Theater Systems): Like Dolby Digital, the DTS surround-sound format offers up to 5.1-channels of information, but uses less compression for a more faithful sound.
- **DVD-Audio:** The DVD format for storing up to six (5.1) channels of 24-bit/96 kHz digital audio or two channels of 24-bit/192 kHz digital audio.
- DVD-R (DVD recordable): A type of DVD disc that can be recorded only once. Can be used for DVD-Video or DVD-Audio.

- DVD-RW (DVD rewritable): A type of DVD disc that can be recorded over and over again. Can be used for DVD-Video or DVD-Audio.
- **DVD-Video:** The format for storing MPEG2 video on DVD, with interactive menus, multiple soundtracks, subtitles, camera angles, and so on.
- **Field:** In interlaced scanning, a field is a single scan of the screen. There are two fields per frame. *See* Interlaced Scanning *and* Progressive Scanning.
- Frame: An individual TV picture is called a frame. With the NTSC color system there are 30 frames per second.
- Interlaced scanning: TV pictures are made by scanning the screen in horizontal lines from top to bottom. With Interlaced scanning, two scans (*fields*) are used to make each picture (*frame*). *Contrast with* Progressive scanning.
- JPEG (Joint Photographic Experts Group): The acronym commonly used to refer to the compressed file format used to store digital images.
- LFE (low-frequency effects): The surroundsound channel used for low-frequency effects.
- Linear PCM: The uncompressed digital audio format used for audio CDs. PCM stands for *Pulse Code Modulation*.
- MP3 (MPEG 1 Audio Layer 3): Popular compressed file format for storing digital music.
- MPEG1 (Moving Picture Experts Group 1): The compressed digital video format used for VCDs.
- MPEG2 (Moving Picture Experts Group 2): The compressed digital video format used for DVDs, offering better picture quality than MPEG1.
- NTSC: The color TV system used in the United States, Japan, Taiwan, and Korea.
- PAL: The color TV system used in most of Europe, the United Kingdom, Australia, Brazil, and China.
- PBC (Playback Control): Version 2.0 of the VCD standard supports interactive menus and search functions.
- Progressive scanning: TV pictures are made by scanning the screen in horizontal lines from top to bottom. With progressive scanning, each picture (*frame*) is made by scanning the entire screen in one go, resulting is a clearer and stabler picture. *Contrast with* Interlaced scanning.

- **S-Video:** A video connection format that separates the luminance (Y) and color (C) signals, providing better picture quality than composite video.
- SACD (Super Audio CD): SACD uses Direct Stream Digital (DSD) technology for audio performance superior to that of standard CDs. It also supports multichannel audio, and hybrid discs can be played in standard CD players.
- **Title:** The contents of DVD-Video discs are organized into titles.
- VCD (Video CD): The format for storing MPEG1 video on CD.
- VLSC (Vector Linear Shaping Circuitry): Unique Onkyo circuitry that reduces pulse noise in analog audio signals converted from digital sources.

Getting to Know the DV-CP802

(1) STANDBY/ON button (21)

This button is used to set the DV-CP802 to On or Standby.

Don't turn on the power until you've completed and double checked all of your connections (page 17).

(2) STANDBY indicator (21)

(3) VIDEO CIRCUIT OFF button & indicator (45)

This button is used to turn off all of the internal video circuitry, eliminating the possibility of interference when playing audio-only discs. The button lights up when the video circuitry is turned off.

(4) LAST MEMORY button (42)

This button is used with the Last Memory function.

(5) REPEAT button (35)

This button is used with the Repeat function.

6 DIMMER button (32)

This button is used to adjust the display brightness.

7 DISPLAY button (42)

This button is used to display information about the current disc, title, chapter, or track, including the elapsed time, remaining time, total time, and so on.

(8) Display

See "Display" on page 12 for more information.

(9) Remote control sensor (16)

This sensor receives control signals from the remote controller.

① Open/Close [▲] button (23)

This button is used to open and close the disc tray.

(1) DISC SELECT 1-6 buttons (24)

These buttons are used to select discs. Playback starts automatically when discs are selected with these buttons

(12) Disc tray (23)

The disc tray has six bays for loading up to six discs.

(13) Disc tray light

This light illuminates the disc tray. It comes on when the DV-CP802 is turned on, and is brighter while the disc tray is open.

(14) DISC SKIP button (23, 24)

This button is used to select the disc bays (i.e., rotate the disc tray) when loading or removing discs, and to select discs for playback.

(15) Previous [**⊢◄**] button (27, 30)

This button is used to select the previous chapter or track. During playback it selects the beginning of the current chapter or track.

(16) Next [►►I] button (27, 30)

This button is used to select the next chapter or track.

(17) PAUSE [11] button (25)

This button is used to pause playback.



This indicator appears while track numbers are being displayed. While stopped, the total number of tracks on the current VCD, CD, or MP3 disc are displayed. During playback, the number of the current track is displayed.

10 LAST M indicator (42)

This indicator appears when using the Last Memory function.

11 REPEAT indicator (35)

This indicator appears when using the Repeat function.

12 A-B indicators (36)

These indicators appear when using the A-B Repeat function.

13 V. OFF indicator (45)

This indicator appears while the video circuits are turned off.

14 Camera angle 🕾 indicator (40)

This indicator appears if the DVD-Video disc being played features multiple camera angles.

15 PRGSV indicator (41)

This indicator appears when progressive scanning is on.

16 TOTAL indicator

This indicator appears while the total time is being displayed.

17 **REMAIN indicator**

This indicator appears while the remaining time is being displayed.

18 JPEG indicator

This indicator appears while a JPEG picture is being displayed.

19 DVD-AUDIO & SACDVCD indicators

These indicators show the type of disc currently selected.

DVD: DVD-Video



These sockets output 5.1-channel analog audio and can be connected to a 5.1-channel analog audio input on an AV receiver, surround sound decoder

(5) SURR 2 AUDIO OUTPUT (19)

These sockets output the same analog audio as the SURR1 outputs and can be connected to the analog surround back left and right inputs on a 7.1-channel AV receiver or other component. When using these sockets, the SURR MODE switch should be set to 1+2.

6 SURR MODE (AUDIO OUT) switch (19)

This switch is used to set the surround output mode of the analog multichannel audio outputs. If you connect the SURR 2 outputs to a 7.1-channel AV receiver or amp, set this switch to 1+2. This reduces the output level by 3 dB. If you're not using the SURR 2 outputs, set it to 1.

7 Power cord (21)

Connect the power cord to a suitable wall outlet.

8 OPTICAL DIGITAL AUDIO OUTPUT (20)

This optical digital audio output can be connected to an optical digital audio input on a hi-fi amp, AV receiver, or surround sound decoder (Dolby Digital, DTS). The Digital Out/Digital1 setting on page 50 is used to configure this output.

(9) COAXIAL DIGITAL AUDIO OUTPUT (20)


This coaxial digital audio output can be connected to a coaxial digital audio input on a hi-fi amp, AV receiver, or surround sound decoder (Dolby Digital, DTS). The Digital Out/Digital2 setting on page 51 is used to configure this output.

(10) REMOTE CONTROL (20)

These RI (Remote Interactive) connectors can be connected to the RI connectors on your other Onkyo AV components for interactive control.

To use RI you must make an analog audio connection (RCA) between the DV-CP802 and your Onkyo AV receiver, even if they are connected digitally.

1 STANDBY button (21)

This button is used to set the DV-CP802 to Standby.

2 ON button (21)

This button is used to turn on the DV-CP802. Don't turn on the DV-CP802 until you've completed and double checked all of your connections (page 17).

3 SEARCH button (27, 30, 35)

This button is used to search for titles, chapters, groups, tracks, and specific points in time.

4 LAST M button (42)

This button is used with the Last Memory function.

(5) Number buttons (27, 30, 35)

These buttons are used to enter title, chapter, group, and track numbers and to enter times for locating specific points in time.

To enter a single-digit number, simply press the corresponding button. To enter a double-digit number, enter the numbers in order from left-to-right (e.g., to enter 14, press [1] then [4].





Installing the Remote's Batteries


1 Open the battery compartment, as shown.




Notes:

- The supplied batteries should last for about six months, although this will vary with usage.
- If the remote controller doesn't work reliably, try replacing both batteries.
- Don't mix new and old batteries, or different types of batteries.
- If you intend not to use the remote controller for a long time, remove the batteries to prevent possible leakage and corrosion.
- Flat batteries should be removed as soon as possible to prevent possible leakage and corrosion.

Using the Remote Controller

To use the remote controller, point it at the DV-CP802's remote control sensor, as shown below.



- The remote controller may not work reliably if the DV-CP802 is subjected to bright light, such as direct sunlight or inverter-type fluorescent lights. Keep this in mind when installing the DV-CP802.
- If another remote controller of the same type is used in the same room, or the DV-CP802 is installed close to equipment that uses infrared rays, the remote controller may not work reliably.
- Don't put anything, such as a book, on the remote controller, because the buttons may be pressed inadvertently, thereby draining the batteries.
- The remote controller may not work reliably if the DV-CP802 is installed in a rack behind colored glass doors. Keep this in mind when installing the DV-CP802.
- The remote controller will not work if there's an obstacle between it and the DV-CP802's remote control sensor.

Connecting the DV-CP802

This chapter explains how to connect the DV-CP802 to your other AV components.

Before Making Any Connections

- Read the manuals supplied with your AV components.
- Don't connect the power cord until you've completed all audio and video connections.


Optical Digital Output



The DV-CP802's optical digital output socket has a dust cap for keeping out dust and dirt when it's not in use. Remove the cap before inserting an optical plug, and push the plug in all the way to make a good connection. Keep the dust cap in a safe place for future use.

RCA AV Connection Color Coding

RCA-type AV connections are usually color coded: red, white, and yellow. Use red plugs to connect right-channel audio inputs and outputs (typically labeled "R"). Use white plugs to connect left-channel audio inputs and outputs (typically labeled "L"). And use yellow plugs to connect composite video inputs and outputs.



- Push each plug in all the way to make a good connection (loose connections can cause noise or malfunctions).
- To prevent interference, keep audio and video cables away from power cords and speaker cables.

Connecting Your TV or Projector

This section explains how to connect the DV-CP802 to your TV or projector.

The TV handles the audio and video. If your TV has a Dolby Pro Logic decoder built-in, you'll be able to enjoy DVDs and videos that bear the Dolby Surround logo.

To enjoy Dolby Digital or DTS (5.1-channel surround), you'll need a suitable decoder (see page 19).

The DV-CP802 has three types of video output: component video, S-Video, and composite video. Component video offers the best picture quality, so if your TV supports it, use a commercially available component video cable to connect the DV-CP802's COMPONENT video output to the component video input on your TV. If your TV supports progressive scanning, you must use component video in order to take advantage of that feature.

See page 41 for more information on progressive scanning.


S-Video offers better picture quality than composite video, so if your TV supports it, use the supplied S-Video cable to connect the DV-CP802's S VIDEO output to an S-Video input on your TV. Failing that, use the supplied composite video cable to connect the DV-CP802's VIDEO output to a composite video input on your TV.

- Turn off the DV-CP802 and your TV, and disconnect their power cords from the wall outlets.


Connecting an AV Receiver

This section shows how to connect the DV-CP802 to an AV receiver for Dolby Digital, DTS, DVD-Audio, and SACD playback.

Digital Audio Connection (Dolby Digital & DTS)

To fully enjoy the Dolby Digital and DTS soundtracks available on most DVD-Video discs, you need to connect one of the DV-CP802's digital audio outputs (OPTICAL or COAXIAL) to a digital audio input on a Dolby Digital/DTS-compatible AV receiver. You can also enjoy Dolby Surround material, if your AV receiver supports Dolby Pro Logic.

Use an optical (or coaxial) digital audio cable to connect the DV-CP802's OPTICAL (or COAXIAL) DIGITAL AUDIO OUTPUT to an optical (or coaxial) digital audio input on your AV receiver, as shown.



Notes:


- Make sure that the Dolby Digital Out setting is set to "Dolby Digital," and that the DTS Out setting is set to DTS (see page 50). Otherwise you won't get surround sound.
- The output formats for the OPTICAL and COAXIAL digital audio outputs can be set independently (see page 50).
- When playing a Dolby Digital or DTS soundtrack, be sure to select Dolby Digital or DTS decoding, respectively, on your AV receiver. On some receivers, the appropriate listening mode is selected automatically. Refer to your AV receiver's manual.
- You can experience Dolby Digital only with DVDs that bear the Dolby Digital logo. Likewise, you can experience DTS only with DVDs or CDs that bear the DTS logo.
- In addition to a digital connection, it's recommended that you also connect the FRONT/D.MIX 1 AUDIO OUTPUT to a spare analog audio input on your AV receiver. This will allow you to record audio to a cassette recorder or CD recorder. If your AV receiver supports Zone 2, you must make an analog audio connection in order to select the DV-CP802 as the input source for Zone 2.

Analog Audio Connection (Dolby Digital, DTS, DVD-Audio & SACD)

To fully enjoy the multichannel audio of DVD-Audio and SACD, you need to connect the DV-CP802's 5.1-channel analog audio output to a multichannel analog audio input on an AV receiver. Dolby Digital and DTS soundtracks can also be fully enjoyed with this type of connection.

Use a multichannel analog audio cable (RCA) to connect the DV-CP802's FRONT/D.MIX 2, SURR 1, CENTER, and SUBWOOFER AUDIO OUTPUTs to a 5.1-channel analog audio input on your AV receiver. (You can use several separate RCA audio cables instead of a multichannel cable.) Set the SURR MODE (AUDIO OUT) switch to 1.

If your AV receiver supports 7.1-channels and you're using back surround speakers, connect the DV-CP802's SURR 2 AUDIO OUTPUTs to the AV receiver's surround back left and right inputs as well, and set the SURR MODE (AUDIO OUT) switch to 1+2.




- Refer to the hookup information supplied with your AV receiver.
- You can experience Dolby Digital only with DVDs that bear the Dolby Digital logo. Likewise, you can experience DTS only with DVDs or CDs that bear the DTS logo.
- DVD-Video discs may contain Dolby Digital and DTS soundtracks. The Dolby Digital soundtrack will be selected by default. To play the DTS soundtrack, use the movie's main menu and look under Language or Audio Setup. Alternatively, use the remote controller's [AUDIO] button (see page 41).
- See "Analog Audio Out" on page 52 for information on how the FRONT/D.MIX 1 and 2 sockets work.

Connecting a Stereo Amp

This section explains how to connect the DV-CP802 to a stereo amp or receiver for sound quality better than that possible with most TV's built-in speakers. This is great for listening to your CDs and MP3s, and DVDs and VCDs will sound better too. You can also enjoy Dolby Surround, if your amp supports Dolby Pro Logic.

Analog Connection

Use an RCA audio cable to connect the DV-CP802's ANALOG AUDIO OUTPUT to a pair of analog audio inputs on your amp or receiver, as shown.





 Be sure to set the Dolby Digital Out setting to "Dolby Digital>PCM," and set the DTS Out setting to

- "DTS>PCM" (see page 50). Otherwise an unpleasant digital noise may be heard, which may damage your equipment.
- The output formats for the OPTICAL and COAXIAL digital audio outputs can be set independently (see page 50).
- Never connect the DV-CP802 to the AC-3RF input on a Dolby Digital receiver. The AC-3RF format is not supported by the DV-CP802.


Connecting Components with RI

With **R**I (Remote Interactive) you can control the DV-CP802 by using the remote controller supplied with your Onkyo **R**I-compatible AV receiver.



- Push each plug in all the way to make a good connection.
- Use only RI cables for RI connections.
- To use RI you must make an analog audio connection (RCA) between the DV-CP802 and Onkyo AV receiver, even if they are connected digitally.
- The DV-CP802 has two RI sockets. You can connect either one to the Onkyo AV receiver. The other socket is for connecting additional RI-compatible components
- Connect the DV-CP802's RI sockets to only Onkyo components. Connecting to other manufacturer's components may cause them to malfunction.



On the Analog Audio Out menu, use the Up and Down [▲]/[▼] buttons to select 2 Channel or Multi Channel (default), and then press [ENTER].

Choose 2 Channel if you're connecting the FRONT AUDIO OUTs to a stereo amp.

Choose Multi Channel if you're connecting the FRONT, SURR 1/SURR 2, CENTER, and SUBWOOFER AUDIO OUTs to a multichannel amp.

If you select 2 Channel, the setup is complete and the Initial Setup menu closes. If you select Multi Channel, continue with this procedure.



Press the [ENTER] button, use the Up and Down [▲]/[▼] buttons to select On or Off, and then press the [ENTER] button.

Choose Off if your multichannel amp has its own speaker setup function.

Choose On if your multichannel amp has no speaker setup function.

If you select Off, the following settings cannot be set and the Initial Setup menu closes. If you select On, the Speaker Setting menu appears.



Here you can specify the size of the speakers being fed from the FRONT, SURR 1/SURR 2, CENTER, and SUBWOOFER AUDIO OUTPUTS.

For speakers with a cone diameter larger than 6-1/2 inches (16 cm), specify **Large**. For those with a smaller diameter, specify **Small**. See page 52 for more information.



Press the [ENTER] button, use the Left and Right [◀]/[▶] buttons to set the Subwoofer setting, and then press [ENTER] again.

Off: Select if no subwoofer is being used

On (default): Select if a subwoofer is being used.



Use the Left and Right [◀]/[▶] buttons to set the Front Speaker setting, and then press the [ENTER] button.

Large: Select if the front speakers are large.

Note that if the Subwoofer setting is set to Off, this setting is fixed at Large.

Note that if the Front Speaker Size is set to Small, the Large option cannot be selected.


Tip: If you press one of the DISC SELECT 1-6 buttons, the disc tray will close and playback of the selected disc will start automatically.

- · You can load up to six discs. You don't have to load all six discs every time.
- When the disc tray is closed, all of the disc indicators appear until the DV-CP802 has checked each bay for the presence of a disc. If a bay is found to have no disc, the corresponding indicator disappears.
- The disc tray can be opened and closed even while the DV-CP802 is in Standby mode, so you don't have to turn it on to remove your discs. (The disc tray will take slightly longer to open.)
- The DV-CP802 supports 8 cm and 12 cm discs. To avoid damaging your discs or the DV-CP802, always place discs in the center of the disc bays.
- Only load discs that are supported by the DV-CP802 (see page 7). Don't load cartridge-type discs.
- · To avoid personal injury, keep your hands away from the disc tray as it closes.
- Always use the OPEN/CLOSE [▲] button to open and close the disc tray. Never push the disc tray, and don't touch it or obstruct it while it's opening or closing. Don't press down on the disc tray while it's open, and don't load anything other than supported discs. Doing so may damage your discs or the DV-CP802.





Loading Discs During Playback



This section explains how to load and remove discs without stopping playback.



Press the OPEN/CLOSE [▲] button.

The disc tray opens.







Starting, Pausing & Stopping **Playback**



This section explains how to start, pause, and stop playback.



To start playback, press the Play [▶] button.

Playback starts and the Play ▶ indicator appears on the display.

If it's a DVD-Video disc, or a VCD with PBC (Playback Control), you may need to start playback from a menu (see page 26).

The front panel Play [▶] button performs play and enter functions. The remote controller has separate Play [▶] and [ENTER] buttons.



To pause playback, press the Pause [11] button.

Playback pauses and the Pause ■ indicator appears on the display.

To resume playback, press the Play [▶]

Remote controller Playback resumes and the Pause ■■ indicator disappears.




■ Stop To stop playback, press the Stop [■] button.

Playback stops and the Play ▶ indicator disappears.



- · During playback, you can select chapters or tracks by using the Next [►►] and Previous [►►] buttons. The first press of the Previous [] button selects the beginning of the current chapter.
- When you stop playback of a DVD disc or VCD, the DV-CP802 remembers the point at which playback was stopped and "Resume" appears onscreen for a few seconds. To resume playback from that point, press the Play [▶] button. To cancel the Resume function, press the Stop [■] button again. The Resume function is reset when another disc is selected.
- With the Last Memory function you can resume playback from a specific point even if another disc has been selected or the disc has been removed (see page 42).
- Do not move the DV-CP802 or subject it to vibration during playback. Doing so may damage your discs or the DV-CP802.
- You can improve the picture quality of paused playback with the Pause/Still setting (see page 57).
- Prolonged display of the same picture or menu may cause irreparable damage to your TV screen called screen burn-in. To prevent this, don't keep playback paused for too long and always press the Stop [] button when you've finished playing a DVD-Video disc or VCD. The DV-CP802 features a screen saver to protect your TV from the effects of burn-in (see
- With some DVD-Video discs, you may experience picture noise that is not normally visible with regular TV broadcasts. This is usually because DVD-Video uses a lot of high-resolution video data. The amount of noise, if any, will depend on your particular TV and the problem can sometimes be alleviated by turning down your TV's sharpness control.



Navigating Disc Menus



DVD-Video discs usually have an onscreen menu from which you can select titles, chapters, and other options, including foreign language soundtracks, subtitles, and audio formats (e.g., Dolby Digital or DTS). DVD-Audio discs sometimes have menus as well. VCDs that support PBC (Playback Control) may also have an onscreen menu (see page 7).

Load and select a DVD-Video, DVD-Audio, or VCD disc.

See pages 23 and 24.

With DVD-Video discs, a menu usually appears automatically. If it doesn't, try pressing the [TOP MENU] button.

With some VCDs, you may have to press the Play [▶] button to display the menu.




Use the remote controller's arrow $[\blacktriangle], [\blacktriangledown], [\blacktriangle], [\blacktriangleright]$ buttons to select items on the menu, and use the $[\mathsf{ENTER}]$ button to confirm your selection.

If you select a playback option (e.g., subtitles), another menu of options will typically appear, in which case you use the remote controller's arrow buttons to select items and the [ENTER] button to confirm your choice.

With VCDs that support PBC, you have to enter a number to select a menu item, which you can do by using the remote controller's number buttons. If the VCD's menu has several pages, use the Next [►►I] and Previous [►►I] buttons to select them. During playback, you can display the menu by pressing the [RETURN] button.


- Not all DVD-Video, DVD-Audio, and VCDs (PBC) have menus.
- Menu operation varies from disc-to-disc. See the disc's sleeve notes for details.
- On some DVD-Video discs, options such as foreign language soundtracks, subtitles, and audio formats appear on a separate menu called the *disc menu*, and titles and chapters appear on what's called the *title menu*. To display the disc menu, press the [MENU] button. If no menu appears, press the [TOP MENU] button.
- With DVD-Video discs, foreign language soundtracks and audio formats can usually be selected during playback by using the remote controller's [AUDIO] button (see page 41). Similarly, subtitles can be selected by using the remote controller's [SUBTITLE] button (see page 41).
- You must turn on PBC in order to use the menus on a VCD that supports PBC (see page 58).
- If PBC is off (see page 58), or your VCD doesn't support it, you can use the Next [►►] and Previous [►►] buttons, or the remote controller's number buttons to select tracks on a VCD.
- PBC menus can be hidden or displayed while playback is stopped by pressing the [TOP MENU] button.

Depending on the type of JPEG disc, either the first nine pictures appear in thumbnail-size or the Disc Navigator appears.

The slideshow stops automatically when all pictures have been displayed.

Notes:

- If the folder containing the JPEG images also contains some MP3 tracks, the DV-CP802 will play those tracks while showing the slideshow.
- If the selected JPEG file's resolution is 640 x 480 pixels or less, a thumbnail-size preview is shown. If the resolution exceeds 640 x 480, a preview will only be shown if the file contains thumbnail data.
- You can use the Repeat function to display JPEG images repeatedly (see page 35).
- You can use the Random function to display JPEG images randomly (see page 37).

- In some cases, the A and B points may be at slightly different points to the ones that you specify.
- If you select a different camera angle during A–B repeat playback, the original camera angle will be selected when playback restarts from the A point.

Random Playback



With the Random function you can enjoy a random selection of discs, titles, chapters, groups, tracks, or folders.

Press the [RANDOM] button repeatedly to select a random Remote controller RANDOM

The currently selected random option appears onscreen and "RANDOM" appears on the display.

The available options depend on the current disc type, as follows:

DVD-Video: Title, 1 Disc, All Disc,

DVD-Audio: Group Random, 1 Disc Random, All Disc Random, Random Off.

SACD: 1 Disc Random, All Disc Random, Random Off.

VCD/CD: 1 Disc, All Disc, Random Off.

MP3/JPEG: Folder, 1 Disc, All Disc (files in subfolders are not played).

With the "Title" option, chapters within the current title are played at random. With the "1 Disc" option, all titles, chapters, groups, tracks, and folders on the current disc are played at random.

If you press the [RANDOM] button during playback, random playback begins after the current disc, title, chapter, group, track, or folder has finished.

Press the Play [▶] button to start random playback.

Random playback starts.




To cancel random playback, use the [RANDOM] button to select Off.

- To select the next random disc, title, chapter, group, track, or folder during random playback, press the Next [►►] button.
- · Random playback may not work with some DVD-Video and JPEG discs.
- To use the Random function with a VCD that supports PBC, you must first turn off PBC (see page 58).
- Random playback cannot be used with the Memory function.
- You can't use the [SEARCH] button during random playback.
- During random playback, the remote controller's arrow $[\blacktriangle]$, $[\blacktriangledown]$, $[\blacktriangleright]$ buttons cannot be used with the Disc Navigator.
- If you select another disc, random playback will be cancelled, except when the random option is set to "All Disc," in which case playback continues.







Memory Playback



With the Memory function you can create a playlist of titles, chapters, groups, tracks, or folders.

Remote controller

MEMORY

Press the [MEMORY] button.

The Memory Play Setup window appears onscreen and the MEMORY indicator appears on the display.



The top row (▶) is used to enter disc, title/group/folder, and chapter/track numbers. Items in the playlist are numbered sequentially.

Move the cursor to the left when you want to enter a title/group/folder number. Move it to the right to enter a chapter/track number. Move it to the far left when you want to enter a disc number. Make sure that the top row is selected before you enter a number.

2Remote controller

Enter the disc, title/group/folder, and chapter/track numbers of the item you want to add to the list.

Use the remote controller's Left and Right [◄]/[►] buttons to select the parameters, and use the Up and Down [▲]/[▼] buttons to select numbers from 001 to 999.

The number of the current disc is already entered.

You can enter numbers directly by using the remote controller's number buttons.



To add all of the titles, groups, folders, chapters, or tracks on a disc, select the top row (\blacktriangleright) , and then press the Down $[\blacktriangledown]$ button.

To select all, while entering a number in the top row, press [0].

Selecting Camera Angles






Press the [ANGLE] button repeatedly to select the available camera angles.

The number of the currently selected camera angle appears onscreen. For example, on a disc with three camera angles, you'd see 1/3, 2/3, and 3/3.

- With some DVDs you may not be able to select different camera angles even though the camera ≗ indicator is displayed.
- With some DVDs you can select camera angles from a menu.



Selecting Languages & Audio Formats



Some DVD-Video discs feature soundtracks in several languages and audio formats (e.g., Dolby Digital or DTS). Music DVD-Video discs and DVD-Audio discs sometimes feature soundtracks in several audio formats, such as PCM, Dolby Digital, or DTS. See the disc's sleeve notes for details.



During playback, press the [AUDIO] button repeatedly to select the available soundtracks.

The name of the selected soundtrack appears onscreen for several seconds. With SACDs you can select Multichannel area, 2 channel area, or CD layer. With VCDs you can select Stereo, Mono L (left), or Mono R (right).

Notes:

- With DVD-Video discs, when you stop playback and cancel the Resume function (see page 25), or select another disc, the soundtrack language will revert to your default language (see page 56), or the disc's default language.
- With some discs, selecting another soundtrack may cause the picture to skip momentarily.
- To listen to just the accompaniment on a karaoke CD, select the Mono L (left) or Mono R (right) channel.
 See the disc's sleeve notes for details.
- With some DVDs you must select soundtracks from a menu, and you may not be able to select other soundtracks during playback.

Selecting Subtitles



Some DVD-Video discs feature subtitles in several languages. See the disc's sleeve notes for details.



During playback, press the [SUBTITLE] button repeatedly to select the available subtitles.

The name of the selected subtitle appears onscreen for several seconds.

To turn off subtitles, use the [SUBTITLE] button to select Off.

Notes:

- With DVD-Video discs, when you stop playback and cancel the Resume function (see page 25), or select another disc, the subtitle language will revert to your default subtitle language (see page 56), or the disc's default subtitle language.
- With some DVDs you must select subtitles from a menu, and you may not be able to select subtitles during playback.
- To check the current subtitle language, press the [SUBTITLE] button once. The current setting will appear onscreen for several seconds.

Using Progressive Scanning

With progressive scanning you can enjoy better picture quality. To use progressive scanning, your TV or projector must support it and be connected to the DV-CP802's component video output (see page 18).

Press the [PROGRESSIVE] but-


Progressive scanning is enabled and the PRGSV indicator appears on the display.



To turn off progressive scanning, press the [PROGRESSIVE] button again.

The PRGSV indicator disappears.

- If your TV or projector is connected to the DV-CP802's component video output and it doesn't support progressive scanning, you'll lose the picture if you turn progressive scanning on.
- When progressive scanning is turned on, nothing is output by the composite video and S-Video outputs.
- Progressive scanning cannot be turned on or off during playback. You must stop playback first.
- Progressive scanning cannot be turned on or off while the Disc Navigator is displayed.
- See also the Progressive Setting on page 50.



Using Last Memory



With the Last Memory function you can resume playback from where you left off even if another disc has been selected or the disc has been removed. Last Memory also remembers the soundtrack and subtitle settings you were using.



During playback, press the [LAST M] button.

The last memory point for the disc is stored, the LAST M indicator appears, and "Last Mem" appears on the display. If the [LAST M] button is pressed again, the last memory point will be updated.



Remote controller

To stop playback, press the Stop [■] button once or twice.

At this point you may choose to play another disc, or to turn off the DV-CP802.



To resume playback, select the disc and press the Play [▶] button.

The Last Memory dialog box appears, as shown.





To resume playback from the last memory point, select "Yes," and then press [ENTER].

To start playback from the beginning, select "No," and then press [ENTER].

To start playback from the beginning and delete the last memory point, select "Memory Clear," and then press [ENTER].

Notes:

- The Last Memory function can store the last point for up to six DVD-Video discs. When you store the last point for a seventh disc, the first disc's setting is lost.
- The Last Memory function can remember the last point for one VCD, but that will be lost when another disc is selected.
- The Last Memory function may not work properly with VCDs that support PBC.
- The Last Memory function will not work while a DVD menu is being displayed onscreen.
- The Last Memory function may not work with some DVD-Video discs.
- If you select another disc, or inadvertently turn off the DV-CP802 during playback, you can resume playback from the same point by selecting the disc again.

Displaying Information

You can display various information about the current disc, title, chapter, group, or track onscreen and on the DV-CP802's display.



During playback, press the [DIS-PLAY] button repeatedly.

The information displayed depends on the type of disc. See the following tables.

Turning Off the Video Circuits

You can turn off all of the internal video circuitry, eliminating the possibility of interference for a pure-audio experience when playing audio-only discs.



Press the DV-CP802's [VIDEO CIRCUIT OFF] button.

The internal video circuitry is turned off, the [VIDEO CIRCUIT OFF] button indicator lights up, and the V.OFF indicator appears on the display.

To turn the video circuitry back on, press the button again.

The internal video circuitry is turned on, the [VIDEO CIRCUIT OFF] button indicator goes off, and the V.OFF indicator disappears from the display.

- When the video circuitry is turned off, none of the DV-CP802's video outputs work.
- With some discs you need start playback from a menu, in which case you should turn off the video circuitry after starting playback.
- Although intended for use with audio discs, this function can also be used to enjoy soundtracks and music on DVD-Video discs and VCDs.



4:3 Normal

Choose this option if you have a 4:3 TV and want to use the full height of the screen when watching widescreen movies. The picture will be cropped on both sides, as shown. This option will not work with discs that don't support pan and scan.




Widescreen movie on 4:3 TV with the "4:3 Normal" setting

16:9 Widescreen

Choose this option if you have a 16:9 widescreen TV.

Notes

 With some DVDs this setting may have no effect. See the disc's sleeve notes to see which picture format is used.



Interlaced Setting

With this setting you can adjust various picture parameters for interlaced scanning. There are three setup memories (1, 2, 3) for storing your favorite settings. You could, for example, use one for daytime viewing (e.g., sun shining through window) and one for nighttime viewing (e.g., curtains drawn, lights down).

The effect may not always be noticeable, and depending on the video source, the picture may look better with it set to Off.





Select Interlaced Setting 1, 2, or 3, and then press the [ENTER] or Right [▶] button.

The parameters appear onscreen.







■ Restoring the Default Settings


