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Important Safety Precautions

Electrical energy can perform many useful functions, but it can also cause personal injuries and property damage if improperly handled. This product has been engineered and manufactured with the highest priority on safety. But IMPROPER USE CAN RESULT IN POTENTIAL ELECTRICAL SHOCK OR FIRE HAZARD. In order to prevent potential danger, please observe the following instructions when installing, operating and cleaning the product. To ensure your safety and prolong the service life of your LCD TV product, please read the following precautions carefully before using the product.

1. Read these instructions --- All operating instructions must be read and understood before the product is operated.

2. Keep these instructions --- These safety and operating instructions must be kept in a safe place for future reference.

3. Head all warnings --- All warnings on the product and in the instructions must be observed closely.

4. Follow all instructions --- All operating instructions must be followed.

5. Attachments --- Only use attachments/accessories specified by the manufacturer. Do not use attachments not recommended by the manufacturer. Use of improper attachments can result in accidents,

6. Power source --- This product is intended to be supplied by a listed power supply indicated on the marking label. If you are not sure of the type of power supply to your home, consult your product dealer or local power company. For added protection for this product during a lightning storm, or when it is left unattended and unused for long periods of time, unplug it from the wall outlet and disconnect the cable system.

7. Power cord protection --- Protect the power cord from being walked on or pinched particularly at plugs, convenience receptacles, and the point where they exit from the apparatus.

8. Overloading --- Do not overload wall outlets, extension cords, or convenience receptacles on other equipment as this can result in a risk of fire or electric shock.

9. Entering of objects and liquids --- Never insert an object into the product through vents or openings. High voltage flows in the product, and inserting an object can cause electric shock and/or short internal parts. For the same reason, do not spill water or liquid on the product.

10. Servicing ---- Refer all servicing to qualified service personnel. Servicing is required when the apparatus has been damaged in anyway, such as power-supply cord or plug is damaged, liquid has been spilled or objects have fallen into the apparatus, the apparatus has been exposed to rain or moisture, does not operate normally, or has been dropped.

Panel protection --- The LCD panel used in this product is made of glass. Therefore, it can break when the product is dropped or impacted upon by other objects. Be careful not to be injured by broken glass pieces in case the LCD panel breaks.

23. Pixel defect --- The LCD panel is a very high technology product, giving you finely detailed pictures. Occasionally, a few non-active pixels may appear on the screen as a fixed point of blue, green or red. Please note that this does not affect the performance of your product.

Preparations

Using the Remote Control

Use the remote control by pointing it towards the remote sensor window of the set. Objects between the remote control and sensor window may prevent proper operation.

Note: the illustration is for your reference only, the remote sensor may locate differently with different model.


Cautions regarding use of remote control

- Do not expose the remote control to shock. In addition, do not expose the remote control to liquids, and do not place in an area with high humidity.
- Do not install or place the remote control under direct sunlight. The heat may cause deformation of the unit.
- The remote control may not work properly if the remote sensor window of the main unit is under direct sunlight or strong lighting. In such a case, change the angle of the lighting or LCD TV set, or operate the remote control closer to the remote sensor window.

Batteries for the Remote Control

If the remote control fails to operate the LCD TV functions, replace the batteries in the remote control.


- 1 Open the battery cover.
- 2 Insert two size-AAA batteries.

Precautions on battery use


Improper use of batteries can result in a leakage of chemicals and/or explosion. Be sure to follow the instructions below.

- Place batteries with their terminals corresponding to the (+) and (-) indications.
- Different types of batteries have different characteristics. Do not mix batteries of different types.
- Do not mix old and new batteries. Mixing old and new batteries can shorten the life of new batteries and/or cause old batteries to leak chemicals.
- Remove batteries as soon as they are non-operable. Chemicals that leak from batteries can cause a rash. If chemical leakage is found, wipe with a cloth.
- The batteries supplied with the product may have a shorter life expectancy due to storage conditions.
- If the remote control is not used for an extended period of time, remove the batteries from the remote control.

Antenna Connection

INSTALL the unit in a room where direct light will not fall upon the screen. Total darkness or a reflection on the picture screen may cause eyestrain. Soft and indirect lighting is recommended for comfortable viewing.


Optimum reception of colour requires a good signal and will generally mean that an outdoor aerial must be used. The exact type and position of the aerial will depend upon your particular area.




Note:

It is recommended that the 75-ohm coaxial cable be used to eliminate interference and noise which may occur due to radio wave conditions.

The aerial cable should not be bundled with the power cord and the like.

Connections

Cautions before connecting

- Carefully check the terminals for position and type before making any connections.
- The illustration of the external equipment may be different depending on your model.
- Loose connectors can result in image or colour problems. Make sure that all connectors are securely inserted into their terminals.
- Refer to the operating manual of the external device as well.
- When connecting an external device, turn the power off on the panel to avoid any issues.




How to connect:





How to connect a DVD Player using Component Video Connections:

Connect the Video cable between the Y, Cb, Cr input jacks on the unit and Y, Cb, Cr output jacks on the DVD player. Connect the Audio cable between the AUDIO input jack on the unit and AUDIO output jacks on the DVD player.



Turning the Unit On and Off

Turning On

Insert the power cord into the wall outlet. Press the **Power** button on the remote control. The unit will be turned on and you will be ready to use it's features.

Turning Off

With the power on, Press the **Power** button on the remote control to turn off.

Note:

You can also use the **Power** button on the Control panel on the main unit.

Viewing the Menus and Displays

Your LCD TV has a simple, easy-to-use menu system that appears on the screen. This system makes it convenient and fast to use features on the unit.

Viewing the Menus

- With the power on, press the **MENU** button on the remote control. 1 The main menu appears on the screen.
- 2 Use the VOL+/- to select menu page. Use $CH \land / \checkmark$ to activate the menu page.
- 3 Use the **CH** \wedge/\neg to select item. Use **VOL**+/- to adjust value or setting of each item. Use **MENU** to exit menu system. On-screen menu will disappear from the screen automatically after some seconds, or you can press the MENU button repeatedly to exit the menu system.

Note:

- In Menu operations, you may use the **SOURCE** button on the unit to confirm your operation or setting just as the ENTER button on the remote control.
- In Menu operations, you may use CH ▲ / ▼ to select item or just press the relevant number button according to the number indicated on the left of the menu item.
- To clearly introduce the menu operations, this operation manual provides a description based on operation with the remote control.




The unit displays current status information (e.g channel number, channel name, channel locking status, colour and sound system or stereo mode) by pressing the **DSP/CAPS** button.





Your LCD TV can memorise and store all of the available channels. After the available channels are memorised, use $CH \wedge / \checkmark$ to scan through the available stations.

Select a Region

Before you start automatic search, it is necessary to select a region firstly.

- **1** Press **MENU** to display the menu main page.
- 2 Press VOL+/- repeatedly to display Option menu page.
- 3 Press CH repeatedly to select Country item.
- 4 Press VOL+ or ENTER to access the sub-menu.
- 5 Press CH ▲ / ▼ to select a region. Please select a proper region according to your area. To search and memorise the SECAM-L/L' programs, you need to select [France].
- 6 Press ENTER to confirm and press MENU repeatedly to exit.

Storing Channels in Memory Automatically

- **1** Press **MENU** to display the menu main page.
- 2 Press VOL+/- repeatedly to display Program menu page.
- 4 Press VOL+ or ENTER to store channels in memory automatically.

The process will begin memorising all of the available channels.


Note:

The process of auto memory will be stopped if you press the **MENU** button

During the process of auto Search, the unit automatically identifies and stores the program name if the program's name is available. If the program's name is with more than 5 characters, the unit only stores the first 5 characters.

Manual Fine Tuning

- **1** Press **MENU** to display the menu main page.
- 2 Press VOL+/- repeatedly to display Program menu page.
- 3 Press CH repeatedly to select Fine Tuning item.
- 4 Press VOL+/- to fine tune till the best possible picture and sound are obtained.
- 5 Press MENU to exit.

Manual Search

Use Manual Search if desired channels can not be memorised or if you would like to store programs to specific channel numbers one by one.

- Use number buttons to directly select a channel that you want to perform manual search.
- Press MENU to display the menu main page. 2
- Press VOL+/- repeatedly to display Program menu page. 3
- Press CH repeatedly to select Manual Search item.
- YOU may press ENTER to input a frequency or press VOL+/- to 5 search program from current frequency.
 - To search program manually by inputting a frequency:
 - 1. Press ENTER the unit allows you to input a frequency.
 - 2. Input the desired frequency by using 0~9 buttons.
 - 3. Press ENTER to confirm and the unit locates to your frequency. If you want to exit, press MENU again.

To search program manually from current frequency: Pressing **VOL+**, the unit searches towards higher frequency; Pressing VOL-, the unit searches towards lower frequency; The search stops when a program is found and this program will be stored in current channel.

During process of manual search, you may control the searching direction by pressing VOL+ or VOL-.

Skipping Channel

- Use number buttons to directly select a channel that you want to 1 skip.
- Press **MENU** to display the menu main page. 2
- Press VOL+/- repeatedly to display Program menu page.
- Press CH repeatedly to select Skip item.
- Press VOL+ or ENTER to access the sub-menu. 5
- Press $CH \land / \checkmark$ to select **On** or **Off**.

Press ENTER to confirm and press MENU repeatedly to exit. When the item is set to on, the selected channel will be skipped. When the item is set to off, the selected channel will not be skipped. The skipped channels can not be selected by using the **CH** \wedge / \neg buttons unless you use **number buttons** to input channel number directly.

Editing Channels

The edit channels function is for you to arrange channel order as you wish.

When viewing single TV screen, press SWAP to display Channel Swap menu. The current channel number appears in the [Program No.] item.


Press CH - to select Sorted No. item.

Press VOL+/- to select a target channel which is to be exchanged with the current channel.

Press CH - to select and highlight OK item.



Setting Favorite Channel

- **1** Press **MENU** to display the menu main page.
- 2 Press VOL+/- repeatedly to display Program menu page.
- 3 Press CH to select Program No item.
- 4 Press VOL+/- to select a channel that you want to set as your favourite channel.
- 5 Press CH repeatedly to select Favourite item.
- 6 Press VOL+ or ENTER to access the sub-menu.
- 7 Press $CH \land / \checkmark$ to select On or Off.
- 8 Press ENTER to confirm and press MENU repeatedly to exit.

You can repeat the above steps to set more favourite channels so that you can cycle among your favourite channels by pressing the **FAV.** button.

When you are viewing a favourite channel, a " • " icon appears on the screen while pressing the **DSP/CAPS** button.

Editing Program Name

- **1** Use **number buttons** to directly select a channel you want to edit its name.
- **2** Press **MENU** to display the menu main page.
- 3 Press VOL+/- repeatedly to display Program menu page.
- 4 Press CH repeatedly to select Program Name item.
- 5 Press ENTER to edit program name.

Use **VOL+/-** to move cursor right or left.

Use 0~9 number buttons to input characters.

Use DSP/CAPS to switch between lowercase and UPPERCASE.

Use **CH**▼ to delete a character.

After you finish inputting, you may use **ENTER** to confirm and return. The maximum length of program name is 8 characters.

Locking TV Channels

Setting Locking Function On or Off

- **1** Press **MENU** to display the menu main page.
- 2 Press VOL+/- repeatedly to display Option menu page.
- 3 Press CH to select Child Lock item.
- 4 Press VOL+ or ENTER to access the sub-menu.
- 5 Press CH ▲ / ▼ to select On or Off.
- 6 Press ENTER to confirm and press MENU repeatedly to exit.

If the [Child Lock] item is set to [On], the unit detects the child lock status for every channels while you changing channels or pressing the **DSP/CAPS** button. If current channel is detected as a locked channel, a " " icon appears on the screen, otherwise a " " icon appears.

If you set the [Child Lock] item to [On], next time if you want to set the [Child Lock] item to [Off], the unit asks you to input password.

Locking or Unlocking TV Channels

If the [Child Lock] item is set to [On], the unit asks you to input password if you want to access the [Program] menu page.

- **1** Press **MENU** to display the menu main page.
- 2 Press VOL+/- repeatedly to display Program menu page.
- 3 Press CH v to select Program No item.
- 4 Press VOL+/- to select a channel that you want to lock or unlock.
- 5 Press CH repeatedly to select Locked item.
- 6 Press VOL+ or ENTER to access the sub-menu.
- 7 Press $CH \land / \checkmark$ to select On or Off.
- 8 Press ENTER to confirm and press MENU repeatedly to exit. You can repeat the above steps to lock or unlock other channels.

9 Restart the unit to active your setting.

The locking settings may not work unless you restart the unit. When you select a locked channel, a " a " icon appears and the screen is blank. In this situation, if you still want to view the locked channel, you may follow these steps to unlock:

- 1. Press FREEZE to display password input page.
- 2. Enter the password. The default password is "000000".

Once the correct password is inputted, the unit allows you to view all locked channels.

Changing Password


- **1** Press **MENU** to display the menu main page.
- 2 Press VOL+/- repeatedly to display Option menu page.
- 3 Press CH to select Change Password item.
- 4 Press ENTER to confirm.
- 5 Input the old password.
- 6 Input the new password.
- 7 Input the new password again and then the password has been changed successfully.

Be sure to write down your password and retain it for future use. If you forget the password, the unit provides a master password as "**962326**" for you to access the locked channels or change password. Please DO NOT let the children know the master password.

Changing Channels

Viewing the Picture-in-Picture

This unit includes a two-tuner Picture-in-Picture (PIP) feature. You can select a group or block of pages displayed in the coloured brackets at the bottom of the screen by pressing the corresponding colour (RED/GREEN/ YELLOW/BLUE) on the remote control unit.

0-9

Directly select any page by using 0-9.

MIX

Press this button to display the Teletext on the screen with transparent background while viewing the TV program simultaneously.

REVEAL

Press the button to reveal hidden information such as an answer to a guiz. Press the button again to hide the information.

SIZE

Press the button to expand the top half of the display. Press it again to expand the bottom half of the display. Press it once more to resume normal size.


HOLD


Press the button to stop updating Teletext pages automatically. Press it again to release hold mode.

UPDATE

Press the button to view the updated teletext page.

Display the TV picture on the screen while waiting for the new teletext page. The characters "???" will appear at the top of left corner of the screen. Then you can input a desired page number. When the update page is available, then the characters "???" will change to the page number.





Before calling for repair service, check the following items for possible remedies to an encountered symptom.

Symptoms	Check item
"Ghost" or double images	• This may be caused by obstruction to the antenna due to high rise buildings or hills. Using a highly directional antenna may improve the picture.
No power	 Check that the AC power cord is plugged into the mains socket. Unplug the power cord, wait for 60 seconds. Then reinsert plug into the mains socket and turn on the unit again.
No picture	 Check antenna connections at the rear of the unit to see if it is properly connected to the unit. Possible broadcast station trouble. Try another channel. Adjust the contrast and brightness settings. Select a correct input. Is a non-compatible signal being input?
Good picture but no sound	 Increase the VOLUME. Check that the unit is not muted. Check Whether the sound is output to headphone.
Good sound but poor colour	•Adjust the contrast, colour and brightness settings.
Poor picture	 Sometimes, poor picture quality occurs when having activated an S-VHS camera or camcorder connected and having connected another peripheral at the same time. In this case, switch off one of the other peripherals. Check whether the room is too bright.
Horizontal dotted line	 This may be caused by electrical interference (e.g. hair dryer, nearby neon lights, etc.) Turn off the equipment.
Television not responding to remote control	 Check whether the batteries are working. Replace if necessary. Clean the remote control sensor lens on the unit. Do not use the remote control under strong or fluorescent lighting. The batteries should be inserted with polarity (+, -) aligned.
Snowy picture and noise	Check the antenna connection.
No stable or not synchronised D-Sub picture	• Check if you have selected the correct D-Sub mode in your PC.
No output from one of the speakers	Adjust Balance in the audio menu.

Note:

If your problem is not solved, restart your TV by turning it off and then on again once. Never attempt to repair a defective TV yourself.
