





## Press the remote control's button

#### 1 TO TURN ON OR OFF THE UNIT

· Please be aware of the OFF indication on the remote control display to prevent the unit from starting/stopping improperly.

#### 2 TO SET TEMPERATURE

- · For cool and dry modes, the range of temperature for selection is 16°C ~ 30°C.
- Operating the unit within the recommended temperature could induce energy saving. COOL mode : 26°C ~ 28°C. DRY mode :  $1^{\circ}C \sim 2^{\circ}C$  lower than room temperature.

#### 3 TO SELECT OPERATION MODE

### AUTO mode - For your convenience

- Unit selects the operation mode according to the room temperature.
- · Once auto mode is selected, the unit will operate at the standard setting temperature.

Room temperature	Operation mode	Standard setting temperature
23°C & above	Cool	25°C
Below 23°C	Dry	22°C

• Press for "HI" to +2°C or  $\nabla$  for "I O" to -2°C to the standard setting temperature.

### COOL mode - To enjoy cool air

 Use curtains to screen off sunlight and outdoor heat to reduce power consumption during cool mode.

### DRY mode - To dehumidify the environment

· Unit operates at low fan speed to give a gentle cooling operation.

· For AUTO, the indoor fan speed is automatically adjusted according to the operation mode.



## **CLEANING INSTRUCTIONS**

- · Do not use benzene, thinner or scouring powder.
- Do not use water hotter than 40°C.

## HINT

· To ensure optimal performance of the unit, cleaning maintenance has to be carried out at regular intervals. Please consult authorized dealer.



#### 5 HUMAN ACTIVITY SENSOR

- · Do not hit or violently press the sensor or poke it with a sharp object. This can lead to damage and malfunction.
- Do not place large objects near the sensor and keep away heating units or humidifiers from the sensor's detection area. This may lead to sensor malfunction.

#### 1 INDOOR UNIT

· Wipe the unit gently with a soft, dry cloth.

### **Remove Front Panel**

- · Raise and pull to remove the front panel.
- Wash gently and dry.

9 ANTI-BACTERIAL FILTER



- Anti-bacterial filter.
- · Clean the filter whenever necessary.
- Wash/rinse the filter gently with water to avoid damage to the filter.
- Drv the filter thoroughly under shade, away from fire or direct sunlight.
- Replace the filter every 10 years or replace any damaged filter. Part no.: CZ-SA22P

10 **AIR FILTERS** 

- · Air filter cleaning is required every two weeks.
- · Wash/rinse the filters gently with water to avoid damage to the filter surface.
- · Dry the filters thoroughly under shade, away from fire or direct sunlight.
- · Replace any damaged filters.

## TROUBLESHOOTING

## The following symptoms do not indicate malfunction.

SYMPTOM	CAUSE
Mist emerges from indoor unit.	<ul> <li>Condensation effect due to cooling process.</li> </ul>
Water flowing sound during operation.	<ul> <li>Refrigerant flow inside the unit.</li> </ul>
The room has a peculiar odor.	<ul> <li>This may be due to damp smell emitted by the wall, carpet, furniture or clothing.</li> </ul>
Indoor fan stops occasionally during automatic fan speed setting.	<ul> <li>This helps to remove the surrounding odours.</li> </ul>
Operation is delayed a few minutes after restarting.	<ul> <li>The delay is a protection to the unit's compressor.</li> </ul>
Outdoor unit emits water/steam.	<ul> <li>Condensation or evaporation occurs on pipes.</li> </ul>
TIMER indicator is always on.	<ul> <li>The timer setting repeats daily once set.</li> </ul>
Cracking sound during operation.	<ul> <li>Changes of temperature caused the expansion/ contraction of the unit.</li> </ul>

## Check the following before calling for servicing.

SYMPTOM	CHECK
Cooling operation is not working efficiently.	<ul> <li>Set the temperature correctly.</li> <li>Close all doors and windows.</li> <li>Clean or replace the filters.</li> <li>Clear any obstruction at the air inlet and air outlet vents</li> </ul>
Noisy during operation.	<ul> <li>Check if the unit has been installed at an incline.</li> <li>Close the front panel properly.</li> </ul>
Remote control does not work. (Display is dim or transmission signal is weak.)	<ul> <li>Insert the batteries correctly.</li> <li>Replace weak batteries.</li> </ul>
The unit does not work.	<ul> <li>Check if the circuit breaker is tripped.</li> <li>Check if timers have been set.</li> </ul>
The unit does not receive the signal from the remote control.	<ul> <li>Make sure the receiver is not obstructed.</li> <li>Certain fluorescent lights may interfere with signal transmitter. Please consult authorized dealer.</li> </ul>

## INFORMATION

### FOR SEASONAL INSPECTION AFTER EXTENDED NON-USE

- · Checking of remote control batteries.
- · No obstruction at air inlet and air outlet vents.
- After 15 minutes of operation, it is normal to have the following temperature difference between air inlet and air outlet vents: Cooling: ≥ 8°C

### FOR EXTENDED NON-USE

- · Turn off the power supply and unplug.
- · Remove the remote control batteries.

## NON SERVICEABLE CRITERIAS

TURN OFF POWER SUPPLY AND UNPLUG then please consult authorized dealer under the following conditions:

- · Abnormal noise during operation.
- Water/foreign particles have entered the remote control.
- · Water leaks from Indoor unit.
- · Circuit breaker switches off frequently.
- · Power cord becomes unnaturally warm.
- Switches or buttons are not functioning properly.


