Important Information

For your safety

To prevent severe injury and loss of life/property, read this section carefully before using the product to ensure proper and safe operation of your product.

WARNING

Power connection

- Use only the power source marked on the product.
- Do not overload power outlets and extension cords. This can result in the risk of fire or electric shock.
- Completely insert the AC adaptor/power plug into the power outlet. Failure to do so may cause electric shock and/or excessive heat resulting in a fire.
- Regularly remove any dust, etc. from the AC adaptor/power plug by pulling it from the power outlet, then wiping with a dry cloth. Accumulated dust may cause an insulation defect from moisture, etc. resulting in a fire.
- Unplug the product from power outlets if it emits smoke, an abnormal smell, or makes an unusual noise. These conditions can cause fire or electric shock. Confirm that smoke has stopped emitting and contact an authorised service centre.
- Unplug from power outlets and never touch the inside of the product if its casing has been broken open.
- Never touch the plug with wet hands.
 Danger of electric shock exists.

Installation

- To prevent the risk of fire or electrical shock, do not expose the product to rain or any type of moisture.
- Do not place or use this product near automatically controlled devices such as automatic doors and fire alarms. Radio waves emitted from this product may cause such devices to malfunction resulting in an accident.
- Do not allow the AC adaptor or telephone line cord to be excessively pulled, bent or placed under heavy objects.

Operating safeguards

- Unplug the product from power outlets before cleaning. Do not use liquid or aerosol cleaners.
- Do not disassemble the product.
- Do not spill liquids (detergents, cleansers, etc.) onto the telephone line cord plug, or allow it to become wet at all. This may cause a fire. If the telephone line cord plug becomes wet, immediately pull it from the telephone wall jack, and do not use.



Installation and relocation

- Never install telephone wiring during an electrical storm.

- Use caution when installing or modifying telephone lines.
- The AC adaptor is used as the main disconnect device. Ensure that the AC outlet is installed near the product and is easily accessible.
- This product is unable to make calls when:
 - the handset batteries need recharging or have failed.
 - there is a power failure.
 - the key lock feature is turned on.



















Important Information

Battery

- We recommend using the batteries noted on page 4. USE ONLY rechargeable Ni-MH batteries AAA (R03) size.
- Do not mix old and new batteries.
- Do not open or mutilate the batteries. Released electrolyte from the batteries is corrosive and may cause burns or injury to the eyes or skin. The electrolyte is toxic and may be harmful if swallowed.
- Exercise care when handling the batteries.
 Do not allow conductive materials such as rings, bracelets, or keys to touch the batteries, otherwise a short circuit may cause the batteries and/or the conductive material to overheat and cause burns.
- Charge the batteries provided with or identified for use with this product only, in accordance with the instructions and limitations specified in this manual.
- Only use a compatible base unit (or charger) to charge the batteries. Do not tamper with the base unit (or charger).
 Failure to follow these instructions may cause the batteries to swell or explode.

Important safety instructions

When using your product, basic safety precautions should always be followed to reduce the risk of fire, electric shock, and injury to persons, including the following:

- Do not use this product near water for example, near a bathtub, washbowl, kitchen sink, or laundry tub, in a wet basement or near a swimming pool.
- Avoid using a telephone (other than a cordless type) during an electrical storm. There may be a remote risk of electric shock from lightning.
- 3. Do not use the telephone to report a gas leak in the vicinity of the leak.

For best performance

Base unit location/avoiding noise

The base unit and other compatible Panasonic units use radio waves to communicate with each other.

- For maximum coverage and noise-free communications, place your base unit:
 - at a convenient, high, and central location with no obstructions between the handset and base unit in an indoor environment.
 - away from electronic appliances such as TVs, radios, personal computers, wireless devices, or other phones.
 - facing away from radio frequency transmitters, such as external antennas of mobile phone cell stations. (Avoid putting the base unit on a bay window or near a window.)
- Coverage and voice quality depends on the local environmental conditions.
- If the reception for a base unit location is not satisfactory, move the base unit to another location for better reception.

Environment

- Keep the product away from electrical noise generating devices, such as fluorescent lamps and motors.
- The product should be kept free from excessive smoke, dust, high temperature, and vibration.
- The product should not be exposed to direct sunlight
- Do not place heavy objects on top of the product
- When you leave the product unused for a long period of time, unplug the product from the power outlet.
- The product should be kept away from heat sources such as radiators, cookers, etc. It should not be placed in rooms where the temperature is less than 0 °C or greater than 40 °C. Damp basements should also be avoided.
- The maximum calling distance may be shortened when the product is used in the following places: Near obstacles such as hills, tunnels, underground, near metal objects such as wire fences, etc.





Note when setting up

Note for connections

- The AC adaptor must remain connected at all times. (It is normal for the adaptor to feel warm during use.)
- The AC adaptor should be connected to a vertically oriented or floormounted AC outlet. Do not connect the AC adaptor to a ceiling-mounted AC outlet, as the weight of the adaptor may cause it to become disconnected.

During a power failure

The unit will not work during a power failure. We recommend connecting a corded-type telephone (without AC adaptor) to the same telephone line or to the same telephone line jack using a T-adaptor.

Note for battery installation

- Use the supplied rechargeable batteries. For replacement, we recommend using the Panasonic rechargeable batteries noted on page 4. 6.
- Wipe the battery ends (⊕, ⊖) with a dry cloth.
- Avoid touching the battery ends
 (⊕, ⊕) or the unit contacts.

Note for battery charge

- It is normal for the handset to feel warm during charging.
- Clean the charge contacts of the handset, base unit, and charger with a soft and dry cloth once a month. Clean more often if the unit is exposed to grease, dust, or high humidity.

Note:

- It is normal for batteries not to reach full capacity at the initial charge.
 Maximum battery performance is reached after a few complete cycles of charge/discharge (use).
- Actual battery performance depends on a combination of how often the handset is in use and how often it is not in use (standby).
- Even after the handset is fully charged, the handset can be left on the base unit or charger without any ill effect on the batteries.
- The battery level may not be displayed correctly after you replace the batteries. In this case, place the handset on the base unit or charger and let it charge for at least 7 hours.





















Making/Answering Calls

Making calls

- 1 Lift the handset and dial the phone number.
 - To correct a digit, press
- 2 [~]
- When you finish talking, press (べの) or place the handset on the base unit or charger.

Using the speakerphone

- **1** Dial the phone number and press [♣].
 - Speak alternately with the other party.
- 2 When you finish talking, press [★①].

Note:

- For best performance, use the speakerphone in a quiet environment.
- To switch back to the receiver, press
 [>].

Adjusting the receiver or speaker volume

Press [▲] or [▼] repeatedly while talking.

Making a call using the redial list

The last 10 phone numbers dialled are stored in the redial list (each 24 digits max.).

- 1 (right soft key)
- 2 [▼]/[▲]: Select the desired phone number.
- 3 [~]

Erasing a number in the redial list

- 1 (right soft key)
- 2 [▼]/[▲]: Select the desired phone number. → → **OK**

3 [V]/[A]: "Yes" \rightarrow OK \rightarrow [\bigstar 0]

Pause (for PBX/long distance service users)

A pause is sometimes required when making calls using a PBX or long distance service. When storing a calling card access number and/or PIN in the phonebook, a pause is also needed (page 18).

Example: If you need to dial the line access number "0" when making outside calls with a PBX:

- 1 $[0] \rightarrow \mathbb{P}$
- 2 Dial the phone number. \rightarrow [\uparrow]

Note:

 A 3 second pause is inserted each time is pressed. Repeat as needed to create longer pauses.

Answering calls

When a call is being received, the ringer indicator on the handset flashes.

- 1 Lift the handset and press [↑] or [♠] when the unit rings.
 - You can also answer the call by pressing any dial key from [0] to [9], [*], or [#]. (Any key answer feature)
- 2 When you finish talking, press [⅍②] or place the handset on the base unit or charger.

Auto talk

You can answer calls simply by lifting the handset off the base unit or charger. You do not need to press []. To turn this feature on, see page 19.






















Adjusting the handset ringer volume Press [▲] or [▼] repeatedly to select the desired volume while the handset is ringing for an incoming call.

Note:

 You can also program the handset ringer volume beforehand (page 19).

Useful features during a call

Mute

While mute is turned on, you can hear the other party, but the other party cannot hear you.

- 1 Press during conversation.
 - 🛛 flashes.
- To return to the conversation, press again.

Recall/flash

[R/①] allows you to use the special features of your host PBX such as transferring an extension call, or accessing optional telephone services.

Note:

 To change the recall/flash time, see page 20.

For call waiting or Call Waiting Caller ID service users

To use call waiting, you must first subscribe to the call waiting service of your service provider/telephone company.

This feature allows you to receive calls while you are already talking on the phone. If you receive a call while on the phone, you will hear a call waiting tone.

If you subscribe to both Caller ID and Call Waiting with Caller ID services,

the 2nd caller's information is displayed after you hear the call waiting tone on the handset.

- 1 Press (R/⊕) to answer the 2nd call.
- 2 To switch between calls, press [R/②].

Note:

 Please contact your service provider/telephone company for details and availability of this service in your area.

Temporary tone dialling (for rotary/pulse service users)

You can temporarily switch the dialling mode to tone when you need to access touch-tone services (for example, telephone banking services).

- Make a call.
- 2 Press [*] when prompted to enter your code or PIN, then press the appropriate dial keys.

Note:

 The dialling mode will return to pulse when you hang up.

Call share

Available for:

You can join an existing outside call. To join the conversation, press [``] when the other handset is on an outside call.

Note:

 To prevent other users from joining your conversations with outside callers, turn the privacy mode on (page 20).



























Handset phonebook

The phonebook allows you to make calls without having to dial manually. You can add 100 names and phone numbers.

Adding entries

- \bowtie (left soft key) \rightarrow \blacksquare
- 2 [V]/[A]: "New Entry" \rightarrow OK
- 3 Enter the party's name (16 characters max.). \rightarrow **OK**
 - You can change the character entry mode by pressing 1/A/? (page 36).
- 4 Enter the party's phone number (24 digits max.). \rightarrow **OK** 2 times
 - To add other entries, repeat from step 3.
- 5 [%0]

Finding and calling a phonebook entry

Scrolling through all entries

- 1 (left soft key)
- 2 [▼]/[▲]: Select the desired entry.
 - You can scroll through the phonebook entry by pressing and holding (▼) or (▲).
- 3 [~]

Searching by first character (using a dial key)

- 1 (left soft key)
 - Change the character entry mode if necessary:

 $\overline{ABE} \rightarrow (V)/(A)$: Select the character entry mode. \rightarrow **OK**

Phonebook

- Press the dial key ([0] to [9]) which contains the character you are searching for (page 36).
 - Press the same dial key repeatedly to display the first entry corresponding to each character located on that dial key.
 - If there is no entry corresponding to the character you selected, the next entry is displayed.
- 3 [▼]/[▲]: Scroll through the phonebook if necessary.

Editing entries

Phonebook

Chain dial

This feature allows you to dial phone numbers in the phonebook while you are on a call. This feature can be used, for example, to dial a calling card access number or bank account PIN that you have stored in the phonebook, without having to dial manually.

- During an outside call, press ■.→ OK
- 2 [▼]/[▲]: Select the desired entry.
- 3 Press OK to dial the number.

Noto:

- When storing a calling card access number and your PIN in the phonebook as one phonebook entry, press to add pauses after the number and PIN as necessary (page 14).
- If you have rotary/pulse service, you need to press [*] before pressing in step 1 to change the dialling mode temporarily to tone. When adding entries to the phonebook, we recommend adding [*] to the beginning of phone numbers you wish to chain dial (page 13).

Copying phonebook entries

You can copy phonebook entries to the phonebook of another compatible Panasonic handset.

Copying an entry

- 1 Find the desired entry (page 17).

- **3** Enter the handset number you wish to send the phonebook entry to.
 - When an entry has been copied,
 "Completed" is displayed.
 - To continue copying another entry: (▼)/(▲): "Yes" → OK
 → Find the desired entry. →

Copying all entries

- 1 \bowtie (left soft key) \rightarrow \blacksquare
- 2 [V]/[A]: "Copy All" \rightarrow OK
- 3 Enter the handset number you wish to send the phonebook entry to.
 - When all entries have been copied, "Completed" is displayed.
























Useful Information

Character entry

The dial keys are used to enter characters and numbers. Each dial key has multiple characters assigned to it. The characters that can be entered depend on the character entry mode (page 36).

- Press (▲) or (▼) to move the cursor left or right.
- Press dial keys to enter characters and numbers.
- Press C to erase the character or number highlighted by the cursor. Press and hold **C** to erase all characters or numbers.
- Press [$m{\times}$] to switch between uppercase and lowercase.
- If you do not press any dial key within 5 seconds after entering a character, the character is fixed and the cursor moves to the next space.
- When entering another character located on the same dial key, operation will differ depending on the display language you select.

English

Press [▼] to move the cursor to the next space, then press the appropriate dial key.

Arabic/Persian

Press [A] to move the cursor to the next space, then press the appropriate dial



Character entry modes

The available character entry modes are Alphabet (ABC), Numeric (0-9), Arabic/Persian (ابت) and Extended (AÄÅ). When in these entry modes except Numeric, you can select which character is entered by pressing a dial key repeatedly.






Error messages

If the unit detects a problem, one of the following messages is shown on the display.

Display message	Cause/solution
Check Phone Line	• The supplied telephone line cord has not been connected yet or not connected properly. Check the connections (page 8).
Error ^{*1}	Recording was too short. Try again.
Failed ^{*2}	 Phonebook copy failed (page 18). Confirm the other handset (the receiver) is in standby mode and try again.




Troubleshooting

Disconnect the base unit from the telephone line and connect the line to a known working telephone. 





















Answering system (KX-TG6421)
