**Basic play** 

#### Preparation

Turn on the television and select the appropriate video input on the television to suit the connections for the player.



If the disc contains both audio data (WMA and MP3) and JPEG, check "Mixed Disc - Audio & Stills" in the SETUP menu (→ page 18). Select "Stills (JPEG)" or "Audio (MP3/WMA)".



## **2** Press $[\blacktriangle]$ to open the disc tray and place the

#### disc label-up on the disc tray.

•Load double-sided discs so the label for the side you want to play is facing up.

#### 3 Press [▶] (PLAY).

The disc tray closes and play begins. It is normal for sound and pictures to take time to start. WMA MP3 CD (CD text only) Track information appears on the television. Press [SUBTITLE] to turn the display on or off.



## Changing soundtracks, subtitles and angles

Some discs have multiple soundtracks, subtitle languages and camera angles, and you can change them during play.

- •"--" or "--" is displayed instead of the language number in
- circumstances such as when no language is recorded on the disc. VCD (SVCD only)

#### Soundtrack and subtitle numbers may change even if corresponding soundtracks are not recorded.

•"D.MIX" indicates that a multi-channel soundtrack can be down-mixed to two channels.





## Subtitles

#### DVD-V VCD (SVCD only):

You can change the subtitle language and turn the subtitles on and off. RAM : You can turn the subtitles on and off.

If the subtitles overlap closed captions recorded on discs, turn the subtitles off

#### To clear/display the subtitles



#### Advanced Surround

#### RAM DVD-V VCD (2-channel or over only)

Enjoy a surround-like effect when using 2 front speakers (SP) or headphones (HP) (connect the unit to equipment that has a headphone jack). The effect broadens when playing discs with surround effects and sound seems to come from speakers either side of you.







## **Using On-Screen Menu Icons**



On-Screen Menu Icons are menus that contain information about the disc or unit and allow you to perform operations by changing this information.

## **3** Press $[\blacktriangleleft, \triangleright]$ to select the item.

## 4 Press $[\blacktriangle, \nabla]$ to select the setting.

- Change numbered items with the numbered buttons and press [ENTER].
- •Read the following explanations for other items.







#### Decoder A decoder re

A decoder restores coded audio signals on DVDs to normal.

#### **Dolby Digital**

This is a method of coding digital signals developed by Dolby Laboratories. Apart from stereo (2-channel) audio, these signals can also be multi-channel audio. A large amount of audio information can be recorded on one disc using this method.

#### **Dolby Pro Logic**

A surround system where a 4-channel audio track is recorded as 2 channels and then is restored to 4 channels for play. The surround channel is monaural and can reproduce up to 7 kHz.

#### DTS (Digital Theater Systems)

This surround system is used in many movie theaters around the world. There is good separation between the channels, so realistic sound effects are possible.

#### Dynamic range

Dynamic range is the difference between the lowest level of sound that can be heard above the noise of the equipment and the highest level of sound before distortion occurs.

#### Film and video

DVD-Videos are recorded using either film or video. Usually, film is recorded at 24 frames per second, the rate movies are filmed at, while video is recorded at 30 frames per second. Frame still and field still
