





This model is designed to be used in Australia and New Zealand according to the location setting feature.

The default setting is Australia. To use in New Zealand, change the setting (feature #74 on page 69).

Caution:

- Note that the images of copied or received documents will remain on the used ink film. Use discretion when disposing of the used ink film.
- Do not rub or use an eraser on the printed side of recording paper, as the print may smear.
- In the event of problems, you should contact your equipment supplier in the first instance.
- This equipment is designed for use on the Australia and New Zealand network.

For Australian users

Warning:

- Please ensure that a separate telephone, not dependent on local power, is available for emergency use.
- This equipment will be inoperable when mains power fails.
- When a failure occurs which results in the internal parts becoming accessible, disconnect the power supply cord immediately and return this unit to an authorised service centre.
- Disconnect the telephone connection before disconnecting power connection prior to relocating the equipment, and reconnect the power first.
- To minimize the possibility of lightning damage, when you know that a thunderstorm is coming, we recommend that you:
 - A. Unplug the telephone line cord from the phone jack.
 - B. Unplug the power supply cord from the AC power outlet.
- No "000" or other calls can be made from this device during a mains power failure.
- The earcap on the handset is magnetised and may retain metallic objects.

For New Zealand users

Instructions to customer

Installation

Attached to this apparatus is an approval label. This label is evidence that it is a "Permitted Attachment" which has been authorised to be connected to your telephone service.


Conditions relating to connection and operation of this Permitted Attachment are contained in Telecommunications General By-Law 220 (5).

You are authorised to install this Permitted Attachment yourself by plugging it into the line socket of any regular telephone. You may connect it in place of your existing telephone or to any spare telephone socket installed in your premises.

To disconnect your existing telephone you must first remove its plug from the line socket. You can then insert the plug of your Permitted Attachment into the socket and use your equipment.

If the plug of your existing telephone cannot be readily removed, you will have to remove the screw securing it. To do this proceed as follows:

- 1. Loosen screw "A" sufficiently to remove the socket cover. (See Fig. 1.)
- 2. Remove screw "B" and withdraw the plug. (See Fig. 2.)
- 3. Replace screw "B". (See Fig. 3.) Ensure that it screws completely into the socket recess. (If the screw is too long, increase the hole depth or replace the screw with one 5 mm shorter.)
- 4. Replace socket cover and tighten screw "A". (See Fig. 4.)



If you are satisfied with the operation of your telephone service after plugging in your Permitted Attachment, your installation is completed.

You will be unable to connect this Permitted Attachment if your telephone service consists only of a wall phone or an old style telephone which is not connected by means of a modern plug and socket. In such cases a new socket will need to be installed.

Should the Permitted Attachment not operate when plugged into a socket, it is either faulty or unsuitable for operation with your telephone service. It should be returned to the store where purchased.

Service difficulties

If at any time a fault occurs on your telephone service carry out the following checks before you call for service:

- Disconnect the Permitted Attachment and try using the service with the normal telephone.
- If the telephone service then operates satisfactorily, the fault is in your Permitted Attachment. Leave the Permitted Attachment disconnected and report the fault to its supplier or agent to arrange for repair.
- If when using the telephone the service is still faulty, report the fault to "Service Difficulties and Faults" for attention.

You are required to keep this Permitted Attachment in good working order while it is connected to your telephone service. Its construction or internal circuit must not be modified in any way without permission.

Important safety instructions

When using this unit, basic safety precautions should always be followed to reduce the risk of fire, electric shock, or personal injury.

- 1. Read and understand all instructions.
- Follow all warnings and instructions marked on this unit.
- 3. Unplug this unit from power outlets before cleaning. Do not use liquid or aerosol cleaners. Use a damp cloth for cleaning.
- 4. Do not use this unit near water, for example near a bathtub, wash bowl, kitchen sink, etc.
- Place the unit securely on a stable surface. Serious damage and/or injury may result if the unit falls.
- Do not cover slots and openings on the unit.
 They are provided for ventilation and protection against overheating. Never place the unit near radiators, or in a place where proper ventilation is not provided.


Battery charge

- Place the cordless handset on the charger for about 7 hours before initial use.

Operating distance and noise

 The base unit and cordless handset use radio waves to communicate with each other.
 For maximum distance and noise-free operation, we recommend the following:



- ① Placing your base unit away from electrical appliances such as TVs, radios, personal computers or other phones.
- ② Placing the base unit in a HIGH and CENTRAL location with no obstructions such as walls.

Environment

- Keep the unit away from electrical noise generating devices, such as fluorescent lamps and motors.
- The unit should be kept free from dust, high temperature and vibration.
- The unit should not be exposed to direct sunlight.
- Do not place heavy objects on top of the unit.
- The unit should be kept away from heat sources such as heaters, kitchen stoves, etc. It should not be placed in rooms where the temperature is less than 5 °C or greater than 35 °C (base unit) / 40 °C (cordless handset, charger unit). Damp basements should also be avoided.

Routine care

 Wipe the outer surface of the unit with a soft cloth. Do not use benzine, thinner, or any abrasive powder.

Recording paper

 Store unused paper in the original packaging, in a cool and dry place. Not doing so may affect print quality.





Soft keys

- Pressing the centre of the joystick selects the centre soft key icon.
- The icons shown will vary depending on how you are using the unit.








2.1.1 Installing the ink film

The included film roll is a starter ink film.


1 Open the front cover by pulling up the centre part.



2 Release the back cover by pushing the green button (1).




3 Open the back cover.




4 Insert the front ink film roll by inserting its blue gear into the left slot of the unit (1). Insert the rear ink film roll by inserting its white gear into the left slot of the unit (2).

- The ink film is safe to touch and will not rub off on your hands like carbon paper.
- Make sure the blue gear (1) and white gear (2) are installed as shown.




5 Turn the blue gear (1) in the direction of the arrow until the ink film is tight (2).




Correct

• The ink film is wrapped around the blue core (3) at least once.




Incorrect

• The ink film is not wrapped around the blue core (4).




• The ink film is reversed.




• The ink film is slack or creased.

7 Close the front cover securely.




2.1.2 Replacing the ink film

To ensure that the unit operates properly, we recommend the use of Panasonic replacement film. See page 11 for accessory information.


 We cannot be responsible for any damage to the unit or degradation of print quality which may occur from the use of non-Panasonic replacement film.

Important:

- Remove the recording paper and the paper tray beforehand, or the paper may misfeed or jam.
- 1 Open the covers (see steps 1 to 3 on page 17).
- 2 Remove the used core (①) and used ink film (②).



3 Remove the stoppers (1) and tags (2) from the new ink film (3).



- 4 Insert the ink film and close the covers (see steps 4 to 7 on page 17).
- 5 Install the paper tray (page 19), then insert the recording paper (page 20).


2.2 Handset cord

Insert the tabs on the paper tray (1) into the slots on the back of the unit (2).




2.4 Recording paper


1 Pull the tension plate forward (1).



2 Fan the paper to prevent paper jams.







2.5 Battery installation / replacement

2.5.1 Installing the batteries

1 Insert the batteries negative (–) terminal first.



2 Close the battery cover.



2.5.2 Replacing the batteries

If **1** flashes even when the batteries have been fully charged, both batteries must be replaced. **Please use only Panasonic batteries**. See page 11 for accessory information.

Important:

- Charge the new batteries for about 7 hours before initial use.
- When replacing the batteries, ensure that the correct battery type is selected (page 77) even if you install the same type of batteries.
- Use only rechargeable batteries. If you install non-rechargeable batteries and start charging, the batteries may leak electrolyte.
- Do not mix old and new batteries.
- 1 Press the notch on the cover firmly and slide it in the direction of the arrow.



2 Remove the batteries positive (+) terminal first. Replace both batteries. See the battery installation procedure.


3.1 Connections

Important:

 The unit will not function when there is a power failure. To make calls in emergency situations, you should connect a telephone that can function during a power failure to the telephone line.

3.1.1 Base unit

- 1 Power cord
 - Connect to the power outlet (220 V 240 V, 50/60 Hz).
- 2 Telephone line cord
 - Connect to a single telephone line jack.





Caution:

- When you operate this product, the power outlet should be near the product and easily accessible.

- Do not extend the telephone line cord.



 If any other device is connected to the same telephone line, this unit may disturb the network condition of the device. If you use the unit with a computer and your internet provider instructs you to install a filter (③), please connect the telephone line cord as follows.



3.1.2 Charger unit

- 1 AC adaptor
 - Connect to the power outlet (220 V 240 V, 50/60 Hz).
- (2) Hooks
 - Fasten the AC adaptor cord to prevent it from being disconnected.




Caution:

- If the cordless handset is not charged, you cannot make or answer calls.
- USE ONLY WITH the included Panasonic AC adaptor.
- The AC adaptor must remain connected at all times. (It is normal for the adaptor to feel warm during use.)
- The AC adaptor should be connected to a vertically oriented or floor-mounted AC outlet. Do not connect the AC adaptor to a ceiling-mounted AC outlet, as the weight of the adaptor may cause it to become disconnected.

3.2 Battery charge

Place the cordless handset on the charger for about 7 hours before initial use.

The charge indicator (1) turns red while the batteries are charging, and turns green when the batteries are fully charged.



Note:

Clean the cordless handset charge contacts

 (②) and the charger charge contacts (③)
 with a soft, dry cloth once a month, otherwise the batteries may not charge properly. Clean more often if the unit is exposed to grease, dust or high humidity.

- If the cordless handset is turned OFF, it will be turned ON automatically when it is placed on the charger.

4.6 Caller ID service

This unit is compatible with Caller ID service offered by your local telephone company. To use this feature, you must subscribe to Caller ID service.

4.6.1 How Caller ID is displayed

When an outside call is received, the calling party's telephone number or name will be displayed. You then have the option of whether or not to answer the call.

The unit will automatically store caller information (telephone number, name, date and time of the call) of the last 50 different callers. Caller information is stored by the most recent to the oldest call. When the 51st call is received, the oldest call is deleted.

Caller information can be viewed on the display one item at a time (page 39) or confirmed by printing the Caller ID list (page 106).

Note:

- When caller information is received and it matches a telephone number stored in the unit's phonebook:
 - The stored name will be displayed.
 - The cordless handset will use the ringer indicator colour and type assigned to the caller's category.
- If the unit is connected to a PBX (Private Branch Exchange) system, caller information may not be received properly. Consult your PBX supplier.
- If the unit cannot receive caller information, the following will be displayed:
 - "OUT OF AREA"/"Out of Area": The caller dialled from an area which does not provide Caller ID service.
 - "PRIVATE CALLER"/"Private Caller": The caller requested not to send caller information.

Note for Australian users:

- Although Telstra and Optus do not currently send caller name information, the caller's name will be displayed as stored in the directory, when a call from that caller is received.
- The area code will need to be stored with the 8-digit telephone number.

Note for New Zealand users:

 Although Telecom New Zealand and TelstraClear do not currently send caller name information, the caller's name will be

- displayed as stored in the directory, when a call from that caller is received.
- Your telephone service provider may charge you for a local call when it is dialled with an area code prefix. If the charge for local call is unacceptable, only the 7-digits of the local number should be dialled from your telephone. Do not dial the "0" prefix or the area code digit.

To confirm caller information by printing the Caller ID list

- To print automatically after every 50 new calls, activate feature #26 (page 68).

Private category

Private categories can help you identify who is calling by using different ringer indicator colours and ringer types for different categories of callers.

You can assign items in the cordless handset phonebook to a category (page 34), change the category names (Friends, Family, etc., page 75), and search for phonebook items by category (page 35). When a call is received from a caller assigned to a category, the ringer indicator colour (page 75) and ringer type (page 74) you select is used.

Call Waiting Caller ID

This is a service of your service provider and will only operate if you have subscribed to this service. When you hear a call waiting tone during a conversation, the display will show the second caller's information. You can answer the second call, keeping the first call on hold. Please consult your service provider for details of this service.

Note:

- The second caller's information will not be displayed when:
 - the answering machine is recording an incoming message,
 - another telephone on the same line is in use, or
 - you are sending or receiving a fax document.

4.7 Viewing and calling back using caller information

You can easily view caller information and call back.

Important:

 Calling back will not be possible if the caller information does not include a telephone number.

Note:

 Telstra, Optus, Telecom New Zealand and TelstraClear do not currently send caller name information.

4.7.1 With the cordless handset







When the other party answers your call:

To select the resolution

- If the resolution setting is changed during feeding, it will be effective from the next page.

To redial the last number

To send more than 10 pages at a time

To predial a fax number

You can dial the fax number first before inserting the document. This is convenient if you need to refer to the document for the other party's fax number.

To send from memory (Quick scan feature)

You can scan the document into memory before sending. To use this feature, activate feature #34 (page 68) beforehand.

- Press [FAX/START].
- The document will be fed into the unit and scanned into memory. The unit will then transmit the data. If the document exceeds the memory capacity, sending will be cancelled and this feature will be turned OFF automatically. You must send the entire document manually.
- This feature cannot be used if the handset is in use, or [DIGITAL SP-PHONE] on the base unit, [] or [] on the cordless handset is pressed.

To stop transmission

Press (STOP).

Printing a sending report

A sending report provides you with a printed record of transmission results. To print sending reports, make sure feature #04 is activated (page 66). For an explanation of error messages, see page 90.

Printing a journal report





Document weight

- Single sheet: 45 g/m² to 90 g/m²
- Multiple sheets: 60 g/m² to 80 g/m²

Note:

- Remove clips, staples or other fasteners.
- Do not send documents that are on the following types of paper: (Make a copy of the document and send the copy.)
 - Chemically treated paper such as carbon or carbonless duplicating paper
 - Electrostatically charged paper
 - Badly curled, creased or torn paper
 - Paper with a coated surface
 - Paper with a faint image
 - Paper with printing on the opposite side that can be seen through the other side, such as newsprint.
- Check that ink, paste or correction fluid has dried completely.
- To send a document with a width of less than 210 mm, we recommend using a copy machine to copy the original document onto A4 or letter-sized paper, then sending the copied document.

5.3 Sending a fax using the base unit phonebook

Before using this feature, store the desired names and telephone numbers into the base unit phonebook (page 36).

- Keep the front cover page open for button locations.
- 1 Adjust the width of the document guides to fit the actual size of the document.
- Insert the document (up to 10 pages) FACE DOWN until a single beep is heard and the unit grasps the document.
 - If the document guides are not adjusted to fit the document, re-adjust them.
- 3 If necessary, press (♣) or (♠) repeatedly to select the desired resolution (page 43).
- 4 Press (▶).
- 5 Press (+) or (-) repeatedly to display the desired item and press (FAX/START).

Fax auto redial

If the line is busy or if there is no answer, the unit will automatically redial the number up to 2 times.

To cancel redialling, press [STOP].

If your unit does not send a fax

- Confirm that you have entered the number correctly, and that the number is a fax number.
- Confirm that the other party's fax machine is answering by turning ON the connecting tone feature (feature #76 on page 69).

5.4 Broadcast transmission



Set the fax machine to TAM/FAX mode (page 50) by pressing **(AUTO ANSWER)** repeatedly.

 The [AUTO ANSWER] indicator on the base unit turns ON and (next to the battery icon) appears on the cordless handset display.



Note:

- Make sure feature #77 is set to "TAM/FAX" beforehand (page 70).
- Do not connect an answering machine to the same telephone line. If connected, set the automatic answer feature to OFF by pressing [AUTO ANSWER] repeatedly.

How phone calls and faxes are received
If the call is a phone call, the fax machine will
record the caller's message automatically.
If a fax calling tone is detected, the fax machine
will receive the fax automatically.

5.5.2 Use only as a fax (FAX ONLY mode)

You have a separate telephone line just for faxes.

Setup

Set the fax machine to FAX ONLY mode (page 52) by pressing [AUTO ANSWER] repeatedly.

 The [AUTO ANSWER] indicator on the base unit turns ON and (next to the battery icon) appears on the cordless handset display.





Note:

 Make sure feature #77 is set to "FAX ONLY" beforehand (page 70).

How faxes are received

All incoming calls will be answered as faxes.

5.5.3 Use mostly as a telephone (TEL mode)



5.9 Junk fax prohibitor (preventing fax reception from undesired callers)

If you subscribe to Caller ID service, this feature prevents fax reception from calls that do not show caller information.

Additionally, you can store undesirable phone numbers in the junk fax prohibitor list; faxes sent from these phone numbers will not be received by your fax machine.

 Keep the front cover page open for button locations.

 - the unit is set to the TEL mode, or
 - manual reception is performed.

To display the junk fax prohibitor list

To erase an item from the junk fax prohibitor list

- 1. Press [MENU] repeatedly to display "JUNK FAX PROH.".
- 2. Press [] repeatedly to display "JUNK LIST DISP.".
- 3. Press (SET).
- Press (+) or (-) repeatedly to display the desired item.
- **5.** Press [**4**].
 - To cancel erasing, press [STOP], then press [MENU].
- 6. Press (SET).
 - The item is erased.
 - To erase other items, repeat steps 4 to 6.
- **7.** Press [MENU] to exit the list.


6.1 Using with the ring detection feature

This feature is only for use if you subscribe to a Distinctive Ring pattern service from your telephone company. For more information on the availability of this service in your area, please contact your telephone company before setting this feature on your unit. In Australia, this service is called "Fax Stream Duet".

In New Zealand, this service is called "FaxAbility".


The Distinctive Ring service gives you an additional phone number on a single telephone line, with a different ringing pattern.

When you wish to use the additional phone number as a facsimile telephone number, set the ring pattern detection feature to ON. When the unit detects a call matching the Distinctive Ring pattern, it will receive a fax automatically.



- 1 Press [MENU].
- 2 Press [#], then [3][1].
- **3** Press (♣) or (━) to select "on".
 - If this feature is not required, select "OFF".
- 4 Press (SET).
- 5 Press (MENU).

7.1 Making a copy



- **1** Adjust the width of the document guides (①) to fit the actual size of the document.
- Insert the document (up to 10 pages) FACE DOWN until a single beep is heard and the unit grasps the document.
 - If the document guides are not adjusted to fit the document, re-adjust them.
- 3 If necessary, press [+] or [-] repeatedly to select the desired resolution.
- 4 Press [COPY].
 - If necessary, enter the number of copies (up to 30).
- **5** Press **(START)**, or wait for 15 seconds.
 - The unit will start copying.

Note:

 Any document which can be sent as a fax can also be copied (page 44).

To select the resolution

Select the desired resolution according to the type of document.

- "FINE": For printed or typewritten documents with small print.
- "SUPER FINE": For documents with very small print.
- "РНОТО": For documents containing photographs, shaded drawings, etc.
 - If you select "STANDARD", copying will be done using "FINE" mode.

Quick scan feature

This feature is helpful when you want to copy the document, then remove it for other uses. To use this feature, activate feature #34 (page 68) beforehand. The default setting is OFF.

 The document will be fed into the unit and scanned into memory. The unit will then print the data.

If the document exceeds the memory capacity, copying of the exceeded document will be cancelled and this feature will be turned OFF automatically.

To stop copying

Press [STOP].

7.1.1 More copying features

To enlarge a document

- 1. Insert the document, then press [COPY].
- 2. Press ()].
- 3. Press (+) repeatedly to select "150%" or "200%", then press (START).


- If the appropriate reduction rate is not selected, the document may be divided and the top of the second sheet will be deleted.
- If the image at the bottom of the document is not copied when you copy a document that is the same length as the recording paper, try 92% or 86%.

To collate multiple copies

The unit can collate multiple copies in the same order as the original document pages.

- 1. Insert the document, then press [COPY].
- 2. Enter the number of copies (up to 30).
- Press [▶] 2 times to display "COLLATE OFF".
- Press (+) or (-) repeatedly to display "COLLATE ON".



8.1 Recording your greeting message

- **3** To stop recording, press **[GREETING]**.

- You can change the maximum TAM/FAX greeting message recording time to 60 seconds (feature #54 on page 69).
 - If you change the setting to 60 seconds, we recommend that you tell the caller in your TAM/FAX greeting message to press

 - If you change the setting from 60 seconds to 16 seconds, your greeting message will be deleted. The pre-recorded greeting message will be played when a call is received.

To check the greeting message

Press [GREETING].

• The unit will play the greeting message.

8.1.1 Erasing your recorded greeting message

Press [GREETING], and then press [ERASE] while your greeting message is played.

Note:

 If you erase your TAM/FAX greeting message, the pre-recorded greeting message will be played when a call is received.

8.1.2 Pre-recorded greeting message

If you do not record a greeting message, one of two pre-recorded messages will be played when a call is received, depending on the caller's recording time (page 61, or feature #10 on page 66).

To check the pre-recorded greeting, press [GREETING].

- When the recording time is set to "1
 MINUTE"/"1 Minute" or "NO LIMIT"/"No
 Limit", the unit will play a greeting message
 asking callers to send faxes or leave
 messages.
- When the recording time is set to "GREETING ONLY"/"Greeting Only", the unit will play a greeting message asking callers to call again.


8.2 Listening to recorded messages

When the unit has recorded new voice messages:

- The [AUTO ANSWER] indicator will flash when the auto answer setting is turned ON.
- The total number of recorded messages will flash on the base unit display.

Example:





Press [PLAYBACK].

- Only new messages will be played.
- Adjust the speaker volume using (♣) or (−).
- After playing back all of the new messages;
 - the [AUTO ANSWER] indicator will stop flashing but will remain lit up when the auto answer setting is turned ON.
 - the total number of recorded messages will stop flashing and remain displayed.
 If you press [PLAYBACK] at this time, all recorded messages will be played.
- At the end of the last message, the unit will announce the remaining recording time if it is less than 5 minutes.
- If the unit announces that the memory is full after playback, erase unnecessary messages (page 58, 60).

Note:

 The total recording time of all messages (greeting, incoming and memo) is about 30 minutes. A maximum of 64 messages (incoming and memo) can be recorded. If messages are recorded in noisy environment, the actual recording time may be less.

To repeat a message

Press (4) while listening to the message.

- If you press [◀] within 5 seconds of the beginning of the message, the previous message will be played.
- To play back a specific message, press [◀]
 or [▶] and search for the message you want
 to listen to.

To skip a message

Press [>] to play the next message.

To stop playback temporarily Press [STOP].

 If you press [PLAYBACK] within 1 minute, the unit will resume playing the rest of the messages.

Voice time/day stamp

During playback, the unit will announce the day of the week and time that each message was recorded.

If you subscribe to Caller ID service

During playback, the display shows the name and/or number of the caller whose message is being played.

You can call back the displayed number using the base unit.

 - If you do not need to edit the telephone number, skip to step 3.





- 5. Select "Emergency Call", then press OK.
- **6.** Select a memory location, then press **OK**.
 - If the memory location already contains an emergency number, the number is displayed.
- 7. Enter/edit the number, up to 24 digits, then press **OK**.
- 8. Press [> 0].

Setting call restriction

You can restrict selected cordless handsets/base unit from dialling certain numbers. You can assign up to 6 telephone numbers to be restricted, and select which cordless handsets/base unit will be restricted. Storing area codes here will prevent the restricted cordless handsets/base unit from dialling any telephone number in that area code. If a restricted number is dialled, the call will not be connected.

- 1. Press (centre of joystick).
- 2. Select , then press OK.
- 3. Enter "0000" (default base unit PIN).If you changed the PIN, enter it (page 80).
- 4. Select "Call Option", then press OK.
- 5. Select "Call Restricted", then press
- **OK**. Select "Call Restricted", then press
- **6.** Select the cordless handsets/base unit to be restricted, then press .
 - Restricted cordless handsets/base unit have a ✓ next to them.
 - To turn call restriction OFF for a cordless handset/base unit, select it, then press
- 7. Press OK.

- **8.** Select a memory location, then press **OK**.
 - Previously stored telephone numbers are displayed.
- Enter the telephone number or area code to be restricted (up to 8 digits), then press
 - To erase a restricted number, press [C].

10.Press [**水**①].

Note:

 If you put a first digit in step 9, the previously stored number will be all cleared. We recommend you to write down the previously stored number.

Selecting area codes to be deleted automatically

In some situations, phone numbers stored automatically in the Caller ID list (page 40) will include area codes. If you do not want to dial the area codes when making calls from the Caller ID list, you can store the area codes which you want the unit to delete automatically.

Example: You have stored the area code "123". If you make a call from the Caller ID list to the phone number "123–456–7890", the unit dials "456–7890".

- 1. Press (centre of joystick).
- 2. Select , then press OK.
- 3. Enter "0000" (default base unit PIN).
 - If you changed the PIN, enter it (page 80).
- 4. Select "Call Option", then press OK.
- 5. Select "Set ARS", then press OK.
- 6. Select "Set Area Code", then press OK.
- 7. Select an area code location (1-25), then press **OK**.
 - If the location already contains an area code, the code is displayed.
- 8. Enter an area code (5 digits max.), then press **OK**.
- 9. Press [> 0].

Note:

 The use of this feature can prevent a National Call from being dialled. E.g., in the case of the South Island, the "03" will be omitted and will therefore prevent a National Call to other areas of the South Island. (for New Zealand users only)

9.6.2 Other options

Changing the base unit PIN (personal identification number)

For security, the base unit PIN must be entered when changing certain settings. The default PIN is "0000".

Important:

- If you change the PIN, please make note of your new PIN. The unit will not reveal the PIN to you. If you forget your PIN, consult your nearest Panasonic service centre.
- 1. Press (centre of joystick).
- 2. Select , then press OK.
- 3. Enter "0000" (default base unit PIN).
 - If you changed the PIN, enter it.
- 4. Select "Other Option", then press OK.
- 5. Select "Change Base PIN", then press OK.
- 6. Enter the new 4-digit base unit PIN.
- 7. Enter the new 4-digit base unit PIN again.
- 8. Press (**★**①].

Resetting the base unit advanced features to their default settings

The base unit advanced features (page 67 to page 70) can be reset with the cordless handset.

- 1. Press (centre of joystick).
- 2. Select , then press OK.
- 3. Enter "0000" (default base unit PIN).
 - If you changed the PIN, enter it (page 80).
- 4. Select "Other Option", then press OK.
- 5. Select "Reset Base", then press OK.
- 6. Select "Yes", then press OK.
- 7. Press [★①].

Note:

- The ECM setting (feature #68 on page 69) will not be reset.
- You can also reset the base unit advanced features with the base unit (feature #80 on page 70).

10.1 Operating additional units

10.1.1 Additional cordless handsets

Up to 6 cordless handsets can be registered to a single base unit. Additional cordless handsets, for example, will allow you to have an intercom call with another cordless handset while a third cordless handset is on an outside call. See page 11 for accessory information.

10.1.2 Additional base units

Cordless handsets can be registered to up to 4 base units, allowing you to add additional base units and extend the area in which your cordless handset(s) can be used. If a cordless handset moves out of range of its base unit when "Auto" is selected on base unit selection (page 81), it will look for another base unit to make or receive calls. Each base unit forms 1 radio cell.

Note:

- Calls will be disconnected when the cordless handset moves from one radio cell to another.
- Intercom calls and call transfers are only possible between cordless handsets in the same radio cell.

10.2 Registering a cordless handset to a base unit

The cordless handset supplied with the base unit is already registered. If an optional cordless handset is purchased, it must be registered using the following method.

- Keep the front cover page open for button locations.
- 1 Press (centre of joystick).
- 2 Select , then press .
- **3** Select "Registration", then press **OK**.
- 4 Select "Register H/set", then press
 OK.
- Press and hold [LOCATOR/INTERCOM] on the base unit for about 3 seconds, until the registration tone sounds.
 - After pressing [LOCATOR/INTERCOM], the rest of

this procedure must be completed within 1 minute.

- 6 Select a base number, then press **OK**.
- 7 Wait until "Enter Base PIN" is displayed, then enter "0000" (default base unit PIN).
 - If you changed the PIN, enter it (page 80).
- 8 Press OK.

Note:

 When the cordless handset has been registered successfully, a confirmation tone will be heard and \(\bar{\psi}\) will stop flashing.

10.2.1 Selecting a base unit

When "Auto" is selected, the cordless handset will automatically use any available base unit it is registered to. When a specific base unit is selected, the cordless handset will make and receive calls using that base unit only. If the cordless handset is out of range of that base unit, no calls can be made or received.

- 1 Press (centre of joystick).
- 2 Select , then press .
- 3 Select "Select Base", then press OK.
- 4 Select the desired base unit number, or "Auto", then press **OK**.
 - The cordless handset starts searching for the base unit.

10.2.2 Cancelling a cordless handset

A cordless handset can cancel its own registration (or the registration of another cordless handset) that is stored in the base unit. This will allow the base unit to forget the cordless handset.

- 1 Press (centre of joystick).
- 2 Select , then press K.
- 3 Enter "0000" (default base unit PIN).
 - If you changed the PIN, enter it (page 80).
- 4 Select "Cancel Handset", then press OK.
 - The names of all cordless handsets registered to the base unit are displayed.
- **5** Select the cordless handset(s) you want to cancel, then press .
- 6 Press OK.

10.2.3 Cancelling a base unit

A cordless handset can cancel a base unit that it is registered to. This allows the cordless handset to forget the base unit.

- 1 Press (centre of joystick).
- 2 Select , then press .
- **3** Select "Registration", then press **OK**.
- 4 Select "Cancel Base", then press OK.
- 5 Enter "0000" (default cordless handset PIN).
 - If you changed the PIN, enter it (page 76).
- 6 Select the base unit(s) you want to cancel, then press .
- 7 Press OK.
- 8 Select "Yes", then press OK.
- 9 Press [> 0].

Note:

 To register the cordless handset to another base unit or to the same base unit again, see page 81.

10.3 Intercom

Intercom calls can be made between cordless handsets/base unit in the same radio cell, but not in different radio cells.

 Keep the front cover page open for button locations.

10.3.1 Between cordless handsets

Example: When cordless handset 1 calls cordless handset 2

- 1. Cordless handset 1:
 - Press [INT] and [2] (desired cordless handset number).
 - The cordless handset 2 will ring.
- 2. Cordless handset 2:

Press () or [] to answer.

3. When finished talking, press [> 0].

10.3.2 Between a cordless handset and the base unit

Example: When cordless handset 1 calls the base unit

1. Cordless handset 1:

Press (INT), then press (0).

- The base unit will ring.
- 2. Base unit:

Press [LOCATOR/INTERCOM], [DIGITAL SP-PHONE] or lift the handset to answer.

3. Cordless handset 1:

When finished talking, press [$^{\sim}$ 0] or place the cordless handset on the charger.

Base unit:

When finished talking, press [DIGITAL SP-PHONE], [LOCATOR/INTERCOM] or replace the handset.

Example: When the base unit calls cordless handset 1

1. Base unit:

Press [LOCATOR/INTERCOM], then press [1] (desired cordless handset number).

- The cordless handset 1 will ring.
- To page all cordless handsets, press [0].
 You can talk with the cordless handset user who answers first.
- To stop paging, press [LOCATOR/INTERCOM] again.
- 2. Cordless handset 1:

 Press (INT), (↑) or (□) to answer.
- 3. Base unit:

When finished talking, press [DIGITAL SP-PHONE], [LOCATOR/INTERCOM] or replace the handset.

Cordless handset 1:

When finished talking, press [🔨 0] or place the cordless handset on the charger.

Note:

 If the cordless handset user has difficulty hearing the base unit user, ask the base unit user to decrease the speaker volume by pressing [—].

Cordless handset locator

Using this feature, you can locate a cordless handset if it has been misplaced.

10.4 Transferring calls / Conference calls

Outside calls can be transferred to the base unit or to a cordless handset.

- 2 people can have a conference call with an outside party.
- Keep the front cover page open for button locations.

10.4.1 From a cordless handset to the base unit

Example: When cordless handset 1 transfers a call to the base unit

1. Cordless handset 1:

During an outside call, press [INT] and [0] to page the base unit.

- The outside call will be put on hold.
- If there is no answer, press [INT] to return to the outside call.

2. Base unit:

Press [LOCATOR/INTERCOM], [DIGITAL SP-PHONE] or lift the handset to answer the page.

• The base unit user can talk with cordless handset 1 user.

3. Cordless handset 1:

To complete the call transfer, press [> 0]. To establish a conference call, press [3].

To transfer a call without speaking to the base unit user

After step 1, press [> ①] on the cordless handset 1.

If the transferred call is not answered within 60 seconds, the cordless handset 1 will ring again. Press [INT] to return to the outside call.

10.4.2 From the base unit to a cordless handset

Example: When the base unit transfers a call to cordless handset 1

1. Base unit:

During an outside call, press [LOCATOR/INTERCOM] and [1] (desired cordless handset number) to page the cordless handset.

- The outside call will be put on hold.
- If there is no answer, press [LOCATOR/INTERCOM] to return to the outside call.
- 2. Cordless handset 1:

Press [INT], [↑] or [♣] to answer the page.

3. Base unit:

To complete the call transfer, press [DIGITAL SP-PHONE] or replace the handset.

To establish a conference call, press [3].

To transfer a call without speaking to the cordless handset 1 user

After step 1, press [DIGITAL SP-PHONE] or replace the handset.

If the transferred call is not answered within 60 seconds, the base unit will ring again. Press [LOCATOR/INTERCOM] to return to the outside call.

10.4.3 Between cordless handsets

Example: When cordless handset 1 transfers a call to cordless handset 2

1. Cordless handset 1:

During an outside call, press [INT] and [2] (desired cordless handset number).

- The outside call will be put on hold.
- If there is no answer, press [INT] to return to the outside call.

2. Cordless handset 2:

Press (INT), (►) or (♣) to answer.

 Cordless handset 2 can talk with cordless handset 1.

3. Cordless handset 1:

To complete the call transfer, press [> 0]. To establish a conference call, press [3].

To transfer a call without speaking to the cordless handset 2 user

After step 1, press [> 0] on the cordless handset 1.

If the transferred call is not answered within 60 seconds, the cordless handset 1 will ring again. Press [INT] to return to the outside call.

10.5 Copying cordless handset phonebook items

Phonebook items (page 34) can be copied from the cordless handset to the phonebook of another cordless handset.

 Keep the front cover page open for button locations.

Example: When cordless handset 1 is sending phonebook items to cordless handset 2.

- 1. Establish an intercom call (page 82).
- 2. Cordless handset 2:

Press (centre of joystick), select "Recv Phonebook", then press OK.

3. Cordless handset 1:

Press , select "Send Phonebook", then press OK.

• If you copy all items, skip to step 5.

4. Cordless handset 1:

Push the joystick up or down repeatedly to select the desired item.

- 5. Press OK.
- 6. Cordless handset 1:

Select "Copy One Item" Or "Copy All Items", then press OK.

 When copying is completed, a beep sounds and "Copy Complete" is displayed. After a few seconds, the cordless handset will return to the intercom call.

Note:

- If cordless handset 2 (the receiver) did not prepare for copying, "Copy Failure" will be displayed on cordless handset 1 (the sender).
- If phonebook memory is full on cordless handset 2 (the receiver), "Copy Incomplete" will be displayed on handset 1 (the sender).

10.6 Walkie-Talkie

This feature allows cordless handsets to communicate with each other directly when they are in range of the same base unit (common base station mode, group mode) and even when outside the range of the base unit (group mode only).

 Keep the front cover page open for button locations.

Important:

- The maximum distance possible between 2 cordless handsets using Walkie-Talkie is 300 metres outdoors. Actual performance will vary depending on usage conditions.
- When using Walkie-Talkie, talk time is about 6 hours; standby time is about 15 hours. Actual performance will vary depending on usage conditions. To improve battery performance, turn OFF the cordless handsets when not talking.
- Outside calls cannot be received while in Walkie-Talkie mode.

10.6.1 Changing the Walkie-Talkie mode

There are two Walkie-Talkie modes, common base station and group.

Common base station mode: Communication is possible between cordless handsets registered to a common base unit. If the cordless handsets are registered to more than one base unit, the same base unit must be selected.

Group mode: Communication is possible between cordless handsets that are both set to Walkie-Talkie mode and have the same 3-digit group ID. This allows cordless handsets to communicate in Walkie-Talkie mode regardless of which base unit they are registered to. The default setting is group.

Important:

- When in common base station mode, the cordless handsets cannot have Walkie-Talkie conversations if the base unit selection is set to "Auto" (page 81). Either select a base unit number, or change the Walkie-Talkie mode to "Group".
- 1 Press (centre of joystick).
- 2 Select [5], then press OK.
- 3 Select "Setting", then press OK.
- 4 Select the desired mode, then press **OK**.

- If "Common" is selected, skip to step 7.
- 5 If "Group" is selected, enter a 3-digit group ID, then press OK.
 - The default ID is "000".
- 6 Assign a cordless handset number (1–9) to be used during Walkie-Talkie conversations, then press **OK** 2 times.
 - This number is displayed on the cordless handset only when using Walkie-Talkie. It does not affect other operations.
- 7 Press [**★**①].

Note:

 To set the Walkie-Talkie mode to common base station mode, the cordless handset must be within range of a base unit.

10.6.2 Turning Walkie-Talkie ON

- 1 Press (centre of joystick).
- 2 Select [68], then press OK.
- 3 Select "on", then press OK.
 - The display changes to the Walkie-Talkie display, and the cordless handset's Walkie-Talkie number is displayed.

Note:

- If a cordless handset is outside the range of a base unit and the Walkie-Talkie mode is set to common mode, Walkie-Talkie cannot be turned ON.
- This feature is turned OFF when the cordless handset is turned OFF.

Turning Walkie-Talkie OFF

- 1. Press (centre of joystick).
- 2. Select "off", then press OK.

10.6.3 Starting Walkie-Talkie conversations


Be sure to turn Walkie-Talkie ON beforehand on both cordless handsets.

- 1 Press (), [♣], or (INT), then the other cordless handset's Walkie-Talkie number.
 - The other cordless handset will ring if it is within range.
- 2 The other cordless handset user can answer the call by pressing (, or (INT).
- 3 When finished talking, press [★①].

11.1 Using the belt clip

You can hang the cordless handset on your belt or pocket using the included belt clip.

To attach the belt clip

11.2 Using an optional headset

Connecting an optional headset to the cordless handset allows hands-free phone conversations. Please use only the Panasonic headset noted on page 11.

The speakerphone is not available while a headset is plugged into the cordless handset. To switch to speakerphone, disconnect the headset.

To connect an optional headset

Open the headset jack cover and plug the optional headset into the headset jack as shown.






Note:

11.3 Wall mounting the charger


- 1 Connect the AC adaptor.

Wall template for charger




11.4 Available character entries for the cordless handset

The cordless handset dial keys are used to enter characters and numbers. Each dial key has multiple characters assigned to it. The available character entry modes are; ABC (Alphabet), 0-9 (Numeric), ABF (Greek), AÄA (Extended 1), SŚŠ (Extended 2), and ABB (Cyrillic). When in ABC, ABF, AÄA, SŚŠ, or ABB character entry modes, you can select which character is entered by pressing a dial key repeatedly.

- Move the joystick to move the cursor.
- Press dial keys to enter characters and numbers.
- Press [C] to erase the character or number highlighted by the cursor. Press and hold [C] to erase all characters or numbers.
- Press [*) to switch between uppercase and lowercase.
- To enter another character located on the same dial key, push the joystick right to move the cursor to the next space, then press the appropriate dial key. (This is not necessary when entering text in LetterWise mode.)

11.4.1 Character entry modes

Press the right soft key repeatedly to select the desired character entry mode.

12.1 Error messages – Reports

If a problem occurs during fax transmission or reception, one of the following messages will be printed on the sending and journal reports (page 44).

COMMUNICATION ERROR (Code: 40-42, 46-72, FF)

A transmission or reception error occurred.
 Try again or check with the other party.

COMMUNICATION ERROR

(Code: 43, 44)

- A line problem occurred. Connect the telephone line cord to a different jack and try again.
- An overseas transmission error occurred. Try using the overseas mode (feature #23 on page 67).

DOCUMENT JAMMED

 The document is jammed. Remove the jammed document (page 102).

ERROR-NOT YOUR UNIT

(Code: 54, 59, 70)

 A transmission or reception error occurred because of a problem with the other party's fax machine. Check with the other party.

JUNK FAX PROH. REJECT

 The fax was rejected by the junk fax prohibitor feature (page 53).

MEMORY FULL

 The memory is full of received documents due to a lack of recording paper or a recording paper jam. Install paper (page 20) or clear the jammed paper (page 100).

NO DOCUMENT

 The document was not fed into the unit properly. Re-insert it and try again.

OTHER FAX NOT RESPONDING

- The other party's fax machine is busy or has run out of recording paper. Try again.
- The other party's fax machine rings too many times. Send the fax manually (page 43).
- The other party's machine is not a fax machine. Check with the other party.
- The number you dialled is not in service.

PRESSED THE STOP KEY

 [STOP] was pressed, and fax transmission or reception was cancelled.

OK

Fax transmission or reception was successful.

12.2 Error messages – Base unit display

If the unit detects a problem, one or more of the following messages will appear on the display.

BUSY

- The cordless handset you tried to call is in use
- The cordless handset you are calling is too far from the base unit.

CALL SERVICE

CALL SERVICE 2

There is something wrong with the unit.
 Contact our service personnel.

CHECK DOCUMENT

- The document was not fed into the unit properly. Re-insert the document. If misfeeding occurs frequently, clean the document feeder rollers (page 104) and try again.
- Attempted to send a document longer than 600 mm. Press [STOP] to remove the document. Divide the document into two or more sheets and try again.

CHECK FILM

- The ink film is empty. Replace the ink film with a new one (page 19).
- The ink film is not installed. Install it (page 17).
- The ink film is slack or creased. Tighten it (see step 5 on page 17).

CHECK MEMORY

 Memory (telephone numbers, parameters, etc.) has been erased. Re-program.

CHECK PAPER

- Recording paper is not installed or the unit has run out of paper. Install paper and press [START] to clear the message.
- The recording paper was not fed into the unit properly (page 102). Reinstall paper (page 20) and press [START] to clear the message.
- The recording paper has jammed near the recording paper entrance. Clear the jammed paper (page 100) and press [START] to clear the message.

CLOSE TENSION PLATE

• The tension plate is open. Close it (page 20).

COVER OPEN

• The back cover is open. Close it.

FAX IN MEMORY

 The unit has a document in memory. See the other displayed message instructions to print out the document. For fax memory capacity, see page 107.

FAX MEMORY FULL

- The memory is full of received documents due to a lack of recording paper or a recording paper jam. Install paper (page 20) or clear the jammed paper (page 100).
- When performing memory transmission, the document being stored exceeded the memory capacity of the unit. Send the entire document manually.

FILM EMPTY

- The ink film is empty. Replace the ink film with a new one (page 19).
- The ink film is slack. Tighten it (see step 5 on page 17) and install again.
- The fax machine is positioned near appliances such as TVs or speakers which generate an intense magnetic field.

FILM NEAR EMPTY

 The remaining ink film is low. Prepare a new ink film (page 11).

MEMORY FULL

- There is no space to store new items in the base unit phonebook. Erase unnecessary items (page 37).
- When making a copy, the document being stored exceeded the memory capacity of the unit. Press [STOP] to clear the message. Divide the document into sections.

MESSAGE FULL

 There is no memory available to record voice messages. Erase unnecessary messages (page 58, 60).

MODEM ERROR

• There is something wrong with the unit's modem. Contact our service personnel.

NO FAX REPLY

• The other party's fax machine is busy or has run out of recording paper. Try again.

OPEN CABINET CHECK FILM SLACK



OPEN CABINET CHECK FILM TYPE

- Please use genuine Panasonic replacement film (page 11).
- The ink film is slack. Tighten it (see step 5 on page 17).
- The fax machine is positioned near appliances such as TVs or speakers which generate an intense magnetic field.

PAPER JAMMED

 A recording paper jam occurred. Clear the jammed paper (page 100).

PLEASE WAIT

12. Help

 The unit is checking that there is no slack or crease on the ink film. Wait for a moment while the check is completed.

POLLING ERROR

 The other party's fax machine does not support polling. Check with the other party.

RECORDING ERROR

 The greeting message or voice memo you recorded was under 1 second long. Record a longer message.

REDIAL TIME OUT

 The other party's fax machine is busy or has run out of recording paper. Try again.

REMOVE DOCUMENT

- The document is jammed. Remove the jammed document (page 102).
- Press (STOP) to eject the jammed document.

SERIAL ERROR

- If any fax documents are stored in the memory, they will be lost. When power is restored, a power down report will be printed stating which documents in memory have been erased.
