### **OVERVIEW**

The PMCQ14A Color Quad Monitor is the ideal choice when you need an easy-to-install video surveillance system for viewing up to four areas at once. Cameras of your choice or alternate video sources (such as VCRs) can be used.

All monitor controls are located on the front of the unit. An observer can change the display to zoom in on a single camera with the touch of a button. Camera ID is displayed on the screen and is easily programmed.

In addition to its video capabilities, the monitor offers alarm and intercom features. The alarm lets you install a "call" button near the camera so that a person on camera can get the attention of the observer. The monitor has audio intercom capabilities that function only when CCQ1400A-4 cameras are used.

VCR connections are provided for recording cameras.

Alarm connections are provided on the back of the monitor. These connections serve as inputs to connect alarm contacts directly to the monitor when using a camera without alarm inputs. If not used as inputs, they can be used as outputs to provide a TTL compatible interface for operating alarm annunciators or other notification devices. Connections are easily made via push-in type wire connectors. An alarm trigger output is also provided on the push-in type wire connector. This can be used to automatically start a VCR when an alarm occurs.

# INSTALLATION

**NOTE:** The mini-DIN (IN) connectors are for use with CCQ1400A-4 cameras.

- 1. Place monitor on a stable surface such as a shelf or desk top.
- Connect cameras or alternate video sources to the desired channel IN/OUT connectors on the back of the monitor (refer to Figure 3).
- 3. Set impedance switches to the 75-ohm position (refer to Figure 3).
- If alarm contacts are used, run wires from the contacts to the monitor and connect at the push-in connector on the back (refer to Figure 3).



BE SURE THERE IS AIR SPACE BELOW MONITOR. DO NOT BLOCK AIR SPACE BY PLACING MONITOR ON A SOFT SURFACE OR BY COUNTERSINKING SPOTS FOR THE FEET.

- 5. If used, connect a VCR to the VIDEO/AUDIO IN/OUT jacks and/or MONITOR OUT connector, depending on the type of connectors on the VCR (refer to Figure 3). If MONITOR OUT is not used for a VCR, another monitor can be connected. If MONITOR OUT has equipment connected to it, set the impedance switch to HI. If MONITOR OUT is unused, set the switch to 75 ohms.
- 6. Plug in the power cord (refer to Figure 3).
- 7. Turn on MAIN switch on the back of the monitor (refer to Figure 3). Then press the POWER button on the front of the monitor.
- 8. The monitor begins operation using the factory set defaults. To re-program the monitor follow the procedure in Table A in the *Programming* section.
- 9. Test according to the check-out procedure in Table B.

## Table A. Programming Menu

Press ALT + MENU to toggle in or out of the programming menu.

Menu Item	Function	Procedure
[1] ID INPUT	Change channel name that appears on the screen.	<ul> <li>a. Press CH1 (1 flashes yellow and the first character in the CH1 description turns yellow).</li> <li>b. Use the up and down arrows (CH1 and CH2 buttons) to change a character. Up advances it through the alphabet, then the numbers, and finally the ASCII symbols. Use the left and right arrows (CH3 and CH4 buttons) to advance to the next or return to the previous character position.</li> <li>c. When you have finished with CH1, press the right arrow until the first character of CH2 turns yellow.</li> <li>d. Continue to change characters and advance through the channels until all desired channel names are entered.</li> <li>e. Press RESET.</li> </ul>
[2] DATE-TIME	Change date and time that appears on the screen.	<ul> <li>a. Press CH2 (2 flashes yellow and YEAR in the date field turns yellow).</li> <li>b. Use the up and down arrows (CH1 and CH2 buttons) to change the YEAR.</li> <li>c. Use the right arrow (CH4) button to advance to the MONTH position.</li> <li>d. Use the up and down arrows (CH1 and CH2 buttons) to change the MONTH.</li> <li>e. Use the right arrow (CH4) button to advance to the DAY position.</li> <li>f. Use the up and down arrows (CH1 and CH2 buttons) to change the DAY.</li> <li>g. When you have finished with the date, press the right arrow until the first character of the TIME field turns yellow.</li> <li>h. Continue to change characters and advance to the DATE FORM position.</li> <li>j. Use the up and down arrows (CH1 and CH2 buttons) to change the date format display. NOTE: The date field does not change in the Setup Menu after the date format is changed, but the selected date format is saved in memory. The new format will be displayed on the screen.</li> <li>k. [3] SEQUENCE	Change the amount of time that each screen is displayed during the sequence mode. (Screens always rotate in the order of QUAD, CH1, CH2, CH3, CH4.)	<ul> <li>a. Press CH3 (3 flashes yellow and the time character in the QUAD field turns yellow).</li> <li>b. Use the up and down arrows (CH1 and CH2 buttons) to change the time. Time range is OFF, 1 to 30 seconds.</li> <li>c. Use the left and right arrows (CH3 and CH4 buttons) to advance to the next or return to the previous channel position.</li> <li>d. Continue to change channels and advance through the times functions until all desired changes are entered.</li> <li>e. Press RESET.</li> </ul>
[4] MISC	Change the PIP Format (horizontal or vertical), Auto Reset time (off, 1 to 60 seconds, Alarm Beep (on or off alarm SensorType (normally open or normally closed and Active Out (TTL high to alarm or TTL low to alarm).	<ul> <li>a. Press CH4 (4 flashes yellow) (The format character in the PIP FORMAT field turns yellow)</li> <li>c. Use the left and right arrows (CH3 and CH4 buttons) to advance to the next or return to the previous field.</li> <li>d. Continue to change fields and advance through the settings until all desired changes are entered.</li> <li>e. Press RESET.</li> </ul>

# **CHECK OUT**

### Table B. Check-Out Procedure

This procedure assumes that power is on.

Step	Procedure	Results
1	Calibrate cameras.	Follow the manufacturer's recommendations for calibration.
2	Press the QUAD/MENU button.	See quad display.
3	Press the CH 1 button.	See channel 1 image full screen.
4	Press the CH 2 button.	See channel 2 image full screen.
5	Press the CH 3 button.	See channel 3 image full screen.
6	Press the CH 4 button.	See channel 4 image full screen.
7	Press the PIP/SEQ button.	See PIP display.
8	While holding the RESET/ALT button, press the PIP/SEQ button.	See each channel image displayed full screen in sequence.
9	Press any channel button, then press the ZOOM/FREEZE button. Use arrow keys to move the highlighted area. Press the QUAD/MENU button. Press the RESET/ALT button.	Zoom area is highlighted in the center of the screen. The highlighted area moves to different parts of the screen. The image zooms to show the selected area full screen. See the selected channel image full screen (normal).
10	Put an object in the area being observed by the selected camera. While holding the RESET/ALT button, press the ZOOM/FREEZE button. Remove the object from the observed area. Press the RESET/ALT button.	See the object on the screen. Any movement will be seen. See the object frozen on the screen. No movement will be seen. The object remains on the screen. The object disappears and movement is once again seen.

# **OPERATION**

The buttons below the screen control the programming and control functions.

## DISPLAY

The monitor display can show all cameras in a quad display, show all cameras with one prominent (picture-in-picture), show only one camera, sequence between all cameras, zoom, and freeze (refer to Figure 5).

## INTERCOM

**NOTE:** The intercom function is available only when CCQ1400A-4 cameras are used. The intercom operates with one camera at a time. When the monitor is in quad display mode, a speaker icon appears next to the channel number to show which camera has the intercom active.

Table D.	Intercom	Function
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Intercom Function	Action
Listen channel X	In quad mode, hold the ALT/RESET button and repeatedly press and release the AUDIO/ TALK button until the speaker icon appears in the window of the desired channel.
Talk channel X	Perform listen step described above. Release the ALT/RESET button and press and hold the AUDIO/TALK button. Speak in a normal voice. Release button to hear response. Adjust volume control, if necessary.

**NOTE:** You can operate the intercom when the other display modes are active (single channel and PIP), but you cannot change the channel unless you are in Quad mode.

## ALARM

The alarm operates with any or all cameras at once. ALM flashes at the top center of the screen and the display automatically switches to show the camera that has the alarm.

ALARM CAUSES THE ALARMED \_\_\_\_\_ CHANNEL TO SHOW FULL SCREEN, ALM BLINKS, BEEP SOUNDS (IF ON).



PRESS RESET TO ACKNOWLEDGE ALARM & STOP BEEP. DISPLAY RETURNS TO THE ORIGINAL MODE. WHEN THE ALARM GOES AWAY, THE CYCLE STARTS OVER.

Alarm Function	Action
Alarm occurs at a camera location.	The display switches to show a full-screen display of the camera that has the alarm and ALM flashes at the top center of the display. If alarm beep is pro grammed ON, the beep sounds for the programmed time period.
Manually acknowledge the alarm.	Press the RESET button. The display returns to the mode it was in before the alarm happened. The alarm beep stops. If the alarm condition still exists, ALM appears at the top of the screen.
Alarm is automatically reset (if the alarm has not been manually acknowledged).	If the programmed reset time has passed, the display returns to the mode it was in before the alarm happened. The alarm beep stops. If the alarm condition still exists, ALM appears at the top of the screen.
The condition that caused the alarm returns to normal.	Display switches as described above when an alarm occurs at a camera location.
Manually acknowledge the return to normal.	Press the RESET button. The display returns to the mode it was in before the alarm returned to normal. The alarm beep stops. ALM disappears from the top of the screen.
Return to normal is automatically reset (if the alarm has not been manually acknowledged).	If the programmed reset time has passed, the display returns to the mode it was in before the alarm returned to normal. The alarm beep stops. ALM disappears from the top of the screen.

### VCR RECORD/PLAYBACK

If a VCR is connected at the Video and Audio jacks (refer to Figure 3), the image displayed on the screen can be recorded. To enter the playback mode, hold the ALT button while you press the VCR button; the screen displays VCR playback. Press Reset to return to the normal display mode.

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Reference Number	Description	Function
1	Reset/ALT key	Resets alarm or video loss detection. When there is no alarm, use as ALT key to activate the alternate functions of the Zoom, PIP, Quad, CH4, and Talk keys.
2	Zoom/Freeze key	Toggles zoom mode when viewing single camera. In single-camera mode, freezes display when pressed while the ALT key is held in. In multiple-camera modes, freezes selected display when pressed while the ALT key is held in and then a channel key is pressed.
3	PIP/Sequence key	In display mode, shows picture-in picture view. Continuous pressing rotates the full- screen view. If pressed while the ALT key is held in, starts sequential viewing mode.
4	Quad/Menu key	In display mode, shows quad view. If pressed while the ALT key is held in, enters menu/setup mode.
5	Power Indicator LED	Illuminates when monitor power is on.
6	CH1/UP key	In display mode, shows full view of channel 1. In menu mode, moves cursor up or toggles setting.
7	CH2/Down key	In display mode, shows full view of channel 2. In menu mode, moves cursor down or toggles setting.
8	CH3/Left key	In display mode, shows full view of channel 3. In menu mode, moves cursor left or toggles setting.
9	CH4/Right key/VCR	In display mode, shows full view of channel 4. In menu mode, moves cursor right or toggles setting. If pressed while the ALT key is held in, display switches to the VCR playback mode.
10	Talk/Audio	Press to talk switch to activate microphone. Press and hold to talk. Release to listen. If pressed while the ALT key is held in, moves audio connection to the next channel.
11	Microphone	Speak in microphone to talk to people at camera locations.
12	Tint	Adjusts display color phase/flesh tones.
13	Sharpness	Adjusts display sharpness level.
14	Color	Adjusts display color saturation level.
