

IMPORTANT SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

- READ INSTRUCTIONS All the safety and operating instruction should be read before the product is operated.
- 2. RETAIN INSTRUCTIONS The safety and operating instruction should be retained for future reference.
- 3. HEED WARNINGS All warning on the product and in the operating instructions should be adhered to.
- 4. FOLLOW INSTRUCTIONS All operating and use instructions should be followed.
- 5. CLEANING Unplug this product from the wall outlet before cleaning. Do not use liquid cleaners or aerosol cleaners. Use a dry cloth for cleaning.
- ATTACHMENTS Do not use attachments not recommended by the product manufacturer as they
 may cause hazards.
- WATER AND MOISTURE Do not use this product near water- for example, near a bath tub, wash bowl, kitchen sink, or laundry tub, in a wet basement, or near a swimming pool, and the like.




- 10. This product should not be placed in a built-in installation such as a bookcase or rack unless proper ventilation is
- provided or the manufacturer's instruction have been adhered to. **11. POWER SOURCES** - This product should be operated only from the type of power source indicated on the marking label. If you are not sure of the type of power supply to your home, consult your product dealer or local power company. For products intended to operate from battery power, or other sources, refer to the operating instruction.
- 12. GROUNDING OR POLARIZATION This product may be equipped with a polarized alternating-current line plug (a plug having one blade wider than the other). This plug will fit into the power outlet only one way. This is a safety feature. If you are unable to insert the plug fully into the outlet, try reversing the plug. If the plug should still fail to fit, contact your electrician to replace your obsolete outlet. Do not defeat the safety purpose of the polarizes plug.

ALTERNATE WARNINGS - This product is equipped with a three-wire grounding-type plug, a plug having a third (grounding) pin. This plug will only fit into a grounding-type power outlet. This is a safety feature. If you are unable to insert the plug into the outlet, contact you electrician to


replace your obsolete outlet. Do not defeat the safety purpose of the grounding-type plug.

- 13. POWER-CORD PROTECTION Power supply cords should be routed so that they are not likely to be walked on or pinched by items placed upon or against them, paying particular attention to cords at plugs, convenience receptacles, and point where they exit from the product.
- 14. PROTECTIVE ATTACHMENT PLUG The product is equipped with an attachment plug having overload protection. This is a safety feature. See Instruction Manual for replacement or resetting of protective device. If replacement of the plug is required, be sure the service technician has used a replacement plug specified by the manufacturer that has the same overload protection as the original plug.
- 15. OUTDOOR ANTENNA GROUNDING If an outside antenna is connected to the receiver, be sure the antenna system is grounded so as to provide some protection against voltage surges and built-up static charges. Article 810 of the National Electrical Code, ANSI/NFPA 70, provides information with regard to proper grounding of the mast and supporting structure, grounding of the mast and supporting structure, grounding of the lead-in wire to an antenna-discharge unit, size of grounding conductors, location of antenna-discharge unit, connection to grounding electrodes, and requirements for the grounding electrode.



16. LIGHTNING - For added protection for this product during a lightning storm, or when it is left unattended and unused for long periods of time, unplug it from the wall outlet and disconnect the antenna or cable system. - 17. POWER LINES An outside antenna system should not be located in the vicinity of overhead power lines or other electric light or power circuits, or where it can fall into such power lines or circuits. POWER SUPPLY

- THIS SET WORKS ON NORMAL HOUSEHOLD AC-POWER.
- MAKE SURE THE SET VOLTAGE OF THE UNIT MATCHES YOUR LOCAL VOLTAGE.
- INSERT THE PLUG OF THE AC-CORD INTO A WALL OUTLET WITH AC-POWER.
- PRESS THE ON/ STANDBY KNOB TO SWITCH "ON" THE UNIT.

IMPORTANT : HOW TO TELL IF POWER IS "ON" ?

WHEN THE POWER IS "ON" THE ENTIRE DIGITAL DISPLAY WILL BE LIT UP WITH A "BLUE" BACK-LIGHT. THIS INDICATES THE HI-FI IS SWITCHED "ON".

BACK UP BATTERIES

- OPEN THE BATTERY DOOR AT THE REAR OF UNIT.
- INSERT 2 PCS "AAA-CELL" (UM-4/LR03 TYPE) BATTERIES IN THE BATTERY COMPARTMENT. THESE 2 BATTERIES ARE FOR BACKUP OF THE "REAL TIME CLOCK" AND "RADIO MEMORY PRESET STATIONS DURING BRIEF POWER OUTAGES". PLEASE OBSERVE THE CORRECT POLARITIES OR THE MEMORY WILL NOT BE PROPERLY MAINTAINED.


PREPARATION OF REMOTE CONTROL

- REMOVE (GENTLY PULL OUT) THE PLASTIC "TAB" FROM THE BATTERY COMPARTMENT AT THE REAR OF THE REMOTE CONTROL.
- TEST THE REMOTE CONTROL BY PRESSING THE υ (ON/ STANDBY) KEY TO CHECK THAT THE UNIT SWITCHES ON PROPERLY USING THE REMOTE CONTROL.

DIGITAL CLOCK FUNCTION

- THE SET HAS A BUILT-IN DIGITAL CLOCK, WHICH IS DISPLAYED IN 2 SITUATIONS:
- (1) WHEN THE SET IS IN "STANDBY MODÉ". (THE DISPLAY WILL CONTINUOUSLY SHOW THE CURRENT TIME). IN THIS SITUATION THE BLUE BACKLIGHT IS NORMALLY DIMMED (TO SAVE ELECTRICITY) BUT YOU CAN SWITCH ON THE BLUE DISPLAY LIGHT BY PRESSING THE "CLOCK SET" KEY OR "TIMER" KEY ON REMOTE CONTROL. THIS WILL ACTIVATE THE BLUE LIGHT FOR APPROXIMATELY 10 SECONDS.
- (2) WHEN THE SET IS IN "ON MODE" (THE BLUE LIGHT OF THE DISPLAY IS "ON" IN THIS MODE, TO INDICATE THAT THE SET IS POWERED "ON"). IN THIS SITUATION THE LCD DISPLAY NORMALLY DOES NOT AUTOMATICALLY SHOW THE CURRENT TIME. BUT YOU CAN PRESS THE "DISPLAY" KEY (ON REMOTE CONTROL) TO SEE THE CURRENT TIME.

HOW TO SET CORRECT TIME:



AUTOMATIC POWER ON/OFF TIMER FUNCTION

- THIS SET HAS A TIMER FUNCTION TO ENABLE YOU TO PROGRAM THE UNIT TO AUTOMATICALLY SWITCH "ON" OR "OFF" AT PRESET TIMES. THIS IS USEFUL AS A MORNING ALARM CLOCK :

HOW TO SET TIMER

- 1. PRESS AND HOLD TIMER KEY (ON REMOTE CONTROL). THE **ON TIME** SYMBOL APPEARS IN THE DISPLAY.
- 2. PRESS NEXT OR BACK TO ADJUST THE HOUR OF THE DESIRED "ON" TIME AND THEN PRESS TIMER KEY TO CONFIRM.
- 3. PRESS NEXT OR BACK TO ADJUST THE MINUTES OF THE DESIRED "ON" TIME AND THEN PRESS TIMER TO CONFIRM.
- 4. NOW THE WORDING IN THE DISPLAY CHANGES TO SHOW OFF TIME
- 5. PRESS NEXT OR BACK TO ADJUST THE HOUR OF THE DESIRED "OFF" TIME AND THEN PRESS TIMER TO CONFIRM.
- 6. PRESS NEXT OR BACK TO ADJUST THE MINUTES OF THE DESIRED "OFF" TIME AND THEN PRESS TIMER TO CONFIRM.
- 7. NOW THE DISPLAY WILL INDICATE THE "WAKE UP MODE" (iPod OR RADIO OR CD). PRESS NEXT TO CHOOSE THE DESIRED MODE & PRESS TIMER TO CONFIRM.
- THE DISPLAY THEN SHOWS THE "WAKE UP VOLUME LEVEL" (LOUDNESS). PRESS BACK OR NEXT TO DECREASE OR INCREASE THE VOLUME LEVEL TO BE USED FOR THE MUSIC TO BE PLAYED WHEN THE TIMER SWITCHES ON THE UNIT AT THE PRE-SETIME.
- 9. PRESS TIMER TO CONFIRM.
- 10. FINALLY THE UNIT WILL RETURN TO THE NORMAL DISPLAY, EXCEPT THAT THE TIMER SYMBOL WILL BE SHOWN, TO INDICATE THAT YOU HAVE PROGRAMMED A ON/OFF ALARM SETTING.
- 11. IN CASE YOU WISH TO DISABLE THE TIMER, PRESS THE TIMER KEY ONCE, & THE TIMER SYMBOL WILL DISAPPEARS.

(NOTE : THE AUTOMATIC ON/OFF TIMER WILL SWITCH ON THE UNIT AS IF YOU HAVE MANUALLY PRESSED THE "ON/ STANDBY" KEY. IF YOU HAVE SELECTED "WAKE TO RADIO", THE EXACT PRESET RADIO BAND & STATION WILL BECOME ACTIVATED WHEN POWER SWITCHES ON).

AUTOMATIC POWER OFF SLEEP FUNCTION

- THIS SET HAS A SPECIAL SLEEP TIMER FUNCTION WHICH CAN AUTOMATICALLY SWITCH OFF THE UNIT. THIS IS USEFUL FOR SLEEPING TO MUSIC AT NIGHT.

- AT ANY TIME WHILE THE UNIT IS OPERATING, PRESS **SLEEP** KEY (ON REMOTE CONTROL) REPEATEDLY TO CHOOSE THE AUTOMATIC POWER OFF TIME.



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(*OFF MEANS SLEEP TIMER IS DEACTIVATED)

ELECTRONIC VOLUME CONTROL

- THIS UNIT USES AN ELECTRONIC VOLUME CONTROL (PUSH BUTTON TYPE).
- TO INCREASE OR DECREASE THE LOUDNESS OF UNIT. PRESS
- THE VOLUME UP (VOL +) OR VOLUME DOWN (VOL -) KEYS RESPECTIVELY.
- RELEASE THE KEY WHEN VOLUME LEVEL IS AT THE DESIRED LOUDNESS.
- SOMETIMES, ESPECIALLY DURING LISTENING TO THE RADIO, YOU MAY NOTICE A "CLICK-CLICK-CLICK" (REPEATING) SOUND WHEN YOU ARE INCREASING OR DECREASING THE VOLUME. THIS IS A NORMAL CONDITION & THE SOUND WILL DISAPPEAR WHEN YOU RELEASE THE VOLUME KEY (WHEN YOU REACH THE DESIRED VOLUME LEVEL).

OPERATION OF RADIO

- PRESS THE "ON/OFF" KEY ONCE TO SWITCH ON THE UNIT.
- PRESS THE FUNCTION KEY (ON UNIT) REPEATEDLY UNTIL THE DISPLAY SHOWS "FM" OR PRESS THE "TUNER" KEY ONCE ON REMOTE CONTROL.
- TO IMPROVE FM-RADIO RECEPTION, FULLY EXTEND THE FM-ANTENNA WIRE AND ADJUST IT'S POSITION.
- USE THE "FM MODE" KEY (ON REMOTE CONTROL) TO SELECT THE DESIRED MODE (FM MONO/STEREO), IN SOME CASES, WHERE RECEPTION IS POOR. IT MAY BE ADVISABLE TO SELECT "MONO" MODE. TO IMPROVE CLARITY OF THE RADIO SIGNAL

MANUAL FREQUENCY ADJUSTMENT (SCAN MODE)

- PRESS (AND IMMEDIATELY RELEASE) THE NEXT KEY OR BACK KEY TO "SCAN" (MANUALLY ADJUST) THE RADIO FREQUENCY "UP" OR "DOWN" BY 1-STEP AT A TIME.
- THE RADIO DIGITAL DISPLAY WILL INDICATE THE EXACT FREQUENCY AT EACH STEP'S POSITION
- WHEN A DESIRED FREQUENCY OR STATION IS REACHED. IT CAN BE SAVED INTO ONE OF THE "MEMORY" POSITIONS. (SEE "RADIO MEMORY" SECTION).

AUTOMATIC FREQUENCY ADJUSTMENT (SEEK MODE)

- PRESS AND HOLD (FOR 2 SECONDS) THE NEXT OR BACK KEYS TO "SEEK" (AUTOMATICALLY ADJUST) THE RADIO FREQUENCY "UP" OR "DOWN" TO THE NEXT AVAILABLE RADIO STATION.
- THE RADIO DIGITAL DISPLAY WILL INDICATE THE EXACT FREQUENCY OF THE NEXT STATION THAT IS FOUND.
- WHEN A DESIRED STATION IS REACHED. IT CAN BE SAVED INTO ONE OF THE "MEMORY" POSITIONS, (SEE "RADIO MEMORY" SECTION),

RADIO MEMORY (STATION PRESET MEMORY STORAGE)

- AT ANY TIME, THE CURRENTLY DISPLAYED STATION OR FREQUENCY CAN BE STORED INTO ONE OF THE MEMORY POSITION.
- PRESS PROGRAM KEY ONCE.
- PRESS RADIO M+ OR RADIO M- KEY ON THE REMOTE CONTROL TO SELECT DESIRED MEMORY POSITION. (THERE ARE 30 MEMORY POSITIONS FOR FM BAND).
- PRESS PROGRAM KEY ONCE TO SAVE THE SELECTED STATION INTO THE SELECTED MEMORY POSITION.
- TO RECALL ANY SAVED MEMORY, SIMPLY PRESS RADIO M+ OR RADIO M-THE SAVED RADIO-BAND WILL BE RECALLED.
- TO CLEAR THE MEMORY OF ANY POSITION. SIMPLY SAVE A NEW STATION TO THE SAME MEMORY POSITION.

OPERATION WITH THE iPod/ iPhone

THIS UNIT IS DESIGNED TO ALLOW YOU TO CONNECT AN iPod/ iPhone WITHOUT THE NEED FOR DOCK CONNECTORS. THE DESIGN OF THE UNIT HAS BEEN STRUCTURED TO PROVIDE SUPPORT TO TE CONNECTOR UNDER NORMAL USAGE WITHOUT EXCESSIVE PRESSURE ON THE iPod/ iPhone WHEN CONTROLLING PLAYBACK USING THE iPod/ iPhone SCREEN.

- TURN ON BOTH THE UNIT AND THE iPod/ iPhone
- PRESS THE FUNCTION KEY REPEATEDLY UNTIL THE DISPLAY SHOWS "iPod" OR SIMPLY PRESS THE "DOCK" KEY ON REMOTE CONTROL.
- THE UNIT WILL AUTOMATICALLY START PLAYBACK OF THE SONGS.
- THE iPod/ iPhone DISPLAY WILL INDICATE THE INFORMATION OF THE CURRENT SONG (TRACK).
- AT ANYTIME DURING PLAYBACK, PRESS THE PLAY/PAUSE KEY TO PAUSE OPERATION OF THE UNIT, PRESS PLAY/PAUSE KEY TO RESUME OPERATION AT THE SAME TRACK & POSITION.
- AT ANYTIME DURING PLAYBACK, PRESS & HOLD THE PLAY/PAUSE KEY TO STOP PLAYBACK OF UNIT.
- AT ANYTIME DURING PLAYBACK. PRESS AND RELEASE THE DEN NEXT/ TUNE + OR ■■BACK/TUNE - KEYS ON UNIT (OR "iPod NEXT/ iPod BACK" KEY ON REMOTE CONTROL) TO SKIP FORWARD OR BACKWARDS BY ONE TRACK, AS DESIRED.
- ANY ANYTIME DURING PLAYBACK. PRESS AND HOLD THE DET NEXT/ TUNE + OR ■■BACK/TUNE - KEYS ON UNIT (OR "iPod NEXT/iPod BACK" KEY ON REMOTE CONTROL) TO FAST-FORWARD (CUE) OR FAST-REVERSE (REVIEW) THE SPECIFIC TRACK, WHICH IS CURRENTLY PLAYING.
- YOU CAN OPERATE THE iPod/ iPhone USING EITHER THE SET. REMOTE CONTROL OR DIRECTLY WITH THE iPod/ iPhone ITSELF.
- WHEN THE iPod/ iPhone HAS BEEN CONNECTED WITH THE UNIT. IT WILL START CHARGING THE BATTERY OF THE iPod/ iPhone.
- NEVER REMOVE (OR UNPLUG) THE iPod/ iPhone FROM THE SET DURING PLAYBACK, ALWAYS PRESS & HOLD FOR 2 SECONDS THE PLAY/PAUSE KEY FIRST AND THEN PRESS THE FUNCTION KEY TO SWITCH TO ANOTHER SOURCE (EG. "RADIO" OR "AUX") BEFORE REMOVING OR UNPLUGGING THE iPod/ iPhone. TO PREVENT DAMAGE TO YOUR SONG FILES OR MEMORY DEVICES.

REPEAT PLAYBACK FUNCTION (iPod/ iPhone)

- AT ANYTIME DURING iPod/ iPhone PLAYBACK:
- PRESS THE "PLAY MODE" KEY ON REMOTE CONTROL OR
- PRESS THE FOLLOWING SYMBOLS ON THE iPod/ iPhone SCREEN:



TO REPEAT THE CURRENT TRACK

= TO REPEAT ALL TRACKS

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SHUFFLE (RANDOM) PLAYBACK FUNCTION (iPod/ iPhone)

- THIS UNIT IS ABLE TO SHUFFLE ALL SONGS ON AN iPod/ iPhone AND PLAY THEM BACK IN "RANDOM" ORDER.
- TO ACTIVATE THIS FUNCTION, SELECT THE SHUFFLE ICON " >>> " (ON THE iPod/ iPhone).
- THE "SHUFFLE" SYMBOL WILL BE DISPLAYED ON THE iPod/ iPhone SCREEN & THE SONGS WILL BE PLAYED IN RANDOM ORDER.

iPod VIDEO OUT

YOU CAN CONNECT THE iPod/ iPhone VIDEO OUT SOCKET TO THE VIDEO INPUT TERMINAL OF YOUR TV TO WATCH VIDEO PROGRAMS FROM YOUR iPod/ iPhone ON YOUR TV SCREEN.

* NOTE: THIS UNIT DOES NOT SUPPORT VIDEO-JOUT FROM THE iPhone 4.

INSERTION AND REMOVAL OF DISCS

PRESS THE "FUNCTION" KEY (ON UNIT) REPEATEDLY UNTIL THE DISPLAY SHOWS "CD" OR PRESS "CD" KEY ONCE ON REMOTE CONTROL. PRESS THE OPEN/ CLOSE KEY TO OPEN THE CD-DOOR. CAREFULLY PLACE A COMPACT DISC ONTO THE CENTER SPINDLE WITH THE LABEL SIDE (PRINTED SIDE OF DISC) FACING OUTWARDS (TOWARDS YOU). PRESS THE "OPEN/ CLOSE" KEY TO AUTOMATICALLY CLOSE THE CD-DOOR. THE CD-DISPLAY WILL BRIEFLY SHOW THE TOTAL NUMBER OF TRACKS ON THE DISC AFTER A FEW SECONDS. THE CD IS NOW READY TO BE PLAYED. TO REMOVE A DISC, PRESS THE OPEN/ CLOSE KEY. THE DOOR WILL OPEN UPWARDS ALLOWING THE REMOVAL OF THE CD INSIDE.

IMPORTANT

MOTORIZED AUTOMATIC CD-DOOR - OPERATION AND PRECAUTIONS

- THIS UNIT HAS A MOTORIZED (MOTOR OPERATED) AUTOMATIC CD-DOOR.
- PLEASE NEVER TRY TO OPEN OR CLOSE THE DOOR MANUALLY (BY HAND)
- ALWAYS USE THE CD OPEN / CLOSE KEY
- WHEN OPENING, THE DOOR WILL SWING UPWARDS AND STOP AUTOMATICALLY WHEN IT IS FULLY OPEN. NEVER APPLY PRESSURE ON THE DOOR TO OPEN THE DOOR FASTER OR BEYOND ITS LIMIT.

NORMAL CD OPERATION

- PRESS "ON/ STANDBY" KEY TO SWITCH ON THE UNIT.
- PRESS THE **"FUNCTION**" KEY (ON UNIT) REPEATEDLY UNTIL THE DISPLAY SHOWS "CD" OR PRESS THE **"CD**" KEY ON REMOTE CONTROL.
- PRESS THE "OPEN/ CLOSE" KEY & INSERT A CD AS DESCRIBED.
- PRESS **PLAY/PAUSE I** KEY IF PLAYBACK DOESN'T AUTOMATICALLY BEGIN. THE DISK WILL START SPINNING & THE FIRST SONG (TRACK) WILL START PLAYING. THE DISPLAY WILL INDICATE THE CURRENT TRACK NO.
- AT ANY ANYTIME DURING PLAYBACK, PRESS THE **PLAY/PAUSE I** KEY TO PAUSE OPERATION OF THE UNIT. PRESS **PLAY/PAUSE I** KEY TO RESUME OPERATION AT THE SAME TRACK & POSITION.
- AT ANYTIME DURING PLAYBACK, PRESS THE **STOP** KEY TO STOP OPERATION OF THE SET. THIS WILL RESET THE SET TO THE FIRST TRACK (IF YOU PRESS PLAY AFTER STOP, THE FIRST TRACK WILL ALWAYS START PLAYING).
- AT ANYTIME DURING PLAYBACK, PRESS AND RELEASE THE NEXTOR BACK KEYS TO SKIP FORWARD OR BACKWARDS BY ONE TRACK, AS DESIRED.
- ANY ANYTIME DURING PLAYBACK, PRESS AND HOLD THE NEXT OR BACK KEYS TO FAST-FORWARD (CUE) OR FAST-REVERSE (REVIEW) THE SPECIFIC TRACK, WHICH IS CURRENTLY PLAYING.

PROGRAMMING THE CD-PLAYER

- THE CD PLAYER CAN BE PROGRAMMED TO PLAY ANY SEQUENCE OF UPTO 20 TRACKS, AS DESIRED.
- ALWAYS PRESS THE **STOP** KEY BEFORE STARTING THE PROGRAMMING.
- 1. SWITCH ON THE SET AND SELECT "CD" FUNCTION. THEN PRESS STOP KEY.
- 2. PRESS PROGRAM KEY ONCE.
- 3. PRESS NEXT AND BACK KEYS TO SELECT THE TRACK (SONG) NUMBER IN THE CURRENT MEMORY POSITION (AS DISPLAYED ON THE SCREEN).
- 4. PRESS [PROGRAM] KEY. THIS SAVES THE SELECTED SONG INTO THE PREVIOUS MEMORY POSITION AND ADVANCES THE MEMORY POSITION TO THE NEXT NUMBER SO THAT YOU CAN SAVE ANOTHER SONG IN THIS POSITION.
- REPEAT STEP (3) AND (4), EACH TIME SELECTING ANY TRACK (SONG) NUMBER OF YOUR CHOICE TO BE STORED IN SUCCESSIVE PROGRAM MEMORY POSITIONS. MAKE SURE TO PRESS PROGRAM KEY EACH TIME.
- 6. AFTER A MAXIMUM OF 20 SONGS (OR LESS) HAVE BEEN SELECTED AS DESCRIBED, PRESS THE **PLAY** KEY TO START PLAYING YOUR PROGRAMMED SEQUENCE OF SONGS.
- 7. TO CLEAR (CANCEL) THE ENTIRE PROGRAM WHICH IS STORED IN THE MEMORY, SIMPLY PRESS **STOP** KEY TWICE. THIS WILL RESET THE MEMORY AND CLEAR THE PROGRAM.

MUSIC EQUALIZER

- ANYTIME DURING CD PLAYBACK, PRESS THE EQ KEY (ON REMOTE CONTROL) REPEATEDLY TO CHOOSE THE DESIRED SOUND EFFECT ACCORDING TO THE MUSIC YOU ARE LISTENING TO :

CLASSIC-ROCK POP JAZZ *OFF

(*OFF MEANS SLEEP TIMER IS DEACTIVATED)

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REPEAT PLAYBACK FUNCTION

- AT ANYTIME DURING PLAYBACK:
- PRESS <u>P-MODE</u> KEY (SAME AS <u>PLAY MODE</u> KEY ON REMOTE CONTROL) REPEATEDLY TO SELECT:
- PRESS ONCE = REPEAT ONE: TO REPEAT THE CURRENT TRACK (DISPLAY FLASHES "REP")
- PRESS TWICE = REPEAT ALL: TO REPEAT ALL TRACK (DISPLAY SHOWSS "REP")
- PRESS THREE = RANDOM: TO SHUFFLE ALL SONGS ON A DISC. (DISPLAY SHOWS "RAND")

MUTE FUNCTION

- THIS SET HAS A MUTE FUNCTION TO ENABLE YOU TO TURN OFF THE VOLUME TEMPORARILY.

- TO CONNECT THE EXTERNAL DEVICE PLEASE USE A STANDARD STEREO HEADPHONE (3.5MM TO 3.5MM PLUGS) CABLE TO CONNECT THE "HEADPHONE-OUT OR AUDIO LINE-OUT" OF THE DEVICE TO THE AUX-INPUT SOCKET OF THIS UNIT.
- SWITCH THE FUNCTION TO "AUX" USING THE **FUNCTION** KEY ON UNIT OR "AUX" KEY ON REMOTE CONTROL.
- SWITCH ON THE UNIT AND THE EXTERNAL DEVICE (eg. MP3-PLAYER OR TV).
- START PLAYBACK OF THE EXTERNAL DEVICE AND ADJUST THE VOLUME CONTROL OF THE MAIN UNIT TO THE DESIRED LEVEL.





FIXING THE BASE TO THE UNIT:


