1. INTRODUCTION

1.1. Safety Information

To ensure reliable and safe operation of this equipment, please read carefully all the instructions in this user guide, especially the safety information below.





- unit and ty stand.




3. Mounting on the wall




Install the Batteries

If the remote control fails to operate the TV functions, replace the batteries in the remote control.

Open the battery cover.

Insert two size-AAA batteries.(Place the batteries with their terminals corresponding to the (+) and (-) indications in the battery compartment.)

Replace the cover.



Precaution on battery use

Improper use of batteries can result in a leakage of chemicals and/or explosion. Be sure to follow the instructions below.

* Place batteries with their terminals corresponding to the (+) and (–) indications.

* Different types of batteries have different characteristics. Do not mix batteries of different types.

* Do not mix old and new batteries. Mixing old and new batteries can shorten the life of new batteries and/or cause old batteries to leak chemicals.


2.1. Power Supply Connection

2.2. RF Antenna Connection


Connect the antenna as shown in the figure to receive the analog or digital (DTT) TV signal.


2.3. Connecting via Composite Video

Connect your video player, decoder, DVD or similar with the corresponding tri-color RCA cable, from the AV output (audio/video) of your video equipment to the video and audio input to your TV by the cable, as shown in the figure.




2.4. Connecting via Component Video

Connect your video player, decoder, DVD or similar with an RCA cable, from the YPbPr video output of the device to the video input on your TV by the cable , as shown in figure . Through this entry you can get HD video. Use a second RCA cable to connect the audio to AUDIO IN R/L.



2.5. Connect to Digital Audio Amplifier


Take the coaxial digital audio output of your TV to connect to a hifi system you have, and improve your sound experience.

2.6. Connecting via HDMI


Connect your video player, decoder, DVD or similar, with the corresponding HDMI cable from the HDMI output of your video equipment to one of the HDMI input on your TV, as shown in figure. This cable transfers HD video and audio.


2.7. Connecting to a PC

Connect the VGA output (RGB) from your PC to the corresponding input on your TV, and the audio output from your computer to the PC AUDIO input of your television.



2.8. Connecting Headphones

Use the HEADPHONES output of your TV set to listen the audio of the unit through your own stereo headphones. When you connect headphones to the unit, the main speakers will be silenced.



3. Initial Setup

3.1. Initial Installation

The first time the unit is turned on or anytime the system is restored to the defaulted settings, the Initial Installation wizard will be displayed on the screen.

Conect the antenna cable to the RF connector at the connections panel and follow the steps displayed on the screen to set up the system basic settings (Language, Cable, etc.) and start an auto search of TV channels.

3.2. Audio/Video Source Selection

Turn on the TV by pressing the **POWER** button on TV or on the remote control, press **SOURCE** and use the direction buttons \blacktriangle / \blacktriangledown to select the desired source depending on the equipment you have connected (AV, HDMI, VGA) or choose TV to enter these mode.



3.3. DTT Mode Operations

Use CH+ or CH- buttons to tune the desired channel, or enter the channel number directly using the numeric keypad. Press OK to display on screen the list of TV and radio channels (press the ◀/▶ buttons to sort by group and show only the DTV, the analog TV channels, Radio channels, etc.).

Use MTS button to select the audio language broadcasting, CC button to show or hide subtitles on screen and FAV button to see a list of your favorite channels.







5. PC Mode

Setting up your PC software (based on Windows XP)

The Windows display-settings for a typical computer are shown below. But the actual screen on your PC will probably be different, depending upon your particular version of Windows and your particular video card. But even if your actual screen looks different, the same, basic set-up information will apply in almost all cases.



- 1. First, click on "Control Panel" on the Windows start menu.
- 2. When the control panel window appears, click on "Appearance and Themes" and a display dialog-box will appear.
- 3. When the control panel window appears, click on "Display" and a display dialog-box will appear
- Navigate to the "Setting" tab on the display dialog-box. The correct size setting (resolution)
 Optimum: 1360×768.

If a vertical-frequency option exists on your display settings dialog box, the correct value is "60Hz". Otherwise, just click "Enter" and exit the dialog box.
