

# TO THE OWNER

Before operating this projector, read this manual thoroughly and operate the projector properly.

This projector provides many convenient features and functions. Operating the projector properly enables you to manage those features and maintains it in better condition for a considerable time.


Improper operation may result in not only shortening the product-life, but also malfunctions, fire hazard, or other accidents.

If your projector seems to operate improperly, read this manual again, check operations and cable connections and try the solutions in the "Trouble-shooting" section of the end of this booklet. If the problem still persists, contact the sales dealer where you purchased the projector or the service center.



# WARNING : TO REDUCE THE RISK OF FIRE OR ELECTRIC SHOCK, DO NOT EXPOSE THIS APPLIANCE TO RAIN OR MOISTURE.

- This projector produces intense light from the projection lens. Do not stare directly into the lens as possible. Eye damage could result. Be especially careful that children do not stare directly into the beam.
- This projector should be set in the way indicated. If not, it may result in a fire hazard.
- Take appropriate space on the top, sides and rear of the projector cabinet for allowing air circulation and cooling the projector. Minimum distance should be taken. If the projector is to be built into a compartment or similarly enclosed, the minimum distances must be maintained. Do not cover the ventilation slot on the projector. Heat build-up can reduce the service life of your projector, and can also be dangerous.



- Do not put any flammable object or spray can near the projector, hot air is exhausted from the ventilation holes.
- The Remote Control Unit, supplied to this projector, emits the laser beam as the Laser Pointer function from the Laser Light Window while pressing the LASER button (for 1 minute). Do not look into the Laser Light Window or shine the laser beam on yourself or other people. Eye damage may result.
- If the projector is not to be used for an extended time, unplug the projector from the power outlet.

# SAFETY PRECAUTIONS

All the safety and operating instructions should be read before the product is operated.

Read all of the instructions given here and retain them for later use. Unplug this projector from AC power supply before cleaning. Do not use liquid or aerosol cleaners. Use a damp cloth for cleaning.

Follow all warnings and instructions marked on the projector.

For added protection to the projector during a lightning storm, or when it is left unattended and unused for long periods of time, unplug it from the wall outlet. This will prevent damage due to lightning and power line surges.

Do not expose this unit to rain or use near water... for example, in a wet basement, near a swimming pool, etc...

Do not use attachments not recommended by the manufacturer as they may cause hazards.

Do not place this projector on an unstable cart, stand, or table. The projector may fall, causing serious injury to a child or adult, and serious damage to the projector. Use only with a cart or stand recommended by the manufacturer, or sold with the projector. Wall or shelf mounting should follow the manufacturer's instructions, and should use a mounting kit approved by the manufacturers.

An appliance and cart combination should be moved with care. Quick stops, excessive force, and uneven surfaces may cause the appliance and cart combination to overturn.



Slots and openings in the back and bottom of the cabinet are provided for ventilation, to insure reliable operation of the equipment and to protect it from overheating.

The openings should never be covered with cloth or other materials, and the bottom opening should not be blocked by placing the projector on a bed, sofa, rug, or other similar surface. This projector should never be placed near or over a radiator or heat register.

This projector should not be placed in a built-in installation such as a book case unless proper ventilation is provided.

Never push objects of any kind into this projector through cabinet slots as they may touch dangerous voltage points or short out parts that could result in a fire or electric shock. Never spill liquid of any kind on the projector. This projector should be operated only from the type of power source indicated on the marking label. If you are not sure of the type of power supplied, consult your authorized dealer or local power company.

Do not overload wall outlets and extension cords as this can result in fire or electric shock. Do not allow anything to rest on the power cord. Do not locate this projector where the cord may be damaged by persons walking on it.

Do not attempt to service this projector yourself as opening or removing covers may expose you to dangerous voltage or other hazards. Refer all servicing to qualified service personnel.

Unplug this projector from wall outlet and refer servicing to qualified service personnel under the following conditions:

Adjust only those controls that are covered by the operating instructions as improper adjustment of other controls may result in damage and will often require extensive work by a qualified technician to restore the projector to normal operation.
- e. If the projector has been dropped or the cabinet has been damaged.
- f. When the projector exhibits a distinct change in performance-this indicates a need for service.

When replacement parts are required, be sure the service technician has used replacement parts specified by the manufacturer that have the same characteristics as the original part. Unauthorized substitutions may result in fire, electric shock, or injury to persons.

Upon completion of any service or repairs to this projector, ask the service technician to perform routine safety checks to determine that the projector is in safe operating condition.



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# FEATURES AND DESIGN

This Multimedia Projector is designed with the most advanced technology for portability, durability, and ease of use. The projector utilizes built-in multimedia features, a palette of 16.77 million colors, and matrix liquid crystal display (LCD) technology.

# Compatibility

This projector widely accepts various video and computer input signals including;

### Computers

IBM-compatible and Macintosh computers up to 1280 x 1024 resolution.

- 6 Color Systems NTSC, PAL, SECAM, NTSC 4.43, PAL-M or PAL-N color system can be connected.
- Component Video

Component video signals, such as a DVD player output, high definition TV signals including 480i, 480p, 575i, 575p, 720p, 1035i, 1080i-50 or 1080i-60, can be connected.

S-Video

S-Video signals, such as a S-VHS VCR output signals, can be connected.

### High Resolution Image

This projector provides 1024 x 768 dots resolution for computer input and 800 horizontal TV lines. The resolution from the computer between XGA (1024 x 768) and SXGA (1280 x 1024) is compressed into 1024 x 768 dots. This projector cannot display image of over 1280 x 1024 dots. When the resolution of your computer is over than 1280 x 1024, reset the computer output for lower resolution.

# Multi-Scan System

This projector has Multi-Scan System to conform to almost all computer output signals quickly. There is no need for troublesome manual adjustment of frequency and other settings.

# One-Touch Auto Imaging

Incoming computer video signals are recognized and the best setting is automatically selected by the Auto Image function. No complicated setup is necessary and projection is always precise.

# Progressive Scan Function

This function converts interlace video signals into progressive scan signals and provide fine picture quality.

# Multilanguage Menu Display

Operation menu is displayed in; English, Deutsch, Français, Italiano, Español, or Japanese.

# Digital Zoom (Computer Mode only)

The Digital Zoom magnifies the image up to 49 times, allowing you to focus on crucial information at a presentation.

### Motor-driven Lens Shift

The projection lens can be moved up, down, left and right with the motor-driven lens shift function. This function makes it easy to provide the projected image where you want.

The zoom and focus can be also adjusted with motordriven operation.

# Keystone Correction

Positioning height of the projector may result in distorted images being displayed in a trapezoid shape. Keystone Correction maintains this problem by digitally altering the projection to produce undistorted images.

### Power Management

Power Management function is provided to reduce power consumption while the projector is not in use.

This Power Management function operates to turn the Projection Lamp off when the projector detects signal interruption and any button is not pressed over 5 minutes. The Projection Lamp is automatically turned on again when the projector detects the signal or any operation button is pressed.

This projector is shipped with this function ON.

# Digital Visual Interface

This projector is equipped with the DVI terminal for connecting DVI (conforming VESA standard) output of the computer.

# Multi Versatile Platform

This projector applies various input/output terminals and 4 terminal slots for expansion to tune to diversity of signals from computers and video equipment.

# Selectable Terminal Slots

4-built-in Terminal Slots enable you to arrange any combinations of input sources just by changing Terminal Boards. For Terminal Boards, contact the sales dealer where you purchased the projector.

# Laser Pointer Function


The Remote Control Unit supplied with this projector includes the Laser Pointer function. This function helps you to make a smart presentation on a projected screen.



# **CONNECTING THE AC POWER CORD**


This projector uses nominal input voltages of 100-120 V or 200-240 V AC. The projector automatically selects the correct input voltage. It is designed to work with single-phase power systems having a grounded neutral conductor. To reduce the risk of electrical shock, do not plug into any other type of power system.

Consult your authorized dealer or service station if you are not sure of the type of power supply being in use. Connect the projector with the peripheral equipment before turning the projector on. (Refer to pages  $12 \sim 15$  for connection.)



Connect the AC Power Cord (supplied) to the projector.

The AC outlet must be near this equipment and must be easily accessible.



# LENS INSTALLATION

Before setting up the projector, install the Projection Lens on the Projector.

- 1. Before installation, check where the projector is used and prepare suitable lens. For specifications of the Projection Lens, refer to the manual separately attached or contact the sales dealer where you purchased the projector.
- 2. For installation, refer to the installation manual supplied to the Projector.



When moving or setting up the projector, be sure to replace the Lens Cover to protect the surface. And be careful not to hold or subject the lens to strong forces. It may damage the lens, cabinet, or mechanical parts.

# **POSITIONING THE PROJECTOR**

This projector is designed to project on a flat projection surface.

### **ROOM LIGHT**

The brightness in the room has a great influence on the picture quality. It is recommended to limit ambient lighting in order to provide the best image.


# VENTILATION

This projector is equipped with cooling fan to protect it from overheating. Pay attention to the following to ensure proper ventilation and avoid a possible risk of fire and malfunction.



Do not cover the vents with papers or other materials.

- Keep the rear grill at least 3 feet (1 m) away from any object.
- Make sure that there are no objects under the projector. An object under the projector may prevent the projector from taking the cooling air through the bottom vent.





LENS SHIFT ADJUSTMENT


The projection lens can be moved up, down, left and right with the motor-driven lens shift function. This function makes it easy to provide the projected image where you want.



# PICTURE LEVEL AND TILT ADJUSTMENT

Picture tilt and projection angle can be adjusted with handles on both sides of the projector. Projection angle can be adjusted to 5.7 degrees upper way.

- **1** Press the knob on the handle. The handle pop out.
- 2 Turn the handles (right and left) until the picture is projected on proper position. Adjust height of rear adjustable feet by rotating them until projector properly stabled on the table.
- 3 Press knob and retract the handle.




The height of front feet can be adjusted by turning the handles.

# **MOVING THE PROJECTOR**

For safety, be sure to hold Carrying Handles on both sides by 2 or more people when moving the projector. Moving it unproperly may result in damage of cabinet or person's injury.

Replace the lens cover and retract the feet to prevent damage to the lens and cabinet.

- 1 Pull up the lock buttons on each side of carrying handles and release the locks.
- Pull carrying handles out fully until it's locked (with a click). Move the projector by holding two handles by 2 or more people.
- **3** To retract carrying handles, pull up the lock buttons and release the lock of handles and press the handles fully in until it's locked.



Pull up the lock buttons to release the lock.


# CAUTION IN CARRYING OR TRANSPORTING THE PROJECTOR


# **TERMINALS OF THE PROJECTOR**







# LASER POINTER FUNCTION

This remote control emits a laser beam as the Laser Pointer from the Laser Light Window. When the LASER button is pressed, the laser light goes on. And when the button is pressed more than 1 minute or the button is released, light goes off. Laser light is emitted with the RED light which tells the laser beam being emitted.

The laser emitted is a class II laser; therefore, do not look into the Laser Light Window or shine the laser beam on yourself or other people. The three marks bellow are the caution labels for the laser beam.

CAUTION: Use of controls or adjustments or performance of procedures other than those specified herein may result hazardous radiation exposure.





- Do not use a new battery with a used battery.
- Avoid contact with water or liquid.
- Do not expose the Remote Control Unit to moisture, or heat.
- Do not drop the remote control unit.
- If batteries have leaked on the remote control, carefully wipe the case clean and load new batteries.


#### **1 MOVING THE POINTER**

Move the pointer (see the NOTE below) by pressing POINT button(s) on the SIDE CONTROL or the REMOTE CONTROL.

### 2 SELECT THE ITEM

Select the item by pressing SELECT button.



- 3 Select the ITEM by pressing SELECT button. The dialog box of the ITEM appears.


- **4** Move the POINTER downward by pressing POINT DOWN button. (The shape of the POINTER becomes an arrow.)







# **TURNING ON / OFF THE PROJECTOR**

# TURNING ON THE PROJECTOR

- Complete the peripheral connections (with Computer, VCR, etc.) before turning on the projector. (Refer to "CONNECTING TO THE PROJECTOR" on Pages 12~15 for connecting that equipment.)
- 2 Connect the projector's AC Power Cord into a wall outlet and turn the MAIN ON / OFF SWITCH to ON. The LAMP indicator lights RED, and the READY indicator lights GREEN.
- **3** Press the POWER ON-OFF button on the Remote Control Unit or on the Side Control to ON. The LAMP indicator dims, and the Cooling Fans start to operate. The Preparation Display appears on the screen and the count-down starts. The signal from the source appears after 30 seconds.

Lamp status is also displayed on screen for 10 seconds. (Refer to "LAMP MANAGEMENT" on page 44.)

# TURNING OFF THE PROJECTOR

- *I* Press the power ON-OFF button on the Remote Control Unit or on the Side Control, and the message "Power off?" appears on the screen.
- Press the power ON-OFF button again to turn off the projector. The LAMP indicator lights bright and the READY indicator turns off. After approximate 90 seconds, the READY indicator will light green again and the projector may be turned on by pressing the power ON-OFF button.
- 3 The cooling fans will operate for approximate 2 minutes after the projector is turned off. To power down completely, turn the MAIN ON/OFF SWITCH to OFF and disconnect the AC power cord.



TO MAINTAIN THE LIFE OF THE LAMP, ONCE YOU TURN THE PROJECTOR ON, WAIT AT LEAST 5 MINUTES BEFORE TURNING IT OFF.

When the Power Management function is ON, the Projector detects the signal interruption and turns the Projection Lamp off automatically. Refer to "Power Management" on page 39.

When the TEMPERATURE WARNING indicator flashes red, the projector is automatically turned off. Wait at least 5 minutes before turning the projector on again.

When the TEMPERATURE WARNING indicator continues to flash, follow procedures below:

- 1. Turn the MAIN ON / OFF SWITCH to OFF and disconnect the AC power cord from the AC outlet.
- 2. Check the air filters for dust accumulation.
- 3. Clean the Air Filter. (See "AIR FILTER CARE AND CLEANING" section on page 43.)
- 4. Turn the Projector on again.

If the TEMPERATURE WARNING indicator should still continue to flash, contact the sales dealer where you purchased this projector or service center.

# NOTE: The Cooling Fan may work for cooling while the projector is turned off. When the Cooling Fan is working, TEMPERATURE WARNING INDICATOR flashes red.


- Press the ZOOM ▲/▼ button(s) on the Side Control or on the Remote Control Unit. The message "Zoom" is displayed.
- 2 Press the ZOOM  $\blacktriangle$  button to make the image larger, and press the ZOOM  $\checkmark$  button to make the image smaller.



#### The message disappears after 4 seconds.

# FOCUS ADJUSTMENT


- I Press the FOCUS ▲/▼ button(s) on the Side Control or on the Remote Control Unit. The message "Focus" is displayed.
- 2 Adjust the focus of the image by pressing the FOCUS  $\blacktriangle/\checkmark$  button(s).



The message disappears after 4 seconds.

# LENS SHIFT ADJUSTMENT

- *I* Press the LENS SHIFT button on the Side Control or on the Remote Control Unit. The message "Lens shift" is displayed.
- Press the POINT UP button to move the image up, press the POINT DOWN button to move the image down, press the POINT LEFT to move the image left and press the POINT RIGHT to move the image right.






# **KEYSTONE ADJUSTMENT**

If the picture has keystone distortion, correct image with KEYSTONE adjustment.

- Press the KEYSTONE ▲/▼ button on the Remote Control Unit or select the Keystone on the SCREEN menu. (Refer to page 34, 38.) The message "Keystone" is displayed.
- 2 Correct the Keystone distortion by pressing the KEYSTONE ▲/▼ button or the POINT UP/DOWN button(s). Press the KEYSTONE ▲ button or the POINT UP button to reduce the upper part or the image, and press the KEYSTONE ▼ button or the POINT DOWN button to reduce the lower part.


Reduce the upper width with the KEY STONE ▲ button or the POINT UP button.





The message disappears after 4 seconds.

Reduce the lower width with the KEY STONE ▼ button or the POINT DOWN button.



# **BLANK FUNCTION**

Press the BLANK button on the Remote Control Unit to black out the image. This function is cancelled when the BLANK button is pressed again or any other function button is pressed.

# PICTURE FREEZE FUNCTION

Press the FREEZE button on the Remote Control Unit to freeze the picture on-screen. This function is cancelled when the FREEZE button is pressed again or any other function button is pressed.


# **PC ADJUSTMENT**

This Projector can automatically tune to the display signals from most personal computers currently distributed. However, some computers employ special signal formats which are different from the standard ones and may not be tuned by the Multi-Scan system of this projector. If this happens, the projector cannot reproduce a proper image and the image may be recognized as a flickering picture, a non-synchronized picture, a non-centered picture or a skewed picture.

This projector has a PC ADJUSTMENT function to enable you to precisely adjust several parameters to match with those special signal formats. This projector has 8 independent memory areas to memorize those parameters manually adjusted. This enables you to recall the setting for a specific computer whenever you use it.

**NOTE:** This PC ADJUSTMENT function cannot be operated when the input signal is digital from the DVI terminal or "RGB" is selected on the SYSTEM MENU (P28 and 29).

- Press the MENU button and the ON-SCREEN MENU will appear. Press the POINT RIGHT/LEFT button to select PC ADJUST and press the SELECT button. Another dialog box "Where to reserve" Menu will appear.
- In this dialog box, you can store the parameter into the area from "Mode 1" to "Mode 8." When memorizing the new computer parameter, select the Mode with the message "Free" by pressing the POINT UP/DOWN button and the SELECT button. To change the parameters of the Mode previously set, select the Mode with "Stored."
- 3 When the Mode is selected, Parameter adjustment dialog box appears. Move the arrow to the item that you want to change by pressing the POINT UP/DOWN button, and adjust each item by pressing the SELECT button to match with your computer.
- **4** Move the arrow to "Stored" and press the SELECT button. The parameter is memorized in the selected Mode.
- 5 To activate the Mode manually adjusted in this PC ADJUSTMENT Menu, select the Mode at the SYSTEM SELECT Menu. (Refer to page 28.)



Move the arrow to  $\blacktriangle$  or  $\checkmark$  and press SELECT button.

### **Total lines**

The number of the total vertical lines. Adjust the number to match the image of your personal computer.

#### Total dots

The number of the total dots in one horizontal period. Adjust the number to match the image of your computer.

#### Horizontal / Vertical

Adjustment of the horizontal or vertical picture position. When the image is not centered on the screen, adjust each of those items.

#### Clamp

Adjustment of the clamp level. When the image has a dark bar(s), try this adjustment.

#### Fine sync

Adjust the picture as necessary to eliminate flicker from the display.

#### Display area

Adjustment of the area displayed with this projector. Select the resolution at the Display area dialog box, or adjust the number at the column of "H" or "V" to match the resolution of the image.

#### Horizontal Scale / Vertical Scale

Adjustment of the horizontal height or vertical width of the image.

NOTE : The Display area, the Horiz. scale and the Vert. scale cannot be adjusted when "480p", "575p", "HDTV720p", "HDTV1035i" or "HDTV1080i" is selected on the SYSTEM MENU (P28 and 29).



### **Total dots**

The number of the total dots in one horizontal period. Adjust the number to match your PC image.

#### White balance (Red / Green / Blue)

Move the arrow to the color that you want to adjust. Point to  $\mathbf{\nabla}$  to lighten the color and select  $\mathbf{\Delta}$  to deepen the color. (From 0 to 63.)

### Contrast

Point to  $\checkmark$  to decrease contrast, and select  $\blacktriangle$  to increase contrast. (From 0 to 63.)

#### Brightness

Point to  $\mathbf{\nabla}$  to adjust the image darker, and select  $\mathbf{\Delta}$  to adjust brighter. (From 0 to 63.)

#### Sharpness

Point to  $\mathbf{\nabla}$  to soften the image, and select  $\mathbf{\Delta}$  to sharpen the image. (From 0 to 15.)

#### Gamma

Point to  $\mathbf{\nabla}$  or  $\mathbf{\Delta}$  to obtain better balance of contrast. (From 0 to 16.)


#### Progressive

Set "On" to provide progressive scan mode.



Press the AUTO IMAGE button on the Side Control or on the Remote Control Unit to automatically adjust Fine sync., Total dots and Screen position for most computers. It will take about 10 seconds.

**NOTE:** Some computers may not be fully adjusted with the "Auto Image Function". In that case, use the "Picture Image" and/or "Picture Position" adjustments (P32, 33) to make fine-adjust then after the "Auto Image Function" is executed.

# PICTURE SCREEN ADJUSTMENT

When selecting " $\mathbf{\nabla}$ " the custom setting dialog box will appear. Move the arrow to the item that you want to change by pressing the POINT UP/DOWN button, and adjust each value or change the setting On or Off by pressing the SELECT button to match with the image.

#### Color

Point to  $\mathbf{\nabla}$  button to lighten the image, and select  $\mathbf{\Delta}$  to deepen the image. (From 0 to 63.)

#### Tint

Point to  $\triangledown$  button to increase purple, and select  $\blacktriangle$  to increase green. (From 0 to 63.)

#### White balance (Red / Green / Blue)

Move the arrow to the color that you want to adjust. Point to  $\nabla$  to lighten the color and select  $\blacktriangle$  to deepen the color. (From 0 to 63.)

#### Contrast

Point to  $\mathbf{\nabla}$  button to decrease contrast, and select  $\mathbf{\Delta}$  to increase contrast. (From 0 to 63.)

#### Brightness

Point to  $\checkmark$  button to darken the image, and select  $\blacktriangle$  to brighten the image. (From 0 to 63.)

#### Sharpness

Point to  $\checkmark$  button to soften the image, and select  $\blacktriangle$  to sharpen the image. (From 0 to 31.)

#### Gamma

Point to ▼ or ▲ to obtain better balance of contrast. (From 0 to 16.)

#### Noise reduction

Set "On" to reduce the noise (rough parts) of the image.




Set "On" to provide progressive scan mode.

Each of the keys operates as follow.

- **Reset** .... Recalls the data previously adjusted.
- **Stored** .... Stores the data in the memory.

Quit .... Closes the PICTURE IMAGE ADJUSTMENT Menu.





Closes the PICTURE IMAGE ADJUSTMENT Menu. button to set the function "On" or "Off".

#### NOTE :

The normal picture level is preset on this projector at the factory and can be restored anytime you press the NORMAL button (located on the Side Control or on the Remote Control Unit). The "Standard" display will be displayed on the screen for a few seconds.

# PICTURE SCREEN ADJUSTMENT

This projector has a picture screen resize function, which enables you to display the desirable image size.



# SETTING MENU

- Press the MENU button and the ON-SCREEN MENU will appear. Press the POINT LEFT/RIGHT buttons to select SETTING and press the SELECT button. Another dialog box SETTING Menu will appear.
- Press the POINT DOWN button and a red-arrow icon will appear. Move the arrow to the item that you want to set, and then press the SELECT button to set it (For example "On" or "Off").

#### Blue back

When this function is "On" this projector will produce a blue image instead of the video noise on the screen when the input source is unplugged or turned off.

#### Display

This function decides whether to display the On-Screen Displays.

- On1 ... shows all the On-Screen Displays.
- On2 ... shows the On-Screen Displays except the Preparation Display (Our Logo).
- Off .... sets the On-Screen Displays disappeared except;
  - ON SCREEN MENU
  - "Power off?" message
  - P-TIMER

#### Ceiling

When this function is "On" the top / bottom and the left / right reversed picture is provided to project the image from a ceiling mounted projector.

#### Rear

When this function is "On" the left / right reversed picture is provided to project the image to a rear projection screen.

#### Split wipe

Turn this function "On" in the SETTING menu. The picture will change into next one by sliding black image side ways like drawing the black curtains when the input source is turned into another one.

#### Power management

This function turns the Projection Lamp off when the projector detects signal interruption and the projector is not used for a certain period in order to reduce power consumption and maintain the Lamp-life. (This projector is shipped with this function ON.)

Power Management function operates to turn the Projection Lamp off when the input signal is interrupted and the projector is not operated over 5 minutes. This function operates as follows;


- 1. When the signal is interrupted, "No signal" and the counting down (5 minutes) display appears.
- 2. When the Projection Lamp turned off, the READY indicator turns off.
- 3. After 90 seconds, the READY indicator flashes and the Lamp can be turned on again (Power Management mode).

In this Power Management mode, the Projection Lamp is automatically turned on when the input signal connected or the projector is operated with any button on the Side Control or the Remote Control.






# SETTING

#### On start

When this function is "On" the projector is automatically turned on just by switching the MAIN ON / OFF SWITCH on.

**NOTE:** Be sure to turn the projector off properly (refer to the section "TURNING OFF THE PROJECTOR" on page 23). If the projector is turned off in the wrong steps, the On Start function does not operate properly.

#### Lamp Mode

This Projector is equipped with 4 Projection Lamps and the number of using lamps can be switched to 4 lamps or 2 lamps. Using 2 lamps maintains the life of the Projection Lamps.

To change over Lamp Mode

- 1. Press the MENU button the ON-SCREEN MENU will appear. Press the POINT LEFT/RIGHT buttons to select SETTING and press the SELECT button. Another dialog box SETTING MENU will appear.
- 2. Press the POINT DOWN button and move a red-arrow icon to Lamp Mode. Set "4 lamps mode" or "2 lamps mode" by pressing the SELECT button. When Lamp Mode is set from "4 lamps mode" to "2 lamps mode," the image becomes little darker. When Lamp Mode is set from "2 lamps mode" to "4 lamps mode," the image become brighter gradually.

NOTE : After changing Lamp Mode, it cannot be switched again for 90 seconds.

#### USB

This Projector is equipped with USB port for interactive operation between the projector and the computer. Set the mode following steps below.

#### Wireless Mouse mode

Select " [15] " when controlling the computer with the Remote Control of this projector.

#### Projector mode

Select " **I** when controlling the projector with the computer.

**NOTE:** Before you control the projector by computer, install USB driver (optionally sold parts) and set up the computer following instruction in the USB driver package. Contact your authorized dealer.

#### Remote control

This projector has two different remote transmit codes; the factory-set normal code (Mode 1) and the secondary code (Mode 2). This switching function prevents the remote control operation mixture (jam) when operating several projectors or video equipment together.

When operating the projector in "Mode 2" both projector and Remote Control must be switched to "Mode 2".

#### To change the code of the projector;

Set the Remote control in the SETTING menu to "Mode 2".

#### To change the code of the Remote Control;

Press both the MENU and the NORMAL buttons on the Remote Control together for over 10 seconds.

After changing the code, make sure the Remote Control operates properly.

To return to the normal code (Mode 1), operate both projector and Remote Control in the ways above again.

**NOTE:** When the ALL-OFF switch on the Remote Control Unit is turned to "ALL-OFF" the remote transmit code automatically returns to the normal code (Mode 1).

#### Lamp replacement monitor timer

Be sure to reset the Lamp Replacement Monitor Timer when the Lamp Assembly is replaced. When the Lamp Replacement Monitor Timer is reset, the LAMP REPLACEMENT indicator stops lighting.


- 1 Turn the projector on, and press the MENU button and the ON-SCREEN MENU will appear. Press the POINT LEFT/RIGHT buttons to select SETTING and press the SELECT button. Another dialog box SETTING MENU will appear.
- 2 Press the POINT DOWN button and a red-arrow icon will appear. Move the arrow to "Lamp age" and then press the SELECT button.
- **3** Move the arrow to replaced lamp number and then press the SELECT button. The message "Lamp replace monitor Reset?" is displayed.
  - **NOTE:** Be sure to reset correct lamp number otherwise LAMP REPLACEMENT indicator continues lighting.
- ∠ Select [Yes] to reset the Timer.



# SELECTING LANGUAGE

The language used in the ON-SCREEN MENU is selectable from among English, German, French, Italian, Spanish and Japanese.

- **1** Press the MENU button and the ON-SCREEN MENU will appear. Press POINT LEFT/RIGHT buttons to select LANGUAGE and press the SELECT button. Another dialog box LANGUAGE Menu will appear.
- 2 Press the POINT DOWN button and a red-arrow icon will appear. Move the arrow to the language that you want to set, and then press the SELECT button.





# APPENDIX

# **OPERATING WIRELESS MOUSE**

The Wireless Remote Control Unit is not only able to operate the projector but also usable as a wireless mouse for most Personal Computers. The POINT buttons and the two CLICK buttons are used for the wireless mouse operation.

The wireless mouse is available only when PC mouse pointer is displayed on the screen. When the menu or the indicator of the projector is displayed on the screen instead of the PC mouse pointer, the wireless mouse cannot be used.

## INSTALLATION

To use the Wireless Remote Control Unit as the Wireless Mouse for a Personal Computer, installation of the mouse driver (not supplied) is required. Make sure that the mouse driver is properly installed in your computer. And make sure that the mouse port of the computer connected to Control Port is activated.

- 1 Connect the mouse port of your computer to the Control Port of the projector with the Control Cable. (Refer to page 12 to 15 for connection.)
- 2 Turn the projector on first, and then turn on your computer. When the computer is switched on first, the Wireless Mouse may not work properly.

Note : When the computer has no mouse port, connect the Serial Port of the computer to Control Port of the projector with the Control Cable for Serial Port.

#### USING USB TERMINAL

USB Terminal can be also used as control port for wireless mouse operation. Connect the USB terminal of the computer to USB terminal of this projector with the USB cable (not supplied). In this operation, selecting Wireless Mouse Mode on SETTING Menu is required. (Refer to P40).

## **OPERATING WIRELESS MOUSE**

When controlling the pointer of the computer, operate the Wireless Mouse with POINT button, SELECT button, and RIGHT CLICK button on the Wireless Remote Control Unit.

#### **POINT** button

Used to move the pointer. The pointer is moved corresponding with the direction you are pressing.


#### SELECT (LEFT CLICK) button

This button has the same function as the left button in a PC mouse.

#### **RIGHT CLICK button**

This button has the same function as the right button in a PC mouse. Pressing this button does not affect any operation when in Menu mode.

# MAINTENANCE

## **TEMPERATURE WARNING INDICATOR**

The TEMPERATURE WARNING Indicator flashes red when the internal temperature of the projector exceeds the normal temperature. The Indicator stops flashing when the temperature of the projector returns to normal. When the TEMPERATURE WARNING Indicator continues to flash, check the items listed below.

- *1* The Ventilation slots of the projector may be blocked. In such an event, reposition the appliance so that the ventilation slots are not obstructed.
- 2 Air filters may be clogged with dust particles. Clean the air filters by following the section AIR FILTER CARE AND CLEANING below.
- **3** If the TEMPERATURE WARNING Indicator remains on after performing the above checks, the Cooling Fans or the Internal Circuits may be malfunctioning. Contact service a personnel from an authorized dealer or service station.

## AIR FILTER CARE AND CLEANING

The Removable Air Filter prevents dust from accumulating on the surface of the Projection Lens and the Projection Mirror. Should the Air Filter become clogged with dust particles, it will reduce the Cooling Fans' effectiveness and may result in internal heat build up and adversely affect the life of the projector. Clean the Air Filter following the steps below:

- 1 Turn the power off, and disconnect the AC power cord from the AC outlet.
- 2 Pull out the air filter from the projector.
- **3** Pulling up the center frame of the air filter top, separate the air filter top and sponge from the air filter base.
- 4 Clean the each parts with brush or wash out the dust and particles. Be sure to dry them out.
- 5 Assemble the sponge and the air filter and replace the air filter to the projector.



#### CAUTION

Do not operate the projector with the Air Filter removed. Dust may accumulate on the LCD Panel and the Mirror degrading picture quality.


Do not put small parts into the Air Intake Vents. It may result in malfunction of the projector.

#### **RECOMMENDATION**

We recommend avoiding dusty/smoky environments when operating the projector. Usage in these environments may cause poor image quality.


When using under dusty or smoky conditions, dust may accumulate on the liquid crystal panel, lens, or optical elements inside it. This condition may degrade the quality of the projected image.

When the above symptoms are noticed, contact your authorized dealer or service station for proper cleaning.



## LAMP MANAGEMENT

This Projector is equipped with 4 Projection Lamps to ensure brighter image and those lamps are controlled by Lamp Management Function. Lamp Management Function detects the status of all lamps and shows the status on screen or on the LAMP REPLACE indicator. This function also automatically controls the Lamp Mode when any of lamps is out for the end of life or malfunctions.




## Lamp Replace Indicator

This LAMP REPLACE indicator lights yellow when any of Projection Lamps is nearing its end, and flashes when any of them becomes out. Check the number of the lamp on Lamp Status Display and replace the lamp.


#### Lamp Status Display

Lamp Status Display appears on the screen when power switch is on or Menu Bar is displayed. This shows the status of each lamp as; ON, OFF, NEAR END, or OUT. Refer to the following for each status.




## Lamp Mode Changeover


Lamp Management Function automatically changes the combination of lighting lamp (Lamp Mode) by detecting the status of lamp. When any of 4 lamps becomes out, the Lamp Mode is changed over from 4 lamps to 2 lamps. And when any of 2 lamps are out, the projector operates with 1 lamp. Lamp Mode can be switched to 4 lamps or 2 lamps manually. Refer to SETTING section on page 39, 40.

## LAMP REPLACEMENT



#### CAUTION

• For continued safety, replace with a lamp assembly of the same type.

- Allow the projector to cool for at least 45 minutes before you open the lamp cover. The inside of the projector can become very hot.
- Do not drop the lamp assembly or touch the glass bulb! The glass can shatter and may cause injury.

Follow these steps to replace the lamp assembly.

- 1 Check the number of lamp to be replaced on Lamp Status Display.
- 2 Turn off the projector and disconnect the AC Power Cord. Allow the projector to cool down for at least 45 minutes.
- **3** Remove the two screws on the Lamp Cover and press the button to open the Lamp Cover. (See right figure.)
- 4 Loosen the two screws and pull out the Lamp Assembly to be replaced by grasping the handle.
- 5 Replace the Lamp Assembly with a new one and tighten the two screws. Make sure the Lamp is set properly
- **6** Replace the Lamp Cover and tighten the two screws.
- 7 Connect the AC Power Cord to the projector and turn the projector on.
- 8 Reset the Lamp Replacement Monitor Timer. (Refer to the section "Lamp Replacement Monitor Timer" on page 41.)
- **NOTE :** Do not reset the LAMP REPLACEMENT MONITOR TIMER when the lamp is not replaced.
- **CAUTION :** Do not operate the projector while any of lamps is removed. It may result in malfunctions, fire hazard, or other accidents.

# **CLEANING THE PROJECTION LENS**

Follow these steps to clean the projection lens:

- *I* Apply a non-abrasive camera lens cleaner to a soft, dry cleaning cloth. Avoid using an excessive amount of cleaner. Abrasive cleaners, solvents or other harsh chemicals might scratch the lens.
- 2 Lightly wipe the cleaning cloth over the lens.
- 3 When the projector is not in use, replace the lens cover.

# TROUBLESHOOTING

Before calling your dealer or service station for assistance, check the items below once again.

- 1. Make sure you have connected the projector to your equipment as described in section "CONNECTING THE PROJECTOR" on pages 12 ~ 15.
- 2. Check cable connections. Verify that all computer, video and power cords are properly connected.
- 3. Verify that power is switched on.
- 4. If the projector still does not display an image, re-start the computer.
- 5. If the image still does not display, unplug the projector from the computer and check the computer monitor's display. The problem may be with your graphics controller rather than with the projector. (When you reconnect the projector, remember to turn the computer and monitor off before you power up the projector. Power the equipment back up in order of: Projector and computer)
- 6. If the problem still exists, check the following chart.
