

This product was designed and manufactured to meet strict quality and safety standards. There are, however, some installation and operation precautions which you should be particularly aware of.

- 1. Read Instructions All the safety and operating instructions should be read and understood before the appliance is operated.
- 2. Retain Instructions The safety and operating instructions should be retained for future reference.
- 3. Heed Warnings All warnings on the appliance and in the operating instructions should be adhered to.
- 4. Follow Instructions All operating and use instructions should be followed.
- 5. Water and Moisture The appliance should not be used near water for example, near a bathtub, washbowl, kitchen sink, laundry tub, in a wet basement or near a swimming pool, etc.

FCC Rules

This equipment complies with Part 68 of the FCC rules. 
Remove the battery compartment cover by pressing in the tab, then lifting the cover.




Insert two batteries as indicated inside the battery compartment.




Replace the battery compartment cover.










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Remote Control







The Title Bar

Any time you leave the Home Page, WebTV displays a Title Bar across the bottom of your screen.

Example of Title Bar information



Page Title

Displays the title of the page currently on your screen.

Indicator Arrows

The indicator arrows are green when the currently displayed page is longer than your screen. Green arrows indicate the direction or directions in which more of the page can be viewed. Press the SCROLL buttons on the remote to view more of the page.

When the down arrow is yellow, it indicates that the page is longer than your screen, but WebTV has not finished loading the page into the system. The yellow arrow will turn green when the page is loaded completely.

WebTV Connection Indicator

The connection indicator is green whenever you are connected to the WebTV Network. When the indicator is moving, it tells you that WebTV is searching the Internet for something you have requested.

The indicator becomes a straight red line when:

- ◆ You receive a telephone call (if you have Call Waiting).
- ◆ You use the HANG UP option. (See ADVANCED OPTIONS on page 35.)



◆ To keep your phone line free, your Internet Terminal automatically disconnects from the WebTV Network if you do not use the remote control for several minutes. This keeps your phone line free, so you don't have to wonder if you are disconnected from the WebTV Network. To reconnect, press the GO button.

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Connections



Connecting your System

Before you can connect to the WebTV Network, you must connect your Internet Terminal to each of the following:

- ◆ Your TV (either directly or through your VCR)
- ◆ A telephone line
- ◆ And an AC power outlet.

The type of connection you choose depends on whether your TV:

- ◆ Has S-VIDEO, RCA-type A/V (audio/video), or RFU coaxial jacks
- ◆ Or is connected to a VCR.

An S-VIDEO connection provides the best picture quality of all the connection options. For optimum audio performance, consider integrating the Internet Terminal into your home entertainment system.

Telephone Line Connection Options

If possible, connect your Internet Terminal to a telephone jack that isn't connected to a telephone. If you have only one telephone jack, use the T-splitter to share the line. This will enable you to keep both the Internet Terminal and your telephone plugged in at the same time. Plug the T-splitter into the wall telephone jack.

If you don't have Call Waiting service for your phone line, a person trying to call you while you're connected to WebTV gets a busy signal.

If you have Call Waiting, see Select Dialing Options on page 31. If you activate Call Waiting and you receive a telephone call, your Internet Terminal temporarily disconnects from the WebTV Network. When this happens, your telephone will ring, and you can take the call the way you normally do. To reconnect to the WebTV Network, press the GO button on the remote. WebTV reconnects you to the page you were visiting when the call came in.

For information on disconnecting from the WebTV Network to make a telephone call, see Advanced Options/Hang Up on page 35.

If the telephones in your house are generally busy, you might consider using a separate, or dedicated, telephone line for the WebTV Network. Contact your local phone company to order a separate phone line.



Connecting to a TV with an S-VIDEO jack

This connection will provide the best picture quality.



Connect the AUDIO R(ight) and L(eft) jacks on the Internet Terminal to your TV's AUDIO IN jacks, using the supplied audio cables.

Do not connect the VIDEO cable (yellow) to the VIDEO OUT jack.




Use an S-VIDEO cable (not supplied) to connect the S-VIDEO OUT jack on your Internet Terminal to the S-VIDEO IN jack on your TV. (An S-VIDEO cable is available from Philips Service Solutions Group or your local dealer. See page 40 for details.)



Connect one end of the telephone cable to the Internet Terminal's TEL LINE jack. Connect the other end to your home's telephone outlet.



Connect one end of the AC power cord to the Internet Terminal's AC INPUT jack. Connect the other end to an AC outlet.





◆ Check that your local AC voltage corresponds to the voltage indicated on the AC adapter (120V) before connecting the unit to AC power. If it does not, consult your dealer.

◆ If you choose the S-VIDEO setup, use the remote control that came with your TV to set the video input, when viewing WebTV, to S-VIDEO IN.

Connections (cont'd)



Connecting to a TV without Audio/Video jacks

If your TV does not have Audio/Video jacks, you must use an RFU adapter (not supplied) to connect the Internet Terminal to your TV.



Set the channel switch on the RFU adapter to VHF channel 3 or 4, whichever is not used or least used in your area.



Connect the RFU adapter to the VIDEO and AUDIO OUT jacks on the Internet Terminal.



Use a RF coaxial cable to connect the ANTENNA OUT jack on the adapter to the ANTENNA IN jack on the back of your TV.

You may need to disconnect the antenna/cable from your TV to make this connection. Connect the antenna/cable to the ANTENNA IN jack on the RFU adapter.




Connect one end of the telephone cable to the Internet Terminal's TEL LINE jack. Connect the other end to your home's telephone outlet.



Connect one end of the AC power cord to the Internet Terminal's AC INPUT jack. Connect the other end to an AC outlet.



Set your TV to channel 3 or 4, whichever channel the adapter is set to, when using the Internet Terminal.



Connections (cont'd)



Connecting to a TV or a VCR with Audio/Video jacks



Connect the audio cables (red and white) to the AUDIO OUT R(ight) and L(eft) jacks on the back of the Internet Terminal and to the AUDIO IN jacks on your TV, matching colors. If there is only one audio jack, connect the white plugs.



Connect the video cable (yellow) to the VIDEO OUT jack on the back of the Internet Terminal and to the VIDEO IN jack on the back of your TV.




Connect one end of the telephone cable to the Internet Terminal's TEL LINE jack. Connect the other end to your home's telephone outlet.



Connect one end of the AC power cord to the Internet Terminal's AC INPUT jack. Connect the other end to an AC outlet.



If connecting through your VCR, connect the audio cables (red and white) to the AUDIO OUT R(ight) and L(eft) jacks on the back of the Internet Terminal and to the AUDIO IN jacks on your VCR, matching colors. If there is only one audio jack, connect the white plugs. Connect the video cable (yellow) to the VIDEO OUT jack on the back of the Internet Terminal and to the VIDEO IN jack on the back of your VCR. Use a coaxial cable to connect the OUT jack on your VCR to the VHF/UHF IN jack on your TV. (Or, you may also use additional audio and video cables to connect the Audio/Video Out jacks on your VCR to the Audio/Video In jacks on your TV.)





- ◆ If you choose the Audio/Video jacks setup, use the remote control that came with your TV to set the video input, when viewing WebTV, to VIDEO IN.
- ◆ If you connect through your VCR, the VCR must be turned on, with the VCR's External Input selected, to access the WebTV Network.

On-Screen Keyboard



The On-Screen Keyboard

Use the on-screen keyboard to type information on your TV screen. When you request an activity that requires typing, such as sending an e-mail message, a text box appears on the screen. A text box contains a vertical yellow line, which indicates exactly where you can type in the text box.

Displaying the on-screen keyboard



Move the yellow highlight to a text box using the remote control Arrow buttons. The highlight becomes a vertical yellow line inside the box.



Press the GO button on the remote. The keyboard slides onto your screen. To remove the on-screen keyboard at any time, press the BACK button.



Typing letters, numbers, and punctuation marks using the on-screen keyboard



Highlight the desired character using the Arrow buttons on the remote control.



Press the GO button on the remote.

Typing upper case letters



Highlight SHIFT on the on-screen keyboard using the remote control Arrow keys.



Press the GO button on the remote. The red light next to "caps" turns on.




Highlight the desired character using the remote control Arrow buttons.



Press the GO button on the remote.

To type more than one upper case letter, repeat these steps for each letter.





◆ You can choose whether your keyboard displays letter keys in alphabetical order or standard typewriter order (QWERTY). See Setup on page 30.

◆ You can type on-screen only when a text box is displayed.



Erasing or changing a character



Highlight an arrow key on the on-screen keyboard. Press the GO button repeatedly until the vertical line is located to the right of the character you want to erase.



Highlight DELETE on the on-screen keyboard, then press the GO button on the remote.



Highlight the character you wish to substitute, then press the GO button on the remote.

Inserting a space between characters



Highlight SPACE on the on-screen keyboard, then press the GO button on the remote.

Moving to the next line in a text box



Highlight RETURN on the on-screen keyboard, then press the GO button on the remote.

Note:

The yellow line generally moves to the next line when you come to the end of a line in a text box.

Moving to the next text box on the same page



Highlight CONTINUE on the on-screen keyboard, then press the GO button on the remote.

Moving to the previous text box on the same page



Press the BACK button to hide the keyboard.



Press the Up Arrow button on the remote. (The yellow line moves to the previous text box.)



Press the GO button on the remote. The on-screen keyboard appears.

Hiding the on-screen keyboard



Press the BACK button on the remote control.

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Signing Up for WebTV



Signing Up for WebTV

Signing up for the WebTV Network is an easy process that asks you to provide your name, billing address, phone number, credit card information, and an Internet name (which acts as your e-mail address). When you complete the last sign-up page, you will be given the opportunity to correct mistakes. Once the information is correct, the WebTV Home Page will appear. You are ready to begin your Internet experience. If you have any difficulty signing up, please call 1-800-GOWEBTV.



Turn on your television.



Press the POWER button to turn on the Internet Terminal. The Philips Magnavox logo will appear briefly.

The screen will show the Connecting to WebTV display. (If your unit is having trouble connecting, you may see various messages on-screen. Follow the directions on-screen carefully, then try again.) Information about WebTV will appear.

Continue will be highlighted on screen. Press the GO button.



Information about choosing items will appear on-screen. This is to familiarize you with using the Arrow buttons to highlight a link.

Use the Arrow buttons to highlight a link. Press the GO button to choose the link. Use the Arrow buttons to highlight CONTINUE, then press the GO button.



The FIRST NAME box will be highlighted. Press the GO button. The on-screen keyboard will appear.

Use the Arrow buttons and the GO button to enter your name. When you finish, use the Arrow buttons to highlight CONTINUE or RETURN, then press the GO button.

CONTINUE will be highlighted on-screen.

Press the GO button again.



The LAST NAME box will be highlighted. Press the GO button.

The on-screen keyboard will appear.

Enter your last name. When you finish, use the Arrow buttons on the remote to highlight CONTINUE or RETURN, then press the GO button. CONTINUE will be highlighted on screen. Press the GO button again.



The PHONE BOX will be highlighted. Press the GO button. The on-screen keyboard will appear.

Enter your area code and phone number. You don't have to insert spaces or hyphens for the phone number information. When you finish, use the Arrow buttons to highlight CONTINUE or RETURN, then press the GO button. CONTINUE will be highlighted on-screen. Press the GO button again.





The STREET box will be highlighted. Press the GO button. The on-screen keyboard will appear.

Enter your street address. When you finish, use the Arrow buttons to highlight CONTINUE or RETURN.



The CITY box will be highlighted. Enter your city name. When you finish, highlight CONTINUE or RETURN, then press the GO button.



The STATE box will be highlighted. Enter your state's postal abbreviation. When you finish, highlight CONTINUE or RETURN, then press the GO button.



The ZIP box will be highlighted. Enter your zip code. When you finish, highlight CONTINUE or RETURN, then press the GO button.



CONTINUE will be highlighted on-screen. Press the GO button again.



Information about WebTV billing procedures will appear. CONTINUE will be highlighted. Press the GO button.



You will be asked to identify the type of credit card you will use. Use the Arrow buttons to highlight the type of credit card you will use, then press the GO button.



The NUMBER box will be highlighted. Press the GO button. The on-screen keyboard will appear. Enter your credit card number. You don't have to insert spaces or hyphens for the credit card information. When you finish, use the Arrow buttons to highlight CONTINUE.



The EXPIRES box is highlighted. Enter your credit card's expiration date. When you finish, highlight CONTINUE, then press the GO button.

- ◆ The sign-up pages will reappear each time you turn on your Internet Terminal until you complete the sign-up process.
- ◆ If you go back a page, you will erase the information on the current
- If you enter a name that has already been chosen by another WebTV member, you will be asked to enter a different name. If you receive this message three times, WebTV will suggest a name for you. You can use it, or you can continue trying to find one on your own.
- ◆ The first time you connect to the WebTV Network, your Internet Terminal takes a minute or more to make the connection.

Signing Up for WebTV (cont'd)





CONTINUE will be highlighted. Press the GO button again.

The Internet name box will be highlighted. Press the GO button. The onscreen keyboard will appear. Type in your Internet name. Your Internet name acts as your e-mail address. It can contain letters and numbers, but must start with a letter. For example, T42 is okay, 24T is not. It must contain at least three characters, and no more than 15. It cannot contain spaces or punctuation marks.

If you enter a name that has already been chosen by another WebTV member, you will be asked to enter a different name. If you receive this message three times, WebTV will suggest a name for you. You can use it, or you can continue trying to find one on your own.

When you finish, highlight CONTINUE, then press the GO button.



When you complete the last sign-up page, WebTV displays a page that contains all the information you have entered.

Correcting a mistake on a previous sign up page:



Highlight the text box that contains the information you wish to change and press the GO button. The page on which you originally entered the information appears.



See "Erasing or changing a character" on page 17 for details on how to make a correction.



Highlight CONTINUE and press the GO button to return to the sign-up information page. You may need to repeat this step more than once to reach the sign-up information page.

Completing the sign-up process



Highlight CORRECT on the sign-up information page and press the GO button. The WebTV Home Page will appear soon.



◆ If you make a mistake, press the BACK button until the incorrect page appears. Going back deletes the information on the current page. Make the correction, then continue as instructed.





Exploring the Internet on WebTV

This chapter explains how to access various pages on the Internet from the WebTV Home Page. Because the Internet is constantly changing, the Home Page will also occasionally change. When you see new icons, explore! WebTV will provide help for using new icons through the INSTRUCTIONS icon.

To connect to the Home Page



Turn on your television.



Press the POWER button on the remote to turn on the Internet Terminal. The Connecting to WebTV screen will appear.



In one to two minutes, the WebTV Home Page will appear.

If the Internet Terminal is having trouble connecting to WebTV, you may see a message on-screen. Follow the on-screen directions carefully. If you need to check your Dialing Options, see page 31 for more details.

To Activate a Home Page Icon



Highlight an icon on the Home Page using the Arrow buttons on the remote control.



Press the GO button on the remote.



◆ If you take your Internet Terminal to a new location, for example, to show it to a friend, you may see the message: "Your Internet Terminal was unplugged or the electricity went out. If you are at a different phone number now, choose New Number. Otherwise, choose Same."

NOTES If you are at the same phone number, highlight Same and press the GO button. If you are at a different phone number, highlight New Number and press the GO button. Follow the instructions on-screen.

◆ If more than one user is registered for your unit, you must enter your user name and password. Then, the Home Page will appear. The Mail, Favorites and Options will be set for the designated user. See Setup on page 30 for details.





Explore





Explore

EXPLORE is designed to make your exploration of the Internet easy and fun. When you enter the EXPLORE area, you'll find links to some of the most exciting and useful pages on the Internet. WebTV will continuously update EXPLORE.

Go to a page from the EXPLORE page



Highlight any icon on the EXPLORE page and press the GO button on the remote control. The icons either lead to more selections or directly to a page.

Instructions



Instructions

The INSTRUCTIONS area contains help for using the remote control and various WebTV features, such as the Home Page areas.

Read the Instructions



Highlight the INSTRUCTIONS icon and press the GO button.



Highlight any topic on the INSTRUCTIONS page and press the GO button on the remote control. The instructions for that topic will appear.



◆ To exit the Instructions at any time, press the HOME button to return to the Home Page.





Search

SEARCH links you to the SEARCH page, which enables you to search the Internet for information on both general and specific topics.

To search for specific information:



Highlight SEARCH on the Home Page and press the GO button.



Type a topic in the text box. You can enter one word, many words, or even a question.



Highlight the SEARCH command and press the GO button. A list appears on your screen.



Highlight an item on the list using the Arrow buttons on the remote control and press the GO button. The page will appear soon.

Note

Press the BACK button or the RECENT button on the remote control to return to the list if the page does not contain what you are looking for.



- ◆ At the end of the listings, you may have the option to highlight NEXT DOCUMENT or PREVIOUS DOCUMENT. Next and previous documents are continuations of listings pertaining to your topic. Highlight NEXT DOCUMENT or PREVIOUS DOCUMENT, then press the GO button to **NOTES** see additional listings.
- ◆ You may press the SEARCH button at any time to go directly to the SEARCH page.





Mail

The MAIL icon links you to your MAILBOX, which lists the e-mail messages you have received. To read a message, simply highlight a message on the list and press the GO button.

The MAILBOX page contains the following icons:

- ◆ write
- ◆ storage
- ◆ setup
- names
- ◆ discard

Note: When you have unread messages in your MAILBOX, the red MESSAGE light on the front of your Internet Terminal is illuminated. If you receive a message while you are connected to the WebTV™ Network, the red MESSAGE light will flash.

Write

Highlight WRITE to open the WRITE A NEW MESSAGE page, where you can address, create, and send e-mail messages.

You can send the same e-mail message to more than one address at a time by entering more than one address in the TO text box. Separate addresses with a comma and a space.

Storage

The STORAGE icon links you to the STORED MAIL page, where you can view messages you have saved.

Setup

The SETUP icon allows you to:

- ◆ Choose whether your MAILBOX displays your oldest or newest messages at the top.
- ◆ Type a signature that is automatically added to the end of each e-mail message you send.
- ◆ Include a carbon copy. (The CC text box on your WRITE A NEW MES-SAGE page allows you to send a copy of your message to one or more addresses.)



Names

The NAMES icon links to your NAMES page, which allows you to store and edit e-mail addresses. You can automatically address messages from your list of names.

Discard

The DISCARD icon allows you to discard messages from your MAILBOX.

To open and read an e-mail message

Highlight an e-mail message on the MAILBOX page and press the GO button. The contents of the message appear on your screen.

To return to the MAILBOX page

Highlight MAILBOX and press the GO button.

To save or store a message



Open a message from your MAILBOX page.



Highlight SAVE and press the GO button.

To read saved messages



Highlight STORAGE on the MAILBOX page and press the GO button. A list of saved messages appears.



Highlight a message and press the GO button. The contents of the saved message appear.

To reply to an e-mail message



With a message open on your screen, highlight REPLY and press the GO button. The REPLY TO A MESSAGE page appears with the address and subject entered in the appropriate boxes for you.



Type your reply.



Highlight SEND and press the GO button. A message appears indicating that your e-mail is being sent.

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Mail (cont'd)



To resend an e-mail message



With a message open on your screen, highlight RESEND and press the GO button. The RESEND A MESSAGE page appears with the subject entered for you.



Type one or more e-mail addresses in the TO text box. Separate addresses by a comma and a space if you type more than one address.



Type a message to add to the forwarded message in the text box on the bottom of the page (optional).



Highlight SEND and press the GO button. A message appears, indicating that your e-mail is being sent.

To send an e-mail message



Highlight WRITE and press the GO button. The WRITE A NEW MESSAGE page appears.



Type one or more e-mail addresses in the TO text box. Separate addresses by a comma and a space if you type more than one address.



Use the Arrow buttons on the remote control to move the vertical line to the SUBJECT text box. Type a subject (optional).



Use the Arrow buttons on the remote control to move to the next text box. Type your message.



Highlight SEND and press the GO button. A message appears indicating that your e-mail is being sent.

To discard a message



Highlight DISCARD and press the GO button. A list of e-mail messages appears.



Highlight a message and press the GO button. Repeat to discard more than one message at a time.



Highlight DISCARD and press the GO button. WebTV discards the highlighted messages from the list.



Add a name to your NAMES page



Highlight NAMES on the MAILBOX page and press the GO button. The NAMES page appears.



Highlight NEW and press the GO button.



Type the appropriate information in the text boxes, then highlight ADD and press the GO button.

Use your list of NAMES



Highlight NAMES on the WRITE A NEW MESSAGE page and press the GO button. The NAMES panel appears.



Highlight the name of the person to whom you want to send a message and press the GO button. Repeat to send the same message to more than one person at a time.



Highlight CONTINUE and press the GO button. The highlighted name or names will appear in the TO text box.

Delete a name on the NAMES page



Highlight NAMES on the MAILBOX page and press the GO button. The NAMES page appears.



Highlight the name you wish to delete and press the GO button.



Highlight DISCARD and press the GO button. WebTV deletes the name from your list.

Favorites

Save a page to your FAVORITES list



Go to a page you wish to visit frequently and press the OPTIONS button on the remote control. The OPTIONS panel appears at the bottom of the screen.



Highlight SAVE on the OPTIONS panel and press the GO button. A panel that displays the SAVE PAGE command appears.



Highlight the SAVE PAGE command and press the GO button. The page is saved in your personal FAVORITES list.

Open a page from your FAVORITES list



Highlight FAVORITES on the Home Page and press the GO button. Your FAVORITES list appears on the screen.



Highlight a title or an icon on the list and press the GO button. The page appears.

Delete a page from your FAVORITES list



Open your FAVORITES list and highlight EDIT, then press the GO button.



In the EDIT FAVORITES screen, highlight the REMOVE box next to the page you wish to delete, then press the GO button.



Highlight DONE and press the GO button.



◆ You may go to your FAVORITES page at any time by pressing the FAVORITES button on the remote control.

Setup

Enter the SETUP area to display options that allow you to:

- ◆ Restrict access to pages on the Internet that contain mature material. (Different users can have different access settings.)
- ◆ Choose whether your on-screen keyboard displays the letter keys in alphabetical order or standard typewriter order (QWERTY).
- ◆ Make the text that appears on your screen smaller or larger.
- ◆ Update your sign-up information.
- ◆ Turn off WebTV sounds.
- ◆ Turn off Call Waiting interruptions.
- ◆ Display/hide ADVANCED OPTIONS (HANG UP and RELOAD) on the OPTIONS panel. See Advanced Options on page 35.
- ◆ Create separate accounts with private MAILBOXES and FAVORITES lists for each member of your household.
- ◆ Change your Internet name or password (except the primary user).

You must create and use a password to access a separate account. Passwords can contain all numbers, or letters and numbers, and must contain a minimum of four characters. Do not use spaces or punctuation marks.

For security reasons, your password will be displayed as a row of dots on the screen. WebTV will ask you to type your password twice to ensure accuracy.

Create separate accounts and set access restrictions (WebTV users)



Highlight WEBTV USERS and press the GO button.



Highlight ADD A USER and press the GO button.



Enter an Internet name, then highlight CONTINUE and press the GO button.



Enter a password and select CONTINUE.

Different access options will appear. Follow the on-screen instructions to set the desired level of access restriction.



Highlight the check box next to an option and press the GO button. A red check mark means the option is turned on. Press the GO button again to remove the check mark.



Select CONTINUE and then select DONE to return to the SETUP page.

Customize your keyboard



Highlight KEYBOARD and press the GO button.



Highlight ALPHABETICAL or QWERTY and press the GO button.



Highlight DONE and press the GO button.

Customize your WebTV screen



Highlight TEXT SIZE and press the GO button.



Make your selection.



Highlight DONE, then press the GO button to return to the SETUP page.

Change sign-up information



Highlight WEBTV USERS and press the GO button. Choose the user whose information you would like to change, then press the GO button.



Enter new information in the appropriate text boxes.



Highlight DONE and press the GO button to return to the SETUP page.



Display Advanced Options



Highlight ADVANCED OPTIONS and press the GO button.

The ADVANCED OPTIONS appear on your OPTIONS panel if you choose this setting.

The ADVANCED OPTIONS allow you to:

RELOAD: Update the version of the page you are visiting currently. HANG UP: Temporarily disconnect from the WebTV Network to make a phone call. To reconnect, press the GO button on the remote. WebTV reconnects you to the same location you were visiting when you disconnected.

Turn off WebTV sounds and music



Highlight SOUND AND MUSIC and press the GO button.



Highlight the appropriate check box and press the GO button. A red check mark means you will not hear the sounds or music. Press the GO button again to remove the check mark.



Highlight DONE and press the GO button to return to the SETUP page.

Select Dialing Options



Highlight DIALING OPTIONS and press the GO button. A list of options appears:

CALL WAITING: Choose whether your Internet Terminal disconnects from

the WebTV Network when a call comes in.

BASIC: Enter a prefix for dialing out; choose tone dialing.

ADVANCED: Set a dialing speed.

ACCESS: Enter an access number for WebTV.



Highlight the box next to a desired option and press the GO button. A red check mark means the dialing option is turned on. Press the GO button again to remove the check mark.



Highlight DONE and press the GO button to return to the SETUP page.

Options Panel



The OPTIONS panel offers several features that enable you to navigate your way through WebTV and to perform other functions easily and efficiently.

Using the OPTIONS panel



Press the OPTIONS button on the remote control. The OPTIONS panel slides onto the bottom of your screen.



Highlight an option and press the GO button.

Each option brings up a different panel. The following sections describe the various options, and how to use each option's features.



The WebTV option returns you to the WebTV Home Page.



The FIND option helps you find a specific word or phrase on the current page; it also lets you scroll to the top or bottom of a page.



To find a specific word or phrase on a page, type a word or phrase in the text box on the FIND panel.



Highlight FIND and press the GO button. WebTV highlights the requested text on the page.



The INFO option displays the title and address of the page currently on the screen, as well as the most recent time the page was updated.

Displaying the INFO panel



Highlight INFO on the OPTIONS panel and press the GO button.





Find a new word or phrase



Highlight CLEAR and press the GO button.



Type a new word or phrase in the text box, then highlight FIND and press the GO button.

Scroll to the top or the bottom of a page



Highlight SCROLL TO TOP or SCROLL TO BOTTOM and press the GO button.



The GO TO option allows you to go directly to a page by typing in an Internet address.

Go directly to a page



Highlight GO TO on the panel and press the GO button.



Type the Internet address in the text box. For example: http://webtv.net



Highlight the GO TO PAGE command and press the GO button. The page appears on your screen.

Display addresses



Highlight SHOW CURRENT and press the GO button to display the address of the currently displayed page.



Highlight SHOW LAST and press the GO button to display the most recent address you entered on the GO TO panel.

Options Panel (cont'd)





The SAVE option allows you to save the currently displayed page on your FAVORITES list.

Save a currently displayed page



Highlight SAVE and press the GO button.



Highlight SAVE PAGE and press the GO button.



The SEND option allows you to send an e-mail message that contains a link to the currently displayed page.

Send a page by e-mail



Open the page you want to send, then press the OPTIONS button on the remote control.



Highlight the SEND option and press the GO button.



In the text box labeled TO, type the e-mail address of the person to whom you want to send the page. Highlight EDIT MESSAGE and press the GO button to add a message.



Highlight the SEND PAGE command and press the GO button. The page link will appear when the recipient opens the e-mail message.



See Display Advanced Options on page 31 for details on how to display the ADVANCED OPTIONS on your OPTIONS panel.



The RELOAD option loads an updated version of the page you are currently visiting. Use this option when the page you are viewing contains information that is updated frequently, such as sports scores or stock quotes.

Reload a page



Open a page, then highlight the RELOAD option and press the GO button.



The HANG UP option allows you to temporarily disconnect from the WebTV Network to make a telephone call, then reconnect to the page you were visiting when you disconnected.

Use the HANG UP option



Highlight the HANG UP option and press the GO button. The WebTV connection indicator on the title bar turns red and becomes a straight line.



Make a telephone call the way you normally do.



Press the GO button to reconnect to the WebTV Network.

Using a Computer Keyboard



You may connect a personal computer keyboard (wired) to the Internet Terminal. This will allow you to type information into the text boxes which appear on-screen. The keyboard must have a PS/2 (6-pin) type connector, and it must be an AT type. Connect the keyboard to the KEYBOARD jack on the back of the Internet Terminal. The function keys on a PC keyboard will have different operations once the keyboard is connected to the Internet Terminal. The keys will have the following functions.


