

This DVD Recorder will play various types of Discs. Some Disc types will only play on the Recorder; others will record in the Recorder; some will record and play. There are also a few types of Discs that will neither play nor record on this Recorder. Look for these logos on your Discs to determine whether the Disc will or will not play or record on the Philips DVD Recorder.

Discs for Recording and Playing



DVD+RW (Digital Video Disc + Rewritable): These Discs can be recorded on repeatedly. Recordings can be erased, then you can record again on the same Disc.



DVD+R (Digital Video Disc + Recordable): These Discs can be recorded only once. After you finalize a DVD+R, you cannot record on it any more.

Region Codes and Color Systems

DVDs must meet the requirements for Region Codes and Color Systems before you can use them with the DVD Recorder. DVDs must be labelled for ALL regions or for Region 1 in order to play on this DVD Recorder. You cannot play Discs that are labeled for other regions. These symbols must appear on your DVDs, or you cannot play the DVD in this Recorder.

The number inside the globe refers to a region of the world. Region 1 represents the United States, Canada, upper regions of North America, Bermuda, the U.S. Virgin Islands, and small regions near Australia.






Furthermore, recordings are made according to different color systems throughout the world. The most common color systems are NTSC, which is used primarily in the United States and North America, PAL, and SECAM.

This Recorder is compatible with NTSC and PAL. Make sure the Discs you play were recorded in NTSC or PAL. The color system of the DVD may appear on the DVD or on the Disc case. However, when playing a PAL Disc, the Recorder must be connected to a PAL-compatible TV using either the S-VIDEO (Y/C) or COMPONENT VIDEO (Y PB PR) OUT jacks of the Recorder. The Recorder's yellow VIDEO (CVBS) OUT jack does not send a clear PAL signal.

8 General Information

Battery Installation

- Remove the battery compartment lid on the rear of the remote control by pressing in the tab and lifting the lid.
- Place two AA batteries inside the battery compartment with their + and ends aligned as indicated. Do not mix old and new batteries or different types of batteries (standard, alkaline, etc.).
- Replace the battery compartment lid.



Unless stated otherwise, the remote can operate all the features of the DVD Recorder. Always point the remote directly at the remote sensor on the front of the Recorder, not the TV. See page 26. Make sure there are no barriers between the remote and the Recorder.

The Recorder's remote will operate some features of some Philips TVs. See page 24.



Some explanations in this manual describe the DVD Disc Menus, which vary among DVDs. Movie producers set these menus; not all DVDs have menus. If the DVD has a menu, access it by pressing DISC MENU on the remote. See page 23.

DVD Recorder Menus...

Some instructions explain how to use the Recorder's menu (or the System Menu or Menu Bars) to set up features of the Recorder or the Disc. You get to the Recorder Menu by pressing SYSTEM MENU on the remote. See page 28. Even if a feature is set up in the Recorder's menu, it will not be available if the current Disc does not include that feature.

Available Disc Features...

Features described in this manual may not be available on every Disc. If the feature is not available, you cannot use the Recorder to make the feature available. An "X" will appear in the top left corner of the TV


screen if you try to access a feature that is not available on the current Disc. Or, some features may not be available at the current time. For example, some features are available only during play, while others can be accessed only if play is stopped. Try stopping or starting play, then try the feature again.

Cleaning Discs

 When a Disc becomes dirty, clean it with a cleaning cloth. Wipe the Disc from the center out, in a straight line. Do not wipe the Disc in a circular motion.



- Do not use solvents such as benzine, thinner, commercially available cleaners, or anti-static spray intended for analog discs.
- Always keep the Recorder's Disc tray closed to avoid dust on the lens.
- The lens may cloud over if you suddenly move the Recorder from cold to warm surroundings. Playing a Disc is not possible then. Leave the power on for about one hour with no Disc in the Recorder until normal play is possible.



Determining the best possible connection...

The capabilities of your existing equipment, especially your TV, will determine your connection possibilities. However, the following guidelines describe which options provide the best picture and sound quality.

- ***

 Component Video provides the best picture quality. Progressive Scan
 Component Video has the ultimate quality, but use it only if the TV has
 Progressive Scan. See page 12.
- *** S-Video provides excellent picture quality. See page 13.
- ★★ Composite Video (a yellow Video jack) provides good picture quality. See page 14.
- ★★ Your TV may have only an RF-style jack, usually labeled Antenna In or 75 ohm. You can use this connection style either with or without a Cable Box. See pages 10-11.
- ***
 Digital audio connections provide the clearest sound. Connect one of the DVD Recorder's DIGITAL AUDIO OUT jacks (COAX (coaxial) or OPTICAL) to your Stereo for the best sound quality. See page 16.
- *** If digital audio connections are not possible, connect one pair of the DVD Recorder's red and white AUDIO OUT jacks to the Audio In jacks of your Stereo or TV. See pages 12-15.

Before you begin...

- Refer to the manuals of your TV, Stereo, or other equipment as necessary.
 Note the style of jacks and connectors on the other equipment. Determine how to choose different Audio and Video In channels on your other equipment so you can see and hear the DVD Recorder on the TV, Stereo, etc.
- Disconnect all equipment from the power outlets. Connect the equipment to the power outlets only after you have finished hooking up everything. Never make or change connections with equipment connected to the power outlet.

Remember...


- Set the TV to the correct Video In channel. This is channel 3 or 4 if your TV has only the single Antenna In jack. See pages 10-11. For all other connections, find the specific Video In channel at your TV.

 Video In channels may be called AUX or AUXILIARY IN, AUDIO/VIDEO or A/V IN, EXT1 or EXT2 or External In, etc. These channels often are near TV channel zero (0). Or, your TV remote may have a button or switch that lets you choose the Video In channel directly. See your TV manual for details.

 Or, go to your lowest TV channel and change channels down until you see the blue Philips DVD background picture on the TV screen. (The Recorder must be on.)
- Connect the DVD Recorder directly to the TV. For example, do not connect
 the Recorder to a VCR, then connect the VCR to a TV. This type of connection
 may distort the picture and sound. Also, your VCR might have the copy protection system, which could distort the DVD image.
- To connect a VCR to the DVD Recorder so you can copy videotapes to a DVD+R or DVD+RW, see page 17.
- Set a Stereo to the correct Audio In channel or "source" mode.
- Do not connect the DVD Recorder's AUDIO OUT jacks to the PHONO IN jack of your Stereo.
- You only need one audio connection and one video connection between the DVD Recorder and your TV (or TV and Stereo). So, you will not use all the jacks on the Recorder. There are multiple jacks so you can connect to different TV styles or to other equipment. See page 17.
- If you plan to watch your TV with the DVD Recorder off, connect the supplied RF coaxial cable to the Recorder's TV jack and to the RF IN or ANTENNA IN jack (75 ohm) on your television. This lets you watch channels at the TV normally when the Recorder is off and will improve the reception at your TV.

Determine the connection that fits with your TV, then find your choice on pages 10-16. Follow the steps for the hookup you chose. When you finish your connections and turn on the DVD Recorder for the first time, complete the Initial Setup. This sets up TV channels, menu languages, and other features, including the GUIDE Plus+® System. See pages 18-20 to do the Initial Setup.

Connecting to a TV Only TV has only an Antenna In jack



- Connect your Antenna or Cable TV signal to the ANTENNA jack on the rear of the Recorder. Your antenna or Cable TV signal may have been connected to your TV already. If so, disconnect it from the TV and connect it to the Recorder's ANTENNA jack.
- Connect the supplied RF coaxial cable to the TV jack on the rear of the Recorder. Connect the other end of the same RF coaxial cable to the Antenna In jack on your TV. Your TV's Antenna In jack may be labelled RF In, Antenna In, or 75 ohm. Check your TV's manual for details.
- Connect the supplied power cord to the MAINS ~ (AC Power) jack on the rear of the Recorder.

 Connect the power cords of the Recorder and the TV to a power outlet.
- Press STANDBY-ON © on the front of the Recorder to turn it on. "ISTV ON? CH03" will appear on the Recorder's display panel the first time you turn on the Recorder.
- **Turn on the TV. Set it to channel 3.** You should see the blue Philips DVD background picture or the Initial Setup screen. *Initial Setup appears the first time you turn on the Recorder. Go to pages 18-20 to complete the Initial Setup.*


- The Recorder's display may show "IS TV ON? CO4" instead. If so, but the TV on channel 4.
- If you need to use TV channel 4 but "IS TV ON? CO3" appears on the display, press and hold the Number 4 button on the Recorder's remote. After several seconds, the display will change to "IS TV ON? CO4." Set your TV to channel 4. Likewise, if the display shows "IS TV ON? CO4" and you need TV

channel 3, press and hold the Number 3 button.

Connecting to a TV and a Cable Box or Satellite Receiver




This example shows a Cable Box, but the steps are the same for a Satellite Receiver. Do not use the G-Link cable if you have a Satellite Receiver.

- Connect your Cable TV signal to the ANTENNA IN jack on your Cable Box.
- If your Cable Box has an ANTENNA OUT or TO TV jack, connect an RF coaxial cable to it and to the Recorder's ANTENNA jack. If your Cable Box has red, white, and yellow AUDIO and VIDEO OUT jacks, use the supplied audio and video cables to connect those jacks to the Recorder's IN EXT 2 VIDEO (CVBS) and AUDIO L/R jacks instead.
- Connect an RF coaxial cable to the Recorder's TV jack and to the ANTENNA IN or RF IN jack on your TV. Your TV's Antenna In jack may be labelled RF In or 75 ohm. Check your TV manual for details.
- Connect the supplied power cord to the MAINS ~ (AC Power) jack on the rear of the Recorder. Connect the power cords of the Recorder, Cable Box/Satellite Receiver, and TV to a power outlet.
- If you have a Cable Box, remove the Demo Pin from the Recorder's G-LINK jack. (This should have been in place when you bought the Recorder.) Connect the supplied G-Link cable to the G-LINK jack now. You will need this later to use the GUIDE Plus+® System.
- Press STANDBY/ON © to turn on the Recorder. Set the Recorder to channel 3 or 4 (your Cable Box output channel) if you used an RF coaxial cable at step 2. Or, set the Recorder to EXT 2 if you connected the Cable Box to those jacks at step 2.

- To watch TV, put the Recorder in Monitor mode and on channel 3 or 4. (Press MONITOR on the Recorder's remote.) Change TV channels at your Cable Box.
- The Recorder's display may show "IS TV ON? CO4" instead. If so, put the TV on channel 4.
- If you need to use TV channel 4 but "IS TV ON? CO3" appears on the display, press and hold the Number 4 button on the Recorder's remote. After several seconds, the display will change to "IS TV ON? CO4." Set your TV to channel 4. Likewise, if the display shows "IS TV ON? CO4" and you need TV channel 3 press and hold.









- Connect the Recorder's yellow OUT 2 VIDEO (CVBS) jack to the VIDEO IN jack on your TV. The supplied video cable has yellow markings.

- Turn on the TV and select its Audio/Video In channel. It may be called AUX or AUXILIARY IN, AUDIO/VIDEO or A/V IN, EXT1 or EXT2 or External In, etc. Or, your TV remote may have a button or switch that selects the Video In channel. This is not channel 3 or 4. See your TV manual for details. Or, go to your lowest TV channel and change channels down until you see the DVD background picture or Initial Setup.



- Connect the Recorder's yellow OUT 2 VIDEO (CVBS) jack to the VIDEO IN jack on your TV. The supplied video cable has yellow markings.
- Connect the supplied power cord to the MAINS ~ (AC Power) jack on the rear of the Recorder. Connect the power cords of the Recorder, Stereo, and TV to a power outlet.

- A small, square, black cap protects the OPTICAL OUT jack.


Connecting to Other Equipment Dubbing Videotape to a DVD+R/DVD+RW



You can connect a Video Cassette Recorder (VCR), Camcorder, or DVD Player to the Recorder's CAM or IN-EXT jacks. A sample connection with a Camcorder is shown here, using the CAM 1 AUDIO/VIDEO IN jacks on the front of the Recorder. These jacks are the most easily accessible. Other equipment will connect similarly, but this is a common connection possibility.

You will need this connection to copy videotapes onto a DVD+R or DVD+RW.

There are more Component Video, S-Video, Digital Video, and Audio In jacks on the front and rear of the Recorder. If your other equipment has these jacks, use them instead. Use the IN-EXT jacks on the rear of the Recorder for permanent connections. That will hide the cables from view.



- Connect the DVD Recorder directly to your TV. Choose a connection from pages 10-16.
- To access the jacks on the front of the Recorder, flip down the door that covers the jacks. Press where the door is marked OPEN ▶.
- Connect a video cable to the VIDEO OUT jack of your Camcorder and to the yellow CAM 1 VIDEO IN jack on the front of the DVD Recorder. Use an RCA-style video cable, which is usually marked with yellow. (One video cable is supplied with the Recorder.)
- Connect audio cables to the AUDIO OUT jacks of your Camcorder and to the red and white CAM 1 AUDIO IN jacks on the front of the DVD Recorder. Most audio cables are marked with red and white. Match the cable colors to the jack colors. (One pair of audio cables is supplied with the DVD Recorder.)
- When all connections are complete, connect all the equipment to power. Turn on all the equipment. Press STANDBY-ON \circ on the front of the DVD Recorder to turn it on.
- Set your TV to the correct Video In channel. This will be channel 3 or 4 or a specific Video In channel, depending on your connection between the Recorder and the TV. Refer to the connection details on pages 9-16. Or, simply go to channel 5 on your TV, then change channels down until you see the DVD Recorder's logo. Initial Setup will appear the first time you turn on the Recorder. See pages 18-20 to do Initial Setup first.
- To watch or record the material playing on the other equipment, press MONITOR to put the Recorder in Monitor mode. Press CH+▲ or CH-▼ to select CAM1 at the Recorder. This is located after your highest TV channel and before your lowest TV channel. Choose CAM1 if you used the connection shown on this page (with the jacks on the front of the Recorder). If you use the IN EXT 1 or IN EXT 2 jacks on the rear of the Recorder instead, choose channel EXT 1 or EXT 2. Choose the channel that matches the jacks to which you connected the other equipment. Start playing the material by pressing PLAY on the other equipment. Press Record on the front of the DVD Recorder to start recording. See page 21.

- Use the DV IN CAM 2 jack to connect the Recorder to a Personal Computer that has a Digital Video output. The PC must have an IEEE 1394 Firewire connector. Limited PC applications may be supported. You also can use this jack to connect the Recorder to Digital Video or Hi-8 camcorders. If you use the DV IN CAM 2 jack, choose CAM 2 at the Recorder in Monitor mode to see the material playing on other equipment.
- Most prerecorded videotapes and DVDs are copy protected. If you try to copy them, the Recorder display may show "COPY PROTECT."
- If the Recorder's display shows "NO SIGNAL," adjust the tracking or play the tape at the VCR/Camcorder.
- Do not connect a Progressive Scan video source (such as a DVD Player) to the IN EXT 1 COMPONENT VIDEO jacks. The Recorder cannot receive Progressive Scan video.


18 Initial Setup

Initial Setup menus will appear on the TV the first time you turn on the Recorder. These help you set up TV channels, the GUIDE Plus+® System, and other features for the first time.

During Initial Setup, "ISTV ON?" will appear on the Recorder's display panel. Turn on your TV and set it to channel 3 or 4 OR the correct Video In channel. Your TV must be on the correct Video In channel to see the Initial Setup menus. See pages 9-17 to find the Video In channel for your hookup. Or, check your TV manual for details. You cannot open the Disc tray while "ISTV ON?" appears. "INSTALL RECORDER FIRST" will show on the display panel.

You cannot turn off the Recorder until you finish the Initial Setup. The only way to quit the Initial Setup is to disconnect the power cord. If you quit, the Initial Setup screens will appear again the next time you turn on the Recorder. The screens will not go away until you finish the Initial Setup.


- Remove the Demo Pin from the G-LINK jack on the rear of the Recorder. Otherwise, a GUIDE Plus+® System demonstration will run after you finish Initial Setup.
- If you are using a Cable Box, connect the G-Link cable to the Recorder's G-LINK jack. See page 11. Place the G-Link sensor in front of your Cable Box. Turn on the Cable Box and set it to channel 2.
- **Press STANDBY** to turn on the Recorder. PHILIPS will show on the display panel. It will take the Recorder several seconds to turn on.
- The Menu Language screen will appear first. Press ▲ CH+ or ▼ CH- to choose English, Espanol, or Français. Press OK. The Recorder's menus will be in the language you selected. To change the Menu Language later, see page 60.





The Audio Language menu appears next. Press ▲CH+ or ▼CH-to choose the language you prefer, then press OK.

Helpful Hints

- The Recorder's features will scroll across the display panel when you first connect the power cord. This is a demonstration that cannot be cancelled.
- The Initial Setup screens will disappear after about 20 minutes of inactivity. The Recorder will turn off. The Initial Setup menus will reappear when you turn on the Recorder again.
- If the Initial Setup menus don't appear, your Recorder is set already. To change items later, see the pages for each feature.
- You can use channel 3 or 4 at your TV. While "IS TV ON? CO4" is on the Recorder's display, press and hold the remote's Number 3 button until the display shows "IS TV ON? CO3." Set your TV to channel 3. To change to channel 4, press and hold Number 4 instead during this process.

The Subtitle Language menu appears next. Press ▲ CH+ or ▼ CHto choose a language for subtitles, then press OK.
To change the Subtitle Language later, see pages 48 and 60.



The TV Shape menu appears next. Press ▲CH+ or ▼CH- to choose the preferred TV Shape, then press OK.

To change the TV Shape later or for details on TV Shapes, see page 58.



"If you have connected the antenna - press OK" appears next. If you have connected an Antenna or Cable TV signal to the Recorder's ANTENNA jack, press OK.


If you have not connected the Antenna or Cable TV signal, do so now, then press OK.

"Searching for TV channels" will appear, along with a scale showing channels are being memorized. The number of channels found will show on the screen as the searching progresses. This will take a few minutes, depending on the channels available in your area. When the channel search finishes, "Auto ch. search complete" will appear, along with the total number of channels found.



Press SYSTEM MENU.

You have completed the basic Initial Setup. Now you are ready to set up the GUIDE Plus+® System. Continue with the GUIDE Plus+® System setup as detailed on the next page.



Helpful Hint

 DVDs will play with the Audio and Subtitles you selected only if those languages are on the Disc. Some DVDs require you to choose these options in the Disc menu. If so, the DVD defaults may override your choices in the Recorder's menus.

GUIDE Plus+® System Setup

- An introduction to the GUIDE Plus+® System will appear. Read this, then press OK to continue through these introductory menus. The remaining menus help you set up the GUIDE Plus+® System, which provides free TV programming information through the Recorder. See pages 43-47.
- First you will be asked about your country, zip code, Cable TV service, and Cable Box availability. Use ▲ CH+ and ▼ CH- to choose an answer, then press OK. Use the Number buttons to enter the zip code. Follow the instructions on the TV screen.
- If you do not have Cable TV or a Cable Box, skip to step 8.

 Otherwise, you will set up your Cable Box next.

 When asked to enter your Cable Box output channel: If you used an RF coaxial cable to connect the Cable Box to the Recorder, choose channel 2, 3, or 4. (Choose the output channel of your Cable Box. This may be indicated by a manual switch on your Cable Box.)

 Or, if you used Audio and Video cables, choose EXT2, EXT 1, CAM 1, or CAM 2. Choose the channel that matches the jacks on the Recorder to which you connected the Cable Box.
- Directions for connecting the G-Link cable will appear next. If you have not connected the G-Link cable to the G-LINK jack on the rear of the Recorder, do so now. Press OK when the cable is connected and you are ready to continue. See pages 11 and 18.
- A list of Cable Box brands will appear. Select your Cable Box brand, then press OK. If your brand is not listed, select "Not Listed."
- You will be advised to turn on the Cable Box and set it to channel 2. After doing this, press OK to continue.
- The Recorder will test codes that allow the G-Link cable to change the Cable Box to channel 9.


 A message will ask you to confirm whether the Cable Box has changed to channel 9. If it does, select Yes. Press OK. If the Cable Box does not change to channel 9, check all connections. Select "Test this code again," then press OK.


 Or, choose No and press OK. The Recorder will try a different code. Repeat this process until the Cable Box changes to channel 9.
- "Confirming your settings" will appear. When the information is correct, choose "Yes, end setup," then press OK. If the settings are incorrect, choose "No, repeat setup process," then press OK. You will go through the setup again. Change any incorrect information.
- Helpful information about the GUIDE Plus+® System will appear.

 Press OK to continue.


 A congratulations message will appear, prompting you to select "Watch TV." Press OK again. You are finished!

 Within a few seconds, the DVD Recorder will turn itself off, then on again. When the Recorder turns on again, the GUIDE Plus+® System will show "no data." This is normal, as the Recorder has not had time to receive programming data. To use the Recorder right away, press GUIDE/TV to remove the GUIDE Plus+® System.
- Press STANDBY © to turn off the Recorder later. The GUIDE Plus+® System data will be available in about 24 hours. When the Recorder is off, channels will change on your Cable Box. This is normal, as the unit is searching for GUIDE Plus+® System information. For best results, turn off the Recorder overnight so it can receive the GUIDE Plus+® System data. Leave the Cable Box turned on.





- By default, the GUIDE Plus+® System will appear first every time you turn on the Recorder. To cancel this feature, turn off the Auto Display under Review Options in the GUIDE Plus+® System. See page 44.
- The Recorder must be off in order to receive GUIDE Plus+® System data.



The Recorder can record TV programming onto a DVD+RW or DVD+R. Make sure TV channels are set. Use an unprotected, unfinalized, recordable DVD+RW or DVD+R.

- Press OPEN/CLOSE




- Press ▼CH- to select an empty Title box on a DVD+RW. To avoid overwriting other recordings, choose the last Empty Title box. On a DVD+R, the Recorder always records at the end of the Disc; you do not need to select an Empty Title box. You can not overwrite DVD+R recordings.
- **Press MONITOR** to see TV channels through the Recorder.
- Press VCH-, ACH+, or the Number buttons to select the channel you wish to record.

 To record material playing on equipment you connected to the Recorder, select EXT1, EXT2, CAM1, or CAM2. Choose the EXT (External) or CAM (Camera) channel that matches the jack to which you connected the other equipment. For example, if you connected a camcorder to the S-VIDEO CAM1 jack on the front of the Recorder, press VCH- or ACH+ to choose CAM1. CAM1 will appear in the Tuner Information Box. See page 30.

 If you are using a Cable Box/Satellite Receiver, set the Recorder to channel 3 or 4. (Choose the output channel of your Cable Box/Satellite Receiver.) Change TV channels at the Cable Box/Satellite Receiver.
- Press REC/OTR to record the channel. Red record lights will encircle the disc tray and the Record button on the front of the Recorder. Recording will begin after a few seconds. (The Disc has to prepare for recording.) To pause recording, press PAUSE ■■ once on the remote. The red light encircling the Record button will flash. To resume recording, press PAUSE ■■ or REC/OTR ●.
- Press STOP to stop recording. The Index Picture Screen will reappear after a few seconds. On a brief recording on a new DVD+RW, formatting the Disc will take a minute.
- To play a DVD+R on another DVD Player, finalize the Disc. Follow the steps on page 40. You cannot record or edit a DVD+R after you finalize it.
- To edit your recordings, see pages 35 and 38-39. However, editing changes may not be accessible when you play the Disc on other DVD Players.




- You can not record only Audio (sound) to a DVD+RW/DVD+R.
 You must record both audio and video (sound and picture).
- To erase a recording, see "Erase this title" details on page 35.
- You cannot duplicate copyrighted DVDs, videotapes, or TV broadcasts using this Recorder. "COPY PROTECT" will appear on the display panel.



- Press STANDBY-ON © to turn on the DVD Recorder.
 Turn on your TV. Set it to the correct Video In channel. See pages 9-17. You should see the blue Philips DVD background picture on the TV screen (if no Disc is in the Recorder).
- Press OPEN/CLOSE

 on the front of the Recorder to open the disc tray. Load your Disc in the tray, with the label facing up and the shiny side facing down. If the Disc (DVD) is two-sided, make sure the label of the side you want to play is facing up.




Press OPEN/CLOSE ▲ again to close the tray.

- Play may start automatically. If not:
 - For a DVD, a Disc menu may appear. **Press ▼CH-, ▲CH+, ◄, or** ► **to select an item, then press OK.** Continue until you set up all the features you want or until the Disc starts playing. Follow the instructions in the DVD Disc menu. If Titles, Chapters, or features are numbered in the menu, use the Number buttons on the remote to choose an item.
 - For an Audio CD, press PLAY

 to start play.
 - With a DVD+RW or DVD+R, an Index Picture Screen will appear. See page 30. Press ▼CH- or ▲CH+ to select a Title; press PLAY ▶. If the Disc is blank, the display panel will show "EMPTY DISC."
- To stop play at any time, press STOP ■.

 If Auto resume is On, play will resume at the same point the next time you play the Disc. To play the Disc from its beginning, restart play from the Disc menu.

If Auto resume is Off, Resume ▶ will appear in the top left corner when you start to play the Disc later. While Resume ▶ appears, press PLAY ▶ to resume play from the point at which you last stopped it. Otherwise, play will start at the beginning of the Disc. Auto resume is On when you purchase the Recorder. However, you can turn it On or Off. See page 62.




- If the Disc is Locked by Access Control, you must enter the fourdigit code or authorize the Disc. See pages 54-56.
- DVDs have a region code. Your Recorder will not play Discs that have a region code different from the region code of your Recorder. The Recorder's region code is 1 (one). See page seven.

Title/Disc menus

Press DISC MENU during Disc play. For a DVD, if the current Title has a menu, the Title menu will appear on the screen. Otherwise, the Disc menu will appear. The menu may list languages, Chapters, or other features.

For a DVD+RW or DVD+R, the Index Picture Screen will appear. See page 31.

- Press ▲CH+, ▼CH-, ◀, or ▶ to select items in the menu or Index Picture Screen, then press OK. Repeat this process until you set up all the features you want or until play begins.

CAM (Camera) jacks

To access these jacks, flip down the door as indicated by the OPEN ▶ label on the door. Use these jacks when connecting a Camcorder or other equipment to the DVD Recorder. See page 17. When recording material that is playing on the other equipment, use the ▲CH+ or ▼CH- buttons in Monitor mode to select the CAM channel that matches the jack to which the equipment is connected.

If your Personal Computer has an IEEE 1394 Firewire connector, you may connect it to the Recorder's DV IN CAM 2 jack. Limited applications are available.

MAINS ~ jack Connect the supplied AC power cord here. See pages 10-16. Connect the supplied RF coaxial cable to the Recorder's TV jack and to the RF IN or ANTENNA IN jack (75 ohm) on your television. ANTENNA jack Connect your antenna or Cable TV signal here. See pages 10-16. **IN EXT 2 jacks** Use these jacks to receive picture and sound from other equipment, such as a Camcorder or VCR. You will use these if you copy videotapes to a DVD+R, for example. See page 17. You only need one video connection from the other equipment, so use either VIDEO (CVBS) or S-VIDEO (Y-C). **VIDEO (CVBS):** Use a video cable to connect this jack to the Video Out jack of other equipment. • AUDIO L/R (left/right): Connect audio cables here and to the Audio Out jacks of other equipment. • S-VIDEO (Y-C): Use an S-video cable to connect this jack to the S-Video Out jack of other equipment.

IN EXT 1 jacks -

Use these jacks to receive picture and sound from other equipment, such as a Camcorder or VCR, that has Component Video. You will use these if you copy videotapes to a DVD+R, for example. See page 17.

- AUDIO L/R (left/right): Connect audio cables here and to the Audio Out jacks of the other equipment.
- **COMPONENT VIDEO (Y PB PR):** Connect these jacks to the Component Video Out jacks of the other equipment.

OUT 1 and OUT 2 jacks -

MAINS

Use these jacks to connect the Recorder to your TV and/or Stereo.

- **VIDEO (CVBS):** Connect the yellow video cable here and to the TV's Video In jack. See *page 14*.
- **S-VIDEO (Y-C):** Connect an S-Video cable here and to a TV's S-Video In jack. See page 13.
- COMPONENT VIDEO (Y PB PR): Connect Component Video cables (red, blue, green) here and to a TV's Component Video In jacks. See page 12.
- AUDIO L/R (Left/Right): Use audio cables (red, white) to connect these jacks to the Audio In jacks of a TV or Stereo. See pages 12-15.

DIGITAL AUDIO OUT jacks

- **COAX OUT:** Connect a digital audio coaxial cable here and to the digital audio Coaxial In jack of a Stereo. See page 16.
- OPTICAL OUT: Connect a digital audio optical cable here and to the digital audio Optical In jack of a Stereo. See page 16.

G-LINK jack

Connect the G-Link cable here to have the Recorder operate a Cable Box for the GUIDE Plus+® System. Remove the Demonstration Pin from this jack first when you receive the Recorder. See pages 18-20.

- Use the same EXT (external) number for each pair of audio and video connections. For example, if you use IN-EXT 2 S-VIDEO (Y/C), use the IN-EXT 2 AUDIO L/R jacks. IN-EXT means this jack is bringing IN the audio and video from an EXTERNAL or separate piece of equipment.
- Do not touch the inner pins of the jacks. Electrostatic discharge may damage the unit permanently.
- You only need one audio and one video connection to a TV.
 You will not use all the jacks.
 There are multiple jacks so you can connect to different TV styles or to other equipment.



Special messages appear in a red bar at the bottom of the TV screen when appropriate, as in the example below.



Tuner Information box

Appears on the left side of the TV screen and identifies the current TV channel or Video source in Monitor mode. For example, if EXT1 appears in the Tuner Information Box, you can view or record the material that is playing on the equipment that is connected to the IN EXT 1 jacks on the rear of the Recorder.

Make sure you connected an Antenna or Cable TV signal to the Recorder's ANTENNA jack. See pages 10-16. Press MONITOR to put the Recorder in Monitor mode and view the TV channel or playback from other equipment.

Timer Information box

Displays the start time or date of the next scheduled timer recording and appears in the Index Picture Screen. You cannot remove it from the Index Picture Screen.

It may appear briefly at the beginning of a timed One-Touch Recording. It does not appear during recording or Disc play.

In Monitor mode, the Timer Information box will appear for a few seconds, then disappear.

The Index Picture Screen shows your recordings. It appears when you insert a DVD+R or DVD+RW or when you stop play or recording. An Index Picture represents each recording. Next to each Index Picture is the program name (or channel and time), length, speed, and date. If GUIDE Plus+® System data is available, the Recorder uses that data to name the recording.

Empty disc areas also show in the Index Picture Screen. "Empty title" and the amount of remaining recording time may appear beside an empty Index Picture box. This indicates blank space that is available for additional recording. "Deleted title" and the amount of blank space will appear in blank areas of a DVD+R. You cannot reuse this space for recordings though. The Index Picture Screen will dim after several minutes of no use. It will brighten again when you use the Recorder or its remote.

Titles


Three index pictures appear at a time. Press ▲CH+ or ▼CH- to move to other screens. Press STOP ■ to go directly to the first recording. Press ▲CH+ repeatedly to go to the Disc Information Screen. See page 38.

Disc Bar

The Disc Bar appears at the right of the Index Picture Screen. Its Disc Pointer indicates your current position on the Disc. Moving through the recordings by pressing ▲CH+ or ▼CH- moves the Disc Pointer. On a DVD+RW, resume play or recording from this point by pressing OK to play or REC/OTR ● to record. Later recordings will be overwritten. On a DVD+R, resume play from the Disc Pointer location by pressing OK. However, on a DVD+R, recording automatically begins at the last empty title space when you press REC/OTR ●.

Title Settings Menu

When you select an Index Picture, press ▶ to go to the Title Settings menu for that recording. Here, you can edit the current Title name, play the entire Title, or erase the selected Title. See page 35.




Once the GUIDE Plus+® System is operating, it will control the time and date of the Recorder. Until then, set the clock by following these steps. After the GUIDE Plus+® System receives the clock data, it will override any earlier clock settings. You cannot change the time information once the GUIDE Plus+® System has set it.

Press ▼CH- repeatedly to select at the end of the second menu. Press ▶. This is not always accessible under some GUIDE Plus+® System circumstances.

Press ▼CH- repeatedly to select Time/Date, then press ►. If the time already is set by the GUIDE Plus+® System, you will see a message "Not valid to change; Valid data received via Guide." You cannot change the clock setting to override the time provided by the GUIDE Plus+® System. Press SYSTEM MENU repeatedly to remove the menu.

Press ▲CH+ or ▼CH- to choose Automatic or Manual, then press ▶.





For PBS Channel, choose the channel number of your PBS station, then press OK. If you do not know your PBS channel number, choose Auto. The Recorder will find the PBS station for you and set the time. Turn Daylight Saving On or Off. Choose Auto if you want the clock set according to the PBS station's Daylight Savings Time schedule. Finally, choose your Time Zone. If you want the Recorder to use the time zone from which your PBS station broadcasts, choose Auto. If your PBS station broadcasts from a different time zone than the one in which you live, be sure to select your time zone.



When all the information is correct, press OK.



- Press ▼CH- repeatedly to select \(\frac{1}{2} \) at the end of the second menu page. Press ▶.




- Press & CH+ or VCH- to select Auto Ch. Programming, then press OK. "Searching for TV channels" will appear, along with a scale showing channels that are being memorized. The number of channels found will show on the screen as the searching progresses. This will take a few minutes, depending on the channels available.
- When the channel search finishes, "Auto ch. search complete" will appear, along with the total number of channels found.

 Press SYSTEM MENU. The Installation menu will reappear.


 If you are satisfied with the channels found, press SYSTEM MENU again to remove the menu. You are finished.

- Only added channels are accessible using CH+▲/CH-▼.

- The Recorder detects whether you have an Antenna or Cable TV signal. If you are receiving limited channels, check the Cable/Antenna setting. Follow steps 1-2 above. Press CH-▼ to choose Cable/Antenna, then press OK. Press CH+▲ or CH-▼ to choose Cable or Anten. Press OK, then press SYSTEM MENU. Press OK again to reset the channels. When the channel search ends, press SYSTEM MENU. This is not available once the GUIDE Plus+® System controls the channel list.

34 One-Touch Recording

Place a recordable DVD+RW or DVD+R in the Recorder.

In the Index Picture Screen of a DVD+RW, press ▲CH+ or **▼CH- to select an Empty Title** (or empty Index Picture box) that has enough time for the recording. Or, select the place at which you want to start the new recording in order to overwrite other recordings. See page 36.

You may skip this step if you use Safe Record. See step 5. Or, if you are using a DVD+R, you may skip this step. Recordings on a DVD+R are made at the end of the Disc automatically. Previous recordings are not overwritten.

Press MONITOR to see TV channels through the DVD Recorder.

Press ▲CH+, ▼CH-, or Number buttons to select a channel to record. You cannot change channels during recording. If you are using a Cable Box/Satellite Receiver that has a single RF Out/TV Out/Antenna Out/75 ohm jack, set the DVD Recorder to channel 3 or 4 in Monitor mode. (Choose the output channel of your Cable Box/Satellite Receiver.)

If your Cable Box/Satellite Receiver has Audio/Video Out jacks, set the Recorder to an EXT channel. Choose the EXT channel that corresponds to the jacks you used on the rear of the DVD Recorder (the jacks to which you connected the Cable Box/Satellite Receiver). Then, change TV channels at the Cable Box/Satellite Receiver.


Press REC/OTR ● twice to start a 30-minute recording. Press REC/OTR ● repeatedly to record longer segments in thirty-minute increments. The length of recording available depends on the current recording mode/speed and the amount of time available on the Disc. See page 37. Recording will begin soon after you press REC/OTR ●. The Disc takes a few seconds to prepare for

Or, use Safe Record to have the Recorder automatically find the empty space at the end of a DVD+RW; this prevents overwriting other recordings. To do so, press and hold REC/OTR ● for about two seconds, or until SAFE REC appears on the Recorder's display panel. Then, press REC/OTR ● repeatedly to choose the time length you want for your recording.

Press STOP ■ if you need to stop the recording before the designated end time. Otherwise, the Recorder will automatically stop recording at the designated end time and turn itself off. Or, if you only pressed REC/OTR ● once, the Recorder will record the current channel or source until the end of the Disc is reached.

Then the Recorder will turn itself off.



- "Disc locked" will appear on the TV if a protected DVD+RW or DVD+R is in the Recorder.
- If the power fails during recording, the Index Picture Screen may not match the actual video content on the Disc. The last recorded Title may be lost. A power failure or unit failure/system crash also may destroy all the material recorded on a Disc.
- When the Disc is full, "End of Disc" will appear on the TV. DISC FULL will show on the Recorder's display panel.
- Press SYSTEM MENU during recording to access or remove the Status, Tuner, or Timer Information box. See pages 29-30.
- The recommended operating temperature range for the Recorder is 32°F-122°F for DVD+RW recording and 32°F-104°F for DVD+R recording. Exceeding these ranges may cause unstable recording results.

The Title Settings Menu lets you rename a Title or recording on a DVD+RW/DVD+R. From the same menu, you can play the entire selected Title or erase the chosen Title from the Disc.

When play is stopped and a DVD+RW or DVD+R is in the Recorder, the Index Picture Screen will appear. See page 31.

Press or ▶ to choose M1, M2, M2x, M3, M4, M6, or M8, then press OK. These recording speeds define the picture quality of recordings and the maximum recording time for a Disc. You also can choose a record mode by pressing REC MODE in Monitor mode or in the Index Picture Screen. You can't change record modes during recording.

Auto chapters

Press ◀ or ▶ to choose On or Off, then press OK. If Auto chapters is On, the Recorder will insert a Chapter marker every five to six minutes during recording. To disable this feature, select Off. To insert Chapter markers after recording, see page 39. To insert Chapter markers manually during recording, see below.


to choose Stndrd (Standard) or Sport, then press OK. Select Sport to improve recording of images that move quickly. Otherwise, choose Stndrd.

Press SYSTEM MENU repeatedly to remove the menus.

Chapter Markers

Chapter Markers let you move easily through recordings by pressing Next ▶►I or Previous I◀◀ during play. This gives you access to specific points on a DVD+RW/DVD+R much as you would choose a Chapter on a DVD.

Press FSS & during recording to insert a Chapter marker at the current position. "Inserting chapter marker" will appear at the bottom of the TV screen. The maximum number of markers varies per Disc. When the maximum is reached, "Too many chapters" will appear. Delete some before inserting more. See page 39.



38 Editing: Disc Information Screen

You can change settings for a DVD+RW or unfinalized DVD+R from the Disc Information Screen.

When in the Index Picture Screen, press STOP ■ to select the first Title on the Disc.

Press ▲CH+ to enter the Disc Information Screen.

In the Disc Information Screen, press ▶ to enter the Settings menu. You cannot do this if a DVD+R is finalized.



DVD+RW example

- Press ▲CH+ or ▼CH- to select Disc name, Protection, Erase disc (DVD+RW only), Make edits compatible (DVD+RW only), or Finalize disc (DVD+R only). Proceed as follows, depending on which feature you want to adjust.
 - Disc name (DVD+RW and DVD+R)
 Press ▶. Press ◀ or ▶ to choose the character position,
 then press ▲CH+ or ▼CH- to enter a character. Press
 SELECT to alternate between capital and lower case characters.
 Press CLEAR to erase a character (the space will remain). When
 the name is complete, press OK.
 - Protection (DVD+RW and DVD+R)

Erase disc (DVD+RW only)

Press OK. "This will erase all titles Press OK to confirm" will appear. **Press OK again to begin erasing.** (If you decide not to erase the Disc, press **◄.**) "Erasing disc" appears until erasing is complete. When the Disc is erased, the Index Picture Screen will reappear, showing the free space on the Disc.


Make edits compatible (DVD+RW only)

Press OK. "This will take XX" and "Press OK to confirm" will appear to indicate how long the action will take. (If you decide to not make edits compatible, press ◀.)

Press OK again. "Working .." and a progress % bar will appear. The Index Picture Screen will reappear when the process is complete. Make edits compatible appears only if you have added Chapter markers or made Chapters invisible on the DVD+RW. See page 39.

Finalize Disc (unfinalized DVD+R only)


Press OK. "Finalizing disc" will appear during the process. This may take a few minutes. Then, the Index Picture Screen will reappear. You cannot unfinalize a DVD+R. You cannot record or edit the DVD+R after you finalize it. A DVD+R will play on other DVD Players only after you finalize it.

- If a DVD+R was recorded on a different DVD Recorder, the settings may not be accessible.
- A disc name may contain a maximum of 64 characters.

Although editing changes may not be accessible when you play a DVD+R or DVD+RW on DVD Players, the changes are available at the Recorder.

- In the Index Picture Screen, press ▲CH+ or ▼CH- to select the Title you want to edit. Press PLAY ▶ to begin play.
- **During play, press FSS** % . The Favorite Scene Selection menu will overlay the current video image. The current Title and Chapter numbers will appear at the top of the screen.




- Press ▲ CH+ or ▼ CH- to select Insert chapter marker, Current chapter, Delete chapter marker, Delete all markers, New index picture, or Divide title (DVD+RW only).
- If you select Insert chapter marker, press OK. "Inserting chapter marker" will appear briefly. This places a Chapter marker at that point so you can go there quickly by pressing Next ►I or Previous I◄◄.
 - If you select Current chapter, press ▶ (or SELECT) repeatedly to select Visible or Hidden. Press OK. By hiding chapters or making them visible, you determine which chapters you want to view. If you do not want to watch certain scenes (for example, commercials), insert Chapter markers at the beginning and end of the scene, then hide that segment. You can then watch your recording without the hidden chapters. The picture may freeze briefly between scenes, but you will not see the hidden content.
 - If you select Delete chapter marker, press OK. "Deleting marker" appears briefly. This deletes the marker at the beginning of the current Chapter. (This option is not always available.)



You can record and finalize DVD+Rs one time. After you fill a DVD+R or complete all the recordings you want on a single DVD+R, finalize it. Otherwise, the DVD+R will play only on this Recorder. To play the Disc on other DVD Players, you must finalize it first.

Once you finalize a DVD+R, you cannot record on it anymore or make editing changes. Therefore, make sure the Disc is as you want it before you finalize it.

Press CH-▼ repeatedly to select 🖰 in the second screen, then press ▶.

Press CH-▼ repeatedly to select Finalize disc. Finalize disc appears only when an unfinalized DVD+R is in the Recorder.





The Disc Manager gives you quick access to recordings made with this Recorder. It remembers the content of each Disc and shows how many unrecorded minutes remain on a Disc.

You can add only DVD+RWs or DVD+Rs to the Disc Manager. The Disc must contain at least one recording made on the Philips DVD Recorder. DVD+Rs can be finalized.

Add current disc

- Insert the DVD+RW or DVD+R for which you want to assign a number.
 - While play is stopped, press DISC MANAGER.
- Press ▼CH- repeatedly to select Add current disc. Press ►. If the Disc is already numbered, you cannot select Add current disc. "Already present" will show in the menu.




To remove a Disc from the Disc Manager, follow these steps. This may be necessary if you need to make room for new Discs or if you want to remove a damaged Disc.

- While Disc play is stopped, press DISC MANAGER.
- Press ▼CH- repeatedly to select Remove disc. Press ►. A Disc number and its contents (Titles) will appear in the menu.



- Press ▲CH+ or ▼CH- to select the Disc number you want to remove, then press OK. This only removes the Disc from the Disc Manager memory. The contents of the Disc will not change. The Disc number you deleted will be available for assignment to a different Disc. Other Discs in the Disc Manager will keep their existing number.

Use the Number buttons enter the details of your recording. Use the Arrow buttons to choose an item to change (Date, Start/End Time, or Channel).

Enter the Date as month/day/year.


Some DVDs are recorded in different languages. For example, you may be able to watch the same movie in French, Spanish, etc. The movie may have special audio features, such as a director's commentary or music sound-track. If these are available on the DVD, access the different languages or featured soundtracks by following these steps.

During DVD play, press the AUDIO ((\(\frac{\cappa}{\chappa}\) button. ((\(\frac{\chappa}{\chappa}\) Audio will be selected in the Menu Bar.

Within five seconds, press the AUDIO ((É button repeatedly to see the different languages available. Or, press ▲ CH+ or ▼ CH- repeatedly to see the different languages. The language you select will be audible in a few seconds. The Menu Bar will disappear automatically in a few seconds.

The languages or options may be abbreviated. For example, French may be Fr. See your Disc case for details on available audio features and explanations.






Subtitles


Some DVDs include subtitles in different languages. Or, material you recorded onto a DVD+RW or DVD+R might include subtitles. To choose subtitles, follow these steps.

During play, press the SUBTITLE ____ button to select ____ in the Menu Bar.

Within five seconds, press the SUBTITLE _____ button repeatedly to see the different subtitle languages. Or, press ▲ CH+ or ▼ CH- to see the different subtitle languages. Subtitles will appear after a few seconds. The Menu Bar will disappear automatically in a few seconds.

You can choose subtitles only if they are available on the Disc.





Helpful Hint

 If you record from a device at the Recorder's DV IN CAM 2 jack, the recording date and time will be recorded as a subtitle. Press SUBTITLE _____ to see the recording date and time in the bottom right corner of the TV screen during play.

Zoom

Zooming lets you enlarge the video image during play and pan through the enlarged image.

Press ZOOM + during Disc play to select + in the Menu Bar.

Within five seconds, press ▲CH+ or ▼CH- to choose 1.33, 2 or 4. Play will pause. The still picture will appear at 1.33, 2, or 4 times the normal size.



To move the enlarged picture, or "pan," press OK. Then, press ▲CH+, ▼CH-, ◄, or ▶.

Press OK again to see the still, zoomed picture without the Menu Bar.

To return to regular play, press PLAY ▶.

Press SYSTEM MENU to remove the Menu Bar again.




Camera Angle

Some DVDs include scenes recorded from different perspectives or angles. To watch segments from a different angle, follow these steps. Multiple angles must be recorded on the DVD.


During DVD play, press the GREEN ANGLE ⊕ button to select ⊕ in the Menu Bar.

Within five seconds, press ▲ CH+ or ▼ CH- or the GREEN ANGLE ⊕ button repeatedly to select a different angle. In a few seconds, play will change to the new perspective.



Or, if the Angle symbol appears in the top left corner of the TV screen during DVD play, multiple angles are available. Simply press ▲CH+ or ▼CH- to switch among the different perspectives.







 The Recorder also refers to Sound settings as Analog output. This means the sound the Recorder sends to your audio equipment (stereo or TV) is analog, or two-channel, left and right. Whether you adjust the sound settings here or as described on page 59, the results will be the same.

Slow Motion

Start slow motion play simply by pressing the SLOW → button during play. Press SLOW → repeatedly to play the Disc at 1/2, 1/4, or 1/8 the regular speed. Press PLAY → to resume regular play.





To use the Menu Bar for searching instead, follow the steps below. You cannot use the Menu Bar to search an Audio CD.




Time Search

Time Search lets you choose a specific elapsed playing time at which you want to begin play. This feature may not be available on all Discs.

Press SYSTEM MENU during Disc play.

Press ► repeatedly to select 🗗 in the second Menu Bar.

Press ▼CH-. Play will pause. A time edit box will show the elapsed playing time of the current Chapter or Disc.




Press the Number buttons to enter the time at which you want play to begin. Enter the hour, minutes, and seconds from left to right in the box.

The time must be within the possible time of the current Chapter or Disc. If not, play will not begin after you press OK at step 5. Instead, a space in the time edit box will blink. Or, play may begin at the wrong time. Refer to the Status box to see the time available, then enter a correct time.

Press OK. After a few seconds, play will resume at the point you selected.



Scan

Scanning plays the first 10 seconds of each Chapter/Track on the Disc.

- Press PLAY MODE repeatedly during play until "scan" appears in the top left corner of the TV screen. Starting with the current Chapter/Track, the first 10 seconds of each Chapter/Track will play. This will continue until the end of the Disc is reached or you resume regular play.
- To stop scanning and continue regular play, press PLAY ▶.




Repeat

You may play a Chapter, Track, Title or entire Disc repeatedly. All Discs do not allow all the repeat options. You cannot play an entire DVD+R or DVD+RW repeatedly. Check your Disc for details.

- During Disc play, press PLAY MODE repeatedly to choose a Repeat option. Depending on the type of Disc, you may choose to play the Chapter, Track, Title, or Disc repeatedly.

 During DVD, Video CD, DVD+R, or DVD+RW play, the repeat symbols will appear briefly on the TV screen. See page 29.
- To cancel repeat play, press STOP ■.



Repeat A-B

You also may set the Recorder to play only a specific portion of a Title, Chapter, or Track repeatedly. Follow these steps.




Locking or Unlocking Specific Discs

After you set Child Lock to Locked, you can unlock a Disc by choosing Play once or Play always.

Insert a Disc. The Access Control message will appear on the TV screen. Child Lock must be Locked. See above.



- Press ▲CH+ or ▼CH- to select Play once or Play always. Press the Number buttons to enter your four-digit code. If you select Play Once, the Disc will play one time. If you open the Disc tray or turn off the Recorder's power, the Access Control screen will reappear when you try to play the Disc again. If you select Play Always, you can play the Disc later without entering your code, even if you turn off the Recorder or open the disc
- If you later decide to lock the Disc so it will not play always: When you insert the Disc, safe (2) appears on the TV screen. **Press** STOP ■ while safe ③ is on the TV screen. Locked ② will appear. The next time you turn on the Recorder or try to play the Disc, the Access Control screen will appear.



- If you do not know your code when Access Control appears, press STOP ■. Select Access Control in the Recorder's menu. When prompted for your code, press STOP **■** four times. Press SYSTEM MENU to remove the menu. This restores the default Access Control settings.
- Two-sided DVDs may have a different ID for each side. Disc sets may have a different ID for each Disc. Unlock each side or Disc.

Parental Level

DVDs may have scenes that conform to a Parental Level or movie rating. The Parental Level may apply to the complete Disc or to certain scenes. Follow the steps below to set the Parental Level at which you want Discs to play.





Press ▼CH- repeatedly to select in the second menu, then press . Access control will be highlighted.



- If you selected Black level shift, press ▲ CH+ or ▼ CH- to select On or Off, then press OK. Set Black level shift to On during play of NTSC Discs. This will improve the color contrast and brighten the picture. Black level shift has no effect on PAL Disc play.
- If you selected Video shift, press ◀ or ▶ to center the picture on your TV screen or "shift" the video. When you are satisfied with the position of the picture, press OK.
- If you selected Video output, press SELECT repeatedly to choose Interlaced or Progressive Scan, then press OK. Select Progressive Scan only if you connected the Recorder to a TV that has Progressive Scan. See page 12. Otherwise, choose Interlaced.

60 Language Settings

In the Language menu, select a different language for the Audio soundtrack or Subtitles of a DVD. Or, change the language of the DVD Recorder's System Menu. You also can determine whether you receive TV channels in Stereo or in a Second Audio Program language by following these steps.

Press CH-▼ repeatedly to select , then press ▶.


Press CH+▲ or CH-▼ to select Playback audio, Recording audio, Subtitle, or Menu, then press ▶ and proceed as detailed in step 4.

- If you selected Playback audio, press CH+▲ or CH-▼ to select the language in which you want to play the Disc, then press OK. The changes will be effective only if the language is available on the Disc. Some DVDs allow you to change languages in the Disc Menu only.
 - If you selected Recording audio, press CH+▲ or CH-▼ to select Stereo or SAP, then press OK.

Some TV programs broadcast in stereo or in a second audio program (SAP). Usually, second audio means the program has a second language available. For example, the program might be available in English and Spanish, with Spanish being the SAP (second audio program) option. Your selection will only be active if the program is available in stereo or second audio. SAP will appear on the display panel when this feature is active and available.


When you play the recording, you can play only in the audio you recorded. For example, if you recorded in SAP, you can play the recording only in SAP.

- If you selected Subtitle, press CH+▲ or CH-▼ to choose the language in which you want the Subtitles, then press OK. The subtitles will be in that language if available on the Disc.
- If you selected Menu, press CH+▲ or CH-▼ to choose English, Espanol (Spanish), or Français (French), then press OK. This adjusts the language of the Recorder's System Menu, which is available only in these three languages.



 Play will resume from the last played point, even if Auto resume is Off. See page 22.
- The display panel will be blank during play of a Video CD with PBC On.

Analog: Sound that has not been turned into numbers. Analog sound varies, while digital sound has specific numerical values. Analog sound is available when you use the red and white audio jacks on your equipment. These jacks send audio through two channels, the left and right.

AUDIO jacks: Jacks on the Recorder that send or receive sound to or from other equipment (VCR, Camcorder, etc.).

A/V: Audio/Video.

COAX (coaxial) OUT jack: Sends digital audio to a Stereo, allowing you to adjust the volume at the Stereo. The Stereo must have a Coaxial In jack. This connection provides the 5.1 channel surround sound as heard in movie theaters.

<u>Color system:</u> There are various systems for transmitting television signals, for example PAL, SECAM, and NTSC. NTSC is the most common color system in the United States of America.

<u>COMPONENT VIDEO Jacks</u>: The jacks on the Recorder that send or receive a picture to or from other equipment. The video is separated into three components (red, green, and blue) to deliver a high quality picture.

<u>Digital</u>: Sound that has been converted into numerical values. Digital sound is available when you use the Recorder's COAX (coaxial) OUT or OPTICAL OUT iacks.

<u>Dolby Digital:</u> A surround sound system that provides 5.1 channel sound as used in movie theaters.

DVD+R: DVD+Recordable. These Discs can be recorded and finalized only once.

DVD+RW: DVD+ReWritable. These Discs can be recorded on repeatedly.

i.LINK: Also known as 'FireWire 'and 'IEEE 1394.' A cable for transfer of high bandwidth digital signals as used by Digital Video camcorders or some computers.

Index Picture Screen: A screen that gives an overview of a DVD+RW or DVD+R. An Index Picture represents each recording.

<u>Letterbox</u>: A TV aspect ratio setting (4:3). Displays the stretched video in full-width, with black bars at the top and bottom of the TV screen. This format is similar to seeing a movie in a theater. The DVD case may advertise it as widescreen format.

MPEG: Motion Picture Experts Group. A collection of compression systems for digital audio and video.

OPTICAL OUT Jack: Converts electrical signals into optical signals before sending the audio to the Stereo. Optical audio is not prone to external electrical influences and has less noise, which reduces adverse effects on external equipment. Keep the protective cap on the jack when the jack is not in use.

OTR: One-Touch Recording. Start a timed recording by pushing just one button; select the switch-off time in intervals of 30 minutes.

<u>Pan & Scan:</u> A TV aspect ratio setting (4:3). Displays the video with full-height picture, with one or both sides of the picture trimmed to fit on your TV screen. Some movie companies refer to this as "reformatting the picture to fit your TV screen."

PBC: Playback Control. A Video CD/Super VCD feature that enables interactive

PCM: Pulse Code Modulation. A digital audio encoding system.

RGB: Red-Green-Blue. A top-quality video connection where red, green, and blue components of a video signal are carried through separate wires. This also is referred to as the component video connection.

S-Video: Produces a clear picture by sending separate signals for the luminance and the color. You can use S-Video only if your TV has an S-Video In jack.

TruSurround: A system that simulates multi-channel sound via a two-channel connection (audio left and right). This allows you to enjoy multi-channel sound if your Stereo does not have a multi-channel decoder.

VCR Plus+ System: Allows you to set a timer recording by entering a PlusCode number found in participating TV listings.

<u>VIDEO (CVBS) Jacks:</u> Jacks that send or receive video to or from other equipment.

Widescreen: A TV aspect ratio setting (16:9). Displays the video appropriately when you connect the Recorder to a widescreen TV.

64 Helpful Hints

If you are having problems with your product, check this list of problems and possible solutions before requesting service. You may be able to solve the problem yourself.

No power

- Press STANDBY-ON () on the front of the Recorder to turn it on.
- Connect the supplied power cord securely to the MAINS ~ (AC power) jack on the rear of the Recorder. Connect the
 power cord firmly to an AC power outlet. Use only the supplied power cord.
- Make sure the AC outlet has power by trying another appliance in the same outlet.

No picture

- Make sure the TV power is on.
- Check the video cables. Make sure the cables are fastened securely to the Recorder and the TV.
- Set your TV to the correct Video In channel. These channels are usually near channel zero. Or, you may have a button on the TV remote that selects an Auxiliary or A/V IN channel. See your TV manual for details. Or, go to your lowest TV channel and change channels down until you see the Recorder's blue background picture on the TV screen.
- You only need one video connection between the DVD Recorder and the TV. See page 9.

The picture is distorted; the picture is black and white during play.

- TVs have a color system standard, usually NTSC in the United States. If the Disc's color system is different than your TV's color system, the picture may be distorted or colorless.
- The Recorder can not record in color if the TV channel or source is not providing color. In some situations, programs that are broadcast in black and white can not be recorded.
- Check the Disc for fingerprints. Clean the Disc with a soft cloth, wiping from the center to the edge in a straight line.
- Sometimes a small amount of picture distortion may appear. This is not a malfunction.

The sound is distorted during Disc play through a Stereo.

- Do not connect any cables from the DVD Recorder to the Stereo's "PHONO IN" jack.
- Do not connect a digital jack on the Recorder (COAX OUT or OPTICAL OUT) to an analog jack on the Stereo. (Analog
 audio jacks are usually labeled as such and are usually red and white.)

No sound

- Check the audio connections. See pages 9-17. Remember, you only need one audio connection. See page nine to see what connection best suits your situation.
- Make sure cables are connected firmly to all equipment.
- Select another channel, sound source, or Auxiliary station at your Stereo or TV. See your Stereo or TV manual for details. Or, just continue selecting the different sound sources or modes on the Stereo or TV until you hear sound from the Disc that is in the Recorder. See pages 9-17.
- Check your Analog output or Digital output settings. Make sure you choose the right setting, based on what equipment you connected to the DVD Recorder. See page 59. Make sure these settings match the capabilities of your Stereo or TV.
- Change the Audio setting of the DVD in the DVD Disc Menu.

A Disc recorded on this DVD Recorder will not play on a DVD Player.

- In some cases, you can adapt the Disc at the DVD Recorder, then try it again in the Player. This procedure does not solve the playability problem with all brands of Players. Furthermore, it may make the Disc incompatible with Players with which the Disc was compatible before you modified the Disc.
 - To modify a Disc, place the Disc in the Recorder's disc tray. Do not close the tray. Press and hold the Number 2 button on the remote until the tray closes. After the Recorder reads the Disc, remove it and try it on the other Player. If the Disc still will not play on the Player, repeat this procedure, but press and hold the Number 3 button instead.
 - To return the Disc to its original version, repeat this process using the Number 1 button.
- To play a DVD+R on another DVD Player, finalize the Disc first. See page 40.
- Editing changes may not be accessible when you play the Disc on other Players. Make the edits compatible. See page 38.

An Audio CD will not play on the DVD Recorder.

Some Audio CDs available on the market are copy protected. This Recorder may not play such copy-protected discs.

The Recorder will not select some features.

• The feature may not be available on the Disc. If not, an "X" will appear on the TV screen. Check the Disc case to see if the Disc has the feature. If the Disc does not have the feature, the Recorder cannot create the feature. This is not a malfunction of the Recorder. Some features are only available during play, while others can be accessed only when play is stopped. Stop or start play, then try the feature again.

Disc will not play.

- Make sure the Disc label is facing up. If you are playing a two-sided Disc, make sure the label of the side you want to play is
 facing up. See page 21.
- Check Access Control. See pages 54-56.
- Check the Region Code of the DVD. The DVD must be coded for All regions or Region 1 in order to play on this Recorder. See page seven.
- See if the Disc is defective by trying another Disc. Make sure the Disc is not scratched or warped. Carefully clean the Disc. See page eight.

The DVD Recorder does not respond to the remote control.

- Aim the remote control directly at the IR sensor on the front of the Recorder. See page 26. Point the remote control
 toward the Recorder, not your TV.
- Remove any obstacles between the Recorder and the remote control.
- Inspect or replace the batteries in the remote control. See page eight.
- The remote control may have been set to operate another Recorder accidentally. Press and hold the SELECT and Number 1 buttons on the remote control at the same time to have the remote control operate the Philips DVD Recorder.
- Make sure you selected DVD Recorder as the Remote control used. See page 61.

Recordings are not occurring as scheduled. New recordings cannot be made.

- See if the Disc has the maximum number of titles. Erase some recordings (DVD+RW only). See page 35.
- You can record only if the Disc is Unprotected. You cannot use a write-protected Disc. See page 47.
- You cannot duplicate copyrighted DVDs, videotapes, or TV broadcasts using the Recorder. "COPY PROTECT" may appear
 on the display panel if you try to dub or record copyrighted material.
- The signal from your Antenna/Cable TV system must be strong enough to provide good channel reception. If the signal is weak, if there is no signal, or if a channel has gone off the air, a recording will not occur.
- Check the Disc. If the Disc is bad (scratched, warped, etc.) or if the Recorder cannot read the Disc, you cannot record. "NO DISC" may appear on the display.
- A timer recording may not occur if the power fails. To see what recordings are set, use SCHEDULE. See page 47.

The Index Picture Screen does not appear, but the Disc still plays.

· Clean the Disc. See page eight.

Another DVD player shows the Index Picture Screen but does not react to PLAY ▶.

You need to access system information for service reasons.

• Press SYSTEM MENU. Press ◀ to select Thin the top left corner of the first Menu Bar. Then, press CH-▼ repeatedly to select at the top of the second menu page, then press ▶. Press ▼ repeatedly until the system information appears.

The DVD Recorder does not work.

- The Recorder will not operate until you complete the Initial Setup. See pages 18-20.
- In all other cases, disconnect the power cord from the MAINS ~ jack on the rear of the Recorder for a few minutes. Reconnect the power cord and try to operate the Recorder again as usual.

If the Recorder still will not operate, disconnect the power cord from the MAINS ~ jack on the rear of the Recorder again. Then, while pressing and holding the STANDBY-ON \circlearrowleft button on the front of the Recorder, reconnect the power cord. This resets the Recorder to the factory mode, or to its original settings as they were when you first received the Recorder. You will have to complete the Initial Setup again and reset any items you have adjusted during your use of the Recorder. You also will have to wait for the GUIDE Plus+® System data to refresh. This will take about 24 hours.

Messages or strange codes appear on the Recorder's display panel.

- · Remove and reinsert the Disc.
- · Clean the Disc.
- Disconnect the power cord from the power outlet, then reconnect the cord and try play as usual.
- During Initial Setup, "IS TV ON ..." will appear on the Recorder's display panel. This appears in addition to the Initial Setup information that shows on your TV screen. See pages 18-20. "IS TV ON ..." indicates you should turn on your TV and set it to the correct Video In channel or channel 3 or 4. Even though your TV may be on, you must set it to the correct Video In channel to see the Initial Setup messages. See pages 9-17 to determine the Video In channel for your connection. Or, check your TV manual.

All of the Recorder's System Menu is not visible on the TV.

• Certain TVs may not show the entire System Menu. If the upper or top portion of the menu does not appear properly, this is a TV issue. It is not an improper functioning of the Recorder. See your TV manual for assistance.

Diagnostic Test

If you are having trouble with the Recorder after checking Helpful Hints and other information in this manual, try a Diagnostic Test.

- Disconnect the power cord from the Recorder's MAINS ~ (AC Power) jack on the rear of the Recorder.
- Press and hold the Play button on the front of the Recorder while you reconnect the power cord to the Recorder. "BUSY" will appear on the display panel, along with a counter number. Release PLAY b. The counter will reach zero (0) when the test is finished.
- Momentarily, "FAIL" or "PASS" will appear on the display panel. If "FAIL" appears, your Recorder needs repair. Contact the Philips Customer Care Center for the Authorized Service Center nearest you. If "PASS" appears, the Recorder apparently has no failure. The problem may be incorrect interpretation of the operating instructions, a wrong Disc in use, or incorrect connections. Contact the Philips Customer Care Center for further assistance in solving the problem.
- If there is no failure, disconnect the power cord again, then reconnect it to the Recorder and an AC power outlet. The Recorder will be ready for use.
