- For a previously-connected iPhone which Bluetooth function is enabled, once it is docked in this
  unit, it re-connects automatically.
- Turn on the main unit.
- 2 On the device, set up the Bluetooth connection:

### Set the alarm timer

You can set two alarms which go off at different time.

# 10 Troubleshooting



· Never remove the casing of this apparatus.

To keep the warranty valid, never try to repair the system yourself.

If you encounter problems when using this apparatus, check the following points before requesting service. If the problem remains unsolved, go to the Philips web site (www. philips.com/support). When you contact Philips, ensure that your apparatus is nearby and the model number and serial number are available.

#### No power

- Ensure that the AC power plug of the unit is connected properly.
- Ensure that there is power at the AC outlet.
- To save power, the unit switches to standby automatically 15 minutes after a play reaches the end and no control is operated.

#### No sound

Adjust the volume.

#### No response from the unit

Disconnect and reconnect the AC power plug, then turn on the unit again.

#### Remote control does not work

- Before pressing any function button, first select the correct source with the remote control instead of the main unit.
- Reduce the distance between the remote control and the unit.
- Insert the battery with its polarities (+/- signs) aligned as indicated.

- Replace the battery.
- Aim the remote control directly at the sensor on the front of the unit.

#### Poor radio reception

- Increase the distance between the unit and yourTV or VCR.
