- iPhone, iPhone 3G.

Load the iPod/iPhone

1 Remove the screw on the dock.



No power

- Ensure that the AC power plug of the unit is connected properly.
- Ensure that there is power at the AC outlet.
- To save power, the system switches off automatically 15 minutes after track play reaches the end and no control is operated.

No sound or poor sound

- Adjust the volume.
- Disconnect the headphones.

No response from the DCM250

• Disconnect and reconnect the AC power plug, then turn on the system again.

Remote control does not work

- Before pressing any function button, first select the correct source with the remote control instead of the main unit.
- Reduce the distance between the remote control and the DCM250.
- Insert the battery with its polarities (+/– signs) aligned as indicated.
- Replace the battery.
- Aim the remote control directly at the sensor on the front of the DCM250.

No disc detected

- Insert a disc.
- Check if the disc is inserted upside down.

- Wait until the moisture condensation at the lens has cleared.
- Replace or clean the disc.
 - Use a finalized CD or correct format disc.

Cannot display some files in USB device

- The number of folders or files in the USB device has exceeded a certain limit. This phenomenon is not a malfunction.
- The formats of these files are not supported.

USB device not supported

• The USB device is incompatible with the DCM250. Try another one.

Poor radio reception

- Increase the distance between the DCM250 and your TV or VCR.
- Fully extend the FM antenna.

Timer does not work

- Set the clock correctly.
- Switch on the timer.

Clock/timer setting erased

- Power has been interrupted or the power cord has been disconnected.
- Reset the clock/timer.
